QUINCY WATTS

DIRECTOR OF TRACK & FIELD AND CROSS COUNTRY



USC Alum, Olympic great and 2025 NCAA Men's Coach of the Year Quincy Watts is in his fifth season at the helm of the program. He was promoted to USC Director of Track and Field and Cross Country on June 17, 2021 after eight seasons on Caryl Smith Gilbert's staff as an assistant in charge of sprints, long hurdles and relays. In his 12 seasons working with USC athletes, he has guided the Trojans to two NCAA Team Championship titles and 160 indoor and outdoor All-American honors. His Trojan athletes also claimed 24 NCAA event titles and 46 conference crowns. He led his student-athletes to set three collegiate records and 32 school records plus all four USC freshman 400-meter records and the women's 400-meter hurdles freshman record.

In addition to 2025 NCAA Men's Coach of the Year recognition, Watts also received honors as 2025 NCAA West Region Men's & Women's Coach of the Year. At the 2025 NCAA Indoor Championships, Watts won his first team title on the men's side and coached Dajaz Defrand to the Indoor 60m Championship title. He achieved back-to-back team titles at the 2025 NCAA Outdoor Championships where the men took home the title and the women earned runner-up. He also produced two NCAA Outdoor Champions with Samirah Moody taking the 100m outdoor title and the women's 4x100 relay team placing first. Additionally, Watts was voted Women's Coach of the 2025 Big Ten Championships by unanimous decision after leading the Women of Troy to the Big Ten Outdoor Team Championship. He also coached his athletes to seven Big Ten titles in the Trojans' inaugural season in the conference.

In the 2024 season, Watts led the men's team to a third-place finish outdoors and the women's team to a 10th-place tie. During the indoor season the men tied for seventh and the women tied for eighth. USC accumulated a combined 30 outdoor and indoor All-America honors, with Jasmine Jones winning the indoor 60m hurdles title and the outdoor 400m hurdles titles, both with school records, and JC Stevenson winning the men's outdoor long jump title. Both the men's and women's teams placed second at the Pac-12 Championships, with Trojans claiming 11 total event titles. During the summer, USC once again stood out at the Olympics with USC athletes winning nine medals, including five gold. The total medals were more than any other collegiate program in track and field.

During his second season at the helm in 2023, Watts led the men's and women's team to second-place finishes at the Pac-12 Championships, with the Trojans winning nine event titles. His 400m crew was especially dominant with freshman William Jones edging teammate and two-time defending champion Johnnie Blockburger in the final with a time of 44.65, just 0.05 off the school freshman record. On the women's side, Jan'Taijah Jones won the title with the second-fastest 400m time by a USC woman of 50.44, to lead a 1-2-3-5 finish for the Trojans in the event. The women's 4x400m relay earned outdoor All-America honors and the women's and men's 4x400m relays earned indoor All-America honors. Jan'Taijah Jones also placed fifth in the 400m at the NCAA Indoor Championships. USC athletes combined to post 60 indoor and outdoor Trojan all-time top 10 results during the season. During the season Allie Jones set the USC heptathlon record, Tade Djora the men's 60m hurdles record, Samirah Moody the women's 60m record and Summer Mosley the women's weight throw record.

In his inaugural season as a head coach in 2022, Watts led USC to some pretty impressive accomplishments. His athletes posted 16 outdoor and 17 indoor all-time USC indoor marks, including setting five school records. Trojans setting USC records were Davonte Burnett in the 60m, Summer Mosley in the women's weight throw, Alyssa Brewer the women's indoor 800m, Janiah Brown, Gigi Maccagnini, Jemima Russell and Brewer in the women's 4x800m relay and Kasaun James, Brendon Stewart, Ashton Allen and Johnnie Blockburger in the men's 4x100m relay, set in winning the NCAA title. The men's team placed 12th at the NCAA Championships, after taking third at the Pac-12 Championships, while the women were 30th at NAAs and fourth at Pac-12s.

Watts was named 2022 NCAA Indoor West Region Coach of the Year and had athletes earn 12 indoor All-America honors and earn 11 first-team outdoor All-America status. In addition, USC athletes combined to earn 23 All-Academic honor roll designations for the Winter and Spring semesters. The Trojans also swept the annual dual meet against UCLA. Watts also continues coaching USA Olympic medalists Michael Norman, Rai Benjamin and Kendall Ellis. Norman won gold medals in the 400m and with the USA 4x400m relay team and Benjamin a silver medal in the 400m hurdles at the 2022 World Athletics Championships.

He was the 2021 U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association National Outdoor Women's Assistant Coach of the Year as well as the West Region Indoor and Outdoor Women's Assistant Coach of the Year. At the 2021 NCAA Indoor meet, he helped Kaelin Roberts to her second 400-meter title and the women's 4x400-meter relay team to a second place finish, while at last week's NCAA Outdoor meet Anna Cockrell was the 400-meter hurdles champ, the women won the 4x100-meter relay and three women earned All-America honors in the 400 meters (the first time by any school in the event since 2014). In his eight years (2014-21) as a USC assistant, the Women of Troy had four Top 3 finishes at the NCAA meet, including winning it in 2018 and 2021 and placing second in 2019, and they never finished below second place at the Pac-12 meet. The Trojan men had a quartet of Top 5 NCAA finishes and Pac-12 runner-up finishes.

Watts, who was inducted into the USC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012, also was a wide receiver on the Trojan football team in 1990. At the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Watts twice broke Lee Evans' Olympic record in winning the 400 meters. He ran 43.71 in the semifinal before clocking 43.50 in the final (that still stands as the USC record) to become the first 400-meter athlete to run sub-44.0 in a championship meet. He then teamed with Andrew Valmon, Michael Johnson and Steve Lewis to win the gold in the 4x400-meter relay in a then-world record time of 2:55.74. He also earned a gold medal in the 4x400-meter relay at the 1993 World Championships and a silver medal in that relay at the 1991 World Championships.

MARTIN MARIC

ASSISTANT COACH, THROWS



Two-time Olympian Martin Maric is in his fourth season as the USC assistant track and field coach for the throws. He was named to the position by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on Sept. 2, 2022.

In the 2025 season, Maric coached two athletes to school records and three more to top-10 marks in program history outdoors. In women's shot put, Ashley Erasmus set the freshman and school record multiple times with a season-best mark of 17.99m at NCAA Outdoor Championships. Racquiel Broderick broke the USC program record in discus with a mark of 63.31 to score points at NCAA Championships as well.

Maric's athletes had a standout 2024 season, posting five all-time USC top-10 marks, seven personal bests, and two first-team All-America honors. Racquiel Broderick set a USC freshman record in the discus with a personal-best throw of 204-6 (62.34m), which ranks second on the Trojans' all-time list. Broderick won the 2024 Pac-12 discus title and finished second at the NCAA Championships with a mark of 202-8 (61.77m)—the best finals performance ever by a Trojan and the highest finish by a USC discus thrower since 1977. Nikolaos Polychroniou earned first-team All-America honors in the men's hammer throw, placing fifth at the NCAA Championships and second at the Pac-12 meet with a mark of 246-10 (75.24m), moving him to third all-time at USC.

Maric also guided Leif Nelson to a career-best javelin mark of 239-11, placing him fourth on USC's all-time list. Nelson finished second at the Pac-12 Championships and 10th at the NCAA Championships to earn second-team All-America honors. Sara Zabarino moved to third on the USC women's all-time discus list (171-3) and placed fourth at the Pac-12 Championships, while freshman Reese Garland recorded a personal-best 178-2 (54.32m) to rank fifth all-time at USC and place eighth in the conference meet. In addition, Maric's work with Allie Jones contributed to her nearly three-foot personal best in the shot put, which helped her set the school pentathlon record with 4,528 points at the Razorback Invitational. Jones went on to earn indoor All-America honors with a fourth-place finish in the pentathlon at the 2024 NCAA Indoor Championships.

In his first season at USC, Maric coached Polychroniou to All-America honors in the hammer throw, as the sophomore placed fifth at the NCAA Championships with a mark of 238-4 (72.65m), moving to sixth on USC's all-time list. Polychroniou also finished second at the 2023 Pac-12 Championships. During the same season, Summer Mosley set the USC women's weight throw record with a toss of 63-9.00 (19.43m), and Karlee Freeman threw a personal-best 53-11 (16.43m) in the shot put to rank eighth on the Trojans' all-time list. Maric also played a key role in the development of All-American heptathlete Allie Jones, helping her improve across all throwing events to ultimately set the USC heptathlon record.

Before joining USC, Maric spent nearly a decade (2013-2022) as the throws coach at Virginia, where he built one of the nation's premier throwing programs. During his tenure, he produced four NCAA champions, 29 All-Americans, and 18 ACC champions. Twice named the USTFCCA Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year, Maric earned the honor again in 2022 after guiding Claudio Romero to the NCAA discus title (217-1) and Ethan Dabbs to the USATF Outdoor Championships javelin title (266-8) and an NCAA runner-up finish (261-5).

That same year, Virginia throwers broke four outdoor school records and two ACC records. Maria Deaviz set both the indoor (54-11.50) and outdoor (56-10) shot put records, while Maric's athletes captured four ACC titles and earned eight All-ACC and five All-America honors in 2022. In 2021, Dabbs repeated as the ACC javelin champion, and Romero won his first conference discus crown before capturing the NCAA title. Freshman Jacob Lemmon placed fifth, giving the Cavaliers two All-Americans in the discus.

Despite the cancellation of the 2020 outdoor season due to the pandemic, Maric's athletes continued to excel. In 2019, Dabbs (javelin), Hilmer Jonsson (hammer), and Oghenakpobo Efekoro (shot put) all qualified for the NCAA Championships and won ACC titles, with Jonsson becoming the first male ACC athlete to win four consecutive hammer throw crowns and setting the Icelandic national record. In 2018, Jonsson claimed his third ACC title in the event and earned second-team All-America honors.

Maric's leadership was instrumental in Virginia's historic third-place team finish at the 2017 NCAA Outdoor Championships, the program's best ever. That year, the Cavaliers scored 36 points—all from the throws unit, the most by a throwing group since SMU in 2002. Filip Mihaljevic captured NCAA titles in both the shot put and discus, earning recognition as a Bowerman semifinalist, ACC Outdoor Field Athlete of the Year, and ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Jordan Young also earned All-America honors in the weight throw, finishing third at the NCAA Indoor Championships and capturing the ACC indoor title.

Maric was first named USTFCCA Southeast Region Men's Assistant Coach of the Year in 2015 after guiding six NCAA outdoor qualifiers. That year, Young became the only male to compete in three throwing events at the NCAA Championships, earning first-team All-America honors in both the discus and hammer, while Mihaljevic placed third in the discus. The Cavaliers broke four school records that season, including Mihaljevic's marks in the shot put and discus, Young's in the hammer throw, and Christine Bohan's in the shot put. In 2014, Maric coached Mihaljevic to ACC Freshman of the Year honors after he won the ACC discus title and earned All-America honors in both the shot put and discus.

As an athlete, Maric represented Croatia at the 2008 Beijing and 2012 London Olympic Games in the discus throw, finishing 29th and 17th respectively. He holds the Croatian national record in the event with a mark of 222-10 (67.92m) and was named Croatian Athlete of the Year for his 2012 performance. Maric also competed at the 2011 World Championships in Daegu, South Korea, and at the 2007 and 2009 World University Games.

KARL GOODMAN

ASSISTANT COACH, SPRINTS



Karl Goodman is in his third season as an assistant coach for sprints with the USC Track and Field program. He was appointed to the position by Trojan Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on July 20, 2023.

During the 2025 season, he guided the Women of Troy to the Big Ten Outdoor Title and a national runner-up finish. Seven of his athletes received First Team All-American status outdoors with Samirah Moody and the 4x100 relay team at the helm, earning national titles. Additionally, he is the first coach to ever produce a 60m champion and a different 100m champion in the same season.

Goodman's sprint group posted impressive results in his first season, producing four all-time Trojan top-10 marks, a Pac-12 Championships event title, and six personal bests. Three of his athletes also qualified for the USA Indoor and Outdoor Championships. Goodman guided Jassani Carter to All-America honors in the 200m, where she placed fifth in the NCAA final after running a personal-best 22.46 in the semifinals, which moved her to sixth on USC's all-time list. Carter also reached the NCAA 100m semifinals, finished second in both the 100m and 200m at the Pac-12 Championships, and advanced to the semifinals in both events at the U.S. Olympic Trials. His work with Madison Whyte led her to a ninth-place finish in the 200m at the NCAA Indoor Championships, where she set a USC freshman record of 22.90 that ranks sixth on the Trojans' all-time indoor list. Whyte also ran 22.69 in the outdoor 200m at the Pac-12 Championships, just shy of the USC freshman record of 22.65 and 11th all-time, to take third in the final. Goodman also guided Samirah Moody to a sixth-place finish at the 2024 USATF Indoor Championships, a third-place finish in the 100m at the Pac-12 Championships, and a berth in the NCAA quarterfinals in the 100m. Additionally, Goodman coached the 4x100m relay team of Christine M. Mallard, Whyte, Moody, and Carter to the Pac-12 title with a time of 43.87, which ranks seventh all-time by a Trojan quartet.

Before joining USC, Goodman spent five seasons at Coastal Carolina University, where he was named an assistant coach in 2019 and promoted to associate head coach on July 1, 2022. He worked primarily with the sprinters and hurdlers, helping the Chanticleers reach new heights both in the Sun Belt Conference and nationally. During his tenure, Goodman coached seven men and 11 women to all-time Coastal Carolina marks in the sprints and hurdles.

In 2023, Alexis Glasco earned first-team All-America honors in the 100m hurdles, placing sixth at the NCAA Championships with a time of 12.74w. At the NCAA East Preliminary Rounds, Goodman guided Glasco to a Coastal Carolina school record of 12.97 (+1.8) in the 100m hurdles. He also coached Kayla Sweeney to regionals in the 100m and 200m, where she reached the NCAA quarterfinals in the 200m, and helped Sydney Clemens advance to the NCAA quarterfinals in the 100m hurdles. On the men's side, Goodman guided Braydon Bennett to the NCAA East Prelims in the 110m hurdles.

During his time at Coastal Carolina, Goodman coached two Sun Belt Conference Women's Outdoor Track Athletes of the Year (2021 and 2022), the 2021 Sun Belt Conference Women's Outdoor Track & Field Freshman of the Year, and the 2021 Sun Belt Conference Women's Outdoor Track & Field Newcomer of the Year, as well as the 2022 Sun Belt Conference Women's Indoor Track Performer of the Year, two Sun Belt Conference Women's Indoor Track Newcomers of the Year (2020 and 2021), and two Sun Belt Conference Women's Indoor Freshmen of the Year (2020 and 2021). Under Goodman's leadership, the Chanticleers' sprinters, hurdlers, and relay groups earned a total of 13 All-America honors, including a program-record 11 accolades during the 2022 outdoor season. He was instrumental in the development of Melissa Jefferson, who became the 2022 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Champion in the 60m dash, the 2022 U.S. National Champion in the 100m at the Toyota USA Outdoor Championships, and a 2022 World Champion gold medalist as part of Team USA's winning 4x100m relay at the World Athletics Championships.

Goodman also guided Mekenze Kelley to a first-place finish in the 400m at the 2022 USA U20 Championships, earning a national title and qualifying for the 2022 World Athletics U20 Championships, where she placed ninth individually and won a gold medal as part of Team USA's 4x400m relay team.

On the men's side, Braydon Bennett picked up first-team 2021 All-Sun Belt honors with a first-place finish in the 110m hurdles and a personal-best time of 13.77 (2.5w). Tyler Graves earned second-team 2022 All-Sun Belt honors, while Reggie Barlow, Ty Floyd, DeVonte Harris, Jeremiah Talbert, and Garrett Wilkins each received third-team all-conference recognition.

During the 2022 indoor season, Melissa Jefferson was named the Sun Belt Conference Indoor Track & Field Performer of the Year, capturing conference titles in both the 60m and 200m dash events, while Arnold won the 400m title for the second consecutive year.

In 2021, Arnold collected multiple accolades, including Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Most Outstanding Freshman, Newcomer of the Year, and All-Sun Belt first-team honors, after winning the 400m at the 2021 Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Championships. The year prior, Jefferson earned both Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Newcomer of the Year and Freshman of the Year honors in 2020.

Before joining the Coastal Carolina staff, Goodman spent the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons with his alma mater, UT Arlington, as a graduate assistant coach under Associate Head Coach Jordan Durham and Assistant Coach Tyrone Edgar. He helped guide the Mavericks to the 2019 Sun Belt Indoor Track & Field Championship and coached the men's 4x100m and 4x400m relay teams to appearances at the 2019 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships. That year, the Mavericks' 4x100m relay squad broke the school record with a time of 39.23, a mark that had stood since 2014.

As a collegiate athlete, Goodman spent his final three seasons at UT Arlington, where he helped lead his 4x400m relay team to the 2017 NCAA Track & Field Championships. A three-time Sun Belt Championship finalist in the 400m, Goodman helped the Mavericks capture both indoor and outdoor league titles in 2017 as part of the program's second-ever league "triple crown."

Goodman began his college career at Division II Mount Olive, where he became an All-American in the distance medley relay and ranked among the top 10 all-time in two outdoor and one indoor event. He helped Mount Olive achieve two "triple crowns" in two years and, in 2014, set the school's all-time indoor 400m record with a time of 49.42.

JEFF PETERSMEYER

ASSISTANT COACH, JUMPS & MULTI EVENTS



The USC track and field program named Petersmeyer to his position as assistant coach on July 6, 2023, by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts. A 27-year veteran jumps and multi-events coach, Petersmeyer has guided his athletes to numerous All-America honors, NCAA titles, conference titles, and Olympic berths throughout his career.

In his second season, Coach Petersmeyer had five athletes earn All-American status indoors with JC Stevenson the sole outdoor All-American. JC Stevenson (60m, Long Jump), Johnny Brackins (60m Hurdles, Long Jump), Elias Gerald (High Jump), and Brady Palen (High Jump) all scored points to contribute to the men's indoor team title. High jumper Elias Gerald took Big Ten runner-up outdoors while Alyssa Hope contributed points towards the women's Big Ten title in long jump.

In his first season leading the jumps program, Petersmeyer's athletes earned five first-team All-America honors, one NCAA individual title, one USATF Indoor title, set two school records, posted six Trojan all-time top five marks, won two Pac-12 individual titles, and achieved 20 indoor and outdoor personal bests. For his success, he was named the USTFCCA West Region Men's Assistant Coach of the Year.

Among his standout athletes, Petersmeyer guided JC Stevenson to the 2024 NCAA outdoor long jump title, where Stephenson won on his final attempt with a personal-best jump of 26-11.75 (8.22m), tying for third on USC's all-time list. He became the first Trojan men's long jump champion since Larry Doubley in 1977. Johnny Brackins Jr. also earned All-America honors in the event by placing fourth with a jump of 26-4.25 (8.03m). Brackins Jr. set the USC indoor long jump record of 27-0.00 (8.23m) while winning the USATF Indoor title, and later placed fourth at the U.S. Olympic Trials. Petersmeyer also coached Temi Ojora to All-America honors in the triple jump at both the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships, finishing fifth indoors and sixth outdoors. She captured the Pac-12 triple jump title and broke the school record with a mark of 45-7.25 (13.90m) at the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds. Ojora also recorded the second-farthest women's indoor triple jump in USC history with 45-2.25 (13.77m) at the Razorback Invitational. High jumper Elias Gerald set personal bests both indoors and outdoors, won the Pac-12 title (held indoors) with a clearance of 7-1.75 (2.18m), and earned second-team All-America honors by placing 11th at the NCAA Championships.

During the indoor season, Petersmeyer helped guide Allie Jones to a fourth-place finish in the pentathlon at the NCAA Championships, where she set her long jump PR of 20-8.00 (6.30m), tied for fifth on USC's all-time list. Earlier that season, she established the school record in the pentathlon with 4,528 points at the Razorback Invitational.

Before joining USC, Petersmeyer served as the Director of Athletics at American International University in Jahra, Kuwait. From 2018 to 2022, he was an assistant track and field coach at Louisville, where he also worked as a speed and power consultant for the men's basketball program in Fall 2022. During his time there, he developed several All-ACC performers and NCAA Championship competitors, as well as three athletes who went on to compete in the 2020 Olympics, including Shelby McEwen, who placed fifth in the high jump at the 2022 World Championships. He also served as Louisville's international recruiting coordinator.

In 2022, Petersmeyer coached Trey Allen to first-team All-America honors in the high jump at both the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships. He coached 10 athletes to All-ACC honors, including seven medalists. At the ACC Indoor Championships, Luke Nichols and Allen placed second and third in the men's high jump, while Synclair Savage finished third in the women's long jump. Under his leadership, Louisville captured both men's and women's high jump titles at the 2022 ACC Outdoor Championships, with Emily Scott and Allen winning their respective events. Savage also claimed the women's long jump title, and both Allen and Willis qualified for the USA Track & Field Championships.

In 2021, Petersmeyer guided Allen to All-America honorable mention in the high jump at the NCAA Outdoor Championships and helped Allen and Jonah Hyde place fourth and fifth, respectively, at the ACC Indoor Championships. That same year, Renate Van Tonder placed fourth in the women's long jump at the ACC Outdoor Championships. He also coached multiple All-ACC performers in 2020, including Alivia Ash, who won the 2019 ACC Indoor high jump title. His event squad in the women's long jump was ranked No. 1 nationally that season.

From 2013 to 2018, Petersmeyer served as the head track and field coach at San Jose State. During his tenure, he guided Destiny Longmire to a 14th-place finish in the long jump at the 2018 NCAA Championships, earning second-team All-America honors. Longmire was the first San Jose State woman to qualify for the NCAA Championships in the program's five-year history. He coached six athletes to the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds, produced four Mountain West individual champions, and led the women's triple jump crew to a No. 1 national ranking. Additionally, distance runner Rebecca Garcia was named a Capital One Academic All-America third-team honoree in 2015.

Prior to that, Petersmeyer was an assistant coach at Boise State from 2009 to 2013, where he coached three All-Americans, 17 conference champions, and guided Kurt Felix to the 2012 NCAA decathlon title. From 2006 to 2009, he was an assistant at TCU, where he coached Jonathan Jackson to become the first TCU athlete to win conference titles in both the long jump and triple jump. Jackson earned back-to-back All-America honors with third-place finishes at the NCAA Championships in 2007 and 2008. He also coached Whitney Gipson and Neidra Covington to All-America honors in 2009, with Gipson later setting the NCAA women's indoor long jump record.

From 1999 to 2006, Petersmeyer served as an assistant coach at Baldwin Wallace (2004-06), Columbia (2002-04), and Northern Arizona (1999-02). At Baldwin Wallace, he guided his team to both indoor and outdoor conference titles. At Columbia, he coached the program's first women's field event Ivy League champion, and at Northern Arizona, he helped lead the team to seven Big Sky championships and five Top 12 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country Championships. He began his career as a graduate assistant at Allegheny College in 1998-99.

Petersmeyer has also coached several athletes to international success. He guided Shelby McEwen to a fifth-place finish in the high jump at the 2022 World Athletics Championships after McEwen claimed the USA high jump title. He coached Roderick Townsend to a gold medal and world record in the high jump at the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games, where Townsend also earned silver in the long jump. In 2019, Petersmeyer coached Ty Butts to an eighth-place finish in the women's high jump at the World Championships. He served

BRENTON EMANUEL

ASSISTANT COACH, HURDLES/SPRINTS



Brenton Emanuel was named USC assistant coach for sprints by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on Aug. 8, 2024.

In his first season, Emanuel's hurdlers contributed significant points to both the men's national titles and women's Big Ten title. Johnny Brackins won the 60mH indoor title at Big Ten Championships and contributed to both men's national team titles. At NCAA Outdoor Championships, Emanuel's men's short sprinters accounted for 25 of the 41 points scored to win the title.

Emanuel has served the prior three seasons as the assistant coach for men's and women's sprint hurdles and relays at Nebraska where his athletes set six school records. He guided Darius Luff to the 2024 NCAA 110m hurdles title with a school-record time of 13.19 (+0.1). Emanuel guided his athletes to 13 All-America honors in his three seasons, as well as leading 11 Nebraska runners to All-Big Ten honors.

Emanuel was named USTFCCCA Midwest Region Assistant Coach of the Year and twice he helped lead Nebraska to Big Ten team titles.

Prior to Nebraska, Emanuel served the 2019-21 seasons as the Director of Track & Field and Cross Country for Eastern Illinois, where he was three times named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year. His men's teams won the OVC outdoor team title all three seasons and twice his men's cross country teams won the OVC title, the school's first in 15 seasons.

While at Eastern Illinois, he had 30 athletes post EIU all-time top 10 times, including school record-holders Pedra Hicks (400m H) and Danielle Frank (indoor 200m). He coached 30 athletes to OVC first-team honors and eight that advanced to the NCAA West Regional. He coached OVC Male Track Athlete of the Year in 2019-20 (Dustin Hatfield) and Adam Swanson in 2021.

Emanuel served the 2018 season as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for Illinois State and was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator from July 2014 through June 2017. While at ISU, Emanuel was named the USTFCCCA Midwest Regional Assistant Coach of the Year in 2018 and coached seven national qualifiers. He coached five All-Americans, 25 Missouri Valley Conference champions and 80 All-MVC honorees. Emanuel had three USATF junior qualifiers and his Illinois State athletes set 10 school records.

He was the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator in 2014 at California University of Pennsylvania. He coached two All-PSAC performers and one World Juniors qualifier.

Emanuel is a 2008 graduate of Eastern Illinois, where he competed for the men's track team for four seasons. He served as a team captain and earned second-team All-OVC honors.

A native of Plainfield, Ill., Emanuel and his wife, Jessica, have three daughters, Brooklyn, Kamryn and Laila and a son, Kyler.

BRENDA MARTINEZ

ASSISTANT COACH, DISTANCE AND CROSS COUNTRY

Olympian Brenda Martinez enters her first season as the Assistant Coach for Distance and Cross Country following the announcement of her hiring on July 15, 2025.

Martinez brings a wealth of experience as a professional athlete and coach. On the coaching side, Martinez created the Big Bear Track Club back in 2014. Through this group, she developed post-collegiate athletes into world-class runners. Some of the athletes she worked with through this organization included 2016 Olympian and World Champion Boris Berian, World Indoor qualifier Jenna Westaway, USATF Indoor finalist Olicia Williams, and two-time Olympic Trials qualifier Dusty Solis.

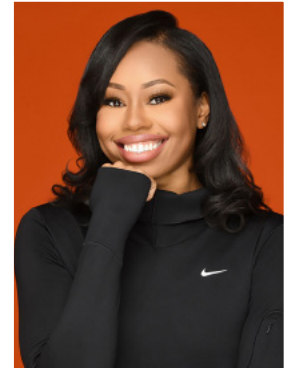


Along with her coaching experience, Martinez also competed professionally, representing Team USA on six occasions. She was a part of Team USA for the 2016 Olympic Games and made five IAAF World Championship appearances, including a second-place finish at the 2013 IAAF World Championships in the 800. During her professional career, she put up career-bests of 1:57.91 in the 800 and 4:00.94 in the 1500. She signed her contract with Team New Balance in 2010 and competed with them until 2023. Currently, she sits on the Athlete Advisory Board for New Balance.

Before her professional career, the Rancho Cucamonga native competed for the Highlanders of UC Riverside. During her time with the cross country and track and field programs, she was a three-time All-American while earning All-Big West honors for three-straight seasons. Not only that, but she was also named the 2009 Big West Track Athlete of the Year while finishing in second place at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in the 1500. She still holds the records for the mile and 3000 in the indoor track and field record books and holds the 800 and 1500 records in the outdoor record book.

STEPHANIE WILLIAMS

ASSISTANT COACH, SPRINTS & RECRUITING COORDINATOR



Stephanie Williams was named assistant coach for sprints and the track and field recruiting coordinator by Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Quincy Watts on Aug. 8.

Williams comes to USC after 15 seasons as a coach at DePaul. The last 10 years she spent at DePaul were as an assistant coach for sprints and hurdles. She also served three seasons (2012-14) as the assistant coach for sprints and two as a graduate assistant coach for sprints.

“I’m very excited to welcome Stephanie and her son Nate to the Trojan Family,” said Watts. “Stephanie’s experience will be invaluable in helping the USC Men’s and Women’s programs. Stephanie fosters a culture that shows how much she cares about her athletes and pushes them to reach their full potential as student-athletes, but more importantly as great citizens in our community.”

“I’m very excited to be a part of the Trojan family,” said Williams. “It is truly a blessing. I would like to thank Coach Watts, the USC administration, coaching staff and the student-athletes for welcoming me with open arms. I’m ready to put in the work in order to continue to elevate the program. Fight On!”

During her time as a coach at DePaul, she coached over 50 Big East champions and 12 NCAA Midwest Preliminary Rounds qualifiers. Williams coached all current DePaul record holders in the short sprints, sprint hurdles and 4x100m relays. She guided Darius Brown to the 2024 NCAA 60m hurdles finals and to the 2024 NCAA outdoor 110m hurdles semifinals. Brown also competed at the 2023 and 2024 USATF Championships in the 110m hurdles and set the Big East Championships 60m hurdles record. She also guided hurdler Kyle Decker to four Big East 60m hurdles titles and to three Big East 110m hurdles championships.

Williams competed for DePaul from 2006-09 and served as team captain for the track and field team. She graduated Cum Laude in 2009 with a degree in Communications and a minor in Marketing: Sales & Leadership. She also earned a Master’s in Communications from the school in 2011.

2025 BIG TEN CHAMPIONS



The Women of Troy had an outstanding 2025 outdoor season, winning the Big Ten Championships and securing the runner-up spot at the NCAA Championships.

At the Big Ten Outdoor Championships, the women claimed the team title behind a dominant showing from Madison Whyte, who won both the 200m and 400m and anchored the meet-clinching 4x400m relay. In a remarkable turnaround, the team scored 112 points on the final day of competition after starting the day in ninth place.

At the NCAA Championships, the team placed second overall and secured title wins in the 100m dash and the 4x400 relay. Madison Whyte and Dejaz DeFrاند took second and third place in the 400m, respectively, combining for 14 points. The team finished with 41 points overall to secure their second-place finish.

2026 INDOOR SEASON RECAP

The Women of Troy had an impressive showing throughout the 2026 Indoor season, where they racked up 21 first-place wins, took third place at the Big Ten Championships, took home three conference titles, and earned eight All-American titles.

Throughout the season, the team earned seven spots in the USTFCCCA Rankings, including five consecutive top-ten rankings. The women also garnered several individual recognitions, with Madison Whyte, Ashley Erasmus, and Oluwatosin each receiving a Big Ten award for Track Athlete of the Week, Field Athlete of the Week, and Freshman of the Week, respectively. Madison Whyte also earned several additional recognitions, including a spot on the Bowerman preseason watchlist, NCAA Women's Athlete of the week, and Big Ten Sportsmanship Honors.

Home of USC Track and Field



Katherine B. Loker Stadium was made possible by a generous donation from Katherine B. Loker. The 3,000-seat stadium opened in the 2001 season and was dedicated on May 5 during that year's USC-UCLA dual meet. The track and stadium underwent renovations in 2020 prior to the Trojans hosting the 2021 Pac-12 Championships. The facility includes track offices, locker rooms, an athlete lounge and meeting rooms. Loker Stadium also hosted the 2003 Pac-10 Championships, the first time a conference meet had ever been held on the USC campus, and the 2013 Pac-10 Championships.
