### WALKER BELL

IM/Free • 6-5 • Junior  
Santa Barbara, Calif.  
Dos Pueblos HS

**THIS SEASON:** Walker Bell, a 2018 junior, is a versatile swimmer who provides scoring for the Trojans in a variety of tough events.

**2017:** Bell made steady improvement as a 2017 sophomore and was a three-time B finalist at the 2017 Pac-12 Championships, finishing 14th in the 400y IM (3:52.64, 3:51.05 in prelims) and 15th in both the 500y free (4:24.79) and the 200y fly (1:46.06, 1:45.38 in prelims). His top Pac-12 times were all season bests ... He won the 500y free against UC Santa Barbara in 4:40.13 and the 1000y free vs. Cal Poly in 9:34.56 ... He competed at the 2017 U.S. Summer nationals, in the 50m (46th), 100m (66th) and 200m fly (52nd).

**2016:** Bell competed in two events as a freshman at the 2016 Pac-12 Championships, finishing 18th in the 400y IM (3:50.19, PR) and 20th in the 200y fly (1:47.28, 1:46.95 in prelims). He swam an exhibition 200y IM that produced a 1:48.61, an NCAA B cut and PR. Bell was also a reliable contributor in the distance free throughout his freshman season.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Bell, who prepped at Dos Pueblos High in Goleta, Calif., led his school to the 2015 Channel League title, winning the 200y and 500y free in the process ... at the 2014-15 CIF Division I Championships, he was second in the 50y back and sixth in the 200y IM and 500y free ... He won the 200m IM at the 2014 Speedo Champions Series at Clovis, Calif., and was eighth in the 400m IM.

**CLUB/COACH:** Santa Barbara Swim Club/Mark Warkentin.

**PERSONAL:** Bell, a business administration major, competed in triathlons since he was 10 and raced in his first U.S. Open in 2011 at 13.

### MAXENCE BOUVIER

Free/Breast • 6-1 • Junior  
Marseille, France

**THIS SEASON:** Maxence Bouvier, from Marseille, France, is a junior college spring semester transfer who will bolster the Trojans' sprint breast and freestyle corps while also providing help in the IM.

**RIVERSIDE CITY COLLEGE:** Bouvier competed for Riverside City College in 2016 and 2017. As a 2017 sophomore, he won 2017 California Community College Swimming and Diving State Championship titles in the 200y IM (1:50.99) and 100y breast (54.93), helping the Tigers to a program-best third place at the state meet ... He led the Tigers to second at the 2017 Orange Empire Conference Championships, earning OEC Swimmer of the Meet honors after wins in the 200y IM, 100y breast and 100y free ... As a 2016 freshman, Bouvier was second at the state meet in the 50y and 100y free and led Riverside to a state title in the 800y free relay. He also led Riverside to second at the conference meet and earned Swimmer of the Meet honors with wins in the 100y fly and 50y, 100y and 200y free.

**PERSONAL:** Bouvier is an Economics major.



### DYLAN CARTER

Free/Fly/Back • 6-2 • RS Senior  
Coral Springs, Fla.  
American Heritage School

**THIS SEASON:** Dylan Carter, a top-end freestyler from Trinidad and Tobago who can also swim the fly and back, is a career 12-time All-American and three-time NCAA and

Pac-12 relay champion who is back for his redshirt senior year. Carter holds USC's school records in the 200y free and 100y fly, is USC's second-fastest in the 50y and 100y free and is among USC's top 10 in the 100y back. He is also part of USC's team records in the 200y, 400y and 800y free relays and in the 200y and 400y medley relays.

**2017:** Carter had the best season of his USC career as a 2017 junior, capped by a six-time All-American performance at the NCAA Championships. He finished tied for second in the 200y free (1:31.16), fourth in the 100y free (41.76, 41.73 in prelims) and seventh in the 50y free (19.08, 19.04 in prelims). All three best times from those events were USC's second-fastest ever performances. He was the only swimmer at the meet to reach the final in the 50-100-200 free trio and the first Trojan to do it since Scott Findorff in 1976. He also led USC to third in the 400y free relay, fifth in the 800y free relay (with a school-record 1:30.95 leadoff) and sixth in the 400y medley relay ... Following the season he represented Trinidad and Tobago at the 2017 World Championships, taking 18th in the 100m free, 19th in the 50m fly, 24th in the 200m free and 28th in the 100m fly ... Carter turned in his best conference meet of his career at the 2017 Pac-12s, highlighted by a second-place finish in the 200y free with a then-school-record 1:31.98. He was also fifth in the 50y free (19.40) and seventh in the 100y free (43.07) and helped USC's 400y medley relay break the school record with the fly leg ... Carter, who won dual meet 12 races on the year, broke USC's record in the 100y fly at the 2016 Texas Invitational with a 45.27 ... At the 2016 FINA World Championships (short course) in December of 2016, Carter was a two-time finalist, finishing fourth in the 200m free and seventh in the 50m fly. In the 200m free, he twice broke the Trinidad and Tobago national record, ultimately lowering it to 1:42.48. He also lowered his country's mark in the 50m fly twice, the second time in the semifinals with a 22.53 ... For his efforts, he won (by popular vote) Trinidad and Tobago's 2016 Peoples Choice Award.

**2016:** Carter redshirted as a 2016 junior to train for the 2016 Olympics ... He represented Trinidad & Tobago at the Rio Games, swimming the 100m free and finishing 23rd (48.80) ... Carter won four titles at the 2016 Caribbean Islands Swimming Championships, claiming first in the 50m, 100m and 200m free and the 100m back.

**2015:** Carter was a four-time All-American as a 2015 sophomore, swimming on two NCAA winning relays and one Pac-12 relay winner ... Carter swam the second leg on USC's 800y free relay that won in a school-record 6:11.64 and then anchored Troy's 400y free relay winner, coming from behind on the final leg in another school record (2:47.06). Carter also swam on USC's fifth-place 200y free relay and on its sixth-place 200y medley relay. Individually, Carter scored twice in 'B' finals, finishing 13th in the 100y free (42.74, PR 42.61 in prelims) and 16th in the 200y free (1:36.01, PR 1:33.27 in prelims). He was also 19th in the 50y free in a PR 19.41 ... At the 2015 Pac-12 Championships, he was a two-time finalist, taking fifth in the 50y free (19.52) and eighth in the 100y fly (46.80) while finishing 11th in the 100y free (43.22). He also led off USC's Pac-12 title in the 800y free relay ... At the 2015 World Championships, Carter swam in four events for Trinidad and Tobago. His top finish was a 15th in the semifinals of the 50m fly (23.60).

**2014:** Carter helped USC to an NCAA title in the 800y free relay and was a two-time Pac-12 finalist as a 2014 freshman. At the NCAA Championships, Carter swam the third leg of the Trojans' wire-to-wire win in the 800y free relay. He scored individually with a 15th-place finish in the 200y free (1:35.06) and he was 42nd in the 50y free (19.93). He also helped USC



qualify for the final of the 400y free relay to earn his second All-American honor ... At the Pac-12s, Carter was sixth in the 50y free (19.51) and seventh in the 100y back (47.33). He also won the 'B' final of the 100y free (43.09). He led off USC's 800y free relay title and swam second on Troy's 400y free relay win ... He was second in the 50m fly and third in the 50m free at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games in the summer.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Carter broke his country's national record in the 400m free (3:50.05) at Trinidad & Tobago's 2013 Short Course Trials and won silver in the 50m fly at the 2013 Junior Worlds. He also became the first Trinidad & Tobago swimmer to final in the 100m back, taking fourth, and also was top 8 in the 50m back at the meet ... Earned the Trinidad & Tobago's Ministry of Sport 2013 Spirit of Sport Award as Junior Male Athlete of the Year ... Carter was third in the 50y free (19.65) at the 2013 U.S. Junior Nationals ... He won the 2012 U.S. Junior National title in the 200y free and broke 20 seconds in the 50 free for the first time at the meet at the age of 16 ... He burst onto the scene at the 2009 Carifta Swimming Championships in Aruba when he won eight golds and a silver and set eight Carifta records ... He was a finalist at the 2011 Commonwealth Youth Games in the 50m and 100m back and the 50m fly and qualified for the 2013 World Championships but opted to focus on the World Juniors instead.

## SANTO CONDORELLI

Free/Fly • 6-1 • RS Senior  
Jacksonville, Fla.  
The Bolles School

**THIS SEASON:** Santo Condorelli, a career eight-time All-American who swam on an NCAA title winning relay and two conference winners in 2015, is primed for a big final

redshirt senior season as one of the NCAA's top freestyle and butterfly sprinters. He is the second-fastest Trojan ever in the 100y fly (45.79), third-fastest in the 50y free (19.27) and fourth-fastest in the 100y free (41.77). He is part of four USC relay records.

**2017:** Condorelli was a four-time All-American as a 2017 redshirt junior, highlighted by his tie for fifth in the 100y free at the NCAA Championships with a PR of 41.77. He led off USC's third-place 400y free relay and then anchored Troy's fourth-place 400y medley relay and fifth-place 800y free relay as well as the 11th-place 200y medley relay. He just missed another scoring swim, tying for 19th in the 50y free (19.35) ... At the 2017 Pac-12 Championships, he was a three-time finalist for the second time, taking fifth in the 50y (19.37) and 100y free (42.94) and seventh in the 100y fly (46.09). He also anchored USC's school record in the 400y medley relay ... Condorelli was a two-time finalist in the 50y and 100y free at the Texas Invitational and won four dual meet races on the year.

**2016:** Condorelli redshirted as a 2016 junior while training for the Olympics, turning it into a huge year that included an Olympic final and being named Swimming Canada's 2016 Male Swimmer of the Year honor ... Condorelli raced in four events for Canada at the Rio Games, highlighted by a fourth-place finish in the 100m free (47.88, PR), finishing 0.03 out of third. He reached the semifinals of both the 50m free (21.97, PR 21.83 in prelims) and the 100m fly (51.83, PR), finishing 12th in both events, while also swimming on Canada's 4x100m free relay that finished seventh ... At the 2016 Canadian Olympic Trials, he won the 100m free and was second in the 50m free, earning Swimmer of the Meet honors.

**2015:** Condorelli was a three-time All-American as a 2015 sophomore,

swimming on USC's NCAA title winning 400y free relay as well Troy's fifth-place 200y free relay and its sixth-place 200y medley relay. Individually, Condorelli scored three times. He won the 100y free 'B' final in a PR 42.20, was 10th in the 100y fly with a school-record 45.79 and was 16th in the 50y free (19.68) ... At the 2015 Pac-12 Championships, he posted a trio of second-places finishes in the 50y (19.29) and 100y free (42.27) and in the 100y fly (45.85). He also swam on USC's Pac-12 title-winning 400y free and medley relays as well as on the second-place 200y medley and free relays ... Competing for Canada at the 2015 World Championships, Condorelli won bronze as part of Canada's mixed 400m free relay that took third in 3:23.59. Condorelli led off with a 48.19. He also swam on Canada's eighth-place 400m free relay and was ninth in the semifinals of the 50m fly (23.30) ... At the Canadian nationals, Condorelli won titles in the 50m and 100m fly and the 100m free. In the 100m free, he was the first Canadian since 2012 Olympic bronze medallist Brent Hayden to go under the 49.0 (48.83) ... He also represented Canada at the 2015 Pan American Games, winning silver in the 100m free and 400m free relay and bronze in the 100m fly and the 400m medley relay.

**2014:** Condorelli was a relay participant as a freshman at the 2014 NCAA Championships and swam on USC's sixth-place 400y free relay ... He was a finalist in the 100y free at the Pac-12 Championships and finished eighth (43.75). He was also 12th in the 50y free (19.75) and 15th in the 100y fly (47.28) ... At the 2014 U.S. Summer Nationals, Condorelli was a two-time 'A' finalist in the 100m fly, finishing eighth (53.75), and in the 50m fly, finishing seventh (24.01). He also finished eighth in the 'B' final of the 100m free (50.51) and was 22nd in the 50m free (22.67).

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Condorelli, from The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla., broke the Florida state record in the 50y free and clocked the fifth fastest time (19.88) in the event in high school history to win the 2012 Florida state title. Also at the meet he led off The Bolles' 400y free relay with a 43.5, one of three relays that broke national prep records. The other two were the 200y free and medley relays. Condorelli, who raced in the 50m and 100m free and 100m fly at the 2012 Olympic Trials, is also a junior national champion in the 100m free ... At the 2013 U.S. Summer Nationals, he won the 'B' final of the 50m free (22.73) and posted three other 'B' final finishes, taking second in the 50m fly (24.19), fourth in the 100m fly (53.55) and sixth in the 100m free (50.18) ... Weeks before entering USC, Condorelli broke the 17-18 National Age Group record in the 50m free with a 22.32 at the 2013 U.S. Junior Nationals (though since broken) and also took second in the 100m free and third in the 100m fly (53.11).

**CLUB/COACH:** Bolles/Sergio Lopez/Jason Calanog.

**PERSONAL:** He was born Jan. 17, 1995, in Japan, and grew up in Portland. He is majoring in economics at USC.

## BRAD DALRYMPLE

Diving • 5-8 • Junior  
St. Joseph, Mich.  
St. Joseph High/Grand Valley State

**THIS SEASON:** Brad Dalrymple, a two-time Division II national champion diver, is a junior transfer who will sit out the 2018 season and

have two years of eligibility remaining.

**GRAND VALLEY STATE:** Dalrymple was named the College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) 2017 Division II Men's Diver of the Year as a sophomore at Grand Valley State after he won the NCAA Division II national title on 3-meter with 513.70 and placed second on 1-meter (513.15), helping the Lancers to fifth as a team ... At the 2017



GLIAC Championships, he won both the 1-meter and 3-meter titles ... Dalrymple, as a 2016 freshman, won the NCAA Division II 1-meter title with 540.45 and was sixth on 3-meter (537.75). He won the GLIAC title on 3-meter.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Dalrymple prepped at St. Joseph High in Michigan where he earned All-State Honors his junior and senior year.

**PERSONAL:** He is majoring in Human Biology.



### CASH DELOACHE

Fly/Free • 6-3 • Junior  
Stone Mountain, Ga.  
Tucker HS

**THIS SEASON:** A 2018 junior, Cash Deloache continues to provide key swims in the butterfly, IM and freestyle and should contribute even more in dual meets and the

postseason.

**2017:** Deloache, as a 2017 sophomore, competed in three races at the Pac-12 Championships, topped by a 16th in the 200y fly (1:46.63). He was also 17th in the 100y fly (47.16, PR) and 40th in the 50y free (21.66) ... Deloache, whose top 100y fly (47.16) and 200y fly (1:45.60) were both NCAA B cuts, was a 2017 CSCAA Scholar All-American honorable mention pick and a 2017 Pac-12 All-Academic first teamer.

**2016:** Deloache raced in three events at the Pac-12 Championships as a 2016 freshman, scoring with a 15th-place finish in the 100y fly (47.67, PR). He won the C final (17th) of the 200y IM (1:47.76, PR) and was 18th in the 200y fly (1:47.28), his times in the 200y IM and 100y fly both NCAA B cuts.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Deloache, who prepped at Stone Mountain High in DeKalb, Ga., was a two-time double finalist at the Georgia 6A state championships, including a second in the 50y free and a third in the 100y fly as a 2014 junior. At the 2013 Georgia 1-5A state meet, he was fifth in both the 100y back and 100y fly.

**CLUB:** Dynamo Swim Club.

**PERSONAL:** He is a business administration major.

**THIS SEASON:** Dashiell Enos, a 2018 senior, is a returning All-American and 2017 Pac-12 Diver of the Year, as well as the two-time defending Pac-12 champion on 3-meter,

looking to finish his Trojan career on an even higher note.

**2017:** Enos, the 2017 Pac-12 Men's Diver of the year, was a two-time NCAA scorer as a junior, including a sixth on platform (428.30) to become the first Trojan to earn All-American honors on the board since 2009. He was also a consolation finalist on 3-meter, finishing 11th (425.85) ... He was a three-time finalist at the 2017 NCAA Zone E meet to earn his NCAA bid, finishing second on 3-meter (732.50), third on 1-meter (694.50) and fourth on platform (706.55) ... At the 2017 Pac-12s, he defended his 3-meter title with a career-best 428.35 while also finishing fourth on platform (335.95) and fifth on 1-meter (324.95) ... He won seven events during the regular season ... In the summer of 2017, he represented the U.S. at the 2017 World University Games, joining sophomore teammate Henry Fusaro to take fifth on synchronized 3-meter, less than four points from the podium. He was also a semifinalist on 3-meter and competed on platform ... He previously teamed with Fusaro to win a 2016 USA Winter National title on synchro 3-meter with 740.67 points. He also finished fourth in the 3-meter final with 1136.75 points, just some 50 points away from a top 2 finish.

His Pac-12 title was USC's first on the board since 1999 (and first on any board since 2011) and 52.10 points ahead of Stanford's second-place Connor Kuremsky (367.25). He was also reached the final on platform, taking fourth with 361.85 points while finishing ninth on 1-meter (308.40) ... At the NCAAs, he was 27th on platform (337.40), 40th on 1-meter (281.85) and 45th on 3-meter (304.25) ... He rebounded from the NCAAs in national competition later that summer, culminating with a pair of finals appearances at the 2016 U.S. Olympic Trials, finishing eighth on both 3-meter (1161.55) and, with USC teammate Henry Fusaro, on synchronized 3-meter (1008.27) ... He and Fusaro finished fourth at the 2016 USA Diving Synchro Nationals in April (679.17) ... At the 2016 USA National Zone F Meet, he won 3-meter (416.70) and was second on 1-meter (336.75).

**2015:** Enos competed in both springboard events as a freshman at the 2015 NCAA Championships, taking 23rd on 3-meter (366.65) and 28th on 1-meter (325.40) ... At the 2015 Pac-12s, he reached the final on 3-meter, taking sixth (368.60) and was ninth on 1-meter (299.95) and 14th on platform (269.25) ... He earned his trip to the NCAA Championships after taking fifth on 3-meter (738.15) at the Zone E Championships. He was also 10th on 1-meter (646.15).

He was a two-time NCAA consolation finalist on 1-meter and 3-meter, finishing ninth (334.2) and 14th (374.90), respectively. He earned his debut NCAA Championships spot thanks to winning the 1-meter at the NCAA Zone E meet with 719.05 points. He was also seventh on 3-meter (688.65) ... **2017:** Mulcare was a two-time All-American as a 2017 sophomore, highlighted by a third-place finish in the 200y back in 1:37.80, the fifth-fastest time ever and the fourth time he lowered his school record in the race in a matter of weeks. It was Mulcare's second straight A final in the race. He also earned All-American honors on USC's 800y free relay. He just missed a B final with a 17th in the 200y IM, but the 1:44.00 was good enough to break USC's school record. He was 22nd in the 400y IM (3:44.69) ... At the 2017 Pac-12 Championships, Mulcare twice broke his own 200y back record, first lowering it in prelims (1:39.44) and then doing it again en route to second place with a 1:39.37 behind Olympic 200 back champion Ryan Murphy. Mulcare also repeated as a 400y IM finalist with a fifth in 3:45.17 and took 11th in the 200y IM (1:45.00) ... Mulcare won 10 races on the season, six in the 200y back ... He earned 2017 Pac-12 All-Academic second team honors.

**2016:** Mulcare was a Pac-12 champion and earned All-American honors in the 200y back as a 2016 freshman. At the NCAA Championships, Mulcare scored twice, highlighted by his eighth-place finish in the 200y back (1:40.22, 1:39.68 in prelims), just USC's second A finalist in the event since 2000. He scored a day earlier in the 400y IM, finishing 15th (3:43.32, PR 3:42.87 in prelims) and was 26th in the 200y IM (1:44.86). He also led off USC's ninth-place 800y free relay with a PR 200y free of 1:34.16 and swam on USC's 15th-place 400y free relay ... At the Pac-12s, Mulcare broke Trojan Olympic champion Lenny Krayzelburg's USC record in the 200y back -- un-touched since 1997 -- twice en route to the Pac-12 title in the race, USC's first since Krayzelburg won it in 1998. He scored for the second time in the 100y free, taking 15th (42.76, 42.33 in prelims) and tied for 19th in the 50y free with a PR 19.35 ... At the 2017 Pac-12s, he was third in the 100y back (45.60) and won the B finals of the 50y (19.66) and 100y free (43.13), both in season-best efforts. He was also part of USC's 400y medley relay that broke a school record and the second-place 400y free relay ... He represented Estonia at the 2017 FINA World Championships, finishing 25th in the 100m back and 34th in the 50m back.

**2016:** Tribuntsov posted a career-best fifth at the NCAA Championships in the 100y back while winning his first career Pac-12 crown in the race as well. At the NAAs, he took fifth in the 100y back in 45.57 and was 15th in the 100y free (42.96, PR 42.51 in prelims). He was also 21st in the 100y fly (46.27) ... At the 2016 Pac-12s, Tribuntsov won the Pac-12 title in the 100y back with a 45.57 (45.30 in prelims), winning by 0.15. It was USC's first win in the race since Olympic champion Lenny Krayzelburg won it back-to-back in 1997-98 and was USC's 14th victory overall in the event. Also at the Pac-12s, he was third in the 100y free (43.14) and fifth in the 50y free (19.74) while leading off USC's second-place 200y medley relay and fourth-place 200y and 400y free relays, the former with a PR 19.58 in the 50.

**2015:** Tribuntsov was a three-time All-American as a 2015 freshman, highlighted by helping USC win the 400y free relay at the NCAA Championships, swimming the third leg. He also was part of USC's fifth-place 200y free relay and finished eighth in the 100y back (45.61). He swam on USC's 10th-place 400y medley relay and was 22nd in the 100y

free (42.89) and 26th in the 100y fly (46.65) ... He was a three-time 2015 Pac-12 finalist, finishing second in the 100y back in 45.27 after going a school-record 44.95 in prelims (with a time that would have won the final). He was also third in the 100y fly (45.96) with a time that made him the second-fastest Trojan ever in the race and then finished fifth in the 100y free in 42.88. His prelim 42.66 made him the fourth-fastest Trojan in the race. Tribuntsov also led off both of USC's Pac-12 titles in the 400y medley and free relays ... He represented Estonia at the 2015 World Championships and swam in six events, highlighted by a 21st in the 50m back.

**THIS SEASON:** Carsten Vissering, a 2018 junior, is the defending Pac-12 champion in the 100y breaststroke with his eyes set on a potential NCAA crown in the event as well.

The two-time All-American is improving on his 200 breast and is also a strong sprint freestyler. Vissering, USC's record holder in the 100y breast, is studying and training abroad in Brisbane, Australia, in the fall semester before returning to the Trojan squad for the spring semester.

**2017:** Vissering was a two-time All-American as a 2017 sophomore, winning a Pac-12 title while lowering his record in the 100y breast. At the 2017 NCAA Championships, Vissering finished third in 51.40, just 0.72 out of first. He became USC's first All-American in the event since Vladimir Morozov in 2013 and just the second since 2005. Vissering swam the breast leg in USC's fourth-place 400y medley relay that lowered the school record to 3:02.20. He also swam on USC's 11th-place 200y medley relay and was 26th in the 200y breast (1:55.15) ... Vissering, at the 2017 Pac-12s, won the 100y breast with a then-school-record 51.45, USC's first win in the event since 2003. He first lowered the school mark in prelims with a 51.82 that erased Morozov's 52.01 standard. Vissering also took 14th in the 200y breast (1:56.71), tied for 35th in the 50y free (20.75) and was part of USC's school-record setting 400y medley relay ... He won the 100y breast seven times as a sophomore, including at the Texas Invitational ... Vissering earned 2017 Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention honors.

**2016:** Vissering competed in three events at the 2016 NCAA Championships as a freshman, scoring with a 16th-place finish in the 200y breast (1:56.00) after he qualified for the B final with a 1:54.73, 0.44 out of the A final.

He also was 26th in the 100y breast (53.25) and swam on Troy's 18th place 200y medley relay ... At the 2016 Pac-12 Championships, Vissering blasted a PR 52.41 to finish second in the 100y breast after a 52.50 prelim swim. He next won the B final of the 200y breast with a PR of 1:54.09, just 0.08 off teammate Steven Stumph's winning time in the A final. He was a three-time winner in the 100y breast and 200y IM at the Washington Metropolitan Interscholastic Championships between 2013-15 ... He is the former NAG (15-16) record holder in the 100m breast and enters USC as the NAG (17-18) record holder in the 200y and 400y medley relays ... He was a two-time winner at the 2015 NCSA Junior Nationals, capturing the 50m (28.23) and 100m breast (1:00.86) and was second in the 200m breast (2:14.65) ... At the 2015 U.S. Winter Nationals he was fourth in the 'C' final of the 100m breast (1:03.11) and 39th in the 200m breast (2:21.66) ... Vissering represented the U.S. at the 2015 World University Games and clocked a PR in the 50m breast (27.93), taking eighth ... At the 2014 U.S. Nationals, he was 11th in the 100m breast, 13th in the 50m breast and 20th in the 200m breast and he was second in both the 50y and 200y breast at the 2014 NCSA Junior National Championships ... # 2017-2018 Trojan Swimming and Diving

## Coach Profiles



**DAVE SALO • HEAD COACH • 12TH YEAR**

Dave Salo came to USC more than 10 years ago as one of the most successful club and national coaches in the country – and now in his 12th season as the Trojans head men's and women's swimming coach, Salo is firmly entrenched among the NCAA's top collegiate coaches. Additionally, his wildly successful Trojan Swim Club has made him a go-to coach for top-shelf swimmers around the world who are seeking to propel their careers even further.

Salo, who has some 30 years of collegiate, club and national level coaching experience, replaced Mark Schubert in 2006 when Schubert assumed USA Swimming's head coach position.

Though far from complete, Salo's remarkable career was honored in 2010 when he was inducted into the American Swimming Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Further validating his strength as a coach, Salo consistently serves as a top national coach, most recently as the U.S. women's head coach for the 2015 FINA World Championships.

Salo has guided both the men's and women's programs to first-in-a-generation feats in the last three years, leading the men's team to its first Pac-12 title since 1979 in 2015 while leading the women's squad to the conference crown in 2016, its first ever in the Pac-12.

In 2017, Salo directed a Trojan team that saw the men's squad finish sixth at NAAs and the women take



ninth on squads that featured seven All-Americans and two Pac-12 swim titles apiece. Among the men's team highlights was Dylan Carter as the only swimmer at NAAs to reach the A finals in the 50, 100 and 200y free while Patrick Mulcare finished third in the 200y back with the fifth-fastest time ever. Carsten Vissering also was third in the 100y breast with a school record. The women were led by freshman Louise Hansson, who was a five-time All-American, reaching two NCAA individual finals after winning the Pac-12 title in the 100y fly.

The women's team finished sixth at the 2016 NAAs, remaining one of just four teams to have finished in the top 8 in each of the past seven years. USC, which featured eight All-Americans in 2016, closed the NAAs with its first-ever NCAA title in the 400y free relay with Kasia Wilk, Kirsten Vose, Chelsea Chenault and Anika Apostolon. During its Pac-12 title run, Troy got scoring from all 27 members of the squad (21 swimmers, six divers) en route to a program-best 1481 points. The Trojans won only three races, but, however, did total 30 A finalists (including diving and the timed mile) and 24 B finalists as well as a handful of scoring C performances. Salo was named 2016 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

The men's 2016 squad finished 13th at NAAs with four All-Americans, and was second at the Pac-12s. Junior Reed Malone, a two-time individual All-American in 2016, led seven conference titles with wins in the 200y and 500y free. Ralf Tribuntsov (100y back), Patrick Mulcare (200y back), Steven Stumph (200y breast) also won events (as Collin Pollard on platform and Dashiell Enos on three-meter).

Also in 2016, USC sent 13 incoming, current and former swimmers to the Rio Olympics. The contingent was highlighted by Hungarian Katinka Hosszu's standout performance in which she won gold medals in the 200m and 400m IM and in the 100m back as well as a silver in the 200m back – becoming the first Trojan to win four individual medals in one Games. Santo Condoirelli (Canada), who redshirted in 2015-16, just missed a medal in the 100m free, taking fourth, and was also a semifinalist in the 50m free and 100m fly.

In the men's team 2015 Pac-12 title run, senior Cristian Quintero won three races and helped USC to three relay titles, Stumph won his first title and juniors Morten Klarskov and Pollard, sophomores Condoirelli and Malone and Tribuntsov all were three-time 'A' finalists. USC clinched the title by winning the 400y free relay, beating Stanford by just nine points. Quintero won the 200y free at the NAAs and helped Troy,

which featured eight All-Americans, win NCAA crowns in the 400y and 800y free relays, both in come-from-behind school-record efforts en route to a fourth-place finish. Senior Andrea Kropp (100y breast) and junior Kendyl Stewart (100y fly) each won Pac-12 titles as USC finished third at the conference meet. Stewart led USC at the NAAs as a three-time All-American, one of seven All-Americans for the women's side as USC took eighth at the NAAs.

In 2014, USC continued its strong success. The women's team finished fifth at the NAAs to become one of only three teams to post five straight top 7 finishes while the men's squad took eighth. Each team producing nine All-Americans. Quintero won his first NCAA title in the 500y free, took second in the 200y free, third in the 100y free and then led USC to a victory in the 800y free relay, its first title in the race since 2002. Luca Spinazzola (100y back) and Dimitri Colupaev (200y free) were also finalists. Quintero won two Pac-12 titles (200y and 500y free) and led USC to wins in the 400y and 800y free relays. Kasey Carlson led USC at the women's NAAs with three top 6 finishes, including a second in the 50y free while Stina Gardell was a two-time finalist. Carlson won the 50y free at the Pac-12s and she and Gardell each posted three top 4 finishes while freshman Chelsea Chenault had three top 7s.

The 2013 Trojans produced another pair of standout seasons, led by the men's fourth-place at the NAAs, its best since 2001, which followed a third at the Pac-12s. The women's team finished seventh at the NAAs for its fourth straight top 7 finish after taking second at the Pac-12's for the first time since 2002 with a school-record point total.

The Trojan men's and women's teams combined for 21 All-American honors and included NCAA titles by senior Haley Anderson (500y and 1650y free) and junior Vladimir Morozov (50y and 100y free) as well as USC's first 400y free relay title since 1977. Quintero posted a pair of top 4s in the 200y and 500y free while all of Troy's men's relays placed in the top 5, including a second in the 200y free relay. The Trojans broke 16 school records in the meet, including in all five relays. In addition to Anderson's big wins for the women, Carlson was a two-time finalist in the 50y free and 100y breast (taking second in the latter) while Gardell was a two-time finalist in both IM while Troy posted four other individual final appearances. The men's and women's squads combined for 12 conference titles, including a men's sweep of all three freestyle relays. While the women's team set a school-record for points,

the men scored its most since 2003. The Trojans also finished with seven swim titles at the meet, their most at a conference meet since 1977.

Salo was nominated for 2013 Coach of the Year by USA Swimming at the annual Golden Goggles Awards after serving as the head coach for the U.S. women's team at the 2013 FINA World Championships. It was his sixth straight Golden Goggles nomination.

Salo had the Trojans rolling again in 2012 as the USC women's and men's teams repeated their third- and seventh-place finishes at their respective NCAA Championships. For the women, that marked the fifth year in a row USC either improved or matched its previous year's NCAA finish and it was the fourth in a row for the men.

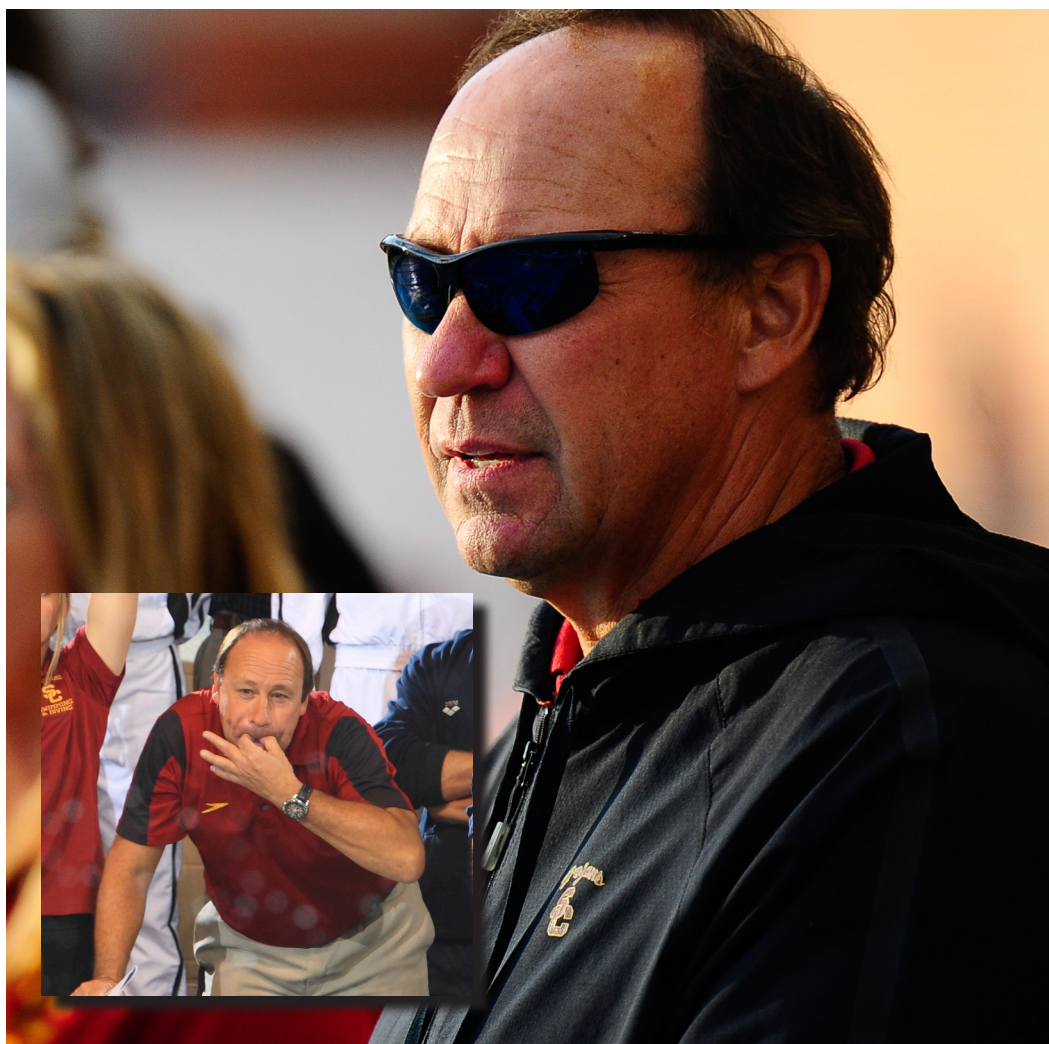
The 2012 women's team was led again by Katinka Hosszu, who completed her Trojan tenure with her fourth and fifth NCAA titles (200y fly, 400y IM) while earning a max seven All-American honors (including a second in the 200y IM) to give her 20 for her career. Hosszu was one of 12 All-Americans for the Trojans. Anderson won her first career NCAA title in the 500y free in addition to taking third in the 1650y free. Both Stina Gardell and Meghan Hawthorne reached the final of the 200y IM while Gardell also did it in the 200y breast and Tanya Krisman did the same in the 200y fly. Kasey Carlson and Christel Simms joined Anderson as three-time All-Americans thanks to strong work on relays. The Trojan women also won seven Pac-12 titles, including three by Hosszu and two by Anderson.

Salo's men's team featured six All-Americans, led by Morozov, who continued his rise as one of the NCAA's top sprinters with a second in the 50y free and a third in the 100y free. In a meet marked with close calls for the Trojans, Colupaev was second in the 200y free while Quintero was second in the 500y free. Alex Lendrum also reached the final of the 200y back. Morozov also won Pac-12 titles in the 50y and 100y free while Colupaev won the 200y free. Morozov was the first Trojan since 1977 to double up in the sprint events at the Pac-12s.

Following the 2012 NCAA season, Salo saw many of his swimmers flourish on the international stage. A whopping 13 swimmers from USC competed for a combined 10 countries at the 2012 Olympics. Anderson won silver in the Marathon 10K while Morozov earned a bronze on Russia's 400y free relay. Recent graduate Rebecca Soni, one of many post-graduate swimmers still thriving under Salo, won her second straight gold in the 200m breast with a world-record swim while also earning gold during another world record in the 400m medley relay. She just missed another gold in the 100m breast, taking silver. Another recent graduate Clement Lefert won one gold and one silver for France on relays while Trojan great Ous Mellouli won gold for Tunisian in the Marathon 10K to go with a bronze in the 1500m free. Morozov went on to thrive at the European Nationals with seven medals (including two golds) while Hosszu won three golds and a silver. Morozov then won titles in the 50m and 100m free at the 2012 FINA Short Course Worlds while Hosszu won two golds as well. Jasmine Tosky, a 2013 freshman, won gold on the U.S. 800y free relay as well.

In 2011 under Salo, the Trojan women's team's third-place finish at the NAAs was its best since 2003 and marked the fourth year in row USC improved its national finish. Troy finished 9-2 and third at the Pac-10 Championships. Hosszu won three NCAA titles (200y IM, 400y IM, 200y fly) and was named NCAA Swimmer of the meet and Pac-10 Swimmer of the Year. She was also tabbed as the Honda Sports Award winner as the nation's top athlete in swimming and diving. The five-time All-American Hosszu was one of eight All-Americans last year and among five with at least three All-American honors apiece, which also included Anderson, Presley Bard, Carlson and Lyndsay DePaul.

The seventh-place NCAA finish by the men's team was its best since 2007 and marked its third straight



season of improvement. USC, which featured eight All-Americans in 2011, was led by four-time All-American sprinter Morozov, the 2011 Pac-10 Newcomer of the Year who rewrote the Trojan record books repeatedly his freshman year. Complementing Morozov were three-time All-Americans Lefert and Colupaev, the trio spearheading the revitalized men's team that finished 6-3 overall and third at the highly competitive Pac-10 Championships.

Salo also guided Soni to three gold medals and one bronze at the 2011 World Championships while Hosszu, Stina Gardell, Morozov and Mellouli also made appearances. At the 2011 World University Games, Anderson won gold and silver medals while Lefert earned a silver and DePaul reached two finals.

In 2010, the Trojans continued their resurgence toward the top of the NCAA swimming ranks while current and former Trojans continued to perform at the highest levels on the national and international stage.

The Trojan women's team (10-2 overall, 4-2 in the Pac-10) finished seventh at the 2010 NCAA Championships and took third at Pac-10s, its best efforts since 2003. Hosszu, Bard and DePaul each reached a pair of finals at the NAAs and, including one final from Anderson, combined for seven top 4 finishes. USC also posted All-American efforts in the 800y free relay and the 400y medley relay. The Trojan women won six Pac-10 titles as well, including the 800y free relay for the first time since 2003.

The men's team finished 7-3, 1-3, taking fourth at Pac-10s and moving up to 11th at the NAAs. Lefert earned individual All-American honors in the 500y free while he joined Zoltan Povaszay, Patrick White and Nick Karpov on an All-American 800y free relay. USC

won the same relay at the 2010 Pac-10s while Lefert won the 200y free.

Outside the NCAA realm in 2010, Soni, on Salo's staff as a volunteer coach, won two Pan Pac titles and three Short Course World Championship crowns. Anderson also posted three top 8 finishes at Pan Pacs. Hosszu won three European Championships gold medals for Hungary and was a two-time finalist at the Short Course Worlds. Mellouli, a former graduate assistant coach for Salo, won four medals at Short Course Worlds, including gold in the 1500m free. Lefert also competed in two events at the Short Course Worlds.

For all of the success, SwimNews.com named Salo 2010 international Women's Coach of the Year.

Salo's 2009 was similar to 2010 with USC swimmers performing strong collegiately, nationally and internationally.

The USC women's team's ninth-place at the 2009 NCAA Championships was its best finish since 2004. The squad (6-1 overall, 5-1 in the Pac-10) was again led by Soni, a senior who won NCAA titles in the 100y and 200y breast events for the second consecutive year. Hosszu also had a huge NAAs, reaching the finals of three events, including a second-place in the 400y IM and a third in the 200y fly. Additionally, Soni and Hosszu were joined by Kristen Lahey and Rachel Waller, who all earned All-American honors after taking third in the 400y medley relay. The youth-dominated men's team (4-3, 2-3) went through a rebuilding season but showed a lot of promise at the 2009 Pac-10s, led by James Martin and Povaszay and took a solid contingent to the NAAs.

Also under Salo in 2009, Hosszu (400m IM) and

Trojan graduates Soni (100m breast) and Mellouli (1500m free) all won 2009 World Championship gold medals while DePaul won a pair of silvers at the 2009 World University Games. Other Trojans who competed at the World Championships included Dina Hegazy, Ania Kowalczyk, Anderson and Povaszay.

Salo's 2008 was highlighted by the huge success of USC swimmers who – after training with Salo – went on to big success at the 2008 Olympics. Swimmers who worked out with Salo and won 2008 Olympic medals included gold-medalists Soni, Mellouli and Klete Keller as well as bronze medalist Larsen Jensen. Salo served as Tunisia's Olympic swim coach at the Olympics, enabling him to mentor the Tunisian-born Mellouli in Beijing.

Also in 2008, USC's women's squad finished 5-5 in 2008 while the men were 2-5. Both finished fifth at the Pac-10 Championships. The Women of Troy's season was topped off by Soni's pair of NCAA titles, including her third consecutive NCAA crown in the 200y breast and her first in the 100y breast. In addition, Whitney Hentzen earned her first career All-American honor (in the 1650y free) while Emily Goetsch, Lahey, Waller and Soni earned additional All-American honors in the 400y medley relay.

The men's season was capped by Vanni Mangoni's Pac-10 title in the 400y IM and Richard Gosper's consolation All-American nod in the 50y free at the NCAA Championships.

In his first year with the Trojans in 2007, USC's men's team finished 5-2 overall, 3-2 in the Pac-10, taking seventh at the NCAA Championships, fourth at the Pac-10 Championships. The Women of Troy, which suffered the losses of three former Olympians prior to the season's end, were 5-4, 3-4, fifth at the Pac-10 Championships, 20th at the NCAA Championships.

Six men's swimmers earned All-American honors in 2007, including then-senior Larsen Jensen, who won NCAA titles in the 500y and 1650y freestyles. Jensen won those same events at the Pac-10 Championships. Mangoni was also fourth in the 400y IM at the NCAA Championships.

Soni earned All-American honors on the women's

side, successfully defending her NCAA title in the 200y breast and also reaching the final of the 100y breast.

Other noteworthy first-year accomplishments under Salo included the breaking of USC's record in the 50y free. Joe Bottom had held the record since 1977, but under Salo, senior Sean Sussex erased the mark, going under Bottom's old standard twice at the end of the 2007 season. (At the start of the 2007-2008 season, it was broken again, this time by Gosper).

Salo also helped then-juniors Hentzen and Brittany Allen become NCAA Championships individual point scorers for the first time, the two distance freestylers each earning points for the Trojans in the 1650y free. Additionally, then-seniors Bryce Elser and Brandon Lovell both cracked USC's all-time top 10 in the 100y fly in their first year under Salo.

Salo who has coached Olympic medalists such as Soni, Mellouli, Jensen, former Trojans Lenny Krayzelburg and Gabe Woodward as well as Aaron Peirsol, Amanda Beard, Staciana Stitts, Colleen Lanne and Jason Lezak, came to USC after serving as head coach of the Irvine Novaquatics from 1990 to 2006.

"Returning to USC, following in the footsteps of Hall of Fame coaches Peter Daland and Mark Schubert, is a coach's dream," said Salo. "The fact that it is my reality can't be described adequately.

"I have had a dream coaching career - coaching some of the best swimmers in the world with one of the best clubs in the country. The opportunity to come back to USC to coach one of the most storied programs in the history of collegiate swimming is tremendously exciting."

Salo guided the Novas to numerous Junior National and U.S. National team titles as well as several age group championships. He was tabbed 2002 U.S. Swimming Coach of the Year after leading the Novas to U.S. Spring and Summer national titles.

He has served extensively at the national level, including head coaching assignments for the United States at the 2015 (women), 2013 (women) and 2005 World Championships (men) and the 2001 Goodwill Games (men). His assistant coaching duties for the U.S. include the 2012 Olympics (women), 2010

Short Course World Championships (women), 2004 Olympics (men), 2003 World Championships (men and women), 2002 Pan Pacific Championships (men), 2000 Olympics (women) and the 1999 Pan American Games (women).

Nova swimmers and alums who trained under Salo consistently dotted the roster of U.S. national teams, often in starring roles. Peirsol, the world record holder in the 100 and 200 backstroke (1cm), is a three-time Olympian and won 2004 Olympic gold medals in both backstroke events as well as the 400 medley relay. He followed that up with golds in the 100 and the 400 medley relay at the 2008 Olympics and a silver in the 200. Beard is a four-time Olympian with seven medals, one of many elite breaststrokers who have come under Salo's tutelage. Lezak, an eight-time Olympic medalist in four appearances, is among American's greatest sprinters ever.

Besides duties with the Novas and the U.S. team, Salo served as co-head coach at Orange Coast College from 2000 to 2004. The Pirates won the 2003 California state title and Salo was honored as state Co-Coach of the Year. Also in 2003, he became the Founding Director of Aquatics at Soka University in Aliso Viejo, Calif., where he recently completed his second season with the Lions.

Salo joined the Novas after five seasons (1985-90) working under legendary USC swimming coach Peter Daland. He helped guide Troy's men's team to five Top 5 NCAA finishes, including second-place marks in 1987, 1988 and 1990. Troy also had perfect dual-meet records in 1988, 1990 and 1991. Among the USC swimmers he helped coach were NCAA champions and Olympians Dave Wharton and Dan Jorgensen.

Salo graduated from Long Beach State with a B.A. and M.A. in exercise physiology and also served as an assistant women's swimming coach there in 1981 and 1982. He earned his doctorate in the same field from USC in 1991.

Salo swam for Santa Rosa Junior College from 1976 to 78 before transferring to Long Beach State.



## **CATHERINE VOGT**

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH • 10TH YEAR



Catherine Vogt, a former top-flight distance swimmer who has coached at both the collegiate and national levels, is in her 10th year at USC and in her second season as the Trojans' associate head coach. A mainstay on Troy's men's and women's staff for almost a decade, she is also one of the top open water coaches in the country with Olympic and World Championship experience. She came to Troy after three years as an assistant coach at her alma mater, North Carolina (2005-2008).

In 2017, Vogt was part of a Trojan staff that saw the men's squad finish sixth at NAAs and the women join them in the top 10 in ninth on squads that featured seven All-Americans and two Pac-12 swim titles apiece. Vogt helped guide USC's 2016 women's team to a memorable season that included its first ever Pac-12 title as well as a sixth-place finish at the NAAs. Troy featured eight All-Americans in 2016 and closed the NAAs with its first-ever NCAA title in the 400y free relay with Kasia Wilk, Kirsten Vose, Chelsea Chenault and Anika Apostolon. During its Pac-12 title run, Troy got scoring from all 27 members of the squad (21 swimmers, six divers) en route to a program-best 1481 points. USC's men's team finished 13th at the NAAs and second at the Pac-12s. USC won seven conference titles, including two by Reed Malone in the 200y and 500y free.

Following the 2016 collegiate season, Vogt turned her attention nationally and served as the head coach for the U.S. Open Water team at the 2016 Olympics in Rio.

In 2015, she helped lead USC to a fourth-place NCAA finish on the men's side for the second time in three years as well as the men's team's first Pac-12 title since 1979 while the women's squad placed eighth at NAAs. The women's team featured six All-American swimmers, including individual finalists Kendyl Stewart (100y fly) and Chenault (200y free). The USC men's team had eight All-Americans, paced by senior Cristian Quintero, who won his first NCAA crown in the 200y free while also leading Troy to relay victories in the 400y and 800y free relays. Both Quintero and Malone finished top 5 in the NCAA 500y free. Quintero, at the Pac-12 Championships, became the first man ever to sweep the 100y, 200y and 500y free at the same meet and again led USC to relay wins in the 400y and 800y free relays and the 400y medley relay. Troy had three conference finalists in the 500y free and two top 6 finishers in the 1650y free.

Vogt then served as USA's open water head coach for the 2015 FINA World Championships, her third such stint. She also was the head coach for the Americans at the 2013 and 2009 World Championships. In 2015, she led Team USA to the open water team world title. There, the U.S. won three medals and posted 11 top-10 finishes throughout the open water competition.



In 2014, USC continued its strong success. The women's team finished fifth at the NAAs to become one of only three teams to post five straight top 7 finishes while the men's squad took eighth. Each team producing nine All-Americans. Quintero won his first NCAA title in the 500y free, took second in the 200y free, third in the 100y free and then led USC to a victory in the 800y free relay, its first title in the race since 2002. Luca Spinazzola (100y back) and Dimitri Colupaev (200y free) were also finalists. Quintero won two Pac-12 titles (200y and 500y free) and led USC to wins in the 400y and 800y free relays. Kasey Carlson led USC at the women's NAAs with three top 6 finishes, including a second in the 50y free while Stina Gardell was a two-time finalist. Carlson won the 50y free at the Pac-12s and she and Gardell each posted three top 4 finishes while then-freshman Chenault had three top 7s.

Following the 2014 season, Vogt was head coach for the U.S. Open Water team at the 2014 Pan Pacific Games.

Vogt, in 2013, helped oversee a USC's men's team that took fourth at the NCAA Championships, its best since 2001, and a seventh for the women, its fourth straight in the top 7. The teams combined for 21 All-Americans and included NCAA titles by Haley Anderson (500y and 1650y free) and Vladimir Morozov (50y and 100y free) as well as USC's first 400y free relay title since 1977. The squads combined for 12 conference titles, including a men's sweep of all three freestyle relays. The women's team finished second at the conference meet for the first time since 2002 with a school-record points total. Vogt also served as the American open water head coach at the 2013 World Championships in Barcelona, her second national open water head coaching stint. Not only did the American Anderson win the women's 5K, but former Trojan and Vogt pupil Ous Mellouli, representing Tunisia, won the men's 5K and claimed bronze in the 10K. Under Vogt, American Eva Fabian also won bronze in the 25K.

In 2012, the distance-savvy Vogt helped USC repeat its third-place NCAA women's finish and its seventh-place NCAA men's finish. The women's squad

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featured 12 All-Americans, including two-time NCAA champion Katinka Hosszu (400y IM, 200y fly), who barely missed a third title in the 200y IM (taking second). Haley Anderson, one of Vogt's top distance swimmers, won her first career NCAA title in the 500y free in addition to a third in the 1500y free. The Trojan women also won seven Pac-12 titles, including two by Anderson in the 500y and 1650y free. The men's team featured six All-Americans, including Cristian Quintero, who was second in the 500y free.

Vogt also coached at the 2012 London Olympics, serving as an assistant on the Tunisian swim staff, working with Mellouli.

Mellouli won gold in the Marathon 10K and bronze in the 1500m free while Anderson also won a medal, taking silver in the Marathon 10K (seconds out first). Anderson earned her spot at the Olympics with a first-place finish at the FINA Olympic Marathon Swim Qualifier in Setubal, Portugal.

In her third year with the Trojans in 2011, Vogt helped guide a combined 15 men's and women's swimmers to All-American honors, including Hosszu, who was a three-time NCAA champion. The women's team finished third at the NCAAs while the men were seventh. Vogt pupil Anderson had a big year, finishing third in the 1650y free and sixth in the 500y free at the NCAA Championships and winning Pac-10 titles in both events. Anderson also won gold in the 1500m free at the 2011 World University Games was fourth in the 10K at the U.S. Open Water Nationals.

Vogt, during her second year with the Trojans in 2010, helped send 11 women's swimmers to the NCAA Championships as USC placed seventh, its best finish since 2003. Also, the Trojans posted a combined seven top 4 individual finishes and had two All-American relays. The men's squad finished 11th at NCAAs with a 10-swimmer squad.

Under Vogt's tutelage in 2010, Anderson was fourth in the 1650y at the NCAAs and was a consolation finalist in the 500y free. She also represented the U.S. at the Pan Pacific Games, finishing fourth in the 10K and the 1500m free and eighth in the 800m free. At the 2010 World Open Water Championships, Anderson was fourth in the 25K. Also, USC's Richard Charlesworth finished just one spot (ninth) out of earning All-American honors in the 1650y free at the 2010 NCAAs.

In 2009, Vogt helped direct Rebecca Soni to her fifth and sixth NCAA titles while Hosszu was a three-time individual finalist. The Women of Troy finished ninth overall at the NCAAs and had four All-Americans. The men's squad, meanwhile, sent six swimmers to the NCAAs.

Vogt also served as head coach for the 2009 U.S. Open Water World Championship team that competed in Rome in July. Under Vogt, the U.S. won one silver, one bronze, posted five top 10 finishes and finished fourth in team

scoring among 36 nations.

Vogt joined the Trojan staff after a busy 2008 season. She served as assistant coach to the 2008 U.S. Open Water World Championship team that competed in Seville, Spain. She also coached swimmers to second- and third-place finishes at U.S. Nationals, which qualified them for two of the five available spots on the World Championship team. She then traveled to Beijing, China, as U.S. head coach for the Open Water test event.

At the 2008 NCAA Championships, she helped guide multiple Tarheel swimmers to All-American honors at the NCAA Championships in the distance and IM events. She led Whitney Sprague to a second-place finish in the 1650y free and coached her to conference and school records in the 500y, 1000y and 1650y free. Also under Vogt, Joe Kinderwater swam to a fifth-place finish in the 1650y free at the NCAAs, setting two school records in the 1000y and 1650y free.

In 2007, Vogt's UNC women's distance swimmers finished 1-2-3 in the 1650y free at the ACC Championships, while the men placed 2-3. At the 2007 NCAA Championships, Vogt helped guide Tar Heels Whitney Sprague and Chip Peterson to All-American honors.

Vogt's resume boasts several national-level coaching stints prior to 2008 that include serving as head coach at both the 2006 Pan Pacific Open Water Championships and the 2007 Pan American Games, as well as serving as assistant men's coach at the 2007 Pan Am Games. Her position on the 2007 Pan Am Games men's staff marked the first time a female coach was named to a U.S. men's team staff at an international competition. She also was an assistant coach at the USA Swimming National Select Open Water camp in 2006 and 2007, as well as at the 2005 and 2006 Open Water World Championships.

While coaching the U.S. team at the 2006 Pan American Open Water Championships, she guided the men and women to wins in the 5K and 10K, as the U.S. earned the overall team award as well.

She has coached age group and senior swimmers that qualified and won medals at the World University Games, Open Water National Championships, Open Water World Championships, U.S. Senior National Championships, Junior Pan Pacific Games, World Championship Trials, and U.S. Olympic Trials. Prior to coaching at North Carolina, Vogt coached at the Carteret Currents Swimming Club in North Carolina. Vogt has also coached club teams in Virginia and Mississippi.

Vogt swam for North Carolina for four years in the distance freestyle (competing as Catherine Frock) and helped lead UNC to an ACC Championship during her freshman year. Her top ACC individual finish was a fifth place in the 1650y freestyle in 1996. She graduated from UNC in 2000 with degrees in education and psychology. She was named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll and Dean's List at UNC from 1997-99.

Vogt has one daughter, Carson Elizabeth, born in October of 2010.





## **CHASE BLOCH**

ASSISTANT COACH • FOURTH YEAR



Chase Bloch, a 2013 All-American and a 2014 co-captain who was also a two-time Pac-12 All-Academic honoree, is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the USC swim team.

Since joining the staff, Bloch has helped lead the men's squad to a Pac-12 title in 2015, the women's team to a conference title in 2016 and to a combined five top 9 finishes at the NCAA Championships.

Bloch was a co-captain as a 2014 senior and was a Pac-12 finalist in the 200y back. He was also a 2014 Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention pick who graduated with a degree in communications. In addition to taking sixth in the final of the 200y back at the Pac-12s, he was ninth in the 100y fly and 11th in the 100y back.

Bloch nabbed his first career All-American honor as a 2013 junior as part of USC's 200y medley relay that finished fifth at the 2013 NCAA Championships in a school record 1:24.54. Bloch became a conference finalist for the first time at the 2013 Pac-12s, touching seventh in the 200y back (1:43.73). He was also 10th in the 100y back (48.04) and 12th in the 100y fly (47.58). At the 2012 U.S. Winter Nationals, he was fifth in the 100y fly (46.86) and 10th in the 200y back (1:43.45). At the 2013 U.S. Summer Nationals, he was fourth in the 'B' final of the 50m back (25.77), fifth in the 'B' final of the 100m back (55.63) and eighth in the 'B' final of the 200m back (2:02.43).

Bloch raced in four events at the 2012 NCAA Championships as a sophomore. He helped USC to a pair of consolation final swims in the 200y and 400y medley relay (swimming the fly in both races) and also was 29th in the 100y back (48.10) and 31st in the 100y fly (47.56). At the 2012 Pac-12 Championships, he was 10th in the 100y fly (57.68) and 200y back (1:44.00) and 11th in the 100y back (48.16). Bloch raced in three events at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials, finishing 24th in the 200m back (2:02.30), 32nd in the 100m back (56.47) and tied for 42nd in the 100m fly (54.41). He was named to the 2012 Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention team.

Bloch raced in three events at the 2011 NCAA Championships as a freshman, taking 33rd in the 200y fly (1:47.68), 35th in the 100y fly (47.50) and swam on Troy's 12th-place 200y medley relay (1:26.61). At the 2011 Pac-10 Championships, Bloch was ninth in the 200y fly (1:46.74), 12th in the 100y fly (47.32) and 17th in the 100y back (48.54). He competed in the 2011 U.S. Nationals, where he was 4th in the 'C' final of the 200m back. He was also 39th in the 100m fly.

Bloch prepped at Oaks Christian High in Westlake, Calif., where he was the 2010 L.A. Daily News Male Athlete of the Year and the 2009 and 2010 L.A. Daily News and Ventura County Star Swimmer of the Year.



### JEFF JULIAN

ASSISTANT COACH • SECOND YEAR



Former USC All-American, Pac-10 champion and U.S. National teamer Jeff Julian, a highly successful club coach with national coaching experience as well, is in his second year as a USC Men's and Women's Assistant Coach after joining the program in July of 2016.

Julian, an eight-time All-American while at USC (1994-97) who won a 200y fly Pac-10 title as a senior, comes to USC after almost 12 years as the Head Coach at Rose Bowl Aquatics.

Julian has been heavily involved in the swimming community for more than three decades. He has served on the Southern California Swimming Board of Directors, was the Pacific Committee Chairperson since 2006 and was a USA Swimming National Select Camp Assistant Coach.

Julian was a 1996 U.S. Olympic Trials finalist in the 200m fly, finishing sixth. His eight All-American honors were highlighted by a second-place finish in the 200y fly at the 1997 NCAA Championships. He was a seven-time Pac-10 finalist, culminating with his conference crown in the 200y fly in 1997.

Also in 1997, he won a U.S. Open title in the 200m fly and won a silver medal in the race while representing the U.S. at the World University Games.

"I am so honored to be back on this amazing campus and excited to do what I can to help our Trojan swimmers and divers reach their goals in life and in the water," said Julian.

"To get a chance to be a part of this incredible tradition again is unbelievable. And to be able to give a little back as a coach to a program that gave me so much as a swimmer is a dream. I can't believe this all worked out so well."

Julian is married to fellow Trojan great Kristine Quance-Julian, herself a nine-time NCAA champion and 1996 Olympic gold medalist. Their son, Trenton, swims at California.



## **VICTORIA ISHIMATSU**

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH • SIXTH YEAR



NCAA champion Victoria Ishimatsu, a five-time All-American, seven-time Pac-12 title winner and the only four-time Pac-12 Women's Diver of the Year is in her sixth year as a volunteer assistant coach at USC.

Ishimatsu, a senior co-captain who completed her undergraduate degree in Human Performance in 2012, finished her distinguished career as a Trojan with her first NCAA title in 2012, winning the 1-meter springboard with 354.10 points. She also earned All-American honors with a seventh-place on 3-meter and she scored again with a 10th on platform. She was named Pac-12 Diver of the Meet for the third year in a row at the 2012 Pac-12 Championships after she won her fourth straight title on 3-meter (386.80) -- becoming the first Pac-12 woman to win four in a row on the same board -- and her third consecutive crown on 1-meter (337.05). She qualified for her fourth trip to the NCAA Championships by winning the 1-meter springboard (626.80) at the 2012 Zone E Championships. She was also second on 3-meter and platform. She was named Pac-12 Women's Diver of the Month for November and February, giving her a record seven monthly honors for her career.

Ishimatsu became the first Pac-10 woman to earn conference Diver of the Year honors three years in a row as a 2011 junior. She was a two-time individual point-scorer at the 2011 NCAA Championships, taking ninth on 1-meter (336.50) and 13th on platform (295.85). She was forced to withdraw from the 3-meter competition after striking her foot during a dive, but was able to come back the next day and score in the platform event. She qualified for the NCAA Championships after sweeping the springboard events at the Zone E Championships, where she scored 643.30 on 1-meter and 631.95 on 3-meter. For the second year in a row, Ishimatsu was named Pac-10 Female Diver of the Meet at the 2011 Pac-10 Championships after repeating as champion on both springboards. She won the 1-meter title with 366.75 points and 3-meter with 357.95. She also reached the finals on platform, taking fourth (265.60). Earlier in the semester, Ishimatsu qualified on all three boards for the first time on the national level at the 2011 U.S. Diving Winter Nationals. She finished fifth on 1-meter springboard, reached the semifinals of 3-meter and competed in the quarterfinals of platform (her first nationals competition on platform).

Ishimatsu, as a 2010 sophomore, had a fantastic season, capping it off with a pair of All-American performances at the NCAA Championships and her second consecutive Pac-10 Women's Diver of the Year award. She first finished fifth on 1-meter springboard (329.15) for the second year in a row and then earned her first All-American honor on 3-meter with a fourth-place finish (357.15), becoming USC's first two-time All-American diver since 2006. She also scored on platform, taking 10th (270.40). At the 2010 Pac-10 Championships, Ishimatsu won her first title on 1-meter (332.80) and won the 3-meter (381.15) for the second year in a row. She was fifth on platform (258.20) and earned Pac-10 Diver of the Meet honors. At the 2010 Zone E Championships, she won both springboards as well ... She was a two-time Pac-10 Women's Diver of the month for November and February. After the season, Ishimatsu teamed with teammate Ariel Rittenhouse to win the bronze medal in women's synchronized 3-meter Tuesday in the final stage of the FINA/Li-Ning Diving World Series meet in Veracruz, Mexico.

As a 2009 freshman, Ishimatsu earned Pac-10 Women's Diver of the Year and Newcomer of the Year honors after she earned All-American honors on the 1-meter springboard at the NCAA Championships, finishing fifth (304.45). She also scored points on platform with a 12th-place mark (260.95) and was 25th on 3-meter (272.25). At the Pac-10 Championships, Ishimatsu won a Pac-10 title on 3-meter (327.70) -- taking the lead on her final dive. She was also second on 1-meter (313.90) and seventh on platform (223.00). USC's



most consistent diver all season, she carried that over to the 2009 Zone E Championships, where she qualified for the NCAA Championships on the first day with a third on 3-meter (583.05). She then took second on 1-meter (572.10) and was third on platform (456.95). During the summer competition, she was fourth on 3-meter synchro at the 2009 FINA Canada Cup.

Ishimatsu took a year off before entering college to prepare for the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials and trained at the U.S. Diving National Training Center. At the Trials, she was sixth on 3-meter, qualifying for the U.S. Diving Olympic Selection Camp. She was up for consideration for the second U.S. slot on 3-meter for the Olympics, but was not selected. At the 2008 U.S. Senior Nationals, she won the 1-meter springboard and was eighth on 3-meter. She also won the 1- and 3-meter springboard at the 2008 USA Junior Nationals.

Ishimatsu graduated from Halstrom High in Oceanside, Calif., in 2007. She won the 1-meter title and was second on 3-meter at the 2007 Junior Pan Am Games and won the 1- and 3-meter titles at the 2007 U.S. Junior Nationals. She was also second on 1-meter and eighth on 3-meter at the 2007 U.S. Senior Nationals. At the 2006 Junior World Championships, she was 13th on 1-meter. At the 2006 J.O. Summer Nationals, she was second on 1-meter and fourth on 3-meter. At the 2005 J.O. Summer Nationals, she was third on 1-meter and 3-meter ... Competed at the 2004 Junior World Championships, taking sixth on 1-meter and 3-meter. Also in 2004, won the J.O. Summer National 3-meter and was second on 1-meter. She was CIF diving champion while attending Los Alamitos High as a 2004 freshman and was an All-American in 2004 and 2005.

Ishimatsu's younger sister, Haley, is a junior on the Trojans. A 2008 Olympian on 10-meter platform and synchro, she competed at Duke in 2011, winning an ACC title, before transferring to USC.

### DAN HERALY

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT • 2ND YEAR



Dan Heraly, a four-year-letter winning collegiate swimmer with NCAA coaching experience, is in his second year as a volunteer assistant coach at USC.

Heraly comes to USC after serving as an assistant coach at Emory & Henry College (Division 3) from 2013-16, where he helped the squad send its first swimmer to the NCAA Championships last season.

The Green Bay, Wisc., native swam for four years at Wisconsin-Milwaukee (2007-11) where he was a 2011 senior captain and helped the Panthers to back-to-back Horizon Conference team titles in 2010 and 2011. He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in youth leadership in 2011.

A middle distance swimmer in college, Heraly owned the UWM's pool record in the 500y free for four years.



## HONGPING LI

HEAD DIVING COACH •  
19TH YEAR

Hongping Li, an NCAA champion and two-time Olympian who has been one of the most successful NCAA coaches for almost two decades, is in his 19th year as USC's head diving coach. He was named to the position on July 1, 1999.

Li is a two-time NCAA Coach of the Year (2002, 2006), an 11-time Pac-12 Women's (2001-02-03-05-06-09-10-11-12-13-14) and two-time Pac-12 Men's (2009, 2016) Diving Coach of the Year. The winner of the 1998 and 1999 United States Olympic Committee's "Diving Developmental Coach of the Year" award, he came to USC after serving as the head coach of the Mission Viejo (Calif.) Nadadores Diving Team since 1993.

Li has had sustained and broad success since joining the USC staff. He has directed nine men's and women's divers to a combined 41 All-American honors, eight NCAA titles and 35 conference titles.

In 2017, Li sent three divers to the NCAAs, including junior Pac-12 Men's Diver of the Year Dashiell Enos, who was a two-time NCAA scorer and earned his first All-American honor with a sixth on platform to go with an 11th on 3-meter. Freshman Henry Fusaro, the Pac-12 Newcomer Diver of the Year, was also a two-time NCAA scorer with consolation appearances on 1-meter and 3-meter. Enos repeated as a Pac-12 champion on 3-meter among three top 5 conference finishes. Sophomore Maddie Witt reached her second NCAAs while she joined freshmen Naomi Gowlett and Carly Souza as Pac-12 finalists.

The 2016 season was another strong campaign for Li and his divers. Li won his second Pac-12 Men's Diving Coach of the Year honor after guiding senior Collin Pollard (platform) and sophomore Dashiell Enos (3-meter) to Pac-12 titles. Pollard was a three-time Pac-12 finalist while Enos and senior Deon Reid were each two-time finalists. Pollard went on to earn his first career All-American honor, reaching the NCAA final on 1-meter while Reid became a first-time NCAA point scorer, finishing 10th on 1-meter. Freshman Maddie Witt led Li's women's squad (all six divers scored in USC's first-ever Pac-12 title team) as a two-time Pac-12 finalist and NCAA qualifier.

Senior Haley Ishimatsu had another strong season in 2015 to highlight Li's divers. She finished second on NCAA platform and won the same event at the Pac-12 Championships to become the first Pac-12 woman to win it three straight years. Junior teammate Sam Adams also qualified for her first NCAAs. A whopping four Trojan men -- senior Jordan Gear, juniors Pollard and Reid and freshman Enos -- all qualified for the NCAA Championships and Pollard scored on 1-meter and platform. Pollard also repeated as a three-time Pac-12 finalist.

In 2014 under Li, Ishimatsu became the first woman to repeat as an NCAA platform champion since 1992-93 when she won the event. She also earned her first All-American honors on 1-meter with a sixth-place finish and scored for the first time on 3-meter with a 13th-place finish. That followed springboard wins at the 2014 NCAA Zone E Championships and titles on 3-meter and platform at the 2014 Pac-12 Championships as she was named Pac-12 Women's Diver of the Year. Adams was a three-time Pac-12 finalist on the women's side while Pollard did the same for the men's team.

The 2013 season saw Li's latest success story emerge as Ishimatsu,

then a sophomore transfer and the younger sister of former USC diving champion Victoria Ishimatsu, set an NCAA record (396.75) en route to the NCAA platform title. She also won the event at the Pac-12 Championships to go with a second on 1-meter and a fourth on 3-meter. Adams was also a two-time Pac-12 finalist as a freshman. On the men's side, Gear repeated as a Pac-12 finalist on platform.

In 2012 under Li, senior Victoria Ishimatsu won her first career NCAA title and became the first conference diver to win the Women's Diver of the Year four straight years (she was also the first to do it three straight). Ishimatsu won the NCAA title on 1-meter and was seventh on 3-meter, finishing with five career All-American honors. She was named Pac-12 Diver of the Meet for the third year in a row at the 2012 Pac-12 Championships after she won her fourth straight title on 3-meter (386.80) -- becoming the first Pac-12 woman to win four in a row on the same board -- and her third consecutive crown on 1-meter (337.05). Gear, as a freshman, was a finalist on platform at the Pac-12s last year, taking fourth.

In 2011, Victoria Ishimatsu was tabbed as the Pac-10 Women's Diver of the Year for the third year in a row after claiming both Pac-12 springboard titles for the second year in a row. She competed in all three boards at the NCAAs, scoring on the 1-meter and platform. Junior Harrison Jones earned All-American honors on 3-meter and won the 1-meter title at Pac-12s. Senior Steven Starks was also a three-time Pac-12 finalist. Also in 2011, Li served as the World Championships USA Diving Team Manager. Li's then-club diver and current Trojan, Haley Ishimatsu (the younger sister of Victoria), won a 2011 U.S. national title on 10-meter.

In 2010, Victoria Ishimatsu earned a pair of All-American honors on 1-meter and 3-meter and was 10th on platform at the NCAA Championships. That followed Pac-10 titles on 1- and 3-meter, which helped her earn Pac-10 Diver of the Meet for the second year in a row. Freshman Ariel Rittenhouse finished 12th on 3-meter at the NCAAs and was second on 1-meter and third on 3-meter at the Pac-10s. On the men's side, Jones scored in two NCAA events and was a three-time Pac-10 finalist, including a title on 1-meter. Starks was a two-time Pac-10 finalist.

Also in 2010, Li served as head coach for the U.S. contingent at the first ever Youth Olympic Games in Singapore and was a FINA World Cup Diving Assistant Coach.

In 2009, Jones (1-meter and platform) and Ishimatsu (1-meter), then both freshmen, earned a combined three All-American honors, becoming the seventh and eighth All-American divers to compete for Li. Jones also was 10th on 3-meter while Victoria Ishimatsu was 12th on platform and Starks scored on platform. In the Pac-10, Jones won a title on platform and was second on both springboards while Starks was a three-time finalist. On the women's side, Ishimatsu won the 3-meter springboard and was second on 1-meter. In the summer of 2009, Li served as the head coach for the U.S. World Championships squad as well as at the international Canada Open Grand Prix. Also in 2009, club diver Haley Ishimatsu won a silver medal at the 2009 World Championships on 10m synchro.

In 2008, Starks, as a freshman, was an NCAA point scorer on platform and was a three-time Pac-10 finalist, including a second-place on platform. Freshman Christine Petrilli was third on both 1-meter and springboard at the Pac-10 Championships while senior Kim Popp was also a two-time Pac-10 finalist on the same boards. Also in 2008, Li worked for the USOC at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing as part of the administrative staff that bridged cultural and language gaps between U.S. and China coaches and athletes. While in Beijing, he was able to watch club divers Rittenhouse (springboard synchro) and Haley Ishimatsu (platform synchro) become Olympic finalists.

In 2007, Kenny Jenkins became the sixth USC diver to garner All-American honors under Li with a fifth place on platform at the 2007 NCAA Championships. Both Jenkins and fellow senior Michael Hilde scored individually at the NCAA Championships in both the 1-meter springboard and platform. Also, Popp reached the NAAs for the second year in a row and scored for the first time with a 12th-place finish on platform.

In 2006, Blythe Hartley won her fourth and fifth career NCAA titles with wins on the 1-meter and 3-meter springboard while Hilde made his All-American debut on 3-meter. Hartley, who also earned her 12th (a maximum for a diver) All-American honor with a final appearance on platform, was named NCAA Women's Diver of the Year for the second time. Her five career NCAA titles is tied for second among NCAA women divers. She also won her seventh and eighth career Pac-10 titles (a Pac-10 record). Junior Michael Hilde earned his first career All-American honor with an eighth-place on 3-meter at the NAAs and he won his second career Pac-10 platform title (Troy's fourth in a row in the event). In addition to Hilde, Jenkins qualified for his first NCAA Championships, marking the third straight year USC has had two men at the NAAs. It was the seventh year in a row USC featured at least one All-American diver under Li.

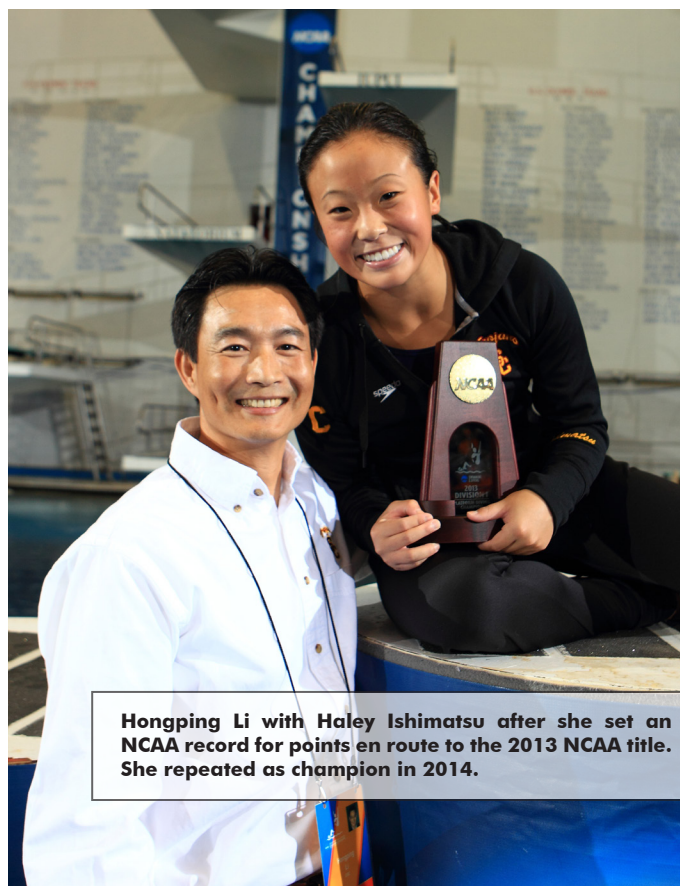
In 2005, Hartley won her third career NCAA title while Ray Vincent earned his third consecutive All-American honors on the platform. Hartley was named 2005 NCAA and Pac-10 women's diver of the year after winning the NCAA 3-meter title and her fifth and sixth career Pac-10 titles a few weeks earlier. She went on to win her second career World Championship gold medal on 1-meter in July, 2005, in Montreal. Vincent also won a Pac-10 title on platform and Troy's men's diving contingent was the highest scoring unit of the meet.

In 2004, Vincent earned All-American honors on the platform, continuing Li's streak of having Trojans earn All-American honors each year he's been at USC. Hilde won his first Pac-10 platform title weeks earlier. Additionally, Hartley represented Canada at the 2004 Olympics (winning bronze on platform synchro) while Li's club diver Rachelle Kunkel made the U.S. team placing 9th on 3-meter springboard. Li was also an assistant coach on the 2004 U.S. Olympic Diving team.

In 2003, three of Li's divers earned All-American honors. Vincent became Li's first men's diver at USC to do so, taking third in the platform at the 2003 NCAA Championships. At the women's NAAs, Hartley was a three-time All-American while Nicci Fusaro earned one All-American honor. Hartley also swept the 2003 Pac-10 Championship diving events on the women's side (Fusaro took a pair of seconds) and Vincent won the platform title in the men's meet. For their efforts, Li was named 2003 Pac-10 Women's Coach of the Year for the third consecutive season and Hartley was named Pac-10 Women's Diver of the Year for the second straight year.

Li also served as head coach for the U.S. Diving team that competed at the 2003 Grand Prix Diving Championships in Rome, Italy.

He earned NCAA Coach of the Year honors after directing the women's diving squad to superb results at the 2002 NCAA Championships. Hartley won a pair of NCAA titles and made three finals appearances on her way to 2002 NCAA Wom-

en's Diver of the Year while Fusaro also made three NCAA finals appearances. Senior diver Kellie Brennan also scored and just missed earning All-American honors. Also in 2002, Hartley won a silver and a bronze at the 2002 Commonwealth Games while Fusaro qualified for the 2002 U.S. national team.

In 2001, Li guided Brennan to a pair of All-American honors (and her third consecutive Pac-10 1-meter title) and Fusaro to her first at the 2001 NAAs. Both also reached the top three at the 2001 U.S. Indoor Championships. Brennan was named Pac-10 Diver of the Year, Fusaro was tabbed as Newcomer of the Year and Li earned his first Pac-10 Coach of the Year honor. A year earlier in 2000, Li helped guide Brennan to her first two All-American honors.

Li, 51, was named the 1998 and 1999 U.S. Diving Outstanding Age Group Coach of the Year, was a U.S. team coach at the 1999 Pan Am Games, the 1998 World Diving Championships, the 1998 Goodwill Games and the 1997 World Junior Championships, and earned the Coach of Excellence award at the 1995 Senior National Championships.

At Mission Viejo, he produced eight Junior National champions who won a combined 20 individual titles. Among the elite divers Li coached was Erica Sorgi, who captured

five senior national titles since 1996.

Li led the Nadadores to the 1998 Junior National Championships team title as well as every Western National team title since 1996. He served as an assistant coach at Mission Viejo from 1989-93, helping the club to consecutive junior team titles from 1991-93.

Originally from Beijing, Li was a 12-time national champion and a two-time Olympian while competing for China. He finished fourth on the 3-meter springboard at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles, earned gold medals on platform at the 1981 FINA World Cup in Mexico City and the 1981 World University Games and won bronze on 3-meter at the 1986 World Championships. He also qualified for the 1980 Olympics, but did not compete because of the Chinese boycott.

Li attended USC from 1985-89 and received a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1989. He won an NCAA title in the 3-meter springboard as a freshman in 1986 and earned All-American honors in the 1-meter springboard. He also earned Pac-10 titles in the 1- and 3-meter springboards that same year. He was not eligible to compete after 1986 because of an NCAA age rule.

Li lives in La Palma, Calif., with his wife, Ling. Their daughter, Amanda, is a USC graduate.

# Uytengsu Aquatics Center

## New Home of USC Swimming and Diving and Water Polo

Thanks to an \$8 million gift from former USC men's swimming captain Wilfred "Fred" Uytengsu as well as the generosity of a host of other donors, USC boasts a new home for its swimming and diving and water polo teams.

The \$8 million gift - the largest ever made to the Athletic Department by a former student-athlete - helped fund the Uytengsu Aquatics Center, which officially opened on Feb. 21, 2014.

At Uytengsu's request, the center's swimming pool was named for his swim coach, Peter Daland, honoring Daland's legendary contributions to USC's aquatics program. Daland guided the Trojans from 1958 to 1992, and won nine national titles and 17 conference crowns.

"The USC community takes such profound pride in its student-athletes, and Mr. Uytengsu's gift sends a strong message of support," said President C. L. Max Nikias at the time of Uytengsu's initial gift. "Thanks to his extraordinary generosity, the university will create world-class facilities for our world-class athletes."

"We are extremely grateful for this transformative gift from Fred Uytengsu and his family," said Pat Haden, inaugural holder of USC's Charles Griffin Cale Director of Athletics' Chair. "It signifies their tremendous commitment to take our aquatics facilities - in which more than 20 national championships have been won - to the next level. The gift will also greatly enhance the experience of our swimming, diving and water polo team members."

Said USC head coach Dave Salo: "Fred's gift is one purely of the heart. I have never met a man

with such humility and integrity. He epitomizes what it means to be a USC graduate, with a true Trojan spirit. This lasting gift is not only a tribute to Fred's generosity and love for his alma mater, but also a great acknowledgment of the man who made USC swimming and diving what it is today - Peter Daland."

"Fred's gift will have an impact beyond brick and mortar," Salo continued. "The design of the new facility will make the spectator experience so much more enjoyable, and USC student-athletes of today and tomorrow will have greater access to their coaches and trainers and the unique opportunity to train in a world class facility."

The Uytengsu Aquatics Center is a state-of-the-art aquatics facility, including a new diving dry-land training area, a new dive tower, new men's and women's swimming, diving and water polo locker and team rooms, new coaches offices for swimming and diving, a multi-purpose room to support activities in the facility, a new scoreboard with video capabilities with a stadium that will seat up to 2,500

that includes a shade structure and a new entry on McClintock Avenue.

"I look back at my learnings and experiences at USC with fond memories and realize how many life lessons came from my education there," said Uytengsu. "Without a doubt, swimming at USC - and for Coach Daland - was a great opportunity. And I am now pleased to be able to give back and support the university's goal of upgrading facilities."

"It is my hope that future Trojan swimmers, divers and water polo players will benefit from the new Uytengsu Aquatics Center and help keep these programs amongst the best in the U.S. I am also pleased to be able to name the pool after Peter Daland, who deserves to be recognized not just for his nine NCAA Championships, but also for the profound impact he had on all of the swimmers he coached over his 35 seasons as head coach of USC Men's Swimming. Indeed the future is bright. Fight On!"

Fred Uytengsu graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from USC's Marshall School of Business's Entrepreneurship program in 1983. A freshman walk-on swimmer, by his senior year, Uytengsu was captain of USC's swim team. He is president and chief executive officer of Alaska Milk Corporation, the leading publicly listed consumer foods company in the Philippines. The company, which engages in the manufacture, distribution and sale of liquid, powdered and ultra-heat treated milk products in the Philippines, was founded by Uytengsu's late father, Wilfred Sr., in 1972, and is based in Makati City, Philippines.

The Uytengsu family also owns the Alaska Aces, a professional basketball team that has won 13 Philippine Basketball Association championships since joining the association in 1986. In addition, Fred Uytengsu, a triathlete, is credited with bringing the Ironman and Xterra races to the Philippines.

Uytengsu is married to fellow USC alum Kerri (Dunn) Uytengsu '84, and the couple has three children. Their daughter Ashton graduated from USC in 2009.

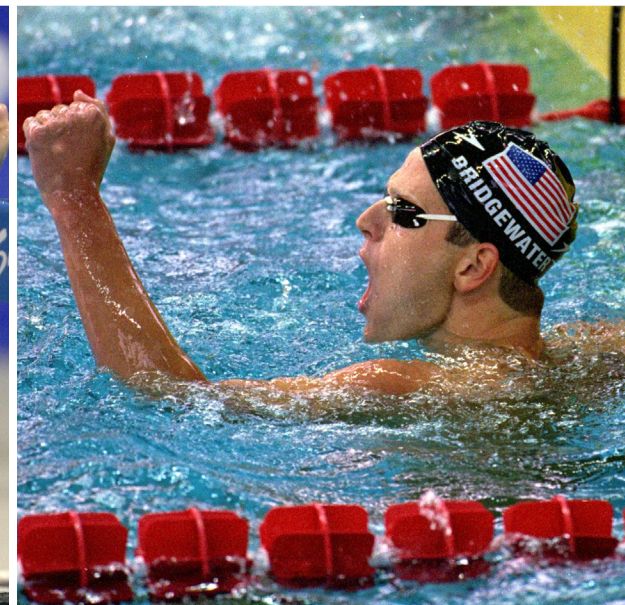

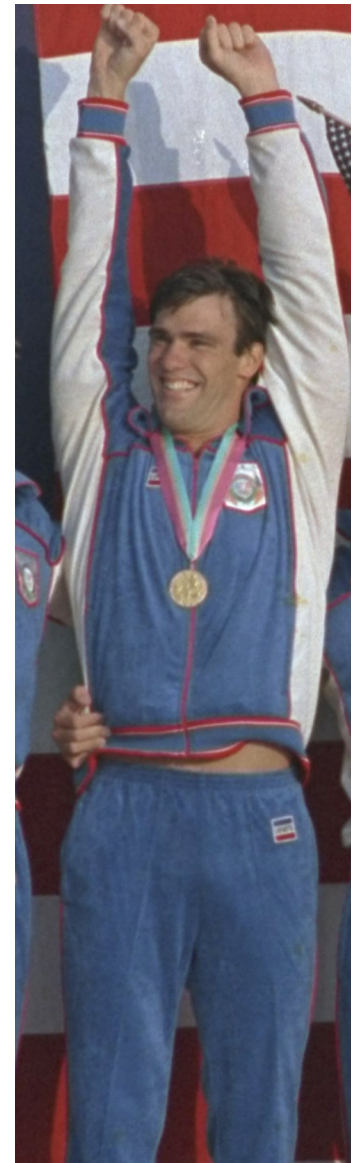

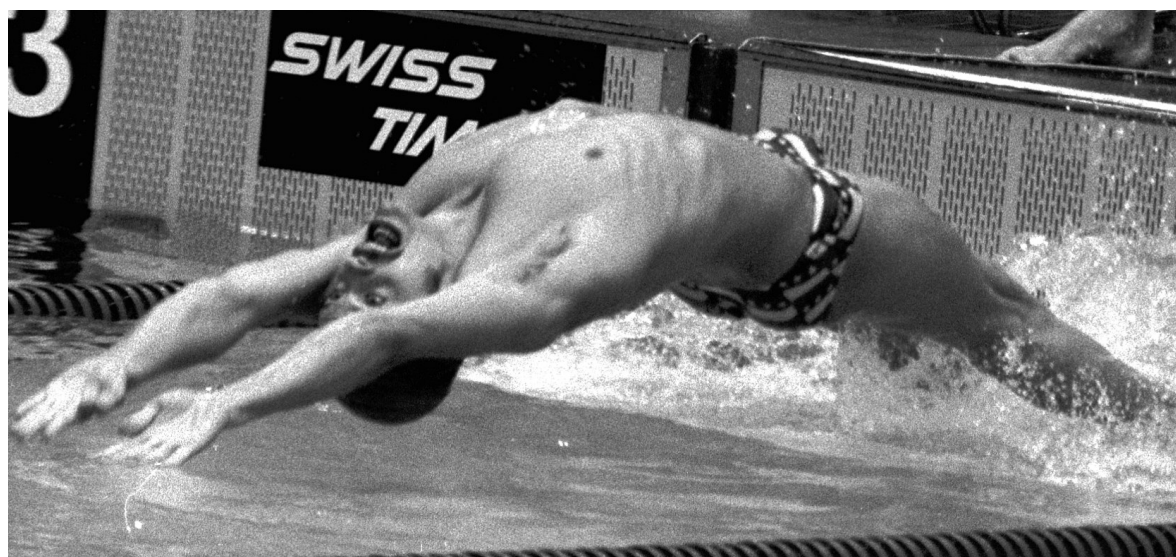

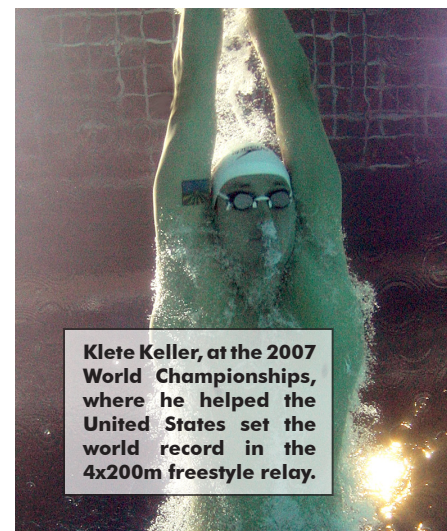

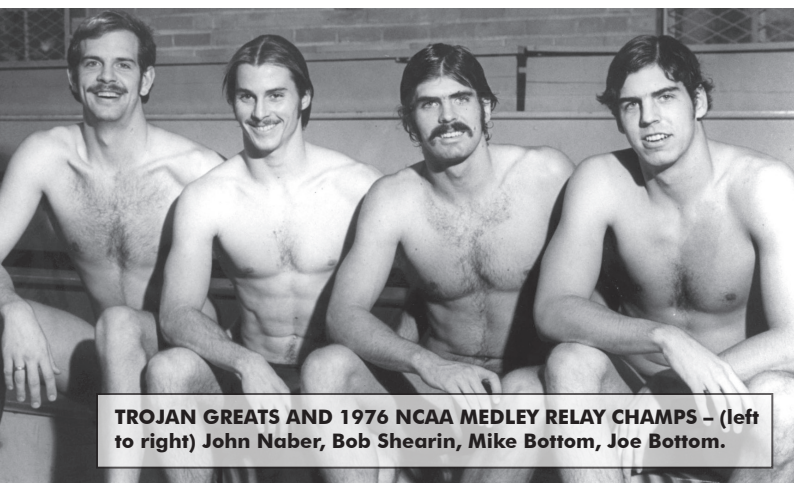

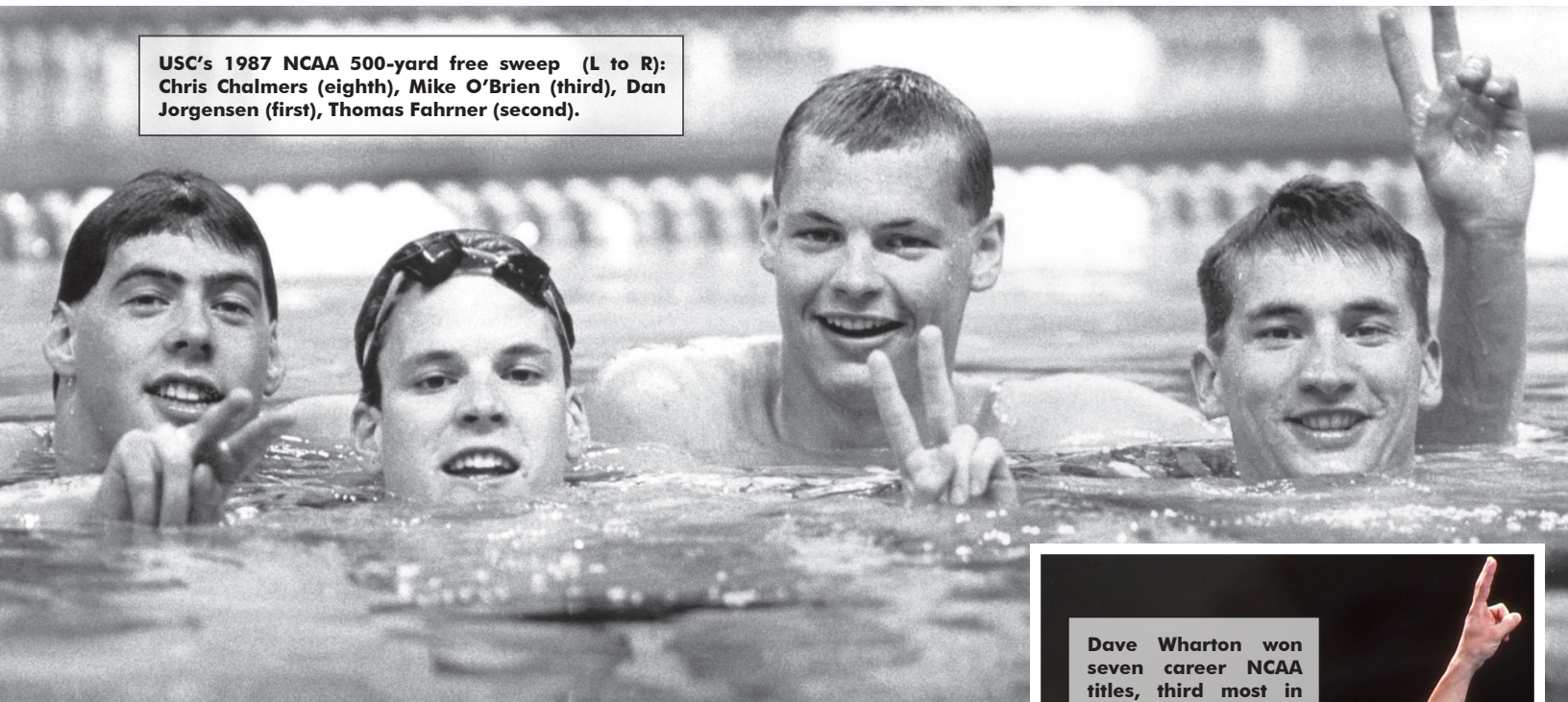

# Swim With Mike

Swim With Mike is an annual swim-a-thon held to raise money for the Physically Challenged Athletes Scholarship Fund. Established in 1981, the Swim was scheduled to be a one-time event organized by friends and teammates on behalf of former USC swimmer Mike Nyeholt, a three time All-American who was paralyzed from the chest down following a motorcycle accident suffered in January of 1981.

Initially called Swim For Mike, the event was first held on March 7, 1981, to raise money to purchase a specially equipped van for Nyeholt. A week prior to the first Swim, Nyeholt was still in the hospital, and his supporters planned to show him a video of the fund-raiser once it was over.

To everyone's surprise, Nyeholt traveled by ambulance to make an appearance at the first event. More than \$58,000 was raised that day, far exceeding the amount needed to purchase the van. At his suggestion, the excess funds were used to create the Physically Challenged Athletes Scholarship Fund at the University of Southern California, the only one of its kind in the country.

Inspired by the overwhelming support, Nyeholt promised to swim in the future to raise money for the other disabled athletes. He kept his promise and swam the following year, and with his participation in the pool, Swim For Mike was appropriately renamed Swim With Mike. Nyeholt

now co-chairs the organizing committee for the annual event, which has raised over \$20 million and provided over 215 scholarships to physically challenged athletes at more than 100 universities from Washington, D.C., to Honolulu.

## USC Endowed Scholarships

In 2009, USC Athletics announced the latest swimming endowed scholarship, named after Mark A. Mader, the All-American Trojan swimmer who passed away in 2008.

A nine-time All-American who lettered from 1968-1970, Mader was a part of three NCAA champion relays, winning the 800y free relay in 1969 and 1970 and the 400y free relay in 1970.

He was also a five-time Pac-8 champion, winning four titles in 1968 (100y and 200y back and 800y free and 400y medley relays) and one in 1969 (800y free relay).

He was a member of USC swim teams that finished second at the 1969 and 1970 NCAA meets, as well as third in 1968. The Trojans won Pac-8 crowns in 1968 and 1969, then placed second in 1970.

One of USC's tallest swimmers ever at 6-foot-9, he went to high school in Pullman, Wash., where he returned after college to become a wheat farmer.

The Mader scholarship is the third for the swim team. The other are the Kathy Mika Endowed Scholarship and the Giles Pellerin Endowed Scholarship.



## Trojans Top Pac-12 All-Century Team

USC had a conference-best 10 swimmers and divers on the Pac-12 All-Century Men's Swimming & Diving team announced in February of 2016 and the Trojans' legendary Peter Daland was tabbed as the "Coach of the Century," by a 32-person panel.

The Trojans' 10 selections were followed by Stanford (7), California (5), UCLA (4), Arizona (3.5), Arizona State (2) and Washington (0.5).

A panel of 20 coaches, swimmers, administrators and members of the media selected the team consisting of 26 swimmers and six divers, plus a Coach, Swimmer & Diver of the Century.

The top four vote-earners in each of the six disciplines made the All-Century Team, with two additional "wildcard" swimmers selected by a second vote of the remaining 5th, 6th

and 7th place finishers. The top two divers in each of the three events also made the All-Century Team. Swimmers and divers could be nominated in more than one event, with three earning roster spots in multiple events.

Longtime USC men's swimming head coach Peter Daland was voted the Men's Swimming & Diving 'Coach of the Century'. Daland led the Trojans to nine NCAA team championships during his 35-year tenure. Under Daland from 1958 through 1992, USC also placed second at the NCAA meet 11 times, won 17 league crowns and posted a 318-31-1 (.917) dual meet record. A six-time National Coach of the Year, his swimmers captured 93 NCAA and 155 Pac-10 individual and relay titles. USC went undefeated in dual meets in 20 of his seasons. His 1977 team is regarded as the finest collegiate swim team

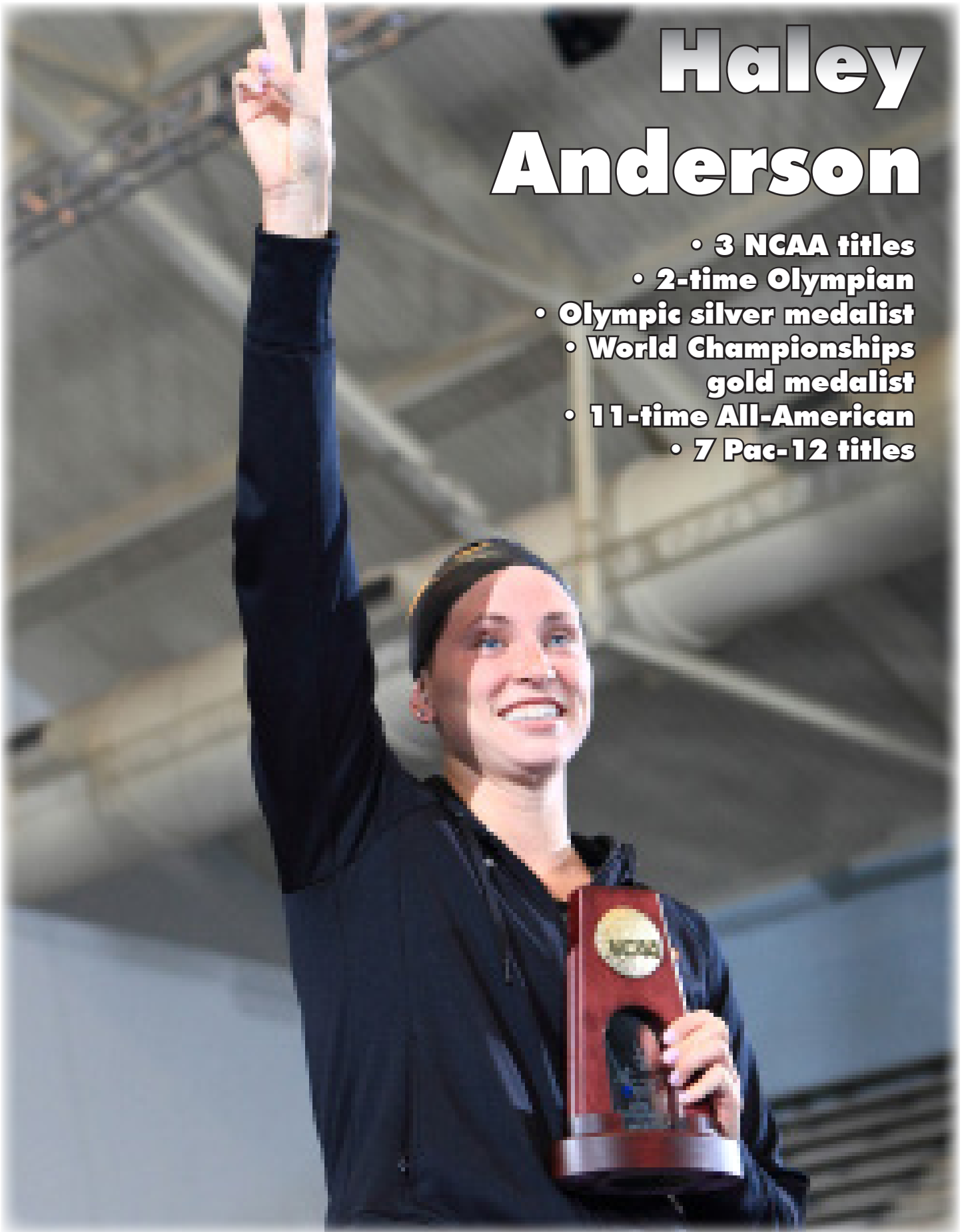
ever. Daland spent more than 45 years coaching at the club and college levels. He coached the U.S. men in the 1972 Olympics as they won nine gold medals and the U.S. women in the 1964 Games as they captured six golds. Daland also won 17 national AAU titles (15 men's at USC and two women's at the Los Angeles Athletic Club). USC finished first or second in the AAU meet a phenomenal 20 times in Daland's 35 years.

In addition to Daland, USC's selections included Brian Earley on Platform, Steve Furniss, Erik Vendt and Dave Wharton in the IM, Bruce Furniss and Joe Bottom in Freestyle Sprints (50-200), Lenny Krayzelburg and John Naber in the Backstroke, Murray Rose in Freestyle Distance and current Trojan head diving coach Hongping Li on 1-meter.

One of the most respected collegiate and international swim coaches in history, Peter Daland retired from coaching in April of 1992 after 35 years at USC and more than 45 years of coaching at the club and college levels.

He remained actively involved in the sport throughout this life, serving on U.S.A. Swimming's International Relations Committee as the sport's liaison for Europe and attending the annual European Championships after retirement.

He died on Oct. 20, 2014, at the age of 93. A memorial service held a month later to honor Daland's life drew hundreds of former Trojans, colleagues and friends who celebrated the legendary coach's influence on their lives, in and out of the pool.

During his tenure at USC, Daland led the Troy to nine NCAA team championships – the second most in NCAA history – and 93 NCAA individual and relay titles. He also won 17 national AAU titles (15 men's at USC and two women's at the L.A. Athletic Club.). USC finished first or second in the country a phenomenal 20 times in Daland's 35 years.

Daland's teams enjoyed tremendous success at the conference level as well, winning the league title 17 of the Pac-10's 32 years. Trojan swimmers captured 155 Pac-10 individual and relay titles under Daland. His dual meet record was unparalleled: 318-31-1 (.917) in 35 seasons. USC went undefeated in dual meets in 20 seasons and his 1977 team might have been the finest collegiate swim team ever.

Among the world class swimmers he has coached are John Naber, winner of four Olympic golds and 10 NCAA titles; American record holders Dave Wharton and Mike O'Brien; Olympic stars Roy Saari, Murray Rose, Jeff Float, Joe and Mike Bottom and Bruce and Steve Furniss.

Yet just as important is the success Daland's swimmers had out of the pool. Seven Trojan swimmers went on to win NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships and three former Trojans were recipients of the NCAA's prestigious Today's Top Six Award (Steve Furniss, Wharton and Naber).

At the international level, Daland stands as one of the world's most successful coaches. He led two of the most powerful United States teams ever in Olympic competition – the 1972 men's team that won nine gold medals and the 1964 women's squad that captured six of eight golds. He also guided American teams to impressive victories in meets against East Germany and the USSR in 1971 and

at the World University Games in 1973.

Administratively, Daland was the longtime swimming chairman for the World University Games (Universiade) since 1983, recently retiring from the post. He was the USA delegate to the International Swimming Federation Congress (FINA) in 1991 and 1995. Daland also served as the president of the American Swimming Coaches Association.

Daland's Trojan swimmers did exceptionally well on the international scene, highlighted by seven gold and two silver medals at the 1976 Olympics in Montreal – more medals than any country except the United States.

Daland was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 1989-90 and was a six-time national Coach of the Year (1971 – NCAA Coaches Association; 1962 – American Swimming Coaches; 1973 – American Swimmer; 1964-66 – Columbus Touch-down Club). He was presented the Ousely Award for Outstanding Service to ASCA in 1992).

In 1975, Daland was awarded the prestigious "national AAU Swimming Award," given to the person who has contributed the most to swimming. The College Swimming Coaches Association of American presented him with the 1976 "Collegiate and Scholastic Swimming Trophy" for his contributions to swimming as a competitive sport and a healthy recreation activity.

He is also involved in a number of swimming-related activities. Daland, who founded Swimming World and Junior Swimmer, was a member of the 1984 Olympic Organizing Committee and was the competition chairman for swimming events at the 1984 Games. Daland formerly directed two coaches' clinics in the United States and conducted overseas clinics and domestic media tours to promote swimming for the Phillips Petroleum Company. He was a member of the Speedo International Advisory Coaches Board and has organized clinics in 40 countries.

Originally from New York City, Daland is a 1948 graduate of Swarthmore College in Pennsylvania. His first coaching job was at Rose Valley (Penn.), where he took the club swim team to eight consecutive Suburban League titles (1947-55). He founded and was the first head coach of the Suburban Swimming Club in Philadelphia (1950-55) and served as an assistant swim coach at Yale University from 1950-54).





# Mark Schubert

**Led USC to 1997 NCAA women's team title • Produced 179 All-Americans and 30 NCAA and 76 Pac-10 individual and relay titles**

Mark Schubert had the unenviable task of following the legendary Peter Daland when he took over as the head men's swimming coach at USC in 1993.

But Schubert thrived in the role and, after becoming the women's head coach in 1994, spent more than a decade guiding one of top swim programs in the country.

Under Schubert, USC won 12 men's and 18 women's NCAA individual titles and 42 men's and 34 women's Pac-10 individual titles. Schubert, who led USC to its only women's NCAA team championships in 1997, also produced 97 men's All-Americans and 82 women's All-Americans.

The USC men's team finished among the top 10 at the NCAA Championships 12 times in 14 seasons with Schubert at the helm, including 10 times in the top 7. Schubert's women's squads finished no lower than 10th at the NCAA Championships in any of his 13 years as head coach, finishing in the top 7 11 times and in the top 4 four times.

Also while with the Trojans, Schubert guided USC squads to U.S. titles at the 2001 and 2006 Spring Nationals and led Trojan Swim Club to championships at the 1999 Spring and Summer and 2003 Summer Nationals.

One of the United States' most recognizable and successful coaches of all-time, Schubert was inducted into the International Swimming Hall of Fame in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., on Jan. 10, 1997 as "Honor Coach." The same year, he also was named Coach of the Year by five organizations: American Swimming Coaches Association, United States Olympic Committee, United States Swimming, NCAA and Pac-10. Two years later, he earned a trio of Coach of the Year awards in 1999, coming from the USOC, ASCA and USS.

Schubert's international coaching experience was highlighted by his seven consecutive coaching appearances with U.S. Olympic swim teams. He was the United States Swimming head coach in 2004, headed the men's team in 2000, was an assistant in 1996 and was head coach in 1992.

Schubert was an assistant for the combined men's and women's teams in 1980, 1984 and 1988. He was also the head coach of the 1982 U.S. World Championship team and was an assistant on the 1978, 1982, 1986, 1991, 1994, 1998 and 2003 World Championships staffs.

With such extensive experience with America's swimming elite, he was a natural pick when U.S. Swimming was looking for a permanent head coach. He was named the national team head coach and general manager by U.S. Swimming in March of 2006. He held the position until retiring in 2010. In 2011 he returned to coaching, working with Janet Evans as she attempted an Olympic comeback.

In his 35-plus years of coaching prior to joining U.S. Swimming, Schubert placed 38 swimmers on U.S. Olympic teams; those athletes won 23 gold and 11 silver medals, plus eight world championship titles. Even more impressive, Schubert's swimmers have broken 27 world and more than 115 American records and have won more than 200 U.S. national titles.

Schubert produced success early in his career, first as head coach of the Mission Viejo Nadadores from 1972-85, where his teams won a record 44 U.S. National team titles during his tenure. He served as head coach of the Mission Bay Makos Swim Team in Boca Raton, Fla., which won nine national team titles from 1986-89. Schubert next worked as Texas's head women's coach from 1989-92, leading the Longhorns to two NCAA team titles (1990 and 1991). He was named NCAA Coach of the Year in 1990.

His swimming-related duties include serving on the American Swimming Coaches Association (ASCA) Board of Directors since 1975. He is a former vice-president and member of the Board of Directors of the College Swim Coaches Association of America.

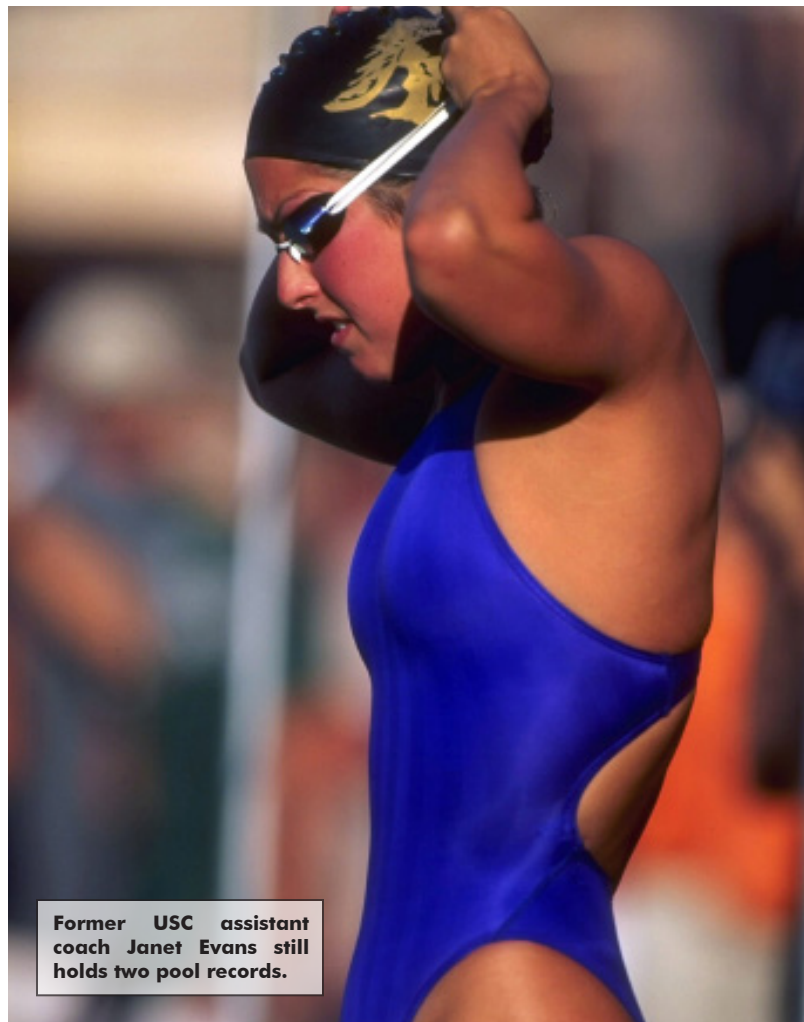

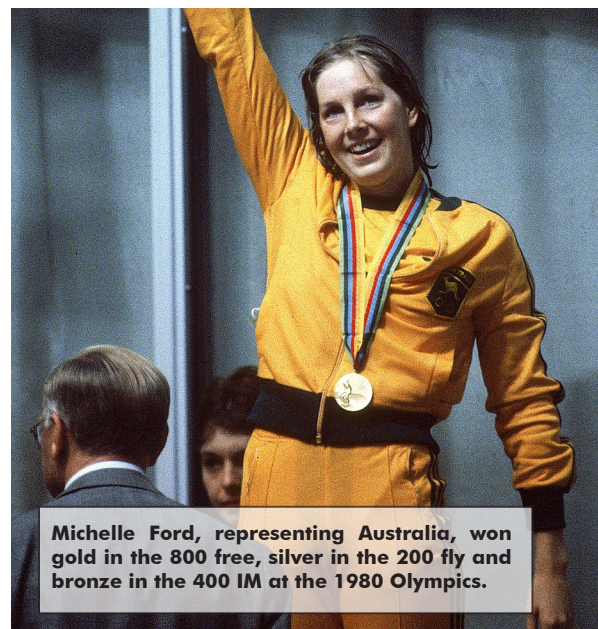

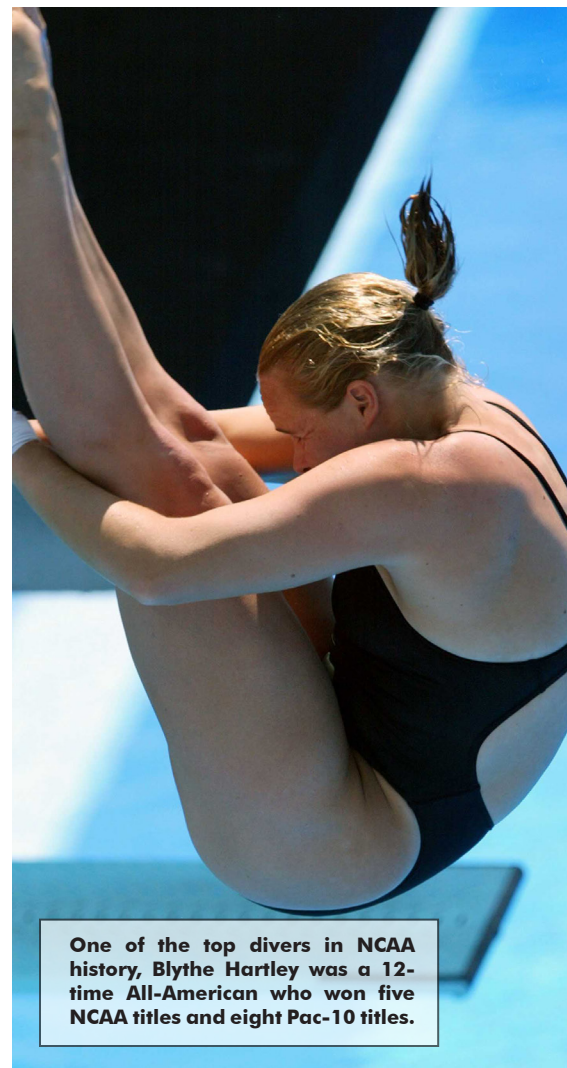

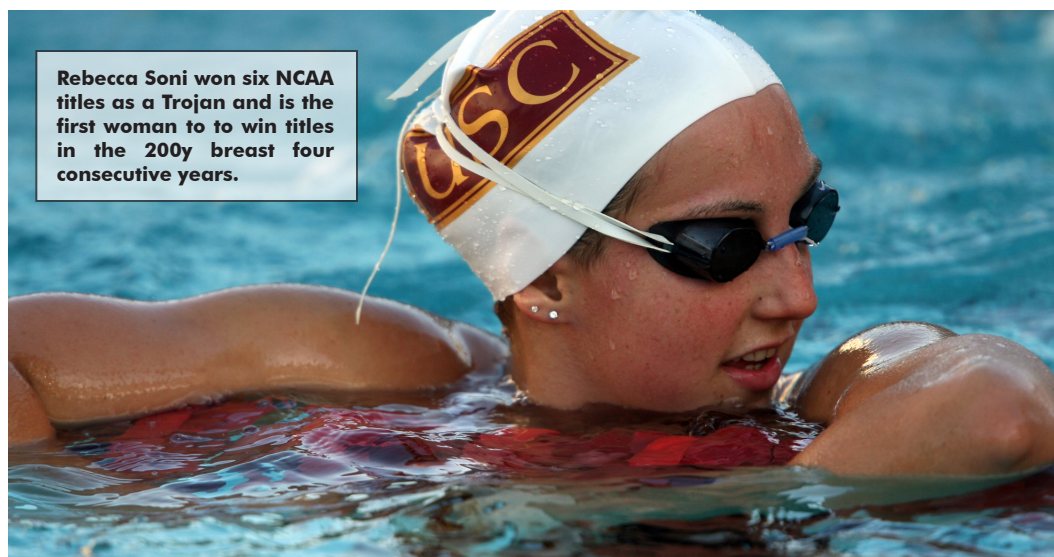

# USC Women Dominate Pac-12 All-Century Team

USC had a conference-best 10 swimmers and divers on the Pac-12 All-Century Women's Swimming & Diving team determined in the winter of 2016

This team of Olympians and national champions was selected by a panel of 25 coaches, swimmers, administrators and media members. The top four vote-getters in each of the six disciplines; two additional "wild card" swimmers qualified via a second vote of the remaining fifth, sixth and seventh place finishers. To determine the All-Century divers, the top two divers in each of the three disciplines were selected.

To ensure that the team truly encapsulated the past century of Pac-12 women's swimming and diving, 10 Pre-Title IX nominees were included on the ballot. These standout swimmers and divers attended Pac-12 universities but did not compete collegiately due to the lack of opportunities for women in intercollegiate athletics at the time.

USC's 10 women named to the team included Cynthia "Sippy" Woodhead (Freestyle Sprints), Haley Anderson and Lindsay Benko-Mintenko (Freestyle Distance), Rebecca Soni (Breaststroke), Katinka Hosszu (Butterfly), Kris-

tine Quance-Julian (Individual Medley and Butterfly), Kaitlin Sandeno (Butterfly), Blythe Hartley (1-Meter, 3-Meter), Victoria Ishimatsu (1-Meter), Haley Ishimatsu (Platform). Quance-Julian was one of four swimmers who made the squad in more than one specialty.
