USC TO HOST LONG BEACH STATE ON SUNDAY • Freshman Guard Bronny James Potentially To Make Collegiate Debut •

TODAY'S GAME -- The USC Trojans (5-3) will host Long Beach State (6-4) at the Galen Center on Dec. 10 at 1:00 p.m. The game will air on the Pac-12 Network with Jacob Tobey and Don MacLean calling the action. The game will be part of a doubleheader as the No. 6-ranked USC women's team (7-0) will host UC Riverside at 3:30 p.m. USC's next home game for the men's team will be Jan. 3, 2024 vs. California.

THE GONE GUYS -- After today's game vs. Long Beach State, USC will play its next four games on the road. USC is scheduled to play at Auburn on Dec. 17, at Alabama State on Dec. 19, at Oregon on Dec. 28 and at Oregon State on Dec. 30. The stretch is the first time USC has played four consecutive road games since the 2002 season (at San Diego, LMU, Washington and WSU). If you go back to the Rady Children's Invitational in San Diego, USC is in a stretch of playing 7 of 9 games away from the Galen Center. USC is also playing only five home games in its first 13 games for the first time since also playing just five home games in the first 13 games of the 2005 season.

USC'S STELLAR STRETCH -- USC won a school-record 95 games over the previous four seasons (22 in 2020, 25 in 2021, 26 in 2022 and 22 in 2023). The four consecutive seasons of 20+ wins sets a school record for most consecutive 20-win seasons, breaking the mark of three consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins from 2016-18. USC's 95 total wins the last four seasons was tied for sixth-most among all Power 6 basketball programs, trailing only Kansas (111), Baylor (104), Arizona (99), UCLA (99) and Duke (97).

FACING LONG BEACH STATE -- Long Beach State (6-4) is coming off an 88-66 win at home vs. Life Pacific on Dec. 6. Guard Marcus Tsohonis leads Long Beach State with an 17.2 scoring average. LBSU has a win at Michigan, 94-86, on Nov. 17 and has won its last three games. USC is 12-6 all-time against Long Beach State, winning the last four contests all by 11 points or less, the last being an 88-78 win on Dec. 14, 2022.

ON DECK: ROAD TRIP TO AUBURN AND ALABAMA STATE -- USC will play at Auburn (5-2) on Dec. 17 and at Alabama State (4-4) on Dec. 19 to close out the nonconference slate. Auburn will play Indiana in Atlanta, Ga. on Dec. 9 and UNC Asheville in Huntsville, Ala. on Dec. 13 before hosting USC. Auburn has won 44 consecutive home nonconference games and is 87-11 at home over the last seven seasons. USC is 3-0 all-time against Auburn, winning at home last season 74-71. Alabama State will play at LSU on Dec. 13 before hosting USC as part of the Pac-12-SWAC Legacy Series which began last season. USC defeated Alabama State 96-58 at the Galen Center on Nov. 10, 2022 in the first-ever meeting in basketball between the two schools.

USC FIRST TO BRING IN BOTH MEN'S & WOMEN'S TOP RECRUIT -- Isaiah Collier was the consensus No. 1 men's basketball recruit for 2023 and JuJu Watkins the No. 1 women's recruit for 2023. It marks the first time that the top recruit on the men's and women's sides both selected to attend the same school in the same season. Also, both the USC men's and women's team were ranked No. 21 in the AP preseason poll, the first time both teams were ranked in the AP preseason top 25.

MAKING HIS SHOTS COUNT -- Redshirt senior forward Joshua Morgan has made 20 of his first 27 shots this season (74.1 percent).

ENFIELD MOVING UP THE USC ALL-TIME COACHING WINS LIST -- USC head coach Andy Enfield is in his 11th season at USC and has compiled an 210-132 record. He picked up his 200th win on Feb. 4, 2023 vs. Washington. Enfield's win total ranks fourth on USC's all-time wins list, trailing only Sam Barry (260), Forrest Twogood (251) and Bob Boyd (216). Including his two seasons as the head coach at FGCU (2012-13), Enfield has compiled a 251-160 record.

IT STARTS WITH DEFENSE -- USC allowed Gonzaga to shoot 52.3 percent from the floor on Dec. 2, just the fourth game in the last two seasons an opponent has made 50 percent or more of its field goals against the Trojan defense. Through the first eight games this season, USC has held its opponents to 41.6 percent shooting. USC held its opponents to a 39.3 shooting percentage last season, 8th in the country. Over the last four seasons, USC's defense held the opposition to 38.9 FG percentage, third in the country, tops among teams in the six basketball power conferences. Also over the last four seasons, USC held the opposition to a 42.4 shooting percentage on two-point field goals, best in the country.

TROJAN TRIPLE THREAT -- USC guards Boogie Ellis (22.4), Isaiah Collier (17.3) and Kobe Johnson (13.0) are all averaging over 13.0 points per game. They also are combining to average 10.3 rebounds, 9.4 assists and 4.5 steals in USC's 8 games, despite Johnson missing two games and Ellis one.

ELLIS SHOOTING TO THE TOP - Fifth-year guard Boogie Ellis is averaging 22.4 points, eighth in the country this season. He is third in the country with 4.0 makes from three-point range per game, netting a career-high 8 vs. Eastern Washington on Nov. 29. The 8 three-pointers made tied him for fourth on USC's all-time list for three-pointers made in a game. He has made 28 of 59 three-point shots this season (47.5 percent). Ellis has made 167 three-point baskets as a Trojan, 11th on USC's all-time three-point baskets made list, 4 behind David Bluthenthal (1999-02) who is 10th on the list and made 171 in his USC career.

ENFIELD AT USC -- Andy Enfield, 54, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. Results came immediately with the Trojans setting the school single-season win record and the most wins in program history over a two-year, three-year, four-year, five-year, six-year, seven-year and now eight year period. USC has won 182 games over the last eight seasons which is the third-most wins in the Pac-12 and tied period. USC has won 182 games over the last eight seasons which is the third-most wins in the Pac-12 and tied for the 14th-most wins in the nation among power conferences during that time. USC has had the second-best overall record in the Pac-12 four of the last six seasons (24-12 in 2018, 22-9 in 2020, 25-8 in 2021, 26-8 in 2022 and 22-11 in 2023). USC's 95 wins the past four seasons are tied for the sixth-most among the six basketball power conferences. Over the last six seasons, USC has had six players selected in the NBA Draft, tied for the 13th-most by any program in the country, with Evan Mobley being selected No. 3 overall in the 2021 NCAA Draft a year after Onyeka Okongwu was selected No. 6 in the 2020 NBA Draft. USC is one of seven teams to have had at least one player selected in five of the last six NBA Drafts. Enfield guided the Trojans into the NCAA Tournament the last three seasons and into the postseason from 2016-18 (2018 NIT), the first time for USC since 2007-09, and his teams have reached the NCAA Tournament five times in the last seven seasons in which there was a postseason. His teams have lace averaged by setting the program's team of the Spring and his teams have also excelled in the classroom by setting the program's top team GPAs for the Spring, Fall and Summer sessions. Enfield has brought in eight consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2022 class ranking No. 7 and the 2023 class ranking No. 4. Enfield has an **210-132** record in his first 10 seasons as the USC head coach and is **251-160** in 12 seasons as a head coach. USC went 22-11 in the **2022-23** season and advanced to the NCAA Tournament where it fell to Michigan State 72-62 in the first round. The three consecutive NCAA Tournaments for the Trojans matched a program record. USC also finished tied for second in the Pac-12 with a 14-6 record. Boogie Ellis and Drew Peterson were named All-Pac-12 first team. USC was third in scoring average (72.5) and led the conference by holding opponents to a 39.3 field goal percentage, the fourth consecutive season holding opponents to under 40 percent shooting from the floor. USC went 26-8 in **2021-22**, placed third in the Pac-12, reached the Pac-12 semifinals and the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in the last six seasons in which a tournament was played. The win total tied the school record. USC held its first 12 opponents to under 40 percent shooting, the first time in 15 seasons a team had accomplished that feat. USC was 11-0 in the nonconference and was undefeated in play prior to conference games for the second time in six seasons, one of only two teams to have done that (Villanova). The 2020-21 Trojans went 25-8 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight, winning the most conference games and games overall in the regular season among Pac-12 teams. The **2019-20** Trojans went 22-9, finished tied for 3rd in the Pac-12 and were getting better as the season was cancelled due to COVID-19. The Trojans led Pac-12 teams in defensive field goal percentage and points per game allowed in Conference play. The **2018-19** Trojans were bitten by the injury bug beginning late in the summer, practicing the majority of the preseason with seven or eight scholarship players. Ultimately USC players missed 54 games due to injury and finished with a 16-17 record after falling to regular season champion Washington 78-75 in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enfield guided the **2017-18** Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest outright conference finish since 1992 USC's 13 Pac-Washington 78-75 in the quarterinnals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enflietd guided the 2017-16 Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest outright conference finish since 1992. USC's 12 Pac-12 wins were its most since also going 12-6 in 2002. The Trojans reached the Pac-12 Tournament finals for the first time since winning the title in 2009. USC set school records with 296 three-pointers made, 1022 FG made and 569 assists. The Trojans also scored the second-most points by a USC team in history (2,798). The Trojans accomplished all of this and achieved a No. 10 ranking in the preseason, its highest since the 1974-75 season, despite 40 percent of its projected starting lineup missing much of the season. USC went 26-10 in the 2016-17 season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. The Trojans won their first 14 games which was tied for the fourthlongest winning streak in school history and was the best USC start since the 1971 season. The 13-0 mark in nonconference regular season action was just the sixth time in school history USC had gone undefeated in the nonconference slate. USC defeated Providence in the First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament win since the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SMU before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since also winning two straight in the 2007 Tourney. After bringing in his recruits and establishing his system during the first two seasons, his Trojans took a big leap forward in the **2015-16** season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the took a big leap forward in the **2015-16** season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA lournament for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. USC played an exciting brand of basketball, averaging over 80 points per game and ranking among the nation's top 20 in offensive output. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. The high-flying athletic style was also in effect in the **2015-16** season as the Trojans averaged over 3.5 dunks per game and set the then USC season record with 182 blocks, ranking in the top 15 in the country in this category. Enfield and staff brought in the No. 12-ranked freshman class in **2014-15** and they became key members of the team. McLaughlin was named to the 2015 Pac-12 All-Freshman team and went on to become one of three Pac-12 players all-time to record 700 transparence. Elijah Stawart would leave LISC as the school's career. or more assists and 1,600 or more career points scored. Elijah Stewart would leave USC as the school's career record-holder for three-point baskets made. USC went 12-20 during the **2014-15** campaign, including a Pac-12 Tournament first-round upset win over Arizona State. USC went 11-21 in his first season (**2013-14**), but Enfield developed freshmen Nikola Jovanovic and Julian Jacobs into impact Pac-12 players, In 2016, Jacobs would lead the Pac-12 in assists and was named to the All-Conference team.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station will be AM 790 KABC with Jordan Moore calling the action. The USC graduate is in his 10th season of working on USC basketball broadcasts, his sixth season as the play-by-play announcer.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 2nd in the 2023-24 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) Arizona (303), 2.) **USC (264)**, 3.) UCLA (249), 4.) Oregon (228), 5.) Colorado (210), 6.) Arizona State (148), 7.) Utah (139), 8.) Stanford (131), 9.) Washington (108), 10.) Washington State (94), 11.) California (67) and 12.) Oregon State (42).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,702-1,247* in its 118 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 83 of its first 117 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 205-79 in 18 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 104-24 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC is 65-10 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach.

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years.

FAST-STARTING FRESHMAN - Isaiah Collier has averaged 17.3 points through USC's first eight games, while averaging 3.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game. He is third in scoring average among Division I freshmen, is fifth in free throws made (36) and fifth in assists per game (4.5) among freshmen players. Collier has scored 138 points through USC's first eight games, the most by a Trojan freshman since O.J. Mayo totaled 168 points in the first eight games of the 2007-08 season.

USC FALLS IN CLOSE CONTEST -- USC fell 72-70 vs. Oklahoma on Nov. 24 in the championship game of the Rady Children's Invitational in Las Vegas, when the Sooners tipped in a missed shot with 1.4 seconds remaining. USC fell to 10-5 in one-possession games since the start of the 2021-22 season.

THE JOHNSON JUMP -- Junior Kobe Johnson averaged 9.2 points and 5.0 rebounds as a sophomore in the 2022-23 season, while tying for 17th in the country with 72 steals. The 72 steals also tied him for third on USC's single-season steals list. As a freshman, he averaged 1.2 points and 1.0 rebounds while playing in 27 games. Johnson also finished third on the 2022-23 team in assists (85) and tied for third in blocks (14). Johnson also led the Trojans with a 84.1 shooting percentage from the free throw line. Johnson averaged 12.4 points over the Trojans' final 11 games of the 2022-23 season. He set his career high with 21 points vs. Washington on Feb. 4, 2023. He registered a career-high 9 rebounds vs. Michigan State in the NCAA Tournament on March 17 and had 19 games with 5 or more rebounds. He has averaged 13.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and 2.7 steals in his six games played this season. He missed two games with left knee discomfort (11/9 vs. CSUB & 11/14 vs. UCI).

THE BOOGIE MAN RETURNS -- USC fifth-year player Boogie Ellis has returned for one final season with the Trojans. The All-Pac-12 guard averaged 17.7 points and his 583 total points scored last season were the 10th-most ever in a single season by a Trojan player. Ellis is the highest -scoring USC player who led the team in scoring and returned the next season since Desmon Farmer in 2004 (18.7 ppg in 2003). Ellis tied for the Pac-12 lead with 83 three-pointers made and is the second-leading returning scorer in the Pac-12. Ellis averaged 22.8 points over USC's final eight regular season games, including matching the Trojan Galen Center record and setting a career high with 35 points vs. Arizona on March 2. Ellis opened up this season by scoring 24 points vs. Kansas State on Nov.6. He missed the game on Nov. 14 vs. UC Irvine with a sprained right ankle. He netted a season-best 28 points vs. Brown on Nov. 19, vs. EWU on Nov. 29 and vs. Gonzaga on Dec. 2.

BIG GAME BOOGIE -- In USC's last 7 games against ranked teams, guard Boogie Ellis averaged 23.4 points. He scored 21 points vs. No. 22 Tennessee on Nov. 24,2022, 28 vs. No. 19/18 Auburn on Dec. 18, 2022, 10 at No. 10/8 UCLA on Jan. 5, 2023, 11 at Arizona on Jan. 19, 2023, 31 vs. No. 8 UCLA on Jan. 26, 2023, a career-high 35 vs. No. 8/9 Arizona on March 2, 2023 and 28 vs. No. 11 Gonzaga on Dec. 2, 2023.

LINE DANCING IN 2022-23 -- USC made 74.5 percent of its free throws during the 2022-23 season, third-best all-time by a Trojan team and their best team FT percentage since the 1976 team made a school-record 75.8 percent of its free throws. USC had shot higher than 70 percent for a season from the free throw line twice in the previous 15 seasons and averaged 65.5 percent from the line the previous four seasons. USC made all 14 of its FT attempts at Arizona State on Jan. 21, tying for the third most makes from the charity stripe in a game without a miss in school history. On Jan. 19 at Arizona, USC made 66.7 percent of its free throw, snapping a streak of five consecutive games making 70 percent or more from the charity stripe, USC's longest such stretch since an 8-game stretch in the 2016-17 season. USC has made 73.8 percent of its free throws (135-for-183) in the first eight games this season. USC made only 47.1 percent from the FT line vs. Gonzaga on Dec. 2.

FROM GALEN TO THE NBA -- USC is one of seven schools to have at least one player selected in five of the last six NBA drafts. The Trojans selected in the last six NBA Drafts are: 2018 - De'Anthony Melton (No. 46), Chimezie Metu (No. 49), 2019 - Kevin Porter Jr. (No. 30), 2020 - Onyeka Okongwu (No. 6), 2021 - Evan Mobley (No. 4) and 2022- Isaiah Mobley (No. 49).

THE MAGIC MARK -- USC defeated Seton Hall 71-63 on Nov. 23 to improve to 128-11 in its last 139 games when holding the opposition to under 70 points, dating back to Feb. 28, 2015. USC is 3-0 this season and was 15-3 last season when it held the opposition to under 70 points. USC has held 68 of its last 96 opponents to under 70 points dating back to the 2019-20 season.

MAGICAL BOTH WAYS -- Since the 2019 season, USC owns a 73-11 record when it scores 70 or more points, 4-2 this season.

THE STRENGTH OF THREE -- A cord of three strands is not easily broken and a USC team with three players scoring 10 or more points is not easily defeated. USC has had three or more players score 10 or more points iin 6 games this season (5-1) and is 68-12 in the last four seasons when at least three players score in double figures.

THE WINNING WAYS -- Since the beginning of the 2016 season, USC has picked up 187 victories, 14th-most by any team that played in the six Power basketball conferences over that period (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 & SEC). In the last five seasons, USC's 100 total wins are seventh-most among all six basketball power conference teams (through games of Dec. 6).

MORGAN ON TOP OF THE MOUNTAIN -- USC forward Joshua Morgan had a career-high and a school-record 10 blocks vs. Seton Hall on Nov. 23. Morgan has 22 blocks in USC's first 8 games for an average of 2.75 blocks per game, ninth in the country. His 10-block game is also the second-most by any player in a Div. I game this season. The previous USC record for blocks in a game was 8 done 4 times, last by Onyeka Okongwu on Nov. 5, 2019 vs. FAMU. Morgan now has 114 career blocks as a Trojan, 10th on USC's all-time career blocks list, 2 behind Rod Keller who is 9th on the list with 116 career blocks as a Trojan.

ITS A TEAM GAME -- Nine of the 10 Trojans that have played at least 5 minutes this season have at least one game in which they scored 10 or more points.

SEVEN DAYS A WEEK -- With the game vs. Gonzaga on Saturday, Dec. 2, game eight of the season, USC has now play at least one game on each day of the week.

ELLIS NAMED SPORTING NEWS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN -- USC guard Boogie Ellis was named to the Sporting News five-man Preseason All-America Team on Nov. 13. Joining Ellis are Zach Edey (Purdue), Kyle Filipowski (Duke), Graham Ike (Gonzaga) and Tyler Kolek (Marquette).

LEADERS OF THE PAC -- The Trojans have a 54-24 record in Pac-12 games the last four seasons and are the only school to finish in the top three of the conference in each of those seasons.

A LOOK AT LAST YEAR -- The Trojans went 22-11 during the 2022-23 season, including a 14-6 record in Pac-12 play which tied for second in the conference. USC also advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season. It was the Trojans' fourth consecutive 20-win season, a school record for back-to-back 20-win seasons. The Trojans return leading scorer and All-Pac-12 guard Boogie Ellis and have added the No. 4 ranked recruiting class in the country, which includes the consensus No. 1 overall player, guard Isaiah Collier.

COLLIER NAMED PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK TWICE -- USC freshman guard Isaiah Collier was named Pac-12 men's basketball Freshman of the Week for the week of Nov. 6-12 as he helped lead the Trojans to a pair of wins by averaging 18.5 points, 5.5 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals. He also made 65.0 percent of his field goals and 90.0 percent of his free throws. He was also named Pac-12 Men's Freshman of the Week for the week of Nov. 13-19. Collier helped the Trojans split a pair of games during the week by averaging 23.5 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists.

PAINT PROTECTORS -- USC has six players listed on the roster which are 6-8 or taller. USC's average height per player is 6-6.71 which ranks fourth among all schools, trailing only UCLA, Saint Mary's and Oregon State, according to the NCAA.

RETURNING ALL-PAC-12 PLAYERS -- The Trojans have three returning players who received 2022-23 Pac-12 accolades. Boogie Ellis was named Pac-12 First Team and Kobe Johnson and Joshua Morgan were named to the All-Defensive Team.

TROJANS SIGN A TRIO OF PROSPECTS -- USC has announced that guards Trent Perry and Liam Campbell and forward Brody Kozlowski have signed National Letters of Intent (NLIs) to play basketball for the Trojans, it was announced by head coach Andy Enfield on Nov. 8. USC's recruiting class is ranked No. 10 nationally by 247Sports.com, marking it the third consecutive top 10 recruiting class and the 10th consecutive top 30 class.

GALEN REFRESH -- The Galen Center, which opened for the 2006-07 season, recently experienced the completion of phase one of a multiphase enhancement to the arena. Among the upgrades include new championships banners recognizing the accomplishments for all four sports which compete in the arena, new signature branding on the north arena wall celebrating the "Fight On!" mantra, a renovated Hall of Champions including two large LED screens with dynamic content highlighting the basketball and volleyball programs, upgraded concession stands, new graphics and branding throughout the arena, a renovated Founders Room, the largest premium hospitality space in Galen, the addition of a new premium lounge space near the court and an updated media room and postgame media conference room.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE AWAITS THE 2023-24 TROJANS -- The Trojans are set to play a potential 10 games against teams which played in the 2023 NCAA Tournament, nearly a third of the schedule. In addition to the always challenging Pac-12 slate of games, the nonconference schedule features a potential nine of 11 contests against teams that finished over .500, including five scheduled games with teams which won more than 20 games. Also, three of its opponents, Gonzaga, UC Irvine and Eastern Washington, won or tied for their regular season conference title.

USC HOSTED A BLOCK PARTY -- USC had 167 blocks last season, led by Joshua Morgan's 63 blocks. USC averaged 5.1 blocks per game, 11th in the country. Morgan's 2.17 blocks per game average led all Pac-12 players and ranekd 16th in the country. USC as a team registered 638 blocks over the last four seasons which ranks 7th nationally. USC had 8 blocks in the season opener, including 5 by Morgan. USC then had 13 blocks (1 off the school record) vs. Seton Hall on Nov. 23. Morgan had a USC single-game record 10 blocks in the game. Through the first eight games, USC has registered 44 blocked shots, 22 by Morgan who is tied for 12th among all Div. I players.

USC TO THE NBA -- USC had 8 former players that began the 2023-24 season on NBA rosters, which ranked tied for 12th among all schools. Here are the current 2023-24 stats for the Trojans playing in the NBA (through Dec. 6):

Boogie Ellis scored 24 points and Isaiah Collier added 18 points in his collegiate debut as No. 21 USC Men's Basketball defeated Kansas State, 82-69, at the Hall of Fame Series Las Vegas on Nov. 6. Collier, the consensus No. 1 recruit in the 2023 class, scored 15 of his 18 in the first. He also had 6 assists in 25 minutes before fouling out. Kobe Johnson scored 12 of his 16 points in the second half and grabbed 8 boards. Joshua Morgan added 11 points on 5-of-6 shooting while blocking 5 shots. The win marked a sweep for USC in the Hall of Fame Series Las Vegas after the No. 21 Women of Troy upset. No. 7 Ohio State, 83-74, in the first session of the day-long event. After conceding 3 free throws to Kansas State to start the game, Collier's and-one play and a layup highlighted a 14-2 run that gave the Trojans their lead that stood the rest of the night. USC made 51.7 percent of its shots, while holding KSU to 31.0 percent shooting. Ellis surpassed 1,000 career points as a Trojan, entering the game only needing 4 points to reach the milestone.

Boogie Ellis scored 28 points, hitting a careerhigh eight 3-pointers, and USC routed Eastern Washington 106-78 on Nov. 29. The 106 points were the most by USC in a game since defeating Bradley 107-92 on Nov. 17, 2000. Ellis was 8 of 10 from 3-point range, tied for the fourthmost makes from beyond the arc by a Trojan in a game all-time. Isaiah Collier added 15 points despite four fouls as one of five Trojans in double figures. The Eagles were led by Jake Kyman with 25 points, including seven 3-pointers made. The Trojans stretched their lead to 31 points to start the second half when Ellis made three 3-pointers. The Trojans built their largest lead of the first half, 44-22, with a 19-3 run that included 13 straight points. Six different players scored, led by Vincent Iwuchukwu with 7 points, including 2 dunks. USC led 52-33 at the break after shooting 63% from the floor. The 52 first-half points were the team's most since also scoring 52 before the break vs. CSUN on Nov. 9, 2021. The 28-point winning margin and 57.1 field goal percentage were USC's best since making 58.9 percent of its shots and winning 97-60 vs. California on Feb. 16, 2023. USC had 24 assists on its 36 baskets and made 12 of 24 3-point attempts in the game.

USC started 1-for-8 from the field with 2 turnovers 4:48 into the game to fall behind 15-2 and never could catch the Bulldogs. Boogie Ellis led USC with a game-high 28 points and added 7 rebounds. USC started to find its footing and closed to within 3 points at 31-28 with 3:30 remaining in the first half and settled for a 44-37 deficit at the half, despite making just 1 of 8 free throws. Gonzaga started the second half on a 12-4 run and USC would get no closer than 9 points the rest of the way. Gonzaga made 52.3 percent of it shots, including 54.5 percent from 3-point range (12-for-22). USC made 47.1 percent of its field goals, but only 6 of 22 from 3-point range (27.3 percent). USC was outrebounded 39-33, including 21-13 in the second half, 11 of which were offensive rebounds. Isaiah Collier added 14 points and 6 assists. Arrinten Page had 4 rebounds and 9 points, which included 3 dunks. Six of the seven Bulldogs who logged over a minute of action reached double figures in scoring.
