• USC TO FACE ASU/OSU WINNER IN PAC-12 QUARTERS •

• Trojans Tie For Second In Pac-12 Regular Season, Earn No. 3 Seed •

TONIGHT'S GAME -- The No. 3 seed USC Trojans (22-9, 14-6) will face the winner of the No. 6 Arizona State Sun Devils (20-11, 11-9)/No. 11 seed Oregon State Beavers (11-20, 5-15) in the Pac-12 Quarterfinals at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas, Nev. on March 9 at 8:30 p.m. The game will air on ESPN with Dave Pasch and Bill Walton calling the action. USC has won 9 of its last 12 games. USC finished tied for second in the Pac-12 regular season, the only conference team to finish in the top 3 of the standings in each of the last 4 seasons.

USC'S STELLAR STRETCH -- USC has won a school-record 95 games over the last four seasons (22 in 2020, 25 in 2021, 26 in 2022 and 22 in 2023). The four consecutive seasons of 20+ wins sets a school record for most consecutive 20-win seasons, breaking the mark of three consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins from 2016-18.

WINNING WAYS -- USC's 95 total wins the last four seasons are tied for the fourth-most among all Power 6 basketball programs, trailing only the last two NCAA champions Kansas (108) and Baylor (103), as well as Arizona (96). Also, USC's 162 wins the last eight seasons ranks 13th among all Power 6 conference teams.

ENFIELD WINS 200TH AS HEAD OF THE USC PROGRAM -- USC head coach Andy Enfield is in his 10th season at USC and has compiled an **205-127** record. He picked up his 200th win on Feb. 4 vs. Washington. Enfield's win total ranks fourth on USC's all-time wins list, trailing only Sam Barry (260), Forrest Twogood (251) and Bob Boyd (216). Including his two seasons as the head coach at FGCU (2012-13), Enfield has compiled a 246-155 record.

USC AT THE PAC-12 TOURNAMENT -- USC is 20-21* all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament (1 win vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 21-21). USC has won its first game at the Pac-12 Tournament the last seven seasons (no tourney in 2020). USC has reached the conference final five times, winning the conference postseason tournament title in 2009.

FACING ARIZONA STATE -- The No. 6 seed Arizona State Sun Devils (20-11, 11-9) will face the No. 11 seed Oregon State Beavers on March 8 with the winner facing USC on March 9. USC defeated Arizona State 68-65 at the Galen Center on March 4 to closeout the regular season and complete a season sweep. USC defeated Arizona state 77-69 in Tempe, Ariz. on Jan. 21. Guard Desmond Cambridge Jr. leads Arizona State with a 13.4 scoring average. USC has won its last seven games against Arizona State and leads the all-time series 61-42* (2 wins vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 63-42).

FACING OREGON STATE -- The No. 11 seed Oregon State Beavers (11-20, 5-15) will face the Arizona State Sun Devils on March 8 with the winner facing USC on March 9. USC defeated Oregon State 63-62 at home on Dec. 4, then lost 61-58 at Oregon State on Feb. 11. Freshman guard Jordan Pope leads Oregon State with a 12.4 scoring average. USC leads the all-time series with Oregon State, 78-67* (2 wins vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 80-67).

IT STARTS WITH DEFENSE -- USC held California to 27.7 shooting on Nov. 30, the lowest by an opponent since holding Stanford to a 25.4 shooting percentage on March 3, 2021. USC allowed Oregon to make 53.8 percent of its shots on Feb. 9 and then Arizona an opponent high of 54.2 percent on March 2, the only two games this season allowing the opposition to shoot 50 percent or higher from the floor. USC has held its opponent to under 40 percent shooting in 18 of its 31 games this season. USC is holding its opponents to a 39.0 shooting percentage this season, 7th in the country. Over the last four seasons, USC's defense has held the opposition to 38.9 FG percentage, second in the country.

LEADERS OF THE PAC -- USC is third in conference regular season wins among Pac-12 teams for the past six seasons (since the 2017-18 season). USC is 74-40, Arizona is 75-39, while UCLA is 78-35 in that stretch. Next up would be Oregon at 70-42 and Colorado at 62-52.

PETERSON PROVIDING A LITTLE OF EVERYTHING -- Guard Drew Peterson is one of two players in a Power 6 conference (Jalen Pickett of Penn State) averaging at least 13.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game this season. Peterson is averaging 14.1 points, 6.3 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game. He scored a career-high 30 points vs. Cal on Feb. 16 and has 24 games scoring in double figures. He also averages more than a steal a game. Peterson battled back spasms the last two games and was held to a combined 14 points.

WHEN FULLY LOADED... -- USC owns an 8-2 record in games this season it has all of its rotational players available. Included in that stretch is five wins over teams in the top seven in the Pac-12 standings. USC's two loss when the entire rotation of players was available have been to No. 8 Arizona. Forward Vincent Iwuchukwu missed USC's first 16 games this season plus the season finale (back) and forward guard Joshua Morgan (right ankle) and Reese Dixon-Waters (left foot) missed 4 games between Feb. 4-16. Both players were injured vs. WSU State on Feb. 2.

ALL ABOUT ENFIELD -- Andy Enfield, 53, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and has quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. Results came immediately with the Trojans setting the school single-season win record and the most wins in program history over a two-year, three-year, four-year, five-year, six-year and now 7-year period. USC won 160 games over the previous seven seasons which is the third-most wins in the Pac-12 and the 13th-most wins in the nation among power conferences during that time. USC has had the second-best overall record in the Pac-12 four of the last five seasons (24-12 in 2018, 22-9 in 2020, 25-8 in 2021 and 26-8 in 2022). USC's 73 wins the past three seasons trail only the last two NCAA Champions Kansas (83) and Baylor (81) among the six basketball power conferences. Over the last five seasons, USC has had six players selected in the NBA Draft, tied for the seventh-most by any program in the country, with Evan Mobley being selected No. 3 overall in the 2021 NCAA Draft a year after Onyeka Okongwu was selected No. 6 in the 2020 NBA Draft. USC and Florida State were the only two schools to have a top 10 pick in each of those drafts. Only USC, Duke and Kentucky have had at least one player selected in each of the last five NBA Drafts. Enfield guided the Trojans into the postseason in three consecutive seasons (2016-18), the first time for USC since 2007-09, and his teams have reached the NCAA Tournament four times in eight seasons, including the 2020-21 season. His teams have also excelled in the classroom by setting the program's top team GPAs for the Spring, Fall and Summer sessions. Enfield has brought in seven consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2021 class ranking No. 12. Enfield has an **205-127** record in his first nine seasons as the USC head coach and is **246-155** in 11 seasons as a head coach. USC went 26-8 in 2021-22, placed third in the Pac-12, reached the Pac-12 semifinals and the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in the last six seasons in which a tournament was played. The win total tied the school record. Forward Isaiah Mobley (selected in the 2022 NBA Draft by Cleveland) and guard Drew Peterson were named first-team All-Pac-12. USC held the opposition to a 39.0 shooting percentage and its first 12 opponents to under 40 percent shooting, the first time in 15 seasons a team had accomplished that feat. The 2020-21 Trojans went 25-8 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight, winning the most conference games and games overall in the regular season among Pac-12 teams. The 2019-20 Trojans went 22-9, finished tied for 3rd in the Pac-12 and were getting better as the season was cancelled due to COVID-19. The 2018-19 Trojans were bitten by the injury bug beginning late in the summer, practicing the majority of the preseason with seven or eight scholarship players. Ultimately USC players missed 54 games due to injury and finished with a 16-17 record after falling to regular season champion Washington 78-75 in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enfield guided the 2017-18 Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest outright conference finish since 1992. USC's 12 Pac-12 wins were its most since also going 12-6 in 2002. The Trojans reached the Pac-12 Tournament finals for the first time since winning the title in 2009. USC set school records with 296 three-pointers made, 1022 FG made and 569 assists. The Trojans also scored the second-most points by a USC team in history (2,798). The Trojans accomplished all of this and achieved a No. 10 ranking in the preseason, its highest since the 1974-75 season, despite 40 percent of its projected starting lineup missing much of the season. USC went 26-10 in the 2016-17 season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. USC defeated Providence in the First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament win since the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SMU before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since also winning two straight in the 2007 Tourney. After bringing in his recruits and establishing his system during the first two seasons, his Trojans took a big leap forward in the 2015-16 season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. The high-flying athletic style was also in effect in the 2015-16 season as the Trojans averaged over 3.5 dunks per game and set the then USC season record with 182 blocks, ranking in the top 15 in the country in this category. USC went 12-20 during the 2014-15 campaign, including a Pac-12 Tournament first-round upset win over Arizona State. USC went 11-21 in his first season. Enfield captivated the nation in 2013 as the head coach at Florida Gulf Coast University as he guided the first No. 15 seed into the NCAA Sweet Sixteen with impressive wins over No. 2 seed Georgetown and No. 7 seed San Diego State and introduced the world to "Dunk City," the nickname for FGCU's high-flying and high-speed offense which often ended with thunderous dunks. Over Enfield's two-year run at FGCU, the Eagles won 41 games, advanced to the A-Sun Championship game both seasons and became the first No. 15 seed in NCAA Tournament history to make the Sweet Sixteen. His two seasons were the program's first as Division I postseason eligible. His squads played an up-tempo offense that featured spectacular dunks and alley-oops (they were nicknamed "Dunk City") and a defense that thrived on takeaways, as they ranked 16th nationally in steals (8.9 per game). As the NCAA tourney's No. 15 seed, the Eagles shocked second-seeded Georgetown and then seventh-seed San Diego State to advance to the Sweet Sixteen. In 2012 in his first year at FGCU, he led the team to the Atlantic Sun Tournament championship game. Prior to going to FGCU, Enfield spent the previous five years (2006-07 through 2010-11) as an assistant coach at Florida State, helping the Seminoles to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments (2009-11), including the Sweet 16 in 2011. Enfield began his coaching career in the NBA, serving as the shooting coach for the Milwaukee Bucks for two seasons (1994-95 and 1995-96). He then was an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics for two seasons (1998-99 and 1999-2000). Through his company All Net Basketball, he was a player development consultant for NBA teams and players, focusing on improving shooting technique and offensive skills. Enfield played four seasons (1987-88 through 1990-91) at Johns Hopkins, scoring a program-record 2,025 career points. He set the NCAA all-divisions career free throw percentage record (92.5, hitting 431-of-466 shots). He was a Division III All-American third teamer in 1991 and was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station will be AM 790 KABC with Jordan Moore calling the action. The USC graduate is in his ninth season of working on USC basketball broadcasts, his fifth season as the play-by-play announcer.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 4th in the 2022-23 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) UCLA (386), 2.) Arizona (352), 3.) Oregon (336), 4.) USC (300), 5.) Stanford (239), 6.) Colorado (207), 7.) Arizona St. (193), 8.) Washington St. (185), 9.) Washington (158), 10.) Utah (102), 11.) California (69) and 12.) Oregon State (47).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,697-1,242* in its 117 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 83 of its 117 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 202-78 in 17 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 102-23 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC is 63-9 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach, including 53-7 in its last 60 regular season nonconference home games.

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years. One of their biggest involvements the past several years has been with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Light the Night Walk.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES -- With the 68-65 win vs. Arizona State on March 4, USC improved to 10-4 in one-possession games since the start of the 2021-22 season, 4-2 this season.

THE JOHNSON JUMP -- Sophomore Kobe Johnson is averaging 8.8 points and 4.8 points, while ranking T-14th in the country with 69 steals this season. Last year Johnson averaged 1.2 points and 1.0 rebounds while playing in 27 games. Johnson is also third on the team in assists (80) and tied for third in blocks (14). He did not score in double figures in his first 35 career games until scoring a 17 points vs. Oregon State on Dec. 4. He has reached double figures in scoring in 12 of his last 23 games and has averaged 10.0 points in that stretch (230 total). His career high for points is 21 scored vs. Washington on Feb. 4. He has recorded 5 or more rebounds 17 times this season. He began the season missing his first 7 three-point attempts, but has made 27 of his last 69 for a 39.1 shooting percentage from beyond the arc in that stretch.

BOOGIE DOWN, BUT NOT FOR LONG - Senior guard Boogie Ellis scored 9 points at Oregon State on Feb. 11, snapping a 14-game streak of scoring in double figures. He then followed up that game with 22 points vs. California on Feb. 16, a then career high 33 points vs. Stanford on Feb. 18 and a new career high of 35 vs. Arizona on March 2. He has averaged 20.4 points the last 20 games (407 total), including scoring a then-career-high 31 points vs. UCLA on Jan. 26. He began his streak by scoring a then career-best 28 points vs. Auburn on Dec. 18. Ellis leads USC with a 18.1 scoring average and leads the team with 81 three-pointers made (Pac-12 leader) and 117 free throws made. He is also second among Trojans with 44 steals. He now has 137 3-pointers made as a Trojan, 15th on USC's all-time list.

BIG GAME BOOGIE -- In USC's 6 games this season against ranked teams, guard Boogie Ellis has averaged 22.7 points.

THE ROAD REPORT - USC is 5-5 on the road this season, following its 62-49 win at Utah on Feb. 25. USC was 9-3 on the road in 2021-22 with wins at Temple, FGCU, WSU, California, Colorado, Utah, ASU, OSU & Oregon. USC's nine true road wins were tied for the second most by any power conference team, trailing only Miami (10-2). USC is now 21-11 in road games the last three seasons.

TROJANS AFTER DARK -- USC's loss at Eugene, Ore. on Feb. 9 was its first this season in a game with a 7 p.m. PT or later tip time. USC also lost to Arizona on March 2 in an 8 p.m. tip. USC is now 14-2 this season when the tip is set for 7 p.m. PT or later.

THE MEN OF STEAL -- Kobe Johnson (69), Boogie Ellis (44) and Drew Peterson (34) have combined for 147 steals this season, the second most by a Pac-12 trio. In total steals, Johnson ranks second among Pac-12 players, Ellis is 8th and Peterson 16th.

TOEING THE LINE -- USC made all 14 of its FT attempts at Arizona State on Jan. 21, tying for the third most makes from the charity stripe in a game without a miss in school history. On Jan. 19 at Arizona, USC made 66.7 percent of its free throw, snapping a streak of 5 consecutive games making 70 percent or more from the charity stripe, USC's longest such stretch since an 8-game stretch in the 2016-17 season. USC has made 74.3 percent of its free throws this season, the best team FT percentage since the 1976 team made a school-record 75.8 percent of its free throws. USC has shot higher than 70 percent for a season from the free throw line twice in the previous 15 seasons.

USC HOSTING A BLOCK PARTY -- USC has 164 blocks this season, led by Joshua Morgan's 62 blocks. USC is averaging 5.3 blocks per game, 8th in the country. Morgan's 2.30 blocks per game average this season leads the conference and ranks 13th in the country. Morgan had 7 blocks vs. FGCU on Nov. 7 which tied him for fifth on USC's all-time single game blocks list. He matched that total with 7 blocks at Cal on Nov. 30. USC as a team has registered 635 blocks over the last four seasons which ranks 6th nationally.

WE KNOW WHAT YOUR NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION WAS... -- USC has averaged 10.8 turnovers per game in its 17 games in 2023 (184 total), after averaging 14.4 turnovers per game in its first 14 contest (201 total) played in 2022. USC has had 12 or more turnovers six times in its last 16 games, while reaching 12 or more turnovers in 12 of its first 14 games.

NO DRAFT DODGERS HERE -- USC is one of three schools along with Duke and Kentucky to have at least one player selected in each of the last five NBA drafts. The Trojans selected in the last five NBA Drafts are: 2018 - De'Anthony Melton (No. 46), Chimezie Metu (No. 49), 2019 - Kevin Porter Jr. (No. 30), 2020 - Onyeka Okongwu (No. 6), 2021 - Evan Mobley (No. 4) and 2022- Isaiah Mobley (No. 49). USC had 11 players on 2022-23 NBA Opening Night rosters, tied for the fourth-most among all schools behind only Kentucky (27), Duke (25) and UCLA (12).

THE MAGIC MARK -- USC defeated Arizona State 68-65 on March 4 to improve to 15-3 this season when holding the opposition under 70 points. USC finished 20-3 in the 2021-22 season and is 125-11 in its last 136 games when hold the opposition to under 70 points, dating back to Feb. 28, 2015. USC has held 65 of its last 91 opponents to under 70 points dating back to the 2019-20 season.

MAGICAL BOTH WAYS -- Since the 2019 season, USC owns a 68-8 record, 15-2 this season, when it scores 70 or more points.

THE STRENGTH OF THREE -- A cord of three strands is not easily broken and a USC team with three players scoring 10 or more points is not easily defeated. USC is 20-3 this season and was 21-5 last season when it has had three or more players registering double digits in points. USC is 63-9 the last three seasons when at least three players score in double figures.

THE WINNING WAYS -- Since the beginning of the 2016 season, USC has picked up 182 victories, 13th-most by any team in the six Power basketball conferences over that period (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 & SEC). In the last four seasons (including 2022-23), USC's 95 total wins are tied for fourth-most among all six basketball power conference teams (through games of March 5).

9 TO 10 -- When Oziyah Sellers scored a career-best 11 points vs. California on Feb. 16, he became the ninth Trojan this season to have at least one game of scoring 10 or more points.

JEKYLL & HYDE FROM WAY OUTSIDE -- USC made 52.2 percent of its 3-pointers vs. California on Feb. 16, its highest shooting percentage from beyond the arc since making 53.8 percent vs. Washington State on Feb. 20, 2022. USC then made a season-best 13 3-pointers vs. Stanford on Feb. 18. USC now has 13 games this season making at least 38 percent from 3-point range. In those 13 games USC has made 45.9 percent of its 3-pointers (129-for-281), while it has averaged 23.5 percent from beyond the arc in the other 18 games (70-for-298).

FINDING THEIR STROKE -- USC has made 46.4 percent of its shots the last 12 games (313-for-675). USC has also made 7.8 three-pointers per game in that stretch (94 total), as opposed to 5.5 makes from beyond the arc the first 19 games.

FOUR SCORE... USC defeated conference foes California (97-60) at home on Feb. 16, Stanford (85-75) at home on Feb. 18, Colorado (84-65) on the road on Feb. 23 and Utah (62-49) on the road on Feb. 25 by a combined 79 points. It was the biggest margin of victory for USC over conference opponents in four consecutive games in a season since defeating UCLA (55-22), California (60-32), California (36-26) and UCLA (43-33) by a combined 81 points from Feb. 15-March 1 during the 1935 season. The last time USC won four consecutive conference games by a double-digit margin was in the 2002 season.

HOME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED AT 14 -- USC lost 87-81 to Arizona at the Galen Center on March 2, snapping a 14-game home winning streak, tied for the third-longest in school history. The 14-game home winning streak was USC's longest in one season since the Trojans won the first 15 games at the Galen Center in the 2015-16 season. USC lost its home opener to FGCU on Nov. 7, then won its next 14 games at the Galen Center. USC was 15-2 at home this season.

THE FOUL TRUTH -- USC committed 21 fouls in its win vs. Arizona State on March 6 to improved to 2-5 this season when committing 20 or more fouls in a game. USC committed more fouls than its opponent in 6 of its 8 losses this season.

WHITE EARNS SECOND PAC-12 HONOR -- Freshman guard Tre White was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week for Jan. 30-Feb. 5 when he averaged 18.0 points and 5.0 rebounds in USC's two wins. He also won for Dec. 12-18 when he averaged 13.5 points and 4.5 rebounds in USC's two wins. USC now has 11 selections as Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, more than any other team in the conference.

ELLIS EARNS SECOND PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR -- Senior guard Boogie Ellis was named Pac-12 Men's Basketball Player of the Week for Feb. 13-19, as he averaged 27.5 points, 4.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds in the Trojans' two wins. He scored a career-high 33 points, dished out a career-best 7 assists and matched a career high with 6 three-pointers made vs. Stanford on Feb. 18. He also won for Jan. 23-29, as he scored a then career best 31 points to lead USC to the victory over No. 8 UCLA on Jan. 26. Ellis matched UCLA with 27 second-half points.

CAPKO NAMED AN ASSISTANT COACH TO WATCH -- USC associate head coach Chris Capko was cited in December as one of 21 assistant coaches to watch in all of college basketball by The Athletic.

TROJANS AFTER DARK - USC played 14 of its 34 games at 8 p.m. or later during the 2021-22 season. Of USC's 31 scheduled games during the 2022-23 season, 10 are scheduled to begin at 8 p.m.

A DECEMBER TO REMEMBER -- USC went 6-0 in December this season and has won its last 12 games played in December. USC went a combined 20-2 during the month of December the last four seasons.

COMING ATTRACTIONS -- USC is bringing in the No. 6 ranked men's basketball recruiting class for the 2023-24 seasons, according to Rivals.com. Leading the way is 247Sports.com No. 1 overall recruit point guard Isaiah Collier from Atlanta, Ga. His teammate from Wheeler High in Marietta, Ga., forward Arrinten Page, the No. 55 player overall according to ESPN.com, has also signed an NLI to continue their collaboration in L.A. Rounding out the class is the No.53 overall player according to On3.com guard Silas Demary Jr. from North Carolina. USC's 2022 class of Vincent Iwuchukwu, Iaroslav Niagu, Oziyah Sellters, Tre White and Kijani Wright was ranked No. 7 by 247Sports.com.

L.A.'S WINNINGEST BASKETBALL PROGRAM -- . If you are looking to watch some good basketball in Los Angeles, the Galen Center is the place to be. Not only do the Trojans have the best winning percentage in the city between the Trojans, Bruins, Lakers and Clippers the last three years, but it also stretches out over the last seven seasons (entering the 2022-23 season).

GOLDEN RECORD IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA -- USC is 29-5 in its last 34 games against teams from the state of California. USC's 75-69 loss at Stanford on Jan. 11, 2022 snapped a 20-game winning streak against teams from the state of California. That loss was USC's first loss to a team from the state of California since Feb. 28, 2019 (1,047 days).

USC TO THE NBA -- USC has 11 former players that began the season on NBA rosters, that ranks tied for fourth among all schools behind only Kentucky (27), Duke (25) and UCLA (12). Here are the 2022-23 stats for the Trojans playing in the NBA (through games of March 6):

The victory was USC's 6th in the last 9 meetings with UCLA. USC defeated a top 10 opponent for the first time since defeating No. 8 UCLA on Jan. 25, 2017. Boogie Ellis led USC with 19 points and four assists, but it wasn't enough as the Trojans fell at Oregon, 78-60, on Feb. 9. Drew Peterson and Kobe Johnson added 11 points apiece. USC saw its four-game win streak end. N'Faly Dante scored 17 points and Will Richardson added 16 for Oregon. USC was playing its second game without 2 of its top defenders, Josh Morgan and Reese Dixon-Waters, and Oregon was able to take advantage, making 53.8 percent of its shots, the first team this season to shoot over 50 percent against the Trojans. Oregon never trailed in the game. After USC trailed 11-10 7 minutes into the game, the Ducks went on an 18-1 run to open up a 29-11 lead and were never challenged after that. USC trailed 42-27 at halftime and got no closer than 14 points in the second half. The Trojans finished with 12 turnovers to Oregon's 11, but the Ducks had a 17-3 edge in points off turnovers. USC fell to 16-2 this season when at least 3 players scored 10 or more points in the same game. USC also lost for the first time this season when the start time was 7 p.m. or later, now owning an 11-1 record in such games. The 60 points score were USC's third-fewest in a game this season and fewest since scoring 58 on Jan. 5.

Boogie Ellis scored a career-high 35 points, but USC fell to No. 8 Arizona 87-81 on March 2. Ellis exploded for 22 points in the second half and shot 6-of-11 from the 3-point line despite dealing with foul trouble the entire game. Reese Dixon-Waters finished with 17 points with 6 rebounds. Kobe Johnson scored 14 with 6 assists. Joshua Morgan grabbed 11 rebounds and blocked four shots. Drew Peterson was battled back spasms throughout the game to finish with 5 points. The loss locked up the No. 3 seed for USC and the No. 2 seed for Arizona in the Pac-12 Tournament next week. Arizona shot an opponent-high 54.2 percent from the field and tied an opponent high by making 50 percent of its 3-shot attempts. The 87 points allowed were a high by an opponent this season. The loss snapped USC's 14-game home winning streak, which tied for the third-longest in school history. Ellis' 35 points scored were the most by a Trojan since Bennie Boatwright scored 36 vs. California on Feb. 16, 2019. USC was outscored 34-22 on points in the paint, despite outrebounding Arizona 38-33. Arizona scored 5 points in the final 37 seconds of the first half to take a 43-31 lead to halftime.
