


WEEKLY TRACK AND FIELD RELEASE - June 11, 2025

THIS WEEK - The USC Track and Field team will compete at the 2025 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships to be held at historic Hayward Field in Eugene, Ore. from June 11-14. The top 24 athletes in the country, 12 in each event from both the East & West Preliminary Rounds, have advanced to the championships. The USC men's team is seeking to become the first school to win the men's NCAA Indoor and Outdoor team titles in the same year since Oregon in 2015. A men's program has won both titles in the same season only twice before.

SO YOU'RE SAYING THERE'S A CHANCE...: The USC men's team has earned 17 berths at the NCAA Championships, 15 in individual events and the 4x100m and 4x400m relays. The Trojan women have earned 12 berths at the NCAA Chamionships, 10 in individual events, plus both relays. The USC men's team has the most chances to score points, while the women's 12 opportunities are the fourth most. USC's combined 29 scoring opportunities are more than any other school has qualified for the championships.

USC AT THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS -- The USC men's track and field program has won 26 NCAA outdoor titles, more than double the next-best school Arkansas, which has won 10. USC won a record 9-straight titles from 1935-43. The men's last team title was in 1976. The USC women's team won the 2021 team title and has won it three times overall (also 2018 & 2001). USC's men have placed in the top 10 in 19 of the last 29 seasons. USC's women have finished in the top 10 in 18 of the last 29 seasons. At least one Trojan man or woman has won an individual NCAA outdoor title in 24 of the last 32 championships.

WHERE TO WATCH THE MEET: The 2025 NCAA Track and Field Championships will be televised on ESPN, ESPN2 and streamed on ESPN+. On June 11, the first day of the men's championship, ESPN will begin coverage at 4:00 p.m. On June 12, the first day of the women's competition, ESPN will begin coverage at 4:00 p.m. On June 13, the men's finals, coverage on ESPN2 will begin at 5:00 p.m. On June 14, the women's finals, coverage on ESPN2 begins at 6:00 p.m. All times are Pacific. The field events will be streamed on ESPN+

USC ATHLETES QUALIFIED TO NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC has 24 athletes traveling to represent the Trojans at the NCAA Championships. USC has qualified seven women for 12 positions and 11 men for 17 spots at the 2025 NCAA Championships. USC has a combined 16 entrants in the 100m and 200m (8 women, 8 men):

ROARING AROUND THE TRACK: USC's women's 4x100m relay team posted an NCAA-leading time of 42.36 to win the Mt. SAC Relays Elite competition, which is 0.37 seconds faster than the next team on the NCAA descending order list. USC's time of 42.36 is the second-fastest in school history and currently ranks eighth in the world. USC's relay time is the second-fastest pre-NCAA Championships 4x100m time since the beginning of the 2019 season (2023 Texas, 41.89 at the Big 12 Championships). USC matched that time at the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds.

MEN SET SCHOOL RELAY RECORD: Travis Williams, Max Thomas, Garrett Kaalund & Edward Nketia won the men's 4x100m relay at the Texas A&M 44 Farms Team Invitational on April 12 with a school-record time of 38.41. USC set the meet and E.B. Cushing Stadium record and broke the previous USC record of 38.49 set in 2022.

THINGS ARE BRIGHT WITH WHYTE: Sophomore Madison Whyte tied the USC record of 22.16 (held by Angie Annelus) in the 200m at the NCAA Quarterfinals on May 31. That time currently ranks sixth in the world and set the Texas A&M E.B. Cushing Stadium record. She also ran a time of 50.78 to win the 400m at the USC-UCLA Dual Meet on May 4 which ranks fourth on USC's all-time list. Whyte also ran on USC's 4x400m relay which won at the Dual Meet on May 4 with a time of 3:27.72, which led the Big Ten. Whyte then won the 200m and 400m and anchored the meet-clinching 4x400m relay at the Big Ten Championships May 16-18.

RANKINGS - The men's team enters the week ranked No. 1 and the women's team No. 2. The men's team's No. 1 rankings this season are its first since the USTFCCCA started compiling rankings in 2008. The four times this season both teams have been ranked in the top two in the country are the first for USC in the rankings history.

USC TRACK AND FIELD HISTORY - USC track and field is well known as one of the most successful athletic programs in the history of the NCAA, with 32 men's and women's national team titles. The Trojans have won far more NCAA team and individual titles combined than any other university. However, the most dominant force in USC's slate of athletic programs is not the baseball team (12 College World Series titles) or the football squad (nine national championships) but the men's track and field program, with an unprecedented 29 NCAA titles (including nine straight, 1935-43). In fact, in the history of the NCAA, only the Oklahoma State wrestling program (34) has more national titles than USC men's outdoor track and field. Trojan athletes have dominated the track and field scene for decades. From the exploits of sprinter Charlie Paddock and thrower Clarence "Bud" Houser in the 1920s and 1930s, sprinter Mel Patton in the 1940s, thrower Parry O'Brien in the 1950s, sprinter Lennox Miller and pole vaulter Bob Seagren in the 1960s, sprinter Quincy Watts in the 1980s, to four-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss (only the fifth collegian to win four in a row) in the 1990s, World Champion hurdler Felix Sanchez early in the 2000s, and NCAA champion and Olympic medalist Andre DeGrasse, and NCAA champions and collegiate record-holders Rai Benjamin and Michael Norman, USC is synonymous with track and field excellence. In 2024, Balasz Kiss was inducted into T&F Collegiate Athlete Hall of Fame.

TROJAN PROGRAM REMAINS IN GOOD HANDS WITH QUINCY WATTS - Former Trojan Olympic great Quincy Watts was promoted to USC Director of Track and Field and Cross Country on June 17, 2021 after eight seasons on Caryl Smith Gilbert's staff as an assistant in charge of sprints, long hurdles and relays. In his 11 seasons working with USC athletes, he has guided Trojans to 158 indoor and outdoor All-America honors in the 400 meters, 400-meter hurdles and 4x400-meter relay and since he has become the head coach, USC has garnered 101 first-team All-American honors. His Trojan athletes also claimed 22 NCAA titles, 39 Pac-12 crowns and 8 Big Ten individual titles. They have also set three collegiate records and 32 school records plus all four USC freshman 400-meter records and the women's 400-meter hurdles freshman record. In 2024, Watts led the men's team to a third-place finish outdoors and the women's team to a 10th-place tie. During the indoor season the men tied for seventh and the women tied for eighth. USC accumulated a combined 30 outdoor and indoor All-America honors, with Jasmine Jones winning the indoor 60m hurdles title and the outdoor 400m hurdles titles, both with school records, and JC Stevenson winning the men's outdoor long jump title. Both the men's and women's teams placed second at the Pac-12 Championships, with Trojans claiming 11 total event titles. During the summer, USC once again stood out at the Olympics with USC athletes winning nine medals, including five gold. The total medals were more than any other collegiate program in track and field. In his first four seasons leading the USC program he has led both the men's and women's teams to a top 10 outdoor finish and a top 10 finish indoors. This indoor season, the men's team won its first title since 1972 and the women's team placed third.

Watts also continues coaching USA Olympic medalists Michael Norman, Rai Benjamin and Kendall Ellis. Norman won gold medals in the 400m and with the USA 4x400m relay team and Benjamin a silver medal in the 400m hurdles at the 2022 World Athletics Championships. Benjamin then won two gold medals at the 2024 Paris Olympics (400m H and 4x400m).

TROJANS' OLYMPIC GLORY - USC athletes of the present and past won won nine medals at the 2024 Paris Olympics, five gold, one silver and three bronze. The nine track and field medals won are tied for the second-most medals won by the Trojans in a single Olympics (also nine at 2016 Rio Games), trailing only the 13 won by Trojans at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. This was the sixth consecutive Summer Olympics in which a USC track and field athlete earned at least one gold medal and a Trojan track and field athlete has won at least one medal in every Olympics since 1912. Trojans earning medals in track and field at the 2024 Paris Olympics were: Rai Benjamin (Gold – M-4v00m H, Gold – M-4x400m), Aaron Brown (Gold – M-4x100m), Anna Cockrell (Silver – W-400m H), Andre De Grasse (Gold – M-4x100m), Yemi John (Bronze – W-4x400m), TeeTee Terry (Gold – W-4x100m), Nicole Yeargin (Bronze – Mixed 4x400m, Bronze – W-4x400m).

FRECH SHINES AT THE 2024 PARIS PARALYMPICS - USC freshman Erza Frech won the T63 high jump gold medal and the T63 100m dash at the 2024 Paralympics in Paris, France. Frech won the high jump gold medal on Sept. 3 with his first-attempt clearance at 6-4.25 (1.94m), which is a new Paralympics record. He then tried to better his own T63 high jump world record of 6-5.50 (1.97m) by raising the bar to 6-6.00 (1.98m), but narrowly missed keeping the bar on at that height. The T63 designation is the classification for athletes with a single-leg amputation above the knee. He won the T63 100m dash title with a time of 12.06 on Sept. 2. Earlier in the games, Frech placed fifth in the men's T63 long jump final on Aug. 31 with a best jump of 21-7.25/6.58m (+0.9). Frech is the inaugural Swim With Mike Scholarship recipient of the Amir Ekbatani Paralympic Scholarship, awarded to a Paralympian attending USC or UCLA. He is in his first semester at USC where he is seeking a bachelor's degree in Business of Cinematic Arts.

ALL-STAR COACHING STAFF - Olympic gold medalist Quincy Watts has put together an impressive coaching staff that looks like an all-star roster. two-time Olympian Martin Maric (throws), John Bolton (sprints), Karl Goodman (sprints), Jeff Petersmeyer (jumps and multi events) and added this season, Stephanie Williams (sprints/hurdles), Brenton Emanuel (sprints/hurdles) and Milton Mallard (distances).

REGULAR SEASON INDOOR MEET RECAPS

SPOKANE SPORTS SHOWCASE: The Trojans won nine events, set a school record, a facility record and posted two NCAA-leading times at the Spokane Sports Showcase in Spokane, Wash. on Jan. 17. Johnny Brackins Jr. set the USC 60m hurdles record with a time of 7.49 and Johnnie Blockburger set The Podium facility record with a time of 20.69 in the men's 200m dash. Trojans winning events at the meet were: Johnnie Blockburger (M-200m), Johnny Brackins Jr. (M-60m H), Dajaz DeFrand (W-60m), William Jones (M-600m), Gigi Maccagnini (W-1000m), Christine M. Mallard (W-300m), Alfredo Reina Corona (M-3000m), JC Stevenson (M-LJ) and Max Thomas (M-60m).

RED RAIDER INVITE: The USC track and field team had another outstanding day at the track winning seven events, setting or matching three school records and registering one Trojan freshman record at the Red Raider Invite held at the Sports Performance Center in Lubbock, Texas on Jan. 24. JC Steveson tied the USC men's 60m record, Yemi John set the Trojan women's 600-yard record, Williams Jones set the USC men's 600-yard record and Ashley Erasmus set the Trojan woman's indoor freshman shot put record. In all, USC athletes combined to post 10 all-time Trojan top 10 times or marks today.

COLLEGIATE CLASSIC: USC athletes won six events (4 men, 2 women) at the Collegiate Classic held at the Albuquerque Convention Center on Feb. 7-8. Johnnie Blockburger won the men's 200m (20.34) and 400m (45.45), the 200m time being the world indoor lead at the time and moving him to tied for second on USC's all-time list. JC Stevenson won the men's long jump with the NCAA-leading jump of 26-9.75, Nathan Cumberbatch won the 800m with a time of 1:49.04 and the 4x400m relay won with the 4th-fastest time in school history of 3:03.57. Yemi John won the women's 400m with a time of 52.24.

TIGER PAW INVITATIONAL: Johnny Brackins Jr. won the men's 60m hurdles with a new school record and NCAA-leading time of 7.48. Elias Gerald took second in the men's HJ with a PR clearance of 7-3.25 (2.22m) to fourth on USC's all-time list. Temi Ojora opened her indoor season with a triple jump of 44-6.25 (13.57m) to take third and move to fourth on the NCAA descending order list.

MEN'S TEAM WINS NCAA INDOOR TITLE, WOMEN TAKE THIRD: The USC men's team won the team title and the women's team placed third at the 2025 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships held at the Virginia Beach Sports Center in Virginia Beach, Va. on March 14-15. Junior Dajaz DeFrand was the only individual event-winner, taking home the crown in the women's 60m dash. USC was one of two schools to have both the men's and women's teams finish in the top three and its 74 combined points were more than any other program. The USC men's team title was its third NCAA Indoor team title in program history and its first since the 1972 season (also won in 1967). The men used a complete team effort to win the team title, as they did not win any individual events. The women's team's third-place finish was its highest since it placed second in 2019 and the 35 points scored were its most since also scoring 35 points to place fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships in 2021.

MEN'S TEAM REACHES NEW HEIGHTS: The USC men's team was ranked No. 1 indoors on Feb. 11. The No. 1 ranking was the team's highest indoor ranking since the USTFCCCA began indoor rankings in 2008. When the men's team was ranked No. 1 outdoors on April 22, it was the first time holding the top position for USC since the rankings began in 2008.

USC WOMEN WIN BIG TEN T&F TITLE, MEN FOURTH: The USC women's team clinched its first Big Ten Outdoor Track & Field team title by winning the 4x400m relay to close out the meet and the men's team placed fourth at the Trojans' first Big Ten conference meet held at Hayward Field in Eugene, Ore. from May 16-18. USC's women scored 121 points and the men's team scored 78 points. USC's women scored 12 of their points on the final day, after beginning the day in ninth place. The men's team climbed up the standings to fourth after beginning the day in 11th place. Sophomore Madison Whyte starred for the Trojan women, winning the 200m, 400m and anchoring the meet-clinching 4x400m relay. Whyte was responsible for 22.5 points scored by the Trojans. The USC women's sprinters scored 80 total points in the 100m, 200m and 400m races.

TROJANS EARN BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS HONORS: USC Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts was named Women's Coach of the Big Ten Championships and Madison Whyte was named Women's Track Athlete of the Championships by a vote of conference coaches on May 21. Watts led the USC women's team to the Big Ten title in its first year in the conference and was the only Big Ten Championship award winner to be a unanimous selection. The sophomore Whyte was a key part of the Trojans' charge, winning the 200m, 400m and anchoring the winning 4x400m relay. Whyte was responsible for 22.5 points scored by the USC women's team. Whyte won the 200m with a time of 22.66 (+0.9) and the 400m with a time of 51.40. The USC women's 4x400m relay team of Christine M. Mallard, Yemi John, Takiya Cenci and Whyte won with a time of 3:30.16 to clinch the team title on the meet's final event. Whyte was also named as USC's women's sportsmanship winner at the Big Ten Outdoor Track & Field Championships. Junior transfer Garrett Kaalund was named the USC men's sportsmanship winner at the championships.

BRODERICK BREAKS USC RECORD WITH FIRST TOSS OF THE SEASON: USC sophomore Racquil Broderick set the USC men's discus throw record with his first throw of the season of 207-0 (63.09m) to win at the Trojan Invitational on March 21. He broke the longest-standing USC men's record of 206-0 (62.78m) set by Gary Carlsen in 1967, 58 years ago. Carlsen was at the meet to congratulate Broderick and present him with a small statue of a Greek discus thrower. Broderick had thrown over 200 feet in all five meets he's competed in before the Big Ten Championships and had the top throw by a collegian in all of those, winning four titles. Broderick was battling a lower body injury but tried to compete at the Big Tens, posting an opening throw of 180-9 (55.09m) which earned him ninth. He passed on his final four attempts. He ended the regular season ranked ninth among NCAA men's discus throwers.

DYNAMIC DUAL-THREAT DUO: Trojan junior JC Stevenson and senior Johnny Brackins Jr. both earned indoor All-America honors in two events. Stevenson placed sixth in the 60m dash and sixth in the long jump. He set the USC 60m dash record with a time of 6.46 in the NCAA Indoor Championships semifinals. He also led the country with an indoor long jump of 26-9.75 (8.17m). Brackins Jr. placed fourth in the 60m hurdles and eighth in the long jump at the NCAA Indoor Championships. During the indoor season he set the USC record of 7.43 in the 60m hurdles and ranked No. 4 in the long jump. He also placed third in the 60m hurdles at the USATF Indoor Championships with his PR of 7.43.

GARLAND WINS DISCUS THROW AT TRITON INVITE: Sophomore Reese Garland won the women's discus throw with a PR of 181-11 (55.46m) at the Triton Invitational on April 5. That mark was the third-best throw in the Big Ten this season. For her efforts, she was named Big Ten Women's Field Athlete of the Week for April 9. The Oak Park, III. native also took second in the discus throw with a mark of 178-1 (54.30m) at the Battle at the Beach on April 4. She took fourth at the Big Ten Championships with a mark of 179-1 (54.60m).

MOODY & BROCK ARE USC's JACKIE ROBINSON AWARD WINNERS: Sprinters Samirah Moody and Bryce Brock are USC's winners and nominees for the inaugural Big Ten Jackie Robinson Community & Impact Award. Each Big Ten school has two campus winners, one female and one male, and two of the winning student-athletes from the conference schools will be selected as the Big Ten winners for the Jackie Robinson Community and Impact Award, which will be announced shortly. The Big Ten Jackie Robinson Community & Impact Award was created to recognize Big Ten student-athletes who demonstrate Jackie Robinson's core values of "Jackie's nine" of courage, determination, teamwork, persistence, integrity, citizenship, justice, commitment and excellence. Specifically, those student-athletes that have made an exceptional effort in impacting their local community through volunteerism, community programming and/or philanthropy between January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024.

DEFRAND IS DA' ONE: USC junior transfer Dajaz DeFrand won the 2025 NCAA Indoor Championships 60m dash title with a time of 7.09. Her time moved her into a second-place tie on USC's all-time list with Angela Williams and TeeTee Terry, the only other USC women to win the NCAA 60m dash title (Williams -2002, Terry - 2019). DeFrand also placed fourth in the 200m dash final with a time of 22.70, earning first-team All-America honors in both events. DeFrand also won the Big Ten 60m title with a meet-record time of 7.10 and 200m dash title with a PR of 22.62. She was named Women's Athlete of the Big Ten Meet and then was named Big Ten Indoor Women's Track Athlete of the Year on March 19. DeFrand ran 11.00 in the 100m twice at the West Prelims to move to fourth on the Trojans' all-time list. She also ran 22.33 in the 200m which moved her to tied for fifth on USC's all-time list.

KAALUND'S FOUR NOBLE TRUTHS: USC junior transfer sprinter Garrett Kaalund ended the regular season in the NCAA's top four in four different events. He ranked fourth in the 100m (9.93w), third in the 200m (20.05), third in the 400m (44.73) and third as part of USC's 4x100m relay (38.41). Kaalund had the fastest time in the 200m at the NCAA Quarterfinal on May 30, when he ran a PR of 19.85 (+1.1). His time is 0.01 off the school record of 19.84 set by Michael Norman in 2018 and currently ranks third in the world.

BRACKINS JR. IS BACK: Senior hurdler Johnny Brackins Jr. did not open up his outdoor season until the USC-UCLA Dual Meet on May 4. The next week he won the 110m hurdles with a time of 13.53 (+1.7) and the 400m hurdles with a then-PR of 50.11 at the Franson Last Chance Invite on May 10. He also ran 13.48 (+2.2w) in the prelims. In the 400m prelims at the Big Ten Championships, he ran a PR of 50.00, then placed eighth in the final. He also placed third in the 110m hurdles final. Brackins ended the regular season ranked 15th in the 110m hurdles and 20th in the 400m H among NCAA athletes. He was named Big Ten Track Athlete of the Week for May 14. He ran a season-best 13.39 in the 110m hurdles at the NCAA West Prelims and a PR of 49.04 in the 400m hurdles. His 400m hurdles time moved him to eighth on USC's all-time list.

ERASMUS ERASES USC SHOT PUT RECORD...AGAIN!: Ashley Erasmus set the USC freshman women's shot put record with her second throw of the season of 56-10 (17.32m), then broke the school record with a mark of 58-5.75 (17.82m) in her third attempt at the Trojan Invitational on March 22. She bettered her school record with a mark of 58-10 (17.93m) to win at the USC-UCLA Dual Meet on May 4. That mark currently ranks eighth among all NCAA throwers. Erasmus placed third with a mark of 57-9 (17.60m) in the shot put at the Big Ten Championships on May 18. She had won all six of her previous outdoor college shot put competitions. Erasmus also has a PR of 176-11 (53.92m) in the discus throw, which she set at the Texas A&M 44 Farms Invitational on April 12 to move into a seventh-place tie on USC's all-time list in the event. Erasmus is one of two freshman to advance to the NCAA Championships in the women's shot put.

MIDSEASON REINFORCEMENTS: The USC track and field program added a pair of Nebraska transfers this semester in Garrett Kaalund and Brithton Senior. The junior Kaalund jumped in late in the indoor season to help lead USC to the NCAA team title by placing fourth in the 200m and fourth as part of the 4x400m relay. Kaalund competed individually for the first time during the indoor season at the Big Ten Championships and placed second in the 200m with a time of 20.67 on March 1. That time matched his indoor PR, also run in the prelims on Feb. 28. He opened his outdoor season with a 200m PR and NCAA-leading time of 20.05 (+1.4) at the Battle on the Bayou on March 28. The senior hurdler Senior has personal bests of 7.66 in the 60m hurdles, 13.54 in the 110m hurdles and 53.16 in the 400m hurdles. His best time in the 110m hurdles in the outdoor season was 13.58 (+1.0). Unfortunately for Senior, he was injured in the Big Ten 110m hurdles final and had to be scratched from the NCAA West Regionals.

BIG TEN INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS RECAP: It looked like USC had won its first Big Ten team title, but about 15 minutes after the meet, the Trojans 4x400m relay team was disqualified and eight points came off the board, leaving USC 6.5 points behind Oregon (106-99.5). USC's men won four individual titles, more than any other school. USC's women also won four events, tied for the most among the 18 schools. Trojan men winning titles were Johnny Brackins Jr. (60m H and Long Jump), William Jones (400m) and JC Stevenson (60m). USC women earning titles were Dajaz DeFrand (60m and 200m), Temi Ojora (Triple Jump) and the 4x400m relay. The women's team placed third in its first Big Ten Indoor Championships.

BRACKINS JR. & DEFRAND EARN TRACK ATHLETE OF THE MEET HONORS: USC's Johnny Brackins Jr. and Dajaz DeFrand, who both won two events and set meet records at the conference championships, were named the Men's and Women's Track Athlete of the 2025 Big Ten Indoor Championships, as voted upon by league coaches and announced on March 5. Brackins Jr. and Yemi John were also named Big Ten Indoor Sportsmanship honorees, for the Indoor Track and Field Championships which were held Feb. 28-March 1 in Indianapolis, Ind. The Sportsmanship honorees were those who distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior and they are now candidates for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award at the end of the academic year. The senior Brackins Jr. won the men's 60m hurdles title with a meet-record time of 7.49 on March 1, bettering the conference record of 7.53 which he set in the first round the previous day. The native of Kansas City, Mo. also won the Big Ten long jump title on Feb. 28 with a jump of 26-2.75 (7.99m). USC junior transfer sprinter DeFrand won the women's 60m and 200m dash titles on March 1. DeFrand won the 60m with a PR and meet-record time of 7.10. The native of Aurora, Colo. broke the original Big Ten Indoor Championships record of 7.18 with her first-round time of 7.15. DeFrand now ranks fourth on the USC all-time women's 60m dash list. She became a two-time Big Ten title-winner when she won the 200m race with a PR of 22.62. That time moved her to second on the USC all-time indoor 200m list.

THAT'S A LOTT OF EVENTS: Freshman Falyn Lott competed in her first college heptathlon at Mt. SAC on April 16. Lott was bothered by a sore hip flexor throughout the competition and pulled out in the 200m, the last event of the first day. Going into that event, Lott was fifth in the Women's Elite "B" competition with 2,385 points, the top total by a collegian. She had a time of 14.20 (-1.2) in the 100m hurdles, a season-best high jump of 5-7.75 (1.72m) and a shot put PR of 34-2.00 (10.41m). Lott established her personal best with 5142 points at the Big Ten Championships to finish 13th. She placed sixth in the heptathlon with 4,882 points at the 2023 USATF U20 Championships.

BRACKINS JR. HURDLES INTO RECORD BOOKS AT USATFs: Johnny Brackins Jr. placed third in the 60m H at the USATF Indoor Championships on Feb. 22 with a PR, USC-record, Big Ten-record and NCAA-leading time of 7.43. He also advanced to the final earlier in the day with a time of 7.44. The previous Big Ten record was 7.47 set by Wisconsin's Reggie Torian in 1997. Brackins Jr. becomes the fourth-fastest collegiate 60m hurdler of all-time, trailing only Grant Holloway (7.35), Trey Cunningham (7.38) and Daniel Roberts (7.41).

YOU MIGHT NEED A PROGRAM: USC added 35 new athletes to its track and field program since the end of the 2024 season.

REGULAR SEASON OUTDOOR MEET RECAPS

TROJAN INVITATIONAL (MARCH 21-22): USC freshman Ashley Erasmus won the women's shot put with a school-record mark, sophomore Racquil Broderick won the men's discus throw with a school record throw and USC won 15 events during the two-day competition. Also, 2025 Paris Paralympics gold medalist Ezra Frech made his historic collegiate debut today as the first above the knee amputee to be recruited and commit to a Division I track and field program. Erasmus won the women's shot put competition with a USC record-throw of 58-5.75, breaking the previous school record of 57-7.75 (17.57m) set by Breana Jemison in 2018. In her second shot put attempt of her USC outdoor career, Erasmus set the Trojan freshman record with a mark of 56-10.00 (7.32m), then in her third round broke the school record with her winning throw of 58-5.75 (17.82m). With his first throw of the season, Broderick set the USC school discus throw record with a mark of 207-0 (63.09m) and won the competition. He broke the longest-standing USC men's track and field record of 206-0 (62.78m) which was set by Gary Carlsen on June 4, 1967. Carlsen, who was on hand at the meet, posed with Broderick after the competition and gave him a gift of a Greek thrower trophy. Other Trojans winning events at the meet were: Jack Carter)M-800m), Jassani Carter (W-100m), Takiya Cenci (W-400m), Reese Garland (W-DT), Jake Heydon (M-JT), Jaren Holmes (M-TJ), Jazonte Levan (M-200m), Falyn Lott (W-LJ), Christine M. Mallard (W-200m), Yougendy Mauricette (M-400m H), W-4x100m, M-4x100m, M-4x400m

BATTLE ON THE BAYOU (MARCH 28-29): USC athletes won six events at the Battle on the Bayou hosted by LSU from March 28-29. The men's 4x100m relay won with a meet-record time of 38.60, tied for third on USC's all-time top 10 list. Nathan Cumberbatch won the men's 800m with a PR of 1:47.70. Madison Whyte was tops among collegians (2nd overall) in the women's 200m with a PR of 22.52 and won the women's 400m with a PR of 50.91, both NCAA-leading times. Edward Nketia won the men's 100m with a slightly wind-aided time of 10.01 (+2.1w). Garrett Kaalund won the men's 200m with a PR and NCAA-leading time of 20.05. Elias Gerald won the men's high jump with a PR clearance of 7-3.75 (2.23m)...the competition was completed indoors after the rains came.

BATTLE AT THE BEACH (APRIL 4): Yougendy Mauricette won the men's 400m hurdles, Ashley Erasmus won the women's shot put and Racquil Broderick won the men's discus throw with big marks and the Trojan women grabbed the top five places in the 100m dash to lead the Trojans at the 2025 Battle at the Beach at Jack Rose Track in Long Beach, Calif. on April 4. In all, USC athletes won six events and captured second in eight other events during the Battle at the Beach.

TRITON INVITATIONAL (APRIL 5): Reese Garland won the women's discus throw, Ashley Erasmus won the women's Elite shot put competition and Racquil Broderick posted the top collegian discus throw in the men's Elite division to lead the Trojans at the 2025 Triton Invitational in La Jolla, Calif. on April 5. Garland led a USC 1-2-3 finish in the women's discus throw with a PR of 181.11 (55.46m) to better her fifth-place standing on USC's all-time list. Karyssa Owens had a PR of 174-0 (53.04) in the final round to place second. Her mark moved her into eighth on USC's all-time list. Erasmus, who ranks ninth on USC's all-time discus throw list, placed third today with a best mark of 169-1 (51.55). Erasmus also won the women's Elite shot put competition with a mark of 57-1 (17.40m). Broderick had the top collegiate throw and finished third overall in the men's discus throw competition. His best mark was 206-4 (62.90m). Shaiquan Dunn also made the final and placed ninth with a season-best mark of 181-5 (55.31m). Dunn placed third in the men's Elite shot put competition with a mark of 60-0.25 (18.29m).

TEXAS A&M 44 FARMS TEAM INVITATIONAL (APRIL 11-12): On April 11 Madison Whyte led a 1-2-3 sweep in the women's 200m dash, Racquil Broderick won the men's discus throw competition and Ashley Erasmus claimed the women's shot put title to lead the Trojans. All three of the Trojan winners set meet records. Whyte led the Trojans to a 1-2-3 finish in the women's 200m dash with a PR, NCAA-leading, outdoor world-leading, meet-record and facility-record time of 22.32 (+1.9). Her time broke the previous facility record of 22.54 set by Trojan great TeeTee Terry in 2021. Dajaz DeFrand was second with a time of 22.66 (+1.9) and Jassani Carter had a season-best time of 22.75 (+1.9). Racquil Broderick won the men's discus throw competition with a best mark of 204-10 (62.44m). Broderick broke his own meet record of 203-1 (61.90m) set last season. Ashley Erasmus won the women's shot put competition with a best mark of 57-10.75 (17.63m). She broke the meet record which had stood since 2021. USC sprinters dominated the competition the next day, setting the school men's 4x100m relay team of Travis Williams, Max Thomas, Garrett Kaalund and Edward Nketia won with a school-record and NCAA-leading time of 38.41. That time also set the meet and facility records The men's sprinters shined in the 100m dash by taking the top five places and six of the top seven positions. Leading the way was Thomas with 9.92 (+2.4w), followed by Kaalund with 9.93 (+2.4w), Nketia with 9.96 (+2.4w), Williams with 10.07 (+2.4w) and JC Stevenson with a time of 10.13 (2.4w). Whyte won the women's 400m race by tying her PR of 50.91 and Yemi John placed third with a season-best time of 51.31. Whyte remains second on the NCAA descending order list and John moves into fifth place on the list. Whyte also set the meet record, breaking the time set by Athing Mu in 2022 while competing for Nike. Brianna Selby won the women's 100m dash with a PR and tied for the 11th-fastest time in school history of 11.11 (+1.9). The women's 4x400m relay team of John, Carter, freshm

MT. SAC RELAYS (APRIL 18-19): Trojans won eight events during the two days of the Mt. SAC Relays. On April 18 the women's "B" relay team won the 4x100m relay, Shaiquan Dunn won the College/Open shot put and Jazonte Levan won the men's C/O 200m dash title. The women's 4x100m relay team of Samirah Moody, Dajaz DeFrand, Madison Whyte and Jassani Carter began action on April 19 with a time of 42.36, the NCAA leader and second on USC's all-time list. Ashley Erasmus won the women's shot put Elite with a mark of 57-11, her fifth consecutive win. Racquil Broderick won the men's discus throw Elite with a mark of 202-6, the fifth consecutive meet he had the top collegiate throw. DeFrand won the women's 100m Elite with a time of 11.35 (-1.3) and Moody won the women's 200m Elite with a tiem of 20.58 (+0.8). JC Stevenson placed second in the long jump with the best jump by a collegian of 26-3.75, to move into first on the NCAA wind-legal long jump list.

USC-UCLA DUAL MEET (May 4): Ashley Erasmus won and broke her school shot put record, Nathan Cumberbatch won two races and USC set three meet records, but the Trojans fell at the annual USC-UCLA Dual Meet being held at Drake Stadium in Westwood Calif. on May 4. The USC men's team came up one point short at 82-81 and the women's team saw its 10-year run as champions fall with a 92-71 setback. The Trojans had either swept or split every Dual Meet dating back to the 2014 season. Garrett Kaalund won the 400m with a PR of 44.73 and Cumberbatch won the 800m (1:48.12) and 1500m (3:43.55) races. Erasmus had a shot put of 58-10 to break her school record. Madison Whyte won the 400m with a PR and meet-record time of 50.78, Samirah Moody won the 100m with a time of 11.09 to tie the meet record and the 4x400m relay closed with a meet-record time of 3:27.72.
