CROSSEXAMINATION

- USC is ranked No. 22 in the IWLCA coaches poll; the 46th consecutive week that the Trojans are ranked in the poll.
- The Trojans are 4-6 all-time in Colorado and 3-2 in Oregon.
- USC's three-game winning streak matches a season long.
- Colorado is the third ranked opponent the Trojans face this season. USC owns 16 all-time wins over ranked foes (16-27).
- Six different Trojans have scored double-digit goals this season with nine players with five goals or more through seven contests.
- Jr. midfielder **Kerrigan Miller** was named the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week (March 11) and is the first player in league history to receive both the offensive and defensive weekly awards in her career.
- Seventh-year head coach **Lindsey Munday** is 85-39 all-time.



LOS ANGELES – No. 22-ranked USC lacrosse (6-1, 1-0 Pac-12) hits the road with a three-game winning streak for a pair of Pac-12 contests this week. The Trojans visit Boulder, Colo., to take on No. 23 Colorado (3-3, 2-0) at Kittredge Field on Saturday, March 16, at 11 a.m. MT (10 a.m. PT). USC then heads up to the Beaver State to take on Oregon (2-5, 0-2) at Papé Field in Eugene, Ore., on Sunday, March 17, at 1 p.m. PT. Both games will be streamed live on the Pac-12+ platform.

The Trojans' three-game streak matches a season high and includes the team's first victory over a ranked team this season (No. 24 Virginia Tech). USC leads the Pac-12 in shots (35.0), shots on goal (25.71), goals (14.71), and free-position percentage (.444). The Women of Troy field a balanced offense, which has seen nine different Trojans score at least five goals this season.

Sophomore midfielder **Kelsey Huff** (15g, 3a), sophomore attacker **Sophia Donovan** (14g, 4a), and junior attacker **Hope Anhut** (11g, 7a) lead the Trojan offense with 18 points apiece. Senior attacker **Emily Concialdi** has scored 13 goals while junior attacker **Izzy McMahon** and junior midfielder **Kerrigan Miller** have each scored 11. Miller does a little of everything and is tied for first in the Pac-12 for caused turnovers (2.00 ctpg) and ground balls (3.57 gbpg). Sophomore goalie **Riley Herford** also grabs 3.57 ground balls per contest and is second in the league with a 10.60 goals-against average.

Senior defender **Jackie Gilbert** leads the Trojans in the center circle with 38 draw controls and has eight caused turnovers to go with six ground balls as one of USC's top crease-defenders. Among USC freshmen, midfielders **Katie Ramsay** (9g, 1a, 14dc) and **Erin Bakes** (6g, 2a, 3gb) have made early impacts for the Women of Troy. Now in her seventh season, head coach **Lindsey Munday** (85-39) leads an experienced and battle-tested squad into a quest for a fourth NCAA berth.

SONI MCALISTER FIELD

Soni McAlister Field is the home of USC women's soccer and women's lacrosse. Thanks to a generous \$150,000 donation from Hobart and Soni McAlister, a new field was built on the corner of 30th Street and Hoover Street in 1998. The field served as the home of USC soccer for 14 years before lacrosse was added as USC's 21st varsity sport in 2012. Trojan lacrosse played its first season in the spring of 2013, and hosted Massachusetts in their first game at the field on February 10.

In 2000, a permanent scoreboard was installed in the southwest corner of the field. In the summer of 2012, the field was moved eastward to accommodate the construction of a new fire station, which put the field's new entrance at 30th and University Avenue.

USC lacrosse is **38-10 (.792)** all-time at McAlister Field. The Trojans went undefeated there in 2015 (7-0), 2016 (9-0), and 2017 (7-0). USC has also hosted one home game at the LA Memorial Coliseum in each of the program's first five seasons and is **4-2** in the historic venue.



USC HEAD COACH LINDSEY MUNDAY



One of the most accomplished collegiate women's lacrosse players in the history of the sport, **Lindsey Munday** was handpicked to lead the first-ever USC women's lacrosse team in 2012.

Munday was named the MPSF Coach of the Year in 2015 and 2016; and was the IWLCA's West/Midwest Regional Coach of the Year. She was also chosen as the ILWomen National Coach of the Year in 2016. As a player, she won a pair of NCAA titles with Northwestern in 2005 and 2006. She then became an assistant at NU and helped the Wildcats to three titles from 2007-09.

Munday is a two-time world champion (2009 and '13) with the U.S. women's national team. In 2009, she earned All-World recognition with 17 goals and 20 assists (37 points) in seven games and later captained the 2013 squad to a record seventh FIL World Cup title.

Munday is **85-39 (.685)** overall at USC and guided the Trojans to three straight NCAA berths (2015-17), and back-to-back MPSF league titles (2016-17). In 2013, she led USC to a fourth-place MPSF finish with an appearance in the league tourney after the Trojans were picked to finish seventh.

As an assistant at Northwestern (2007-10) Munday was the recruiting coordinator and offensive coach. NU was 85-4 during her tenure and went 23-0 in 2009.

One of the greatest players in NU history, Munday was a Tewaaraton semifinalist in 2005 and 2006, and finished her career as the program's all-time leader in assists (128), third in points (268), and fifth in goals (140). She set single-season NU records for points (107) and assists (54) in 2005. The Wildcats were 64-12 and won the school's first-ever NCAA titles in the sport. She helped Northwestern become the first school outside the Eastern Time zone to win a national title and the first program to win consecutive NCAA championships.

Munday is a two-time first-team All-American (2005-06), All-Region, and All-American Lacrosse Conference selection. Munday received a bachelor's degree in communication from Northwestern in 2006.

SCOUTING REPORT



NO. 23 COLORADO: The Buffaloes (3-3, 2-0 Pac-12) enter the week on a two-game winning streak with a pair of Pac-12 road victories over Stanford and Cal. CU's three losses this season are to ranked foes including to No. 6 Florida, No. 6 Stony Brook, and No. 25 Michigan. Senior mainstay **Miranda Stinson** leads the Buffs with 27 points (21g, 6a) and 10 caused turnovers. Stinson is also second on the team with 15 draw controls. In the circle, **Eliza Cahill** leads with 23 draw controls and has 11 ground balls. In goal, **Julia Lisella** has a .504 save percentage with an 11.60 goals-against average. The Women of Troy are 5-2 all-time against Colorado but are only 1-2 when they face the Buffs in Boulder. CU won the last meeting, 10-7, at home. Further, the Trojans are 4-6 in the state of Colorado, which includes last year's season-ending loss to Stanford in the Pac-12 semifinal.



OREGON: The Ducks (2-5, 0-2 Pac-12) have lost three in a row and have surrendered 12 goals or more in each of their last six games. Oregon's wins are over Mercer and Jacksonville. Senior **Shannon Williams** is the Pac-12's points leader with 20 goals and 14 assists. **Jamie Level** has 32 draw controls in the center circle and has scored 10 goals on the season. In goal, **Rachel Hall** has surrendered 89 goals but holds a .511 save percentage with 93 saves. Four Ducks have reached double-digit ground balls and three have double-digit goals including Williams and Level. **Carlie Leach** has 12 goals to help power the offense. USC is 5-3 all-time against the Ducks but had a four-game winning streak over Oregon snapped in a stunning 18-11 loss in Eugene, Ore., last spring.

USC will appear in four live Pac-12 Networks broadcasts this spring. Home games against Stanford (Mar. 25), Colorado (Apr. 5), and Oregon (Apr. 7); and a road game at Stanford (Mar. 31) will be shown on the Networks' national and regional channels. Pac-12 tournament games will also be carried on the network's channels. All non-broadcast league games will be shown on the Pac-12+ stream platform.

LAST TIME OUT: The Women of Troy won their seventh straight conference opener on a resounding 15-3 victory at Arizona State. USC held a 10-1 lead at the half and got hat tricks from **Sophia Donovan** and **Katie Ramsay** in the win. It was the first game in which the Trojans held their opponent under the 10-goal mark and snapped a string of five games of 10-plus goals by USC opposition. Back home for a non-conference tilt, the Women of Troy secured a 13-11 win over No. 24 Virginia Tech to log the team's first victory over a ranked opponent this spring. It was the program's 16th all-time win against a ranked foe. Donovan led all scorers with four goals this time while **Kelsey Huff** and **Hope Anhut** each racked up three-goal hat tricks. **Kerrigan Miller** was the Trojans' defensive catalyst as she picked up six ground balls and caused five turnovers in the win.

OREGON TRAIL: Two of the Trojans' squad-women hail from the Beaver State. Junior defender **Natalie Byrne** is from West Linn, Ore., and sophomore goalie **Riley Herford** is from Lake Oswego, Ore., both suburbs to the south of Portland. Formerly, USC letterwinner **Ceara Leo** also came from Oregon. She played for the Trojans from 2013-15.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Women of Troy are **42-12** all-time in home games and are **38-10** at McAlister Field. Between 2015 and 2018, the Trojans won 23 straight games on McAlister Field. Including two wins at the LA Memorial Coliseum, USC claimed 25 consecutive home victories during the impressive streak.

LET'S GET IT STARTED: USC improved to 4-3 all-time in season openers following its 15-10 win over Hofstra (Feb. 9). The Trojans started the year 3-0 before suffering a loss; the second-best start in school history. The program record for consecutive wins to open a season is 20 when USC blazed a trail into the 2016 NCAA quarterfinals with a 20-0 record.

FRESH RECORDS: In USC's game against Hofstra, freshman attacker **Katie Ramsay** became the first Trojan freshman to record a hat trick in her first collegiate game since 2013 (Maggie Mawhinney vs. Presbyterian; Feb. 13). She scored the first goal of the game, which marked only the third time that a freshman scored the Trojans' first goal of the season. Ramsay joined **Kelsey Huff** (2018 at Virginia Tech) and **Amanda Johansen** (2013 vs. Northwestern).

NET VALUE: Sophomore goalie **Riley Herford's** win on Feb. 9 vs. Hofstra marked just the second time that a USC netminder has earned a victory in her first-career start. The other was **Cassandra Collins** (April 24, 2016) in her senior game start against UC Davis. Herford's career-high 11 saves against Jacksonville (Feb. 24) made her just the third USC goalie to collect double-digit saves in a game.

ALL-AMERICAN GIRLS: USC has celebrated **seven** IWLCA All-America selections through six years as a program. **Michaela Michael** was the first-ever All-American selection as a third-teamer in 2015. Michael and defender **Courtney Tarleton** were each named to the first team in 2016, with midfielder **Amanda Johansen** chosen to the third team. Michael repeated her first-team honors in 2017 and defender **Lydia Sutton** earned third-team honors. **Kerrigan Miller** joined the ranks as a third-team choice in 2018.

PAC IT UP: 2019 is the second season of Pac-12 lacrosse. In 2018, the Conference of Champions made lacrosse the 13th women's sport sponsored by the Pac-12. The addition of Arizona State brought the league to the minimum six teams to receive an automatic qualifier berth into the NCAA championship. The first-ever Pac-12 Lacrosse Championship was held at Prentup Field; hosted by Colorado. Stanford claimed the first Pac-12 title and will defend its crown at the 2019 championship in Eugene, Ore. (April 25-28). Previously a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation, from the end of 2015 to the middle of the 2018 season, USC won a school-record 22 consecutive conference games. The Trojans were undefeated in the MPSF in 2016 (9-0) and 2017 (8-0). USC won the 2016 and 2017 MPSF championships. USC is 6-0 all-time in league openers and earned its first victory in a Pac-12 opener, 14-3, against Arizona State in 2018.

PAC-12 POW-WOW: Trojans own **six** Pac-12 Player of the Week awards. Senior attacker **Emily Concialdi** nabbed her first-career Offensive Player of the Week honor on Feb. 25 following back-to-back hat trick performances against San Diego State and Jacksonville. Junior midfielder **Kerrigan Miller** was named Defensive Player of the Week on March 11 and became the first player in conference history to receive both the offensive and defensive awards in her career. All-Pac-12 goalie **Gussie Johns** was named for the Defensive Player of the Week award twice in 2018. All-American defender **Lydia Sutton** was also Defensive Player of the Week once.

POLL POSITION: The Trojans opened 2019 ranked No. 21 in the IWLCA Coaches' preseason poll. USC has spent **46** consecutive weeks ranked in the IWLCA poll dating back to the 2016 preseason poll. USC spent a school-record **26 straight** weeks in the top 10 from March 21, 2016 through Feb. 19, 2018. The Trojans are **16-27** all-time against ranked opponents, which includes a **9-13** record against teams ranked in the top 10 and **2-10** against teams ranked among the top five.

EAST COAST BIAS: USC has played **26 games** on the East Coast (in the Eastern time zone) and holds a **13-13** overall record in those games. The Trojans own wins over Dartmouth (2), Notre Dame (2), LIU Brooklyn, Marist, Stetson, Florida, Virginia Tech, and Boston University in true road games. USC defeated James Madison at



a neutral location in the 2015 NCAA first round in Durham, N.C.; beat Ohio State in a game played in New Jersey; and took down Jacksonville in Gainesville, Fla., in the first round of the 2017 NCAA tournament.

SISTER SITUATION: Four pairs of sisters have suited up for the Trojans. The first duo was fraternal twins **Glade** and **Shannon Nugent** (2014-16). The Nugent sisters played in a total of 10 games together in three seasons. All-American **Amanda Johansen** (2013-16) was on the Trojans' inaugural team and graduated before younger sister **Kelly Johansen** joined the team for the 2017 season. The elder Johansen also served as one of Troy's assistant coaches in 2018. In the same year, midfielder **Kaeli Huff** was joined by sister **Kelsey Huff**. The Huffs comprise only the second sister pair to be on the same roster for the Trojans. All-MPSF attacker **Gabby McMahon** (2014-17) has departed but younger sister **Izzy McMahon** (Isabel) joined the Women of Troy in 2018 following her transfer from Army. The two McMahons are also the older sisters of Daniella McMahon, who is a junior at Pac-12 rival Stanford.

HAT TRICK MAGIC: Eight current Trojans are members of the program's hat-trick club. Junior midfielder **Kerrigan Miller** leads the group with **13**-career hat tricks, which ranks sixth among USC's career leaders. Sophomore midfielder **Kelsey Huff** has **nine** hat tricks and ranks **eighth** all-time at Troy. Junior midfielder **Kaeli Huff** has **six** and ranks **ninth** in a tie with junior attacker **Izzy McMahon** who has **six** hat tricks at USC including one in her Trojan debut. McMahon had two four-goal games while at Army. Senior attacker **Emily Concialdi** has **five**-career hat-trick games. Sophomore attacker **Sophia Donovan** has **three**; junior **Hope Anhut** and freshman attacker **Katie Ramsay** each have **two**. USC's all-time leader is **Michaela Michael**, who finished her career (2014-17) with 41 games of three goals or more.

STATE YOUR CASE: USC's roster is made up of players from **11 different states**. In a bi-coastal battle, New York takes the edge with nine players from the Empire State on the 2019 Trojan squad. California is represented by seven Women of Troy. Four players hail from New Jersey, with two from Florida, Maryland, Oregon, and Pennsylvania. Connecticut, Georgia, Texas, and Virginia are each represented by one Trojan player.

POWER 100 PLAYERS: Freshman midfielders **Erin Bakes** and **Katie Ramsay** were each part of the ILWomen.com Power 100. Bakes was named the No. 2-ranked incoming freshman while Ramsay received the No. 47 rating. Frosh midfielder **Nicole Macolino** rounded out a trio of Trojans with her selection as one of 50 freshmen "On the Rise." Last year, **Riley Herford** (No. 12) and **Kelsey Huff** (No. 13) were ranked among the nation's top 15. In 2016, the Women of Troy landed the country's No. 1-rated recruit in **Kerrigan Miller**. In 2015, **Jackie Gilbert** was rated the No. 17 incoming recruit by the publication.

RED, WHITE, AND BLUE FOR TWO: All-American midfielder **Kerrigan Miller** was chosen as a member of the 2019 U.S. Lacrosse Women's Senior National Training Team along with former all-league goalie **Gussie Johns**. Miller has experience with the U19 team and helped Team USA take silver at the 2015 FIL Women's World Cup in Edinburgh, Scotland. Senior defender **Jackie Gilbert** was also a member of the 2015 U.S. U19 roster and has the distinction of being the first California native to be selected to a U.S. lacrosse national team.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS: Junior midfielder **Kerrigan Miller** was named to the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Preseason All-America third team. Senior defender **Jackie Gilbert** received honorable mention preseason status.

RING IT UP: USC head coach **Lindsey Munday** owns a pair of NCAA titles as a player at Northwestern (2005-06) and has three more as an assistant coach with the Wildcats (2007-09).
