EIGHT MPSF PLAYERS OF THE YEAR | 10 NATIONAL PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

A former All-American who scored the game-winning goal in USC's first-ever national championship, Marko Pintaric finished his USC playing career before he had the chance to defend the Trojans' 1998 NCAA title.

In his 18 years since on the coaching staff, he has helped five USC men's water polo teams successfully defend their NCAA crowns. Now, as the head coach, Pintaric has the opportunity to set up defense of another NCAA trophy.

The Trojans roared to the program's first 30-win season last season, with Pintaric serving as a co-head coach. With a program-record 10 All-Americans on the roster, the 2018 Trojans won it all in a 14-12 championship victory over host Stanford, collecting USC's 10th men's national championship.

As this 2019 men's season unfurls, USC is ranked No. 1 in the nation and Pintaric stands atop the program as USC's new men's and women's head coach. With 20 years of experience at Troy, Pintaric is primed to lead his Trojans into battle in pursuit of yet another national championship. Coming into 2019, the USC men have reached an unprecedented 14 consecutive NCAA title matches. That rally was sparked by a 2005 championship, highlighted by a run of six straight championships won from 2008-2013 and then capped with this latest 2018 trophy. The plan, as ever, is to add to the collection in 2019.

"The momentum from last year's championship is still with us," Pintaric said. "We have the personnel to achieve it. We return a big part of our team from last year, with players who know the system and who know what it takes to get into the final. That's always the goal in this program – to reach the final and win a national championship."

It's a balanced unit of veterans and new faces for 2019. Senior captains Marin Dasic, Matt Maier and Sam Slobodien are seasoned, savvy and certain leaders for a USC roster brimming with talent. They are three of eight returning All-Americans, including a power pack of four of 2018 newcomers who exploded onto the scene in their first seasons as Trojans. Sophomores Hannes Daube, Jake Ehrhardt and Nic Porter and junior Jacob Mercep made indelible marks on the stat sheets for USC last year, and they are in full stride for 2019. Daube, Ehrhardt and junior Marko Vavic also combine forces in training with the U.S. National Team, with Daube and Vavic on-hand over the summer to help Team USA qualify for the Olympic Games, while Ehrhardt captained the USA's World University Games team to a silver medal. Aussie goalie Porter and Croatian product Mercep represent possibly one of the most daunting one-two punches out there, as Porter stops shots on the defensive end while Mercep scores them at the other.

For Pintaric, his trio of captains set the tone and provide leadership in and out of the water.

"They've played in three championships and won it all last year," Pintaric said of Dasic, Maier and Slobodien. "They have set the goal to get the team with them to their fourth final. They're doing a great job of being a coach's voice in the locker room, communicating our team culture and teaching the new guys what USC is all about.

"This program achieves its goals through hard work and team effort. We put the team above personal interests. I've very happy with the way this group is progressing. They are very united in what we're trying to accomplish inside and outside the water. Our veterans are playing an integral role in keeping the team chemistry at a high level."

While Dasic, Maier and Slobodien are in their final seasons of competition, there are three other Trojans entering their fourth years with the program. Redshirt juniors Troy Furniss, Luka Karaman and Luke Wyatt also play a hefty leadership role for the group. Their dedication and hard work, too, have lifted all of them into significant contribution roles in the water as well. A lefty, Wyatt punched up 23 goals for the Trojan cause last season, including one in the NCAA Championship game. Karaman and Furniss factored in for 12 goals apiece in 2018.

With a year under their caps, several other returning Trojans are primed to reach a raised bar in 2019. Alexander Lansill and James Kolenda each enter their sophomore seasons slated for bigger roles in the USC gameplan. So, too, will redshirt freshmen Corey Allan and Bennett Winther see their hard work and diligence pay off as they dig in for their first official action as Trojans.

In goal, returning All-American Porter will be pushed once more by teammate Vaios Vlahotasios, who was also a newcomer to the USC cage in 2018 and who has proven himself a shot-stopping force to reckon with as well. Porter and Vlahotasios are a formidable goalie tandem for the Trojans, and are joined by freshman Garrett Allen and sophomore Jere Ashby as USC's talented goalkeeping corps for 2019.

Goalie Allen is one of 11 new Trojans set to see their first splashdown in Cardinal and Gold.

"With this new group as a whole we have every position covered," Pintaric said. "Grayden Reynolds is working extremely hard as a center, and Henry Saunders is very good addition, very physical and very studious. We also have a great outside shooting threat in Chris Sturtevant, Stefan Vavic and Marcus Longton – they've proven themselves as good offensive threats. I'm also happy with our blue-collar players like Matt Harrison, Chris Agliozzo, Emmett Pernecky, Payne Fama and Patrick Burke who bring in competition in every aspect of the game."

MARKO PINTARIC

HEAD COACH

1ST SEASON (19TH OVERALL AT USC)

Former USC All-American Marko Pintaric is in his 19th season on the USC staff, and now serves as head coach of the USC men's and women's teams. Pintaric spent the previous three seasons as co-head coach for the USC men after three seasons as an associate head coach. From 2015-19, Pintaric also served as the scouting director for the USC women. Prior to 2015, Pintaric was as assistant coach to both the USC men and women.

In all, Pintaric has been on the USC staff for nine men's NCAA titles and five USC women's national championships.

A member of USC's 1998 national championship team as a player, he has been on the USC coaching staff for nine USC men's title runs and six women's NCAA crowns.

Pintaric was a two-year starter for the Trojans in 1997 and 1998. He recorded 44 goals during the Trojans' 1998 national championship season and earned National Player of the Year and first team All-America honors. He also earned second team All-America honors in 1997. Pintaric was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team both years. He transferred to USC from the University of Zagreb in Croatia, where he was a member of the Croatian Junior National Team (1989-94).

Along with his current coaching experience, Pintaric served as the varsity coach at Loyola High in Los Angeles during the 1999-2000 school year. He has played club for Shores and Los Angeles Water Polo, and currently plays for the New York Athletic Club, where he also was a member of the 2001 summer national championship team and four consecutive winter national championship teams (1999-2002).

In November 2012, Pintaric joined interim head coach Jovan Vavic on the coaching staff for the U.S. Men's National Team, helping lead Team USA to World Championship qualification with success at the 2013 UANA World Aquatic Championship Qualification Tournament in Canada.

Pintaric graduated from USC in 2000 with a degree in communications and earned his master's in 2003 in communications management. He and his wife, Beatrice, have two sons, Francesco and Filip.

Casey Moon enters his 12th season on the USC staff. He first joined the USC coaching staff in 2007, just a year before the Trojan men began their six-year run of national championships, and has also helped the Women of Troy win four NCAA titles since coming to USC. As of 2019, Moon has moved into a dual role as associate head coach for the USC men's and women's teams. He previously served as the USC men's director of player personnel and as the USC women's associate head coach for four seasons, and was an assistant on both sides from 2007-14.

In all, Moon has been on the USC staff for six men's NCAA championship runs (2008, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2018) and four NCAA titles by the women (2010, 2013, 2016, 2018). Moon also served as interim women's head coach during the 2019 season.

Moon served as an assistant coach for the U.S. National Team for the 2013 UANA World Aquatic Championship Qualification Tournament, helping Team USA qualify for the FINA World Championships. He also was head coach of the Trojan Water Polo Club Under-21 team for five years.

Prior to coming to USC, Moon served as an assistant coach for Trojan Water Polo Club and as head coach at Santa Cruz High School. Moon also was an assistant for Wax'em Water Polo Club in Santa Cruz. As a player, Moon competed at UC Santa Cruz, graduating in 2004 with degrees in biology and legal studies. In high school, Moon was a four-year varsity swimmer and water polo player at St. John Bosco, where he was named MVP as well as All-CIF and all-league as a senior.



CONNOR VIRJEE

An All-American and four-time NCAA champion as a player at USC, Connor Virjee enters his first season as assistant coach on the USC men's water polo staff. After graduating from USC with a degree in environmental studies with a business minor in 2014, Virjee worked for the Movember Foundation and as an Ocean Lifeguard for the Los Angeles County Fire Department. He also served as head coach of Westside Aquatics.

As a Trojan, Virjee scored 94 goals, including 49 in his senior season as USC won its sixth consecutive NCAA title in 2013. Virjee was a member of four NCAA championship teams from 2010-2013 at USC, picking up All-America and All-MPSF honorable mention along with a spot on the 2013 NCAA All-Tournament Second Team. He also was a two-time MPSF Scholar-Athlete.

National Championships

USC has long dominated the world of intercollegiate athletics. In fact, it could be argued that Troy was the “Collegiate Athletic Program of the 20th Century.” USC men and women have combined for 130 national team titles, which includes 107 NCAA team titles.

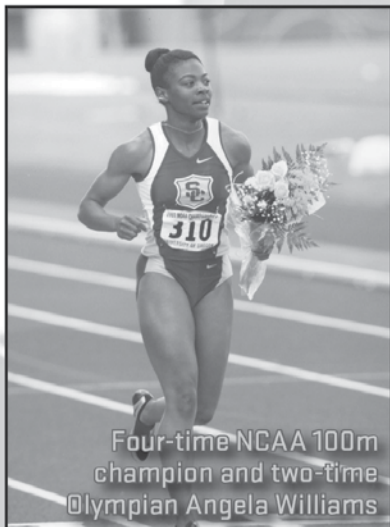
Trojan men's teams are tops in the nation in NCAA championships with 85 – more than any other university. Overall, USC's men have won 98 national championships.

USC has won the National Collegiate All-Sports Championship – an annual ranking by *USA Today* (previously *The Knoxville Journal*) of the country's top men's athletic programs – six times (1971-72-74-75-77-80) since its inception in 1971.

USC's women are also a force, with 32 national team titles, all since 1976, including two won in 2013 by the water polo and golf teams and three in a row by beach volleyball.

From 1959-60 to 1984-85, USC put together an amazing streak. In each of those 26 years, at least one Trojan team won a national championship (including five crowns in both 1962-63 and 1976-77).

Impressive recent streaks have been held by both the USC men's water polo and tennis teams. The tennis team won four in a row from 2009-12, and the water polo team won an unprecedented six straight men's titles from 2008-13.

The USC Athletic Experience

USC has a proud athletic heritage – and with good reason. Arguably, Troy could be regarded as one of the best collegiate athletic programs in the nation:

- Trojan teams have won more national championships, 98 men's (including a national-best 85 men's NCAA titles) and 32 women's, than all but two other universities
 - The Trojans won at least one national team title in 26 consecutive years (1959-60 to 1984-85)
- USC has won the National College All-Sports Championship – an annual ranking by *USA Today* (previously *The Knoxville Journal*) of the country's top men's athletic programs – six times since its inception in 1971
- USC has won the annual Crosstown Gauntlet, a year-long all-sports competition between Troy and crosstown rival UCLA, eight times (2002, 2004, 2006, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012)
- Trojan male athletes have won more individual NCAA titles (309) than those from any other school in the nation (the Women of Troy have brought home another 69 individual NCAA crowns)
- Troy has also established a stellar reputation and a long tradition of nurturing Olympic athletes. Since 1904, 418 Trojan athletes have competed in the Games, taking home 135 gold medals (with at least one gold in every summer Olympics since 1912), 87 silver and 65 bronze.
- Four Trojans have won the prestigious Sullivan Award as the top amateur athlete in America: diver Sammy Lee (1953), shot putter Parry O'Brien (1959), swimmer John Naber (1977) and Janet Evans (1989)
- Two Women of Troy athletes have won the Honda-Broderick Cup as the top collegiate woman athlete of the year: Cheryl Miller (1983-84) and Angela Williams (2001-02)
- USC has won six Heisman Trophy winners with the most recent winners being Carson Palmer (2002) and Matt Leinart (2004)
- Along with the great accomplishments on the playing fields, USC student-athletes have received 52 NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, in the top 10 among all schools. In addition, USC has had 31 first team Academic All-Americans and four athletes who were Rhodes Scholars

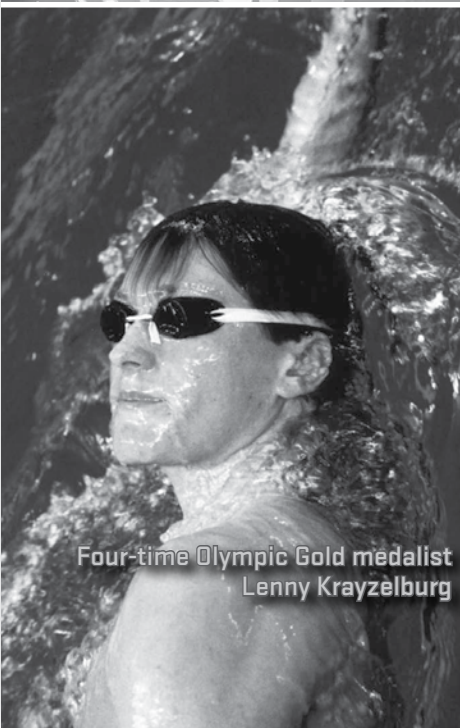

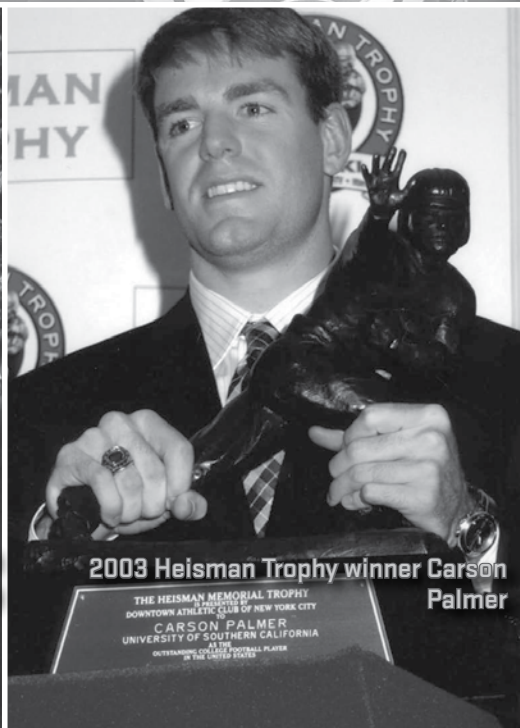

Uytengsu Aquatics Center





USC Athletics celebrated the ceremonious groundbreaking on Nov. 2, 2012 of the \$16 million Uytengsu Aquatics Center, made possible by the record \$8 million lead gift by former walk-on swimmer and 1983 swim captain Fred Uytengsu. The gift is the largest ever to Athletics from a former student-athlete.

The \$16 million Uytengsu Aquatics Center includes a new stadium entrance, diving and dryland training areas, men's and women's locker rooms, coaches' offices, meeting rooms, a new scoreboard, permanent seating and renovation of the diving tower and pool deck. In May 2014, the brand-new venue was host to the 2014 NCAA Women's Water Polo Championships.
