USC TRAVELS CROSSTOWN TO FACE RIVAL UCLA

• Trojans Have Won 20 Games For The 5th Time In 6 Seasons •

TODAY'S GAME -- The USC Trojans (20-6, 14-5) will play at the UCLA Bruins (17-7, 13-5) at Pauley Pavilion in Westwood, Calif. on March 6 at 1 p.m. The game will air on CBS with Spero Dedes and Jim Spanarkel calling the action. USC has won 20 games for the fifth time in its last six seasons under Andy Enfield. USC's 20-6 record is its best after 26 games since being 21-5 during the 2017 season. USC is tied for first, but percentage points behind Oregon (13-4) and a half-game ahead of UCLA (13-5). The winner of today's game would win the Pac-12 regular season title with an Oregon loss at Oregon State on March 7. USC has not won the conference title outright since the 1961 season.

FACING UCLA -- UCLA (17-7, 13-5) is coming off an 82-74 loss at Oregon on March 3. UCLA is 11-0 at home this season and has won 18 consecutive home games dating back to the 2019-20 season. The Trojans defeated the Bruins 66-48 on Feb. 6 at the Galen Center. UCLA has five active players averaging 10 or more points per game, led by Johnny Juzang at 14.2 points per game. USC has won three-in-a-row and four of its last five games against UCLA, but trails in the all-time series 112*-143 (*1 win later vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 113-143).

USC SHUTS DOWN STANFORD -- Tahj Eaddy scored 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting and USC routed Stanford 79-42 on March 3, snapping a two-game skid. Drew Peterson added 15 points, 9 rebounds & 6 assists for USC. USC took it to the Cardinal from the opening tip, scoring 15 straight points for a 17-2 lead after holding Stanford scoreless for over nine minutes. USC held Stanford to 22.2 percent shooting in the first half to lead 36-17. The 17 points at halftime were the fewest by a Trojan opponent since Oregon St. also scored 17 points at the break on Dec. 28, 2016. After a layup by Stanford's Spencer Jones started the 2nd half, USC scored 14-straight to open up a 50-19 lead and cruised from there. The 42 points scored by Stanford were its fewest against USC since the 2011 season and the 37-point loss was its largest against the Trojans since also falling by 37 in 1953. The last time USC beat any conference opponent by 37 points or more was in 2007 when it beat Oregon St. by 45. USC held Stanford to 25.4 percent shooting the lowest by an opponent since CSUF made 23.3 percent of its shots on Nov. 10, 2016.

THE UNICORN -- USC freshman Evan Mobley, who is averaging 16.2 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 2.8 blocks, is the only Division I player to be averaging at least 16.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.0 blocks and 2.0 assists. Mobley was named a Jabbar Award Finalist on Feb. 26 and a Naismith Defensive Player of the Year semifinalist on Feb. 24.

MOBLEY NAMED A NAISMITH TROPHY SEMIFINALIST - Evan Mobley was named a 2021 Naismith Trophy Player of the Year Semifinalist by the Atlanta Tipoff Club on March 4. He is one of 10 student-athletes on the current list for the top Division I college basketball player.

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT ON DECK-- USC's next game will be in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament in Las Vegas, Nev. on March 11. The Pac-12 Tournament runs March 10-13 in Las Vegas at T-Mobile Arena. USC's seed could be anywhere from No. 1 to No. 4. Live coverage will be featured across Pac-12 Networks and/or ESPN. USC is 18*-19 all-time at the Pac-12 Championships, winning the 2009 title. (*win in 2008 vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 19-19).

THE STRENGTH OF THREE -- A cord of three strands is not easily broken and a USC team with three players scoring 10 or more points is not easily defeated. The Trojans are 17-0 this season when they have at least three players scoring in double figures.

HART RECOGNIZED -- USC Associate Head Coach Jason Hart was named to the Advancement of Blacks in Sports (ABIS) Assistant Coaches Watch List on March 1. This 15-Person ABIS Black Assistant Coaches Watch List will be shared annually with Athletic Administrators and Executive Search Firms prior to the start of the hiring cycle. Hart is in his fourth season as Associate Head Coach and his eighth with the program. He has been an integral part of Andy Enfield's staff which has won the most games in school history for a season (26 in 2017) and a six year stretch (129). Hart graduated from Syracuse in 2000 and then enjoyed nine-year NBA career.

SCORING MARGIN BEST SINCE 1971 SEASON -- USC has a +10.6 scoring margin is second among Pac-12 teams. It is also USC's biggest average scoring margin in a season since the 1970-71 team went 24-2 and defeated opponents by an average of 14.0 points per game.

GUARDING THE LINE -- USC has held opponents to 33.3 percent shooting from three-point range this season. The Trojans held Stanford to 24.0 percent shooting on March 3, snapping a 5-game stretch where its opponents shot over 40 percent each game from three-point range for a total percentage of 51.2 (44-for-86). USC has held 10 teams to 25 percent or less from beyond the arc this season.

LET ME ASSIST YOU -- USC has a total of 57 assists in its six losses (9.5 apg) and 308 in its 20 wins (15.4 apg). On the road trip to Colorado and Utah, USC was out-assisted 39-15 in the two games. USC bounced back with a 21-8 advantage in assists vs. Stanford on March 3. USC is 13-0 in games it registers at least 14 assists.

THE PAINT PATROL -- USC has outrebounded its opponents 1045-835 through the first 26 games and has outscored the opposition 898-626 on points scored in the paint. USC's +8.08 rebound margin leads the Pac-12 lead and ranks 15th in the country.

ALL ABOUT ENFIELD -- Andy Enfield, 51, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and has quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. Results came immediately with the Trojans setting the school single-season win record and the most wins in program history over a two-year, three-year, four-year and five-year period. USC has won 109 games over the last five seasons which is the third-most wins in the Pac-12 and the 21st-most wins in the nation among power conferences during that time. USC has had the second-best overall record in the Pac-12 two of the last three seasons (24-12 in 2018 & 22-9 in 2020). He guided the Trojans into the postseason in three consecutive seasons (2016-18), the first time for USC since 2007-09, all while his athletes have set the program's top team GPAs for the Spring, Fall and Summer sessions. Enfield has brought in seven consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2021 class ranking No. 12. Over the last three seasons, USC has had four players selected in the NBA Draft, tied for the fifth-most by any program in the country. He now has an **152-108** record in his eight seasons as the USC head coach (4th-most wins in school history) and is **193-136** in 10 seasons as a head coach. The 2019-20 Trojans went 22-9, finished tied for 3rd in the Pac-12 and were getting better as the season was cancelled due to COVID-19. USC won three straight and five of its last seven to closeout the season. The Trojans led Pac-12 teams in defensive field goal percentage and points per game allowed in Conference play. The 2018-19 Trojans were bitten by the injury bug beginning late in the summer and only had as many as 10 scholarship players available for preseason practice four of the 30 sessions. Ultimately USC players missed 54 games due to injury and finished with a 16-17 record after falling to regular season champion Washington 78-75 in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enfield guided the 2017-18 Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest conference finish since tying for second in 2002 and its first outright second-place finish since 1992. USC reached the Pac-12 Tournament final for the first time since winning it in 2009. USC set school records with 296 three-pointers made, 1022 FG made and 569 assists. The Trojans also scored the second-most points by a USC team in history (2,798). The Trojans accomplished all of this and achieved a No. 10 ranking in the preseason, its highest since the 1974-75 season, despite 40 percent of its projected starting lineup missing much of the season. USC went 26-10 in the 2016-17 season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. The Trojans won their first 14 games which was tied for the fourth-longest winning streak in school history and was the best USC start since the 1971 season. The 13-0 mark in non-conference regular season action was just the sixth time in school history USC had gone undefeated in the nonconference slate. USC defeated Providence in a 2017 First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament win since the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SMU before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since also winning two straight in the 2007 Tourney. After bringing in his recruits and establishing his system during the first two seasons, his Trojans took a big leap forward in the 2015-16 season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. USC went 12-20 during the 2014-15 campaign, with impressive wins at New Mexico and Boston College, as well a Pac-12 Tournament first-round upset win over Arizona State. USC went 11-21 in his first season, but Enfield developed freshmen Nikola Jovanovic and Julian Jacobs into impact Pac-12 players, Jacobs ultimately becoming an All-Conference player. Enfield captivated the nation during the 2013 season as the head coach at Florida Gulf Coast University as he guided the first No. 15 seed into the NCAA Sweet 16 with impressive wins over No. 2 seed Georgetown and No. 7 seed San Diego State and introduced the world to "Dunk City," the nickname for FGCU's high-flying and high-speed offense which often ended with thunderous dunks. In Enfield's two-year run at FGCU, the Eagles won 41 games, advanced to the A-Sun Championship game both seasons - its first two playing at the Division I level. FGCU had a 41-28 record in his two seasons as head coach (2011-12, 2012-13), equaling the win total of the program the previous four seasons. Prior to FGCU, Enfield spent the previous five seasons (2007-11) as an assistant coach at Florida State, helping the Seminoles to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments, including the Sweet 16 in 2011. FSU posted four 20-win seasons during his time on the staff and won 31 ACC games, the second-most in the conference behind Duke. In 2011 and 2012, FSU became the first program since Georgetown (1991-92) to lead the nation in defensive field goal percentage two straight seasons. He began his coaching career in the NBA, serving as the shooting coach for Milwaukee (1995, 1996). Then he was an assistant coach with Boston for two seasons (1999, 2000). Enfield played four seasons (1988-91) at Johns Hopkins, scoring a program-record 2,025 points. He also set the NCAA all-divisions career free throw percentage record of 92.5 percent, making 431-of-466 free throws. He was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station will be AM 790 KABC with Jordan Moore calling the action. The USC graduate is in his sixth season of working on USC basketball broadcasts, his third season as the play-by-play announcer.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 6th in the 2020-21 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) UCLA (251), 2.) ASU (246), 3.) Oregon (241), 4.) Stanford (209), 5.) Arizona (173), **6.) USC (154)**, 7.) Colorado (149), 8.) Utah (131), 9.) Washington (85), 10.) California (65), 11.) Washington State (54) and 12.) Oregon State (36).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,643-1,221* in its 115 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 80 of the first 114 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 174-72 in 15 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 90-22 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC is 52-8 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach, including 40-5 in its last 44 regular season nonconference home games.

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years. One of their biggest involvements the past several years has been with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Light the Night Walk.

THE MAGIC MARK -- With the 79-42 win vs. Stanford on March 3, USC is now 86-5 in its last 91 games when holding the opposition to under 70 points scored dating back to Feb. 28, 2015.

STINGY ON DEFENSE -- When USC allowed ASU to score 71 points on Feb. 17, it snapped a streak of seven consecutive games holding its opponent to under 70 points. USC then made it four of five games surrendering 71 or more points in a game. USC held Stanford to 43 points on March 3, the eighth opponent this season it has held under 60 points. Overall, USC has held 18 of 26 opponents under 70 points. USC is allowing its opponents 64.2 points per game which ranks second among Pac-12 schools.

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE -- USC has held its opponents to 38.7 percent shooting this season, best in the Pac-12 and eighth-best in the country. Stanford's 51.9 percent shooting against USC on Feb. 2 was the only time this season a Trojan opponent shot over 50 percent.

LOOKING FOR A BLOCK PARTY -- USC has had 136 blocks in its first 26 games for an average of 5.2 blocks per game, fifth in the country in total blocks. Freshman Evan Mobley is averaging 2.85 blocks per game, 8th in the country and first among freshmen. Mobley already ranks second on USC's all-time freshman blocks list (74), two behind Oneyka Okongwu (76), and 5th on the school's all-time top 10 list for a single season.

A DOUBLE DOSE OF MOBLEY PLEASE -- USC brothers Evan (9) and Isaiah Mobley (6) rank first and tied for second respectively in double-doubles this season by Pac-12 players. Evan Mobley also ranks tied for 22nd in the country with his nine double-doubles. The Mobleys also rank first (Evan, 8.5) and third (Isaiah, 7.7) in rebounding. Evan is averaging 16.2 points per game and Isaiah is averaging 9.1 points per contest.

MOBLEY ON LATE SEASON WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST -- USC freshman Evan Mobley is one of 20 players selected to the 2021 Wooden Award Late Season Watch List for the top collegiate player. Mobley is one of four freshmen on the list and the only Pac-12 player.

LIKE NIGHT AND DAY -- In its 20 wins, USC is shooting 48.6 percent from the floor (574-for-1180) and in its six losses is shooting 38.9 percent (133-for-342). USC has also outrebounded or had the same amount of boards as the opposition in all 20 of the wins (214 more total rebounds) and was outrebounded in four of its six losses. USC has a total of 57 assists in its six losses.

EFFICIENT OFFENSE -- USC is third among Pac-12 teams with an 74.7 scoring average and second with a +10.6 scoring margin. USC also is third among all Pac-12 teams with a 46.5 shooting percentage this season.

THE GOOD AND THE BAD -- The good news is USC ranks tied for 10th in the country with 561 free throw attempts. The bad news is it has made just 364 of those shots for a 64.9 shooting percentage from the charity stripe, which ranks 315th in the country (out of 340 teams).

TROJANS TELLING TALL TALE -- USC hopes that height translates into success as eight players on the roster are 6-7 or taller. According to KenPom.com, USC's roster is the tallest in the country with an average height of 79.6 inches.

LUCKY 7'S -- With the turnover to USC's roster since last season and the time missed due to injury by Ethan Anderson, 77.7 percent (1509 points) of USC's 1943 points scored this season have come from players who did not suit up for USC during the 2019-20 season.

EVAN MOBLEY NEAR THE TOP OF THE PAC -- USC freshman forward currently ranks among the Pac-12's top players in scoring (7th, 16.2 ppg), rebounds (1st, 8.5), field goal percentage (4th, .582) and blocks (1st, 74).

MOBLEY GETTING NOTICED - USC freshman forward Evan Mobley racked up the preseason honors being named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List on Dec. 1, to the Midseason List on Jan. 6 and the Late Season List on Feb. 1. He has already been named to the NABC Player of the Year Watch List, a Naismith Trophy semifinalist, a Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Award semifinalist, a Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award finalist and to the Pac-12 Media Preseason All-Conference First Team.

ISAIAH MOBLEY DOING DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUTY -- Sophomore forward Isaiah Mobley scored 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for his first career double-double in the game vs. CBU on Nov. 25. Last season, Mobley was within a basket or a rebound of logging a double-double four times. Mobley then set a new career high with 13 rebounds vs. Montana on Nov. 28. Isaiah Mobley also has double-doubles vs. BYU, at Arizona St., vs. Riverside, at Washington and vs. ASU to give him six for the season. He ranks tied for second among Pac-12 players in that category and third in rebounds with an 7.7 average. Isaiah has had 12 games this season with at least 8 rebounds.

MORE THAN A BOARD GAME -- USC has outrebounded the opposition 833-619 in its 20 wins (+10.7 rpg) and has been outrebounded 216-212 (-0.7 rpg) in its six losses. USC lost at Utah on Feb. 27, despite winning the board battle 41-30. USC outrebounded California Baptist 48-28 on Nov. 25, including 18-9 in offensive rebounds. The 20-rebound advantage was USC's biggest in a game since outrebounding Santa Clara 52-27 (+25) on December 14, 2017. USC also outrebounded ASU by 20 (50-30) on Jan. 9. The Trojans have had 13 games outrebounding the opposition by 10 or more rebounds.

NO THREE-PEAT -- After allowing CBU to make an opponent-record 20 three-pointers in the opener (20-for-41, 48.8 percent), USC has held its last 25 opponents to a combined 32.0 percent from three-point range (166-for-518). UCR on Jan. 12 and Colorado on Feb. 25, both with 12, were the only two other opponents to reach double figures in makes.

EADDY HAS BEEN A KEY ADDITION - USC graduate transfer guard Tahj Eaddy's baseline floater four minutes into the second half in the opener vs. CBU on Nov. 25 gave him 11 points in the game and 1,001 in his career. Eaddy scored 224 at Southeast Missouri State and 766 at Santa Clara. Eaddy finished the game with 18 points, including hitting the three-pointer that tied the game at 79 in regulation. Eaddy is second on the team with a 13.9 scoring average, which ranks 14th among Pac-12 players. He is also second on the team with 65 assists. Eaddy leads USC with 53 three-point baskets made (tied for second among Pac-12 players) and is connecting at a 39.6 percent rate from beyond the arc. Eaddy scored in double figures eight games in a row, before being held to 4 at Utah, and 20 times overall, second on the team. In the last seven games he has scored 121 points for an average of 17.3 points per game. He also has made 52.3 percent of his shots (45-for-86) in the seven contests.

PETERSON HAS BEEN DOING IT ALL -- Rice transfer junior guard Drew Peterson got the opening night start on Nov. 25 vs. CBU and came up one rebound short of a double-double and has remained in the starting lineup since. Peterson scored 12 points, had nine rebounds and three assists. Peterson had four double-doubles for the Owls during the 2019-20 season. Peterson led USC in scoring vs. Montana on Nov. 28 with 13 points, vs. BYU on Dec. 1 with 19 points and Feb. 27 at Utah with 19 points. He is third on the team with an 9.8 scoring average and a 5.1 rebound average. He had nine assists and no turnovers vs. Santa Clara on Dec. 29. Peterson had his first double-double as a Trojan with 13 points and 11 rebounds vs. Utah on Jan. 2, second with 15 points and 11 rebounds on Jan. 16 vs. WSU and third with 15 points and 11 rebounds vs. Oregon on Feb. 22. Peterson leads USC with 78 assists and came close to a triple-double with 10 assists, 8 rebounds and 7 points at Arizona on Jan. 7. He started USC's first 22 games, before coming off the bench for three games starting on Feb. 22 vs. Stanford. He started again on March 3 vs. Stanford and scored 15 points, had 9 rebounds and 6 assists. In the last four games he is averaging 13.3 points (53 total), 7.3 rebounds (29 total) and 3.5 assists (14 total).

MAKING ADJUSTMENTS -- USC outscored Stanford 43-25 in the second half on March 3. USC has only been outscored by the opposition in the second half in six games this season (vs. Montana, vs. WSU, vs. Arizona, vs. Oregon, at Colorado, at Utah). USC has outscored the opposition by 141 points in the second half and overtime of its 26 games (5.42 points).

HE'S BEEN A GOODWIN -- USC grad transfer forward Chevez Goodwin has been a very valuable addition to the Trojan squad. In 15.1 minutes game, he has averaged 5.9 points and 3.8 rebounds. He is third on the team with 38 offensive rebounds and third on the team with 10 blocks. His .542 shooting percentage is second among Trojans with at least one shot taken per game this season. Goodwin has scored in double figures four times with a best of 12 this season and has had 11 games with at least five rebounds. He started for the first time as a Trojan on Feb. 22 vs. Oregon.

WHITE HAS BEEN A STEAL -- Graduate transfer Isaiah White is averaging 7.0 points and 3.5 rebounds per game while making 22 starts for the Trojans. He is also leads the team with 26 steals. He had 10 points and seven rebounds in 18 minutes off the bench in the opener vs. CBU on Nov. 25. White added 10 points in the second game with eight of them coming from the free throw line. When Ethan Anderson could not answer the bell vs. UConn on Dec. 3, White was inserted into the starting lineup. He has started 21 times for USC and has made 72 career collegiate starts. White scored a season-best and team-leading 22 points at Arizona on Jan. 7 and had 13 points vs. WSU on Jan. 16 and 11 vs. Oregon State on Jan. 28. White left the game vs. Stanford on March 3 with back spasms.

A DOUBLE, DOUBLE-DOUBLE...THRICE! -- USC brothers Evan Mobley (17 points/11 rebounds) and Isaiah Mobley (11 points & 11 rebounds) both posted a double-double in the win vs. BYU on Dec. 1. It was the first career double-double for the freshman Evan and the second at that time of sophomore Isaiah's career and season. The pair also notched double-doubles in the win at Arizona State on Jan. 9 with Evan scoring 19 points and grabbing 13 rebounds and Isaiah scoring 13 points and grabbing 10 rebounds, as well as vs. UC Riverside on Jan. 12, with Evan scoring 20 points and grabbing 11 rebounds and Isaiah scoring 16 points and grabbing 12 rebounds.

JOYFUL JANUARY -- USC went 8-1 in the month of January, its most wins in any month since also going 8-1 in January of 2002.

THE WAIT IS OVER FOR BAUMANN -- Junior sharp-shooting guard Noah Baumann, who redshirted last season after transferring from San Jose, scored four points and had an assist in 15 minutes off the bench in his Trojan debut. Baumann was 2-for-3 from the floor and also grabbed three rebounds. Baumann scored 9 points vs. UConn on Dec. 3 and then scored 18 in his first start as a Trojan vs. UC Irvine on Dec. 8. He scored 11 points and made three 3-pointers vs. Oregon State on Jan. 28. Baumann is third on the team with 23 three-point baskets made.

LONGEST BREAK SINCE 1967 SEASON -- The Trojans went 20 days without playing a game following its win over UC Irvine on Dec. 8, until facing Santa Clara on Dec. 29. The 20 days without a game during a season was USC's longest stretch without a game since going 36 days without a game during the 1967 season (playing Dec. 21 and then not again until Jan. 27). After the game vs. UC Irvine on Dec. 8, USC had four scheduled games either postponed (Dec. 13 vs. Stanford and Dec. 20 at Oregon State) or canceled (Dec. 16 vs. San Francisco and Dec. 23 vs. Texas Southern) due to a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the USC men's basketball program that caused team activities to be paused beginning on Dec. 13.

DESERT DELIGHT -- USC defeated Arizona 87-73 in Tucson, Ariz. on Jan. 7 snapping a 10-game road losing streak at Arizona, then snapped a seven-game road losing streak at Arizona State with a 73-64 win on Jan. 9. The sweep in the desert of Arizona and ASU was USC's first since the 1985 season. It also marked USC's first 2-0 start in Pac-12 road games since the 2007 season. USC had a .486 shooting percentage and held the Arizona school to a combined .372 shooting percentage. USC also outrebounded the desert schools 82-62 in the two games.

ADD WATERS AND MIX -- Guard Reese Waters, a member of this year's highly-touted recruiting class, has graduated from high school early, enrolled at USC and became eligible for competition on Dec. 12. The 6-5 guard from Long Beach, Calif. made his first shot as a collegian, a three-pointer against Santa Clara on Dec. 29. Waters scored five points and had a rebound in five minutes of action against the Broncos. Waters and attended St. Bernard HS in Playa del Rey, Calif. He was ranked as the No. 4 player in the state of California and No. 50 overall player in the nation by 247Sports.com. Waters averaged 17.0 points, 10.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.0 steals per game in leading the Vikings to a 22-7 record last season.

IT'S A TEAM GAME -- Eight Trojans have already had at least one game of 10 points scored or more this season.

CBU SETS AN OPPONENT RECORD -- California Baptist's 20 three-point baskets made was a USC opponent record for makes in a game. The previous record of 16 was set by Arizona in 2002. CBU made 20 of 41 shots from beyond the arc for a 48.8 shooting percentage. Ty Rowell made 9 3-pointers to tie the record by a Trojan opponent from beyond the arc, set in 2019 by Markus Howard of Marquette.

LONDON TO FOCUS ON FOOTBALL -- USC basketball guard and football wide receiver Drake London has decided not to join the men's basketball team this season and to put all of his focus into football. London played in two games for the basketball team last season and had three rebounds in six minutes of action. This past football season, the sophomore had 33 catches for a team-leading 502 yards, along with three touchdowns.

THE 2020-21 TROJANS -- The USC men's basketball team has a new look for the 2020-21 season as the strong sophomore core of Ethan Anderson, Isaiah Mobley and Max Agbonkpolo is joined by eight new players which includes a consensus top three recruit in Evan Mobley and Noah Baumann who redshirted last season following his transfer from San Jose State. The 2020-21 Trojans will be a team with many interchangeable parts and feature players who can guard multiple positions. USC entered this season having won 109 games over the last five seasons, the winningest five-year stretch in school history and the 2020-21 Trojans look to continue the upward trend.

EVAN MOBLEY HAD A STONG COLLEGIATE DEBUT -- USC's decorated freshman forward Evan Mobley did not disappoint in his collegiate debut vs. CBU on Nov. 25, scoring 21 points, grabbing nine rebounds, three blocks and three dunks. His 21 points scored were the third-most by a USC freshman in his debut and the most since O.J. Mayo scored 32 vs. Mercer on Nov. 10, 2007.

MOBLEY NAMED PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK A RECORD SIX TIMES -- USC freshman forward Evan Mobley has been named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week six times this season, a new conference record. He won for his efforts for the week of Nov. 30-Dec. 6, the week of Dec. 7-13, the week of Jan. 4-10, the week of Jan. 18-24, the week of Feb. 1-7 and the week of Feb. 8-14.

MOBLEY SECOND-EVER NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER AND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK -- When freshman Evan Mobley was named Pac-12 Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week for the week of Feb. 1-7, he became the second player (USC's Onyeka Okongwu in 2020) to earn both honors in the same week.

OKONGWU KEEPS USC'S DRAFT SUCCESS ROLLING -- USC 2019-20 forward Onyeka Okongwu was selected sixth overall by the Atlanta Hawks in the first round of the 2020 NBA Draft. Okongwu was USC's highest drafted player since O.J. Mayo was selected third in the 2008 NBA Draft and fourth all-time taken in the top 10 (DeMar DeRozan 9th in 2009 and Paul Westphal 10th in 1972). For the second consecutive NBA Draft USC has had a player taken in the first round (Kevin Porter Jr., 2019). USC seven first-round selections since 2007 in the NBA Draft are tied for 13th among all college programs. Also, USC's four draft selections in the last three NBA Drafts are tied for the most among all-Pac-12 teams with Washington and Arizona.

YOU WILL BE MISSED... -- The Trojans have re-loaded and are anxious to continue the program's upward surge, but there is no doubt that this edition will be a different team. Gone are All-Pac-12 and now NBA forward Onyeka Okongwu (16.2 ppg, 8.6 rpg) and a pair of four-year players in all-time USC three-point baskets leader Jonah Mathews (13.4 ppg and 247 career 3-pointers made) and second all-time rebounder Nick Rakocevic (10.5 ppg, 923 career rebounds). In all, 8 of the 11 Trojans to score a point in the 2019-20 season are no longer on the roster. All that means is the new edition of the Trojan cagers will be called upon to replace 80.6 percent of the scoring, 76.4 percent of the rebounding and 74.7 percent of the minutes played.

RECAP OF THE 2019-20 SEASON -- The 2019-20 Trojans went 22-9 and led the Pac-12 in rebounding and were among the Conference's top teams in blocks, scoring defense and defensive field goal percentage. USC seemed to be just hitting its stride heading to the postseason as winners of five of its last seven games and finishing tied for third in Pac-12 play at 11-7 before the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. USC led all Pac-12 teams in Conference play in points allowed and field goal percentage defense.

USC opened the 2020-21 season with a 95-87 OT win over California Baptist on Nov. 25, despite the Lancers making a Trojan opponent record 20 3-point baskets. USC was outscored 60-15 in 3-point baskets. USC led much of the game, but was down 79-74 with 1:59 remaining. First Ethan Anderson hit a pair of free throws, then he hit Tahj Eaddy with a pass who drilled a 3-pointer with 47 seconds remaining to tie it at 79-all and send it into OT. CBU scored the first basket of OT, but USC scored the next 10 points to put the game away. USC was 6-for-6 from the field in OT and won its 12th home opener in 13 tries. Eaddy scored 18 points in his Trojan debut which surged him to 1,008 career points scored. Freshman Evan Mobley scored 21 points and had 9 rebounds. His points scored were third-most ever by a Trojan in his first career game and most since O.J. Mayo score 32 in 2007. Six Trojans scored 10 points or more for the first time since 2017 and all 9 players who saw action scored. Isaiah Mobley scored 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for his first career double-double. Ty Rowell made 9 3-pointers to tie the record by a Trojan opponent from beyond the arc, set in 2019 by Markus Howard of Marquette.

Tahj Eaddy scored 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting and USC routed Stanford 79-42 on March 3, snapping a 2-game skid. Drew Peterson added 15 points, 9 rebounds & 6 assists for USC which notched its 20th win for the 5th time in 6 seasons under Andy Enfield. USC took it to the Cardinal from the opening tip, scoring 15 straight points for a 17-2 lead after holding Stanford scoreless for over 9 minutes. USC held Stanford to 6 of 27 shooting and led 36-17 at halftime. The 17 points at halftime were the fewest by a Trojan opponent since Oregon St. also scored 17 points at the break on Dec. 28, 2016. After a layup by Stanford's Spencer Jones started the 2nd half, USC scored 14-straight to open up a 50-19 lead and cruised from there. USC cleared its bench with 5 minutes to go. The reserves pushed the lead to 38 on a dunk by Boubacar Coulibaly that had the bench on its feet cheering. Amar Ross' 3-pointer put USC ahead by 41 seconds later. The 42 points scored by Stanford were its fewest against USC since the 2011 season and the 37-point loss was its biggest since also falling by 37 in 1953. The last time USC beat any conference opponent by 37 points or more was in 2007 (Oregon State, 91-46). USC held Stanford to 25.4 percent shooting the lowest by an opponent since CSUF made 23.3 percent of its shots on Nov. 10, 2016.
