

## 2024 NCAA Championships

- Men 3rd, Women T-10th •



Above left, JC Stevenson holds up his first place award for winning the NCAA outdoor long jump title with a jump of 26-11.75 (8.22m). His jump moved him into a third-place tie on USC's all-time list with Larry Doubledy (1977), who was the last Trojan to win the event at the NCAA Championships, which was with that jump. Above right, Racquil Broderick celebrates after finishing second in the NCAA men's discus throw final with a mark of 202-8 (61.77m). He became the first Trojan to score in the event since Aaron Dan in 2010 (5th) and the first USC freshman to score in the event since Darrell Elder in 1975. Broderick's second-place finish in the event was the highest by a Trojan since Ralph Fruguglietti also placed second with a throw of 202-0 in 1977, which was the previous best mark by a Trojan in the final. The pair helped lead the USC men's team to a third-place finish, USC's best since also finishing third in 2003.



Above left, Jasmine Jones (L) placed fourth and Jalaysiya Smith placed eighth in the women's 100m hurdles final at the 2024 NCAA Outdoor Championships. Earlier in the day Jones also won the 400m hurdles with a school-record and NCAA meet-record time of 53.15, passing two runners in the final 80 meters. She joins Natasha Danvers (2000) and Anna Cockrell (2019 and 2021) as Trojans to bring home the NCAA title in the 400m hurdles. Jassani Carter placed fifth in the women's 200m final with a time of 22.66. Her finish was the highest in the final by a Trojan since TeeTee Terry also placed fifth in 2021. The women's team tied for 10th, its highest finish since winning the 2021 team title.



# QUINCY WATTS

**USC Director of Track & Field | Fourth Season/12th With Program**

Former Trojan Olympic great Quincy Watts is in his fourth season in charge of the Trojans' program as he was promoted to USC Director of Track and Field and Cross Country on June 17, 2021 after eight seasons on Caryl Smith Gilbert's staff as an assistant in charge of sprints, long hurdles and relays.

In his 11 seasons working with USC athletes, he has guided Trojans to 119 indoor and outdoor All-America honors in the 400 meters, 400-meter hurdles and 4x400-meter relay.

His Trojan athletes also claimed 21 NCAA titles and 39 Pac-12 crowns, and they set three collegiate records and 29 school records plus all four USC freshman 400-meter records and the women's 400-meter hurdles freshman record.

Last season, Watts led the men's team to a third-place finish outdoors and the women's team to a 10th-place tie. During the indoor season the men tied for seventh and the women tied for eighth. USC accumulated a combined 30 outdoor and indoor All-America honors, with Jasmine Jones winning the indoor 60m hurdles title and the outdoor 400m hurdles titles, both with school records, and JC Stevenson winning the men's outdoor long jump title. Both the men's and women's teams placed second at the Pac-12 Championships, with Trojans claiming 11 total event titles. During the summer, USC once again stood out at the Olympics with USC athletes winning nine medals, including five gold. The total medals were more than any other collegiate program in track and field.

During his second season at the helm in 2023, Watts led the men's and women's team to second-place finishes at the Pac-12 Championships, with the Trojans winning nine event titles. His 400m crew was especially dominant with freshman William Jones edging teammate and two-time defending champion Johnnie Blockburger in the final with a time of 44.65, just 0.05 off the school freshman record. On the women's side, Jan'Taijah Jones won the title with the second-fastest 400m time by a USC woman of 50.44, to lead a 1-2-3-5 finish for the Trojans in the event. The women's 4x400m relay earned outdoor All-America honors and the women's and men's 4x400m relays earned indoor All-America honors. Jan'Taijah Jones also placed fifth in the 400m at the NCAA Indoor Championships. USC athletes combined to post 60 indoor and outdoor Trojan all-time top 10 results during the season. During the season Allie Jones set the USC heptathlon record, Tade Ojora the men's 60m hurdles record, Samirah Moody the women's 60m record and Summer Mosley the women's weight throw record.

In his inaugural season as a head coach in 2022, Watts led USC to some pretty impressive accomplishments. His athletes posted 16 outdoor and 17 indoor all-time USC indoor marks, including setting five school records. Trojans setting USC records were Davonte Burnett in the 60m, Summer Mosley in the women's weight throw, Alyssa Brewer the women's indoor 800m, Janiah Brown, Gigi Maccagnini, Jemima Russell and Brewer in the women's 4x800m relay and Kasaun James, Brendon Stewart, Ashton Allen and Johnnie Blockburger in the men's 4x100m relay, set in winning the NCAA title. The men's team placed 12th at the NCAA Championships, after taking third at the Pac-12 Championships, while the women were 30th at NCAAs and fourth at Pac-12s.

Watts was named 2022 NCAA Indoor West Region Coach of the Year and had athletes earn 12 indoor All-America honors and earn 11 first-team outdoor All-America status. In addition, USC athletes combined to earn 23 All-Academic honor roll designations for the Winter and Spring semesters. The Trojans also swept the annual dual meet against UCLA. Watts also continues coaching USA Olympic medalists Michael Norman, Rai Benjamin and Kendall Ellis. Norman won gold medals in the 400m and with the USA 4x400m relay team and Benjamin a silver medal in the 400m hurdles at the 2022 World Athletics Championships.

He was the 2021 U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association National Outdoor Women's Assistant Coach of the Year as well as the West Region Indoor and Outdoor Women's Assistant Coach of the Year. At the 2021 NCAA Indoor meet, he helped Kaelin Roberts to her second 400-meter title and the women's 4x400-meter relay team to a second place finish, while at last week's NCAA Outdoor meet Anna Cockrell was the 400-meter hurdles champ, the women won the 4x100-meter relay and three

women earned All-America honors in the 400 meters (the first time by any school in the event since 2014).

In his eight years (2014-21) as a USC assistant, the Women of Troy had four Top 3 finishes at the NCAA meet, including winning it in 2018 and 2021 and placing second in 2019, and they never finished below second place at the Pac-12 meet. The Trojan men had a quartet of Top 5 NCAA finishes and Pac-12 runner-up finishes.

Watts guided Trojans to 86 indoor and outdoor All-America honors in the 400 meters, 400-meter hurdles and 4x400-meter relay. His Trojan athletes also claimed 19 NCAA titles and 26 Pac-12 crowns, and they set three collegiate records and 24 school records plus all four USC freshman 400-meter records and the women's 400-meter hurdles freshman record.

Besides Cockrell and Roberts, among the other champion Trojan athletes that Watts has coached are Michael Norman, Rai Benjamin, Ricky Morgan Jr., Cameron Samuel, Kendall Ellis, Kyra Constantine, Bailey Lear, Jaide Stepter, Amalie Iuel, Nicole Yeargin and Vanessa Jones.

The 2020 season did not finish due to COVID-19, but he guided Kyra Constantine, Bailey Lear and Kaelin Roberts to indoor 400m All-America honors and those three and Anna Cockrell to All-America honors in the indoor 4x400m relay

In 2019, Watts guided Kaelin Roberts to the NCAA Indoor 400m title and Kyra Constantine to both indoor and outdoor All-America honors in the event. In addition, the women's 4x400m relay earned All-America honors both indoors and outdoors. Watts was named the 2019 West Region Indoor Assistant Coach of the Year.

In 2018 Watts helped guide his athletes to a banner year which earned him U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) Men's Assistant Coach of the Year and NCAA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors. Watts guided Michael Norman in the 400m dash and the men's 4x400m relay team of Ricky Morgan Jr., Rai Benjamin, Zach Shinnick and Norman to NCAA titles and collegiate records at the 2018 NCAA T&F Championships. Norman won the 400m race with a collegiate, NCAA Championships and Hayward Field record time of 43.61. The 4x400m relay won its title with an all-time NCAA, NCAA Championships and school-record time of 2:59.00. Watts also coached Norman to a Pac-12 400m title with a time

- Watts spent the 2012 and 2013 seasons as an assistant coach at CS Northridge,
- Watts attended USC from 1989-92 and won the 1992 NCAA 400m title with a meet-record time of 44.00. He still in the USC 400m record-holder with a time of 43.50 and was inducted into the USC Athletics Hall of Fame in 2012
- Won the 1992 Olympic gold medal in the 400m and the 4x400m relay

of 44.40. He also guided the 4x100m relay to a Pac-12 title and this season it posted two of the top five times ever by Trojans in the event. He also guided Rai Benjamin to a time of 44.74 in the 400m, sixth on USC's all-time list and fifth in the country during the regular season. Kendall Ellis set the USC indoor and outdoor 400m records and became the third NCAA woman athlete to run sub-50 in the 400m when she won the Pac-12 title with a time of 49.99. Ellis placed second in the 400m at the NCAA Championships and then ran an epic anchor leg for USC's women's 4x400m relay which won with a time of 3:27.06 to clinch the team title. Ellis' time of 50.34 to win the NCAA indoor title set the USC, collegiate and USA 400m records. Watts continues to train Olympians Norman and Benjamin who began their professional careers after combining to set three collegiate records at the NCAA Championships.

In 2017, Watts guided Ellis to then USC records in the women's indoor (51.52) and outdoor (50.00) 400m race, a second-place finish at the NCAA Indoor Championships and a third-place finish at the Outdoor Championships. Cameron Pettigrew also reached the women's final and Michael Norman also became a 400m All-American on the men's side. Norman also set the USC freshman record with a time of 44.60. Both Norman and Ellis also won Pac-12 400m titles. Watts again had great success with the relays with the women's 4x400m relay winning the indoor title and placing second outdoors, while setting the indoor collegiate record (3:27.03) and running the second-fastest time ever outdoors (3:23.35). The men's team set the school indoor record and ran its fastest outdoor time since 2012. Ellis also qualified during the summer to represent the USA in the 400m at the World Championships. Watts also worked with the 400m hurdlers Anna Cockrell and Amalie Iuel, who placed second and third respectively at the NCAA Championships and Cockrell setting the Trojan freshman record with a time of 55.14 at the USA T&F Championships.

In 2016, Ricky Morgan garnered 400m All-America honors and Jaide Stepter set the then school indoor and outdoor 400m records. The USC women's relays both set school records. Stepter also was a 400m hurdles All-American, won her third consecutive conference hurdles title and tied the school record with a time of 54.95 at the USA T&F Championships. He also worked with Pac-12 heptathlon champion Amalie Iuel, guiding her to a time of 2:06.34 in the 800m race which clinched the title and was the 10th-fastest time ever run by a Trojan woman.

In 2015 he coached Vanessa Jones to the Pac-12 women's 400m title and Ellis to the USC women's freshman outdoor 400m record and Morgan to the men's freshman indoor record. All three runners advanced to the NCAA semifinals in the event. At the time, Jones ran the second-fastest 400m time ever by a USC woman of 51.50 to win the conference title. Ellis' freshman record of 52.32 was set in winning the 400m at the USATF Juniors. He also guided the talented quartet of Stepter, Amalie Iuel, Ellis and Jones which won the Pac-12 title, earned a second-place finish at the NCAA Championships and set both the USC indoor and outdoor 4x400m records. Iuel and Stepter were All-Americans in the 400m hurdles and Stepter won the Pac-12 title in the event.

In his first season back home at USC, Watts helped guide the men's and women's sprinters post some impressive marks. His best works was with the 400m runners as Akawkw Ndigagbor won the MPSF indoor 400m title and then earned indoor All-America honors and set the school indoor record. Three USC women and one male scored at the Pac-12 Championships in the 400m dash. Stepter won her first Pac-12 400m hurdles title.

Watts spent the 2012 and 2013 seasons as an assistant coach at CS Northridge, primarily working with the distance runners and cross country team. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach at Harvard-Westlake High in Los Angeles (Calif.), where he helped develop one of the strongest distance programs in the country. He began his coaching career as head coach at his prep alma mater, Taft High in Woodland Hills (Calif.).

Watts came to USC from Taft specializing in the 100- and 200-meter dashes, then turned into one of the best 400-meter runners in Trojan history. The four-year (1989-92) letterman won the 1992 NCAA 400-meter race in 44.00, a meet record that stood for 25 years. Watts also ran the anchor leg on the 4x400-meter relay team that set a school record of 3:00.58 while placing second at those NAAs. As a junior, he finished second in the 400 meters at the 1991 NCAA Championships.

Watts, who was inducted into the USC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012, also was a wide receiver on the Trojan football team in 1990.

At the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Watts twice broke Lee Evans' Olympic record in winning the 400 meters. He ran 43.71 in the semifinal before clocking 43.50 in the final (that still stands as the USC record) to become the first 400-meter athlete to run sub-44.0 in a championship meet. He then teamed with Andrew Valmon, Michael Johnson and Steve Lewis to win the gold in the 4x400-meter relay in a then-world record time of 2:55.74 (he ran the second leg in a blistering 43.10).

He also earned a gold medal in the 4x400-meter relay at the 1993 World Championships (in a still-standing world record time of 2:54.29), and a silver medal in that relay at the 1991 World Championships.

Watts was ranked in the world Top 10 in the 400 meters for four consecutive years (1991-94), including No. 1 in 1992.

A native of Detroit, Mich., he was born on June 19, 1970. He and his wife, Kelly, have three children, daughters Talise and Kylie and son Quincy Jr.

# JOHN BOLTON

## Assistant Coach, Sprints | Second Season



John Bolton is in his second season as an assistant coach for sprints with the USC track and field program. He was named to the position by USC Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on Aug. 8, 2023.

In his first season of working with the USC sprint corps, 11 different Trojans posted sprint PRs. Travis Williams earned indoor first-team All-America honors by placing fifth in the 60m dash. During the indoor season, Williams had a 60m time of 6.52 which moved him to second on USC's all-time list. Williams placed fifth in the

100m at the Pac-12 Championships and was an NCAA quarterfinalist in the event. Max Thomas set his 100m PR of 10.13 to move to tied for 10th on USC's all-time list and his 200m PR of 20.28 to tie for ninth on USC's all-time list. Thomas placed second in both events at the Pac-12 Championships and advanced to the semifinals in both events at the NCAA Championships and the USA Olympic Trials. JC Stevenson placed third in the 100m dash at the Pac-12 Championships with a PR of 10.13 which moved him into a 10th-place tie on USC's all-time list. He also posted a 60m personal best of 6.61 which ties him for ninth on USC's all-time list. Justin Braun also had a 60m dash time of 6.55 which ranks tied for third on USC's all-time list. The USC men's 4x100m relay team won the Pac-12 title and reached the NCAA finals by running the second-fastest time in school history of 38.54 in the semifinals, but was disqualified in the final. They also ran the eighth-fastest time of 38.77 earlier in the season.

Bolton came to USC from Mt. SAC where he coached both the men's and women's sprint programs. During his coaching tenure, he was voted Assistant Sprints Coach of the Year an impressive 10 times.

Bolton spent the three seasons prior to joining USC and 10 overall as the sprints and relay coach for Mt. San Antonio College (Mt. SAC) where he helped lead the men's team to the South Coast Conference title in 2022 and 2023. The women's team also won the title in 2022. Bolton helped guide Jake Jensen to the 2023 SCC 100m and 200m titles and the 4x100m and 4x400m relays also took home the gold medals. Mt. SAC also won its second consecutive men's and women's team titles at the 2023 California Community College Athletic Association state championships. Bolton coached Jacob Williams to a first-place finish and Jensen to a third-place finish in the 100m and Kerry Smith to the 200m title and Jensen to a runner-up finish in the 200m. In addition, the men's 4x100m and 4x40m relays won titles. On the women's side, he guided Amari Weatherford to the 100m and 200m titles.

Bolton spent the 2019 season as the sprints coach at Cerritos College

where he led 11 individuals and four relays to state titles and was named CCCAA Assistant Coach of the Year, before returning to Mt. SAC where he had coached the previous five seasons (2013-18) developing a powerhouse sprint corps.

During his tenure at Mt. SAC he was named South Coast Conference Assistant Coach of the Year seven times (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019, 2022, 2023) and the California Community College Athletic Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2016. He helped lead teams he coached to 10 CCCAA state titles. He successfully placed 61 athletes into NCAA Division I & 2 programs with 52 student-athletes graduating from those programs. He also coached Mexico's national 200m champion.

In 2016, Bolton's sprinters dominated the CCCAA State Championships, with his student-athletes scored an incredible 68 points. Bolton's athletes captured titles in the 100m, 200m, 400m, 4x100m and 4x400m. For his efforts, Bolton was named the South Coast Conference and 5CTCA State Track and Field Assistant Coach of the Year.

During his time at Mt. SAC he helped lead 15 athletes to the U.S. Trials, coached 44 athletes to state titles, with over 50 athletes advancing to the NCAA ranks. Bolton is the winningest track and field coach in California Junior College history. He coached the likes of Kyree King, who went on to win Pac-12 100m and 200m titles at Oregon, Ilias Garcia who ran 9.97w, Gaston Brouchereau who ran 10.15w, Joey Fox who ran 10.16 and Cooper Bibb who ran 10.18. In addition to coaching 15 individual sprint champions, he also guided 12 relay teams to state titles.

Bolton served as an assistant coach at Fullerton College for two seasons and helped lead them to two Orange Empire Conference titles. Along with his sprinters, he helped guide jumpers L.V. Johnson and Cheyenne Thompson to CCCAA state titles. He was named the 2012 and 2013 Orange Empire Conference Assistant Coach of the Year.

He also worked with Daniel Stokes who was part of NC A&T's NCAA Champion 4x400m relay in 2021.

Prior to Fullerton College, Bolton coached at Los Angeles Southwest College and with his company B.S.D. (Bolton Speed Development). Bolton's S.H.A.R.K.S ELITE club 4x100m relay team ran a time of 39.21.

Bolton graduated from Dominguez High School, before attending Long Beach City College and Cal State Fullerton. An outstanding sprinter, he was a California Community College State and Big West Conference finalist.

Bolton holds a Bachelor's Degree in Kinesiology and is a NASM Certified Personal Trainer. A native of Compton, Bolton currently resides in Chino Hills, with his wife Stephanie and their three children Jamari, Skyla and Jamir.

# BRENTON EMANUEL

## Asst. Coach, Sprints | First Season

Brenton Emanuel was named USC assistant coach for sprints by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on Aug. 8.

"It gives me great pleasure to welcome Brenton Emanuel, his wife Jessica, and their family to the Trojan Family," said Watts. "Brenton is an outstanding coach. His leadership, and reputation in the track community for cultivating and developing champions at the highest level are impressive. I am truly blessed to have Brenton join the USC Track and Field family."

Emanuel has served the last three seasons as the assistant coach for men's and women's sprint hurdles and relays at Nebraska where his athletes set six school records. He guided Darius Luff to the 2024 NCAA 110m hurdles title with a school-record time of 13.19 (+0.1). Emanuel guided his athletes to 13 All-America honors in his three seasons, as well as leading 11 Nebraska runners to All-Big Ten honors.

Emanuel was named USTFCCA Midwest Region Assistant Coach of the Year and twice he helped lead Nebraska to Big Ten team titles.

"It is an honor to join such a prestigious program at USC," said Emanuel. "I am so grateful for Coach Watts for opportunity to join the USC family. I would like to thank my wife, family, and the staff and athletes at the University of Nebraska. I cannot wait to give my all for USC and continue to help young men and women better themselves on and off the track Fight On!"

Prior to Nebraska, Emanuel served the 2019-21 seasons as the Director of Track & Field and Cross Country for Eastern Illinois, where he was three times named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year. His men's teams won the OVC outdoor team title all three seasons and twice his men's cross country teams won the OVC title, the school's first in 15 seasons.

While at Eastern Illinois, he had 30 athletes post EIU all-time top 10 times, including school record-holders Pedra Hicks (400m H) and Danielle Frank (indoor 200m). He coached 30 athletes to OVC first-team honors and eight that advanced to the NCAA West Regional. He coached OVC Male Track Athlete of the Year in 2019-20 (Dustin Hatfield) and Adam Swanson in 2021.

Emanuel served the 2018 season as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for Illinois State and was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator from July 2014 through June 2017. While at ISU, Emanuel was named the USTFCCA Midwest Regional Assistant Coach of the Year in 2018 and coached seven national qualifiers. He coached five All-Americans, 25 Missouri Valley Conference champions and 80 All-MVC honorees. Emanuel had three USATF junior qualifiers and his Illinois State athletes set 10 school records.

He was the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator in 2014 at California University of Pennsylvania. He coached two All-PSAC performers and one World Juniors qualifier.

Emanuel is a 2008 graduate of Eastern Illinois, where he competed for the men's track team for four seasons. He served as a team captain and earned second-team All-OVC honors.

A native of Plainfield, Ill., Emanuel and his wife, Jessica, have three daughters, Brooklyn, Kamryn and Laila.

# KARL GOODMAN

## Assistant Coach, Sprints | Second Season

Karl Goodman is in his second season as an assistant coach for sprints for the USC track and field program. He was named to the position by Trojan Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on July 20, 2023.

Goodman's sprint crew posted some impressive results during the season, posting four all-time Trojan top 10 times, a Pac-12 Championships event title and six personal bests, with three athletes competing at the USA Indoor and Outdoor Championships.

Goodman guided Jassani Carter to All-America honors in the 200m as she placed fifth in the final, after running a PR of 22.46 in the semifinals which moved her to sixth on USC's all-time list. Carter also reached the NCAA 100m semifinals and took second in both the 100m and 200m at the Pac-12 Championships. Carter then advanced to the semifinals in the 100m and 200m at the U.S. Olympic Trials. His work with Madison Whyte led her to a ninth-place finish in the 200m at the NCAA Indoor Championships with a USC freshman record of 22.90, which also ranks sixth on the Trojans' all-time indoor 200m list. Whyte also ran 22.69 in the outdoor 200m at the Pac-12 Championships, just off the school freshman record of 22.65 and 11th all-time by a Trojan, to take third in the final.

He also guided Samirah Moody to a sixth-place finish at the 2024 USATF Indoor Championships, to the quarterfinals in the 100m at the NCAA Championships and a third-place finish at the Pac-12 Championships. Additionally, Goodman led the 4x100m relay team of Christine M. Mallard, Whyte, Moody and Carter to the Pac-12 title with a time of 43.87, seventh all-time by a Trojan quartet.

Goodman spent the previous five seasons at Coastal Carolina, being named an assistant coach in 2019 and then being promoted to associate head coach on July 1, 2022. He worked primarily with the sprinters and hurdlers groups.

Goodman helped the Chanticleers reach new heights, both in the Sun Belt Conference and nationally, particularly in the sprints and hurdles areas. He coached seven men and 11 women to all-time Coastal Carolina times in the sprints and hurdles in his five seasons.

In 2023, Alexis Glasco earned first-team All-America honors in the 100m hurdles, placing sixth at the NCAA Championships with a time of 12.74w. At the NCAA East Preliminary Rounds, he guided Glasco to a Coastal Carolina school record of 12.97 (+1.8) in the 100m hurdles. He also guided Kayla Sweeney to regionals in the 100m and 200m, reaching the NCAA quarterfinals in the 200m. Also, hurdler Sydney Clemens reached the NCAA quarterfinals in the 100m hurdles. Goodman also coached Braydon Bennett to the East Prelims in the 110m hurdles.

Goodman coached two Sun Belt Conference Women's Outdoor Track Athletes of the Year (2021 and 2022), the 2021 Sun Belt Conference Women's Outdoor Track & Field Freshman of the Year, and the 2021 Sun Belt Conference Women's Outdoor Track & Field Newcomer of the Year, as well as the 2022 Sun Belt Conference Women's Indoor Track Performer of the Year, two Sun Belt Conference Women's Indoor Track Newcomers of the Year (2020 and 2021), and two Sun Belt Conference Women's Indoor Freshman of the Year (2020 and 2021).

Under his leadership, the Chanticleers' sprinters, hurdlers, and relay groups have earned a total of 13 All-America honors, including a program-record of 11 All-American accolades during the 2022 outdoor season. He was key in coaching Melissa Jefferson who was the 2022 NCAA Indoor Track & Field champion in the 60m dash. Jefferson also became a 2022 U.S. National Champion with a first-place finish in the 100m at the 2022 Toyota USA Outdoor Track & Field Championships and a 2022 World Champion gold medalist as part of Team USA's winning 4x100m relay team at the 2022 World Athletics Championships. Goodman also helped guide Mekenze Kelley to a first-place finish in the 400m at the 2022 USA U20 Championships to become a national champion and qualify for the 2022 World Athletics U20 Championships where she took ninth place. She also won a gold medal as part of Team USA's 4x400m relay team.

On the men's side, the Chants' Braydon Bennett picked up first-team 2021 All-Sun Belt honors with a first-place finish in the 110m hurdles with a PR of 13.77 (2.5w), while Tyler Graves garnered second-team 2022 All-Sun Belt honors during the outdoor season. Reggie Barlow, Ty Floyd, DeVonte Harris, Jeremiah Talbert, and Garrett Wilkins all earned third-team all-conference recognition.

During the 2022 indoor season, Jefferson was named the 2022 Sun Belt Conference Indoor Track & Field Performer of the Year as she raced her way to a pair of conference championships in the 60-meter and 200-meter dash events, while Arnold won the 400-meters for the second consecutive year.

In 2021, Arnold picked up 2021 Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Most Outstanding Freshman, 2021 Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Newcomer of the Year, and All-Sun Belt first-team honors, as she was the 2021 Sun Belt Conference Women's Indoor Track & Field Champion in the 400-meters. She did this just one year after Jefferson won both the 2020 Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Newcomer of the Year and 2020 Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Freshman of the Year awards.

Before joining the Coastal Carolina staff, Goodman spent the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons with his alma mater UT Arlington working as a graduate assistant coach directly under associate head coach Jordan Durham and assistant coach Tyrone Edgar. Goodman helped guide the Mavericks to a 2019 Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Championship and coached the 4x100m and the 4x400m relay teams to berths into the 2019 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships. In 2019, the Mavs' 4x100m relay squad broke the school record with a time of 39.23 which had stood since 2014.

As a collegian, Goodman spent his last three seasons at UTA, and in 2017, the former Maverick helped lead his 4x400m relay team to a spot in the 2017 NCAA Track & Field Championships. Additionally, the native of Wendover, England, was a three-time Sun Belt Championship finalist in the 400m and ultimately, helped the 2017 Mavericks to indoor and outdoor league titles, as the program capped off its second-ever league "triple crown."

Goodman spent his first two seasons with Division II Mount Olive. The former Trojan sprinter completed his career as an All-American in the distance medley relay and finished in the top 10 all-time in two outside track events and one indoor event. Goodman helped Mount Olive to two triple crowns in two years. In 2014, Goodman set the school's all-time mark in the indoor 400m with a time of 49.42.

# MILTON MALLARD

**Assoc. Head Coach Cross Country, Asst. Coach T&F | First Season**

Extremely accomplished track and field coach Milton Mallard was named USC's assistant coach for distances and associate head coach for cross country by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on Aug. 28, 2024.

Mallard coached at Texas A&M from 2011-12 and from 2018-23 developing nine NCAA Champions, seven USATF National Champions and 27 Conference champions.

Mallard spent the 2023-24 season at UTEP as the associate head coach of track and field. He helped lead his athletes to six school records in his time at UTEP.

"It is with great excitement that we welcome coach Milton Mallard as our new distance and cross country coach here at USC," said Watts at the time. "Coach Mallard has an impressive track record, having coached some of the most successful student-athletes in NCAA history. We are truly thrilled and honored to have him join our staff, and we look forward to the incredible impact he will have on our program and our student-athletes."

"I want to express my sincere gratitude to coach Watts, the USC administration and the entire USC community for the warm welcome extended to me and my family," said Mallard. "Having had the privilege of working at several esteemed programs over the years, I am truly excited and blessed to embark on this new journey at USC. The university stands as a pillar of excellence both on and off the field, and I look forward to collaborating with exceptional student-athletes and colleagues. Fight On!"

While at Texas A&M, Mallard served as an assistant coach for the sprints, middle distances and relays, while leading the charge for the Aggies recruiting efforts. One of the 46 NCAA All-Americans that Mallard helped develop is the USA record-holder in the women's 800m race, Athing Mu, who clocked 1:55.21 in winning the gold medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. In her one season at Texas A&M under Mallard, Mu was a four-time All-American and a three-time NCAA champion. She set 11 all-time top-12 mark, including six all-time collegiate records. Also, Brandon Miller won the 2022 NCAA indoor 800m title and the 2021 SEC 800m title-the fourth time in five seasons a Texas A&M athlete won the title.

During the shortened 2020 season his athletes earned 11 All-America honors and two SEC indoor event titles. Devin Dixon claimed his third consecutive SEC indoor 800m gold, while the men's 4x400m claimed its fourth consecutive SEC title. Carlton Orange and true freshman Charokee Young each earned All-SEC honors with third place finishes in the 800m.

Mallard played a key role in the success of the Aggie women's fourth-place team finish at the 2019 NCAA Championships in Austin. He

coached Jazmine Fray to her first NCAA title in the women's 800 meters while Devin Dixon (American Collegiate indoor 800m record holder) and Carlton Orange earned second and fourth place finishes in the men's 800. The Aggies closed both NCAA Championship meets in style by sweeping the mile relays with the men just missing the NCAA record after finishing in 2:59.05.

During Mallard's first semester on the job in Spring 2018, the Aggies swept the SEC Outdoor Meet in the 800 meters while Sammy Watson went on to win the NCAA Championship at that distance. The Aggie women claimed three of the top five spots in the women's 800 meters at the 2018 SEC Championships while three different 800 meter athletes, headlined by Watson's NCAA title, scored at the national meet. Mallard also helped coach the Aggie men's mile relay to an SEC title and an NCAA runner-up finish in 2018.

Prior to returning to Texas A&M in 2018, Mallard was an athletic coordinator and coach within the Channelview school district. He also served as co-events director for the Houston site of the American Track League.

Following his service as a volunteer coach in 2012 at Texas A&M, Mallard became an assistant coach at Texas Lutheran University, working with the men's and women's sprints, hurdles and relays. The men's team at Texas Lutheran also restarted its program that year.

Mallard also coached athletes to national championship titles in Jamaica (2), Bermuda and the Bahamas, and was the head jumps coach for the Bermuda World Indoor Championship team in 2008.

As a professional athlete, Mallard competed from 1997 to 2005 and qualified for the 2000 and 2004 U.S. Olympic Trials in the 200 meters. He ranked among the top 20 in the world in the 200m in 1994, 2000 and 2004. In 2000 he placed fourth in the 200m dash at the USATF Indoor Championships.

Collegiately, Mallard competed for UTEP and LSU. In addition to five All-America honors, Mallard claimed five Western Athletic Conference titles at UTEP and two SEC titles at LSU. At UTEP, Mallard was the 1994 NCAA runner-up in the 400m. He was also a scoring member of two top-three team finishes at the NCAA Championships.

In 1992, Mallard earned gold and silver medals in the World Junior Championships. As a prep at North Garland High School (Texas), Mallard won a pair of State 5A titles in the 200m and 400m in 1992.

Following his retirement as a professional sprinter, Mallard worked with Carl Lewis Athletics, where he was involved with athlete recruitment as well as meet and sponsorship scheduling. Mallard assisted Lewis in developing and overseeing projects with the IAAF, USATF and several community-based programs throughout the country.

Mallard is married to LaTarsha Stroman Mallard, a four-time track and field champion for LSU. The Mallards have three daughters – Keondra, Aliyah and London.

# MARTIN MARIC

## Assistant Coach, Throws | Third Season

Two-time Olympian Martin Maric is in his third season as the USC assistant track and field coach for the throws. He was named to the position by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on Sept. 2, 2022.

Maric's athletes had a banner 2024 season, posting five all-time USC top 10 marks, seven throwers establishing personal bests and two athletes earning first-team All-America honors. Racquil Broderick had a PR in the discus throw of 204-6 (62.34m) to set the USC freshman record and move into second on the Trojans' all-time list. He won

the 2024 Pac-12 discus throw title and finished second in the event at the NCAA Championships with a mark of 202-8 (61.77m). Broderick's mark was the best ever in the finals by a Trojan and his second-place finish was the best by a USC athlete since Ralph Fruguglietti also placed second in 1977. Also earning first-team All-America honors was Nikolaos Polychroniou in the men's hammer throw by placing fifth. He also placed second at the Pac-12 Championships in the hammer throw and moved into third on USC's all-time list with a mark of 246-10 (75.24m). Leif Nelson moved into fourth on the USC men's all-time javelin throw list (239-11), placed second at the Pac-12 Championships and placed 10th at the NCAA Championships to earn second-team All-America honors. Sara Zabarin moved into third on the USC women's all-time discus throw list (171-3) and placed fourth in the event at the Pac-12 Championships. Freshman Reese Garland had a discus throw PR of 178-2 (54.32m) to move into fifth on USC's women's discus throw list and placed eighth in the event at the Pac-12 Championships. In addition, his work with Allie Jones helped her set nearly a three-foot PR in the shot put to help her establish the school pentathlon record with 4,528 points at the Razorback Invitational. She went on to earn indoor All-America honors by placing fourth in the pentathlon at the 2024 NCAA Indoor Championships.

In his first season with USC, Maric guided Polychroniou to All-America honors in the hammer throw, with the sophomore placing fifth at the NCAA Championships with a mark of 238-4 (72.65m) which moved him to sixth on the Trojans' all-time list in the event. Polychroniou also placed second in the hammer throw at the 2023 Pac-12 Championships. During the indoor season, Summer Mosley set the USC women's weight throw record with a toss of 63-9.00 (19.43m). At the USC-UCLA Dual, Meet Karlee Freeman placed second in the shot put with a PR of 53-11 (16.43m), which ranks eighth on USC's all-time list. He was also instrumental in All-American heptathlete Allie Jones improving in all of the throwing events which contributed to her setting the USC record in the event.

Maric was the throws coach at Virginia from 2013-22, where he produced four NCAA champion throwers, 29 All-Americans and 18 ACC Champions. Two times he was named the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

He was named the 2022 Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year as he guided Claudio Romero to the NCAA discus throw title (217-1). He also led Ethan Dabbs to the USATF Outdoor Championships javelin throw title (266-8) and to a second-place finish in the event at the NCAA Championships (261-5).

In all, the Virginia throwers set four outdoor school records and two ACC records during the 2022 campaign. He guided Maria Deaviz to the Virginia indoor shot put record with a mark of 54-11.50 and to the school's outdoor record with a mark of 56-10. Maric guided the Virginia men and women to four ACC titles during the indoor and outdoor seasons. His throwers recorded eight All-ACC honors and five All-American honors in 2022.

In 2021, Ethan Dabbs repeated as the ACC javelin champion, and Claudio Romero captured his first conference discus crown. At the NCAA Championships, Romero finished first, and freshman Jacob Lemmon placed fifth to give UVA a pair of All-Americans in the event.

While the 2020 outdoor season did not take place due to the pandemic, Maric's athletes recorded three All-America honors during the 2019 season as Ethan Dabbs (javelin), Hilmar Jonsson (hammer) and Oghenakpobo Efekoro (shot put) competed at the 2019 NCAA Outdoor Championships. All three athletes also captured ACC titles in their respective events. Jonsson became the first male ACC competitor to capture four consecutive titles in the hammer throw. Jonsson also set the Icelandic national record in the event during the regular season.

During the 2018 season, Hilmar Jonsson captured his third ACC title in the hammer throw. He advanced to the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships, earning second-team All-America honors in the event.

Maric led the Cavaliers to a program-best third place finish at the 2017 NCAA Outdoor Championships. Virginia scored in five throwing events,

tallying all 36 of the team's points, the most by a throwing unit since SMU in 2002. Filip Mihaljevic captured the NCAA title in the shot put and discus, earning him recognition as a Bowdman semifinalist. Mihaljevic was named the ACC Outdoor Field Athlete of the Year, ACC Championships Outdoor Field MVP, the 2017 USTFCCCA Southeast Regional Field Athlete of the Year and ACC Outdoor Scholar Athlete. At the ACC Championships, Mihaljevic placed first in the shot put and discus, while Hilmar Jonsson won the hammer title. Maric led five males and one female student-athletes to All-American honors. Jordan Young was named an All-American in the weight throw at the NCAA Indoor Championships, finishing third in the event. He also won the ACC title in the event, earning the Indoor ACC Field Performer of the Year. Mihaljevic finished first in the shot put at the conference meet.

Maric's group had a stellar 2015 season, which earned him USTFCCCA Southeast Region Men's Assistant Coach of the Year honors. He guided the throwers to six NCAA Championship entries during the outdoor season, as Jordan Young was the only male to compete in three individual events in Eugene. Young earned first-team All-America honors in both the discus and hammer throw, while Filip Mihaljevic finished third in the discus.

The Cavaliers broke four school records during the outdoor season, with Mihaljevic setting the marks in the shot put and discus, Young in the hammer throw and Christine Bohan in the shot put. During the indoor season, Young had a fourth-place finish in the weight throw at the NCAA Championships. Between the indoor and outdoor seasons, Mihaljevic and Young won a combined four ACC Championships.

Maric spent the 2015-16 school year as a member of the Virginia IM-Rec staff.

In 2014, Maric coached Mihaljevic, the ACC Outdoor Track & Field Freshman of the Year. Mihaljevic won the ACC Outdoor Championship in the discus and earned first-team All-America honors in both the shot put and discus.

Maric is the Croatian national record holder in the discus throw with a mark of 222-10 (67.92m) and he represented his home country in the discus at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing and the 2012 Games in London. He finished 29th in 2008 before placing 17th in 2012. He was named Croatian Athlete of the Year for this effort in London.

He also represented Croatia at the 2011 World Championships in Dague, South Korea, and at the 2007 and 2009 World University Games.

Maric competed collegiately at California and was the NCAA champion in the discus throw in 2009 (196-3), as well as an All-American in the discus in 2008 and the javelin throw in 2007.

Maric spent the springs of 2010 and 2011 as a volunteer assistant coach at the University of Florida and served as an assistant coach at the ASK Split Athletic Club in his native Split, Croatia.

Maric graduated from California with a bachelor's degree in political economy of industrial societies in 2009. He then completed a Master's degree program in Exercise Physiology at Virginia in 2015.

He and his wife, Danielle, have a son named Elijah.

# JEFF PETERSMEYER

## Assistant Coach, Jumps & Multi Events | Second Season

Veteran coach Jeff Petersmeyer is in his second season as an assistant coach for jump and multi-events with the USC track and field program. He was named to the position by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on July 6, 2023.

Petersmeyer is a 27-year veteran jumps and multi-events coach who has guided his athletes to numerous All-America honors, NCAA titles, conference titles and Olympic berths.

In his first season as the leader of the jumps program, Petersmeyer's athletes earned five first-team All-America honors, one NCAA individual title, one USATF Indoor title, set two school records, posted six Trojan all-time top five marks, won two Pac-12 individual titles and his athletes set 20 indoor and outdoor personal bests. He was named the USTFCCA West Region Men's Assistant Coach of the Year.

Petersmeyer guided JC Stephenson to the 2024 NCAA outdoor long jump title, winning on his final jump with a personal-best jump of 26-11.75 (8.22m) which moved him to tied for third on USC's all-time list. He became the first Trojan men's long jump champion since Larry Doubly in 1977. Johnny Brackins Jr. was also All-America honors in the event by placing fourth with a jump of 26-4.25 (8.03m). Brackins Jr. set the USC indoor long jump record of 27-0.00 (8.23m) in winning the USATF indoor long jump title and outdoors he placed fourth at the U.S. Olympic Trials in the long jump.

Petersmeyer also helped lead Temi Ojora to All-America honors in the triple jump at both the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships, placing fifth indoors and sixth outdoors. She also won the Pac-12 triple jump title and set the school record in the event with a jump of 45-7.25 (13.90m) at the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds. Ojora also had the second-farthest women's indoor triple jump in school history of 45-2.25 (13.77m) at the Razorback Invitational. High jumper Elias Gerald set his indoor and outdoor PRs, won the Pac-12 title (which was contested indoors) with a clearance of 7-1.75 (2.18m) and earned second-team All-America honors by placing 11th in the high jump at the NCAA Championships.

During the indoor season, Petersmeyer helped guide Allie Jones to a fourth-place finish in the pentathlon at the NCAA Championships, where she set her long jump PR of 20-8.00 (6.30m) which ranks tied for fifth on USC's all-time list. Earlier in the season, he helped guide her to the school record with 4,528 points in the pentathlon at the Razorback Invitational.

Petersmeyer spent the year before joining USC as the Director of Athletics at American International University in Jahra, Kuwait.

From 2018-2022, Petersmeyer was an assistant track and field coach at Louisville, where he also worked as a speed and power consultant for the men's basketball program during the Fall of 2022. He developed several All-ACC performers and NCAA Championships competitors. He also developed three athletes which competed at the 2020 Olympics, including Shelby McEwen who went on to place fifth in the high jump at the 2022 World Championships. Petersmeyer served as Louisville's international recruiting coordinator.

In 2022, Petersmeyer coached Trey Allen to first-team All-America honors in the high jump at both NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships. He also coached 10 athletes to All-ACC honors, including seven medalists. At the ACC Indoor Championships, Luke Nichols earned took second and Allen third in the men's high jump while Synclair Savage took third in the women's long jump. Under Petersmeyer's guidance, the Cards won 2022 ACC Outdoor titles in men's and women's high jump. Emily Scott cleared a personal-best and facility-record mark win the women's title, while Allen captured the men's gold. Additionally, Savage won the women's long jump. Allen and Willis qualified to compete at the USA Track & Field Championships in the high jump and long jump respectively.

Petersmeyer guided Allen to All-America honorable mention in the high jump at the 2021 NCAA Outdoor Championships. He coached Allen and Jonah Hyde to fourth and fifth respectively at 2021 ACC Indoor Championships. Renate Van Tonder placed fourth in the women's long jump at the 2021 ACC Outdoor Championships. He helped Alivia Ash earn first team All-ACC honors at the 2020 ACC Championship while Van Tonder (High Jump), Alexis Gibbons (Long Jump), Cayden Spencer-Thompson (High Jump), Allen (High Jump) all earned second team All-ACC honors. He also coached Ash to the high jump title at the

2019 ACC Indoor Championships. He finished his first season with six All-ACC indoor selections and four All-ACC outdoor selections. His 2019 event squad in the women's long jump was ranked No. 1.

From 2013-18 Petersmeyer was the head track and field coach at San Jose State. During his stint at San Jose State, he guided Destiny Longmire to 14th in the long jump to earn second-team All-America honors in 2018. She was the first San Jose State woman athlete to qualify for the NCAA Championships in the five-year history of the program. The San Jose women's triple jump crew was ranked No. 1. He also coached a record six San Jose women's athletes to the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds. Four of his athletes won Mountain West individual titles and in 2015, distance runner Rebecca Garcia was named a Capital One Academic All-America third-team honoree.

He served as an assistant coach at Boise State from 2009-13. Petersmeyer coached three All-Americans, 17 conference champions and guided Kurt Felix to the 2012 NCAA decathlon title.

Petersmeyer was an assistant coach at TCU from 2006-09. He coached Jonathan Jackson to become the first TCU athlete to win league titles in both the long jump and triple jump. Jackson was a back-to-back All-American in 2007-08 under Petersmeyer with a pair of third-place finishes at the NCAA Championships. He also coached Whitney Gipson and Neidra Covington to All-America honors in 2009. Gipson went on to place third at the 2009 USA Junior Outdoor Track & Field Championships and Covington became a three-time All-American under Petersmeyer. Gipson later went on to set the NCAA women's indoor record in the long jump.

From 1999-2006 he served as an assistant coach at Baldwin Wallace (2004-06), Columbia (2002-04) and Northern Arizona (1999-02). At Baldwin Wallace he guided his team to an indoor and outdoor conference title, at Columbia he coached the school's first women's field event Ivy League champion and at Northern Arizona he helped guide the team to seven Big Sky championships and to five Top 12 at the NCAA Cross Country Championships. He was a graduate assistant from 1998-99 at Allegheny College.

Petersmeyer has a long history of coaching athletes to international success. He guided Shelby McEwen to a fifth-place finish in the high jump at the 2022 World Athletics Championships, after claiming the USA high jump title. Petersmeyer coached Roderick Townsend to the gold medal and a world record in the high jump at the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games. Townsend also earned the silver medal in the long jump. In 2019 he guided Ty Butts to an eighth-place finish in the women's high jump at the World Championships. In 2017 he was an assistant coach for Team USA at the Para World Championships and led Townsend to a gold in the high jump. He and Townsend teamed up in 2016 at the Rio Paralympic Games and Townsend set an International Paralympics Committee (IPC) world record in the high jump. Petersmeyer was a coach for Grenada at the 2012 London Games and the 2013 World Championships in Moscow, Russia. He coached Kurt Felix to a bronze medal in the decathlon at the 2014 Commonwealth Games in Scotland.

Petersmeyer is originally from Delphos, Ohio. He earned a Bachelor's Degree from Baldwin Wallace in 1996. He was a two-time NCAA All-American and a nine-time Ohio Athletic Conference champion and the Baldwin Wallace school record-holder in the 400m hurdles. He was inducted into the Baldwin Wallace Athletic Hall of Fame. Petersmeyer also earned a Master's degree from Northern Arizona in 2002, MBA with Distinction from Manchester Metropolitan in 2022, a Master's of Arts in International History with Distinction from Staffordshire, a Master's of Science in Sports Administration from Louisville and is working on a PhD in History from Southampton.

## Assistant Coach, Sprints | First Season

Stephanie Williams was named assistant coach for sprints and the track and field recruiting coordinator by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on Aug. 8.

Williams comes to USC after 15 seasons as a coach at DePaul. The last 10 years she spent at DePaul were as an assistant coach for sprints and hurdles. She also served three seasons (2012-14) as the assistant coach for sprints and two as a graduate assistant coach for sprints.

"I'm very excited to welcome Stephanie and her son Nate to the Trojan Family," said Watts. "Stephanie's experience will be invaluable in helping the USC Men's and Women's programs. Stephanie fosters a culture that shows how much she cares about her athletes and pushes them to reach their full potential as student-athletes, but more importantly as great citizens in our community."

"I'm very excited to be a part of the Trojan family," said Williams. "It is truly a blessing. I would like to thank Coach Watts, the USC

During her time as a coach at DePaul, she coached over 50 Big East champions and 12 NCAA Midwest Preliminary Rounds qualifiers. Williams coached all current DePaul record holders in the short sprints, sprint hurdles and 4x100m relays. She guided Darius Brown to the 2024 NCAA 60m hurdles finals and to the 2024 NCAA outdoor 110m hurdles semifinals. Brown also competed at the 2023 and 2024 USATF Championships in the 110m hurdles and set the Big East Championships 60m hurdles record. She also guided hurdler Kyle Decker to four Big East 60m hurdles titles and to three Big East 110m hurdles championships.

Williams competed for DePaul from 2006-09 and served as team captain for the track and field team. She graduated Cum Laude in 2009 with a degree in Communications and a minor in Marketing: Sales & Leadership. She also earned a Master's in Communications from the school in 2011.

# USC T&F ATHLETES HAVE BIG SUMMER

## • Trojans Athletes Around The Globe Flex Their Muscles •

### • USATF CHAMPIONSHIPS •

Jasmine Jones and Anna Cockrell in the women's 400m hurdles and Rai Benjamin in the men's 400m hurdles earned their way to the 2024 Paris Olympics during the final day of the 2024 U.S. Olympic Track & Field Team Trials held at Hayward Field in Eugene, Ore. which ran Jun 21-30. There were 11 members from the 2024 USC outdoor track and field team competing, as well as another 15 previously graduated Trojans.

Current and graduated Trojans who clinched spots on Team USA for the Paris Olympics were Rai Benjamin (M – 400m H), Anna Cockrell (W – 400m H), Kendall Ellis (W – 400m), Jasmine Jones (W – 400m H), Michael Norman (M – 400m), TeeTee Terry (W – 100m).



### • TROJANS SHINE AT WORLD U20 CHAMPIONSHIPS •

The Trojans shined during the five days of the World Athletics U20 Championships held in Lima, Peru from Aug. 27-31.

Nonah Waldron had a time of 13.30 (-0.3) to place fourth in the women's 100m hurdles final on Aug. 30.

Incoming freshman Shaiquan Dunn competing for Jamaica placed seventh in the men's discus throw final (1.75 kg) with a best mark of 196-2 (59.79m) in the final on Aug. 31. Dunn also placed ninth in the men's shot put final on Aug. 27 with a best mark of 62-1 (18.92m). He advanced to the final earlier in the day with a throw of 64-1 (19.53m).

Incoming freshman and 2024 Olympian Tiana Eyakpobeyan placed seventh in the women's 100m final with a time of 11.63 (+0.0) on Aug. 28. Eyakpobeyan, competing for Nigeria, had a time of 11.61 (+0.2) in the preliminary rounds and 11.56 (-0.3) in the semifinal on Aug. 27. Fellow freshman Avery Lewis, competing for USA, had a time of 11.85 (-0.6) to advance out of the prelims and a time of 11.77 (-0.3) in the semifinal, but did not advance to the final.

Sophomore Reese Garland placed ninth in the women's discus throw final on Aug. 28 with a mark of 165-10 (50.56m). Garland, representing USA, advanced to the final with a best throw of 165-0 (50.31m) in the qualifying round on Aug. 27.

Sophomore Jenna Gallaway, competing for USA, placed 21st in the women's hammer throw on Aug. 29 with a best mark of 167-2 (50.97m).

### • BROWN WINS CANADIAN 200M TITLE •

Aaron Brown (USC, 2014) won the Canadian 200m title on June 30 with a time of 20.09 (+3.1w) to qualify for the Olympics. Joining Brown to prepresent Team Canada at the 2024 Paris Olympics will be seven-time Olympic medalist Andre de Grasse (USC, 2014) and Krya Constantine (USC, 2021). Brown qualified to represent Canada in the 100m, 200m and 4x100m, De Grasse in the 100m, 200m and 4x100m and Contantine in the 4x400m relay.

# USC GRABS THE BLING AT THE PARIS OLYMPICS

• **Trojans Earn 9 Medals: 5 Gold, 1 Silver, 3 Bronze** •

Current and former Trojan students won nine medals at the 2024 Paris Olympics, five gold, one silver and three bronze. The nine track and field medals won are tied for the second-most medals won by the Trojans in a single Olympics (also nine at 2016 Rio Games), trailing only the 13 won by Trojans at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. This was the sixth consecutive Summer Olympics in which a USC track and field athlete earned at least one gold medal and a Trojan track and field athlete has won at least one medal in every Olympics since 1912.

On the final day, Rai Benjamin (USC, 2019) anchored USA's 4x400m relay team to the gold medal, winning with an Olympic-record time of 2:54.43. That time is also the fourth-fastest time ever run by a men's 4x400m relay team. Benjamin's split of 43.13 was the fastest among the American runners and the second-fastest anchor leg in the final. Benjamin, who won the men's 400m hurdles title the previous day to become the first male athlete to ever win a gold medal in the 400m hurdles at the Olympics and then anchor his 4x400m relay team to a gold medal.

## FRECH EARNS 3 MEDALS AT PARIS PARALYMPICS

USC freshman Ezra Frech won the T63 high jump gold medal at the 2024 Paralympics in Paris, France on Sept. 3. It was the second gold medal in two days for Frech, who won the T63 100m dash title on Sept. 2.

Frech won the high jump gold medal with his first-attempt clearance at 6-4.25 (1.94m), which is a new Paralympics record. He then tried to better his own T63 high jump world record of 6-5.50 (1.97m) by raising the bar to 6-6.00 (1.98m), but narrowly missed keeping the bar on at that height. The T63 designation is the classification for athletes with a single-leg amputation above the knee.

Earlier in the games, Frech placed fifth in the men's T63 long jump final on Aug. 31 with a best jump of 21-7.25/6.58m (+0.9). He then won the T63 100m dash title with a time of 12.06 on Sept. 2.

Frech is the inaugural Swim With Mike Scholarship recipient of the Amir Ekbatani Paralympic Scholarship, awarded to a Paralympian attending USC or UCLA. He is in his first semester at USC where he is seeking a bachelor's degree in Business of Cinematic Arts.

**THIS YEAR:** Sophomore Jacob Andrews is in his second season as a sprinter on the USC track and field team. He has run on two of USC's all-time top 10 indoor 4x400m relays and one of its outdoor 4x400m relays, earning All-America honors in 2024 with both.

**2024:** Andrews had a season-best 400m time of 46.21 to place fourth at the Oxy Invitational on May 4. He reached the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds in the 400m. He went on to earn first-team All-America honors outdoors with the men's 4x400m relay which ran 3:02.68 to place eighth at the NCAA Outdoor Championships on June 7. They also ran 3:02.29 in the semifinals on June 5, the seventh-fastest time in school history. He set his indoor 400m PR of 46.92 in placing third at the Ken Shannon Last Chance Meet. Andrews ran on the fourth and sixth-fastest indoor 4x400m relays in USC history. He ran the third leg on USC's 4x400m relay which earned All-America honors by placing seventh with a time of 3:04.67 at the NCAA Indoor Championships on March 9, the fourth-fastest time ever by a Trojan indoor relay team.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Andrews is a 2023 graduate of Sehome High in Bellingham, Wash. He has personal bests in the 100m of 10.47, the 200m of 20.97 and the 400m of 45.91. His 400m time ranked fifth among graduating high school seniors. He placed third at the 2023 Nike Outdoor Nationals in the 200m with a time of 21.10, after running his PR of 20.97 in the prelims. He placed second in the 400m at the USATF U20 Championships with his PR of 45.91. As a senior, Andrews helped lead Sehome to its second consecutive team title by winning the WIAA 2A 100m title with a time of 10.56, the 200m with a time of 21.21 and the 400m with a time of 46.89, while anchoring the 4x100m relay to the title... his 200m and 400m times set 2A state records, which he bettered later in the year. In his junior season he won the 200m, 400m and with the 4x400m relay and took second in the 100m to lead the Marines to the 2A Washington state team title. He also won the 2022 Nike Outdoors 400m title and the 2022 USATF Junior Olympics 400m title.

**THIS YEAR:** Graduate student Johnnie Blockburger is in his fourth season on the USC track and field team, after spending his freshman year at Arizona. He only has indoor eligibility for the 2025 season. He was part of school record-setting 4x100m relay and also ran on the second-fastest 4x400m relay in USC history. He also has run on six of USC's all-time top 10 indoor 4x400m relays. Blockburger ranks tied for third on USC's all-time outdoor 400m list.

**2024:** Blockburger won his third Pac-12 400m title with a personal-best time of 44.51 to move into a third-place tie on USC's all-time list in the event. He then won the Pac-12 200m title with a wind-aided PR of 20.19 (+2.2w). He also anchored the winning 4x100m relay which ran 38.84 to account for 22.5 points at the meet, earning him the Most Outstanding Male Athlete of the Meet Award. Blockburger was also named the 2024 Pac-12 Men's Track Athlete of the Year. He ran 44.90 to place fourth in the 400m final at the NCAA Championships to earn All-America honors. He also earned All-America honors with USC's 4x400m relay which placed eighth. After the season, he reached the 400m semifinals at the U.S. Olympic Trials. During the indoor season he had a 400m PR of 46.20 at the Arkansas Qualifier on Feb. 16 to move into ninth on USC's all-time indoor 400m list. He earned indoor All-America honors with the 4x400m relay which placed seventh at the NCAA Indoor Championships with a time of 3:04.67, which ranks fourth on USC's all-time indoor relay list. He also ran on the 4x400m relay which clocked of 3:03.14 to win at the Eagle Elite Invitational on Feb. 10, which ranks as the second-fastest all-time by the Trojans. He also ran on the sixth-fastest 4x400m relay in school history earlier in the season and now has competed on six of USC's all-time best indoor 4x400m relay teams.

**2023:** Blockburger placed second in the 400m at the Pac-12 Championships with his best time as a Trojan of 44.80, which ranks eighth on USC's all-time outdoor 400m list...his streak of two consecutive Pac-12 400m titles was snapped, as he was edged by teammate William Jones. Blockburger was injured following Pac-12s and could not run at the NCAA Championships. He set his indoor 400m PR of 46.58 in placing second at the Arkansas Qualifier running 46.58 on Feb. 17, which moved him to ninth on USC's all-time indoor 400m list. He also recorded a personal best in the 60m at the Cougar Classic, running 6.83 in the prelims on Jan. 13. He anchored USC's 4x400m relay which placed third at the NCAA Indoor Championships to garner All-America honors with a time of 3:03.16, second on USC's all-time indoor list.

**2022:** Won his second consecutive Pac-12 400m title with a time of 45.19 on May 15...also placed 8th in the 200m and anchored USC's Pac-12 title-winning 4x100m (38.60) and 4x400m (3:03.39) relays. Advanced fifth out of the West Regional in the 400m with a season-best time of 45.14 on May 27. Ran the anchor leg for USC's 4x100m relay which won the NCAA title and set the USC record with a time of 38.49 on June 10...also anchored the 4x400m relay which placed second with a time of 2:59.98, which ranks second on the Trojans' all-time list. Ran his 200m PR of 20.67 (+0.8) to place second at the Trojan Invitational on March 19. Reached the semifinals in the 400m at the USATF Championships and finished 13th with a time of 45.67 on June 24.

**PRIOR TO USC:** Blockburger was the 2021 Pac-12 400m dash champion with a time of 45.57 and was named the Pac-12 Men's Freshman of the Year. He set the Arizona school record and posted a personal-best time of 44.71 to win the 400m title at the Jim Click Shootout on April 10. Blockburger ranked No. 6 among NCAA runners in the 400m during the regular season and was the only freshman to run a sub-45.0 time in the 400m dash. Blockburger was called "the 400m Find of 2021" by Track and Field News and finished 12th in that distance at the NCAA Championships, one of three freshman to reach the semifinals. Blockburger also qualified for the U.S. Olympic Team Trials in the 400m.

**THIS YEAR:** Senior Johnny Brackins Jr. is in his third season on the USC track and field team, after transferring from Baylor. He ranks fifth on USC's all-time outdoor long jump list and sixth on its 110m hurdles list. He also is the school indoor long jump record holder and ranks second on the USC all-time 60m hurdles list.

**2024:** Brackins Jr. won the 110m hurdles with a time of 13.52 (-1.8) and placed fourth in the long jump with a mark of 24-11.75/7.61 (-0.6) at the Pac-12 Championships from May 10-12. He went on to place fourth in the long jump and ninth in the 110m hurdles at the NCAA Outdoor Championships to earn first-team All-America honors in the long jump and second-team in the hurdles. Brackins Jr. then placed fourth in the long jump at the U.S. Olympic Trials with a personal-best jump of 26-9.75/8.17m (+1.9) which moved him into fifth place on USC's all-time list. He ran a 110h hurdles PR of 13.37 (+0.2) in the NCAA Championships semifinal which moved him to second on USC's all-time list. He placed second in the 60m hurdles with a time of 7.57 and fourth in the long jump with a leap of 26-3.50 (8.01m) to earn All-America honors in both events at the 2024 NCAA Indoor Championships on March 8-9. Brackins Jr. also set the school record in the indoor long jump with a leap of 27-0.00 (8.23m) to win the event at USATF Indoor Championships on Feb. 17, breaking the record which had stood for 34 years. Brackins Jr. also ran 7.55 in the 60m hurdles to win at the Ken Shannon Last Chance Meet on Feb. 23, moving into second on USC's all-time 60m hurdles list.


**2023:** Brackins Jr. won the Pac-12 long jump title on May 13 with a wind-aided PR of 27-2.75/8.30m (+4.0w). He also matched a season best with a jump of 26-4.25/8.03m (+0.9) in the long jump rounds at Pac-12s, which ranks fifth on USC's all-time long jump list. He also placed second in the 110m hurdles with a time of 13.75 (-1.3) at the Pac-12 Championships. Brackins Jr. also led off for USC's winning 4x100m relay and was named the Outstanding Male Athlete of the Meet as he earned 22.0 points. He reached the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds and competed at the USATF Championships in the long jump. He advanced to the NCAA Semifinals in the 110m hurdles, running a PR of 13.51 (+1.7) in the Quarterfinals. He ranked second in the 60m hurdles enters the NCAA Indoor Championships, running 7.60 at the Ken Shannon Last Chance and Arkansas Qualifier meets, which ranks tied for second on USC's all-time 60m H list. He earned All-America honors indoors in the long jump with an indoor PR of 26-9.25/8.16m to place fifth at the NCAA Indoor Championships.

**BEFORE USC:** Brackins competed for Baylor his freshman year in 2022. He won the 2022 Big 12 long jump title with a PR of 26-5.50/8.06m and placed third in the 110m hurdles with a PR of 13.62. He advanced to the NCAA Championships in both events and earned honorable mention All-America honors. Indoors, he earned All-America honors in the long jump, placing seventh with a leap of 24-11.25/7.60m at the NCAA Indoor Championships. This summer he earned a bronze medal with USA's 4x100m relay team and placed sixth in the long jump at the World Athletics U20 Championships. Brackins Jr. also has a best indoor triple jump of 51-5.75 (15.69m) and outdoor PR of 50-0.00 (15.24m).


**2024:** Broderick had an outstanding first season as a Trojan, setting the USC freshman discus throw record with a mark of 204-6 (62.34m) at the Beach Opener on March 2...that throw moved him to second on USC's all-time discus throw list, behind only the mark of 206-0 (62.78m) set by Gary Carlsen in 1967. He won the USC-UCLA Dual Meet discus throw title with a mark of 198-1 (60.39m) on April 27 and placed third in the shot put with a PR of 52-7.50 (16.04m) on April 28. Broderick won the Pac-12 discus throw title with a mark of 192-5 (58.65m) on May 12. He earned first-team All-America honors by placing second at the NCAA Championships with a discus throw of 202-8 (61.77m), the only underclassman to score in the event. He became the first Trojan to score in the discus throw since Aaron Dan in 2010 (5th) and the first USC freshman to score in the event since Darrell Elder in 1975. Broderick's second-place finish in the event was the highest by a Trojan since Ralph Fruguglietti also placed second with a throw of 202-0 in 1977, which was the previous best mark by a Trojan in the final before Broderick's mark. Broderick competed at the Jamaica Championships and placed fifth with a discus throw of 201-0 (61.27m). He did not compete during the indoor season.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Broderick is a 2023 graduate of Jamaica College High in Kingston, Jamaica. He has a discus throw personal best of 189-5 (57.74m) which he set in placing seventh at the Jamaican Athletics Championships on July 8, 2023. 



He then finished 16th in the event with a throw of 210-9 (64.25m) at the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds on May 25. Indoors, he placed seventh in the weight throw with a PR of 64-10.50 (19.77m) which is the USC freshman record and ranks fourth on the Trojans' all-time list. During the summer he placed fourth in the hammer throw (6K) with a mark of 249-9 (76.16m) at the World Athletics U20 Championships.

He was the 2020 U18 world leader in the hammer throw with a mark of 260-10 (79.52m) in the 5K hammer...that throw was achieved at the Throws Festival in Tripoli, Greece and was over two meters farther than the next best mark in the world in 2020. He also had a then 6K hammer throw best of 242-2 (73.83m) to win the U20 hammer throw at the 37th Thodia Meeting on June 13, 2021 in Tripoli. His regulation 16-pound hammer throw best is 222-3 (67.76m) on June 5, 2021 to place fifth at the Greece Championships held at Pampeloponnisiako Stadium. He was the 2020 and 2021 national champion in his age group in the hammer throw.

## USC REMEMBERS KATHERINE B. LOKER

Katherine Bogdanovich Loker who passed away on June 26, 2008 at the age of 92 was associated with USC for more than 60 years. A member of the Class of 1940, she was an English major and a star runner on the track team. She married stage and screen actor Donald P. Loker, whose professional name was Don Terry and who later served as an executive in the StarKist Foods Company, the firm founded by Katherine's father in 1917.

Katherine and her husband gave more than \$30 million to the university, placing them among the top individual benefactors in USC history. Together they were the principal benefactors of what is now the USC Loker Hydrocarbon Research Institute, where their support was instrumental in enabling Distinguished Professor George A. Olah to complete the research that led to his winning the 1994 Nobel Prize in Chemistry. Katherine was also a strong supporter of USC athletics, particularly track and field, which named its new stadium in her honor, and of the USC School of Theatre, where she established the Donald P. Loker Action Fellowship in memory of her beloved husband.

Katherine was elected an honorary trustee of USC in 2000. She received an honorary degree from USC in 1998 and USC's highest honor, the Presidential Medallion, in 2006. She was also the recipient of the Alumni Association's highest honor, and the Dean's Medallion for the USC College of Letters, Arts and Sciences.

She was a Presidential Associate, a member of the Board of Councilors of the USC College of Letters, Arts and Sciences, a life member of Town and Gown, and a member of the San Diego Trojan League. In 2005 she was inducted into the USC Athletic Hall of Fame and received its Spirit Award. In 2006 she received the USC Track and Field Heritage Award.

Katherine Loker's steadfast support of higher education extended beyond the University of Southern California. She served on the Committee of University Resources at Harvard and received the Harvard

Medal in 1995 and an honorary degree in 2000. She also served as a life member of the Advisory Board of California State University, Dominguez Hills, where she received an honorary degree in 1999; a trustee and foundation member of the California Science Center of Los Angeles; a foundation executive board member of the Nixon Presidential Library in Yorba Linda; and a founding member of the Los Angeles Music Center. She was an active supporter of the Donald P. Loker Cancer Treatment Center at the California Hospital Medical Center, Los Angeles.

### Loker Award Established

For years the Trojans have honored the top male track and field athlete with the Cromwell Award and in 2012 the Loker Award has been established to honor USC's most outstanding female athlete. The award is being created to pay tribute to Katherine B. Loker, longtime USC track and field supporter who passed away in 2008.

The USC track shown here just after the new surface was laid down. USC's Cromwell Field and Loker Stadium both underwent significant renovations over the winter break in preparation for the 2013 track and field season. Both the track and the infield were replaced and the exterior of Loker Stadium received a facelift.

USC installed a brand new Bynon BSS 2000 track, the same kind used at Hayward Field in Oregon, the site of the 2012 Olympic Trials and home to the 2014 NCAA Championships. In addition, a new all-weather Field Turf Revolution was installed in the infield of the track.

Also, the exterior of Loker Stadium, the fences and signs were repainted and the water fountains replaced. The landscaping was upgraded and new jumping pits and runways were added. In addition, new fiber was brought into the venue to provide an upgraded sight for broadcasts with the conference championships being televised by the Pac-12 Network.

The last time USC hosted the conference meet before 2013 was in 2003 and they hosted again in 2021.


## The Story of USC's Unmatched Track & Field History

USC is well known as one of the most successful athletic programs in the history of the NCAA, with 133 men's and women's national championships. The Trojans have won far more NCAA team and individual titles combined than any other university. However, the most dominant force in USC's slate of athletic programs is not the baseball team (12 College World Series titles) or the football squad (nine national championships) but the men's track and field program, with an unprecedented 28 NCAA titles (2 indoor), including nine straight from 1935-43. The Trojan women have now joined the men's program with national titles in 2001, 2018 and 2021. Quincy Watts took over leadership of USC's program in June of 2021 and the success is expected to continue to grow.

Trojan athletes have dominated the track and field scene for decades. From the exploits of sprinter Charlie Paddock and thrower Clarence "Bud" Houser in the 1920s and 1930s, sprinter Mel Patton in the 1940s, thrower Parry O'Brien in the 1950s, sprinter Lennox Miller and pole vaulter Bob Seagren in the 1960s, sprinter Quincy Watts in the 1980s, to four-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss (only the fifth collegian to win four in a row) in the 1990s and World Champion hurdler Felix Sanchez in the 2000s, USC is synonymous with track and field excellence.

### THE CROMWELL YEARS: 1909-1948

The roots of Troy's preeminence date back to 1926, when coach Dean Cromwell brought the first NCAA track and field cham-

pionship to USC. Cromwell, who led the Trojans from 1909-48, also served as head coach of the football team for five seasons.

However, the foundation he laid was not on the gridiron but the cinderpaths. Cromwell's track squads won 12 NCAA championships and featured 34 NCAA individual champions. In addition, Cromwell was unanimously selected as headcoach of the victorious 1948 U.S. Olympic team, a group which featured five Trojans (Mel Patton, Bob Chambers, Roland Sink, Wilbur Thopson and Cliff Bourland). In fact, Patton, Thomson and Bourland brought home gold medals in their respective events from London, the Olympic site.

From 1935-43, USC experienced a streak of unequalled track and field success. No other university has come close to matching Troy's string of nine consecutive NCAA championships, all under Cromwell's watchful eye. Nicknamed the "Maker of Champions," he fashioned Trojan athletes into a powerhouse. At the 1936 Olympics in

Berlin, USC trackmen scored enough points (37 1/2) to have finished among the top five in the world. Cromwell's influence extended far beyond the USC campus to the corners of the world. He personally tutored champions in every Olympic Games from 1912 to 1948, and upon his retirement in 1949, "The Dean" remained involved as a regular figure in various Southland sporting events until his death in 1962.

### TWO JESSES, NINE NATIONAL TITLES: 1949-1961

Jess Hill and Jess Mortensen, both integral parts of USC's proud athletic heritage, carried the track and field torch after Cromwell's retirement. Both men are still considered among the finest all-around athletes in USC history, and their accomplishments did not end after their playing days were over.

Hill, who lettered in three sports at USC (football, baseball and track), served as head coach of Troy's track and field program in 1949 and 1950, leading the Trojans to an undefeated season and national championship in both seasons. From 1951-56, Hill coached the football team, and in 1957, he began his tenure as USC athletic director, a position he held until 1972.

Mortensen's reign at USC also began as an undergraduate. The talented athlete lettered in track, basketball and football, winning the NCAA javelin title as a junior. After a 14-year coaching stint at Riverside Junior College, he returned to become coach of the Trojan track and field team in 1951, leading Troy to seven NCAA championships in his 11-year tenure. Mortensen's Trojan teams never lost a dual meet, going 79-0 between 1951 and 1961. He developed some of Troy's best-known trackmen, including Parry O'Brien and Max Truex. Sadly, "Mort" died suddenly at the age of 54 from complications caused by a blood clot. Hill, his longtime friend and teammate, stepped in as interim head coach for the 1962 season, and a new chapter in Trojan track and field history was about to begin.



## THE WOLFE YEARS: 1963-1984

The prospect of succeeding three consecutive coaching legends would be a difficult task for anyone, but Vern Wolfe answered the challenge.

During his 22 years at the helm of the Trojan track and field program, USC captured five outdoor NCAA championships, including back-to-back titles in 1967 and 1968. A pole vaulter for Cromwell's Trojan teams, Wolfe also won indoor titles in 1967 and 1972. At the time of his retirement in 1984, he was the third-winningest coach in U.S. track history, all despite reductions in scholarships and the lack of a top-flight on-campus facility.

Wolfe, who competed in senior events as a pole vaulter, attacked all problems with a straight-ahead approach. He continued to win throughout his career and towards the end oversaw the modernization of Cromwell Field, USC's track facility which served as a training site for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. And so, after 21 years on the job, Wolfe retired and gave way to Ernie Bullard.

## BULLARD AND BUSH: 1985-94

Another in the line of former Trojan athletes to become head coaches at USC, Ernie Bullard came to Troy from San Jose State, where he helped build the Spartans into a national contender. It didn't take long for Bullard to continue Troy's winning ways, recruiting athletes like sprinter Quincy Watts, a two-time gold medalist at the 1992 Olympic Games.

Jim Bush was the man picked to replace longtime friend Bullard in 1991. After all, who better to rebuild the USC program than the man who guided UCLA to five national championships?

Bush helped stabilize the program and recruited some of Troy's stars, like Balazs Kiss of Hungary, the 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996 NCAA champion in the hammer throw. Consequently, he helped lay the foundation for the latest in the distinguished line of Trojan head track coaches: Ron Allice.

## RON ALLICE: 1995-2013

Ron Allice, who prior to the 1995 season was named the Director of Track and Field for USC's combined men's and women's program, was no stranger to success. He distinguished himself at every level of competition, all in the Southland, and is well-known not only as a master builder, but a man who can keep a

program at the highest level year after year.

Allice came to Troy with impeccable credentials: 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach (Calif.) City College, where his 1980 squad was called "the best junior college team in history" by Track & Field News. During his tenure at Long Beach C.C., his teams lost just one dual meet.

He quickly went to work, guiding the USC men's team to a fourth-place finish at the 1995 NCAA Outdoor Championships. In 1996, his Women of Troy won their first-ever Pac-10 title. In 1997, he led the Trojan men's team to its first Pac-10 title since 1977 and a third-place showing at the 1997 NAAs. In 1999, the men won their second Pac-10 title in three years. At the NAAs, the women finished third and the men fifth (as a combined men's and women's program, this was the best finish in school history). In 2000, the men finished seventh--their seventh consecutive top 10 finish--while the women placed second--their highest finish ever. In 2001, Allice guided the Women of Troy to their first-ever NCAA team championship. In 2003, he led the men's team to a third-place finish, with three Trojans winning NCAA titles.

Allice's troops continued the winning ways, being the only school in the country to have both the men's and women's programs finish in the top 10 from 2005-07. In fact, four times between 2005-09 USC accomplished that feat with the only blemish being an 11th place finish by the women's team in 2008.

The Trojans also dominated at the Regional and conference level with the men's team capturing four regional titles and the women's team tying for one seven seasons, while the men earned one more Pac-10 title in 2006.

Allice retired after guiding the USC men's team to a fifth-place finish and the women's team to a 21st-place finish at the 2013 NCAA Championships. Bryshon Nellum in the 400m and Reggie Wyatt in the 400m IH both won individual titles. Allice guided the USC men's teams to a top 10 finish 14 times and the women's team to a top 10 finish 11 times.

Allice had a career dual meet record of 218-50-1 at five schools, and coached more than 286 first-team All-Americans, 32 individual NCAA champions, 54 Olympians, four world record holders and 7 American record holders.

## CARYL SMITH GILBERT: 2013-2021

Caryl Smith Gilbert took over the program on June 17, 2013 and led the men's team to a fourth-place tie and the women to a 16th-place tie at the 2014 NCAA Championships in her

first season. She also guided both teams to a second-place finish at the Pac-12 Championships. Throw in the women's indoor MPSF conference title and it is easy to see that the program was in good hands for future success.

In her second season USC's men placed 5th and the women 7th at the NAAs, as well as the women capturing the MPSF indoor title again. The teams both took second one again at the conference meet. They also combined to set four USC outdoor records and set four Trojan freshman outdoor marks. Despite a slew of injuries, the USC women tied for 9th and the men were 12th at the 2016 NCAA Championships and Randall Cunningham won the NCAA high jump title. Four more USC outdoor records were established and Smith Gilbert guided the men to the MPSF indoor team title. In 2017 USC's men and women placed second at the Pac-12 Championships and the women finished third at NAAs, their highest finish since 2006 and their 43 points were the team's most since 2002. 2018 was a banner year for the Trojans as the women's team captured the NCAA title in dramatic fashion in the meet's final race - the 4x400m - edging Georgia by one point. The men's team placed fourth, but along the way set three collegiate records - Michael Norman in the 400m, Rai Benjamin in the 400m H and the pair along with Ricky Morgan Jr. and Zach Shinnick in the 4x400m relay. The women's team also captured its first conference crown since 1996. The men's and women's team won MPSF indoor conference team titles and swept the USC-UCLA Dual Meet. Indoors the men took second and the women seventh at the 2018 NCAA Indoor Championships.

In 2019 the women won their second consecutive Pac-12 title and finished runner-up at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships. Annelus in the 200m, Terry in the 200m & the 4x100m relay set school records at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. The men's team placed fifth at the Pac-12 Championships, 17th indoors and 37th outdoors. Ayden Owens set the school record in the decathlon. The 2020 season had great promise but was cancelled due to COVID-19. Before things were shutdown, the USC women's team was taking a No. 2 ranking and the men a No. 11 ranking to the NCAA Indoor Championships. USC didn't let the shutdown slow the momentum as the women won its third national title in 2021, led by Anna Cockrell's hurdles double and the men placed fifth behind the first men's 800m title in school history set by Isaiah Jewett.

Longtime decorated assistant, school record-holder and Olympic hero Quincy Watts took over the reigns to the program on June 17, 2021 and began the Trojans on a new path to glory. In 2024, he led both programs to top 10 finishes at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

She also set her PR and moved to ninth on USC's indoor 200m list with a time of 23.10 at the New Mexico Classic on Feb. 3.

**2022:** Moody competed during the outdoor season. She was injured early, then came back late to help the Trojans in the postseason. Moody opened her season by winning the 200m with a time of 23.43 (-0.8) at the Trojan Invitational on March 19. Opened eyes at the Texas Relays by running a wind-aided 11.08 in the 100m to place third at the Texas Relays on March 26...the day before in the prelims she set her legal PR of 11.24 (+1.2). She did not run again until May 13 at the Pac-12 Championships, where she came in 14th in the 200m with a time of 24.24 (+0.6). She set her 200m PR of 23.25 (+1.0) in the NCAA West Prelims, but did not run in the quarterfinal. She 17th in the 100m dash at the NCAA West Prelims on May 28 with a time of 11.21 (+2.6w). Was inserted into the 4x100m relay in the semifinals and the team finished 10th with a season-best time of 43.32.



# WOMEN OF TROY CROSS COUNTRY

## THE 2024 SEASON

The USC women's cross country program had a strong season in its first year as a member of the Big Ten and its first under the guidance of new associate head coach for cross country and assistance track and field coach Milton Mallard. Four different runners led the Trojans in their five meets and three runners set their 6K personal bests.

The team began the season with a third-place finish at the Waves Invitational (4K) on Aug. 20 led by Gigi Maccagnini's seventh-place finish. She finished more than a minute faster than she did on the same course the previous season and most of the Trojan women set their 4K bests. USC had only five runners compete at the 6K Dave Murray Invitational on Sept. 28 and placed seventh, led by Helena Teixeira-Dasilva.

Jacqueline Duarte ran a personal-best 6K time to lead the Trojans at the Highlander Invitational on Oct. 19. Nearly all six Trojan runners finish among the top half of competitors. Teixeira-Dasilva again led USC at the team's first Big Ten Championships on Nov. 1. At the NCAA West Regional, Leah Disher was USC's leading runner, with two of the Trojans' five runners posting a 6K personal best.

The team also excelled in the classroom once again with the squad earning USTFCCCA All-Academic honors in the fall. Trojans which earned Fall Big Ten All-Academic Team selection were Leah Disher, Jacqueline Duarte, Gigi Maccagnini, Giovanna Pisano and Haley Spoden.





# KATHERINE B. LOKER STADIUM

Home of USC Track and Field



Katherine B. Loker Stadium was made possible by a generous donation from Katherine B. Loker. The 3,000-seat stadium opened in the 2001 season and was dedicated on May 5 during that year's USC-UCLA dual meet. The track and stadium underwent renovations in 2020 prior to the Trojans hosting the 2021 Pac-12 Championships. The facility includes track offices, locker rooms, an athlete lounge and meeting rooms. Loker Stadium also hosted the 2003 Pac-10 Championships, the first time a conference meet had ever been held on the USC campus, and the 2013 Pac-10 Championships.
