• USC HOSTS OREGON ST. IN PAC-12 HOME OPENER • • Trojans Seeking 3rd 2-0 Start In Conference Play Since 2011 •

TODAY'S GAME -- The USC Trojans (5-3) are hosting the Oregon State Beavers (4-4) at the Galen Center at 4:00 p.m. The game will air on the Pac-12 Network with Jordan Kent and Don MacLean calling the action. USC is attempting to begin conference play 2-0 for the third time since 2011. USC is honoring and presenting gifts to 600-800 elementary school students today who successfully completed the Readers of Troy reading program. In addition, the first 1,000 students to the game will receive a voucher for a T-shirt hoodie.

USC'S STELLAR STRETCH -- USC won a school-record 73 games over the last three seasons (22 in 2020, 25 in 2021 and 26 in 2022). The previous school record for wins in three consecutive seasons was 71 (2016-18). The three consecutive seasons of 20+ wins also equals the school record for most consecutive 20-win seasons set from 2016-18.

WINNING WAYS -- USC's 73 total wins the previous three seasons tied for the third most among all Power 6 basketball programs, trailing only the last two NCAA champions Kansas (83) and Baylor (81). Also, USC's 160 wins the previous seven seasons ranked 13th among all Power 6 conference teams.

ENFIELD LEADING THE WAY -- USC head coach Andy Enfield is in his 10th season at USC and has compiled an 188-121 record. His wins total ranks fourth on USC's all-time wins list, trailing only Sam Barry (260), Forrest Twogood (251) and Bob Boyd (216). Including his two seasons as the head coach at FGCU (2012-13), Enfield has compiled a 229-149 record as a head coach.

FACING OREGON STATE -- The Oregon State Beavers (4-4) are coming off a 66-65 home win over Washington on Dec. 1, snapping a 4-game skid. Oregon State won its first three games, before losing its next four games to Portland State (79-66), Duke (54-51), Florida (81-68) and then Portland State again (83-71). Freshman guard Jordan Pope leads three Beavers scoring in double figures with a 14.6 average. USC defeated Oregon State 81-71 in Los Angeles and then 94-91 in double-overtime in Corvallis, Ore. last season and has won 10 of its last 13 games against the Beavers. USC leads the all-time series with Oregon State 77-66 (2 USC wins vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 79-66).

CS FULLERTON ON DECK -- USC's next game will be vs. the CS Fullerton Titans (4-4) on Dec. 7 at 8 p.m. The Titans lost their last game 69-62 at Seattle on Nov. 30 and have played only three home games this season. Senior guard Jalen Harris leads four Titans scoring in double figures with a 15.7 average. USC leads the all-time series with CS Fullerton 6-0, winning the last meeting 84-42 on Nov. 10, 2017.

DECEMBER DANCE -- USC has gone 14-2 during the month of December the last three seasons, which helped lead to two NCAA Tournament appearances and a 22-9 season which ended with the cancellation of the tournament due to Covid-19. USC won all 6 games last December.

IT STARTS WITH DEFENSE -- USC held California to 27.7 percent shooting, the lowest by an opponent since holding Stanford to a 25.4 shooting percentage on March 3, 2021. USC has held 6 of its 8 opponents this season to 37.5 percent shooting or less. USC held 22 of its 34 opponents during the 2021-22 season to under 40 percent shooting. USC held the opposition to a 39.0 shooting percentage during the season, 14th in the country. USC is holding its opponents to a 36.9 shooting percentage this season, 23rd in the country.

MORGAN HOSTING BLOCK PARTY -- USC has 52 blocks in the first eight games of the 2022-23 season, led by Joshua Morgan's 29 blocks. USC is averaging 6.5 blocks per game, tied for 5th in the country. Morgan's 29 blocks this season ranks second in the country. Morgan had 7 blocks vs. FGCU on Nov. 7 which tied him for fifth on USC's all-time single game blocks list. He matched that total with 7 blocks at Cal on Nov. 30. His 29 blocks this season surpass his total from last season (28) and match the total by Isaiah Mobley who led the 2021-22 team with 29 blocks.

ELLIS BUILDING OFF LAST SEASON - Guard Boogie Ellis averaged 12.5 points last season, second among the Trojans and most among the returning players. Ellis also led USC with 56 three-point baskets made and with 27 steals. Ellis had a .789 free throw percentage (71-for-89) which ranked 10th in the Pac-12. Ellis is averaging 16.5 points this season and leads the Trojans with 18 three-pointers made. He was the only Trojan to score in double figures in the first seven games this season, before scoring 6 at Cal. He also has a team-leading 30 free throws made and is second on the team with 11 steals. Ellis has made 43.9 percent of his three-point attempts this season (18-for-41). Ellis is one of five Power 6 players averaging 16.5 or more points that has made 16 or more 3-pointers and has 10 or more steals.

IN THE SPIRIT OF THE HOLIDAYS, PETERSON IS GIVING TO ALL -- Guard Drew Peterson leads USC and is second among Pac-12 players with 51 assists, which ranks tied for ninth nationally. Peterson is the only player nationally averaging at least 14.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists per game this season. Peterson is averaging 14.9 points, 8.0 rebounds and 6.4 assists per game. His 3 double-doubles this season are tied for 21st in the country.

ALL ABOUT ENFIELD -- Andy Enfield, 53, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and has quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. Results came immediately with the Trojans setting the school single-season win record and the most wins in program history over a two-year, three-year, four-year, five-year, six-year and now 7-year period. USC won 160 games over the previous seven seasons which is the third-most wins in the Pac-12 and the 13th-most wins in the nation among power conferences during that time. USC has had the second-best overall record in the Pac-12 four of the last five seasons (24-12 in 2018, 22-9 in 2020, 25-8 in 2021 and 26-8 in 2022). USC's 73 wins the past three seasons trail only the last two NCAA Champions Kansas (83) and Baylor (81) among the six basketball power conferences. Over the last five seasons, USC has had six players selected in the NBA Draft, tied for the seventh-most by any program in the country, with Evan Mobley being selected No. 3 overall in the 2021 NCAA Draft a year after Onyeka Okongwu was selected No. 6 in the 2020 NBA Draft. USC and Florida State were the only two schools to have a top 10 pick in each of those drafts. Only USC, Duke and Kentucky have had at least one player selected in each of the last five NBA Drafts. Enfield guided the Trojans into the postseason in three consecutive seasons (2016-18), the first time for USC since 2007-09, and his teams have reached the NCAA Tournament four times in eight seasons, including the 2020-21 season. His teams have also excelled in the classroom by setting the program's top team GPAs for the Spring, Fall and Summer sessions. Enfield has brought in seven consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2021 class ranking No. 12. Enfield has an **188-121** record in his first nine seasons as the USC head coach and is **229-149** in 11 seasons as a head coach. USC went 26-8 in 2021-22, placed third in the Pac-12, reached the Pac-12 semifinals and the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in the last six seasons in which a tournament was played. The win total tied the school record. Forward Isaiah Mobley (selected in the 2022 NBA Draft by Cleveland) and guard Drew Peterson were named first-team All-Pac-12. USC held the opposition to a 39.0 shooting percentage and its first 12 opponents to under 40 percent shooting, the first time in 15 seasons a team had accomplished that feat. The 2020-21 Trojans went 25-8 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight, winning the most conference games and games overall in the regular season among Pac-12 teams. The 2019-20 Trojans went 22-9, finished tied for 3rd in the Pac-12 and were getting better as the season was cancelled due to COVID-19. The 2018-19 Trojans were bitten by the injury bug beginning late in the summer, practicing the majority of the preseason with seven or eight scholarship players. Ultimately USC players missed 54 games due to injury and finished with a 16-17 record after falling to regular season champion Washington 78-75 in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enfield guided the 2017-18 Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest outright conference finish since 1992. USC's 12 Pac-12 wins were its most since also going 12-6 in 2002. The Trojans reached the Pac-12 Tournament finals for the first time since winning the title in 2009. USC set school records with 296 three-pointers made, 1022 FG made and 569 assists. The Trojans also scored the second-most points by a USC team in history (2,798). The Trojans accomplished all of this and achieved a No. 10 ranking in the preseason, its highest since the 1974-75 season, despite 40 percent of its projected starting lineup missing much of the season. USC went 26-10 in the 2016-17 season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. USC defeated Providence in the First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament win since the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SMU before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since also winning two straight in the 2007 Tourney. After bringing in his recruits and establishing his system during the first two seasons, his Trojans took a big leap forward in the 2015-16 season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. The high-flying athletic style was also in effect in the 2015-16 season as the Trojans averaged over 3.5 dunks per game and set the then USC season record with 182 blocks, ranking in the top 15 in the country in this category. USC went 12-20 during the 2014-15 campaign, including a Pac-12 Tournament first-round upset win over Arizona State. USC went 11-21 in his first season. Enfield captivated the nation in 2013 as the head coach at Florida Gulf Coast University as he guided the first No. 15 seed into the NCAA Sweet Sixteen with impressive wins over No. 2 seed Georgetown and No. 7 seed San Diego State and introduced the world to "Dunk City," the nickname for FGCU's high-flying and high-speed offense which often ended with thunderous dunks. Over Enfield's two-year run at FGCU, the Eagles won 41 games, advanced to the A-Sun Championship game both seasons and became the first No. 15 seed in NCAA Tournament history to make the Sweet Sixteen. His two seasons were the program's first as Division I postseason eligible. His squads played an up-tempo offense that featured spectacular dunks and alley-oops (they were nicknamed "Dunk City") and a defense that thrived on takeaways, as they ranked 16th nationally in steals (8.9 per game). As the NCAA tourney's No. 15 seed, the Eagles shocked second-seeded Georgetown and then seventh-seed San Diego State to advance to the Sweet Sixteen. In 2012 in his first year at FGCU, he led the team to the Atlantic Sun Tournament championship game. Prior to going to FGCU, Enfield spent the previous five years (2006-07 through 2010-11) as an assistant coach at Florida State, helping the Seminoles to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments (2009-11), including the Sweet 16 in 2011. Enfield began his coaching career in the NBA, serving as the shooting coach for the Milwaukee Bucks for two seasons (1994-95 and 1995-96). He then was an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics for two seasons (1998-99 and 1999-2000). Through his company All Net Basketball, he was a player development consultant for NBA teams and players, focusing on improving shooting technique and offensive skills. Enfield played four seasons (1987-88 through 1990-91) at Johns Hopkins, scoring a program-record 2,025 career points. He set the NCAA all-divisions career free throw percentage record (92.5, hitting 431-of-466 shots). He was a Division III All-American third teamer in 1991 and was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station will be AM 790 KABC with Jordan Moore calling the action. The USC graduate is in his ninth season of working on USC basketball broadcasts, his fifth season as the play-by-play announcer.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 4th in the 2022-23 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) UCLA (386), 2.) Arizona (352), 3.) Oregon (336), 4.) USC (300), 5.) Stanford (239), 6.) Colorado (207), 7.) Arizona St. (193), 8.) Washington St. (185), 9.) Washington (158), 10.) Utah (102), 11.) California (69) and 12.) Oregon State (47).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,680-1,236* in its 117 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 82 of the first 116 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 191-77 in 17 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 99-23 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC is 60-9 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach, including 50-7 in its last 57 regular season nonconference home games.

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years. One of their biggest involvements the past several years has been with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Light the Night Walk.

GETTING IT DONE -- With the 59-57 win over Vermont on Nov. 15, USC improved to 7-2 in one-possession games since the start of the 2021-22 season.

KINGS OF THE ROAD - USC opened up the 2022-23 road slate with a 66-51 win at California on Nov. 30. USC was 9-3 on the road in 2021-22 with wins at Temple, FGCU, WSU, California, Colorado, Utah, ASU, OSU & Oregon. USC's nine true road wins were tied for the second most by any power conference team, trailing only Miami (10-2). USC was joined by three other teams with nine road wins: Wisconsin (9-2), Arizona (9-3), Duke (9-2) during the regular season. USC is 17-6 in road games the last three seasons.

THE 2022-23 TROJANS -- Last season USC tied the school single-season wins record by going 26-8, finishing third in the Pac-12 and advancing to the 2022 NCAA Tournament. The 2022-23 Trojans will be led by a strong returning core of guards Boogie Ellis (12.5 ppg), Drew Peterson (12.4 ppg) and Reese Dixon-Waters (4.8 ppg). In addition, USC returns scholarship players Harrison Hornery (F), Kobe Johnson (G), Joshua Morgan (F) and Malik Thomas (G). The 2022-23 Trojans will also feature the No. 7 ranked freshman class of forward Vincent Iwuchukwu, Iaroslav Niagu and Kijani Wright and guards Tre White and Oziyah Sellers.

RANKINGS ROUNDUP -- USC ended the 2021-22 regular season ranked No. 22 in the AP Poll and was No. 28 in the Coaches Poll after the season was complete. USC was ranked as high as No. 5 last season on Jan. 10, its highest regular season ranking since also being ranked No. 5 on Dec. 30, 1974. USC finished the 2020-21 season ranked No. 9 in the Coaches Poll.

THE TROJANS WILL BE CHALLENGED - USC will face a tough nonconference schedule during the 2022-23 season which includes playing at the Battle4Atlantis in the Bahamas from Nov. 23-25. USC opened at the Battle4Atlantis facing BYU on Nov. 23, then faced No. 22/ No. 21 Tennessee on Nov. 24 and then faced Wisconsin on Nov. 25. The Trojans will also have a home game vs. Auburn on Dec. 18 and a game against Colorado State at the Jerry Colangelo Classic in Phoenix, Ariz. on Dec. 21.

NO DRAFT DODGERS HERE -- USC is one of three schools along with Duke and Kentucky to have at least one player selected in each of the last five NBA drafts. The Trojans selected in the last five NBA Drafts are: 2018 - De'Anthony Melton (No. 46), Chimezie Metu (No. 49), 2019 - Kevin Porter Jr. (No. 30), 2020 - Onyeka Okongwu (No. 6), 2021 - Evan Mobley (No. 4) and 2022- Isaiah Mobley (No. 49). USC had 11 players on 2022-23 NBA Opening Night rosters, tied for the fourth-most among all schools behind only Kentucky (27), Duke (25) and UCLA (12).

LEADERS OF THE PAC -- USC is tied for first in conference regular season wins among Pac-12 teams for the past six seasons (since the 2017-18 season).. USC is 61-34 in conference games during that stretch, tied with Arizona who is at 61-33 and UCLA who is 61-33. Next up would be Oregon at 59-34 and Colorado at 54-40.

THE MAGIC MARK -- USC defeated Cal 66-51 on Nov. 30 to improved to 3-1 this season when holding the opposition under 70 points.. USC finished 20-3 in the 2021-22 season and is 113-9 in its last 122 games when hold the opposition to under 70 points, dating back to Feb. 28, 2015. USC has held 51 of its last 73 opponents to under 70 points dating back to the 2019-20 season.

MAGICAL BOTH WAYS -- Since the 2019 season, USC owns a 56-6 record when it scores 70 or more points.

ENFIELD INDUCTED INTO THE FGCU HALL OF FAME - Andy Enfield and his 2012-13 Florida Gulf Coast basketball team were inducted into the FGCU Athletics Hall of Fame on Nov. 15, 2021 as part of its first-ever class.

THE STRENGTH OF THREE -- A cord of three strands is not easily broken and a USC team with three players scoring 10 or more points is not easily defeated. USC is 5-0 this season and was 21-5 last season when it has had three or more players registering double digits in points. USC is 48-6 the last three seasons when at least three players score in double figures.

THE WINNING WAYS -- Since the beginning of the 2016 season, USC has picked up 164 victories, 13th-most by any team in the six Power basketball conferences over that period (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 & SEC). In the last four seasons (including 2022-23), USC's 77 total wins are tied for the fourth-most among all six basketball power conference teams (through games of Dec. 1).

PETERSON & ELLIS RECEIVE PRESEASON RECOGNITION -- USC fifth-year guard Drew Peterson was named to The Sporting News 2022-23 Preseason All-America third team. He was also named to the Naismith Trophy Player of the Year Watch List. Both Peterson and senior guard Boogie Ellis were named to the 2022-23 Pac-12 Preseason All-Conference first team.

TROJANS AFTER DARK - USC played 14 of its 34 games at 8 p.m. or later during the 2021-22 season. Of USC's 27 games during the 2022-23 season with a set game start time, nine are scheduled to begin at 8 p.m.

COMING ATTRACTIONS -- USC is bringing in the No. 6 ranked men's basketball recruiting class for the 2023-24 seasons, according to Rivals.com. Leading the way is 247Sports.com No. 1 overall recruit point guard Isaiah Collier from Atlanta, Ga. His teammate from Wheeler High in Marietta, Ga., forward Arrinton Page, the No. 55 player overall according to ESPN.com, has also signed an NLI to continue their collaboration in L.A. Rounding out the class is the No.53 overall player according to On3.com guard Silas Demary Jr. from North Carolina. USC's 2022 class of Vincent Iwuchukwu, Iaroslav Niagu, Oziyah Sellters, Tre White and Kijani Wright was ranked No. 7 by 247Sports.com.

L.A.'S WINNINGEST BASKETBALL PROGRAM -- If you are looking to watch some good basketball in Los Angeles, the Galen Center is the place to be. Not only do the Trojans have the best winning percentage in the city between the Trojans, Bruins, Lakers and Clippers the last three years, but it also stretches out over the last seven seasons (entering the 2022-23 season).

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN STREAK SNAPPED -- With USC's 75-69 loss at Stanford on Jan. 11, 2022, the Trojans suffered their first loss to a team from the state of California since Feb. 28, 2019 (1,047 days). USC had won 20 consecutive games against teams from California. USC went 3-3 against teams from California after that, so it is 23-4 in its last 27 games against teams from the state of California.

THE FAST START -- USC started the 2021-22 season at 13-0, tied for the fourth-best start by the Trojans in school history (also in 1940). USC's best start of a season was 17-0 in 1910, followed by 16-0 in 1971 and the 14-0 start to the 2017 season. USC's 3-0 start in Pac-12 play before losing was its best since beginning the 2002 conference season at 5-0.

STREAKS - USC's 13-game winning streak during the 2021-22 season before losing on Jan. 11 at Stanford tied for the 6th longest in school history.

ENFIELD NAMED 2021 PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR -- USC head coach Andy Enfield was named the 2021 John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year recipient as he guided the Trojans to a 22-7 regular season record and second place in the Pac-12 with a 15-5 record, percentage points behind Oregon (14-4). USC finished 25-8 and its 25 victories were the most by a Pac-12 team and only six Division I teams won more games. Enfield was the first USC head coach to be named the conference's Coach of the Year since George Raveling in 1992. USC's other Conference Coach of the Year winners were Stan Morrison in 1985 and Bob Boyd in 1979.

USC TO THE NBA -- USC has 11 former players that began the season on NBA rosters, that ranks tied for fourth among all schools behind only Kentucky (27), Duke (25) and UCLA (12). Here are the 2022-23 stats for the Trojans playing in the NBA (through games of Dec. 1):
