USC HOSTS VERMONT TUESDAY AT GALEN Third Of Four Home Games To Begin The Season

TONIGHT'S GAME -- The USC Trojans (1-1) are hosting the Vermont Catamounts (1-2) at the Galen Center on Nov. 15 at 8 p.m. The game will air on the Pac-12 Network with J.B. Long and Don MacLean calling the action. USC has started 1-1 for the eighth time in the last 16 seasons.

THE 2022-23 TROJANS -- Last season USC tied the school single-season wins record by going 26-8, finishing third in the Pac-12 and advancing to the 2022 NCAA Tournament. The 2022-23 Trojans will be led by a strong returning core of guards Boogie Ellis (12.5 ppg), Drew Peterson (12.4 ppg) and Reese Dixon-Waters (4.8 ppg). In addition, USC returns scholarship players Harrison Hornery (F), Kobe Johnson (G), Joshua Morgan (F) and Malik Thomas (G). The 2022-23 Trojans will also feature the No. 7 rankéd freshman class of forward Vincent Iwuchukwu, laroslav Niagu and Kijani Wright and guards Tre White and Oziyah Sellers.

USC'S STELLAR STRETCH -- USC won a school-record 73 games over the last three seasons (22 in 2020, 25 in 2021 and 26 in 2022). The previous school record for wins in three consecutive seasons was 71 (2016-18). The three consecutive seasons of 20+ wins also equals the school record for most consecutive 20-win seasons set from 2016-18.

WINNING WAYS -- USC's 73 total wins the previous three seasons tied for the third most among all Power 6 basketball programs, trailing only the last two NCAA champions Kansas (83) and Baylor (81). Also, USC's 160 wins the previous seven seasons ranked 13th among all Power 6 conference teams.

ENFIELD LEADING THE WAY -- USC head coach Andy Enfield is in his 10th season at USC and has compiled an 184-119 record. His wins total ranks fourth on USC's all-time wins list, trailing only Sam Barry (260), Forrest Twogood (251) and Bob Boyd (216). Including his two seasons as the head coach at FGCU (2012-13), Enfield has compiled a 225-147 record as a head coach.

NO DRAFT DODGERS HERE -- USC is one of three schools along with Duke and Kentucky to have at least one player selected in each of the last five NBA drafts. The Trojans selected in the last five NBA Drafts are: 2018 - De'Anthony Melton (No. 46), Chimezie Metu (No. 49), 2019 - Kevin Porter Jr. (No. 30), 2020 - Onyeka Okongwu (No. 6), 2021 - Evan Mobley (No. 4) and 2022- Isaiah Mobley (No. 49). USC had 11 players on 2022-23 NBA Opening Night rosters, tied for the fourth-most among all schools behind only Kentucky (27), Duke (25) and UCLA (12).

FACING VERMONT -- Vermont (1-2) is coming off a 94-85 double-overtime loss at CS Fullerton on Nov. 13. They opened with an 80-65 home win vs. Brown on Nov. 7 and a 79-53 loss at St. Mary's on Nov. 10. Guard Aaron Deloney, the 2022 American East 6th Man of the Year, leads the Catamounts with a 18.0 points per game average. The Trojans defeated Vermont 64-56 on Dec. 30, 2014 in the only other meeting between the schools.

MOUNT ST. MARY'S ON DECK -- USC's next game will be when it hosts the Mount St. Mary's Mountaineers (0-2) at the Galen Center on Nov. 18 at 8 p.m. It will be USC's first game ever against Mount St. Mary's. Guards Jalen Benjamin (20.5 ppg) and Dakota Leffew (14.5 ppg) lead Mount St. Mary's in scoring. Mount St. Mary's has losses at West Virginia (76-58) and at Coppin State (83-78) and will host McDaniel on Nov. 15, before traveling to Los Angeles.

IT STARTS WITH DEFENSE -- USC held Alabama State to 33.3 percent shooting and has held both opponents this season to under 40 percent shooting. USC held 22 of its 34 opponents during the 2021-22 season to under 40 percent shooting. USC held the opposition to a 39.0 shooting percentage during the season, 14th in the country. USC held its first 12 opponents during the 2021-22 season under 40 percent shooting in each game and to a combined 35.2 shooting percentage, which was second in the country. The Trojans were the first team in the last 15 seasons to hold its first 12 opponents to under 40 percent shooting in each game.

PETERSON & ELLIS RECEIVE PRESEASON RECOGNITION -- USC fifth-year guard Drew Peterson was named to The Sporting News 2022-23 Preseason All-America third team. He was also named to the Naismith Trophy Player of the Year Watch List. Both Peterson and senior guard Boogie Ellis were named to the 2022-23 Pac-12 Preseason All-Conference first team.

BLOCK PARTY 2023 -- USC has total 17 blocks in the first two games of the 2022-23 season, led by Joshua Morgan's 10 blocks. USC is currently tied for fourth in the country with an average of 8.5 blocks per game. Morgan it tied for second in the country with his 10 blocks. Morgan had 7 blocks vs. FGCU on Nov. 7 which tied him for fifth on USC's all-time single game blocks list.

BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS -- USC will open play in the Battle 4 Atlantis facing BYU on Nov. 23 at the Atlantis Paradise Island Resort in the Bahamas. The second game for the Trojans will be a Thanksgiving contest on Nov. 24 against either Butler or Tennessee and the final game on Nov. 25 will be against one of four teams: Dayton, Kansas, NC State and Wisconsin. The combined record of the eight teams competing at the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament is currently 12-3.

ALL ABOUT ENFIELD — Andy Enfield, 53, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and has quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. Results came immediately with the Trojans setting the school single-season win record and the most wins in program history over a two-year, three-year, four-year, five-year, six-year and now 7-year period. USC won 160 games over the previous seven seasons which is the third-most wins in the Pac-12 and the 13th-most wins in the nation among power conferences during that time. USC has had the second-best overall record in the Pac-12 four of the last five seasons (24-12 in 2018, 22-9 in 2020, 25-8 in 2021 and 26-8 in 2022). USC's 73 wins the past three seasons trail only the last two NCAA Champions Kansas (83) and Baylor (81) among the six basketball power conferences. Over the last five seasons, USC has had six players selected in the NBA Draft, tied for the seventh-most by any program in the country, with Evan Mobley being selected No. 3 overall in the 2021 NCAA Draft a year after Onyeka Okongwu was selected No. 6 in the 2020 NBA Draft. USC and Florida State were the only two schools to have a top 10 pick in each of those drafts. Only USC, Duke and Kentucky have had at least one player selected in each of the last five NBA Drafts. Enfield guided the Trojans into the postseason in three consecutive seasons (2016-18), the first time for USC since 2007-09, and his teams have reached the NCAA Tournament four times in eight seasons, including the 2020-21 season. His teams have also excelled in the classroom by setting the program's top team GPAs for the Spring, Fall and Summer sessions. Enfield has brought in seven consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2021 class ranking No. 12. Enfield has an **184-119** record in his first nine seasons as the USC head coach and is **225-147** in 11 seasons as a head coach. 119 record in his first nine seasons as the USC head coach and is 225-147 in 11 seasons as a head coach. USC went 26-8 in 2021-22, placed third in the Pac-12, reached the Pac-12 semifinals and the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in the last six seasons in which a tournament was played. The win total tied the school record. Forward Isaiah Mobley (selected in the 2022 NBA Draft by Cleveland) and guard Drew Peterson were named first-tam All-Pac-12. USC held the opposition to a 39.0 shooting percentage and its first 12 oppenents to under 40 percent shooting, the first time in 15 seasons a team had accomplished that feat. The 2020-21 Trojans went 25-8 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight, winning the most conference games and games overall in the regular season among Pac-12 teams. The 2019-20 Trojans went 22-9, finished tied for 3rd in the Pac-12 and were getting better as the season was cancelled due to COVID-19. The 2018-19 Trojans were bitten by the preseason with seven or eight scholarship. 25-8 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight, winning the most conference games and games overall in the regular season among Pac-12 teams. The 2019-20 Troians went 22-9, finished tied for 3rd in the Pac-12 and were getting better as the season was cancelled due to COVID-19. The 2018-19 Trojans were bitten by the injury bug beginning late in the summer, practicing the majority of the preseason with seven or eight scholarship players. Ultimately USC players missed \$4\$ games due to injury and finished with a 16-17 record after falling to regular season champion Washington 78-75 in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enfield guided the 2017-18 Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest outright conference finish since 1992. USCs 12 Pac-12 wins were its most since also going 12-6 in 2002. The Trojans reached the Pac-12 Tournament finish for the first time since winning the title in 2009. USC set school records with 296 three-pointers made, 1022 FG made and 569 assists. The Trojans also scored the second-most points by a USC team in history (2,798). The Trojans accomplished all of this and achieved a No. 10 ranking in the preseason, its highest since the 1974-75 season, despite 40 percent of its projected starting lineup missing much of the season. USC went 26-10 in the 2016-17 season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. USC defeated Providence in the First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament times the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SNUb before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. The high-flying athletic style was

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station will be AM 790 KABC with Jordan Moore calling the action. The USC graduate is in his ninth season of working on USC basketball broadcasts, his fifth season as the play-by-play announcer.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finisth 4th in the 2022-23 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) UCLA (386), 2.) Arizona (352), 3.) Oregon (336), **4.) USC (300)**, 5.) Stanford (239), 6.) Colorado (207), 7.) Arizona St. (193), 8.) Washington St. (185), 9.) Washington (158), 10.) Utah (102), 11.) California (69) and 12.) Oregon State (47).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,676-1,234* in its 117 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 82 of the first 116 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 189-77 in 17 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 97-23 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC is 58-9 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach, including 48-7 in its last 55 regular season nonconference

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years. One of their biggest involvements the past several years has been with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Light the Night Walk.

RANKINGS ROUNDUP -- USC ended the 2021-22 regular season ranked No. 22 in the AP Poll and was No. 28 in the Coaches Poll after the season was complete. USC was ranked as high as No. 5 last season on Jan. 10, its highest regular season ranking since also being ranked No. 5 on Dec. 30, 1974. USC finished the 2020-21 season ranked No. 9 in the Coaches Poll.

THE TROJANS WILL BE CHALLENGED - USC will face a tough nonconference schedule during the 2022-23 season which includes playing at the Battle4Atlantis in the Bahamas from Nov. 23-25. USC will open at the Battle4Atlantis facing BYU on Nov. 23, then either Butler or Tennessee on Nov. 24 and then face one of Dayton, Kansas, North Carolina State or Wisconsin on Nov. 25. The Trojans will also have a home game vs. Auburn on Dec. 18 and a game against Colorado State at the Jerry Colangelo Classic in Phoenix, Ariz. on Dec. 21.

PETERSON FILLS UP THE STAT SHEET -- USC 2022 All-Pac-12 guard Drew Peterson averaged 12.4 points and 6.2 rebounds last season, both ranking third among the Trojans. He also led the team with 113 assists and was second in free throws made (76) and three-pointers made (49), while finishing third in blocks (27) and steals (23). He has totaled 28 points, 15 rebounds and 12 assists in USC's two games this season.

ELLIS IS USC'S TOP RETURNING SCORER - Guard Boogie Ellis averaged 12.5 points last season, second among the Trojans and most among the returning players. Ellis also led USC with 56 three-point baskets made and with 27 steals. Ellis had a .789 free throw percentage (71-for-89) which ranked 10th in the Pac-12. Ellis is USC's leading scorer through the first two games with 34 points.

LEADERS OF THE PAC -- USC is tied for second in conference regular season wins among Pac-12 teams for the past five seasons (since the 2017-18 season).. USC is 60-34 in conference games during that stretch, one behind Arizona who is at 61-33. UCLA is 60-33, Oregon is 58-34 and Colorado is 54-40.

KING OF THE ROAD - USC was 9-3 on the road in 2021-22 with wins at Temple, FGCU, WSU, California, Colorado, Utah, ASU, OSU & Oregon. USC's nine true road wins were tied for the second most by any power conference team, trailing only Miami (10-2). USC was joined by three other teams with nine road wins: Wisconsin (9-2), Arizona (9-3), Duke (9-2) during the regular season. USC is 16-6 in road games the last two seasons.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN STREAK SNAPPED -- With USC's 75-69 loss at Stanford on Jan. 11, 2022, the Trojans suffered their first loss to a team from the state of California since Feb. 28, 2019 (1,047 days). USC had won 20 consecutive games against teams from California. USC went 3-3 against teams from California after that, so it is 23-4 in its last 27 games against teams from the state of California.

THE FAST START -- USC started the 2021-22 season at 13-0, tied for the fourth-best start by the Trojans in school history (also in 1940). USC's best start of a season was 17-0 in 1910, followed by 16-0 in 1971 and the 14-0 start to the 2017 season. USC's 3-0 start in Pac-12 play before losing was its best since beginning the 2002 conference season at 5-0.

STREAKS - USC's 13-game winning streak during the 2021-22 season before losing on Jan. 11 at Stanford tied for the 6th longest in school history.

THE MAGIC MARK -- USC defeated Alabama State 96-58 on Nov. 10. USC finished 20-3 in the 2021-22 season and is 111-8 in its last 119 games when hold the opposition to under 70 points, dating back to Feb. 28, 2015. USC has held 48 of its last 70 opponents to under 70 points dating back to the 2019-20 season.

MAGICAL BOTH WAYS -- Since the 2019 season, USC owns a 54-6 record when it scores 70 or more points.

ENFIELD INDUCTED INTO THE FGCU HALL OF FAME - Andy Enfield and his 2012-13 Florida Gulf Coast basketball team were inducted into the FGCU Athletics Hall of Fame on Nov. 15, 2021 as part of its first-ever class.

THE STRENGTH OF THREE -- A cord of three strands is not easily broken and a USC team with three players scoring 10 or more points is not easily defeated. USC is 1-0 this season and was 21-5 last season when it has had three or more players registering double digits in points. USC is 44-6 the last three seasons when at least three players scored in double figures.

THE WINNING WAYS -- Since the beginning of the 2016 season, USC has picked up 161 victories, 13th-most by any team in the six Power basketball conferences over that period (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 & SEC). In the last four seasons (including 2022-23), USC's 74 total wins are the fourth-most among all six basketball power conference teams.

TROJANS AFTER DARK - USC played 14 of its 34 games at 8 p.m. or later during the 2021-22 season. Of USC's 25 games during the 2022-23 season with a set game start time, nine are scheduled to begin at 8 p.m.

RECRUITING ROUND-UP - USC men's basketball 2022 recruiting class of Vincent Iwuchukwu, Iaroslav Niagu, Oziyah Sellters, Tre White and Kijani Wright was ranked No. 7 by 247Sports.com, the eighth consecutive class brought in by Andy Enfield and staff that ranks within the top 30 and fifth inside the top 20.

L.A.'S WINNINGEST BASKETBALL PROGRAM -- . If you are looking to watch some good basketball in Los Angeles, the Galen Center is the place to be. Not only do the Trojans have the best winning percentage in the city between the Trojans, Bruins, Lakers and Clippers the last three years, but it also stretches out over the last seven seasons (entering the 2022-23 season).

ENFIELD NAMED 2021 PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR -- USC head coach Andy Enfield was named the 2021 John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year recipient as he guided the Trojans to a 22-7 regular season record and second place in the Pac-12 with a 15-5 record, percentage points behind Oregon (14-4). USC finished 25-8 and its 25 victories were the most by a Pac-12 team and only six Division I teams won more games. Enfield was the first USC head coach to be named the conference's Coach of the Year since George Raveling in 1992. USC's other Conference Coach of the Year winners were Stan Morrison in 1985 and Bob Boyd in 1979.

USC TO THE NBA -- USC has 11 former players that began the season on NBA rosters, that ranks tied for fourth among all schools behind only Kentucky (27), Duke (25) and UCLA (12). Here are the 2022-23 stats for the Trojans playing in the NBA (through games of Nov. 13):

It snapped a 7-game winning streak in home openers, a 14-game nonconference regular season winning streak and a 13-game home winning streak against nonconference foes. USC led early 21-10, but held only a 30-29 lead at halftime. FGCU took the lead 2:28 into the second half and never looked back, leading by as many as 20 points. USC struggled with it shooting, making only 40.4 percent of its shots, including 15.8 percent from 3-point range. USC was outrebounded 46-35, including a 25-12 margin in the second half. Chase Johnston led FGCU with a gamehigh 20 points. Seven of the 11 Trojans to play scored 5 or more points. Josh Morgan made his first start for USC and scored 6 points, grabbed 9 rebounds and had 7 blocks. His block total ties for fifth on USC's all-time single-game block list.

Drew Peterson scored 21 points to lead five Trojans in double-figures and the Trojans cruised to a 96-58 victory at the Galen Center on Nov. 10. The 38-point win was USC's largest since defeating CSUN by 40 points on Nov. 9, 2021. Seven players scored 7 points or more and 9 of 10 players had at least one rebound. Boogie Ellis scored 15 points, had 4 assists and a career-high 7 steals. The 7 steals ties Ellis for fourth on USC's single-game steals list, becoming the first Trojan with 7 steals in a game since Julian Jacobs on Jan. 9, 2016 vs. Arizona. Tre White scored 8 points and grabbed 12 rebounds and hit a 35-footer at the first half buzzer to give the Trojans a 48-23 lead at the break, USC's most points in a first half since scoring 48 on Dec. 1 vs. Utah. USC outscored Alabama State 46-28 on points in the paint. USC made 55.4 percent of its shots, while holding the Hornets to 33.3 percent shooting.
