### 13 MPSF PLAYERS OF THE YEAR | FIVE NATIONAL PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

f there's one constant that head coach Marko Pintaric is noticing early on as he prepares the USC women's water polo team for the 2023 season, it's team cohesion. The program roster boasts a bevy of returning talent and new faces – many of whom are already playing in the most elite levels of the sport – who are all working toward clinching another national title.

"The most important thing is the team - that team culture and leadership is set right," Pintaric said. "From what I'm seeing right now, we are really on the right path."

Several Trojans are hungry for another title after a record-breaking win over UCLA in the 2021 NCAA Championship game. While their teammates were dominating at NCAAs, All-Americans **Paige Hauschild, Tilly Kearns** and **Alejandra Aznar** were taking off the year to practice with their respective national teams in preparation for the 2020 Olympics. With one season back at USC under their belt to reintegrate with the rest of the squad, the trio, especially Hauschild and Kearns as captains, have been setting high expectations for the team.



Kearns finished the 2022 season at the top of the scoring leaderboard with 64 goals - 10th most scored in a single season in program history - and as a Peter J. Cutino Award finalist. The Aussie Olympian earned spots on the 2022 NCAA All-Tournament First Team, the MPSF All-Tournament Team and All-MPSF First Team for her work at two-meters. Olympic gold medalist Hauschild collected 47 goals of her own last season while applying pressure on both sides of the pool. Aznar continues to be a powerful driver on the left-hand side, tallying three hat tricks over the 2022 season, with one in the MPSF semifinal win over Cal.

Adding to the list of returning All-Americans are seniors **Mireia Guiral**, **Grace Tehaney**, and **Bayley Weber**. Guiral, who Pintaric calls "one of the best utilities," will be a key force in center and as a defender. Tehaney's sharpshooting tallied 40 goals last season, adding depth to the Trojans' roster of lefties. Weber rose to No. 2 on the 2022 season's scoring chart with 53 goals while collecting two MPSF Player of the Week honors in February and April.

"To have them back is phenomenal — in all aspects of our polo game," Pintaric said of super seniors Guiral, Tehaney and Weber.

Depth on the roster has provided an opportunity for players to shine in and out of the pool. Drivers **Julia Janov** and **Téa Poljak** are frequently looked to for their critical knowledge of the team system and their shooting skills. **Claire Haas, Brooklyn Aguilera** and **Christina Crum** have been leading by example in workouts and conditioning and will be tapped for their consistent capabilities as utilities.

Pintaric has great expectations for other returners as well. **Honnie Vandeweghe-O'Shea** will be a versatile player once again for the USC effort. Pintaric emphasized that the sophomore "is a player who can play both sides of the pool. She is probably one of the most talented players on the team."

Isabel Zimmerman, who is "very physical, very feisty, and very exciting to watch play," according to Pintaric, will see more action after joining the 2022 NCAA Tournament roster as a true freshman. In addition, Hannah Meyer, who had to sit out last season due to injury, will be back on offense as a center and on defense as a guard.

USC's newest additions come from an array of the best talent in the world, including U.S. pipeline members **Morgan Netherton** and **Maggie Johnson**. Both freshmen, they each are coming off of international podium wins over the summer, and Pintaric is excited to see them acclimate to the program.

"They're doing a great job as freshmen learning the system, training hard, buying into the team culture," Pintaric said of Netherton and Johnson. "They are players who are very exciting to coach."

The Trojans have added Fresno State transfer **Fanni Muzsnay** to the team this season, whose international experience as a member of the Hungarian National Team will complement the diversity of playing styles.

"Fanni is a great addition to our team," Pintaric said. "She was a key player on the Fresno State team. She has a great potential to be an X-factor for this team and we are looking forward to her progress."

Freshman **Alex Bonaguidi** has also been putting in the effort to train and learn from the slate of center talent in the likes of Kearns and Guiral, and Pintaric sees her as a player to look out for.

All-American goalie **Carolyne Stern** will return for another season in the cage. She finished the last season ranked No. 9 all-time among USC goalies with 193 career saves, including a career-high 13 saves in the NCAA final match against Stanford.

"She is leading the attack, setting the example and training super hard," Pintaric said. USC's goalie corps also features young talent. Pintaric highlights redshirt freshman Laine Hourigan for her ability to adapt quickly, train hard and continue to learn. Alongside Stern and Hourigan, USC boasts added goalie depth in redshirt freshman Sofia Stein and true freshman Jada Ward. Similar to the USC field players, the Trojan goalie group's work ethic has created healthy competition for game minutes and has fueled a campaign for an eighth national championship.

In all, USC returns 13 of the 16 Trojans on the 2022 NCAA Tournament roster, including a total of seven All-Americans. USC posted a 20-4 overall record last season in its run to the NCAA final

This season's schedule has the Trojans traveling down south for the Triton and Barbara Kalbus invitationals, along with Inland Empire visits for the Lancer Joust and Convergence Tournament. MPSF play will begin mid-March, with a slate of home games that lead to the MPSF Tournament in San José. Not looking to break any streaks, the Women of Troy are taking aim at making their 19th straight NCAA Tournament appearance with a spot in Stockton in May.

# PINTARIC Former LISC All-American Marko Pintaric is in his 27

Former USC All-American Marko Pintaric is in his 22nd season on the USC staff and fourth year as head coach of the USC men's and women's teams.

USC MEN

Pintaric spent the previous three seasons as co-head coach for the USC men after three seasons as an associ-

ate head coach. From 2015-19, Pintaric also served as the scouting director for the USC women. Prior to 2015, Pintaric was an assistant coach to both the USC men and women.

In his first year at the helm of the USC program, Pintaric guided the men to a 16th straight NCAA appearance with a trip to the NCAA semifinals in 2019. In 2020 with the women, Pintaric had the Women of Troy ranked No. 1 in the nation when competition was canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

As he enters his fourth year as USC's head coach, he holds a 41-18 overall record with the USC men and a 54-6 record with the women. In 2021, Pintaric led the USC women to the NCAA Championship and was named **MPSF and National Coach of the Year** on the women's side. In 2022, the Women of Troy again reached the NCAA final, and Pintaric was named **MPSF Coach of the Year** for the second straight season.

In his first season as head coach of the USC men, he guided the Trojans to a 15-6 overall record with a run to the NCAA semifinals in USC's 15th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. In last season's 2021 campaign, the USC men went 18-3 overall and reached the NCAA final for the 16th time in the past 17 seasons.

In all, Pintaric has been on the USC staff for nine men's NCAA titles and six USC women's national championships since taking on a coaching role in 2001.

A member of USC's 1998 national championship team as a player, Pintaric was a two-year starter for the Trojans in 1997 and 1998. He recorded 44 goals during the Trojans' 1998 national championship season and earned National Player of the Year and first team All-America honors. He also earned second team All-America honors in 1997. Pintaric was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team both years. He transferred to USC from the University of Zagreb in Croatia, where he was a member of the Croatian Junior National Team (1989-94).

Prior to coaching at USC, Pintaric served as the varsity coach at Loyola High in Los Angeles during the 1999-2000 school year. He has played club for Shores, Los Angeles Water Polo and New York Athletic Club, where he also was a member of the 2001 summer national championship team and four consecutive winter national championship teams (1999-2002).

In November 2012, Pintaric joined interim head coach Jovan Vavic on the coaching staff for the U.S. Men's National Team, helping lead Team USA to World Championship qualification with success at the 2013 UANA World Aquatic Championship Qualification Tournament in Canada.

Pintaric graduated from USC in 2000 with a degree in communication and earned his master's in 2003 in communication management. He and his wife, Beatrice, have two sons, Francesco and Filip.

# CASEY MOON

### ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

16TH SEASON AT USC

Casey Moon is in his 16th season on the USC staff. He first joined the USC coaching staff in 2007, just a year before the Trojan men began their six-year run of national championships, and has also helped the Women of Troy win four NCAA titles since coming to USC. In fall 2019, Moon moved into a dual role as associate head coach for the USC men's and women's teams. In fall 2021, Moon moved to full-time associate head coach duties for the USC women. As of fall 2022, he serves in the same role for the USC men and women.

He previously served as the USC men's director of player personnel and as the USC women's associate head coach for four seasons, and was an assistant on both sides from 2007-14.

Moon also served as interim head coach for the USC women during the 2019 season, going 9-2 in that role while helping the Trojans win the MPSF Tournament Championship and reach the 2019 NCAA final.

In all, Moon has been on the USC staff for six men's NCAA championship runs (2008, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2018) and four NCAA titles by the women (2010, 2013, 2016, 2018). Moon also served as interim women's head coach during the 2019 season.

Moon served as an assistant coach for the U.S. National Team for the 2013 UANA World Aquatic Championship Qualification Tournament, helping Team USA qualify for the FINA World Championships. He also was head coach of the Trojan Water Polo Club Under-21 team for five years.

Prior to coming to USC, Moon served as an assistant coach for Trojan Water Polo Club and as head coach at Santa Cruz High School. Moon also was an assistant for Wax'em Water Polo Club in Santa Cruz. As a player, Moon competed at UC Santa Cruz, graduating in 2004 with degrees in biology and legal studies. In high school, Moon was a four-year varsity swimmer and water polo player at St. John Bosco, where he was named MVP as well as All-CIF and all-league as a senior.

# KELSEY McINTOSH

ASSISTANT COACH

2ND SEASON

Three-time All-American and two-time national champion Kelsey McIntosh is in her second year as assistant coach on the USC women's water polo coaching staff, having joined the staff in July 2021 after captaining the USC women to the 2021 NCAA Championship.

McIntosh earned her USC degree in psychology with a minor in occupational science, playing five seasons with the USC women and scoring 123 goals. A savvy player, she helped USC win NCAA championships in 2018 and 2021 while picking up ACWPC All-America Honorable Mention in 2019 and 2021 and First Team honors in 2020. McIntosh also helped her Trojans win three MPSF Tournament titles while also earning three sets of All-MPSF accolades in her USC career. During the summers while at USC, she worked as a camp counselor and instructor for the Southern California Water Polo camps.


