• USC OPENS 2023-24 SEASON AGAINST K-STATE IN VEGAS • • Trojans Coming Off Program-Record 4th Consecutive 20-Win Season •

TONIGHT'S GAME -- The No. 21 USC Trojans (0-0) will open the 2023-24 season facing the Kansas State Wildcats (0-0) in a Hall of Fame Series game at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas, Nev. on Nov. 6 at 7 p.m. The game will air on TNT with Spero Dedes, Grant Hill and Allie LaForce calling the action.

A LOOK AT LAST YEAR -- The Trojans went 22-11 during the 2022-23 season, including a 14-6 record in Pac-12 play which tied for second in the conference. USC also advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season. It was the Trojans' fourth consecutive 20-win season, a school record for back-to-back 20-win seasons. The Trojans return leading scorer and All-Pac-12 guard Boogie Ellis and have added the No. 4 ranked recruiting class in the country, which includes the consensus No. 1 overall player, guard Isaiah Collier.

USC'S STELLAR STRETCH -- USC has won a school-record 95 games over the last four seasons (22 in 2020, 25 in 2021, 26 in 2022 and 22 in 2023). The four consecutive seasons of 20+ wins sets a school record for most consecutive 20-win seasons, breaking the mark of three consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins from 2016-18.

WINNING WAYS -- USC's 95 total wins the last four seasons are tied for sixth-most among all Power 6 basketball programs, trailing only Kansas (111), Baylor (104), Arizona (99), UCLA (99) and Duke (97). Also, USC's 182 wins the last eight seasons ranks tied for 14th among all Power 6 conference teams.

FACING KANSAS STATE -- The Kansas State Wildcats went 26-10 during the 2022-23 season and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight, beating Montana State, Kentucky and Michigan State along the way. The Wildcats return three starters (Nae'Quan Tomlin - 10.4 ppg, Cam Carter - 6.5 ppg and David N'Guessan - 6.4 ppg) and have added nine new players to the roster since last season. USC has a 1-4 all-time record against Kansas State, last playing the Wildcats on March 20, 2008 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament (L, 67-80). Jerome Tang is the K-State head coach and he was named the 2023 Naismith Men's Coach of the Year.

GETTING THINGS STARTED -- USC lost 74-61 in its 2022-23 season opener at home against FGCU on Nov. 22, 2022. That loss snapped a seven-game home opener winning streak. USC is now 81-36 all-time in season openers. USC is opening up away from the Galen Center for the first time since the 2013-14 season when the Trojans lost 78-65 at Utah State. The last time USC opened the season with a neutral site game was an 82-77 loss vs. North Carolina on Nov. 27, 1987 in the first round of the Richmond Holiday Classic.

CSU BAKERSFIELD ON DECK FOR HOME OPENER -- USC will host CSU Bakersfield in its home opener at the Galen Center on Nov. 9 at 6 p.m. USC is 22-5 in its last 27 home openers. CSU Bakersfield went 11-22 during the 2022-23 season. USC is 2-0 all-time against the Roadrunners, winning 90-75 in the last meeting on Nov. 25, 2018.

USC FIRST TO BRING IN BOTH MEN'S & WOMEN'S TOP RECRUIT -- Isaiah Collier was the consensus No. 1 men's basketball recruit for 2023 and JuJu Watkins the No. 1 women's recruit for 2023. It marks the first time that the top recruit on the men's and women's sides both selected to attend the same school in the same season. Also, both the USC men's and women's team are ranked No. 21 in the AP preseason poll, the first time both teams have been ranked in the AP preseason top 25.

ENFIELD MOVING UP THE USC ALL-TIME COACHING WINS LIST -- USC head coach Andy Enfield will begin his 11th season at USC and has compiled an **205-129** record in his first 10 seasons. He picked up his 200th win on Feb. 4, 2023 vs. Washington. Enfield's win total ranks fourth on USC's all-time wins list, trailing only Sam Barry (260), Forrest Twogood (251) and Bob Boyd (216). Including his two seasons as the head coach at FGCU (2012-13), Enfield has compiled a 246-157 record.

IT STARTS WITH DEFENSE -- USC held its opponent to under 40 percent shooting in 19 of its 33 games in the 2022-23 season. USC held its opponents to a 39.3 shooting percentage last season, 8th in the country. Over the last four seasons, USC's defense has held the opposition to 38.9 FG percentage, third in the country, tops among teams in the six basketball power conferences. USC held California to 27.7 percent shooting on Nov. 30 last season, lowest by an opponent since holding Stanford to a 25.4 shooting percentage on March 3, 2021. Only two times last season did an opponent shoot over 50 percent in a game. Also over the last four seasons, USC has held the opposition to a 42.4 shooting percentage on two-point field goals, best in the country.

RETURNING ALL-PAC-12 PLAYERS -- The Trojans have three returning players who received 2022-23 Pac-12 accolades. Boogie Ellis was named Pac-12 First Team and Kobe Johnson and Joshua Morgan were named to the All-Defensive Team.

LEADERS OF THE PAC -- The Trojans have a 54-24 record in Pac-12 games the last four seasons and are the only school to finish in the top three of the conference in each of those seasons.

ENFIELD AT USC -- Andy Enfield, 54, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. Results came immediately with the Trojans setting the school single-season win record and the most wins in program history over a two-year, three-year, four-year, five-year, six-year, seven-year and now eight year period. USC has won 182 games over the last eight seasons which is the third-most wins in the Pac-12 and tied for the 14th-most wins in the nation among power conferences during that time. USC has had the second-best overall record in the Pac-12 four of the last six seasons (24-12 in 2018, 22-9 in 2020, 25-8 in 2021, 26-8 in 2022 and 22-11 in 2023). USC's 95 wins the past four seasons are tied for the sixth-most among the six basketball power conferences. Over the last six seasons, USC has had six players selected in the NBA Draft, tied for the 13th-most by any program in the country, with Evan Mobley being selected No. 3 overall in the 2021 NCAA Draft a year after Onyeka Okongwu was selected No. 6 in the 2020 NBA Draft. USC is one of seven teams to have had at least one player selected in five of the last six NBA Drafts. Enfield guided the Trojans into the NCAA Tournament the last three seasons and into the postseason from 2016-18 (2018 NIT), the first time for USC since 2007-09, and his teams have reached the NCAA Tournament five times in the last seven seasons in which there was a postseason. His teams have also excelled in the classroom by setting the program's top team GPAs for the Spring, Fall and Summer sessions. Enfield has brought in eight consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2022 class ranking No. 7 and the 2023 class ranking No. 4. Enfield has an **205-129** record in his first 10 seasons as the USC head coach and is **246-157** in 12 seasons as a head coach. USC went 22-11 in the **2022-23** season and advanced to the NCAA Tournament where it fell to Michigan State 72-62 in the first round. The three consecutive NCAA Tournaments for the Trojans matched a program record. USC also finished tied for second in the Pac-12 with a 14-6 record. Boogie Ellis and Drew Peterson were named All-Pac-12 first team. USC was third in scoring average (72.5) and led the conference by holding opponents to a 39.3 field goal percentage, the fourth consecutive season holding opponents to under 40 percent shooting from the floor. USC went 26-8 in **2021-22**, placed third in the Pac-12, reached the Pac-12 semifinals and the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in the last six seasons in which a tournament was played. The win total tied the school record. USC held its first 12 opponents to under 40 percent shooting, the first time in 15 seasons a team had accomplished that feat. USC was 11-0 in the nonconference and was undefeated in play prior to conference games for the second time in six seasons, one of only two teams to have done that (Villanova). The **2020-21** Trojans went 25-8 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight, winning the most conference games and games overall in the regular season among Pac-12 teams. The **2019-20** Trojans went 22-9, finished tied for 3rd in the Pac-12 and were getting better as the season was cancelled due to COVID-19. The Trojans led Pac-12 teams in defensive field goal percentage and points per game allowed in Conference play. The **2018-19** Trojans were bitten by the injury bug beginning late in the summer, practicing the majority of the preseason with seven or eight scholarship players. Ultimately USC players missed 54 games due to injury and finished with a 16-17 record after falling to regular season champion Washington 78-75 in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enfield guided the **2017-18** Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest outright conference finish since 1992. USC's 12 Pac-12 wins were its most since also going 12-6 in 2002. The Trojans reached the Pac-12 Tournament finals for the first time since winning the title in 2009. USC set school records with 296 three-pointers made, 1022 FG made and 569 assists. The Trojans also scored the second-most points by a USC team in history (2,798). The Trojans accomplished all of this and achieved a No. 10 ranking in the preseason, its highest since the 1974-75 season, despite 40 percent of its projected starting lineup missing much of the season. USC went 26-10 in the **2016-17** season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. The Trojans won their first 14 games which was tied for the fourth-longest winning streak in school history and was the best USC start since the 1971 season. The 13-0 mark in nonconference regular season action was just the sixth time in school history USC had gone undefeated in the nonconference slate. USC defeated Providence in the First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament win since the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SMU before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since also winning two straight in the 2007 Tourney. After bringing in his recruits and establishing his system during the first two seasons, his Trojans took a big leap forward in the **2015-16** season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. USC played an exciting brand of basketball, averaging over 80 points per game and ranking among the nation's top 20 in offensive output. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. The high-flying athletic style was also in effect in the **2015-16** season as the Trojans averaged over 3.5 dunks per game and set the then USC season record with 182 blocks, ranking in the top 15 in the country in this category. Enfield and staff brought in the No. 12-ranked freshman class in **2014-15** and they became key members of the team. McLaughlin was named to the 2015 Pac-12 All-Freshman team and went on to become one of three Pac-12 players all-time to record 700 or more assists and 1,600 or more career points scored. Elijah Stewart would leave USC as the school's career record-holder for three-point baskets made. USC went 12-20 during the **2014-15** campaign, including a Pac-12 Tournament first-round upset win over Arizona State. USC went 11-21 in his first season (**2013-14**), but Enfield developed freshmen Nikola Jovanovic and Julian Jacobs into impact Pac-12 players. In 2016, Jacobs would lead the Pac-12 in assists and was named to the All-Conference team.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station will be AM 790 KABC with Jordan Moore calling the action. The USC graduate is in his 10th season of working on USC basketball broadcasts, his sixth season as the play-by-play announcer.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 2nd in the 2023-24 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) Arizona (303), 2.) **USC (264)**, 3.) UCLA (249), 4.) Oregon (228), 5.) Colorado (210), 6.) Arizona State (148), 7.) Utah (139), 8.) Stanford (131), 9.) Washington (108), 10.) Washington State (94), 11.) California (67) and 12.) Oregon State (42).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,697-1,244* in its 117 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 83 of its 117 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 203-78 in 17 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 102-23 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC is 63-9 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach, including 53-7 in its last 60 regular season nonconference home games.

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES -- With the 68-65 win vs. Arizona State on March 4, USC improved to 10-4 in one-possession games since the start of the 2021-22 season, 4-2 during the 2022-23 season.

THE JOHNSON JUMP -- Junior Kobe Johnson averaged 9.2 points and 5.0 rebounds as a sophomore in the 2022-23 season, while tying for 17th in the country with 72 steals. The 72 steals also tied him for third on USC's single-season steals list. As a freshman, he averaged 1.2 points and 1.0 rebounds while playing in 27 games. Johnson also finished third on the 2022-23 team in assists (85) and tied for third in blocks (14). Johnson also led the Trojans with a 84.1 shooting percentage from the free throw line. Johnson averaged 12.4 points over the Trojans' final 11 games of the 2022-23 season. He set his career high with 21 points vs. Washington on Feb. 4, 2023. He registered a career-high 9 rebounds vs. Michigan State in the NCAA Tournament on March 17 and had 19 games with 5 or more rebounds.

THE BOOGIE MAN RETURNS -- USC fifth-year player Boogie Ellis has returned for one final season with the Trojans. The All-Pac-12 guard averaged 17.7 points and his 583 total points scored last season were the 10th-most ever in a single season by a Trojan player. Ellis is the highest -scoring USC player who led the team in scoring and returned the next season since Desmon Farmer in 2004 (18.7 ppg in 2003). Ellis tied for the Pac-12 lead with 83 three-pointers made and is the second-leading returning scorer in the Pac-12. Ellis averaged 22.8 points over USC's final eight regular season games, including matching the Trojan Galen Center record and setting a career high with 35 points vs. Arizona on March 2.

HE WAS BIG GAME BOOGIE -- In USC's 6 games last season against ranked teams, guard Boogie Ellis averaged 22.7 points. He scored 21 points vs. No. 22 Tennessee on Nov. 24, 28 vs. No. 19/18 Auburn on Dec. 18, 10 at No. 10/8 UCLA on Jan. 5, 11 at Arizona on Jan. 19, 31 vs. No. 8 UCLA on Jan. 26 and a career-high 35 vs. No. 8/9 Arizona on March 2.

LINE DANCING IN 2022-23 -- USC made 74.5 percent of its free throws during the 2022-23 season, third-best all-time by a Trojan team and their best team FT percentage since the 1976 team made a school-record 75.8 percent of its free throws. USC had shot higher than 70 percent for a season from the free throw line twice in the previous 15 seasons and averaged 65.5 percent from the line the previous four seasons. USC made all 14 of its FT attempts at Arizona State on Jan. 21, tying for the third most makes from the charity stripe in a game without a miss in school history. On Jan. 19 at Arizona, USC made 66.7 percent of its free throw, snapping a streak of five consecutive games making 70 percent or more from the charity stripe, USC's longest such stretch since an 8-game stretch in the 2016-17 season.

NO DRAFT DODGERS HERE -- USC is one of seven schools to have at least one player selected in five of the last six NBA drafts. The Trojans selected in the last six NBA Drafts are: 2018 - De'Anthony Melton (No. 46), Chimezie Metu (No. 49), 2019 - Kevin Porter Jr. (No. 30), 2020 - Onyeka Okongwu (No. 6), 2021 - Evan Mobley (No. 4) and 2022- Isaiah Mobley (No. 49).

THE MAGIC MARK -- USC defeated Arizona State 68-65 on March 4 to improve to 15-3 last season when holding the opposition under 70 points. USC finished 20-3 in the 2021-22 season and is 125-11 in its last 136 games when hold the opposition to under 70 points, dating back to Feb. 28, 2015. USC has held 65 of its last 92 opponents to under 70 points dating back to the 2019-20 season.

MAGICAL BOTH WAYS -- Since the 2019 season, USC owns a 68-9 record, 15-3 in the 2022-23 season, when it scores 70 or more points.

THE STRENGTH OF THREE -- A cord of three strands is not easily broken and a USC team with three players scoring 10 or more points is not easily defeated. USC was 20-5 last season and was 21-5 in the 2021-22 season when it had three or more players registering double digits in points. USC is 63-11 the last three seasons when at least three players score in double figures.

THE WINNING WAYS -- Since the beginning of the 2016 season, USC has picked up 182 victories, tied for 14th-most by any team in the six Power basketball conferences over that period (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 & SEC). In the last four seasons, USC's 95 total wins are tied for sixth-most among all six basketball power conference teams.

WHEN FULLY LOADED... -- USC went 8-2 record in games last season when it had all of its rotational players available, only losing to Arizona twice.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE AWAITS THE 2023-24 TROJANS -- The Trojans are set to play a potential 10 games against teams which played in the 2023 NCAA Tournament, nearly a third of the schedule. In addition to the always challenging Pac-12 slate of games, the nonconference schedule features a potential nine of 11 contests against teams that finished over .500, including five scheduled games with teams which won more than 20 games. Also, three of its opponents, Gonzaga, UC Irvine and Eastern Washington, won or tied for their regular season conference title.

USC HOSTED A BLOCK PARTY -- USC had 167 blocks last season, led by Joshua Morgan's 63 blocks. USC averaged 5.1 blocks per game, 11th in the country. Morgan's 2.17 blocks per game average led all Pac-12 players and ranked 16th in the country. Morgan had 7 blocks vs. FGCU on Nov. 7 which tied him for fifth on USC's all-time single game blocks list. He matched that total with 7 blocks at Cal on Nov. 30. USC as a team has registered 638 blocks over the last four seasons which ranks 7th nationally.

USC TO THE NBA -- USC had 8 former players that began the 2023-24 season on NBA rosters, which ranked tied for 12th among all schools. Here are the current 2023-24 stats for the Trojans playing in the NBA:
