THIS WEEK

Top-ranked USC is now embedded in a run of conference competition with four MPSF games left on the regular-season docket. This week, the undefeated Trojans (24-0, 2-0 MPSF) carry their record win streak of 51 consecutive victories into an MPSF matchup against No. 4 Arizona State (18-4, 2-1). The Trojans and the Sun Devils are set to clash at 12:30 p.m. on Saturday (April 1) at USC's Uytengsu Aquatics Center. The game will be televised on Pac-12 Network, Pac-12 Los Angeles and Pac-12 Arizona with Jason Knapp and Adam Krikorian on the call.

USC IN THE RANKINGS

USC opened 2016 ranked No. 2 in the national preseason poll and in the MPSF preseason poll. After spending the first seven weeks of the season at No. 2, USC climbed to No. 1 following the Trojans' win over top-ranked Stanford on Feb. 26. USC remains the top-ranked team in the land entering this 10th week of competition.

SCOUTING ASU

The No. 4 Sun Devils are 18-4 overall and 2-1 in MPSF play after beating Cal 7-6 last week. Lena Mihailovic is ASU's top scorer with 41 goals to date, while goalie Mia Rycraw is averaging 9.84 saves and 6.73 goals-against per game. USC is 25-2 all-time against the Sun Devils with wins in the last five meetings. USC beat ASU 12-2 earlier this season in the title match at the Triton Invitational. Last year, USC won 6-3 at the UCI Invitational and 8-3 during MPSF play in Tempe. USC's last loss to ASU was a 10-9 sudden-death decision in the first round of the 2014 MPSF Tournament.

GETTING STREAKY

The USC women set a new national women's record win streak on March 16, winning their 47th straight game in a 15-2 victory over Indiana in a neutral matchup in Honolulu – breaking the previous women's record that had been set by UCLA from 2007-09. The Trojans have since extended the streak to 51 in a row – dating back to the final game of 2015 and including an undefeated 2016 to add to this season's 24-0 mark so far. With the Trojans' overtime win over then-No. 1 Stanford at the Barbara Kalbus Invitational, the USC women broke the USC men's best winning run of 44 in a row (2005-06). The UCLA men hold the longest collegiate water polo win streak with 57 in a row, held from 2014-16.

LAST WEEK

USC had a victorious return to its home waters of Uytengsu Aquatics Center last week, pinning up three wins to extend its record win streak out to 51 in a row. In a televised contest against No. 10 Princeton, the top-ranked Trojans rolled up a 12-3 win over the Tigers behind a five-goal outburst from freshman **Maud Megens**. Two days later, senior **Brigitta Games** paced the Trojans to back-to-back wins in a doubleheader. Games rifled in a career-high seven goals to help USC to a 19-3 MPSF win over No. 14 San José State before turning right around and dishing out four more goals in a 21-5 win over No. 18 Hartwick. Fellow senior **Stephania Haralabidis** delivered seven goals for the Trojans during that doubleheader, working her way to a takeover of the No. 2 all-time scoring position in serving up a hat trick against the Hawks. She now holds 256 career goals to move ahead of former No. 2 Aniko Pelle. Following their powerful performances in last week's trio of wins, both Games and Megens picked up conference honors. **Brigitta Games** was named the MPSF Player of the Week, and **Maud Megens** was selected MPSF Newcomer of the Week. It's the second career pick for Games, and the first of her young Trojan career for Megens.

BIG WINS IN IRVINE

The nation's best teams tangled in Irvine at the Barbara Kalbus Invitational, and the Women of Troy emerged as the champion in another key tournament with a winning run at the 2017 event. After pinning up its first shutout win of the year to open the tourney, topping No. 20 LMU 14-0 behind a four-goal game from **Ioanna Haralabidis** and 10 saves from Amanda Longan, USC closed down group play with a 12-4 win over No. 7 Hawai'i. Haralabidis added four more in that one, while goalie **Victoria Chamorro** had a career-high 17 saves to get USC through to the semifinals. There, the Trojans would face rival UCLA for the first time this year, and USC was able to shrug off an early 3-2 deficit and more out ahead of the Bruins for a final 10-9 victory to seal a trip to the title match once again. In a rematch of the 2016 NCAA Championship game, USC was up against top-ranked Stanford, and the game lived up to its billing. The Cardinal tied up the game at the end of the third quarter and then again later in the fourth to bring up overtime. There, USC would issue back-to-back scores to take a lead in the first overtime frame. In

the second, Stanford struck first, but USC struck last when it mattered, netting a blast from Haralabidis to go up 10-9 with five seconds left, and USC would fend off the Cardinal for the win. **Brianna Daboub** led the scoring charge for USC with three goals, while Longan gathered in 12 saves to help keep the Cardinal at bay. For her 10 goals logged at the tournament, including that OT game-winner, **Ioanna Haralabidis** picked up her first career selection as **MPSF Player of the Week**. Along the way, Haralabidis also moved up to rank as USC's No. 10 all-time scorer.

VIC PICKS UP MPSF ACCOLADES

Junior goalie **Victória Chamorro** gave up just four goals and accumulated 19 saves in her two appearances in the cage for the Trojans at the Triton Invitational. For her stellar efforts on the defensive end, Chamorro picked up her first career selection as **MPSF Player of the Week** on Feb. 14. In a complete-game effort in the championship match against #5 Arizona State, Chamorro collected 12 saves while allowing just two goals to the Sun Devils in a 12-2 championship win for the Trojans. The previous day, she checked in for three periods of work against #17 San Diego State and made seven saves in that stretch while allowing just two goals through by the Aztecs. Chamorro's effort in the cage helped USC successfully defend its Triton Invite title and improve to 14-0 on the year. With 354 career saves to her name to date, Chamorro ranks No. 6 all-time on the Trojans' career saves list. She's gone big this season with several powerful performances, collecting 11 saves in a single half of work at UCSB, and gathering a career-high 17 saves in a win over Hawai'i already this year.

STEPH STRIKES IT BIG AT WINTER INVITE

Stephania Haralabidis set a new career high and tied the MPSF single-game record with nine goals scored in the final game of the Winter Invitational back in January, helping to earn the senior USC's first **MPSF Player of the Week** award of 2017. Haralabidis' nine-goal outburst came in USC's 19-5 win over No. 9 host UC Santa Barbara, marking the Trojans' fifth straight win at the event. Haralabidis let all USC scorers with 17 goals totaled across those five games. She opened the season with a single goal scored in a 17-3 win over No. 8 Michigan on day one. On the second day, Haralabidis scored twice in a 22-1 win over Cal Baptist and punched in two more in a 16-3 win over CSUN. The final day was Haralabidis' big one, as she had a hat trick in a 13-8 win over No. 5 Hawai'i before the record nine-goal explosion against UCSB.

BY THE NUMBERS

Through the first 24 games of 2017, undefeated USC has outscored opponents 395-94. Senior **Stephania Haralabidis** is the top scorer to date with 71 goals – sixth most in a single season by a Trojan and giving her 256 career goals to lock her in at No. 2 on USC's all-time scoring chart. Behind her on the 2017 scoresheet sits freshman **Maud Megens** with 46 goals to date, followed by seniors **Ioanna Haralabidis** and **Brigitta Games** with 43 goals apiece. On the defensive end, three goalies have checked into the cage to date. Sophomore **Amanda Longan** has logged minutes in 16 games, averaging 11.14 saves and 4.71 goals-against per game. Junior goalie **Victória Chamorro** has appeared in 12 games and averages 10.22 saves and 3.0 goals-against per game. Freshman **Holly Parker** has also capped up in her first year as a Trojans, making 16 saves and allowing just seven goals in her eight appearances. The Trojan defense has opponents silent in at least one period of play in 19 different games

while accumulating a grand total of 40 shutout periods this season so far.

ON THE RISE

Greek twins **Stephania Haralabidis** and **Ioanna Haralabidis** are climbing in the USC record books. Stephania opened 2016 ranked as USC's No. 8 all-time career scorer. On March 25 vs. Hartwick, she took over as USC's No. 2 scorer, and she now holds 256 career goals to her name. Ioanna, meanwhile, started out 2017 at No. 20 in the record books. After 24 games, she has catapulted to No. 10 all-time, holding 161 career goals to date. On March 4, another USC senior broke into the century club at Troy, as **Brigitta Games** scored her 100th career goal in a win at CSUB. Games remains on the climb, now seated at No. 22 all-time with 213 career goals. While those three are rising in the ranks on the offensive end, two Trojans are making their marks on the USC career saves sheet. Junior **Victória Chamorro** – who set a USC freshman goalie record with 207 saves in her first season at Troy – now boasts 366 career saves to rank No. 6 on the career saves charts and sit 11 away from the No. 5 position. Sophomore **Amanda Longan** is a spot behind, sitting at No. 7 all-time with her 287 saves and counting.

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS

USC's leadership corps boasts a veteran pair, with senior **Avery Peterson** and junior **Brianna Daboub** standing tall as USC's team captains for the second straight season. Both All-Americans and All-MPSF Honorable Mention recipients, they also are both MPSF Scholar-Athletes. And of course, they captained the Trojans to an undefeated 2016 season to claim their first national crowns. With 73 career goals to her name, Peterson stands out as a 2-meter power for the Trojans. Daboub has rung up 84 goals to date. Goalie **Amanda Longan** also has picked up a captain's role this season, standing out as a vocal defensive leader for the Trojans in her sophomore season.

BRINGING BACK THE BALANCE

USC's 2017 roster looks strikingly similar to last year's NCAA Championship crew. The Trojans' overall balance is back, with all six top scorers returning, along with an All-American pairing of goalies in sophomore **Amanda Longan** and junior **Victória Chamorro** back in the cage. In all, the returning Trojans accounted for 88 percent of the scoring last year, while Longan and Chamorro combined for an average of 8.8 saves and 4.7 goals-allowed per game in 2016.

THE VETS

Senior captain **Avery Peterson** is one of five seniors on the roster for 2017, joined by fellow All-Americans **Brigitta Games**, **Ioanna Haralabidis** and **Stephania Haralabidis**, along with **Nikki Stansfield**. A further depth charge of veteran talent with winning experience comes from juniors **Brianna Daboub**, **Annika Jensen** and **Hayley McKelvey**. All with NCAA Championship experience, all are warriors, and all are fiercely devoted to their team and the task at hand.

NETMINDERS

On last year's All-American list, there was one USC freshman standing tall among them. At 6-foot-2 **Amanda Longan** was an impact player as soon as she splashed down at Troy, Longan quickly made herself at home as half of an impressive goalkeeping tandem for the Trojans – sharing time with 2015 All-American and Brazilian Olympian **Victória Chamorro**. Now a junior-sophomore goalkeeping tandem, Chamorro and Longan are yet another expression of the youth movement making waves alongside USC's juniors and

seniors. They have some backup this year as well, with freshman **Holly Parker** having proven herself fully capable of stepping into the cage as she has logged 16 saves and allowed only seven goals in her 10 periods of action so far.

THE NEW CREW

When it comes to this year's freshman class, there are already several new faces that are forcing opponents to take notice. Dutch import **Maud Megens** has emerged as the headliner so far. She tallied 10 goals in her first five games of action to stand as USC's third leading scorer after that first week of work. **Denise Mammolito** also made noise in week one, punching up six goals, while fellow freshmen **Elise Stein**, **Sawyer Belville** and **Kaylee Brownsberger** also notched their first career goals as Trojans in those first days of competition at the UCSB Winter Invitational.

TRITON TITLISTS

USC rolled its way to another Triton Invitational title last month, beating four teams to claim the tournament championship on Feb. 12 in La Jolla. Led by five goals from **Maud Megens**, USC opened up with an 18-2 win over Santa Clara to start the first day of play. That afternoon, **Brigitta Games** and **Stephania Haralabidis** each had hat tricks to help lift USC to a 17-4 win over San Diego State. The next day, USC put its silencers on in the fourth period of both contests to top off another run to a Triton Invitational championship. In the semifinal round against No. 6 Michigan, USC worked out ahead of the Wolverines to notch a 9-5 win and move on to the title match. There, the Trojans poured on a run of eight consecutive goals, rendering the Sun Devils scoreless as USC crafted a 12-2 lead entering the final minute of the game. One last big save from goalie **Victória Chamorro** – her 12th save of the game – wrapped up the resounding victory for the Trojans, while **Haralabidis** finished off a hat trick during the surge to victory.

2017 TROJANS AT A GLANCE

The defending national champions are coming off an undefeated run through 2016, with head coach **Jovan Vavic** at the helm for the 23rd season. The USC women are looking to claim back-to-back national titles for the first time in program history. Their 13th consecutive NCAA appearance was a fortunate one, as the Trojans topped off 2016 by raising the NCAA trophy. Picked No. 2 in the National and MPSF Preseason Polls, the Trojans weigh in just behind top-picked Stanford for the second straight season. USC returns all six 2016 All-Americans, including Cutino Award winner **Stephania Haralabidis** and Cutino finalist **Brigitta Games**. In addition to those two powers – both seniors this year – USC has seven All-Americans on the roster for 2017. Both All-American captains, **Brianna Daboub** and **Avery Peterson**, return, having combined for 63 goals last year. Peterson's career-best 35 goals in 2016 was matched by **Ioanna Haralabidis**. In all, USC returns 12 members of last season's 16-player NCAA roster. •

men -- and has coached 12 Cutino Award winners. The USC women's undefeated run through the 2016 season brought Vavic the 14th national championship (nine men's and five women's) won during his tenure at USC. Vavic has the most team titles of any USC head coach in history.

Vavic's 2016 women's team reached the NCAA Tournament for the 13th straight season. What's more, the Women of Troy were able to finish off the program's second undefeated season, going 26-0 en route to an epic win in the 2016 national championship game. That perfect season improved Vavic's overall career record on the women's side to 516-142 (.784) as he now enters his 23rd season as the USC's women's head coach.

In the calendar years of 2013 and 2010, Vavic swept both sides of the game, winning national championships with the women in the spring and following that with men's titles in the fall of those years. In 2013, the Women of Troy won the longest NCAA women's championship game in history, beating Stanford 10-9 in triple sudden death to claim USC's fourth national championship on the women's side, while finishing with a 27-1 overall record. The USC men would follow with a historic feat of their own, winning an unprecedented sixth straight national championship in claiming the 2013 crown. In 2010, the USC women and men went back-to-back as Vavic followed 2010 National and MPSF Coach of the Year awards on the women's side with 2010 National and MPSF Coach of the Year with the men in leading the Trojan men to their third consecutive national championship.

Following the USC men's 2009 NCAA title and the USC women's run to the 2010 national championship, Vavic saw two Trojans sweep the Cutino Awards for the third time in his career, as J.W. Krumpholtz and Kami Craig went back-to-back as the 2009 and 2010 Cutino Award winners following the USC women's run to the 2010 NCAA Championship. The first Trojan pair to sweep the awards was Juraj Zatovic and Lauren Wenger in 2006.

Since 1999 when the program was fully funded, Vavic's record is 451-75 (.857), including 13 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances. Between 2003 and 2010, Vavic was named either MPSF or National Coach of the Year (or both) every year but one. His 2004 women's team won the national championship and became the first team in NCAA Championship history to go undefeated (29-0). In 1999, 2004, 2010, 2013 and 2016 Vavic was named the women's National and MPSF Coach of the Year.

Vavic oversaw the team's move from Division II in 1995 to Division I in 1996. He guided USC to its first-ever Division I National Collegiate Championships appearance in 1997 and a seventh-place national finish while the 1998 team took fifth nationally. In 1999, USC won the national championship, and Vavic was named the National Coach of the Year and the MPSF Coach of the Year. The 2000 squad added another strong showing, finishing second nationally. Vavic came to USC in 1992 as an assistant men's water polo coach, joined John Williams as co-head coach in 1995 and took over the men's program in 1999 after Williams retired. He and Williams were named National Coaches of the Year in 1998 after leading USC to its first-ever national championship. They were also named MPSF Co-Coaches of the Year in 1996 after leading USC to the conference title. In fact, in the 1998-99 season, Vavic did something no other coach has accomplished as his teams won three national championships. Besides capturing the 1998 men's and 1999 women's titles, his 1999 men's club team won the Men's Senior National Club Championship. In 21 seasons at the helm of the USC men's program, Vavic has improved his career coaching record on the men's side to 494-82 (.858) with national championships won in 1998, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013.

Vavic, a native of Yugoslavia, spent the 1990 season as an assistant men's coach at UCLA. Previously, he coached three seasons (1987-1990) at Palos Verdes (Calif.) High, where he led Palos Verdes to two undefeated league seasons (1987-89). Vavic also served as assistant coach to the U.S. team at the 1995 World University Games, and was the head coach of the team in 2003.

In November 2012, Vavic was named interim head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team, and led Team USA to World Championship qualification with success at the 2013 UANA World Aquatic Championship Qualification Tournament in Canada.

Vavic graduated from UCLA in 1992 with a bachelor's degree in history. He and his wife, Lisa, have four children: Nikola, Monica, Marko and Stefan. Nikola and Monica both played water polo for their father at USC and both won national championships with their respective USC water polo teams.
