FIRST SERVE

- USC is on a five-match winning streak. It matches the team's longest previous streak this season (Sept. 15-Oct. 1).
- The Trojans' No. 14 position in the latest AVCA coaches poll is a season high.
- In 12 of the preceding 16 years under head coach **Mick Haley**, the Trojans have posted at least the same or better record in the back half of conference matches as they have in the front half. (7-3; 5-1)
- The Trojans are 2-2 in their last four visits to Maples Pavilion. USC is 8-2 in its last 10 at Haas Pavilion and has won six in a row in the Bears' lair.
- The Trojans have reached 20 wins in a season for the 13th time in 17 years.
- USC owns seven wins over ranked opponents this season: No. 6 Washington, at No. 7 Creighton, at No. 11 UCLA, at No. 12 Utah, No. 15 Utah, No. 16 Michigan, and No. 25 Colorado.
- So. OH **Khalia Lanier** was named the AVCA National Player of the Week for the first time in her career (Nov. 14) and is the Pac-12 Off. POW (Nov. 13).

LOS ANGELES – No. 14 USC (20-7, 12-4 Pac-12) takes a five-match winning streak into pivotal Pac-12 road contests this week at No. 4 Stanford (22-3, 15-1) and California (13-14, 4-12). With four regular-season matches remaining, USC is second in the Pac-12 standings behind Stanford. Wins in the Bay Area would create some separation between the Trojans and a glut of teams in third and fourth place. This week's AVCA National Player of the Week, OH **Khalia Lanier** (4.09 kps) is just one of the Trojans' go-to pin-hitters. OPP **Brittany Abercrombie** (3.14 kps), OPP **Niki Withers** (2.57 kps), and OH **Brooke Botkin** (2.05 kps) are also proven scoring threats. **Jordan Dunn** (1.04 bps) and **Brittany Welsh** occupy the middle of the net. Setters **Reni Meyer-Whalley** (6.16 aps) and **Cindy Marina** (5.30 aps) run USC's 6-2 system; and libero **Victoria Garrick** puts up 3.86 digs per set.

USC HEAD COACH MICK HALEY



Mick Haley is in his 17th season as head coach at USC. He has guided teams to two NCAA titles (2002, '03), six Final Four appearances (2002, '03, '04, '07, '10, and '11) and 16 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. USC has finished the season ranked nationally in the top five nine times out of 16 years under Haley.

The winningest coach in the program's history, Haley has posted an impressive overall record of **430-116 (.788)** while going **237-81 (.745)** in the Pac-12. Haley was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2015 for leading the Trojans to the league title each time.

Haley's 2003 squad won the program's sixth overall title and third NCAA crown. The Trojans were a perfect 35-0 (only the fourth team ever to accomplish the feat) and Haley was honored as the AVCA Division I Coach of the Year. A two-time national championship coach at Texas and four-year coach of the U.S. Women's National Team, Haley took the helm at USC to start of the 2001 season.

Haley earned a bachelor's degree in education from Ball State in 1965 and a master's degree in education in 1966 from Southern Illinois. Haley and his wife, Carrie, have a daughter, Halie, and a son, Hunter. He also has a son, Heath, and a daughter, Heather, from a previous marriage, and six grandchildren, Harrison, Hayley, Amelia, Michael, Presli, and Harley.

BUT FIRST, LET ME TAKE A #SELFIE: Get social with the Women of Troy! Fans can follow and interact with the USC women's volleyball team on Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, and Periscope by searching for **@USCWomensVolley**.

LAST TIME OUT: The Trojans extended their winning streak to five matches with a four-set win over No. 15 Utah and a five-set victory over No. 25 Colorado at the Galen Center to equal the previous long this season (Sept. 15-Oct. 1). USC also avenged a road loss to the Buffaloes. S **Reni Meyer-Whalley** dished out 32 assists to go with 12 digs for her ninth double-double of the year in the win over Utah; and OH **Khalia Lanier** produced her sixth double-double of the season (22nd career) with 21 kills and 14 digs in the win over CU. The Trojans had four players in double-digit kills in each of the wins.

HEY BAY BAY: Three Trojans hail from Bay Area cities and will play in front of friends and family when USC visits the Bay Area this week. **Victoria Garrick** prepped at Sacred Heart and grew up in Atherton, Calif. **Madison Murtagh** is from San Francisco and **Jenna Adams** is a native of San Mateo, Calif.

LINE DANCING: The Women of Troy have used **10** different starting lineups this season. No player can claim to have started all **27** matches, but three have appeared in all **106** sets for the Trojans: OPP **Brittany Abercrombie**, and setters **Reni Meyer-Whalley** and **Cindy Marina**. Defensive specialist **Jenna Adams** has played in all but one set for USC.

SHOW AND PROVE: In 12 of the previous 16 years under the direction of head coach **Mick Haley**, the Trojans have posted at least the same or better records in the back half of league play as they have in the front half. USC completed the front portion of the Pac-12 schedule with a 7-3 record this season. The last time the Trojans were 7-3 on the front end, they went 8-2 to finish with a 15-5 mark in 2012.

900 CLUB: USC head coach **Mick Haley** ranks **third** in career NCAA Division I victories (**952**) among active coaches behind only Penn State's Russ Rose and Navy's Larry Bock. Haley is in his 34th season as a Division I coach, but has 41 years of overall coaching experience and is **1,300-336-1 (.795)** in all matches including men's and women's at Kellogg Community College.

THE PAC-12 CONFERENCE

Built on a firm foundation of academic excellence and superior athletic performance, the Pac-12 Conference renewed its undisputed claim as the Conference of Champions® in 2016-17, becoming the first conference to win 500 NCAA Championships. Beyond the court's and fields, the Pac-12's accomplishments extend into the classrooms across 12 campuses, and outside its traditional geographic footprint into new corners around the world.

En route to becoming the first conference to win 500 NCAA Championships, the Pac-12 led the nation in 2016-17 with 13 NCAA crowns. This haul adds to the an incredible 158 NCAA team titles since 1999-2000 and 300 since 1981-82, the start of women's sports sponsorship, an average of over nine per year. Even more impressive has been the breadth of the Pac-12's success with championships coming in 29 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-12 has led or tied the nation in NCAA Championships in 51 of the last 57 years, the only exceptions being in 1980-81, 1988-89, 1990-91 and 1995-96 when the Conference finished second, and only twice finished third in 1998-99 and 2004-05.

For the 12th straight year, the Pac-12 had the most or tied for the most NCAA titles of any conference in the country, winning at least six every year since 2000-01. No other conference has won double-digit NCAA crowns in a single year, the Pac-12 doing so nine times, including a record 14 in 1996-97.

In over a century of athletics achievements, The Pac-12 has claimed 501 NCAA Championships (297 men's, 174 women's, 30 combined), nearly 200 more than the next league. It was also the first to win 400 championships then surpassed 450 when Colorado and Utah joined the league in 2010-11.

Pac-12 members have won 297 NCAA team championships on the men's side, 81 more than the next-closest conference. Men's NCAA crowns have come at a phenomenal rate for the Pac-12 - 16 basketball titles by six schools, 54 tennis titles, 47 outdoor track & field crowns, and 28 baseball titles. Pac-12 members have won 25 of 47 NCAA titles in volleyball, 43 of 48 in water polo, 30 in skiing, and 24 in swimming & diving national championships.

Individually, the Conference has produced an impressive number of NCAA individual champions. Over 2,000 (2,292) individual crowns have been won by Pac-12 student-athletes over the years with 1,358 by male student-athletes. Student-athletes have also captured 185 individual titles at combined championships (ie., skiing and fencing).

On the women's side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 36 years ago, Pac-12 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 26 occasions, including a current streak of 17-consecutive years, dating back to 2000. Overall, the Pac-12 has captured 174 NCAA women's titles, easily outdistancing the SEC, which is second with 100. Pac-12 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 23 softball titles, 23 tennis crowns, 15 volleyball titles, 18 of the last 28 trophies in golf, and 15 in swimming & diving.

Pac-12 women student-athletes shine nationally on an individual basis, as well, having captured an unmatched 749 NCAA individual crowns, an average of over 20 championships per season, including 30 in 2016-17.

The Pac-12's excellence is further proven in the annual Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cup competition, the prestigious award that honors the best overall collegiate athletics programs in the country. Stanford won an unprecedented 23rd-consecutive Directors' Cup in 2016-17 to lead the Conference. Five Pac-12 member institutions ranked among the top-15 Division I programs, and a remarkable six institutions were in the top 20: No. 1 Stanford, No. 3 USC, No. 8 Oregon, No. 9 UCLA, No. 12 California, and No. 20 Washington. At least five member institutions have been ranked in the top 20 in all but one year of the Director's Cup program, with seven appearing in the top 20 on five different occasions (1998, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2006).

NATIONALLY NOTABLE: Two Trojans have received national recognition for their performances this season. Senior OPP **Brittany Abercrombie** was named the espnW National Player of the Week on Oct. 3 and sophomore OH **Khalia Lanier** was chosen as the AVCA's National Player of the Week on Nov. 14. Lanier is USC's 10th all-time AVCA National Player of the Week award winner and the first since three-time All-American OH **Samantha Bricio** was selected on Nov. 10, 2015.

PAC-12 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Trojans have been selected for the Pac-12's Player of the Week award **five** times this season. Following the opening weekend, sophomore OH **Khalia Lanier** was honored as the Offensive Player of the Week. It was her first-career POW award after having received one Freshman of the Week award in 2016. On Sept. 25, senior OPP **Brittany Abercrombie** (offensive) and junior L **Victoria Garrick** (defensive) were each named Players of the Week for the first times in their careers. Abercrombie became the first Trojan to earn back-to-back selections as the Pac-12 Player of the Week since Samantha Bricio (2015) when she was chosen again on Oct. 2. Women of Troy have garnered weekly honors a total of **73** times, which ranks third in Pac-12 history.

AVCA POLL POSITION: The Trojans opened 2017 unranked in the AVCA's Preseason Coaches Top 25 Poll; the first time that USC has not stood inside the top 25 since the poll's inception in 1982. The program's previous lowest preseason ranking was No. 21 in 1999. USC entered the 2017 rankings in the first regular-season poll (Aug. 28) and were ranked No. 18. Overall, the Trojans have appeared in the poll **493 times** and have held a spot among the poll's top 10 teams **312 times**, which ranks seventh all-time. The Trojans have also held the No. 1 ranking **47 times** previously, which is sixth all-time.

ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMINS: Four Benjamins to be exact. Head coach **Mick Haley** earned his 400th victory at USC on Sept. 16, 2016. As the winningest coach in program history, he is now **430-116** in 17 seasons for a **.788 winning percentage**.



Haley surpassed legendary coach **Chuck Erbe** who logged a 310-121-3 record in 12 seasons as USC's head coach from 1976-77 and 1979-88. Haley's 300th win with Troy also gave him at least 300 wins at three different schools: Kellogg Community College, Texas, and USC.

TOP OF THE BLOCK: Junior MB **Brittany Welsh** broke out for a 12-block performance in USC's 3-2 win over Utah on Oct. 22. Her net play delivered the winning point on a solo block to end the match. The 12 blocks were Welsh's career-high mark and also marked the highest single-match total for a USC player since All-American **Alexis Olgard** had 12 against Washington State on Nov. 17, 2012.

ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS: Women of Troy racked up non-conference tournament awards in the season's opening weekend (Aug. 25-26). Sophomore OH **Khalia Lanier** took home MVP honors and was joined on the USC/LMU All-Tournament Team by junior OH **Alyse Ford** and senior OPPs **Brittany Abercrombie** and **Niki Withers**. Lanier was also chosen to the Bluejay Invitational All-Tournament Team for the second weekend of the season (Sept. 1-2). Lanier, senior MB **Jordan Dunn**, and junior libero **Victoria Garrick** were each named to the UCSB Thunderdome Classic all-tournament team. Lanier and Abercrombie rounded out the non-conference slate with selections to the Maryland Challenge all-tournament team. Lanier was the only Trojan to be chosen to all four pre-conference tournament teams.

TROJAN OLYMPIANS: USC's proud Olympic heritage includes representation by at least one player or coach in all but three Olympic Games since 1964 (1972, 1976, 2004). A total of 19 USC Olympians have competed in women's volleyball and beach volleyball combined. In the last summer games, USC was represented by three-time All-American **April Ross**, who paired with Stanford All-American Kerri Walsh Jennings, to win bronze medals in beach volleyball. Ross also holds a silver medal from the 2012 London Games with partner **Jennifer Kessy**. Trojan All-American libero **Debora Seilhamer** also participated in the 2016 Rio Games where she led Puerto Rico to its historic first-ever berth in the Olympic tourney.

1,000 SHIPS: USC's win over Arizona State on Oct. 5, 2016, was the program's 1,000th all-time victory. The Trojans became just the 17th program in NCAA Division I women's volleyball history to reach the 1K milestone. USC is the owner of six national championships (three AIAW and three NCAA) and has won eight conference crowns including two since the inception of the Pac-12 (2011 and 2015). Head coach **Mick Haley** has led USC to each of its 100-win milestones since the program's 600th victory. The Trojans won their 800th, 900th, and 1,000th all in home matches under Haley's direction.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Trojans have enjoyed the comforts of home to the tune of a **149-31 (.828)** all-time record at the Galen Center. When it comes to the volleyball court, the Women of Troy are less than hospitable to their visitors. The Trojans went 12-1 in home matches in 2011 and completed the 2012 home schedule with a 17-1 mark. In 2007, USC was 19-0 at home on the way to an appearance in the NCAA national semifinal match.

HALL MONITOR: Five Trojan greats were inducted into the first-ever class of the Southern California Indoor Volleyball Hall of Fame (SCIVHOF) last May. Among USC's women's inductees were setter **Debbie Green** (1976-77); and middle blocker **Paula Weishoff** (1980). Among the men, **Dusty Dvorak**, **Steve Timmons**, and **Bryan Ivie** were also chosen to the 25-person inaugural class. This fall, **Debbie Landreth Brown** was named to the 2017 AVCA Hall of Fame Class.

TRANSFER OF POWER: The Trojans will play 2017 with eight players who transferred from other colleges including four new transfers this season alone. Among those transfers are seniors **Niki Withers** (Cal State Fullerton), **Nikki Leonard** (Gonzaga), **Danielle Geiger** (UC Irvine), and **Reni Meyer-Whalley** (Washington); juniors **Madison Murtagh** (San Francisco), and **Brittany Welsh** (Louisiana State); and sophomores **Cindy Marina** (Duke) and **Jenna Adams** (Ohio State). Sophomore opposite hitter **Daley Krage** was bound for Northwestern before she changed course to come to USC, but never played for the Wildcats.

WELCOME, FRESHMAN: Freshman hitter/setter **Brooke Botkin** left her hometown of Pearland, Texas, six months early to enroll at USC in January. She is part of a freshman class that includes MB **Brennan Wilhite**, S **Alexa Gallegos**, and DS **Zoe Gries**. Her three fellow first-year teammates arrived on campus in June and July.

OH, BROTHERS: Three Trojans have brothers with ties to rival UCLA. **Alyse Ford's** brother Aaron Wallace played linebacker for the football team and is now with the NFL's Tennessee Titans. **Niki Withers'** brother Mercedes Lewis is a former Bruin tight

end and a member of the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars. **Victoria Garrick's** brother Jonathan played for the men's golf team and is now a professional golfer.

A LONG TIME (HOME)COMING: 2017 marks the 40th anniversary of the first two national championships won by the Women of Troy. USC claimed AIAW crowns in 1976 and 1977 under head coach **Chuck Erbe**. The '76 Trojans went 34-1 (8-0 in WCAA matches) before defeating rival UCLA in Austin, Texas, for the national title. In 1977, USC was unblemished to finish 38-0 (8-0 WCAA) and defeated Hawai'i in Provo, Utah, to claim the second of back-to-back championships. USC honored members of both squads during the USC-ASU match on Nov. 3, the weekend of Homecoming on campus.

EUROPEAN TOUR: The Women of Troy spent two weeks traveling through five different European countries last May (18-31). The Trojans visited Reykjavik, Iceland; Salzburg, Austria; Bled and Maribor, Slovenia; Vienna, Austria; Prague, Czech Republic; and Munich, Germany. The trip allowed newer members of the team to begin the process of practicing, learning the USC system, and bonding with their new teammates. The Trojans played in eight matches against international competition and earned wins against Denmark, Iceland, and the Czech Republic World University Games team. #1 **THE AIR UP THERE:** The air is a little thinner where OH **Alyse Ford** likes to hang out during matches. The leaper has been measured with a standing vertical jump of 31 inches and can touch 10'6" on an approach.

#2 **SISTER, SISTER:** MB **Madison Murtagh's** elder sister **Mackenzie Murtagh** played volleyball at San Francisco from 2010-13, where Madison also played as a freshman in 2015-16. Following her transfer, Murtagh joined another volleyball sister as she reunited with **Victoria Garrick** at USC, whom she played club volleyball with at Red Rock VBC in Redwood City, Calif.

#3 **SIBLING RIVALRY:** OH **Niki Withers** may be a transfer from Cal State Fullerton, but her choice to play at USC puts her on the other side of a crosstown rivalry with brother **Mercedes Lewis**. Lewis is in his 11th year as a Pro Bowl tight end for the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars and won the Mackey Award as the top college tight end while at UCLA (2002-05), but never beat the Trojans while he wore the Bruin jersey.

#4 **NUTTY VICE:** Libero **Victoria Garrick's** guilty pleasure is Nutella, a delicious hazelnut spread made of skim milk with a hint of cocoa.

#4 **SKIPPING PRACTICE:** Last spring, libero **Victoria Garrick's** TEDx Talk on the need for attention to mental health among student-athletes spread through the volleyball community. Garrick has since advanced her message through her own podcast entitled *Skipping Practice*. In it, she has casual conversations with athletes, celebrities, and other personalities on a bi-weekly basis.

#5 **NET VIOLATION:** MB **Jordan Dunn** is all about preventing net violations. She is a former goalie for the Corona HS soccer team. At 6-4, her reach helped her stop many oppositional net violations during her futbol career.

#5 **GREAT DANE:** **Jordan Dunn** is the descendant of a former Queen of Denmark. The great-great-great-great grandmother of Dunn served as the Danish queen consort in the early to mid-1800s.

#6 **CROSS HER HEART:** OPP **Brittany Abercrombie** spent over 180 volunteer hours as an intern with the American Red Cross this summer. There, she developed a heart and desire to learn more about and pursue a career in the non-profit sector.

#6 **LA COSTA CONNECTION:** OPP **Brittany Abercrombie** is the third player to play for USC from La Costa Canyon HS in Carlsbad, Calif. She follows in the footsteps of three-time All-American libero **Natalie Hagglund**, and All-American opposite hitter **Katie Fuller** who each produced successful careers with the Women of Troy.

#7 **HER MAJESTY:** OH **Brooke Botkin** graduated from high school a full semester early to join the Trojans in the spring of 2017. In the fall of 2016, she was named Homecoming Queen of Pearland HS in Pearland, Texas, a suburb of Houston.

#9 **ALBANIA MANIA:** Sophomore transfer **Cindy Marina** is also a setter for the Albanian Women's National Team. Following USC's European trip this May (18-31), Marina joined her national team for a month of training and competition.

#12 FAMILIAR FACE: Junior transfer **Brittany Welsh** moved back to Southern California from LSU and was with the Women of Troy for three days before she packed her bags to head to Europe for a two-week trip with her new team. Luckily, she has the comforts of a familiar face in junior OH **Alyse Ford** whom she played with at Mater Dei HS.

#13 GRANDIOSE: DS **Raegan LeGrand** is the cousin of former Stanford All-American libero Gabi Ailes. LeGrand is plenty familiar with the Pac-12 having watched her cousin perform in the league growing up. Ailes' shoes are big ones to fill, but LeGrand is up to the task after being named the 2015-16 Gatorade Nebraska Volleyball Player of the Year.

#14 YOU'RE KIDDING: Setter **Reni Meyer-Whalley** knows what it's like to be the middle kid. She is one of nine children and is right in the middle of her eight siblings whose ages range from 14 to 34. In all, she has five brothers; Ryan (34), Zane (25), Quade (24), Hayze (21), and Trae (14); and has three sisters; Kristin (31), Elyza (30), and Stevie (14). Older sister Kristin was a defensive specialist and libero for Boston College (2004-07) and also wore the No. 14.

#14 RECORDS FOR RENI: Setter **Reni Meyer-Whalley** is the daughter of world-renowned record label executive Tom Whalley. Tom Whalley was the chairman and CEO of Warner Bros. Records and served as an artist and repertoire (A&R) executive at Interscope Records. He later started a record label called Loma Vista Records.

#15 FLIP OUT: Setter **Nikki Leonard** is an all-around athlete in all facets. She spent eight years as a gymnast in her youth growing up in Bakersfield, Calif.

#16 FATHER FIGURE: OH **Khalia Lanier** is the daughter of NBA Hall of Famer **Bob Lanier**. He was the first overall pick in the 1970 NBA draft and went on to become an eight-time all-star during his career with the Detroit Pistons (1970-80) and Milwaukee Bucks (1980-84). He entered the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992 and served as an interim head coach of the Golden State Warriors from 1994-95. Khalia lists her father as her biggest sports hero and wears the No. 16 as tribute to his athletic career. Bob Lanier's No. 16 is retired by both the Pistons and the Bucks.

#17 TRAVEL PARTNER: OH **Daley Krage** doesn't go on a trip without travel companion Pery the Platypus. The Pillow Pet version of the Nickelodeon cartoon character has gone on every volleyball trip with her for the past four years.

#20 SCHOOL OF CHOICE: Sophomore transfer DS **Jenna Adams** played her freshman season at Ohio State in 2016. Following her first campaign, she surveyed several schools on the West Coast to consider for her transfer in order to be closer to home in San Mateo, Calif., and eventually selected USC. Adams had plenty of influence in her process with uncles and grandparents who played sports at UCLA, San Diego State, and Pepperdine.

#21 TROJAN TIES: Senior transfer MB **Danielle Geiger** seemed destined to end up at USC. The former Ant eater once played for a Trojan great at UC Irvine under coach **Paula Weishoff** for two seasons before a coaching change took place. If that wasn't sign enough that cardinal and gold could be part of her future, nearly 100 years ago, her grandparents met on the USC campus in 1927.

THE GALEN CENTER

130 years ago, USC's founders envisioned an on-campus arena to further unify the Trojan community. On October 12, 2006, that dream became a reality with the opening of the Galen Center – the new home to USC's basketball and volleyball programs.

In late 2002, a successful banker and longtime USC fan named Louis Galen pledged a \$10 million donation towards the project with his wife Helene. The Galens later added an additional sum of \$25 million and upped their original donation to \$15 million. Their total donation of \$50 million was the final push needed to break ground on the new facility.

On October 31, 2004, ground was officially broken across from the USC campus. Los Angeles City Council members Bernard Parks and Jan Perry were alongside Louis and Helene Galen and a contingency of Trojan supporters for the historic groundbreaking ceremony.

After nearly two years of construction, the first event held in the Galen Center was a women's volleyball match between USC and Stanford on October 12, 2006. A few weeks later, Galen Center hosted its first-ever concert featuring Al Green. The first men's basketball game held at the arena took place on November 16 between USC and South Carolina. A capacity crowd of 10,258 attended a men's basketball game between USC and Arizona on January 31, 2008, to set the venue's all-time attendance record.

Galen Center construction cost an estimated \$147 million, and included the arena, offices, and a state-of-the-art practice facility. The center puts USC teams on an appropriately impressive stage that allows its student-athletes to put their talents on display in the 255,000 square-foot arena. Trojan athletes and visiting teams have access to state-of-the-art locker rooms, weight room, and medical training rooms.

An adjacent 45,000 square-foot pavilion contains additional practice areas with three sections and enough space for four full basketball courts or nine volleyball courts as well as seating for 1,000 spectators. The ground floor of the pavilion wing houses offices for coaches and administrative personnel. Galen Center also has its own ticket office, concession stands, and merchandise stores, and houses the USC Athletic Department Hall of Fame.

Built with the entire community in mind, the Galen Center has opened its doors to youth and high school sporting events, concerts, commencement ceremonies, community events, lectures, meetings, shows, pageants, and more. It has also hosted numerous MPSF, Pac-12, and NCAA championship events including the 2012 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championship. In 2013, the Galen Center served as host of one of four NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Regional Championships.

The Women of Troy are particularly comfortable in the Galen Center. Since its opening, the women's volleyball team is **149-31 (.828)** as the home team. In 2007, the Trojans went undefeated at home (19-0) and advanced to the NCAA semifinal match. In 2010, 2011, 2012, and 2015, USC lost just once at home in each season.
