If the USC men's volleyball team can show as much improvement in Year Three of the **Jeff Nygaard** Era as it did in Year Two, good things could be in store in 2018.

In 2017, the Trojans went 14-14 overall to double their win total from Nygaard's 2016 debut season as head coach. USC, which tied for sixth in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation with an 8-10 mark, also advanced to the MPSF Tournament in 2017 after a year's hiatus.

Troy is hoping the momentum of the second half of last season carries over to the 2018 campaign. After dropping 7 of their first 9 matches last spring, the Trojans finished strong by winning 8 of their final 10 contests. USC gave NCAA Tournament participant Long Beach State 1 of its 4 losses of 2017 and Troy also beat 4 other Top 10 teams.

Although program stalwarts Lucas Yoder (the 3-year starting outside hitter led the nation in kills at 4.85 and points at 5.22 in 2017 while making All-American second team and All-MPSF first team) and Andy Benesh (the 4-year starting middle blocker was sixth nationally in hitting percentage in 2017 at .429) have graduated, 12 players from last year's roster return, including 4 starters and the libero. However, there are just 7 upperclassmen on USC's 21-player roster, including only 2 seniors.

"We will be a young team this year, but I expect growth and improvement similar to what we have had the past 2 years," said Nygaard. "For us, the challenge in 2018 will be cultivating experience. We will rely on contributions from many players who don't have much MPSF experience. We will improve as a team as they gain experience."

"We had a very productive fall. The entire team gained in physicality and volleyball IQ. Our players are devoted to the process of attaining success and I expect that to continue throughout this season as we make our run to post-season play."

The returning starters, who own 124 career starts between them, are skilled.

Gert Lisha, a 6-6 senior from Albania, returns as the starting setter. He started 12 matches in 2016 and 26 last year when he was second nationally in assists (10.85). He also was second among the Trojans in 2017 in digs (124), blocks (44) and aces (15).

"Gert brings international experience and great passion to our team," said Nygaard. "He has a vision for where he wants to take his volleyball career and is working hard to attain it."

Connor Inlow, a 6-6 junior middle blocker and 2018 team co-captain, had 22 starts last year, hitting .409 with 93 kills, 27 blocks and 40 digs.

"Connor earned the right to be a captain with his hard work and his actions on and off the court," said Nygaard. "He is the embodiment of the ideal Trojan."

Gianluca Grasso, a 6-2 junior outside hitter from Brazil (his parents played for the country's national teams), joined USC in late January of last season as a junior college transfer and quickly earned a starting job. A 15-match starter, he posted 189 kills while hitting .268 and added 96 digs and 24 aces. A back injury could slow him early in the 2018 season.

"Gianluca has demonstrated tremendous resiliency overcoming any obstacle in front of him," said Nygaard. "We expect big things from him."

Lucas Lossone, a 6-8 sophomore whose mother played at USC, emerged as the starting opposite hitter midway through 2017 (earlier, he had come off the bench as a middle blocker). The 16-match starter had 139 kills (hitting .259), 61 digs and 31 blocks last year.

"Lucas has embraced the challenge of becoming more consistently physical in his play," said Nygaard. "He is thirsty to improve daily and he shows the desire to have our team succeed."

Matt Douglas, a 5-10 junior who started 26 times at libero in 2017, had a team-best 233 digs and only 37 reception errors in 590 attempts last season.

"Matt brings a lot of MPSF-level experience to our team," said Nygaard. "He also now understands what it takes to get to the next level."

Five other Trojans return with some starting experience to their names. There's 6-8 junior outside hitter **Ryan Moss** (he also can play opposite hitter and middle blocker), who has 13 career starts, including 6 times as a middle in 2017 when he hit .330 with 53 kills and 23 blocks; 6-6 senior opposite hitter **Jon Rivera** of Puerto Rico, who in his career has 22 starts (mostly in 2016), 212 kills, 93 digs, 37 blocks and 11 aces; 6-4 sophomore opposite hitter **Aaron Strange** (his sister starred on a pair of USC's national championship beach squads), who started 13 times in the first half of 2017 and ended with 95 kills, 65 digs and 27 digs; and 6-3 soph setter **Matt Faraimo**, who started twice last spring.

USC also welcomes back 6-5 junior outside hitter **Jack Wyett**, who returned to the program after a 2-year absence (he started once in 2015) and is now a team co-captain.

"Ryan has handled more than his share of adversity and come through it with strength, consistency and maturity," said Nygaard. "I expect great things from him and he expects even more. Jon is a passionate, hard-working veteran who gives his all for our team. Aaron can be unstoppable when he puts his game together. He is a physical specimen who is learning what consistency in his play can do for the team's success. Matt is well-respected by his teammates and is learning how to be successful on and off the court the Trojan way. Jack is part of our team for all the right reasons and we're glad to have him back. He's a very physical player."

Also back from last year are 2 players who have yet to see action at USC: a 6-8 sophomore middle blocker **Tyler Resnick** and 5-8 redshirt freshman libero **Michael Chang**. Resnick could be hampered by a shoulder injury in 2018.

"Tyler has earned our team's respect with his hard work, growth mindset and ability to raise our team's culture and performance," said Nygaard. "Michael is a driven, team-oriented player who is a great role model on and off the court."

Nygaard brought in a large and talented class of 9 freshmen, including 2 players—6-10 middle blocker **Sam Lewis** of Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High (USC's second tallest player ever) and 6-2 setter **Chris Hall** of Notre Dame High in Sherman Oaks, Calif.—who were starters on the 2016 and 2017 USA Boys Youth National Teams, another—5-11 libero **Cole Paxson** of Laguna Beach (Calif.) High—who joined them on the 2016 USA Boys Youth National Team and another—6-4 outside hitter **Chris McBee** of Palos Verdes High in Palos

Mitch Haly, a 6-7 middle blocker from Corona del Mar (Calif.) High, earned 2017 prep All-American honors and was the All-CIF Division 1 Player of the Year, but a back injury could slow him in 2018. Also a football and basketball player in high school, he has a brother who played volleyball at Stanford.

Outside hitters **Clay Dickinson** of Corona del Mar (Calif.) High, who is 6-7, and 6-7 **Noah Franklin** of Huntington Beach (Calif.) High joined Lewis, Hall, Paxson, Fauntleroy and Haly on the Volleyballmag.com Fab 50 list last year.

"Sam has the potential to be a dominant middle blocker not only collegiately, but internationally," said Nygaard. "As he grows and matures as a player, the weight of expectations placed on him will get easier. Chris has a maturity and high volleyball IQ that raises the level of our team's play each day. Cole has benefited from international competition and brings great experience despite his youth. Christopher is a natural passer and a very good blocker who has a ton of upside once he embraces the level of consistency needed to succeed.

"Kyle is very coachable, has a workman's mentality and great drive and has unlimited potential. Billy

Verdes Estates, Calif.—who was an alternate on that 2016 USA Boys Youth National Team (his brother played on a pair of USC's NCAA champion water polo teams). Lewis and Hall were 2017 prep All-Americans and Hall was the All-CIF Division 2 Player of the Year.

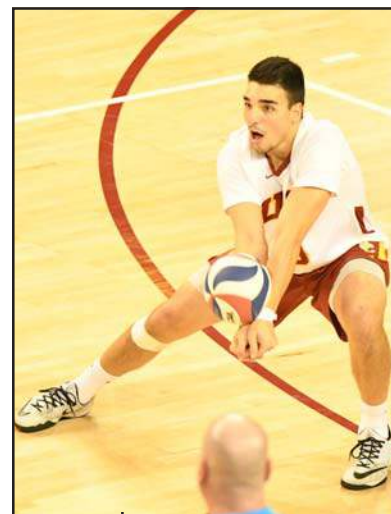
Two other newcomers can play multiple positions: 6-8 **Kyle Gear** of Gates Chili High in Rochester, N.Y., who is available at middle blocker and opposite hitter (his brother plays for Penn State), and 6-7 **Billy Fauntleroy** of New Trier High in Winnetka, Ill., a 2017 prep All-American who can be used at outside hitter and opposite hitter (he has 3 sisters who have played collegiately).

also has high potential; he is all in, is our hardest worker, has a high value system and brings a great voice to the gym.

"Mitch is a multi-sport athlete with great leadership qualities. Clay's physicality has been impressive and as he is challenged more he'll rise to the level needed to succeed. Noah has one speed, all out, and he plays hard. He wants to be good and has a promising future."

The 2018 Trojans hope to add to the program's tradition of success that includes 4 NCAA Championships, 14 NCAA Tournament appearances, 20 Olympians, 34 All-American first teamers and 7 College Players of the Year.

USC has attained those feats despite playing in America's toughest conference. The MPSF, celebrating its 25th anniversary in 2018, has been reconfigured this season into a 7-team league. Six schools departed for the Big West, leaving USC, UCLA, Stanford, Pepperdine and BYU along with new members Concordia and Grand Canyon.

"USC always has the ability to win a national championship," said Nygaard, who is aided by fulltime assistants **Gary Sato** and **Todd Hollenbeck** and volunteer assistant **Brian Schirripa**. "The league we play in prepares us for that. Even though the MPSF now has a new look, the league is still full of top tier teams, which means we will face strong competition in every match."

In addition to its 12 MPSF contests, Troy's 2018 schedule features early season appearances at the Texaco Rainbow Warrior Classic at Hawaii and the AVCA Showcase at UCLA (site of the 2018 NCAA tourney), where it will face defending NCAA champ Ohio State and Penn State. The Trojans also will battle some of their former MPSF foes now in the Big West, including Long Beach State, UC Irvine and UC Santa Barbara.

Jeff Nygaard • Head Coach



Jeff Nygaard, a 3-time Olympian in indoor and beach volleyball and a 2-time collegiate MVP while playing on a pair of NCAA championship teams, is in his third season as the head coach of the USC men's volleyball team. He was

named head coach on June 4, 2015, after serving the previous 5 seasons as a Trojan assistant.

In 2017, his second season at Troy, USC went 14-14 overall (8-10 for a sixth place tie in the MPSF) to double its win total from the previous year and it advanced to the MPSF Tournament after a year's hiatus. After dropping 7 of their first 9 matches, his Trojans finished strong by winning 8 of their last 10 contests. USC gave NCAA Tournament participant Long Beach State 1 of its 4 losses of 2017 and Troy also beat 4 other Top 10 teams. Lucas Yoder made All-American second team and All-MPSF first team, while Andy Benesh was an All-American honorable mention pick and All-MPSF second teamer.

A rebuilding USC team went 7-19 overall in his 2016 debut season (5-17 in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation for 11th place).

Nygaard, 45, replaced Bill Ferguson, who was USC's head coach the previous 9 years.

In the summer of 2015, he was the head coach of the **U.S. Men's National Team** that competed in the Pan American Cup in Reno.

Nygaard coached USC's middle blockers in his 5 seasons (2011-15) as Ferguson's lead assistant. During that span, Troy played in a pair of NCAA Final Fours, won 2 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation regular season titles and posted an 88-48 (64.7%) overall mark. The 2015 Trojans went 19-9 overall, placed fourth in the MPSF, advanced to the MPSF Tournament semifinals and finished with a No. 7 national ranking.

Before coming to USC, Nygaard was a volunteer assistant coach with the UCLA men's team for 3 seasons (2002-04). He spent 2009 as an assistant women's coach at Whittier.

He has been involved with USA Volleyball, serving as an assistant with the Pan American men's indoor team in 2010, as head coach at the USA High Performance Clinic (Iowa/Midwest Region) for indoor women since 2010 and on staff with the Elite Development Program on the beach since 2013.

The 6-8 Nygaard was a middle blocker on the U.S. National Team from 1993 to 2000 and represented the U.S. in 3 Olympics. He was a member of the indoor team at the 1996 and 2000 Olympics and teamed with Dain Blanton on the beach in the 2004 Olympics. He also helped the U.S. win a bronze medal at the 1994 World Championships.

He played indoors professionally in Greece (1996-97), Croatia (1998), France (1999) and Turkey (2007). He also played on the 1999 and 2001 Los Angeles Athletic Club teams that won the U.S. Men's Open national titles.

Nygaard played on the pro beach tour from 2001 to 2011, winning AVP MVP honors in 2003 when he and Blanton were named AVP Team of

the Year. He won 7 AVP tourneys and an FIVB event, with nearly \$500,000 in career earnings. He captured a beach tourney for 4 consecutive years (2002-05), including an AVP-best 3 victories in 2003.

As a 4-year (1992-95) starter at UCLA, Nygaard was the first collegiate men's player to be named National Player of the Year in 2 consecutive seasons when he did so in 1994 and 1995. He was also the National and Conference Freshman of the Year in 1992. He was a 3-time (1993-95) All-American and All-Conference first teamer. He helped the Bruins to the 1993 NCAA title, setting an NCAA tourney record by hitting .867 in the semifinals and earning NCAA All-Tournament co-MVP honors. In 1994, he set UCLA season records with 650 kills while averaging 6.98 kills per match as the Bruins advanced to the NCAA championship match, where he made the NCAA All-Tourney team. The 1995 UCLA team won the NCAA title while posting a 31-1 record (going undefeated in league play) and he was named NCAA All-Tournament MVP. His 123 career aces set a school record.

In 2016, he was named to the **Pac-12 All-Century Team**.

He received his bachelor's degree in English from UCLA in 1995 and began work on his master's in English at Whittier.

He helped La Follette High in Madison, Wisc., to the 1987 and 1989 state championships and a runner-up finish in 1988.

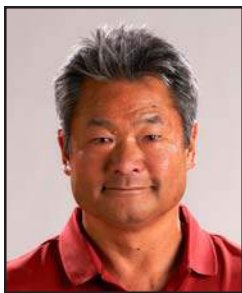
Nygaard was born on Aug. 3, 1972. He and his wife, Renee, have 2 daughters, Sophia, 10, and Elena, 7, and a son, Alexander, 2.

Gary Sato • Assistant Coach



Gary Sato, an assistant coach on 3 U.S. Olympic teams, is in his third year as an assistant coach with the USC men's volleyball team.

Sato, 63, was an assistant with the U.S. Men's National team from 1984 to 1988, in 1992 and from 2009 to 2012, including squads that won a gold medal at the 1988 Olympics, a bronze at the 1992 Games and placed fifth in 2012. He also assisted with U.S. men's teams that won the 1986 FIVB World Championship and the 1987 Pan American Games

and captured a silver medal at the 2012 FIVB World League. He was the head coach for the U.S. men's squad that won gold at the 1985 FIVB World Cup, where he was named the tourney's Most Valuable Coach.

He spent 2013 as the head coach of the Japan men's national team.

Sato also was the head coach for the U.S. Beach National men's (silver medal) and women's teams at the 2007 Pan Am Games, as well as for Team Paul Mitchell in the Bud Light Pro Beach Volleyball League.

He was the head coach of the U.S. Boys' Youth National team that won silver at the 2010 NORCECA Boys' Youth Continental Championship.

He was the head coach of Pepperdine's women's team for 4 years (1979-82), leading the Waves into the post-season 3 times (his 1979 squad finished ninth in the national rankings). He also was an assistant coach with the Pepperdine men's teams that won NCAA championships in 1978 and 2005.

Additionally, he was the head coach for the Santa Monica Beach Volleyball Club, the technical director for the Sinjin Smith Volleyball Academy and a clinician at the Los Angeles Volleyball Academy. He is the founder of the Gary Sato Volleyball Clinics/Grow the Game and president of the Association of Beach Volleyball Coaches.

Sato played volleyball at Santa Monica (Calif.) High and Santa Monica College before moving on to UC Santa Barbara, where he was an All-American outside hitter. He was inducted into the International Volleyball Hall of Fame, Santa Monica High School Hall of Fame, Pepperdine Athletic Hall of Fame, California Community Colleges Sports Hall of Fame and Santa Monica College Sports Hall of Fame.

Sato graduated with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 1978 from Pepperdine and as a Doctor of Chiropractic from the Southern California University of Health Sciences in 1992. He has his own practice, Sato Chiropractic.

Sato is a member of the "First Family of Volleyball." Brother Eric won an Olympic gold medal with the U.S. men in 1988 and a bronze in 1992 (Gary was an assistant with those teams). Sister Liane won an Olympic bronze medal with the U.S. women in 1992 and also played on the 1988 Olympic team. Brothers Scott (San Diego State) and Glenn (Loyola Marymount) both played college volleyball and Glenn also was an assistant coach at USC from 1990 to 1996 (the Trojans won the 1990 NCAA title). Their mother, Elissa, was a longtime fixture at local volleyball matches as a scorekeeper, usually accompanied by their late father, Richard.

Sato was born on Jan. 2, 1955. He has 3 children: Andrew (23), who was a libero at Long Beach State (2014-17), Katie (22), a senior libero at Cal State Northridge, and Malia (18), a freshman at USC.

Todd Hollenbeck • Assistant Coach



Todd Hollenbeck, the 2015 AVCA Division III Coach of the Year, is in his third year as an assistant coach with the USC men's volleyball team.

Hollenbeck, 32, spent 5 seasons (2011-15) as UC Santa Cruz's head men's coach, guiding his team to a national Top 10 final ranking each season. His 2015 team went 24-6 and advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals as he produced 3 AVCA All-Americans en route to being named the Division III Coach of the Year. In 2013, the Banana Slugs placed fifth

in the NCAA Division III tourney. His 2012 team won the league title and finished third at the NCAA Division III championship as he was named the Continental Volleyball Conference Coach of the Year.

He was a Banana Slugs men's assistant in 2009 and 2010.

He also was UC Santa Cruz's women's head coach for 3 seasons (2010-12), going 53-35, and taught physical education courses there.

In 2014 and 2015, he also was the head indoor boys and sand coach with the Mountain View Volleyball Club and an assistant coach with the Cabrillo College women's sand volleyball team. In 2013 and 2014, he was the head boys coach with the Main Beach Volleyball Club and the lead coach and co-director of the West Coast Volleyball Academy. He also served as a coach at various high school, club, college and USA Volleyball camps and clinics.

In addition to coaching, he has pursued a career in marketing.

He was an outside hitter and middle blocker at Pacific, where he earned his bachelor's degree in marketing in 2007. He prepped at Peninsula High in Rancho Palos Verdes (Calif.).

He played on the AVP and CBVA beach circuit, as well as indoors professionally in Germany.

He was born on Feb. 5, 1985.

Brian Schirripa • Volunteer Assistant Coach



Brian Schirripa is in his second year as a volunteer assistant coach with the USC men's volleyball team.

He previously coached girls club teams at the Sinjin Smith Volleyball Academy (2009-11) and HAX, boys at Harvard Westlake Middle School (2010), freshmen boys at Crespi High (2012) and boys with the Pacific Palisades Volleyball Club (2012).

He played volleyball at Santa Monica College in 2005, then was a member of UCLA's team in 2006 and 2007, including on the Bruins' 2006 NCAA championship squad.

Schirripa, 33, prepped at Crespi High in Encino (Calif.).

He received his bachelor's degree in anthropology, with a minor in political science, from UCLA in 2008. He then received dual master's degrees in business administration and in public policy at Pepperdine in 2011.

He is the owner and chief executive officer of two real estate management companies.

IN MEMORIAM**ERNIE HIX****1936-2016****"THE FATHER OF USC MEN'S VOLLEYBALL"**

Ernie Hix, known as "The Father of USC Men's Volleyball" after building the program in its early years as head coach and guiding the Trojans to their first 2 NCAA championships, died of malignant melanoma on June 4, 2016, in Alta Loma, Calif. He was 80.

During his 8-year (1974-81) tenure at USC, Hix not only won NCAA titles in 1977 and 1980 and finished as runner-up in 1979 and 1981, but he laid the foundation of the nascent Trojan program and fostered its development into a national power. He won 73.8% of his matches at USC, with an overall record of 138-49.

Among the All-American players he coached at USC were Tim Hovland, Dusty Dvorak, Steve Timmons, Celso Kalache, Bob Yoder, Pat Powers and Bill Stetson. Dvorak, Timmons, Kalache and Powers were Olympians.

In 1977, midway through Hix's head coaching tenure at USC, the university started awarding athletic scholarships in men's volleyball.

From 1971 to 1973, Hix served as USC's assistant coach.

A 1958 graduate of USC who played on the 1955 Trojan freshman basketball team and on the varsity in 1956, Hix was a member of a pair of Hollywood (Calif.) High's Los Angeles City finalist basketball squads.

He was founder and president of Hix Homes and Hix Development Corp., a residential homebuilder and land developer in Southern California, from 1963 to 2009. He served in leadership roles in the residential construction industry, including as president of the Building Industry Association Baldy View Chapter in 1992 and then president of the Building Industry Association of Southern California.

He also owned and operated assisted living facilities in Southern California since 2002. In fact, Hix passed away at Sunlit Gardens in Alta Loma, an assisted living facility that he developed.

AN ERA OF EXCELLENCE

Since volleyball scholarships were first awarded at USC in 1976-77, the USC men's and women's teams have combined to become a dominant force in the sport. The men have captured 4 national titles and played in 14 Final Fours in the last 41 years, while the women have won 6 national crowns and played in 12 Final Fours since 1976. The men have a winning percentage of .613 in that span (758-478), while the women are at .741 (978-341-4).

1976-77: After the Trojan women won the national title in the fall of 1976, the men made it a USC sweep when they won the NCAA championship in the spring. The Trojans finished 18-1 with a team that included future Olympians Celso Kalache and Dusty Dvorak, and future coach Bob Yoder. This was the year that volleyball scholarships were first awarded at USC.

1977-78: Though the women won their second straight national crown, the men fell short of a second straight title when they were stopped by Long Beach State in the NCAA regionals and finished 14-7.

1978-79: Ernie Hix's squad rebounded to reach the Final Four again, where Troy downed Rutgers-Newark but fell to host UCLA in the final. USC began the season with wins in its first eight matches and finished 23-5 overall.

1979-80: The Trojans avenged the previous season's NCAA final loss to UCLA by beating the Bruins in the title game this time. Tim Hovland, Dusty Dvorak and Pat Powers all were named first team All-Americans as the Trojans won their second NCAA crown in four years. Troy was 22-6 overall.

1980-81: For the third straight year and the fourth time in five seasons, the Trojans made an appearance in the NCAA title match. Their bid for a second straight crown fell short, though, when UCLA won in five games, the fifth 15-13. The Trojans were 21-5 overall in Ernie Hix's last season as coach, winning the California Intercollegiate Volleyball Association title along the way. USC's women won the national title that season.

1981-82: Under new head coach Bob Yoder, himself a former player at Troy, USC reached the Final Four for the fourth straight year. Though the Trojans were stunned by host Penn State in the semifinals, Yoder's first team still finished 22-10 overall and third in the nation. The Women of Troy, meanwhile, captured a second straight national championship.

1982-83: USC found itself in the unusual position of rebuilding, and for the first time in the decade failed to make the NCAA Tournament, finishing the season 14-13. The Trojan women were second in the country.

1983-84: USC rebounded from its mediocre 1983 season, winning its first six matches en route to a 29-13 overall mark. Only a loss in the finals of the NCAA Western Regional kept the Trojans from another Final Four trip.

1984-85: After a two-year hiatus, the Trojans returned to the Final Four and finished second in the nation. First team All-Americans Bill Yardley and Adam Johnson led USC to a 28-9 record and a spot in the NCAA title game, where Troy was stopped by Pepperdine, 15-13, in the match's deciding game.

1985-86: After the Women of Troy finished third nationally, Yoder's squad began its season with a loss at UCLA in the Kilgour Cup, then ran off 27 straight victories, including an unprecedented 20 without a blemish in the CIVA. Only a heartbreaking five-game loss to Pepperdine in the closest NCAA final ever (the fifth and deciding game was 16-14) kept the Trojans from a national title in a 27-2 season. College Player of the Year Adam Johnson led Troy, which was in the Final Four for the seventh time in 10 years.

1986-87: For the third year in a row, USC was the NCAA runner-up, losing in the final to UCLA (no other school in the country had been to the Final Four each of those years). Featuring 3-time All-American Adam Johnson and second team All-American Dave Yoder (the coach's brother), USC's 29 victories (29-11) equalled a school season record.

1987-88: After three straight second-place finishes in the NCAA tourney, USC won the national championship (the school's third). The Trojans set a school victory record by going 34-4 and were led by the likes of College Player of the Year Tom Duke, All-American Jen-Kai Liu, College Freshman of the Year Bryan Ivie and third team All-American Chris Martz. The Women of Troy, after a year layoff, advanced into the NCAA tourney.

1988-89: For the first time in 5 years, USC didn't advance to the NCAA Final Four. The Trojans, 28-11 overall, finished tied for fourth in the WIVA and lost to Stanford in the NCAA regional. Although all but one player returned from the 1988 NCAA titlists, injuries to 3 starters hampered Troy's hopes.

1989-90: Although it lost in the semifinals of the WIVA Tournament, USC was selected to an NCAA tourney berth ... and made the most of it. The Trojans, 26-7 overall, won their fourth NCAA title. Under the guidance of first-year coach Jim McLaughlin, USC's senior-less team was led by College Player of the Year Bryan Ivie, second team All-Americans Dan Greenbaum and Kevin Shepard, and Freshman All-American Jason Perkins. The women also had a new coach, Lisa Love, who led them into the NCAA playoffs.

1990-91: USC spent all year ranked No. 1 nationally and had a school-record 30-match win streak en route to a 34-2 record (tying the Trojan season win mark), but Troy lost in the NCAA final to Long Beach State. USC, the nation's top hitting team, lost only 21 games. Bryan Ivie won College Player of the Year honors again and Dan Greenbaum was a first team All-American.

1991-92: For the first time since scholarships were awarded in the sport at USC (1977), the young (no seniors, four frosh/soph starters) Trojans finished with a sub-.500 record (11-13). It was USC's fewest wins since 1976. The Women of Troy, however, went 23-8 to advance into the NAAs.

1992-93: For the second consecutive year, USC didn't advance to the NCAA Final Four (only the second such two-year occurrence since scholarships were awarded in the sport at Troy in 1977). But the Trojans were improved, posting an 18-12 overall mark. Sophomore Jason Mulholland, who set NCAA records for most kills in a match (55) and highest kill average in a season (7.67), was a second team All-American, while Jason Perkins closed out his career with USC's highest all-time hitting percentage (.430). USC's women went 21-9 and were an NCAA tourney team.

1993-94: USC started off 10-0 and ranked No. 2 nationally, but leveled off to finish with a 17-7 NCAA mark (23-8 overall). It was the first time in the school's scholarship-era history that it went three years without a Final Four visit. Jason Mulholland and Chris Underwood were first team All-Americans. The Women of Troy, 22-9 overall, advanced to the NCAA second round.

1994-95: USC — with just one senior — began the season at 11-5, but won just five of its next 17 matches to finish at 16-17 overall (11-14 NCAA). USC's women went 22-8 and made it to the NCAA regional finals.

1995-96: For the first time since 1983, USC didn't qualify for a berth in the conference tournament. The Trojans were 14-16 overall (10-12 NCAA). The Women of Troy were 18-9 and advanced to the NCAA regional semis.

1996-97: Pat Powers — the one-time USC All-American, Olympic gold medalist and pro beach star — took over as Troy's head coach. He guided the Trojans to an 18-14 record (12-12 NCAA), but they failed to advance to the conference tourney for the second year in a row. USC's women went 21-9 and made it to the NCAA regional semifinals.

1997-98: In Powers' second season, USC finished 17-17 (11-15 NCAA) but missed out on the MPSF Tournament by one game. In the fall, the Women of Troy made it to the NCAA Pacific Region semifinals and had a record of 23-6, the squad's most wins since 1991.

1998-99: A senior-less USC team came within a victory of advancing to the NCAA Final Four, losing in the MPSF Tourney championship to host and top-ranked BYU. But the Trojans finished strong with wins over No. 7 Hawaii, No. 4 Pepperdine and No. 2 Long Beach State before the BYU loss. USC finished 24-12 (17-11 NCAA) and ranked No. 7. All-American setter Donald Suxho's 63 aces was a school season record and Brook Billings was the MPSF Freshman of the Year. USC's women went 24-6 in the fall and made the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

1999-2000: For the second straight year, USC was 1 win away from the NCAA Final Four, losing in the MPSF Tourney semis to Pepperdine. Troy went 26-6 overall (No. 4 in final poll) and, for the first time since 1991, won a share of the MPSF Pacific Division title at 16-3. USC went 14-0 at home, was ranked No. 1 nationally for 2 weeks near season's end, twice beat a No. 1 team (Long Beach State and UCLA, to break a 13-match losing streak to the Bruins). The Women of Troy went 21-9 and got into the NCAA's second round.

2000-01: The Trojan men, with 5 starters returning, then went 15-11 and qualified for the MPSF tourney with a 10-7 record. The Women of Troy went 29-3 and advanced to the NCAA Final Four for the first time since 1985, losing in the semifinals.

AN ERA OF EXCELLENCE (con't.)

2001-02: USC's men struggled through their most difficult season, going 6-22 overall (finishing 11th in the MPSF at 3-19). Troy set school records for most losses, as well as most consecutive overall and MPSF losses (11). USC's women were 25-4, getting to the NCAA regional final.

2002-03: The Women of Troy went 31-1 and captured their fifth national championship, while Turhan Douglas took over the men's program and went just 6-25 (a school record for losses in a season) in his first year.

2003-04: USC's women had a perfect 35-0 season for their sixth national title (second consecutive). The Trojan men posted their third straight 6-win season (this time 6-23) while tying school records for most consecutive overall and MPSF losses (11) and setting the consecutive home loss mark (8).

2004-05: USC's men, hampered by injuries throughout the year, were 7-23. The Women of Troy went 23-6 and advanced to their third consecutive NCAA Final Four, losing in the semis.

2005-06: After USC's women forged a 17-11 record and advanced to the NCAA second round, the Trojan men posted an 11-18 mark (their best since 2001), including wins over UCLA and Pepperdine to break 6- and 5-year losing streaks to those teams.

2006-07: The Trojan men, under new head coach Bill Ferguson, had their best season since 2001, going 12-16 overall and 9-13 in the MPSF for eighth place to qualify for the conference tournament. Along the way, Troy had its first 3-game win over UCLA since 1991 and first win at Hawaii since 1999. The USC women went 27-5 and made it to the NCAA third round.

2007-08: USC's men had their most overall (13) and league (10) wins since 2001, their first repeat MPSF tourney visit since 2001, their first victory at Pepperdine since 1999 and their first consecutive wins over UCLA since 1991 (and first consecutive wins at UCLA since 1990). The Women of Troy made it to the NCAA Final Four (losing in the semifinals), finishing at 29-5.

2008-09: The Trojan men, after tying for fifth in the MPSF, re-emerged onto the volleyball map by winning their first MPSF Tournament and advancing to the NAAs for the first time since 1991 (they lost in the final to UC Irvine, 3-2). The USC women went 17-12 and got to the NCAA second round.

2009-2010: After the USC women went 22-10 and got to the second round of the NAAs, the men were 16-11 and qualified for the MPSF tourney.

2010-2011: Both the USC women (who went 29-5) and men advanced to the NCAA Final Four, losing in the semifinals. The 23-4 men (their most wins since 1999) won their first MPSF title since 2000 and were ranked No. 1 nationally until the final poll, led by AVCA National Player of the Year Murphy Troy.

2011-12: For the second consecutive year, USC's women (19-5) and men (24-6) made it to the NCAA Final Four. The women won the first-ever Pac-12 title and the men (the NCAA runnersup) won their second straight MPSF regular season title for the second year in a row (for the first time ever). Both teams featured the AVCA National Player of the Year, Alex Jupiter and Tony Ciarelli.

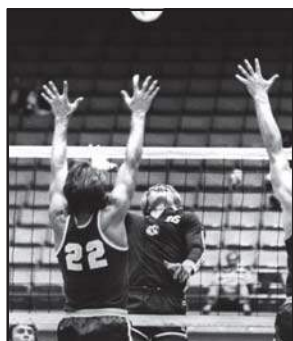
2012-13: USC's women went 30-6 while advancing to the NCAA regional final, as Natalie Hagglund repeated as an All-American first teamer and Samantha Bricio was the National Freshman of the Year. The young, injury-plagued Trojan men struggled to a 6-18 mark in a rebuilding season, but did beat teams that were ranked Nos. 1, 2 and 3 along the way.

2013-14: The Women of Troy were 29-6 and got to the NCAA regional final, with Natalie Hagglund, Samantha Bricio and Ebony Nwanebu making All-American first team (Hagglund also was an Academic All-American first teamer and Nwanebu was the National Freshman of the Year). USC's men, led by All-American first teamer Micah Christenson (winner of the inaugural Lloy Ball Award) and National and MPSF Freshman of the Year Lucas Yoder, were 16-11.

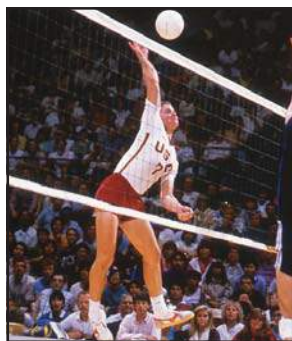
2014-15: After the USC women went 16-16, the Trojan men were 19-9 and advanced to the MPSF Tourney semis (repeat All-American Micah Christenson won his second consecutive Lloy Ball Award).

2015-16: The Trojan women advanced to the NCAA regional final and finished with a 33-3 record, while Jeff Nygaard assumed the men's head coaching duties and his rebuilding Trojan squad was 7-19.

2016-17: USC's women were 18-14 and played in their 26th consecutive NCAA tourney, while the Trojan men went 14-14 (doubling their win total from the previous year and making the MPSF tourney after a year's hiatus).

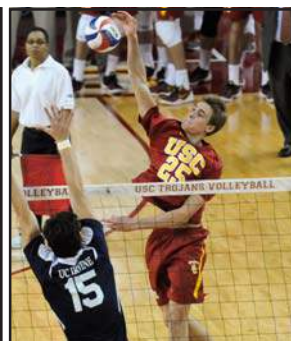

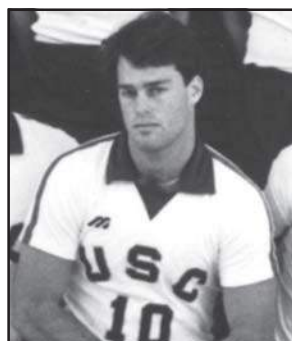

USC'S SETTERS AND THE 5-1 SYSTEM

USC was one of the earliest proponents of the 5-1 offense in college volleyball. Much of the Trojans' success over the years — four NCAA crowns, eight runners-up placings and two third-place finishes — can be attributed to the 5-1 offense.

The 5-1, which features only one setter handling the entire offensive scheme, has long been recognized internationally as the premier offensive system. With the success of the U.S. men's National Team, which uses the system, all of today's college teams have gravitated to the 5-1.

USC began with the system in the early 1970s with Carlos Fonseca at setter (1973-74-75). Although three players shared the setting position in 1976 (Gary Fisette, Brent Peterson and Alan Rosehill), the Trojans have had only 16 setters since then: Dusty Dvorak (1977-78-79-80), Bill Stetson (1981-82), Rudy Dvorak (1983-84-85-86), Mike Lauterman (1987-88), Dan Greenbaum (1989-90-91), Ty Price and Aaron Boone in 1992, Price and Steve Loeswick in 1993, Loeswick in 1994-96, Donald Suxho in 1997-2000, Miles McGann in 2001 and 2003, McGann and J.T. Gilmour in 2002, Gilmour in 2004, Jimmy Killian in 2005-08, Riley McKibbin in 2009-11, Micah Christenson in 2012-15, Jack Yoder and Gert Lisha in 2016 and Lisha solely in 2017.

The accomplishments of these setters are a testament to the efficiency and effectiveness of the system as employed by USC. During Dusty Dvorak's tenure, the Trojans won two national championships (1977-80). Under the guidance of coach Ernie Hix, and with the talent and creativity of Dvorak, much of the playset offense and quick transition attack was developed. The USC system combined the quickness of the Japanese and the playset options and back-row attack of the Polish teams (both were Olympic gold medal winners). The USA National Team adopted the system when Dvorak moved there. As the setter, Dvorak led the U.S. to international dominance and an eventual gold medal in the 1984 Olympics. He is still recognized as perhaps the best setter ever produced in the U.S.

Bill Stetson set the Trojans to the NCAA Final Four in 1981-82. He proved himself internationally as the setter for West Germany's 1988 national champions. And Stetson was the starting setter for this country's most successful club team, Molten America, guiding his squad to several national championships. Rudy Dvorak, an All-American in 1986, brought USC back to collegiate volleyball prominence with two NCAA runners-up finishes in 1985-86. He has since trained with the U.S. National Team, and played internationally in Italy and professionally on the beach. Mike Lauterman, a walk-on surprise, set USC in the 1987 and 1988 NCAA Finals, guiding Troy to its third NCAA title (1988) when he was named to the NCAA All-Tournament team.

Dan Greenbaum took over the setting reins in 1989 and helped the Trojans win the 1990 NCAA crown. He was an All-American for the 1991 NCAA runners-up and then was with the U.S. Olympic team. First-time Trojan Ty Price handled most of the setting duties in 1992, while first-year freshman Steve Loeswick took over for Price in mid-1993 and continued on solely in 1994, 1995 and 1996. Donald Suxho of Albania started at setter for 4 years (1997-2000), earning National Player of the Year honors in 2000 before joining the U.S. Olympic squad. He was succeeded in 2001 and 2003 by Miles McGann (McGann and J.T. Gilmour handled the duty in 2002). Gilmour (along with Gio Altamura at times) was the 2004 setter. Jimmy Killian took over in 2005 through 2008 (Gilmour filled in at times in 2005). Riley McKibbin inherited the job in 2009, getting the Trojans their first NCAA berth since 1991, and continued setting in 2010 and while earning All-American first team honors in 2011. Micah Christenson was the AVCA National Newcomer of the Year in 2012 as he guided USC to the NCAA runnerup spot and continued in that role in 2013 and as an All-American first teamer in 2014 and 2015 (while also setting for the U.S. National Team). Jack Yoder and Gert Lisha shared the setter job in 2016, with Lisha handling it in 2017.

USC IN THE NCAA AND MPSF

USC has been one of the most successful teams in college volleyball over the last 41 years. The Trojans won the NCAA title in 1977, 1980, 1988 and 1990, finished second in 1979, 1981, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1991, 2009 and 2012, and placed third in 1982 and 2011.

The 7-member men's volleyball version of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation originally was a merger in 1993 of the three largest conferences in the West — the Pac-10, Big West and Western Athletic — along with several independents and it was comprised of 13 teams. A number of teams joined or left the MPSF over the next 24 years (it was a 12-team league in 2017). As the MPSF celebrates its 25th anniversary in 2018, the league was reconfigured into a 7-team league, maintaining inaugural members USC, UCLA, Stanford, Pepperdine and BYU and adding newcomers Concordia and Grand Canyon. The MPSF, formerly the Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association, was formed to pool resources in several non-revenue sports and yet maintain a high level of competition.

Schools play a 12-match MPSF schedule, with overall records against league teams determining seeding into the postseason 7-team MPSF Tournament. The tourney winner gets 1 of the 5 automatic NCAA Tournament bids.

In all but 8 of the 48 years of the NCAA tourney, the national champ has come from the MPSF (or its predecessor conferences).

USC'S 1949 AND 1950 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMS

In 1949 and 1950, USC fielded a men's volleyball team (although not under the athletic department's jurisdiction)...and those squads won the first two USVBA Collegiate National Championships ever held. In the 1949 event in Los Angeles, the Trojans defeated Stanford in the final, 15-4, 15-2. Then, in 1950, Troy beat the University of Mexico for the title in Knoxville, Tenn., 13-9, 14-8. Hans Vogel coached USC to both crowns. USC's Dick Archer and Ray Solari were named All-American first teamers in 1949 and Robby Duron and Don Patterson were so honored in 1950. The team disbanded in 1951.

USC'S 1949 USVBA CHAMPIONS



USC's 1949 men's volleyball team, although not under the jurisdiction of the athletic department, captured the first-ever USVBA Collegiate National Championship. The event was held in Los Angeles that year and the Hans Vogel-coached Trojans beat Stanford in the final, 15-4, 15-2. Dick Archer and Ray Solari were named All-American first teamers.

USC'S 1950 USVBA CHAMPIONS



USC followed up its 1949 USVBA Collegiate National Championship with a repeat title in 1950. Hans Vogel took his Trojans (still not under the auspices of the athletic department) to the final in Knoxville, Tenn., where they beat the University of Mexico, 13-9, 14-8. Robby Duron and Don Patterson made the All-American first team. The team disbanded in 1951.

USC'S 1977 NCAA CHAMPIONS



In the year that USC first awarded volleyball scholarships, head coach Ernie Hix's Trojans went 18-1 with a team that featured future Olympians Celso Kalache (Brazil) and Dusty Dvorak (USA) and future USC head coach Bob Yoder. After beating Rutgers Newark in the NCAA semifinal, USC defeated Ohio State in 4 games (15-11, 9-15, 15-10, 15-12) to win its first NCAA Championship. Kalache and Yoder were All-American first team picks, while Dvorak and Steve Obradovich were All-American second teamers. Kalache was the NCAA All-Tournament team MVP.

USC'S 1980 NCAA CHAMPIONS



The Trojans and head coach Ernie Hix found themselves in their third Final Four in 4 years. USC defeated UCLA in four games (15-7, 6-15, 15-13, 15-8) to win its second NCAA Championship. Troy (22-6), one of the best teams in college volleyball history, featured 3 future Olympic gold medalists (Dusty Dvorak, Steve Timmons and Pat Powers) and a 3-time All-American first teamer (Tim Hovland). Powers went on to coach the Trojans from 1997 to 2002. Hovland, Dvorak and Powers were All-American first team selections that year, with Dvorak earning NCAA All-Tournament team MVP honors.

USC'S 1988 NCAA CHAMPIONS



After being down two games to none in the NCAA Championship match, USC head coach Bob Yoder subbed Lawrence Hom into the lineup...and Hom sparked one of the greatest comebacks in NCAA history as Troy won the next three games to defeat UC Santa Barbara, 15-17, 14-16, 15-10, 15-11, 15-9, en route to the school's third NCAA Championship (after three straight NCAA Championship runnerup seasons). The Trojans (34-4) were led by All-American first teamer and NCAA All-Tournament team MVP Jen-Kai Liu, All-American first teamer and College Player of the Year Tom Duke and College Freshman of the Year Bryan Ivie.

USC'S 1990 NCAA CHAMPIONS



The Trojans (26-7), under the guidance of first-year head coach Jim McLaughlin, were in their 10th Final Four in 13 years. Troy's lineup of future Olympians Bryan Ivie, Dan Greenbaum and Nick Becker defeated Long Beach State, 15-10, 12-15, 15-4, 15-6, to win its fourth NCAA Championship. Ivie was honored as an All-American first teamer, College Player of the Year and NCAA All-Tournament team MVP. Greenbaum, Kevin Shepard and Freshman All-American Jason Perkins joined Ivie on the NCAA All-Tournament team.

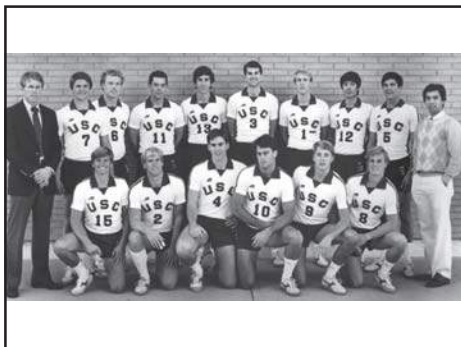

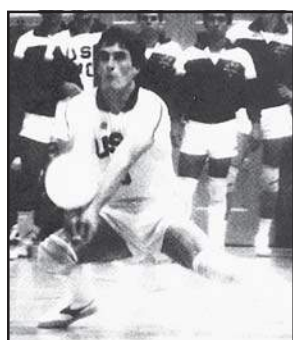

ALL-TIME TEAMS

Three Trojans--Dusty Dvorak, Tim Hovland, Pat Powers--were named to Volleyball magazine's All-Century first team, in its February 2000 issue. Bryan Ivie was on the second team, Celso Kalache the third team, Steve Timmons the fourth team and Adam Johnson was honorable mention.

Four Trojans--Timmons (#8), Powers (#24), Dvorak (#25), Hovland (#33)--were among the "35 Best U.S. Players of All Time" in the magazine's Jan. 2012 issue.

In 2016, Dvorak, Ivie, Kalache and Powers were named to the Pac-12's All-Century team.

In its September 1995 issue, Volleyball magazine selected its All-Time American Indoor Team. Trojans Dusty Dvorak, Pat Powers and Steve Timmons made the first team, while Tim Hovland made the third team.

In March of 2003, USA Volleyball selected its 75th anniversary All-Era Team. Four Trojans made the 1978-2002 squad: Dusty Dvorak, Bryan Ivie, Pat Powers and Steve Timmons. Also, Trojans Tim Hovland and Adam Johnson were named to the All-Era Beach Team (1988-2003) in January of 2004.

Dusty Dvorak, Bryan Ivie and Steve Timmons were named to the inaugural class of the Southern California Indoor Volleyball Hall of Fame in 2017.

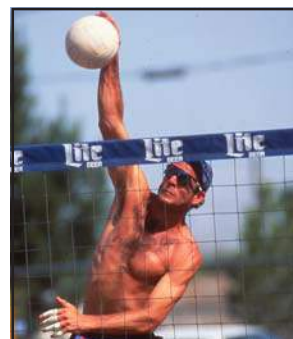

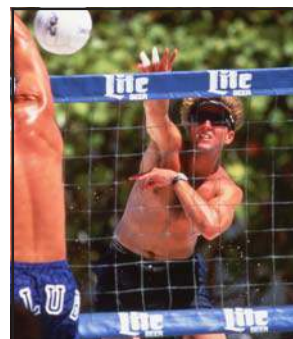
HOME RECORD

Troy played there from the team's inception in 1970 through 1988, then played its matches in the Lyon Center (capacity 1,300) from 1989 to 1996. USC then went back to the North Gym from 1997 to 2002 until splitting time between the North Gym and Lyon Center from 2003 to 2006 before taking up residence in the new Galen Center (capacity 10,258) in 2007.
