No. 10 USC SQUARES OFF WITH No. 16 TEXAS A&M First Match-Up Of Ranked Opponents At Galen Since 2007

TONIGHT'S GAME -- The No. 10/No. 10 USC Trojans (4-0) will host the No. 16/No. 19 Texas A&M Aggies (5-0) at the Galen Center on Nov. 26 at 7 p.m. USC has won it last 21 nonconference home games. USC has started the season 4-0 for the third consecutive season, prior to that, USC had not gone 4-0 to start a campaign since the 2001 season.

SECOND TIME'S THE CHARM? -- Tonight's matchup of No. 10/No. 10 USC vs. No. 16/ No. 19 Texas A&M is the first matchup of ranked teams at the Galen Center since 2007. The only other matchup of ranked opponents at the Galen Center came on Dec, 2, 2007, when No. 4 Kansas defeated No. 22/No. 24 USC 59-55.

USC TAKES CARE OF LEHIGH -- Lehigh scored the first basket, but USC would score the next 10 points and never look back in an 88-63 win at the Galen Center on Nov. 22. Bennie Boatwright led USC with 19 points and 11 rebounds, for his third career double-double. Jonah Mathews added 18 points and a career-high seven rebounds. Chimezie Metu just missed out on a double-double with 15 points and nine rebounds. Eleven Trojans scored in the game and all 12 that played, had at least one rebound. USC held Lehigh to 35.7 percent shooting, while making 47.1 percent of its own shots. The Trojans outrebounded Lehigh 49-32 and outscored them 40-22 on points in the paint. The win was USC's 21st consecutive home win over a nonconference opponent. Kahron Ross led Lehigh with a game-high 24 points.

BREAKING DOWN NO. 16/NO. 19 TEXAS A&M -- No. 16/No. 19 Texas A&M (5-0) is coming off an 81-65 home win over Pepperdine on Nov. 24. The Aggies have dominated their opponents with its closest win being by 11 points, a 98-87 win over Penn State in the Legends Classic championship game on Nov. 21. Texas A&M also has wins over then-No. 11 West Virginia (88-65), UC Santa Barbara (84-65) and Okahoma State (72-55). Texas A&M has eight players averaging at least 6.0 points per game, led by junior forward D.J. Hogg at 17.2 points per game. Texas A&M is making 50.8 percent of its shots, while holding its opponents to 38.9 percent. Texas A&M returned eight letterman and four starters from last season's 16-15 team. USC won at Texas A&M 65-63 last season and leads the all-time series, 2-0.

ROAD TRIP TO SMU ON DECK -- USC will play at the SMU Mustangs (5-2) in Dallas, Texas on Dec. 2. SMU is coming off a a tough 63-61 loss vs. Western Kentucky, a game the Mustangs led for nearly 37 minutes. SMU also has a loss to Northern lowa (58-61) and has wins over UMBC (78-67), Lousiana Monroe (83-65), Northwestern State (81-35), Arkansas-Pine Bluff (72-37) and Arizona (66-60). Four Mustangs are averaging double figures in points, led by junior guard Shake Milton at 17.7 points per game. USC leads the all-time series with SMU. 5-1. USC has won the last four meetings, including a 78-73 win at the Galen Center on Nov. 25, 2016 and a 66-65 win in the NCAA Tournament on March 17, 2017.

COMEBACK KIDS AT IT AGAIN -- USC rallied from a 10-point deficit in the win vs. North Dakota State on Nov. 13 and from a 14-point hole in the victory at Vanderbilt on Nov. 19. USC led all NCAA teams during the 2016-17 season with 13 comebacks from 10 or more points down. USC also had 15 wins in games it trailed by nine or more points in the 2016-17 season.

USC KEEPS NONCONFERENCE ROAD WIN STREAK ALIVE -- USC's 93-89 overtime win at Vanderbilt on Nov. 19 extended its winning streak to seven games in nonconference road games. USC last lost on the road in nonconference play at LBSU on Dec. 19, 2013.

STEWART SOARING UP THE CHARTS -- USC senior Elijah Stewart surpassed the 1,000 points scored mark during the win at Vanderbilt on Nov. 19 and now has 1,019 career points scored. Stewart has made seven three-pointers this season to give him 182 career 3-point makes, fourth on USC's all-time list and 21 behind Desmon Farmer, who is third on USC's all-time list with 203. Stewart has also played 106 consecutive games, the most of any player in the Pac-12.

ALL ABOUT ENFIELD -- Andy Enfield, 48, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and has quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. His arrival on campus created a buzz around the program and the results have come immediately with an increase in games won each season, including a school-record 26 victories during the 2016-17 season. He now has a **74-64** record in his five seasons as the USC head coach and is 115-92 in seven seasons as a head coach. His teams have also excelled in the classroom, setting the USC men's basketball record for highest GPA in the fall, spring and both summer sessions. Enfield has brought in four consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2017 class ranking No. 18. USC went 26-10 in the 2016-17 season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. The Trojans won their first 14 games which was tied for the fourth-longest winning streak in school history and was the best USC start since the 1971 season. The 13-0 mark in nonconference regular season action was just the sixth time in school history USC had gone undefeated in the nonconference slate. USC's 47 wins during the 2016 and 2017 seasons were the most by the Trojans in a two-season stretch, breaking the mark of 46 total wins in consecutive seasons done in 2001-02 and 2007-08. USC defeated Providence in a 2017 First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament win since the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SMU before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since also winning two straight in the 2007 Tourney. USC continued to play its up-tempo style and set the school record for assists (550), three-pointers made (283) and shots blocked (190), while recording its most steals as a team (252) since the 2003 season. USC also averaged 4.25 dunks per game (153 total) and had seven players average at least 7.0 points. After bringing in his recruits and establishing his system during the first two seasons, his Trojans took a big leap forward in the 2015-16 season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. Enfield and staff brought in the No. 12-ranked freshman class in 2014-15 and they became key members of the team. McLaughlin was named to the 2015 Pac-12 All-Freshman team before shoulder injuries cut short his season and Elijah Stewart tied a school record by going 10-for-10 from the floor at Boston College. USC went 12-20 during the 2014-15 campaign, with impressive wins at New Mexico and Boston College, as well a Pac-12 Tournament first-round upset win over Arizona State. USC went 11-21 in his first season, but Enfield developed freshmen Nikola Jovanovic and Julian Jacobs into impact Pac-12 players, Jacobs ultimately becoming an All-Conference player. Enfield captivated the nation during the 2013 season as the head coach at Florida Gulf Coast University as he guided the first No. 15 seed into the NCAA Sweet 16 with impressive wins over No. 2 seed Georgetown and No. 7 seed San Diego State and introduced the world to "Dunk City," the nickname for FGCUs high-flying and high-speed offense which often ended with thunderous dunks. In Enfield's two-year run at FGCU, the Eagles won 41 games, advanced to the A-Sun Championship game both seasons - its first two playing at the Division I level. FGCU had a 41-28 record in his two seasons as head coach (2011-12, 2012-13), equaling the win total of the program the previous four seasons. Prior to FGCU, Enfield spent the previous five seasons (2007-11) as an assistant coach at Florida State, helping the Seminoles to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments, including the Sweet 16 in 2011. FSU posted four 20-win seasons during his time on the staff and won 31 ACC games, the secondmost in the conference behind Duke. In 2011 and 2012, FSU became the first program since Georgetown (1991-92) to lead the nation in defensive field goal percentage two straight seasons. Enfield helped FSU sign three straight Top 25 classes. He began his coaching career in the NBA, serving as the shooting coach for Milwaukee (1995, 1996). Then he was an assistant coach with Boston for two seasons (1999, 2000). Enfield played four seasons (1988-91) at Johns Hopkins, scoring a program-record 2,025 points. He also set the NCAA all-divisions career free throw percentage record of 92.5 percent, making 431-of-466 free throws. He was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001.

FACING THE BEST -- The USC men's basketball team is once again taking on an ambitious nonconference schedule for the 2017-18 season, highlighted by a home games against Texas A&M and Princeton and tough road games at SMU and Vanderbilt. USC's nonconference schedule features a potential five games against conference champions, seven games against teams which made the NCAA Tournament last season and 11 games against opponents who finished .500 or better during the 2016-17 seven season. When you include the tough Pac-12 slate, which includes three teams which finished ranked in the top 10 in the country, USC will play a potential 22 games against teams which were .500 or better and 12 games against 2017 NCAA Tournament teams.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station once again will be ESPNLA 710 Radio with Chris Fisher calling the action and Jordan Moore providing sideline commentary. Fisher is in his eighth season as the USC play-by-play announcer. Moore is in his fourth season of providing USC basketball sideline reports. Both Fisher and Moore are USC graduates.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 2nd in the 2017-18 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media, its highest ranking ever. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) Arizona (273), 2.) USC (251), 3.) UCLA (223), 4.) Oregon (203), 5.) Stanford (182), 6.) Arizona State (146), 7.) Utah (129), 8.) Oregon State (125), 9.) Colorado (112), 10.) Washington (71), 11.) California (46) and 12.) Washington State (33).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,567-1,178* in its 112 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 78 of the first 111 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 126-59 in 12 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 70-16 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC has won its last 21 home nonconference games and is 32-2 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach.

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years. One of their biggest involvements the past two years has been with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Light the Night Walk, along with Director of Scouting Martin Bahar to raise money in the name of his sister Maddie who died from the disease in 2009.

STRONG IN THE CLASSROOM - During the first four seasons of the Enfield Era at USC, the men's basketball team has set program's record for grade-point average in the fall, spring and both summer school sessions.

THE 2017-18 USC TROJANS -- USC enters the 2017-18 season with high expectations coming off consecutive NCAA Tourney appearances, a school-record 26 wins and returning virtually its entire roster. USC's top eight scorers from last year's team are back and are joined by Duke transfer guard Derryck Thornton and three highly-touted freshman in guard Charles O'Bannon Jr., wing Jordan Usher and forward Victor Uyaelunmo. The Trojans picked up their record-setting 26th win with their 66-65 victory over No. 11 SMU in the NCAA Tournament. USC won two games in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 2007 season and its 47 total wins over the past two seasons are also the most by the Trojans in consecutive seasons. USC also set school records with most points scored (2,816), three-point baskets made (283), blocked shots (190) and assists (550).

ROSTER BREAKDOWN -- There are a total of 15 players on the 2017-18 USC men's basketball roster. The Trojan team by class are: **Seniors (3)**: Kurt Karis (G), Jordan McLaughlin (G), Elijah Stewart (G); **Juniors (4)**: Shaqquan Aaron (G), Bennie Boatwright (F), Devin Fleming (G), Chimezie Metu (F); **Sophomores (5)**: Harrison Henderson (F), Jonah Mathews (G), De'Anthony Melton (G), Nick Rakocevic (F), Derryck Thornton (G); **Freshmen (3)**: Charles O'Bannon Jr. (G), Jordan Usher (G/F), Victor Uyaelunmo (F).

USC'S ROSTER FEATURES RARE PAIR OF 4-YEAR SENIORS - In senior guards Jordan McLaughlin and Elijah Stewart, USC has its first pair of four-year scholarship seniors since the 2004-05 season when it had five. The seniors on the 2004-05 roster were guards Derrick and Errick Craven, forward Nick Curtis, center Rory O'Neil and forward Gregg Guenther, who was at USC on a football scholarship.

TROJANS HIGHEST PRESEASON RANKING SINCE 1974 -- The USC men's basketball team was ranked No. 10 in the Associated Press (AP) preseason poll on Nov. 1. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Trojan men's basketball team since the 1974-75 season. It is also the highest ranking at any point for the Trojans since finishing the 1991-92 season at No. 8. The Trojans also were ranked No. 11 in the USA TODAY/Coaches preseason poll and are listed as No. 6 in the ESPN Power Index. USC was ranked five weeks in the 2016-17 AP poll, with a highest ranking of No. 22 on Dec. 26. USC is currently No. 10 in both the AP and USA TODAY/Coaches polls.

TROJANS TO PLAY AT THE DIAMOND HEAD CLASSIC - USC will be playing in the Diamond Head Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawai'i from Dec. 22-25. USC's first-round opponent will by Akron on Dec. 22. Akron went 27-9 and won the 2016-17 Mid-American regular season title, but return just one starter and five lettermen from that team. The second-round game will be against either Middle Tennessee or Princeton on Dec. 23. USC's final game of the tournament will be against an opponent from the group of Davidson, Hawai'i, Miami and New Mexico State on Christmas day. USC won the inaugural Diamond Head Classic in 2009, defeating Western Michigan, Saint Mary's and UNLV.

METU, McLAUGHLIN & BOATWRIGHT NAMED TO PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS -- Junior forward Chimezie Metu was one of 32 players named to the preseason watch list for the Oscar Robertson Trophy which recognizes college's top men's basketball player. In addition, Metu and senior guard Jordan McLaughlin were named to the preseason watch list for the the Lute Olson Award, given to the top college player which has played at least two seasons. Metu and McLaughlin have been named to the preseason Top 50 for the John R. Wooden Award as the nation's top player. Metu, McLaughlin & Bennie Boatwright are 3 of 50 candidates for the Citizen Naismith Trophy as the 2018 player of the year. Only 3 schools have 3 or more players on the watch list (Duke-4, USC-3, Arizona-3).

MORE PRESEASON PROPS - USC head coach Andy Enfield was named the preseason National Coach of the Year by College Sports Madness. Also, four Trojans were named to preseason watch lists: Jordan McLaughlin (Cousy Award - Top Point Guard), De'Anthony Melton (Jerry West Award - Top Shooting Guard), Bennie Boatwright (Karl Malone Award - Top Power Forward) and Chimezie Metu (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award - Top Center).

TROJANS BUILTING STEP-BY-STEP -- The Trojans have made steady progress since Andy Enfield became the head coach for the 2013-14 season. The 2016-17 continued the upward trajectory which produced a school-record 26 wins. Also, USC was 10-8 in Pac-12 play last season after being 9-9 in 2016, 3-15 in 2015 and 2-16 in 2014.

USC TO THE NBA -- USC has five former players that have played in NBA games this season: All-Star DeMar DeRozan (Toronto), Taj Gibson (Minnesota), Nikola Vucevic (Orlando), Nick Young (Golden State) and Dewayne Dedmon (Atlanta). Four of the players are starting and the other, Nick Young, comes off the bench for the defending NBA Champion Warriors. I CAN SEE CLEARLY NOW...CLEAR BAG POLICY FOR GALEN -- To provide a safer environment for the public and significantly expedite guest entry into the venue, the Galen Center will be implementing a "clear bag policy" that limits the size and type of bags that may be brought into the arena for all events (one clear bag no larger than 12" x 6" x 12" per person) starting January 1st, 2018. The policy does not affect other items that fans normally bring to a game, which still can be carried in their pockets or openly in their arms. USC rolled to an 84-42 home win in the season opener vs. CS Fullerton on Nov. 10. USC scored the first 6 points of the game and never looked back. USC's 42-point margin of victory was its most in an opener since winning 101-54 vs. San Diego State on Nov. 17, 1998. It was also USC's most points in an opener since scoring 87 to begin the 2012 season. USC held CSUF to 42 points and 23.3 percent shooting in the game. It was the fewest points allowed in an opener by USC since holding Loyola to 41 to begin the 1949 season. The shooting percentage was the lowest by a Trojan opponent since UC Riverside shot 19.0 percent on Dec. 15, 2012. Chimezie Metu led USC with 18 points and 10 rebounds for his 8th career double-double. Five Trojans scored in double figures, 10 different players scored, and all 14 which played had at least one rebound. USC improved to 19-4 in its last 23 home openers. The crowd was USC's largest in an opener since the Galen Center's inaugural game on Nov. 16, 2006. De'Anthony Melton was held out as a precaution due to eligibility concerns.
