USC HAS SHOWDOWN WITH STANFORD SATURDAY

• Trojans Have Won 8 Of Last 9 Games •

TODAY'S GAME - The USC Trojans (14-3, 3-1) will host the RV/No. 25 Stanford Cardinal (15-2, 4-0) at the Galen Center on Jan. 18 at 3:30 p.m. The game will air on the Pac-12 Network with J.B. Long and Don MacLean calling the action. USC has won 8 of its last 9 games. USC has won 14 of its first 17 games for only the third time in the last 18 seasons (15-2 in 2017 and 14-3 in 2016...both teams were 15-3 after 18 games).

BREAKING DOWN NO. 25 STANFORD -- The Stanford Cardinal (15-2, 4-0) is coming off a 74-59 win at UCLA on Jan. 15. The Cardinal opened Pac-12 play with home wins over California, WSU and Washington and sits in first place in the conference through the first two and a half weeks. Stanford is receiving votes in the AP Poll and ranked No. 25 in the Coaches Poll, the first time in the rankings since also being RV/No. 25 on Jan. 19, 2015. Junior Oscar da Silva (15.9) and freshman Tyrell Terry (15.8) lead Stanford in points per game. USC and Stanford split the 2018-19 season series with each team winning at home. Stanford leads the all-time series 127-125* (1 USC win vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 127-126). Seven of the last 12 games between the two schools have been decided by 5 points or less or in overtime.

USC POSTS BIGGEST WIN OVER CAL SINCE 1972 -- Jonah Mathews scored 19 points and Daniel Utomi added 17 to lead USC to an 88-56 win over California on Jan. 16. It was USC's biggest margin of victory over the Bears since winning by 33 on Jan. 14, 1972 (102-69) and its largest Pac-12 margin of victory since winning by 45 at Oregon St. on Jan. 6, 2007 (91-46). USC led 22-19 with 6:39 remaining in the first half and finished with a 19-6 run to lead 41-25 at the break. Cal got no closer than 14 points in the second half. Quinton Adlesh hit a 3-pointer with 11 minutes remaining in the game to push the lead to 21 points and the Trojans maintained a lead of over 20 points the rest of the way. USC made 50 percent of its shots, including 60.9 percent from 3-point range, its highest since making 61.3 percent at Cal last season. Mathews was 3-for-5 from 3-point range and Utomi was 4-for-6. Utomi had season best in 3-pointers, points and tied his rebound high. USC held Cal to 33.9 percent shooting from the floor, including 20 percent from 3-point range. USC outrebounded Cal 45-28 (+17), its biggest advantage on the boards since outrebounding Santa Clara 52-27 (+25) on Dec. 14, 2017. USC had 21 assists on 26 made baskets.

No. 8 OREGON ON DECK -- The Oregon Ducks (14-4, 3-2) lost 72-61 at Washington State on Jan. 16 and will play at Washington on Jan. 18, before hosting USC on Jan. 23. Oregon is 10-0 at home this season. Senior Payton Pritchard leads the Ducks with a 19.4 scoring average. Oregon leads the Pac-12 with 150 3-pointers made. USC and Oregon split the season series in 2019 with each team winning its home game. USC lost 81-60 at Oregon last season and has fallen in 8 of the last 9 games in Eugene, Ore. USC won the last game 66-49 at home and leads the all-time series 64-57* (2 USC wins vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 66-57).

THE MAGICAL MARKER -- USC held California to 56 points on Jan. 16 to improve to 11-0 this season when holding the opposition to under 70 points scored. In fact, USC is 64-2 in its last 66 games when holding the opposition to 69 points or less and is 79-8 in such games during the Andy Enfield Era.

GIVING IS GOOD -- USC had an assist on a season-high 80.8 percent of its baskets (21 of 26) vs. California on Jan. 16. In its wins, USC averages 16.8 assists (235 assists/14 G) and 8.7 assists in its losses (26 assists/3 G).

BOARD BROTHERS -- USC forwards Nick Rakocevic (8.8) and Onyeka Okongwu (8.7) are one of four pairs of teammates in Division I averaging 8.7 rebounds or more per game. The other schools with a tandem of rebounders averaging 8.7 rebounds or more per game are Saint Louis, West Virginia and William and Mary.

DID U KNOW? -- Grad transfer Daniel Utomi has scored 1,258 points and made 228 three-pointers in his career. He ranks 25th among active players in three-pointers made and 103rd in points scored. Utomi has started the last two games and scored a combined 30 points.

ALL ABOUT ENFIELD -- Andy Enfield, 50, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and has quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. Results came immediately with the Trojans setting the school single-season win record and the most wins over a two-year, three-year and four-year period over the last four seasons. He guided the Trojans into the postseason in three consecutive seasons (2016-18), the first time for USC since 2007-09, all while his athletes have set the program's top team GPAs for the Spring, Fall and Summer sessions. Enfield has brought in six consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2019 class ranking No. 7. Over the last two seasons, USC has had three players selected in the NBA Draft, tied for the fifth-most by any program in the country. He now has an 124-96 record in his seven seasons as the USC head coach and is 165-124 in nine seasons as a head coach. The 2018-19 Trojans were bitten by the injury bug beginning late in the summer and only had as many as 10 scholarship players available for preseason practice four of the 30 sessions. Ultimately USC players missed 54 games due to injury and finished with a 16-17 record after falling to regular season champion Washington 78-75 in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enfield guided the 2017-18 Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest conference finish since tying for second in 2002 and its first outright second-place finish since 1992. USC reached the Pac-12 Tournament final for the first time since winning it in 2009. USC set school records with 296 three-pointers made, 1022 FG made and 569 assists. The Trojans also scored the second-most points by a USC team in history (2,798). The Trojans accomplished all of this and achieved a No. 10 ranking in the preseason, its highest since the 1974-75 season, despite 40 percent of its projected starting lineup missing much of the season. USC went 26-10 in the 2016-17 season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. The Trojans won their first 14 games which was tied for the fourth-longest winning streak in school history and was the best USC start since the 1971 season. The 13-0 mark in nonconference regular season action was just the sixth time in school history USC had gone undefeated in the nonconference slate. USC defeated Providence in a 2017 First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament win since the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SMU before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since also winning two straight in the 2007 Tourney. After bringing in his recruits and establishing his system during the first two seasons, his Trojans took a big leap forward in the 2015-16 season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. USC went 12-20 during the 2014-15 campaign, with impressive wins at New Mexico and Boston College, as well as a Pac-12 Tournament first-round upset win over Arizona State. USC went 11-21 in his first season, but Enfield developed freshmen Nikola Jovanovic and Julian Jacobs into impact Pac-12 players, Jacobs ultimately becoming an All-Conference player. Enfield captivated the nation during the 2013 season as the head coach at Florida Gulf Coast University as he guided the first No. 15 seed into the NCAA Sweet 16 with impressive wins over No. 2 seed Georgetown and No. 7 seed San Diego State and introduced the world to "Dunk City," the nickname for FGCU's high-flying and high-speed offense which often ended with thunderous dunks. In Enfield's two-year run at FGCU, the Eagles won 41 games, advanced to the A-Sun Championship game both seasons - its first two playing at the Division I level. FGCU had a 41-28 record in his two seasons as head coach (2011-12, 2012-13), equaling the win total of the program the previous four seasons. Prior to FGCU, Enfield spent the previous five seasons (2007-11) as an assistant coach at Florida State, helping the Seminoles to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments, including the Sweet 16 in 2011. FSU posted four 20-win seasons during his time on the staff and won 31 ACC games, the second-most in the conference behind Duke. In 2011 and 2012, FSU became the first program since Georgetown (1991-92) to lead the nation in defensive field goal percentage two straight seasons. He began his coaching career in the NBA, serving as the shooting coach for Milwaukee (1995, 1996). Then he was an assistant coach with Boston for two seasons (1999, 2000). Enfield played four seasons (1988-91) at Johns Hopkins, scoring a program-record 2,025 points. He also set the NCAA all-divisions career free throw percentage record of 92.5 percent, making 431-of-466 free throws. He was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001.

FACING THE BEST -- The USC men's basketball team is once again taking on an ambitious nonconference schedule for the 2019-20 season, highlighted by a home games against Temple and South Dakota State, tough road games at Nevada and TCU and a neutral sight game against defending SEC champion LSU. In all, USC will face four defending conference champions, play 15 games against teams which reached the 2019 postseason and 14 games against teams which won 20 or more games last season.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station for the first time will be AM 790 KABC with Jordan Moore calling the action. The USC graduate is in his fifth season of working on USC basketball broadcasts, his second season as the play-by-play announcer.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 5th in the 2019-20 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) Oregon (291), 2.) Colorado (288), 3.) Washington (273), 4.) Arizona (263), 5.) USC (198), 6.) Arizona State (187), 7.) Oregon State (161), 8.) UCLA (148), 9.) Utah (131), 10.) Stanford (84), 11.) Washington State (47) and 12.) California (35).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,615-1,209* in its 114 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 79 of the first 113 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 154-69 in 14 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 85-22 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC is 47-8 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach, including 35-5 in its last 40 regular season nonconference home games.

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years. One of their biggest involvements the past two years has been with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Light the Night Walk, along with former Director of Scouting Martin Bahar to raise money in the name of his sister Maddie who died from the disease in 2009.

OKONGWU NEAR THE TOP OF THE CLASS -- Through his first 16 career games, Okongwu is averaging 16.6 points, 8.7 rebounds and 2.94 blocks per game, while shooting 61.0 percent from the field. His 47 total blocks already rank third on USC's all-time freshman blocks list. Among all freshmen nationally through Jan. 16, he ranks second blocks per game (2.94), in total blocks (47) and in field goal percentage (61.0 percent), fourth in offensive rebounds per game (3.31), tied for fourth in total field goals made (105), fifth in rebounds per game (8.7), tied for fifth in double-doubles (6), sixth in points per game (16.6), eighth in total rebounds (139) and ninth in total points (265).

THE GANG IS STARTING TO SHOOT STRAIGHT --- Despite making only 20 percent of its shots at Washington on Jan. 5, USC has made 45.6 percent of its shots in the last nine games (231-for-507). In the first eight games of the season, USC made 43.3 percent of its shots (210-for-485).

TURNING UP THE DEFENSE -- USC's defense has held its last six opponents to a combined 36.7 shooting percentage (140-for-381). For the year, USC is holding the opposition to 38.5 percent shooting which ranks 29th in the country. Also in the last six games combined, USC's opponents are shooting 24.1 percent (32-for-133) from three point range. USC's opponents shot a higher percentage than that in each of the previous 10 games, and prior to the last six games, had made 35.6 percent of its shots from beyond the arc for season.

GLAD TO BE AT GALEN -- USC just finished a stretch with 8 of 10 games away from the Galen Center (Nov. 23-Jan. 15) and went 8-2 in that stretch. USC is a combined 7-2 in games away from home (4-1 on the road and 3-1 in neutral site games).

GONE STREAKING -- USC has a 5-game and 6-game winning streak this season, the third time this decade with two winning streaks of 5 or more games in a season (2016 & 2017).

ROAD WARRIORS -- USC is 4-1 on the road this season, after going 2-9 on the road during the 2018-19 season. Only five schools among the ACC, AAC, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, SEC and Pac-12 have four true road wins this season: Duke (4-1), **USC (4-1)**, DePaul (4-2), Seton Hall (4-2) and Georgia Tech (4-3). In six of the last 11 seasons, USC won 2 or less road games for an overall record of 34-90 (27.4 percent). USC finished over .500 on the road (6-5) during the 2017 and 2018 seasons, the only two seasons in the past 11 with a winning road record.

DEFENSIVE SHIFT -- USC is 14-3 after 17 games this season, after being 9-8 after 17 games during the 2018-19 season. The biggest change has been on the defensive end where the Trojans are holding their opponents to 66.8 points per game and to a 38.5 shooting percentage. USC has held its opponent to under 40 percent shooting 10 times this season.

OKONGWU PICKS UP SECOND PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR (Dec. 16) -- Onyeka Okongwu posted a double-double in USC's victory over Long Beach State on Dec. 15 and was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week of Dec. 9-15, it was announced by the Pac-12 on Dec. 16. Okongwu was also named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week on Nov. 25. He has earned three Pac-12 weekly honors (two Freshman of the Week and one Player of the Week--also Nov. 25) to lead all Conference players. The 6-9 forward scored 28 points and grabbed 12 rebounds in USC's 87-76 victory over Long Beach State on Dec. 15, tallying 24 of his points in the second half. He also had a career-best three steals. For Okongwu, it was his fifth double-double of the season and fifth game scoring at least 20 points.

OKONGWU NAMED PAC-12 FRESHMAN & PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Nov. 25) -- Freshman forward Onyeka Okongwu averaged 25.5 points, 5.5 rebounds and 3.5 blocks in USC's two games to earn Pac-12 Freshman of the Week and the Player of the Week honors for the week of Nov. 18-24, it was announced by the Pac-12 today (Nov. 25). With the Freshman of the Week being a new honor this season, Okongwu becomes the first player to earn both awards in the same week. In the 91-84 win over Pepperdine on Nov. 19, Okongwu scored a career-high 33 points, while grabbing five rebounds and making two blocks. The 33 points scored were the most by a USC freshman in a game since O.J. Mayo scored 37 on March 1, 2008 at Arizona State (player participation later vacated due to NCAA penalty, previous USC freshman with more points was Harold Miner with 34 on February 15, 1990 vs. Stanford). The 6-9 forward also made 17 of 21 free throws (81.0 percent) in the game against Pepperdine to set the record for most free throws made in a game by an individual at the Galen Center and it was also the third-most free throws ever made in any game by a Trojan. The last Trojan to make more free throws in a game was John Block on Feb. 11, 1966 vs. Washington when he set the school record with 21. The 17 free throws made are currently tied for the most by an NCAA Division I player this season and were the most by a Conference player since Stanford's Reid Travis (19) in Dec. 2016. Okongwu followed that game up with 17 points, six rebounds and five blocks in the 70-61 loss to undefeated Temple on Nov. 22.

RAKOCEVIC NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Nov. 18) -- Senior forward Nick Rakocevic averaged 25.5 points, 13.5 rebounds and eclipsed the 1,000 career points scored mark to help lead the Trojans to two wins and earn Pac-12 Player of the Week honors for the week of Nov. 11-17. It is the third career Pac-12 Player of the Week selection for Rakocevic, tied for the third-most all-time by a Trojan, trailing only Harold Miner (7) and Wayne Carlander (4). In USC's 84-66 home win over South Dakota State on Nov. 12, Rakocevic matched a career high with 27 points and added 16 rebounds for a double-double. He hit a pair of free throws with just over eight minutes remaining in the game to reach 1,000 career points scored. He then scored 24 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the Trojans' 76-66 win at Nevada on Nov. 16. Rakocevic made 10 of 15 shots to help USC hand Nevada just its fourth loss in its last 48 home games.

MATHEWS & RAKOCEVIC SHARING SENIOR SUCCESS - USC senior guard Jonah Mathews (1,185 career points) and senior forward Nick Rakocevic (1,162 career points) both surpassed 1,000 career points scored in the game vs. South Dakota State on Nov. 12. They became the 41st and 42nd Trojans to register 1,000 or more career points in a USC uniform and became the first pair of Trojans to accomplish the feat in the same game since Don Carfino and Purvis Miller vs. Oregon in 1980. Rakocevic also has 814 career rebounds which ranks 7th on USC's all-time list and 11th among active players. He now has 26 career double-doubles which ranks T-13th among active players. Mathews has made 215 career three-point baskets, fifth on USC's all-time list and tied for 42nd among active players.

10 FOR 10 -- All 10 available basketball scholarship players on USC's team have had at least one 10-point scoring game this season. All 10 players played and scored at WSU on Jan. 2.

NONCONFERENCE RECAP -- USC went 11-2 in the nonconference, the third time under Andy Enfield with 11 or more wins in nonconference play (13-0 in 2017 and 11-2 in 2016). Prior to that, USC had not won 11 nonconference games since the 1976 season. USC played 9 teams that are .500 or better and eight of its opponents have won eight or more games. USC went 2-0 in road games and 3-1 in neutral site games.

THE "BIG O" MY -- Freshman forward Onyeka Okongwu scored 20 points, grabbed 13 rebounds and matched the school record with eight blocks in his collegiate debut vs. FAMU on Nov. 5. Okongwu also became the first USC freshman to post a double-double in his debut since Taj Gibson in 2006.

RAKOCEVIC NAMED TO PRESEASON WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST -- Nick Rakocevic was one of 50 players named to the preseason Wooden Award Watch List on Nov. 5. The 50 student-athletes on the watch list are early front-runners for the Wooden Award All-American Team and the Most Outstanding Player Award, as voted upon in a preseason poll of national college basketball experts.

PAC-12 PRESEASON HONORS -- Senior forward Nick Rakocevic was named to the inaugural Pac-12 Preseason All-Conference team, announced at Pac-12 Media Day on Oct. 8 in San Francisco, Calif. Senior guard Jonah Mathews and freshman forward Isaiah Mobley were named honorable mention. USC was picked to finish fifth by Pac-12 media and received one of the 27 first-place votes.

USC PRESEASON ACTION -- USC defeated preseason No. 10 Villanova 72-61 in an exhibition game on Oct. 18 which benefited the California Fire Foundation. Senior transfer wing Daniel Utomi and freshman forward Onyeka Okongwu led USC with 15 points each, with Okongwu adding 10 rebounds for a double-double. The Trojans then experimented with different rotations and lineups and won its closed scrimmage against Santa Clara 72-68 on Oct. 26. USC was led by the freshmen five of Okongwu (17), Isaiah Mobley (14), Ethan Anderson (10), Kyle Sturdivant (8) and Max Agbonkpolo (7) who scored 56 of the team's 72 points.

WINNING WAYS -- USC won 87 games over the previous four season (2016-19), the winningest four-year stretch in school history. Included in that stretch was a school-record 26 wins during the 2017 season.

TROJANS EXCEL ON FOREIGN SUMMER TOUR -- The USC men's basketball team went on an 11-day foreign summer tour (Aug. 6-16) to Spain and France. The Trojans traveled to Barcelona, Spain, Cannes, France, Monaco and Paris, France. The Trojans spent three nights in Barcelona, Cannes and Paris and played a game in each city. USC went 3-0 on the trip, defeating a Spanish Select team 102-51 in Barcelona on Aug. 8, a French Select team 90-67 on Aug. 11 in Cannes and a Lithuania Select team 105-83 on Aug. 14 in Paris. USC made 52.3 percent of its shot on the trip and Onyeka Okongwu averaged 20.3 points and 10.7 rebounds, while Nick Rakocevic averaged 13.3 points and 11.0 rebounds per game. Among the cultural highlights were a tour of La Sagrada Familia, a tour of the FC Barcelona Nou Camp, a catamaran trip to Ile Saint-Honorat, a day trip to Monaco and a Siene River boat cruise.

MOBLEY NAMED TO MALONE AWARD WATCH LIST -- USC freshman forward Isaiah Mobley is one of 20 athletes named to the 2020 Karl Malone Award Watch List, it was announced by the Basketball Hall of Fame on Oct. 17. Mobley is one of two freshman on the pre-season watch list for the Karl Malone Award. The annual award in its sixth year recognizes the top power forwards in Division I men's college basketball and is named after 2010 Hall of Famer and two-time NBA Most Valuable Player Karl Malone. A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch list of 20 candidates. Mobley graduated in 2019 from Rancho Christian School in Temecula, Calif. where as a senior he averaged 22 points, 13 rebounds, four assists and three blocks. He helped lead Rancho Christian into the CIF State Open Division Championships. RAKOCEVIC NAMED TO THE ABDUL-JABBAR AWARD WATCH LIST -- USC senior Nick Rakocevic is one of 20 athletes named to the 2020 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award Watch List, it was announced by the Basketball Hall of Fame on Oct. 18. The annual award in its sixth year recognizes the top centers in Division I men's college basketball and is named after 1995 Hall of Famer and three-time NCAA Champion Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch list of 20 candidates. Rakocevic enters his senior season ranked 15th on USC's all-time rebound list with 665 career rebounds and is 35 points away from 1,000 career points scored. Last season, he averaged 14.7 points and 9.3 rebounds in 33 games. He posted 15 double-doubles which ranked second among Pac-12 players and 23rd nationally. He ranked in the Pac-12's top 10 in six categories: scoring average (10th), rebounds (3rd, 308), field goal percentage (8th, 54.8 percent), blocked shots (5th, 47), offensive rebounds (1st, 109) and defensive rebounds (3rd, 199). Rakocevic was named honorable mention on the 2019 Pac-12 All-Conference team and is on the 2020 preseason first team All-Conference list. USC GRADUATION RATES HIT ALL-TIME HIGH FOR 6TH YEAR IN A ROW -- The 2019 Graduation Success Rate of USC student-athletes hit an all-time high for the sixth consecutive year, this year reaching 90%, according to data released on Oct. 16 by the NCAA. The 2019 GSR measures how many student-athletes in the classes of 2009 through 2012 graduated within six years of their enrollment. That 90% figure is four percentage points higher than USC's 2018 mark. It also is 23 percentage points higher than it was when the NCAA first released GSR numbers in 2005. Eleven of the 19 USC sports whose data was tracked by the NCAA had a GSR this year above 90%, including seven with a perfect 100%: men's and women's tennis (both 100%), defending NCAA champion men's water polo (100%), women's lacrosse (100%), women's rowing (100%), women's soccer (100%), women's swimming (100%), women's water polo (95%), women's track and field (94%) and men's and women's volleyball (92%). Five other teams scored in the 80% range: men's track and field (88%), women's basketball (87%), men's golf (86%), men's swimming (84%) and football (82%). Nine USC teams either set or equaled all-time high GSR rates for their programs this year: the seven teams that scored 100%, plus men's volleyball and football. Football's rate, which is seven percentage points higher than 2018 and 27 percentage points better than its initial figure in 2005, was at a program high for the fourth consecutive year. Seventeen USC teams saw their scores either improve from last year or stay the same: men's basketball (+10 percentage points), women's golf (+10), men's water polo (+8), football (+7), men's golf (+6), women's track and field (+6), women's volleyball (+6), women's swimming (+4), men's swimming (+3), men's volleyball (+2), women's water polo (+2), women's basketball (+1), men's tennis (even), men's track and field (even), women's rowing (even), women's soccer (even) and women's tennis (even). "The continued increase of our graduation rates highlights our student-athletes' outstanding effort and performance in the classroom," said Dr. Denise Kwok, USC's director of Student-Athlete Academic Services. "These GSR figures are testament to the emphasis that USC places on academic success in the athletic department and the culture that has grown from that. We are thankful for the collaborative work among faculty, staff, coaches and the SAAS staff in the Stevens Academic Center that supports our student-athletes in their pursuit of academic and athletic excellence."

TROJANS SIGN No.1 RECRUIT MOBLEY - Evan Mobley, the No. 1 overall recruit in the 2019-20 men's basketball recruiting class, signed a National Letter of Intent (NLI) to play basketball for USC on Nov. 13. Mobley's signing marks the first time in program history that USC has signed the nation's No. 1-ranked recruit. Mobley, a 7-0, 210-pound forward, averaged 19.2 points, 10.4 rebounds and 4.7 blocks per game last season for Rancho Christian School in Temecula, Calif. Mobley was named the 2019 Gatorade California Player of the Year and is the consensus No. 1 recruit in the 2019-20 recruiting class, topping the list on ESPN.com, Rivals.com and 247Sports.com. Mobley has won gold medals representing USA Basketball at the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup and the 2018 FIBA U17 World Cup. He was named as a participant for the 2019 USA Basketball Men's Junior National Team October minicamp and participated in the 2019 USA Men's Junior National Team Next Generation minicamp at the NCAA Men's Final Four. Mobley and current Trojans Onyeka Okongwu and Isaiah Mobley led the Compton Magic to the prestigious 2018 Adidas Gauntlet Championship before earning the "mythical AAU national championship" later that summer in Las Vegas, Nev.

USC'S 2019 FRESHMAN CLASS RANKED NO. 7 - USC's freshman class of Max Agbonkpolo, Ethan Anderson, Drake London, Isaiah Mobley, Onyeka Okongwu and Kyle Sturdivant was ranked No. 7 by 247Sports.com. Agbonkpolo led Santa Margarita Catholic to the CIF Southern Section Div. I title by scoring 23 points and hitting the game winner. He was ranked as the No. 5 prospect in California and No. 52 nationally by 247Sports. Anderson was the L.A. City Section Player of the Year and he led Fairfax High to the Open Division Championship. He ranked as the No. 4 point guard in California. London, at USC on a football scholarship as a wide receiver, was named to the CIF Southern Section Div. 4 first team as he averaged 29.2 points and 11.9 rebounds per game. Mobley was a 2019 McDonald's All-American and was ranked as the No. 1 recruit in California and No. 15 nationally. Okongwu was named California "Mr. Basketball" each of the last two years and was ranked No. 17 nationally by ESPN.com. Sturdivant was named the No. 6 player in the state of Georgia and the No. 12 point guard in the country by 247Sports.com.

USC TO THE NBA -- USC has seven former players that began the season on NBA rosters: Dewayne Dedmon (Sacramento), All-Star DeMar DeRozan (San Antonio), Taj Gibson (New York), De'Anthony Melton (Memphis), Chimezie Metu (San Antonio), Kevin Porter Jr. (Cleveland) and Nikola Vucevic (Orlando). Since the 2007 NBA Draft, USC has had six players selected in the first round, tied for 13th-most in the country. In addition, Jordan McLaughlin is signed to a two-way contract with Minnesota and made his NBA debut on Nov. 6. Also, Pe'Shon Howard is on Grand Rapids in the G-League, Curtis Washington on Maine in the G-League and Bennie Boatwright are on the Memphis G-League roster. USC outscored Florida A&M 53-25 in the second half to win its opener 77-48 at the Galen Center on Nov. 5. The Trojans' vaunted freshman class scored 53 of the team's 77 points, led by Onyeka Okongwu's 20. Okongwu also had 13 rebounds and tied a school record with 8 blocks. He also became the first USC freshman to post a double-double in his debut since Taj Gibson in 2006. USC's next two leading scorers were also freshman, Isaiah Mobley with 17 and Max Agbonpolo with 10. Freshman point guard Ethan Anderson had 4 points and tied the USC freshman first-game record with seven assists. USC led 24-23 at halftime as it shot 33.3 percent from the field, while making just 1 of 8 3-pointers and 1 of 9 free throws. USC bounced back from the charity stripe in the second half, making 13 of 14. USC outscored FAMU 21-9 on fastbreak points and 50-32 on points in the paint. USC had 12 steals, matching the most it had in a game during the 2018-19 season. USC improved to 21-4 in its last 25 home openers.

Onyeka Okongwu scored a career-high 33 points, Nick Rakocevic had 16 points and 11 rebounds, and USC rallied from an early pair of double-digit deficits to beat Pepperdine 91-84 at the Galen Center on Nov. 19. Okongwu went 17 for 21 from the free throw line, the most makes by a Trojan in a game at the Galen Center and third all-time by a Trojan. His 33 points were also the most by a USC freshman since O.J. Mayo scored 37 on March 1, 2008 (participation later vacated due to NCAA penalty). The previous freshman with more points in a game was Harold Miner with 34 on Feb. 15, 1990. Jonah Mathews added 16 points and Isaiah Mobley had 14, 11 in the second half. Pepperdine hit 3 consecutive 3-pointers to cut USC's lead to 81-78 with 2:14 remaining, but Okongwu and Rakocevic finished things off from there. Okongwu hit a pair of free throws before dunking on Rakocevic's alley-oop pass. Rakocevic got fouled and made a pair of free throws that put the Trojans back up by nine. The 5-0 start with all of the wins by 7 points or more is USC's first since accomplishing the feat the first 8 games of the 1963 season. Colbey Ross kept the Waves in the game by making 6 3-pointers and scoring 38 points, the most by an opponent in regulation at the Galen Center.

Jonah Mathews, whose 3-pointer with 4:22 remaining gave USC the lead for good, led 5 Trojans in double figures with 15 points. Mathews missed the front end of a one-and-one with 4 seconds remaining to give LSU hope, but Javonte Smart's desperation shot at the buzzer was blocked by Okongwu, his 4th block of the game. Nick Rakocevic had 14 points and 9 rebounds and Okongwu had 10 points and 9 rebounds. Anderson scored all 11 of his points in the 2nd half, while Daniel Utomi added 10 points. LSU jumped out to a 13-6 lead before Kyle Sturdivant scored 8 points off the bench during an 18-7 run to put the Trojans up 24-20 with 7:19 remaining before halftime. The game was tied at 28 when LSU scored the last 7 points of the first half. USC was outrebounded 43-40 and outscored 42-22 on points in the paint. USC made 41.0 percent of its shots, including 50 percent of its shots from the floor and 3-point range in the second half. The Trojans held LSU to 36.8 percent shooting, 16.7 percent from 3-point range.

Nick Rakocevic posted a double-double of 19 points and 13 rebounds to lead USC to a 71-58 win over Florida Gulf Coast on Dec. 29, the same school Andy Enfield began his head coaching career at and led to the 2013 Sweet 16. USC finished nonconference action 11-2, the third time in the last 18 seasons it began winning 11 or more of its first 13 games. USC got off to a slow start, trailing 7-1 nearly 3 minutes into the game, before a Jonah Mathews 3-pointer ignited an 11-0 run to take the lead for good. The Trojans led 35-31 at halftime while shooting 42.9 percent from the field, but made 50 percent of its shots after the break to pull away. Onyeka Okongwu scored 27 points and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead USC to a 65-56 win in its Pac-12 Conference opener at Washington State on Jan. 2. The win was USC's 6th straight and snapped WSU's 6-game winning streak. Despite Okongwu's 6th double-double of the season and USC leading for nearly the entire game, it wasn't easy as the Trojans had to overcome their 20 turnovers and 20 offensive rebounds by WSU. USC's defense was the key, holding WSU to 27.8 percent shooting, including 21.4 percent from 3-point range. USC made 51.1 percent of its shots, going over 50 percent for the 2nd time this season. USC made a season-low one 3-pointer (1-for-7). USC used its height advantage for a 40-28 lead on points in the paint and a 46-39 lead in rebounds. Jonah Mathews was the only other Trojan in double figures with 10 points scored, 7 of those from the FT line. Isaac Bonton led WSU with 18 points, but was 7 of 26 from the floor. WSU leading scorer CJ Elleby was held to 9 points on 3-for-22 shooting. WSU took 34 more shots than USC (79 for 45). All 19 players in the game scored at least one point. USC registered 8 blocks, including 3 by Okongwu and 2 by guard Quinton Adlesh which tied his career total coming into the game.

USC posted season lows in shooting, 3-point shooting, FT percentage and turnovers and fell 72-40 at Washington on Jan. 5. USC had its 6-game winning streak snapped as it shot 20 percent from the field, 13.3 percent from 3-point range and 48.0 percent from the FT line. The only Trojan scoring in double figures was Onyeka Okongwu with 10 points and 9 rebounds. Nick Rakocevic (2-for-14) and Isaiah Mobley (2-for-13) were a combined 4-for-27 (14.8 percent) and had 10 of their shots blocked. UW blocked 12 shots, the most by a USC opponent since Stanford set the opponent record with 19 on Jan. 25, 2007. The 40 points scored were USC's fewest since scoring 39 in a 67-39 loss vs. Utah on Feb. 1, 2015, the lowest points scored in the Andy Enfield Era. USC's 20 percent shooting was its worst since shooting 15.9 percent at Oregon on Feb. 3, 1956. USC fell behind 10-1 to start the game before a layup by Elijah Weaver gave USC its first field goal. USC cut the deficit to 16-14 after a pair of FTs by Kyle Sturdvant with 8:22 remaining in the first half, but would score 1 FG over the next 4 minutes to fall behind 25-16. USC trailed 35-21 at halftime and cut it to 41-29 3:30 into the 2nd half, but UW answered with an 11-0 run to put the game away.




