THIS YEAR: Senior Katerina Berdousi from Greece returns as one of the Trojans' top middle distance runners. She had another strong cross country season and looks to carry that success over into the track season.

2015: Berdousi ran distance races from 800m to 5000m for USC. She took third in the 5000m with a time of 17:14.10 and was fourth in the 1500m with a time of 4:36.98 at the USC-UCLA Dual Meet on May 3. She also ran both at the Pac-12 Championships and had her best times as a Trojan, posting a 4:30.43 time in the 1500m and a 17:08.08 time in the 5000m...Berdousi's 5000m time moved her into seventh on USC's all-time list in the event.

2014: Berdousi led the Trojans with a best 1500m time of 4:35.49 which she ran in placing sixth at the Triton Invitational on April 26. Her best 800m time was 2:16.85 at the Cal-Nevada Championships on April 4. Helped lead the USC women's team to a win over UCLA at the Dual Meet on May 4 by winning the 1500m race with a time of 4:38.28.

2013: Berdousi won the 1500m race at the Northridge Invitational with a time of 4:34. At the Trojan Invite she ran the eighth-fastest women's 3000m race in USC history and finished sixth with a time of 9:45.42. She placed sixth in the sixth heat of the women's 1500m race with a season-best time of 4:31.06 at Mt. SAC on April 19. She also took third in the steeplechase at the USC-UCLA Dual Meet on April 27 with a time of 11:09.82 to move into ninth place on USC's all-time list. It was her first 3000m steeplechase at USC and she tripped on the second to last hurdle and went fully underwater or she would have taken second place

HIGH SCHOOL: Berdousi is a 2012 graduate of Second High School of Tripoli in Greece. Berdousi has personal bests of 2:13 in the 800m, 4:23.68 in the 1500m, 9:37.56 in the 3000m and 17:00.98 in the 5000m races and figures to challenge for Trojan top-10 times in all four events. Last season, Berdousi placed second in the 1500m and third in the 5000m at the Greek Outdoor Championships with her PRs in both events. In 2010, she took third place in the 3000m race at the European Youth Olympic Trials with a time of 9:48.56 which qualified her for the Youth Olympic Games in Singapore where she placed fourth with her PR of 9:37.56. Berdousi won the Greek Junior Cross Country Championships in March and is a member of the Greek National Athletics Team. She was voted the best Greek Female Athlete in April of 2010. In July of 2011, Berdousi won the 5000m and placed second in the 3000m races at the Greek Junior Outdoor Championships.

THIS YEAR: Junior Destinee Brown begins her second season of competing in the sprints and relays for USC.

2015: Brown had a strong first season at USC, setting personal bests of 11.43 (+2.0) in the 100m at the Mt. SAC Relays on April 17 and 23.63 (+1.9) in the 200m in the Pac-12 semifinals on May 16. She scored in both events at the Pac-12 Championships taking sixth in the 100m with a time of 11.66 (+1.1) and eighth in the 200m with a time of 23.83 (+0.7). She advanced to the NCAA West Regional in both events. She won her first 100m race for USC, running 11.73 (-1.3) to take the title at the Trojan Invitational on March 21. Brown also competed indoors and placed third in the 200m (23.99) and sixth in the 60m (7.40) at the MPSF Championships. She had PRs of 7.37 and 23.78 during the indoor season.

BEFORE USC: Brown attended Cal State Fullerton as a freshman. She had 13 top five finishes in her 2014 season, holding the top three times for Cal State Fullerton for the 100m dash, with her best time coming in at the UC Riverside Invitational, where she placed first with a time of 11.64.

HIGH SCHOOL: Destinee Brown attended Westchester High School in Inglewood, Calif., where she was a four year varsity letter winner in both track and field and basketball. In 2013, she was the City Section 100m and 200m dash champion.

PERSONAL: Destinee was born on July 6, 1994 to parents Kimberly Jones and Eric Brown in Inglewood, Calif...She has seven siblings, five brothers and two sisters...She is a sophomore Communications major at USC. THIS YEAR: Sophomore Gabriella Cantrell begins her second season as a Trojan competing in the 100m, 200m and relays.

2015: Cantrell set PRs in the 100m with a time of 11.53 (-1.2) and 200m with a time of 23.34 (+1.6) at the Florida Relays on April 3. She finished sixth in the 200m with a time of 23.55 (+0.7) at the Pac-12 Championships on May 17...also placed ninth in the 100m final with a time of 11.72 (+1.1). She reached the NCAA quarterfinals in the 200m and placed 22nd with a time of 24.04 (+0.6). During the indoor season she set PRs in the 60m (7.39) and the 200m (23.60). She placed second in the 200m with a time of 23.81 at the MPSF Indoor Championships on Feb. 27.

HIGH SCHOOL: Cantrell graduated with the class of 2014 from San Leandro High in San Leandro, Calif. after running her first three seasons at Bishop O'Dowd in Oakland, Calif. Cantrell placed second in the 200m (23.85) and fifth in the 100m (11.73) at the 2014 California State meet, despite working her way back from a hamstring injury suffered during the indoor season. She finished third in both as a junior as well. She achieved her personal bests in the 100m (11.50w) and the 200m (23.77) at the Clovis CIF State Championship meet in May of 2013. She currently holds her High School records in both the 100 and 200 meter races and was the anchor leg on the record setting 4 x 100m team. She also reached the 2014 USATF Junior Championship 200m dash finals before a DQ.

PERSONAL: Gabriella was born on November 30, 1995 in Oakland, CA. Her parents are Gregory and Velma Cantrell and she has one sister, Sienna Cantrell. THIS YEAR: Sophomore Kendall Ellis begins her second season as a Trojan competing in the 400m dash and 4x400m relay. She ranks in USC's top 10 and is the school freshman record-holder in the 400m dash and ran the third leg on USC's 4x400m relay which set the school indoor and outdoor records last season.

2015: Ellis opened her outdoor season by winning the 400m with a time of 53.49 at the Trojan Invitational on March 21. She then won and set the USC freshman record in the 400m with a time of 53.01 at the Jim Click Shootout on April 11...she bested Malika Edmonson's record of 53.02 which was set in 1998 and moved to ninth on USC's all-time 400m list. Ellis was named the Pac-12 Women's Track Athlete of the Week for the week of April 6-12. She would go on to better her freshman record four more times. She had a time of 52.96 to place third at the Mt. SAC Relays on April 18, ran 52.88 to finish fifth at the Pac-12 Championships, ran 52.58 to place 10th at the NCAA West Regional to advance to the NCAA Championships where she ran 54.45 in the semifinals to place 24th. She then had a PR of 52.32 to take the 400m title at the USATF Junior Championships on June 27. Ellis went on to place third at the Pan Am Juniors with a time of 52.81 on July 31. Ellis was also a key member of USC's 4x400m relay which set the school indoor record with a time of 3:29.63 to place third at the NCAA Indoor Championships on March 14, the outdoor record with a time of 3:27.86 at the NCAA West Regional on May and won the Pac-12 title. The quartet finished second at the NCAA Championships with a time of 3:29.97.

HIGH SCHOOL: Ellis graduated with the class of 2014 from St. Thomas Aquinas High in Pembroke Pines, Florida. She is a four-time Florida State champion in the 400m dash, winning in 2014 with a PR of 52.95. She is also the four-time female MVP. Ellis' 400m dash time ranked fourth in the country among all high school women in 2014.

She has two siblings: Courtney and Kimberly Ellis...She received a high school GPA of 4.7 while participating in clubs such as Delta GEMS and Think BIG and volunteering at the West Pembroke Pines Optimist Track Club...Her Sports hero is Allyson Felix because she is great at everything she does... THIS YEAR: Redshirt sophomore Rebekah Ent begins her first season of running track for USC...She competed in cross country in the Fall...Ent transferred to USC from UC Santa Barbara.

BEFORE USC: Ent was on the UC Santa Barbara track team in 2014 and 2015. She set an 800m PR of 2:10.18 in placing fifth at the Big West Championships on May 16, 2015...that time ranks fifth all-time by a Gaucho. She also posted a 1500m PR of 4:33.44 to place second at the UCSB-Cal Poly Dual Meet on May 2. She was also on the cross country team for two seasons, but only competed in one race. She redshirted the 2013 season and then missed most of the 2014 season due to injury. In her only career cross country race for UC Santa Barbara, she led the Gauchos with a time of 19:24.8 to place 30th at the CS Fullerton Titan Invitational (5K).

HIGH SCHOOL: Ent is a 2013 graduate of Miramonte High in Orinda, Calif. She was the DFAL League champion in the 400m and 800m races as a senior. Ran on the 4x800m relay team which set the Miramonte school record. Her high school 800m best was 2:17.15. Was second in the 2013 CIF State Indoor Championships in the 600m race with a time of 1:30.41 (to current teammate Mikaela Smith).

THIS YEAR: Senior All-American Alexis Faulknor returns for her final season of competing in the sprints and jumps for USC. She transferred to USC from UCF in 2013 and has been a key member of the Trojan program since her arrival on campus. She ranks 10th on USC's all-time 100m and 200m dash lists.

2015: Had a strong season as a sprinter and jumper which culminated with a PR of 11.26 (+1.8) in the 100m in the preliminary rounds at the USATF Championships on June 25 which ranks 10th all-time by a Trojan. She also had a PR in the 200m of 22.97 (+0.5) in the prelims at the USATFs to advance to the semifinals where she placed 14th with a time of 23.16 (+1.5)...that time also ranks 10th on USC's all-time list. She had a wind-aided PR of 11.18 (+3.0w) to finish ninth at the NCAA Championships, one spot short of reaching the finals. At the Pac-12 Championships, she won the long jump title with a wind-aided best mark of 21-0.75/6.42m (+3.7w)...she also had a season-best legal jump of 20-9.25/6.33m (-2.7) in her series. She went on to finish 15th in the LJ at the West Regional with a jump of 20-1.50/6.13m (+2.2w). Also at the Pac-12s, she was third in the 200m with a then-PR of 23.08 (+0.7) and fourth in the 100m with a time of 11.36 (+1.1). She ran the third leg on USC's 4x100m relay which ran 43.10 to set the Pac-12 Championships meet record and ranks third all-time on the Trojans' all-time list. She earned All-America honors with the 4x100m relay team which took third with a time of 43.27, which ranks fifth on USC's all-time list. During the indoor season she set PRs in the 60m (7.27) and the 200m (23.99). She won the MPSF long jump title with a PR of 20-5.25/6.23m and finished fifth in the 60m (7.34).

2014: Earned All-America honors running the third leg on USC's 4x100m relay team which placed second at the NCAA Championships with the second-fastest time in school history of 43.00, just .04 seconds off the USC record. Faulknor placed third in the long jump with a season-best leap of 20-4.50 (6.21m) at the Pac-12 Championships...also placed fourth in the 100m dash (11.53) and ninth in the 200m race (23.94). She advanced to the NCAA West Regional in the 100m and long jump where she placed 13th in both, one position shy of advancing to the NCAA Championships in each event...her 100m time was 11.61 (+0.4) and had a long jump of 19-10.75 (6.06m). She took second in the 100m dash with a season legal-best time of 11.45 at the USC-UCLA Dual Meet on May 4...she also took second in the 200m dash that day with a PR of 23.48. Faulknor posted a wind-aided 100m season best of 11.38 (+2.8w) at the Florida Relays on April 4.

2013: During her freshman campaign at UCF, Faulknor earned first team All-America honors in the 4x100m relay as the Knights took second at the 2013 NCAA Championships with a time of 43.36. She also finished 14th in the 100m dash with a time of 11.37w to earn second team All-America honors. UCF's 4x100m relay team set a school record with a time of 43.15 in the semifinals at the NCAAAs which is the eighth-fastest clocking all-time by a collegiate women's quartet. She earned Conference-USA Indoor and Outdoor Championships Freshman of the Meet, was the C-USA outdoor long jump and 4x100m relay champion, took third in the 200m final and fourth in the 100m dash. During her freshman season she established PRs of 7.43 in the 60m dash, 11.42 (legal) in the 100m, 23.55 in the 200m and 21-4.75 (6.52m) in the long jump. Her long jump mark would rank fourth on USC's all-time long jump list. Following the NCAA season, she was a two-time gold medal winner at the 2013 Pan American Junior Championships. She won the long jump with a leap of 20-5.75 (6.24m) on Aug. 24 and then came back to win gold running the third leg for USA's 4x100m relay team (43.97) on Aug. 25 at the Pan American Junior Championships held in Medellin, Colombia.

HIGH SCHOOL: Faulknor competed at Serra High and helped lead her team to its first state championship in school history in 2012, capturing the long jump and 4x100m titles and taking a silver medal in the 100m and 200m dashes. She set the Serra record in the 100m, 200m and long jump and was named the Daily Breeze 2012 Track and Field Athlete of the Year.

PERSONAL: Alexis was born on September 22, 1994 in Los Angeles, Calif....Her parents are Chris and Ann and she has a brother, Chris...Her father ran for Jamaica in the 1988 Olympics on the 4x100m relay team and her mother (formerly Ann Foster) won the NCAA Division II triple jump title four consecutive seasons while at Abilene Christian. Faulknor's hobbies include making people laugh...Her favorite food is any type of chicken...Her favorite musician is Beyonce...She is a Human Biology major and is involved in Autism Walks...Hopes to go to the Olympics some day.

THIS YEAR: Redshirt senior All-American sprinter Tynia Gaither is in her final season of running track for USC, following her transfer from Georgia after the 2013 season. She ranks tied for eighth on USC's all-time 200m dash list and anchored the second and third-fastest 4x100m relays in USC history.

2015: Established a 100m PR of 11.27 (+1.1) to take second at the Pac-12 Championships on May 17...that time is 11th on USC's all-time list. She also won the 200m dash title the same day at the conference meet with a time of 22.97 (+0.7). She advanced out the NCAA West Regional in the 100m with the eighth-fastest time of 11.32 (+2.5w), but had to pull out of the 200m quarterfinals with an injured right hamstring hurt while running the 4x100m. Injured halfway through the anchor leg, she assured that her teammates would advance by more or less hopping down the stretch and willing herself to the finish to hold off the opposition. She anchored the 4x100m relay which won the Pac-12 title on May 17 with a meet-record time of 43.10, third all-time by a Trojan quartet. She set indoor PRs in the 60m (7.23) and the 200m (23.19) during the indoor season. She won the 200m (23.51) and placed third with a PR in the 60m (7.23) at the MPSF Championships. She went on to finish 11th in the 200m (23.43) and 13th in the 60m (7.44) at the NCAA Indoor Championships.

2014: In her first season at USC she quickly established herself as one of the top sprinters on the West Coast and in the country. Gaither anchored USC's 4x100m relay team which ran 43.00 to place second at the NCAA Championship and second on the Trojans' all-time list. .04 seconds off the school record. She placed sixth in the 200m dash with a time of 23.05 (+2.2w) and eight in the 100m with a time of 11.73 (-3.4) at the NCAA Championships. She placed third in the 100m (11.44) and 200m (23.07) at the Pac-12 Championships. She won both events at the USC-UCLA Dual Meet on May 4, running 11.45 in the 100m and 23.34 in the 200m. She set a then 100m legal PR of 11.41 (+0.5) in tying for seventh at the Florida Relays on April 4. Set a 200m PR of 22.88 (+1.5) in qualifying fifth at the NCAA West Regional on May 31. She had wind-aided PRs of 11.23 (+2.2w) in the 100m in the NCAA semifinals and 22.80 (+3.0w) in the 200m at the Mt. SAC Relays on April 19. She also anchored USC's 4x400m relay which posted the third-fastest time in school history of 3:29.42 at the Florida Relays on April 5. Earned indoor All-America honors by placing sixth in the 200m dash with a time of 23.41. She took second in the 60m and 200m to help USC win the MPSF Conference title in its first season running in the conference.

THIS YEAR: Sophomore Diior Hall had an outstanding first season as a hurdler for USC earning both indoor and outdoor All-America honors and setting the USC freshman indoor and outdoor records.

2015: Hall placed third in her 100m HH heat and overall with a time of 13.00 (+2.1w) in her first collegiate outdoor meet at the Florida Relays on April 3...there was only one other collegiate hurdler in her heat. She only finished lower than third in one completed race, placing sixth in the NCAA semifinals, but she made up for it by running a PR, USC freshman record and world junior record of 12.74 (+1.7) in the finals on June 13 to place third and earn All-America honors. Her time broke the previous world junior record of 12.84 set by Aliuska Sanchez of Cuba in 1987 and the U.S. junior record of 12.87 set by Kendell Williams in 2014. Hall's time is also third all-time by a Trojan, .01 second outside of second place (12.73) set by Nia Ali in 2011. She also was called into duty and ran the leadoff leg for the 4x100m relay in the NCAA finals which ran 43.27 to finish third and earn All-America honors, the fifth-fastest time ever by a USC quartet. Hall won the Pac-12 100m HH title with a time of 12.99 (-0.4) on May 17...she also won the 100m HH at the Jim Click Shootout (13.17) and the Mt. SAC Relays (12.89)...her time at Mt. SAC originally broke the school freshman record of 13.06 set by Lauren Blackburn in 2011. Hall won the USATF Junior title with a time of 13.20 (+2.6w) and then went on to win the 100m HH at the Pan Am Junior Championships with a time of 13.20 (-1.7) on July 31. Hall also established a 200m PR of 23.79 at the Jim Click Shootout on April 11. She established the USC freshman indoor 60m HH mark with a time of 8.07 at the Don Kirby Elite Meet on Feb. 14, won the MPSF title with a time of 8.11 on Feb. 28 and was eighth to earn indoor All-America honors with a time of 8.48 at the NCAA Indoor Championships on March 14 after clipping the third hurdle.

HIGH SCHOOL: Hall graduated with the class of 2014 from the Denver School of Science and Technology at Stapleton while competing for George Washington High in Denver, Colo. Hall is a two-time winner of the Gatorade Colorado Girls Track and Field Athlete of the Year award. Her mother Yolanda Johnson was the first to receive the National Gatorade Girls Track and Field Athlete of the Year in 1986. In February 2013, Hall established the World Youth Best for the Indoor 60m hurdles. Hall is a three-time state champion in the 100m HH, and holds the national high school record. In 2014 at the IAAF World Youth Championships, Hall established the U.S. High school record with a time of 12.92 seconds to win a silver medal. Both Hall and the winner Kendell Williams (then a freshman at Georgia) beat the previous IAAF World Youth record of 12.96. Hall's time broke the previous high school record of 12.95 which was set by Candy Young in 1979. Her time of 12.92 was .41 seconds faster than the second-fastest high school hurdler in the country, while only .27 seconds separated No. 2-10 on the high school list in 2014.

THIS YEAR: Junior All-American Amalie Iuel returns to compete in the heptathlon, 400m IH and the 4x400m relay for the Trojans. She ranks fourth on USC's all-time list in the 400m IH and the heptathlon and ran a leg on the 4x400m relay which set the school indoor and outdoor records.

2015: Iuel moved into fourth place on USC's all-time 400m IH list by running 55.92 to finish third at the Florida Relays on April 3. She went on to place second in the event at the Pac-12 Championships (56.06), as well as placing seventh in the 100m HH (14.11) and running on the conference champion 4x400m relay team which clocked 3:32.12. Iuel earned All-America honors in the 400m IH by placing seventh with a time of 56.99 at the NCAA Championships. She also earned All-America status with the 4x400m relay which was the NCAA runner-up with a time of 3:29.97. The quartet of Jaide Stepter, Iuel, Kendall Ellis and Vanessa Jones set the USC outdoor record in the event with a time of 3:27.86 at the NCAA West Regional on May 30...the previous school record of 3:28.08 was set in 1999. The same group also set the school indoor record in the 4x400m with a time of 3:29.63 to take third at the NCAA Indoor Championships on March 14...it was the 11th-fastest college women's 4x400m relay time ever. She competed in the 400m dash and had a PR of 53.38 at the MPSF Indoor Championships to place fifth. Iuel again competed in the heptathlon at the Pac-12 Multi-Events Championships and took third with a PR of 5,610 points to move into fourth place on USC's all-time list. During the season she set PRs in the 200m (23.96/+1.6), 800m (2:10.28), 100m HH (13.80/+0.3), 400m IH (55.92), long jump (19-1.50/5.83m/+1.9) and shot put (34-2.75/10.43m). During the summer she placed fifth in the 400m IH at the European U23 Championships with a Norwegian national U23 record of 56.36, just a few weeks after officially becoming a citizen of Norway. She then placed 26th in the 400m IH with a time of 56.59 at the World Championships on Aug. 23.

2014: Iuel won the Pac-12 heptathlon by posting a then-800m PR of 2:12.43 to win the final event by more than 2.5 seconds to earn 929 points and easily make up the 86 points she trailed by entering the final event. Iuel finished the two-day competition (May 10-11) with 5,378 points to become the first Trojan woman to win the event since Nicole Haynes in 1996 and her point total moved her into seventh place on USC's all-time list. Iuel was the first freshman to win the conference heptathlon since Jackie Johnson of ASU in 2004. It was only the second heptathlon ever for Iuel, who scored 4,877 points in her first attempt to place second at the Aztec Invitational on March 27-28. Iuel also excelled in the 400m IH race, placing second at the USC-UCLA Dual Meet on May 4 with a time of 58.70. She bettered that with a time of 58.10 to move into ninth place on USC's all-time list and grab the final advancing spot at the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds on May 30. She had a time of 59.74 to place 18th at the NCAA Championships on June 11 to earn All-America honorable mention. Competed indoors in the 400m and had a then-PR of 56.52 to place 10th at the Cherry & Silver Invite on January 25.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from the International School of Bangkok in 2013. Had bests of 61.4 in the 400m HH, 56.1 in the 400m dash and 5-8 in the high jump.

She advanced to the NCAA Preliminary Rounds in the 400m IH, but finished 14th with a time of 58.30. Stepter showed during the indoor season that she was primed for a breakout season as she set an indoor PR of 53.98 in the 400m dash to place sixth at the MPSF Indoor Championships and anchored the third-place 4x400m relay team's 3:37.23 effort. She went on to earn indoor All-America honors running the third leg for the relay team which placed sixth with a then school-record time of 3:33.20.

As a junior she led Canyon del Oro to the Division II state title by winning the 100m HH (14.62), 300m IH (43.40) and the 200m dash (24.99).

THIS YEAR: Sophomore All-American Ky Westbrook begins her second season as a Trojan competing in the 100m and 200m dashes. She ranks sixth on USC's all-time 100m list.

2015: Westbrook had an incredible freshman season competing in both the 100m and 200m dashes, as well as the 4x100m relay. At the Pac-12 Championships, Westbrook placed third in the 100m dash with a time of 11.36 (+1.1) and seventh in the 200m dash with a time of 23.58 (+0.7). She also ran the second leg for USC's winning 4x100m relay team which won with a meet-record time of 43.10, third-all time by a Trojan quartet. At the NCAA Semifinals, Westbrook set new PR's in the 100m with a time of 11.17 (+1.8) and had a wind-aided 200m PR of 23.01 (+4.6w). That 100m time moved her to sixth on USC's all-time list. She went on to place fourth in the 100m dash finals with a wind-aided PR of 11.11 (+3.1w), the third-fastest time ever run by a Trojan in the finals. She also earned All-America honors in the 4x100m relay which placed third with a time of 43.27. She went on to place second in the 200m and tied her legal PR of 23.22 (+0.8) at the the USATF Junior Championships on June 27. She also finished third the day before in the 100m dash final with a time of 11.39 (+0.6). Westbrook set indoor PRs of 7.18 in the 60m and 23.44 in the 200m. She placed second in the 60m at the NCAA Indoor Championships to earn All-America honors with a time of 7.21... she became the first Trojan to score in the event at the Indoor Championships since Virginia Powell in 2006 and had the highest finish by a USC woman since Angela Williams won the title in 2002.

HIGH SCHOOL: Westbrook is a 2014 graduate of Chandler High in Chandler, Ariz. As a senior she led her school to its ninth consecutive state Division I championship by winning four individual Arizona state titles, taking the crown in the 100m (11.69), 200m (24.33/-3.7w) 100m HH (14.17) and shot put (45-7.75). Her efforts earned her the title of Arizona Gatorade Girls Track and Field Athlete of the Year for the second time. She is a 14-time state champion and the 2013 World Youth Champion in the 100 meter dash.

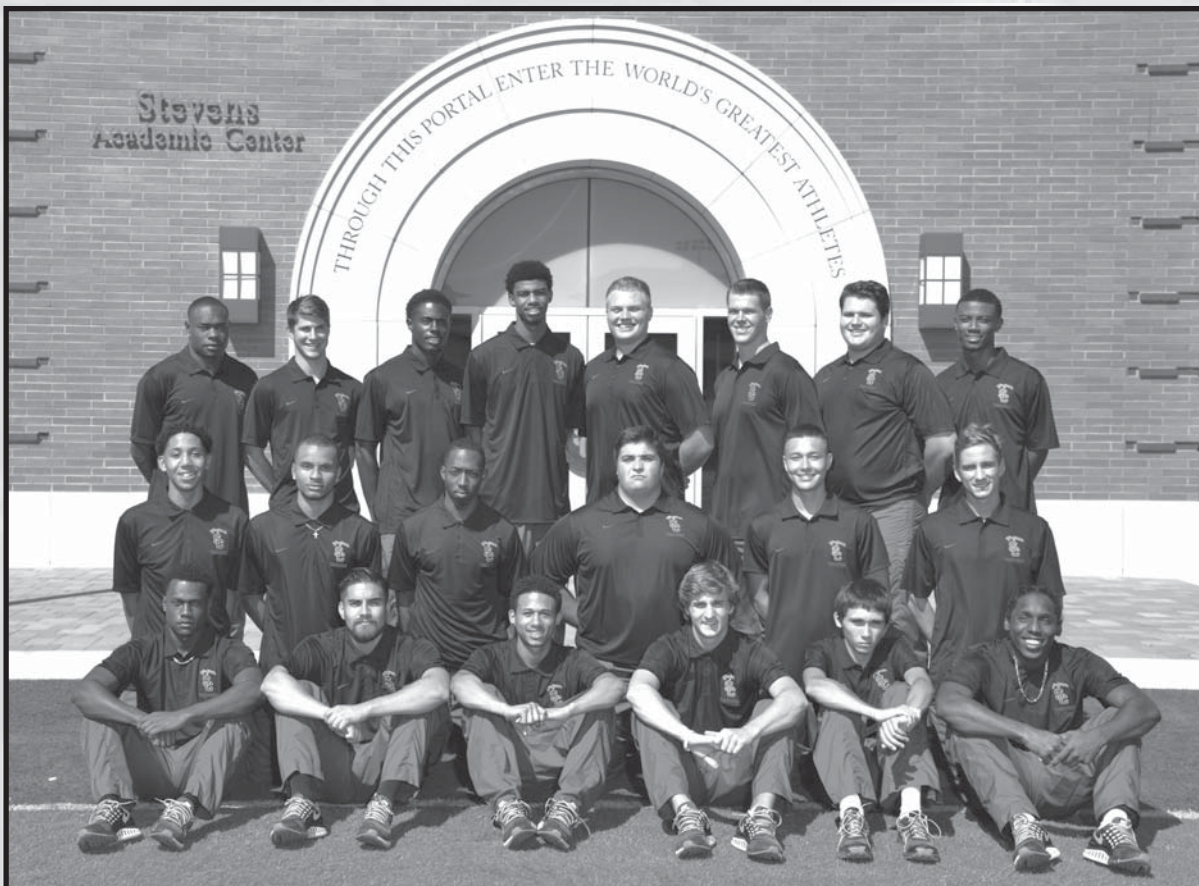

THE 2015 SEASON

USC's young cross country team under the leadership of third-year coach David Freeman was led by seniors Katerina Berdousi and Jenna Tong, redshirt sophomore Rebekah Ent and an encouraging group of freshmen.

Berdousi, Ent and Tong represented USC with a solid outing at the NCAA West Regional in Seattle, Wash. Although Berdousi and Tong are graduating, the addition of Ent, the return to action of redshirt freshman Madison Ricks and its strong six-woman freshman class, the Trojans seem to have laid a foundation to build upon.

The freshmen group included Rachel Glynn, Amber Gore, Lauren Maurer, Sophia Racette, Taylor Seamans and Mikaela Smith. Gore was the 2014 California state Division II cross country champion. Racette missed the season due to injuries, but was a four-time cross country All-State selection in Missouri and helped lead her team to the state title as a senior. Most of the group are primarily 800m runners, so their first season was spent adapting to the distance, eventually extended out to the only 6K competition of the season at the Pac-12 Championships where the team placed 12th.

The team also excelled in the classroom once again.

Entering the 2015 season, Allyson Felix has ranked in the top four in the world in the 200m dash for the last 11 years, six times No. 1. She has been ranked in the top 10 in the 200m 12 seasons, the 400m five times and the 100m four times.



USC's standout hurdlers (L-R) junior Amalie Iuel, sophomore Dior Hall and senior Jaide Stepter not only had a big 2015 NCAA season, but also ranked highly among the world's best hurdlers. Iuel placed second at the Pac-12s, seventh at the NCAAs, set the Norway U23 record and had the 42nd-fastest time in the world in the 400m IH (55.92). Hall won the Pac-12 title, finished third at the NCAAs and set the USC freshman and world junior record in the 100m HH (12.74). She also won the USATF Junior and Pan Am Juniors 100m HH title and had the 19th-fastest time in the world. Stepter won the Pac-12 title, finished eighth at the NCAAs and ran the 39th-fastest 400m IH time in the world in 2015 (55.83).
