NO. 1 USC MEN'S VOLLEYBALL HOSTS NO. 2 BYU IN KEY BACK-TO-BACK MPSF MATCHES

THE FACTS

The No. 1-ranked USC men's volleyball team (10-1 overall, 10-1 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation) begin a 6-match homestand by hosting No. 2 BYU (13-4, 9-3) in a pair of crucial back-to-back MPSF matches on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) in the Galen Center. Both matches start at 7 p.m. The jerseys of former USC All-Americans and Olympians Dusty Dvorak and Celso Kalache will be retired after the Saturday match.

ON THE INTERNET

All of USC's home matches are video-, audio- and data-streamed on USCTrojans.com. Former USC player Dustin Avol will do the play-by-play, while ex-Trojan player and assistant coach Mark Beltran will handle the analyst role. Some road matches will also be audio-streamed on usctrojans.com, with one-time Northeastern player/Winthrop assistant coach Paul Duchesne mikeside.

RANKINGS

USC, which began the season No. 1 in the AVCA Division I-II poll for the second consecutive year, remains in the top spot this week as it has all year (the Trojans also were ranked co-No. 1 in the MPSF coaches pre-season poll). BYU is No. 2 in the AVCA poll.

OPPONENTS

USC trails in its BYU series , 29-18, and the Trojans have lost the last 2 matches.

JERSEY RETIREMENT CEREMONY

Two former Trojans who established the foundation for the success of the USC men's volleyball program--All-Americans Celso Kalache (1977) and Dusty Dvorak (1979-80)--will have their jerseys retired after the Saturday (March 5) match. Kalache, a high-leaping outside hitter, helped USC to its first-ever NCAA title in 1977 (he was MVP of the NCAA tourney) and played for Brazil in the 1972 and 1976 Olympics. Dvorak was the setter on USC's 1977 and 1980 NCAA title teams (the 1979 team was NCAA runnerup), winning MVP honors at the 1980 NAAs, then led the U.S. to a gold medal at the 1984 Olympics. They'll join ex-Trojan greats Tim Hovland and Bob Yoder with banners hanging in the Galen Center commemorating their retired jerseys.

LAST MATCHES

Three Trojans had double kill figures as No. 1 USC went on the road to post a 25-21, 27-25, 25-19 sweep at unranked Cal State Northridge in an MPSF match on Feb. 23. Murphy Troy had a match-best 16 kills (hitting .323) with 6 digs, 4 blocks and 2 aces. Tri Bourne added 14 kills while hitting .524 and Tony Ciarelli had 12 kills and 5 digs. Riley McKibbin had a match-high 11 digs, Henry Cassidy added 8 digs and Steven Shandrick had 5 blocks. USC hit .636 in the match and had 8.5 blocks, while CSUN hit .256 with 5.0 blocks. The Trojans trailed 11-9 in the first set, but ran off 5 unanswered points to forge a lead it never relinquished. USC held an early 9-3 lead in the second set, the Matadors caught up at 20-20 only to fall back behind 24-22 before again knotting the score at 24-24, then the Trojans closed the set with a pair of Ciarelli kills (CSUN hit .462 in the set to USC's .390). USC went on a 4-0 run (with the help of 3 straight Ciarelli kills) to open a 10-6 margin in the final set and was never threatened while hitting .600. On Feb. 25, USC--behind 4 players in double kill figures--fought back to post a 23-25, 25-20, 25-23, 23-25, 15-12 win at No. 6 Long Beach State in a closely-contested MPSF match. It was only the fourth time in 11 matches this

season that the Trojans were extended beyond 3 sets and it was USC's first 5-set victory of 2011. Ciarelli led USC in kills with 17 (hitting .341) and had 13 digs, Austin Zahn hit .524 with 14 kills, Bourne had 13 kills, 12 digs and 3 blocks, Troy had 12 kills, 5 aces, 11 digs and 2 blocks, Shandrick hit .474 with 9 kills and 5 blocks, Cassidy had a career-high 18 digs and Riley McKibbin added 9 digs and 60 assists. USC outthit Long Beach State, .315 to .253, but the 49ers had the edge in blocks (11.5 to 7.0) and aces (8 to 6). Long Beach State got off to a 5-0 start in the first set and USC didn't catch up until 23-23, but a pair of LBSU kills closed the set as the 49ers hit .390 to the Trojans' .324. USC turned up its hitting in the second set (.444) and LBSU cooled off (.107), as the Trojans overcame a 12-7 deficit to tie it at 15-15 and then a bit later scored 5 unanswered points to forge a comfortable 23-18 margin. USC used a 4-point run (behind a pair of Troy aces) to go ahead 17-15 in the third set and held onto that lead. USC scored 5 straight points to tie the fourth set at 15-15, but then at 21-21 the 49ers got a combo block followed by a kill to give LBSU the lead it needed. The final set went back and forth (USC hit .542 to LBSU's .400) until the Trojans scored the match's final 4 points, with Shandrick leading the way with 2 kills and a block assist in that late run.

2011 SUPERLATIVES

At 10-1, USC has its **best overall 11-match start** since 2000 (also 10-1) and its **best MPSF 11-match start** since 1994 (also 10-1)...USC got off to a 6-0 overall and MPSF start in 2011, its **best overall start** since 1991 and its **best league start** since 2000...USC's **6-match winning streak** in 2011 was its longest since 2001 (also 6)...Seven of USC's 10 wins this year have been **3-0 sweeps**, including all 4 home matches...Only 4 of USC's 11 matches in 2011 have **extended beyond 3 sets**...USC has **lost just 7 sets** this year and 6 were by the minimum 2 points...USC has **held opponents to 20 or less points** in 18 of its 33 winning 25-point sets this year...USC's **team hitting percentage** of .376 is well above the USC rally scoring era season record of .316 set in 2009...Seven of the 9 players who have started for USC in 2011 are currently **hitting above .300** (and 6 of them are above .390)...USC began the 2011 season **No. 1 in the AVCA Division I-II poll** for the second consecutive year...The Trojans also were ranked **co-No. 1 in the MPSF coaches pre-season poll**...USC's Jan. 12 win over Cal State Northridge **snapped a 17-match losing streak to the Matadors** that dated to 2004...USC's home match against Long Beach State lasted just 67 minutes, **USC's quickest match in the rally scoring era that began in 2001** (and the fastest since a 63-minute sideout scoring win over UC San Diego in 2000).

MPSF STAT RANKS

USC currently leads the MPSF in hitting percentage (.376), kills (14.46), assists (13.56) and digs (10.28) and is second in opponent hitting percentage (.242), third in blocks (2.60) and fifth in aces (1.08). **Riley McKibbin** is first in the MPSF in assists (12.28) and seventh in digs (2.10), **Henry Cassidy** is second in digs (2.59), **Murphy Troy** is third in points (5.22) and aces (0.44) and ninth in hitting percentage (.398) and **Austin Zahn** is fourth in blocks (1.15) and 10th in hitting percentage (.397).

NEW ASSISTANT COACHES

Helping mold USC into a championship unit is a trio of big-name new assistant coaches: **J.J. Riley**, **Jeff Nygaard** and **Cameron Green**. Riley is a former Pepperdine star setter and then assistant with the Waves' men's and women's programs. Nygaard, a 3-time indoor and beach Olympian and 2-time collegiate MVP while playing on NCAA championship teams at UCLA, has coached

with the Bruins and at Whittier. Green, USC's administrative assistant the past 2 years and a long-time successful club, prep and beach coach, moves up to the volunteer assistant role in 2011.

FALL PRESEASON TOURNEYS

USC had an impressive showing in 2010 fall play. In October, the Trojans went 5-0 in the 6-team USC Fall Tournament, sweeping MPSF opponents UCLA, Cal State Northridge, Long Beach State, UC Santa Barbara and Pacific. Then, in November, USC went 2-1 at the UCLA SAC Tourney, beating both UCLA and Cal State Northridge, but falling to UC Santa Barbara while using the Trojan backups.

TROY

The Trojans' most decorated player is 6-8 senior opposite hitter **Murphy Troy**, a contender for National Player of the Year recognition in 2010. Troy, a cannon-armed 2009 All-American first teamer who won second team honors last year, is starting for his fourth season. He was named AVCA National Player of the Week and MPSF Player of the Week (Jan. 24) after leading USC to wins at No. 7 UC Irvine and No. 15 UC San Diego when he had match-highs in kills in both matches (19 and 15), hit a combined .417 and totaled 16 digs (against UCI, he made a match-turning save: after USC had come back from a 5-point deficit late in the second set and with the score tied 24-24, he made an unbelievable kick save on a ball that allowed USC to get to set point). He repeated as MPSF Player of the

Week the following week (Jan. 31), helping USC to victories at No. 6 UC Santa Barbara (he hit a blazing .632 with 12 kills and no errors in 19 attempts) and No. 4 UCLA (he had a match-best 26 kills while hitting .512 and added 5 aces and 7 digs; in the fourth set, USC scored 9 consecutive points with Troy serving as he had 4 aces in that run, including one off the face of a Bruin passer). In his career, the USC co-captain has 1,683 kills, 578 digs, 217 blocks and 121 aces. His 1,683 kills and his 30 matches with 20-plus kills are USC rally scoring era career records. He is on pace to set the school career rally scoring era standard for aces (124). In 2010, he notched a team-high 481 kills (hitting .255) to go along with 27 aces, 179 digs and 77 blocks while playing both at opposite and outside hitter. His 4.62 kills average was 10th in the NCAA last season.

R. McKIBBIN

Riley McKibbin, a heady 6-2 senior co-captain and All-American candidate (he won third team honors in 2009), is in his third season as USC's steady setter. He has posted 3,650 assists, 583 digs and 132 blocks in his career. Last year, he topped the Trojans in assists (1,384) and digs (235) while also getting 56 blocks. His 13.06 assists average was ninth nationally in 2010.

CIARELLI

Tony Ciarelli, a fiery 6-6 junior honors candidate, is back for his third season in the lineup. The 2009 All-American second teamer and National Freshman of the Year has 1,009 career kills, 449 digs, 176 blocks

and 78 aces. He was named AVCA National Player of the Week and MPSF Player of the Week (Feb. 21) as he helped USC bounce back from its first loss of 2011 with sweeps over No. 5 Stanford (he had a match-best 12 kills while hitting .667 with no hitting errors in 18 attempts and added 5 aces, 5 blocks, no reception errors on 15 attempts and 1 serving error on 24 attempts) and No. 15 Pacific (he had 12 kills on .357 hitting, 2 aces, and no errors on 19 reception attempts and 19 serves). Last year, he had 406 kills, 194 digs and 73 blocks while leading USC in aces (38).

ZAHN

Austin Zahn, a 6-8 senior who has a .415 career hitting percentage (which is above the USC rally scoring record of .399) with 612 kills and 301 blocks, starts at middle blocker for his fourth season. Last spring, he hit at a .387 clip with 174 kills and 87 blocks. He was an All-American third teamer in 2009.

BOURNE/M. McKIBBIN

USC's two most versatile players—6-5 senior **Tri Bourne** and 6-5 sophomore **Maddison McKibbin**—have shared time as the starter at an outside hitter spot in 2011, with Bourne the most recent starter. Both have plenty of experience. Bourne, who has 45 career starts but has battled injuries throughout his USC tenure, saw starting time in 2010 at outside hitter and libero. The younger McKibbin had 13 starts at opposite hitter and libero in 2010 while being named to the MPSF All-Freshman team.

USC HEAD COACH BILL FERGUSON

It took fifth-year USC men's volleyball head coach **Bill Ferguson**, one of the game's top young coaches, just 3 seasons to put the Trojans back on the volleyball map. He has a **72-55 career record** at USC, with a trip to the NCAA Final and an MPSF tourney title. He has gone 7-2 against crosstown rival UCLA.

In **2010** in his fourth Trojan campaign, his team was 16-11 overall and 13-9 in the MPSF (sixth place). USC began the season No. 1 in the AVCA poll (its first pre-season top ranking since 1991 and its first No. 1 ranking anytime since late in 2000). Troy held that top spot for the first 4 polls while off to a 6-1 overall start and 4-0 MPSF start (its best starts since 2000). USC appeared in its fourth consecutive MPSF tourney, its longest streak since going 7 straight from 1989 to 1995.

In **2009**, he was named the **AVCA and VBall Magazine National Coach of the Year** as he guided the Trojans to a 21-11 overall mark (USC's most overall wins since 2001) and a fifth-place tie in the MPSF at 13-9 (USC's most MPSF victories since 1999). USC won its first-ever MPSF Tournament title. His Trojans defeated 7 Top 6-ranked teams. He guided USC into the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1991, where it lost in 5 sets in the final. He also helped USC to the MPSF tourney final for the first time since 1999 and its first back-to-back-to-back appearances in the MPSF

tournament since a 3-year streak from 1999 to 2001, as well as to its highest national ranking (second) since 2000. USC's 5-match early-season winning streak was its longest since 2001. USC posted its first back-to-back wins over BYU since 1997-98 and snapped a 14-match losing skid to the Cougars that stretched to 2001. His Trojans posted a third consecutive victory over UCLA, USC's longest such streak over the Bruins since getting 4 in a row in 1980-81. With a 3-0 win over UC Irvine in the MPSF tourney semis, USC snapped a 10-match losing streak to the Anteaters that stretched to 2004 and was the Trojans' first win at Irvine since 2000. USC also won a pair of pre-season tourneys (in Canada and Hawaii).

In **2008**, he led USC to its most overall and league wins since 2001 and its first back-to-back appearances in the MPSF tournament since a 3-year streak from 1999 to 2001. USC was 13-16 overall and 10-12 for eighth place in the MPSF. His Trojans swept UCLA, the first time USC defeated the Bruins twice in a row since 1991 and the first time since 1990 that USC recorded consecutive wins at Pauley Pavilion. And his squad had a 5-game victory at Pepperdine (USC's first victory in Malibu since 1999, snapping a 9-match losing streak there).

In **2007**, his first season as head coach, he guided USC to its best season in 6 years. The Trojans had their most overall (12-16) and

MPSF (9-13) wins, their highest MPSF finish (eighth) and their first appearance in the MPSF tournament since 2001. USC beat UCLA at Pauley Pavilion for the first time since 2000 and the 3-0 win was its first sweep over the Bruins since 1991. Troy also snapped a 12-match losing streak to Hawaii and did so in Honolulu, its first win there since 1999.

Ferguson, 40, was an assistant at USC in 2006. This is his second stint at USC, as he also was an assistant for 2 years (1997-98).

He was one of the nation's most successful junior volleyball coaches and club directors before returning to USC in the summer of 2005. In his 15 years of coaching experience at the club level (Santa Monica Beach Club, Reebok Palisades Club, Los Angeles Athletic Club and Southern California Volleyball Club), he coached teams to 19 medals (including 12 golds) at national championships and the clubs he directed won 31 medals.

Ferguson played for Palisades High in Pacific Palisades (Calif.), where he was on the 1988 L.A. City championship team. He then took a 2-year hiatus from volleyball. While enrolled at Santa Monica (Calif.) College, he pursued a competitive surfing career.

He and his wife, the former Brenn Larson, who played at Washington State and UCLA, have a newborn daughter, Blake.

SHANDRICK

Starting at the other middle blocker spot is 6-7 junior **Steven Shandrlick**, who has appeared in 41 matches (starting 20) in his career. His .529 hitting percentage in 2011 is well above the USC season record of .494 set by Jason Perkins in 1991. He hit .430 in 2010 with a 1.25 block average (a USC rally scoring era record).

LIBEROS

Andrew Pizula, a 5-10 junior, started 16 matches at libero in 2010 (mostly in the first half of the season) and had 189 digs. His 3.15 digs average last year was a USC record and his 20 digs against Stanford tied a school rally scoring era match record. He helped USC average 11.50 digs per match, a school rally scoring era season mark. But Pizula surrendered the starting libero role in 2011 to 6-3 freshman **Henry Cassidy**, who made the 2010 Hawaii State Division I All-Tournament team for national champion Punahou High in Honolulu, Hi., and was the Co-MVP in the Boys International Youth Division at the 2009 USA Volleyball High Performance Championship. Also in the libero picture are 6-3 junior **Brad Keenan**, who has been hampered by a pair of knee injuries while at USC (he did not see any action last year), and 6-0 redshirt freshman **J.B. Green**, a one-time USC football walk-on wide receiver who last played volleyball in 2009 at Newport Harbor High in Newport Beach, Calif., and was also a member of a gold medal team at the Junior Olympics.

OTHER MIDDLES

Also available in the middle are 6-7 junior **Ian Wright**, who has seen action only in 6 matches at USC (with 2 starts), and 6-9 freshman **Tanner Clayton**, a 2010 All-CIF San Diego Section first teamer at CIF San Diego finalist Rancho Bernardo High in San Diego, Calif., who was on the 2009 USA Boys Youth National Team and 2010 USA Junior National Training Team.

OTHER OUTSIDES

Other outside hitters available are veteran 6-5 senior **Sean Dennis**, who has played in 37 matches (with 22 starts) for the Trojans, plus backup 6-6 sophomore **Steven Mochalski**, who redshirted last year, and 6-5 freshman **Joey Booth**, a 2010 All-CIF Division I second team pick at Corona del Mar (Calif.) High who was named the "Best Attacker" at the 2009 USA Volleyball High Performance Championship.

OTHER OPPOSITES

Two somewhat inexperienced young players—6-4 sophomore **Tucker Peleuses**, who has gotten into just 1 match so far at USC, and 6-5 redshirt freshman **Tanner Jansen**, who has played in just 2 matches in his career (with 1 start)—are the backup opposite hitters.

OTHER SETTERS

A pair of relatively-green 6-3 sophomores—**Jeff Carlson**, who redshirted last year while recuperating from a shoulder injury after seeing action in just 3 matches in 2009, and **Chris Trefzger**, who played briefly in 5 matches last season and then spent this past summer with the USA Men's Junior National A2 team (with Booth and Cassidy)—are battling to be the backup setter. Other setters on the roster are 6-2 redshirt freshman **Tyler Hornacek** and 6-2 freshman **Sean Heitzler** out of Palos Verdes (Calif.) High.

ACADEMICS

Ten Trojans have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above: **Steven Mochalski** (3.46, business administration), **Ian Wright** (3.34, neuroscience), **Sean Dennis** (3.31, business administration), **Steven Shandrlick** (3.26, business administration), **Maddison McKibbin** (3.20, business administration), **Murphy Troy** (3.19, physics), **Andrew Pizula** (3.16, business administration), **Riley McKibbin** (3.12, business administration), **Tony Ciarelli** (3.11, history) and **Henry Cassidy** (3.10, business administration). Troy made the 2009 Academic All-District 8 second team as well as the 2009 and 2010 Academic All-MPSF squads, while Riley McKibbin, Ciarelli and Pizula made the 2010 Academic All-MPSF team and Dennis made the 2009 Academic All-MPSF team.

VOLLEYBALL SCHOOL

Besides the 4 NCAA crowns (1977-80-88-90) that USC's men have won, the Women of Troy have captured 6 national volleyball titles. USC's women won the AIAW trophy in 1976, 1977 and 1980, and the NCAA crown in 1981. Then, current coach Mick Haley's 2002 and 2003 Women of Troy squads captured the NCAA titles.

RELATIVELY SPEAKING

Joey Booth's grandfather is Peter Ueberroth, who played water polo at San Jose State, then later became president of the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee, commissioner of Major League Baseball (1984-89) and chairman of the U.S. Olympic Committee...**Tony Ciarelli's** parents were standout players and then coached at his high school: father, Rocky, played at Long Beach State (1977-79) before becoming an assistant coach there (he also played some pro beach volleyball in the 1980s and competed in numerous indoor USVBA Opens) and was a volunteer assistant coach at USC (2009-10), while his mother, Cammy (Chalmers), played at UCLA (1979-82) and then won 14 pro beach tournaments in the early 1990s (mainly with Holly McPeak)...**Tyler Hornacek's** father, Jeff, played 14 years as a guard in the NBA (1987-92 with the Phoenix Suns, 1993-94

with the Philadelphia 76ers and 1995-2000 with the Utah Jazz), with career averages of 14.5 points and 4.9 assists (he was a 1992 NBA All-Star), after leading Iowa State to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen in 1986...Brothers **Riley and Maddison McKibbin** have a pair of relatives who played volleyball at USC--uncle, Owen McKibbin (who lettered in 1983-84-86-87, as the Trojans finished second at the NCAA Championships his final 2 seasons), and aunt, Claudia McKibbin (a letterwinner on the Women of Troy's 1980 national championship team)...**Steven Mochalski's** father, Dave, was a starting middle blocker on UCLA's 1982 NCAA championship team (going 29-0) who was named to the NCAA All-Tournament team and All-Conference second team that season, while his brother, Eric, is a freshman outside hitter at Stanford...**Murphy Troy's** brother, Phinney, was an offensive tackle at Missouri...**Austin Zahn's** brothers played college basketball: Andrew at Arizona in 2002 and Biola in 2003 (he then played professionally in Japan) and Adam at Oregon (2004-07), who then played professionally in Norway and Jordan...Head coach **Bill Ferguson's** father, Tom, was a 2-time (1961-62) All-American at Santa Monica College, which won the USVBA college national championship both years...The wives of head coach **Bill Ferguson** (Brenn Larson, Washington State and UCLA) and assistant coach **J.J. Riley** (Emily Rothman, Pepperdine) played collegiate volleyball.

ARTLETICS

Some of **Murphy Troy's** artwork is on display at the 2011 "Artletics" on-campus exhibit that features the works of 20 USC student-athletes. The free exhibit is in the Galen Center's Hall of Fame area through March 10 during USC athletic events. Last year, **Tri Bourne** had his artwork displayed at the 2010 "Artletics."

2012 SIGNEES

The Trojans signed 3 talented high school seniors to letters of intent for the 2012 season: **Micah Christenson**, a 6-5 setter from Hawaii, **Cristian Rivera**, a 6-6 outside hitter from Puerto Rico, and **Robert Feathers**, a 6-8 middle blocker from Loyola High in Los Angeles.

--Christenson plays for Kamehameha-Kapalama High in Honolulu, Hi., where he earned Volleyball Magazine High School All-American first team, All-State first team and All-Conference first team honors as a 2009 sophomore. He was All-Conference first team as a 2008 freshman. Kamehameha was the 2009 and 2010 state Division I runnerup and he was named to the All-Tournament team both years. He was a starter on the U.S. Junior National Team that won a gold medal in the 2010 NORCECA Junior Championship in Canada in August, earn-

ing his team a berth in the 2011 World Junior Championship. He was named Best Setter of that tourney. He also started on the U.S. Youth National Team in 2009 and 2010; the 2009 squad finished 10th at the FIVB Boys Youth World Championship in Italy (he was the youngest starting setter to ever compete for the U.S. on a national team) and was named USA Volleyball's 2009 Indoor Team of the Year, while the 2010 squad won a silver medal at the NORCECA Youth Championship in Mexico and will participate in the 2011 World Youth Championship. His Outrigger club team was the silver medalist at the 2010 USA Volleyball Junior Olympics in the Under 18 Open Gold Division and he made the All-Tournament team. In 2008, he captained the U.S. High Performance Select A1 Red team. He also played basketball at Kamehameha, which won the state Division I championship when he was a 2009 sophomore and reached the state title game in 2010 as a junior. He was the 2010 Gatorade Hawaii Player of the Year and Interscholastic League of Honolulu Co-Player of the Year, and made the Honolulu Star Bulletin All-State Feb 15 team (and Co-Player of the Year) when he averaged 16.4 points and 7.3 rebounds. He made the 2009 Honolulu Advertiser All-State and Honolulu Star Bulletin All-State Feb 15 teams. His father, Robert, played basketball at Hawaii-Hilo and his mother, Charlene, played volleyball at Hawa'i-Hilo, where she won 3 national championships and was named a 2-time All-American.

--Rivera plays for Colegio San Jose in Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico, which won the 2009 and 2010 Puerto Rico High School Athletic Alliance championships. He was a starter on the Puerto Rican Junior National Team that won a bronze medal by beating 3-time defending champion Cuba in the 2010 NORCECA Junior Championship in Canada in August, earning his team a berth in the 2011 World Junior Championship. He also started on Puerto Rico's Youth National Team that will participate in the 2011 World Youth Championship. He also made the All-Tournament team at the 2010 and 2009 USA Volleyball Junior Olympics, in the Under 17 and 16 Open Gold Divisions, respectively. His Halcones de Torrimar club team was the silver medalist at the 2009 Junior Olympics in the 16 Open Gold Division and the bronze medalist at the 2008 tourney in the 15 Open Gold Division.

--Feathers made the 2010 All-CIF Division I first team as a junior as Loyola won the CIF Southern Section Division I title.
