• USC TO PLAY AT No. 19 WASHINGTON ST. THURSDAY • • Trojans Are 2-8 On The Road; 3-3 In Last 6 Games With 2 OT Losses •

TONIGHT'S GAME -- The USC Trojans (11-16, 5-11) will play at the Washington State Cougars (21-7, 12-5) at Beasley Coliseum in Pullman, Wash. on Feb. 29 at 7:30 p.m. The game will air on the Pac-12 Network with AJ Kanell and Eldridge Recasner calling the action. USC is 3-3 in its last six games with two of the losses coming in overtime.

TROJANS SNAP 7-GAME ROAD LOSING STREAK -- USC defeated UCLA 62-56 on Feb. 24 in Westwood, Calif. to snap a seven-game road losing streak, its longest road losing streak since falling in nine consecutive road contests in the 2015 season. USC is 2-8 in road games this season. Through games of Feb. 26, USC has played 10 road games and four neutral site contests. The 14 games away from home (4 neutral, 10 road) are tied for the second most among all Power 6 schools. The 10 true road games are tied for fifth among Power 6 teams.

USC'S STELLAR STRETCH -- USC won a school-record 95 games over the previous four seasons (22 in 2020, 25 in 2021, 26 in 2022 and 22 in 2023). The four consecutive seasons of 20+ wins sets a school record for most consecutive 20-win seasons, breaking the mark of three consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins from 2016-18. USC's 95 total wins the last four seasons was tied for sixth-most among all Power 6 basketball programs, trailing only Kansas (111), Baylor (104), Arizona (99), UCLA (99) and Duke (97).

FACING No. 19 WSU -- The No. 19 Washington State Cougars (21-7, 12-5) are coming off a 73-61 loss at Arizona State on Feb. 24, but have won 11 of their last 13 games. WSU is 13-1 at home this season. Forward Isaac Jones (15.8 ppg) and guard Myles Rice (15.4 ppg) lead the Cougars in scoring. Washington State defeated USC at the Galen Center on Jan. 10 by a score of 72-64, scoring the final nine points of the game. USC is 82-50 all-time against Washington State. USC is 13-2 in its last 15 games against Washington State.

ON DECK: AT WASHINGTON -- The Washington Huskies (15-13, 7-10) are coming off a 91-75 loss at Arizona on Feb. 24. Forward Keion Brooks Jr. leads all Pac-12 players with a 21.0 scoring average and UW averages 80.8 points per game, second in the conference. This will be the first meeting of the season between USC and Washington. USC won both games against Washington last season and has won its last seven games against the Huskies. USC is 79-75 all-time against Washington (2 wins vacated due to NCAA penalty, original record 77-75).

ENFIELD TIES FOR 3RD ON USC'S ALL-TIME WINS LIST -- USC head coach Andy Enfield is in his 11th season at USC and has compiled an **216-145** record. He picked up his 200th win on Feb. 4, 2023 vs. Washington and his 216th at UCLA on Feb. 24, 2024. Enfield's win total ranks tied for third on USC's all-time wins list with Bob Boyd (216), trailing only Sam Barry (260) and Forrest Twogood (251). Including his two seasons as the head coach at FGCU (2012-13), Enfield has compiled a 257-173 record.

THE OFFENSE COMING ALIVE -- USC has averaged 74.3 points in its last six games, after averaging 62.5 points in its previous six games. USC scored 70 or more points in 14 of its first 15 games and averaged 78.9 points per game in that stretch. USC is averaging 17.3 assists and 9.5 turnovers in its last six games.

MISSING IN ACTION -- USC has had players miss 51 games of action due to injury or illness. Players missing games are Gardner (26), James (8), Collier (6), Ellis (4), Morgan (2), Iwuchukwu (2), Johnson (2), Rodman (1). USC has at least one projected starter missing in 10 of its 27 games.

TEAM TROJAN -- All 11 Trojans that have played at least 5 minutes this season have had at least one game in which they scored 12 or more points. USC has used 12 different lineups this season. USC is the only Pac-12 team to have 11 players play at least 280 minutes this season.

APPARENTLY SHOOTING IS IMPORTANT -- USC is 10-4 in games it outshoots its opponent and 1-12 in games the opponent has a better shooting percentage.

WINS VS. LOSSES -- No real surprises when you compare the stats from USC's wins vs. its losses. They shoot better across the board, get 4.4 rebounds and 3.5 more assists per game.

THE STARTING FIVE -- When USC has started its opening night lineup of Boogie Ellis, Isaiah Collier, Kobe Johnson, DJ Rodman and Joshua Morgan it is 7-3. USC outscores the opposition 79.9-73.6 in those games and outshoots the opposition .479-.431. USC is 4-1 in Pac-12 games with this lineup, with the lone loss being in overtime vs. Colorado.

A POINT OF COMPARISON -- USC freshman guard Isaiah Collier returned from injury to post 89 points in five games (17.8 ppg). Through his first 21 games (20 starts) he compares well with recent freshman point guard standout Jordan McLaughlin, now with the Minnesota Timberwolves.

ENFIELD AT USC -- Andy Enfield, 54, a proven winner as a player, assistant coach and head coach, was named the USC men's basketball head coach on April 1, 2013 and quickly brought success to the Trojans' basketball program. Results came immediately with the Trojans setting the school single-season win record and the most wins in program history over a two-year, three-year, four-year, five-year, six-year, seven-year and now eight year period. USC has won 182 games over the last eight seasons which is the third-most wins in the Pac-12 and tied for the 14th-most wins in the nation among power conferences during that time. USC has had the second-best overall record in the Pac-12 four of the last six seasons (24-12 in 2018, 22-9 in 2020, 25-8 in 2021, 26-8 in 2022 and 22-11 in 2023). USC's 95 wins the past four seasons are tied for the sixth-most among the six basketball power conferences. Over the last six seasons, USC has had six players selected in the NBA Draft, tied for the 13th-most by any program in the country, with Evan Mobley being selected No. 3 overall in the 2021 NCAA Draft a year after Onyeka Okongwu was selected No. 6 in the 2020 NBA Draft. USC is one of seven teams to have had at least one player selected in five of the last six NBA Drafts. Enfield guided the Trojans into the NCAA Tournament the last three seasons and into the postseason from 2016-18 (2018 NIT), the first time for USC since 2007-09, and his teams have reached the NCAA Tournament five times in the last seven seasons in which there was a postseason. His teams have also excelled in the classroom by setting the program's top team GPAs for the Spring, Fall and Summer sessions. Enfield has brought in eight consecutive Top 30 recruiting classes, with the 2022 class ranking No. 7 and the 2023 class ranking No. 4. Enfield has an **216-145** record in his first 11 seasons as the USC head coach and is **257-173** in 13 seasons as a head coach. USC went 22-11 in the **2022-23** season and advanced to the NCAA Tournament where it fell to Michigan State 72-62 in the first round. The three consecutive NCAA Tournaments for the Trojans matched a program record. USC also finished tied for second in the Pac-12 with a 14-6 record. Boogie Ellis and Drew Peterson were named All-Pac-12 first team. USC was third in scoring average (72.5) and led the conference by holding opponents to a 39.3 field goal percentage, the fourth consecutive season holding opponents to under 40 percent shooting from the floor. USC went 26-8 in **2021-22**, placed third in the Pac-12, reached the Pac-12 semifinals and the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in the last six seasons in which a tournament was played. The win total tied the school record. USC held its first 12 opponents to under 40 percent shooting, the first time in 15 seasons a team had accomplished that feat. USC was 11-0 in the nonconference and was undefeated in play prior to conference games for the second time in six seasons, one of only two teams to have done that (Villanova). The **2020-21** Trojans went 25-8 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight, winning the most conference games and games overall in the regular season among Pac-12 teams. The **2019-20** Trojans went 22-9, finished tied for 3rd in the Pac-12 and were getting better as the season was cancelled due to COVID-19. The Trojans led Pac-12 teams in defensive field goal percentage and points per game allowed in Conference play. The **2018-19** Trojans were bitten by the injury bug beginning late in the summer, practicing the majority of the preseason with seven or eight scholarship players. Ultimately USC players missed 54 games due to injury and finished with a 16-17 record after falling to regular season champion Washington 78-75 in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. Enfield guided the **2017-18** Trojans to a 24-12 record and to a second place finish in the Pac-12, its highest outright conference finish since 1992. USC's 12 Pac-12 wins were its most since also going 12-6 in 2002. The Trojans reached the Pac-12 Tournament finals for the first time since winning the title in 2009. USC set school records with 296 three-pointers made, 1022 FG made and 569 assists. The Trojans also scored the second-most points by a USC team in history (2,798). The Trojans accomplished all of this and achieved a No. 10 ranking in the preseason, its highest since the 1974-75 season, despite 40 percent of its projected starting lineup missing much of the season. USC went 26-10 in the **2016-17** season to set the school record for wins in a season, was in the top 25 rankings for five weeks with a high of No. 22 and won two NCAA Tournament games. The Trojans won their first 14 games which was tied for the fourth-longest winning streak in school history and was the best USC start since the 1971 season. The 13-0 mark in nonconference regular season action was just the sixth time in school history USC had gone undefeated in the nonconference slate. USC defeated Providence in the First Four game for its first NCAA Tournament win since the 2009 season, then defeated No. 11 SMU before falling 82-78 to No. 12 Baylor, one win away from a Sweet 16 berth. USC won consecutive NCAA Tournament games for the first time since also winning two straight in the 2007 Tourney. After bringing in his recruits and establishing his system during the first two seasons, his Trojans took a big leap forward in the **2015-16** season. USC went 21-13 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. The Trojans had an 8.0 game improvement from the 2014-15 season which was tops among the Power 5 conference teams. USC played an exciting brand of basketball, averaging over 80 points per game and ranking among the nation's top 20 in offensive output. They matched a school record with four 100-point games in a season, after not having broken the century mark since 2002. The high-flying athletic style was also in effect in the **2015-16** season as the Trojans averaged over 3.5 dunks per game and set the then USC season record with 182 blocks, ranking in the top 15 in the country in this category. Enfield and staff brought in the No. 12-ranked freshman class in **2014-15** and they became key members of the team. McLaughlin was named to the 2015 Pac-12 All-Freshman team and went on to become one of three Pac-12 players all-time to record 700 or more assists and 1,600 or more career points scored. Elijah Stewart would leave USC as the school's career record-holder for three-point baskets made. USC went 12-20 during the **2014-15** campaign, including a Pac-12 Tournament first-round upset win over Arizona State. USC went 11-21 in his first season (**2013-14**), but Enfield developed freshmen Nikola Jovanovic and Julian Jacobs into impact Pac-12 players. In 2016, Jacobs would lead the Pac-12 in assists and was named to the All-Conference team.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station will be AM 790 KABC with Jordan Moore calling the action. The USC graduate is in his 10th season of working on USC basketball broadcasts, his sixth season as the play-by-play announcer.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 2nd in the 2023-24 Pac-12 preseason poll by league media. The rest of the predictions went as follows: 1.) Arizona (303), 2.) **USC (264)**, 3.) UCLA (249), 4.) Oregon (228), 5.) Colorado (210), 6.) Arizona State (148), 7.) Utah (139), 8.) Stanford (131), 9.) Washington (108), 10.) Washington State (94), 11.) California (67) and 12.) Oregon State (42).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,708-1,260* in its 118 years of inter-collegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 83 of its first 117 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 209-84 in 18 seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 104-25 in nonconference games at the Galen Center. USC is 65-11 in home nonconference games with Enfield as the head coach.

OUT IN THE COMMUNITY -- The USC men's basketball team tries to be a conscientious member of the community and has routinely had youth groups or schools visit practice or ventured out into the community for an event over the last several years.

BLOCK AROUND THE CLOCK -- USC registered 14 blocks vs. Oregon on Feb. 1 to tie the school record for blocks in a single game. USC also had 14 blocks vs. Pepperdine on Dec. 11, 2016. Josh Morgan (4) and Arrinten Page (4) became the first Trojan teammates to record 4 or more blocks in the same game since Alex Stepheson and Nikola Vucevic each had 4 blocks vs. Northern Arizona on Dec. 11, 2010. USC has 56 blocks in its last eight games (7.0 blocks per game) and it has 142 blocks this season, second to WSU (144) among Pac-12 teams.

FABULOUS FRESHMAN RETURNS TO ACTION -- USC freshman point guard Isaiah Collier suffered a fracture to the second metacarpal in his right hand in the game vs. Washington State on Jan. 10 and had surgery to repair it on Jan. 11 at Keck Medical Center. He returned to action at California on Feb. 7 and scored 20 points off the bench, then started and scored 18 points at Stanford on Feb. 10. He was the only Trojan to start all 16 games before suffering the injury. Collier is averaging 16.0 points, 2.8 rebounds and 4.3 assists per game. He is fourth in scoring average among Division I true freshmen, first in free throws attempted per game (6.2), fourth in field goal percentage (.477) and tied for fifth in assists per game (4.3). Collier has scored 335 points through his first 21 games, the most by a Trojan freshman since Evan Mobley totaled 353 points in the first 21 games of the 2020-21 season.

ON THE DEFENSE -- USC held UCLA to 33.3 percent shooting on Feb. 24 and has held its opponents to under 37.0 percent shooting in 5 of the last 8 games. USC held the opposition to under 37.0 percent shooting in 3 of its first 19 games. On Dec. 30, USC allowed Oregon St. to make 59.6 percent of its shots, the highest shooting percentage by a Trojan opponent since UW made 67.3 percent of its FGs against USC on Dec. 29, 2017. USC opponents have shot 50 percent or higher from the field eight times in the last two seasons, including six times this season. This season, USC has held its opponents to 42.8 percent shooting, fifth in the conference. USC held its opponents to a 39.3 shooting percentage last season, 8th in the country. Over the last four seasons, USC's defense held the opposition to 38.9 FG percentage, third in the country, tops among teams in the six basketball power conferences.

ELLIS A TOP 10 TALENT -- USC guard Boogie Ellis was named a Top 10 candidate for the 2024 Jerry West Award which recognizes the top collegiate shooting guards on Jan. 30.

USC FALLS IN CLOSE CONTEST -- USC fell 72-70 vs. Oklahoma on Nov. 24 in the championship game of the Rady Children's Invitational in Las Vegas, when the Sooners tipped in a missed shot with 1.4 seconds remaining. USC fell to 10-5 in one-possession games since the start of the 2021-22 season.

KOBE JOHNSON, MAN OF STEAL -- Junior Kobe Johnson has 50 steals this season which ranks second in the conference. He now has 138 career steals which rank 9th on USC's all-time steals list. He is 10 steals behind Lodrick Stewart who is in eighth with 148 career steals as a Trojan.

BIG GAME BOOGIE -- In guard Boogie Ellis' last 7 games against ranked teams, Ellis has averaged 23.4 points. He scored 21 points vs. No. 22 Tennessee on Nov. 24, 2022, 28 vs. No. 19/18 Auburn on Dec. 18, 2022, 10 at No. 10/8 UCLA on Jan. 5, 2023, 11 at Arizona on Jan. 19, 2023, 31 vs. No. 8 UCLA on Jan. 26, 2023, a career-high 35 vs. No. 8/9 Arizona on March 2, 2023 and 28 vs. No. 11 Gonzaga on Dec. 2, 2023.

NOT SO FREE FROM THE LINE -- USC made 74.5 percent of its free throws during the 2022-23 season, third-best all-time by a Trojan team and their best team FT percentage since the 1976 team made a school-record 75.8 percent of its free throws. USC had shot higher than 70 percent for a season from the free throw line just twice in the previous 15 seasons and averaged 65.5 percent from the line the previous four seasons. USC has made 68.0 percent of its free throws (363-for-534) this season, but only 57.7 percent (75-for-130) the last 6 games.

FROM GALEN TO THE NBA -- USC is one of seven schools to have at least one player selected in five of the last six NBA drafts. The Trojans selected in the last six NBA Drafts are: 2018 - De'Anthony Melton (No. 46), Chimezie Metu (No. 49), 2019 - Kevin Porter Jr. (No. 30), 2020 - Onyeka Okongwu (No. 6), 2021 - Evan Mobley (No. 4) and 2022- Isaiah Mobley (No. 49).

THE MAGIC MARK -- USC defeated UCLA 62-56 on Feb. 24 to improve to 132-13 in its last 145 games when holding the opposition to under 70 points, dating back to Feb. 28, 2015. USC is 7-2 this season and was 15-3 last season when it held the opposition to under 70 points. USC has held 74 of its last 109 opponents to under 70 points dating back to the 2019-20 season.

MAGICAL BOTH WAYS -- Since the 2019 season, USC owns a 77-17 record when it scores 70 or more points, 9-8 this season.

THE STRENGTH OF THREE -- A cord of three strands is not easily broken and a USC team with three players scoring 10 or more points is not easily defeated. USC has had three or more players score 10 or more points in 18 games this season (11-7) and is 74-18 in the last four seasons when at least three players score in double figures.

THE WINNING WAYS -- Since the beginning of the 2016 season, USC has picked up 193 victories, is tied for 17th-most by any team that played in the six Power basketball conferences over that period (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 & SEC). In the last five seasons, USC's 106 total wins are 15th-most among all six basketball power conference teams (through games of Feb. 26).

WHEN YOU SHARE THE BALL, THE TEAMS WILL FALL -- USC had 22 assists in its double-overtime loss to Colorado on Feb. 17 and fell to 23-3 in games it has 20 or more assists since the start of the 2019-20 season. All three of the losses are this season (Oregon on Dec. 28 and Feb. 1 and Colorado on Feb. 17).

NEAR THE TOP OF THE PAC -- The Trojans have a 59-35 record in Pac-12 games the last five seasons and are also the only school to finish in the top three of the conference in each of the last four seasons. USC's win total in Pac-12 games in that stretch is fourth, behind UCLA's 67, Arizona's 65 and Oregon's 60.

DINNERS WITH DEMAR -- Chicago Bulls' star and USC alum DeMar DeRozan launched a new digital series on YouTube called "Dinners with DeMar" on Feb. 20, a series which will feature "authentic, unrehearsed, unfiltered conversations about mental health." That same day DeRozan visited USC, shared his program and spoke with USC student-athletes and staff about his mental health awareness platform and joined on a panel with current USC basketball players Boogie Ellis and Dominique Darius. The first season of the show will feature DeRozan's conversations with Draymond Green, Dwyane Wade and Damian Lillard.

BIG THREE HAS BIG GAME -- USC guards Isaiah Collier (26), Boogie Ellis (22) and Kobe Johnson (21) all scored over 20 points in the win vs. Stanford on Jan. 6. They also had 13 assists and 9 steals in the game. The last time USC had three players score 20 or more points in the same game was on March 18, 2018 vs. UNC Asheville (McGlaughlin, Rakocevic, Stewart).

JOHNSON'S RARE GAME -- Kobe Johnson scored 21 points, had 5 rebounds, 5 assists, 5 steals and no turnovers vs. Stanford on Jan. 6. He became the first Pac-12 player since Chris Duarte of Oregon in 2020 to record a stat line like that (20 points, 5 or more rebounds, assists and steals and no turnovers) and just the third Pac-12 player since the 1996-97 season to do so.

DIALING IN FROM DISTANCE -- USC made 14 three-point baskets vs. Stanford on Jan. 6, its most since also knocking down 14 three-pointers vs. California on Jan. 16, 2020. USC has made 10 or more three-point baskets in seven games. USC made 10 or more three-point baskets in three consecutive conference games (10 at Oregon State on Dec. 30, 11 vs. California on Jan. 3 and 14 vs. Stanford on Jan. 6) for the first time since accomplishing the feat in six consecutive games during the 2004-05 season. USC made 10 or more three-point baskets in any three consecutive games for the first time since making 10 or more in five straight during 2017-18 nonconference play. Since then, USC has totaled 77 three-point makes in the last 12 games (6.4 per game). USC's opponents have made 100 3-pointers in the last 12 games (8.3 pg)

USC FIRST TO BRING IN BOTH MEN'S & WOMEN'S TOP RECRUIT -- Isaiah Collier was the consensus No. 1 men's basketball recruit for 2023 and JuJu Watkins the No. 1 women's recruit for 2023. It marks the first time that the top recruit on the men's and women's sides both selected to attend the same school in the same season. Also, both the USC men's and women's team were ranked No. 21 in the AP preseason poll, the first time both teams were ranked in the AP preseason top 25.

MORGAN ON TOP OF THE MOUNTAIN -- USC forward Joshua Morgan had a career-high and a school-record 10 blocks vs. Seton Hall on Nov. 23. Morgan has 60 blocks in his first 25 games for an average of 2.4 blocks per game, 9th in the country. His 10-block game is also the second-most by any player in a Div. I game this season. The previous USC record for blocks in a game was 8 done 4 times, last by Onyekwa Okongwu on Nov. 5, 2019 vs. FAMU. Morgan now has 152 career blocks as a Trojan, fourth on USC's all-time career blocks list. Chimezie Metu (2016-18) is third on the list with 168 blocks for USC. USC is 10-7 this season when Morgan is in the starting lineup.

ELLIS NAMED SPORTING NEWS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN -- USC guard Boogie Ellis was named to the Sporting News five-man Preseason All-America Team on Nov. 13. Joining Ellis are Zach Edey (Purdue), Kyle Filipowski (Duke), Graham Ike (Gonzaga) and Tyler Kolek (Marquette).

A LOOK AT LAST YEAR -- The Trojans went 22-11 during the 2022-23 season, including a 14-6 record in Pac-12 play which tied for second in the conference. USC also advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season. It was the Trojans' fourth consecutive 20-win season, a school record for back-to-back 20-win seasons. The Trojans return leading scorer and All-Pac-12 guard Boogie Ellis and have added the No. 4 ranked recruiting class in the country, which includes the consensus No. 1 overall player, guard Isaiah Collier.

COLLIER NAMED PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK THREE TIMES -- USC freshman guard Isaiah Collier was named Pac-12 men's basketball Freshman of the Week for the week of Nov. 6-12 as he helped lead the Trojans to a pair of wins by averaging 18.5 points, 5.5 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals. He also made 65.0 percent of his field goals and 90.0 percent of his free throws. He then was named Pac-12 Men's Freshman of the Week for the week of Nov. 13-19. Collier helped the Trojans split a pair of games during the week by averaging 23.5 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists. He also was named Pac-12 FOW for Jan. 1-7 when he averaged 19.5 points and 5.5 assists.

PAINT PROTECTORS -- USC has six players listed on the roster which are 6-8 or taller. USC's average height per player is 6-6.71 which ranks fourth among all schools, trailing only UCLA, Saint Mary's and Oregon State, according to the NCAA.

RETURNING ALL-PAC-12 PLAYERS -- The Trojans have three returning players who received 2022-23 Pac-12 accolades. Boogie Ellis was named Pac-12 First Team and Kobe Johnson and Joshua Morgan were named to the All-Defensive Team.

TROJANS SIGN A TRIO OF PROSPECTS -- USC has announced that guards Trent Perry and Liam Campbell and forward Brody Kozlowski have signed National Letters of Intent (NLI) to play basketball for the Trojans, it was announced by head coach Andy Enfield on Nov. 8. USC's recruiting class is ranked No. 10 nationally by 247Sports.com, marking it the third consecutive top 10 recruiting class and the 10th consecutive top 30 class.

USC HOSTING BLOCK PARTIES -- USC had 167 blocks last season, led by Joshua Morgan's 63 blocks. USC averaged 5.1 blocks per game, 11th in the country. Morgan's 2.17 blocks per game average led all Pac-12 players and ranked 16th in the country. As a team, USC has 142 blocks this season and 780 blocks over the last five seasons which rank sixth nationally. USC had 8 blocks in the season opener, including 5 by Morgan. USC then had 13 blocks (1 off the school record) vs. Seton Hall on Nov. 23. Morgan had a USC single-game record 10 blocks in the game. USC then tied the school record with 14 blocks vs. Oregon on Feb. 1 (also 14 vs. Pepperdine on 12/11/16).

USC TO THE NBA -- USC had 8 former players that began the 2023-24 season on NBA rosters, which ranked tied for 12th among all schools. Since then, Taj Gibson signed with the New York Knicks twice and Drew Peterson signed a two-way contract with the Boston Celtics. Here are the current 2023-24 stats for the 10 Trojans who have played in the NBA this season (through Feb. 26). :

ELLIS SHOOTING TOWARDS THE TOP - Fifth-year guard Boogie Ellis has averaged 17.0 points per game this season. He made a career-high 8 three-pointers vs. Eastern Washington on Nov. 29. The 8 three-pointers made tied him for fourth on USC's all-time list for three-pointers made in a game. He has made 69 of 167 three-point shots this season. Ellis has made 208 three-point baskets as a Trojan, sixth on USC's all-time three-point baskets made list. Brandon Granville (1999-02) is fifth on the list with 218 career three-pointers made.

WELL, THAT WAS ODD -- USC had back-to-back 82-67 losses on the road trip to Arizona (Jan. 17) and Arizona State (1/20). It had been 584 games since USC last played an 82-67 game, falling to California in the conference tournament on March 9, 2006. USC then fell 65-50 vs. UCLA on Jan. 27, making it three consecutive losses by 15 points. The last time USC lost three consecutive games by 15 or more points was Feb. 3-10, 1996.

BIG ATTRACTION -- USC's played four games from Jan. 13-Jan. 27 that were each played before more than 10,000 fans (an average of 12,184 fans per game). Eighteen of USC's first 27 games have been played before 6,000 or more fans (66.7 percent). Last season, USC played 12 of its 33 games before crowds of 6,000 or more fans. The 18 games played before 6,000 or more fans this season, its most in a single season since also playing 18 such games during the 2017-18 season. USC has played before an average crowd of 10,133 in its 10 road games, tops in the Pac-12.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS -- Several Trojans are working their way up some of the USC all-time career top 10 lists, including Boogie Ellis, Josh Morgan and Kobe Johnson. Johnson just joined the USC all-time top 10 list for career steals, while Ellis and Morgan are already in the top 10 in career three-pointers made and blocks, respectively. Ellis is also shooting up the USC all-time scoring list.

Boogie Ellis scored 24 points and Isaiah Collier added 18 points in his collegiate debut as No. 21 USC Men's Basketball defeated Kansas State, 82-69, at the Hall of Fame Series Las Vegas on Nov. 6. Collier, the consensus No. 1 recruit in the 2023 class, scored 15 of his 18 in the first. He also had 6 assists in 25 minutes before fouling out. Kobe Johnson scored 12 of his 16 points in the second half and grabbed 8 boards. Joshua Morgan added 11 points on 5-of-6 shooting while blocking 5 shots. The win marked a sweep for USC in the Hall of Fame Series Las Vegas after the No. 21 Women of Troy upset. No. 7 Ohio State, 83-74, in the first session of the day-long event. After conceding 3 free throws to Kansas State to start the game, Collier's and-one play and a layup highlighted a 14-2 run that gave the Trojans their lead that stood the rest of the night. USC made 51.7 percent of its shots, while holding KSU to 31.0 percent shooting. Ellis surpassed 1,000 career points as a Trojan, entering the game only needing 4 points to reach the milestone.

With captains and starting guards Boogie Ellis and Kobe Johnson out with leg injuries, USC's offense struggled to find its rhythm and the Trojans fell 70-60 at home to UC Irvine on Nov. 14. USC erased a 6-point deficit over the final 4:02 to tie at 70-all when DJ Rodman hit a pair of free throws with 27.9 seconds left. Oklahoma's Javian McCollum, who was named tournament MVP, launched a highly contested 3-pointer which bounced off the rim and was ticked in by Owhe who raced in from the baseline. USC led 39-36 at the break and surged to an 8-point lead 1:20 into the second half as Boogie Ellis, who finished with 16 points and was named to the All-Tournament team, hit a 3-pointer and another jumper to make it 44-36. Boogie Ellis scored 28 points, hitting a career-high eight 3-pointers, and USC routed Eastern Washington 106-78 on Nov. 29. The 106 points were the most by USC in a game since defeating Bradley 107-92 on Nov. 17, 2000. Ellis was 8 of 10 from 3-point range, tied for the fourth-most makes from beyond the arc by a Trojan in a game all-time. Isaiah Collier added 15 points despite four fouls as one of five Trojans in double figures. The Eagles were led by Jake Kyman with 25 points, including seven 3-pointers made. The Trojans stretched their lead to 31 points to start the second half when Ellis made three 3-pointers. The Trojans built their largest lead of the first half, 44-22, with a 19-3 run that included 13 straight points. Six different players scored, led by Vincent Iwuchukwu with 7 points, including 2 dunks. USC led 52-33 at the break after shooting 63% from the floor. The 52 first-half points were the team's most since also scoring 52 before the break vs. CSUN on Nov. 9, 2021. The 28-point winning margin and 57.1 field goal percentage were USC's best since making 58.9 percent of its shots and winning 97-60 vs. California on Feb. 16, 2023. USC had 24 assists on its 36 baskets and made 12 of 24 3-point attempts in the game.

With his father LeBron and the entire James family and a jam-packed crowd of local and national media in attendance, Bronny James scored 4 points, had 3 rebounds, 2 assists, 2 steals and a block in his first game since a cardiac arrest on July 24. USC led 45-30 at halftime and still by 10 points at 56-46 with 13:10 remaining, but LBSU went on a 12-3 run to cut it to 59-58 with just under 10 minutes remaining. Neither team had more than a one-possession lead until USC took a 69-64 lead with 5:56 left after a Boogie Ellis 3-pointer and a layup by Kobe Johnson. LBSU finished regulation on a 10-5 run to force OT. James had a steal and made 1 of 2 FTs to give USC a 2-point lead with 21 seconds left in regulation, but LBSU's Marcus Tsohonis, who scored a game-high 28 points, hit a tough jumper in the paint to tie the game at 74 with 3.9 seconds left. LBSU outscored USC 10-5 in OT to secure the win. USC made only 40.6 percent of its shots and 55.6 from the free throw line, missing 16 shots from the charity stripe. Isaiah Collier and Vincent Iwuchukwu led USC with 15 points and Ellis added 14. There were 47 fouls called in the choppy game.

Isaiah Collier (25), Boogie Ellis (22) and Kobe Johnson (21) all scored over 20 points as the Trojans defeated Stanford 93-79 at Galen Center on Jan. 6. It was the first time USC has 3 players score 20 or more points in the same game since March 18, 2018 vs. UNC Asheville (McLaughlin, Rakocovic and Stewart). Johnson scored 21 points, had 5 rebounds, 5 assists, 5 steals and no turnovers. He became the only Trojan since 1996 to register a stat line like that, and only the second NCAA player this season with a line like that. Collier scored a season-high 26 points and Ellis added 22. The Trojans made 14 3-pointers, their most since also netting 14 vs. California on Jan. 16, 2020. The game was close throughout and after Stanford scored 10 straight points to tie the game at 61-all with 9:46 remaining, USC finished the game on a 32-18 run. Collier, Ellis and Johnson took over from that point, combining for 28 of the Trojans' final 32 points to pull away. Both teams scorched the nets all day with Stanford making 52.7 percent of its shots, including 59.1 percent from 3-point range, while USC made 47.8 percent of its FGs, including 56.0 percent from beyond the arc. USC had 18 assists and 6 turnovers. The Trojans also forced 13 turnovers and outscored Stanford 25-10 on points off turnovers.

The game featured 19 lead changes and 9 ties, but after USC had taken a 64-63 lead on a 3-pointer by Harrison Hornery with 2:16 remaining, WSU scored the final 9 points to secure the victory. USC missed its final 5 shots and 2 front ends of 1-and-1s in the last 2 minutes. Isaiah Collier had 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting with three rebounds, but checked out of the game with 12:12 remaining with a right hand contusion and did not return. The Trojans also missed starting forward Joshua Morgan due to an upper respiratory illness and Ellis played with a hamstring issue. The Trojans made only 6 of their first 26 shot and finished with 32.3 percent shooting in the first half to trail 29-28 at the break. USC shot better from the field in the second half and regained the lead when Ellis hit a 3-pointer at the 10:01 mark, sparking a tight battle between the two teams that saw 10 lead changes in the final 10 minutes. Isaiah Jones scored a game-high 26 points for WSU, making 12 of 15 FTs, 11 in the second half. USC's DJ Rodman scored eight second-half points against his former team. Oziah Sellers scored 10 points on a perfect 3-of-3 shooting from the field, but it wasn't enough as USC men's basketball fell to UCLA, 65-60 on Jan. 27. The loss extended the Trojans' skid to 5 games, its longest since the 2015 season when it lost 9 straight. It also snapped USC's 5-game winning streak at the Galen Center against UCLA. The game saw the return of captain Boogie Ellis, who missed the last 3 games due to injury, and he scored 8 of USC's first 10 points. The Trojans opened up a 22-15 lead with 7:29 remaining in the first half, but UCLA closed the half on a 22-4 run to forge a 37-26 halftime lead and they never trailed again. The Bruins dominated the Trojans in the paint, winning the rebounding battle 41-29, including grabbing 15 offensive rebounds. UCLA outscored USC 22-14 on points in the paint and 17-4 on second-chance points. USC shot 35.4 percent from the field, while holding UCLA to 35.7 percent. UCLA also outscored USC by eight points at the free throw line. The 50 points scored by USC were its fewest in a game since a 72-40 loss at Washington on Jan. 5, 2020. After falling being 5-2 to start the game, USC went on a 20-6 run to take a 22-11 lead and never trailed again, leading by as many as 33 points in the second half. USC made 49.2 percent of its shots, while holding OSU to 34.6 shooting. USC had 22 assists on its 30 baskets and improved to 22-2 over the last 5 seasons when registering 20 or more assists. Bronny James had a game-high 6 assists and finished with 9 points. Harrison Hornery led USC with 14 points, scoring 12 consecutive points in a 5-minute stretch midway through the second half. Oziyah Sellers and Kijani added 12 points each for the Trojans. USC outrebounded OSU 44-24, its biggest rebound edge since outrebounding ASU by 25 on Jan. 24, 2022. USC's 20 offensive rebounds were its most in a game since also grabbing 20 offensive boards at ASU on Feb. 3, 2022. Colorado outscored USC 18-6 over the final 6:31 of regulation to forge overtime. Isaiah Collier, who finished with 25 points and a season-best 9 assists, made 1 of 2 free throws with 11 seconds left. After a timeout, the Buffaloes Luke O'Brien tied the game at 73-all with a dunk with 3 seconds remaining. Kobe Johnson missed a potent game-winning 3-pointer at the buzzer. USC fell behind by 4 points with under a minute remaining in the first OT, but Ellis made a pair of FTs and Collier hit a driving layup with 4 seconds left to force the 2nd OT. Simpson hit a 3-pointer and the Buffs made six straight free throws in the 2nd OT for the 92-89 win. USC was outrebounded 47-22 and was outscored 17-10 on second-chance points. USC played has played in 3 OT games this season, the most in a season since the 2021 season and lost 3 OT games for the first time since the 2019 season. It was USC's first 2 OT game since the 2022 season at Oregon State. USC forced 21 turnovers for the second time this season, both times in losses.
