J.T. Higgins

Head Coach • 1st Year

J.T. Higgins, a Hall of Fame golf coach who guided the Texas A&M men's team to an NCAA championship and 17 NCAA appearances during his 19 years there, was named the head coach of the USC men's golf program on Aug. 14, 2020.

In his 23-year head coaching career at Texas A&M (2002-20) and New Mexico (1998-2001), he has been named Conference Coach of the Year three times and Region/District Coach of the Year four times. He was inducted into the Golf Coaches Association of America Hall of Fame in 2015.

With Higgins at the helm, Texas A&M captured the 2009 NCAA crown (the program's first ever in golf, as well as A&M's first in any sport since 1987 and first in a men's sport since 1939). His teams earned a school-record 12 consecutive NCAA Regional berths from 2003 to 2014. Texas A&M's appearance in the NCAA Championship in 2004 was its first since 1998.

Under Higgins, the Aggies posted 12 Top 5 finishes in NCAA Regional play, including Regional championships in 2018 and 2019, and had 10 Top 15 finishes at the NCAA Championships, including tied for fifth in 2018 and 2019. A&M finished in the Top 20 national ranking 12 times under Higgins and twice was in the nation's Top 5 in scoring rating. His teams posted the 15 lowest season scoring averages in school history.

His Aggies placed in the Top 3 of their conference tourney nine times (the first three were as members of the Big 12), including winning the Big 12 in 2012 (A&M's first league title since 1987) when he was the Big 12 Coach of the Year.

Texas A&M golfers earned 24 All-America honors under his watch, as well as more than three dozen Academic All-Conference honors. He produced nine professional tour players.

Higgins, 54, was the 2020 Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year as he led Texas A&M to a pair of tournament victories and a final No. 6 national ranking during the coronavirus-shortened season.

In 2018, A&M won a school-record six tournaments and for a portion of the season was ranked No. 1 in the coaches poll.

He was the Region Coach of the Year in 2005-08-10.

Higgins came to Texas A&M from New Mexico, where he led the Lobos to the NCAA Regionals in each of his four seasons and to two NCAA Championship appearances. His teams never finished below fourth at the conference tourney and in 1998 won the NCAA West Regional. He was the 2001 Mountain West

Conference Coach of the Year and District VII Coach of the Year.

Three New Mexico players earned All-America honors under Higgins' guidance and two were the Conference Freshman of the Year. Four of his players were named Academic All-America and 12 earned Academic All-Conference honors. UNM's Wil Collins received the 2001 Ben Hogan Award as the top student-athlete in college golf.

In 1999, Higgins coached the United States in the World Junior Golf Team Championships in Japan, leading the Americans to a runner-up finish.

Prior to New Mexico, Higgins served as an assistant coach at Nevada-Las Vegas under legendary coach Dwaine Knight for six years (1992-97). The Rebels appeared in the NCAA Championships each year, posting four Top 10 finishes and a runner-up showing in 1996. Then, with many of the players Higgins had recruited, UNLV won the NCAA Championship in 1998 in Higgins' first year at New Mexico.

While at UNLV, Higgins served as the team's academic advisor and guided 19 of 20 Rebel golfers to graduation. He also was the Executive Director of the Rebel Golf Foundation that raised more than \$3.1 million to help the men's golf program come close to endowing itself. In addition to academic and fund-raising duties, he was in charge of accounting and team travel.

Before joining the Rebels coaching staff, Higgins served as a UNLV sports information assistant in 1990-91. He was the publicist for the top-ranked UNLV men's basketball team that advanced undefeated to the 1991 NCAA Final Four under legendary coach Jerry Tarkanian.

Before UNLV, Higgins was the media relations director for the Las Vegas Stars, the AAA farm team of the San Diego Padres. He produced the organization's first-ever media guide and handled media coordination for the AAA All-Star game.

He began his career in sports publicity at his alma mater, Eastern Oregon State College. A standout basketball and baseball player there, he also was the school's sports information director during his junior and senior years.

Higgins graduated from EOSC in 1989 with a bachelor's degree in business administration and a specialization in economics.

A native of Meridian, Id., he has three children: Ashley, Ben, and Casey Lynn.



Matt Walton

Assistant Coach • 1st Year

Matt Walton, a collegiate All-American with Division I coaching experience to complement a broad array of work with juniors and amateurs, is in his first season as a USC men's golf assistant coach, hired on Nov. 4, 2020.

Walton comes to USC after one season as the men's golf assistant coach at Wichita State (2019-20) in which the Shockers won one regular-season event (NMSU/Herb Wimberly Invitational), posted one individual title and combined for another two individual top 10 finishes in the covid-shortened season.

The Shockers men's golf squad also posted the highest GPA (3.70) among all Wichita State teams, earned an American Athletic Conference Team Academic Excellence Award and seven of its eight golfers captured All-Academic conference honors.

Before joining Wichita State, Walton served as lead coach at Gary Gilchrist Golf Academy in Orlando, Fla., providing comprehensive training for some of the nation's top junior golfers. Prior to that he worked as an assistant professional for several years in Indiana.

Walton, a four-time national tournament qualifier at the NAIA and NJCAA

levels, graduated in 2013 from University of Cumberlands (Williamsburg, Ky.), with a degree in Sport and Exercise Science.

He played his final two seasons of collegiate golf with the Patriots and helped them win back-to-back Mid-South Conference Championships in 2012 and 2013.

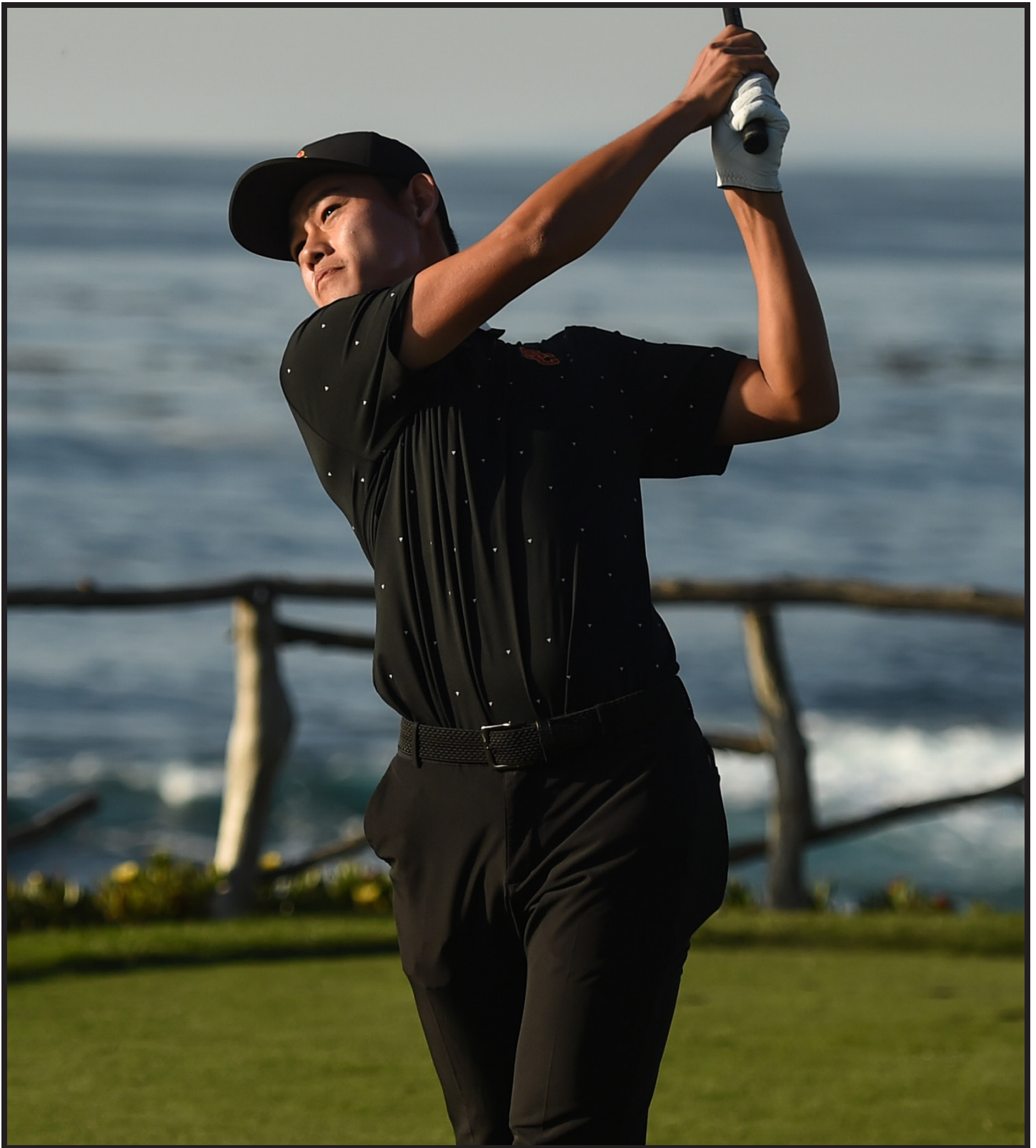
As a senior he twice earned conference golfer of the week honors and was named to the PING All-South Region squad. Cumberlands finished fifth in the 2012 NAIA National Championship and ninth in 2013.

Before transferring to Cumberlands, Walton played two seasons for Rend Lake College in Ina, Ill. The team took ninth at the 2010 NJCAA Division II National Championship. Walton qualified individually the following year and finished fifth to earn All-American second-team honors as well as PING All-Central Region team notice.

Walton, originally from Lytham St. Annes, England, has been married to his wife Carly for three years.

The Haskins Award

The Haskins Award, college golf's equivalent of the Heisman Trophy, has been presented each year since 1971 to the top collegiate golfer in the nation.

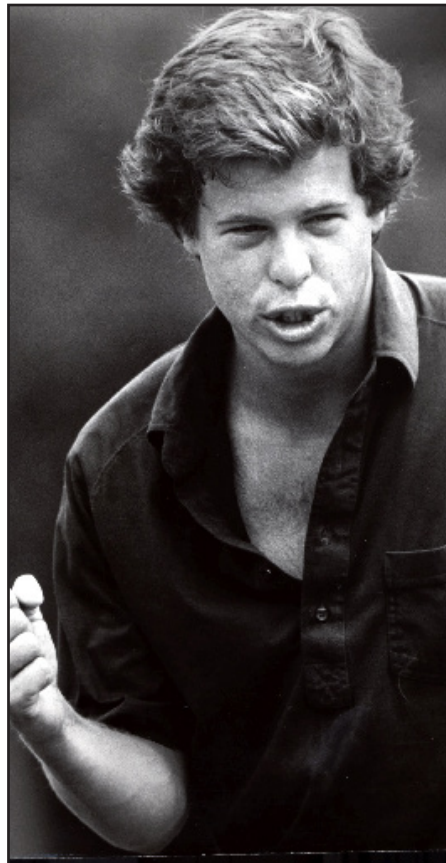
Three Trojans have been Haskins Award recipients:

- Scott Simpson won it after capturing the second of back-to-back NCAA championship crowns in 1977. Simpson went on to compete on the U.S. Walker Cup team in 1977, beginning an outstanding pro career which includes seven tour victories and over \$6 million in earnings.
- Sam Randolph was named the winner after his NCAA runner-up finish and 1985 U.S. Men's Amateur title. Randolph also competed on the '85 U.S. Walker Cup team.
- Jamie Lovemark won it in 2007 after winning the 2007 NCAA championship title as a freshman.

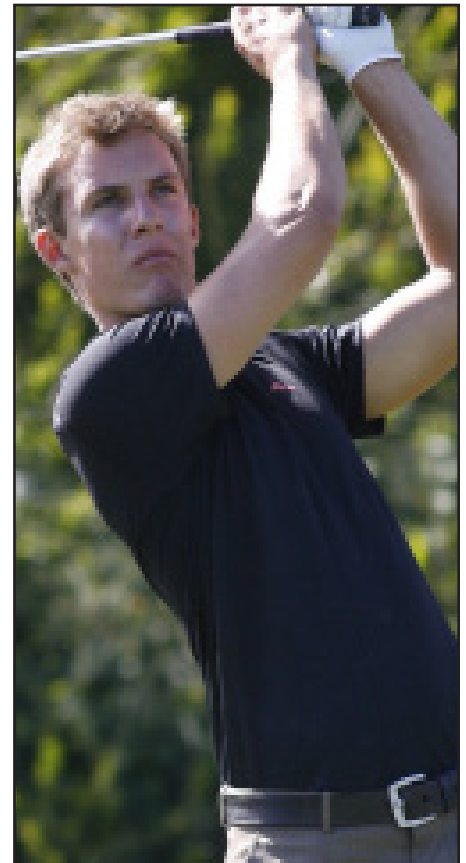
The award, voted on by media and collegiate coaches and players, is housed in the World Golf Hall of Fame in Pinehurst, N.C., and a replica is given to the winner.

USC's 'Fearsome Foursome'

AL "MR. 59" GEIBERGER (B.S., '59)

After winning 11 titles (including the **1966 PGA championship**) and more than \$1.2 million on the PGA tour, Geiberger joined the Senior Tour in 1987. He continued his success, winning 10 Senior PGA Tour events, earning a career-high \$608,877 in 1993. That year, he won the Infiniti Tournament of Champions and the GTE West Classic, with 10 Top 10 finishes. During his career, he has won 21 tournaments and finished first on the Champions Tour 10 times. However, it was at the 1977 Danny Thomas-Memphis Classic that he etched his name into the record books forever with an amazing 13-under-par 59 at the Colonial Country Club. A two-time All-American at USC (1958-1959), Geiberger was named an NCAA Silver Anniversary Award winner in 1984. Al, who participates in the annual "Trojan Golf Fantasy" fundraiser, has won over \$6 million in career earnings on both the regular and senior tours. In 2001, he had three top 25 finishes, including a season-best tie for 19th at the Bruno's Memorial Classic, and earnings totalling \$122,624. In 2002, he played in five events, with his best finish being a tie for 17th at the Royal Caribbean Classic. He returned to the Champions Tour in 2004, finishing 74th at the Administraff Small Business Classic and 75th at the SBC Championship. His son, Brent, won the Chrysler Classic of Greensboro 28 years after his triumph at the same tourney. They became the first father/son duo to win the same PGA tour event. He was inducted into the USC Hall of Fame in 1994.



SCOTT SIMPSON (Business Admin., '78)

A two-time first team All-American and back-to-back NCAA individual titleist (1976-77), Simpson had his biggest year on the PGA Tour in 1993, earning \$707,166 while winning the GTE Byron Nelson Classic. In 1987, he finished No. 4 on the money list, earning more than \$620,000, and joined an elite group when he captured the **U.S. Open** at San Francisco's Olympic Club. Since turning pro in 1977, Scott has won over \$6.4 million, notching seven PGA Tour victories during his pro career, including the 1998 Buick Invitational. Simpson also served on the 1987 Ryder Cup team. He suffered a broken ankle in 2000 and was unable to play on the tour, but he returned in 2001 to earn \$512,530 with his best finish being a tie for second at the Greater Greensboro Chrysler Classic. In 2003, he played in his first-ever Nationwide Tour event and finished tied for 54th at the Chitimacha Louisiana Open. His best effort for the season was a tie for 22nd at the MCI Classic. In 2004, he had one top 10 finish, a tie for 10th at the Valero Texas Open. He was inducted into the USC Hall of Fame in May of 1997. In his first full year on the Champions Tour in 2006, he won the Wal-Mart First Tee Open at Pebble Beach, had eight top 10 finishes and finished sixth on the money list. In 2007 on the Champions Tour, Simpson had five top 10 finishes and 14 in the top 25, earning more than \$800,000. He had nine top 10 finishes in 2008 and was 14th on the money list (\$1,272,626) and had seven top 10s in 2009.





CRAIG STADLER ('75)

A tour member since 1975, Stadler had perhaps his finest PGA season ever in 1991, placing second on the Tour's money list with \$827,628. "The Walrus," as he is affectionately called, has won 13 PGA Tour events, most recently the 2003 B.C. Open. Stadler also received the PGA Arnold Palmer Award as the tour's leading money winner in 1982. His fifth tour victory, the **1982 Masters**, served notice that he was among the tour's top players. Since winning the 1973 U.S. Amateur Championship and earning All-American honors four consecutive years at USC (1972-75), Stadler has gone on to earn over \$11 million on the PGA tour and crack the Top 15 on the all-time career money list. He played on the 1983 and 1985 Ryder Cup teams and won the Kemper Open twice (1981-82). In 2001, he had earnings of \$196,000, with his best finish being a tie for fifth at the WGS-Accenture Match Play Championship. In 2002, he played with his son, Kevin (another former USC golfer), for the first time in an official TOUR event at the B.C. Open. He later tied for 10th at the Worldcom Classic and earned over \$500,000 for the year. In 2003, he was named the Champions Tour "Rookie of the Year" as he was 14th on the money list in just 14 starts, with two wins and seven top-10 finishes. He was on fire for most of 2004, winning the **Champions Tour's Player of the Year** after a career-best five victories in a single season, the most wins by any player in a year since Larry Nelson in 2001. He also received the Arnold Palmer Award as the circuit's leading money winner, with a personal-best \$2,306,606--the 10th-highest money total ever. He joined Lee Trevino and Tom Watson as the third player to earn money titles on both the Champions and PGA Tours. In 2006, he had two runner-up finishes and five in the top 10 while in 2007, he carded four top 10 finishes with earnings of more than \$500,000. Six top 10 finishes in 2008 helped him earn \$752,732 and he had 10 top 10s in 2009. He was inducted into the USC Hall of Fame in 1999.

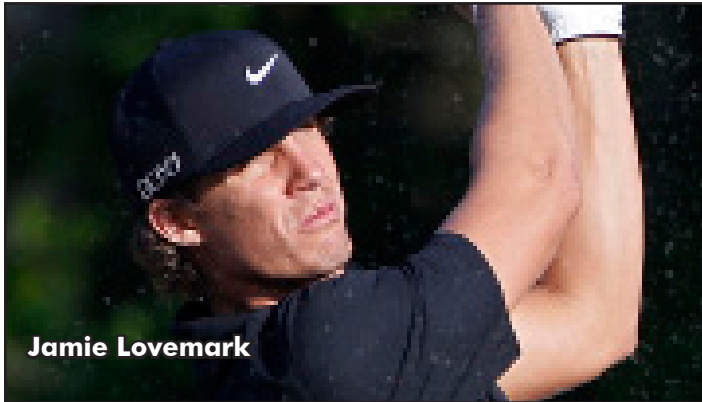


DAVE STOCKTON (General Management, '63)

Dave Stockton, who has earned a reputation as one of the golf world's best putters, is another in the distinguished line of Trojan standouts. Stockton has won 25 titles on the PGA and Senior PGA Tours, including the **1996 U.S. Senior Open**, winning career earnings of more than \$9.5 million, which ranks him at No. 6 on the all-time money list. Stockton joined the tour in 1964 and won the **1970 and 1976 PGA Championships**. Before joining the Senior Tour in 1991, Stockton logged 11 PGA Tour victories, earning over \$1.2 million. Upon joining the Senior Tour in 1991, he earned Rookie of the Year honors. In 1993, he dominated the Senior Tour, winning five tournaments and earning more than \$1.1 million in earnings. Dave followed that up with three victories in 1994 and won his second straight Arnold Palmer Award as the circuit's leading money winner. In 1997, he won the Franklin Quest Championship. In 2002, he had his highest finish on the money list since 1998 with \$304,000 in earnings. In 2003, he appeared in 20 events, placing top 10 in five of them with earnings of \$142,833. In 2004, he had three top-10 finishes and finished among the top 50 money winners for an unprecedented 12th consecutive season, earning \$145,250. He continues to play on the Champions Tour and has five top 10 finishes in the past five years. After serving as a Ryder Cup member in 1971 and 1977, Dave had the prestigious honor of being the 1991 PGA Ryder Cup Captain. He was inducted into the USC Hall of Fame in 1995. He served as chairman of the Senior Tour Player Advisory Council up until 2001. He is a second-generation Trojan.
