EIGHT MPSF PLAYERS OF THE YEAR | 10 NATIONAL PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

After a productive business trip to Europe, the USC men's water polo team is ready to clock in for work in the home office.

Back in July, the Trojans journeyed to Europe for a team training trip jam-packed with competition. What's more, the venture offered USC's seven newcomers valuable hours alongside returning Trojans, building up chemistry and experience sure to give head coach Marko Pintaric's 2022 squad a powerful foundation for the season to come.

"It was super valuable in terms of experience," Pintaric said of the trip, which took the Trojans through Spain and Croatia. "We played about 15 games, and the No. 1 thing was that our newcomers had a chance to play together, work

on fundamentals of our system and develop our team chemistry. Usually that takes the whole year."



As NCAA finalists last season, this year's Trojans open the 2022 campaign ranked No. 2 in the nation. USC went 18-3 overall in that run to the title match — the program's 15th appearance in the final in its 16 consecutive trips to the NCAA tourney. Two All-Americans — Jake Ehrhardt and Ashworth Molthen — both return from that 2021 roster, which also featured All-MPSF honoree Carson Kranz. In all, USC's arsenal includes savvy seniors Marcus Longton and Chris Sturtevant. Ehrhardt and Sturtevant serve as USC's team captains, leading a 30-player Trojan roster boasting balance, talent and determination to bring the program its 11th national championship.

"Every year our ultimate goal is to win the national championship," Pintaric said. "The strength of our team that I'm noticing is our team chemistry and leadership. Our seniors in particular know the system and they've been to the NCAA Tournament every year, so they are teaching the newer players what it takes."

Ehrhardt has four seasons of experience with the Trojans, having been a freshman when USC won its most recent NCAA crown in 2018. He also has U.S. National Team experience — although he is not alone. Redshirt senior Molthen also has been a member of Team USA, and junior Kranz represented the United States at the 2021 FINA Junior World Championship. Additionally, three newcomers saw international action at the recent FINA Youth World Championships, where freshmen Evan Ausmus and Bernardo Herzer played for the USA, and freshman Andrej Grgurevic capped up for Australia.

Last season, Ehrhardt, Molthen, Longton and Kranz all logged at least 20 goals for the Trojan cause, and their firepower will be key to USC's gameplan in 2022. They'll have plenty of support, too. Savvy perimeter scoring prowess also returns in the hands of Sturtevant, Chris Agliozzo, Luka Brnetic, Jake Carter, Tom McGuire and Joshua Waldoch, while the offensive grunt work at two-meters falls largely on the muscle of Max Miller and Tony Nardelli.

USC's incoming reinforcements are headlined by Italian import Massimo Di Martire, who also has National Team experience and who joins the Trojans as a grad student. And in addition to Ausmus, Grgurevic and Herzer, USC's true freshmen are primed to shine. Lefties Charlie Saunders and Jack Vort pair well with the two-meter power of Zac Crenshaw. Meanwhile, fans can expect to see more of returners Reed Stemler, Henry Saunders and Aidan Wattson.

Not to be missed is USC's depth between the pipes. Goalies Blake Jackson, Kyle McKenney and Garrett Allen each logged minutes last year and stand to provide a stanch rotation of defensive backbone along with redshirt freshman Eric Hubner and true freshman Herzer.

"I'm very confident in our group of goalies," Pintaric said. "They work hard, and the defense in front of them is working hard to protect them, too. Offensively we have lefties, guards who can shoot and excellent shooters all around. Our post-up game is also strong. We have eight guys who can go in and post up. Our offense is looking consistent, and I'm excited for this season to start."

MARIC PINTARIC

Former USC All-American Marko Pintaric is in his 22nd season on the USC staff and fourth year as head coach of the USC men's and women's teams.

Pintaric spent the previous three seasons as co-head coach for the USC men after three seasons as an associate head coach. From 2015-19, Pintaric also served as the

scouting director for the USC women. Prior to 2015, Pintaric was as assistant coach to both the USC men and women.

In his first year at the helm of the USC program, Pintaric guided the men to a 16th straight NCAA appearance with a trip to the NCAA Semifinals in 2019. In 2020 with the women, Pintaric had the Women of Troy ranked No. 1 in the nation when competition was canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

As he enters his fourth year as USC's head coach, he holds a 41-18 overall record with the USC men and a 54-6 record with the women. In 2021, Pintaric led the USC women to the NCAA Championship and was named **MPSF and National Coach of the Year** on the women's side. In 2022, the Women of Troy again reached the NCAA final, and Pintaric was named **MPSF Coach of the Year** for the second straight season.

In his first season as head coach of the USC men, he guided the Trojans to a 15-6 overall record with a run to the NCAA Semifinals in USC's 15th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. In last season's 2021 campaign, the USC men went 18-3 overall and reached the NCAA final for the 16th time in the past 17 seasons.

In all, Pintaric has been on the USC staff for nine men's NCAA titles and six USC women's national championships since taking on a coaching role in 2001.

A member of USC's 1998 national championship team as a player, Pintaric was a two-year starter for the Trojans in 1997 and 1998. He recorded 44 goals during the Trojans' 1998 national championship season and earned National Player of the Year and first team All-America honors. He also earned second team All-America honors in 1997. Pintaric was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team both years. He transferred to USC from the University of Zagreb in Croatia, where he was a member of the Croatian Junior National Team (1989-94).

Prior to coaching at USC, Pintaric served as the varsity coach at Loyola High in Los Angeles during the 1999-2000 school year. He has played club for Shores, Los Angeles Water Polo and New York Athletic Club, where he also was a member of the 2001 summer national championship team and four consecutive winter national championship teams (1999-2002).

In November 2012, Pintaric joined interim head coach Jovan Vavic on the coaching staff for the U.S. Men's National Team, helping lead Team USA to World Championship qualification with success at the 2013 UANA World Aquatic Championship Qualification Tournament in Canada

Pintaric graduated from USC in 2000 with a degree in communication and earned his master's in 2003 in communication management. He and his wife. Beatrice, have two sons, Francesco and Filip.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

16TH SEASON

Casey Moon is in his 16th season on the USC staff. He first joined the USC coaching staff in 2007, just a year before the Trojan men began their six-year run of national championships, and has also helped the Women of Troy win four NCAA titles since coming to USC. In fall 2019, Moon moved into a dual role as associate head coach for the USC men's and women's teams. In fall 2021, Moon moved to full-time associate head coach duties for the USC women. For the coming 2022-23 seasons, he is serving as associate head coach for both programs under Pintaric.

He previously served as the USC men's director of player personnel and as the USC women's associate head coach for four seasons, and was an assistant on both sides from 2007-14.

Moon also served as interim head coach for the USC women during the 2019 season, going 9-2 in that role while helping the Trojans win the MPSF Tournament Championship and reach the 2019 NCAA final.

In all, Moon has been on the USC staff for six men's NCAA championship runs (2008, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2018) and four NCAA titles by the women (2010, 2013, 2016, 2018). Moon also served as interim women's head coach during the 2019 season.

Moon served as assistant coach for the U.S. Men's Junior National Team at the 2021 FINA Junior World Championships in Prague. He also was an assistant coach for the U.S. National Team for the 2013 UANA World Aquatic Championship Qualification Tournament, helping Team USA qualify for the FINA World Championships. Moon was head coach of the Trojan Water Polo Club Under-21 team for five years.

Prior to coming to USC, Moon served as an assistant coach for Trojan Water Polo Club and as head coach at Santa Cruz High School. Moon also was an assistant for Wax'em Water Polo Club in Santa Cruz. As a player, Moon competed at UC Santa Cruz, graduating in 2004 with degrees in biology and legal studies. In high school, Moon was a four-year varsity swimmer and water polo player at St. John Bosco, where he was named MVP as well as All-CIF and all-league as a senior.



ASSISTANT COACH

1st season

Ivan Buich enters his first season as assistant coach for USC men's water polo. A native of Mlini, Croatia, Buich brings 15 years of coaching to Troy.

Buich comes to USC after spending seven seasons at San Juan Hills High School as head coach of the boys and girls teams, reaching two CIF finals in that span. He also served as an assistant coach on the Santa Margarita Catholic boys' and girls' coaching staff, helping the Eagles win the girls CIF title in 2013.

With Orange County Water Polo Club, Buich was a head coach at all levels, spending the last seven years with the 18-unders boys. He also served as a head coach for Los Angeles Athletic Club for three years and coached at Mt. SAC as women's assistant in the 2021-22 season.

Buich attended Redwood High School in Marin County, Calif., before going on to play at Golden West College and Long Beach State. He received his bachelor's degree in history from Arizona State. After college, he competed in Croatia for VK Gusar. Buich and his wife, Jen, have a 4-year-old son, Roko.

USC Athletics celebrated the ceremonious groundbreaking on Nov. 2, 2012 of the \$16 million Uytengsu Aquatics Center, made possible by the record \$8 million lead gift by former walk-on swimmer and 1983 swim captain Fred Uytengsu. The gift is the largest ever to Athletics from a former student-athlete.

The \$16 million Uytengsu Aquatics Center includes a new stadium entrance, diving and dryland training areas, men's and women's locker rooms, coaches' offices, meeting rooms, a new scoreboard, permanent seating and renovation of the diving tower and pool deck. In May 2014, the brand-new venue was host to the 2014 NCAA Women's Water Polo Championships.



National Championships

USC has long dominated the world of intercollegiate athletics. In fact, it could be argued that Troy was the "Collegiate Athletic Program of the 20th Century." USC men and women have combined for 134 national team titles, which includes 111 NCAA team titles.

Trojan men's teams are tops in the nation in NCAA championships with 85 — more than any other university. Overall, USC's men have won 98 national championships.

USC has won the National Collegiate All-Sports Championship — an annual ranking by *USA Today* (previously *The Knoxville Journal*) of the country's top men's athletic programs — six times (1971-72-74-75-77-80) since its inception in 1971.


USC's women are also a force, with 36 national team titles, all since 1976, including two won in 2013 by the water polo and golf teams and three in a row by beach volleyball.

From 1959-60 to 1984-85, USC put together an amazing streak. In each of those 26 years, at least one Trojan team won a national championship (including five crowns in both 1962-63 and 1976-77).

Impressive recent streaks have been held by both the USC men's water polo and tennis teams. The tennis team won four in a row from 2009-12, and the water polo team won an unprecedented six straight men's titles from 2008-13.
