REQUIRED READING

- When USC and Oregon meet, there is never a shortage of storylines...or interested readers.
- After all, these particular pages have been known to receive a little extra attention.
- For those inclined to study every word, there should be plenty worth highlighting.
- So, read closely: The Trojans and Ducks are ready to add another chapter to the series.
- The Ducks fly south for a little California sunshine and a showdown with the Trojans in USC's Big Ten home opener. Kickoff is set for 4:30 p.m. PT on NBC.

AN EAST COAST VICTORY

- USC improved to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in Big Ten play with its 42-35 victory at Rutgers.
- The Trojans have won both all-time meetings against Rutgers, defeating the Scarlet Knights 42-20 in Los Angeles in 2024 and 42-35 in Piscataway in 2026.
- USC never trailed and scored in all four quarters.
- The Trojans produced 461 yards of total offense, averaging 7.3 yards per play.
- The Trojans averaged 5.9 yards per rush and 8.7 yards per pass attempt.
- USC scored in three different phases: four offensive TDs, one defensive TD and two field goals.
- The Trojans scored 14 points off two Rutgers turnovers, while Rutgers did not score any points off turnovers.
- The Trojans punted just once. That punt traveled 56 yards and pinned Rutgers at its own 5-yard line.
- USC converted 5-of-10 third downs, including 2-of-3 in the fourth quarter.
- The Trojans recorded six plays of at least 20 yards, with three rushing and three passing.
- The Trojans' two interceptions generated 115 return yards.
- USC's 42 points were distributed among five different scorers: **RB King Miller**, **WR Corey Simms**, **S Prophet Brown**, **RB Riley Wormley** and **K Caden Chittenden**.
- The Trojans have scored 172 points through four games, averaging 43.0 points per game.
- USC has led at halftime in every game, outscoring its opponents 106-24 in the first half.
- USC is 19-of-24 (.792) in the red zone, scoring 17 touchdowns.

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WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ABOUT USC

MAIAVA MAGIC

- ... The USC quarterback is a position unlike any other.
- ... This young man becomes a household name, an annual Heisman contender and is under the brightest spotlight. They are in a league of their own and comprise a historic fraternity of some of the best collegiate players in history.
- ... USC returns the nation's best quarterback in redshirt senior **Jayden Maiava**.
- ... Maiava went 20-of-32 passes for 277 yards, 2 TDs and no INTs.
- ... Maiava averaged 8.7 yards per attempt and 13.9 yards per completion.
- ... He completed passes to nine different Trojans.
- ... Maiava connected with WR Corey Simms for a 52-yard touchdown on third-and-14.
- ... He delivered his second touchdown pass to RB Riley Wormley on third-and-goal from the 2-yard line, extending USC's lead to 42-28.
- ... Maiava also found WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt for USC's successful two-point conversion.
- ... Maiava was particularly efficient in the fourth quarter, completing 5-of-6 passes for 35 yards and a touchdown.
- ... Maiava leads the nation in passing yards (1,173), passing TDs (12) and points responsible for (80).
- ... Maiava's opening four-game stretch compares favorably with the greatest quarterbacks in USC history. Through four games, Maiava has produced more passing yards and passing TDs than Carson Palmer, Matt Leinart and Caleb Williams did through the same point of their Heisman Trophy-winning seasons. Maiava's 75.7 completion percentage and 194.0 passing efficiency rating are also the best among the group, while his 12 passing TDs are 3 more than Williams, 4 more than Leinart and 7 more than Palmer recorded during their respective four-game starts.

- ... Maiava makes his throws count. He is No. 2 among USC career leaders in yards per attempt with 8.9 (min. 500 attempts at USC). He's in good company in the stat - Caleb Williams sits at No. 1 with 9.2 yards per attempt, Matt Leinart is third with 8.6 and Sam Darnold holds the No. 4 spot with 8.5 yards per attempt.
- ... He is currently 10th on USC's career total offense leader board with 6,285 total yards of offense as a Trojan.
- ... Maiava also ranks 13th on USC's single season passing leader board with 265 completions in the 2025 season.
- ... He has been named to the Maxwell Award Watch List, the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award Watch List, the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award Watch List, the Davey O'Brien Award Watch List, the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Watch List and he was one of 12 total players from the Big Ten Conference to be named to the 2026 Big Ten Football Preseason Honors list.
- ... Maiava was also recently named a nominee for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year, the Allstate AFCA Goodworks Team and to the Wuerffel Trophy watch list for his commitment to community service and leadership beyond the gridiron.

... With another year under offensive coordinator Luke Huard and Riley, who is the only head coach to tutor three Heisman Trophy winning quarterbacks, have 3 quarterbacks selected No. 1 overall in the NFL Draft and has the most No. 1 overall draft selections in the common draft era, Maiava is expected to continue to make large strides.

MAIAVA MAKES A DIFFERENCE

- ... As USC's quarterback and a household name under one of football's most prominent spotlights, Maiava remains deeply grounded in service, humility and community.
- ... Originally from Honolulu's Pālolo Valley, Maiava never forgot where he came from or the struggles he overcame growing up. His experiences shaped an incredible servant's heart and a genuine passion for mentoring children and uplifting underserved communities, especially his deep commitment to giving back to the community that helped shape him.
- ... Maiava consistently uses his platform to inspire hope, connection and opportunity for others. He embodies the spirit of 'ohana: the value of family, connection and community.
- ... In June of 2026, he returned to Honolulu's Pālolo Valley where he hosted a free youth football clinic for more than 350 local children ages 6 to 14, transforming a day of football instruction into a meaningful event centered on mentorship, inspiration and opportunity.
- ... Throughout the clinic, Maiava taught football fundamentals while emphasizing teamwork,

perseverance and the importance of believing in yourself despite adversity, drawing from his own journey from the Pālolo Valley to the highest levels of the sport.

- Extending his impact beyond the field, proceeds from event t-shirt sales were donated to Aloha 1st Athletics, a local nonprofit dedicated to leadership, character development and mental health support through sports, reinforcing his commitment to investing in the next generation and strengthening the community that shaped him.
- Above all, Maiava encouraged attendees to lead with integrity, make a positive impact on those around them and pursue excellence in football, academics, faith and everyday life.
- On this same trip, Maiava continued his commitment to giving back by returning to his former high school, Kaimukī High, where he spoke to students not only as the USC quarterback but as someone who once walked the same halls with the same aspirations.
- Reflecting on his journey from serving as a Bulldogs ball boy and water boy to achieving his dream of wearing the Kaimukī jersey and competing at the highest level, Maiava shared an honest message about overcoming adversity, embracing opportunity and trusting God’s plan.
- He encouraged students to approach life with a “Fight On” mentality, emphasizing resilience, discipline, faith, accountability and the importance of supporting others through difficult times.
- Crediting his mother as his greatest inspiration, he also stressed the value of education and the life lessons football has taught him about leadership, perseverance and character.
- Maiava’s outreach continued at Jarrett Middle School, where he inspired more than 400 students through an interactive discussion focused on perseverance, personal responsibility and making positive choices, sharing his own experiences growing up in Pālolo Housing and encouraging students to embrace discipline over regret as they pursue their goals.
- He also visited Pālolo Elementary School, where he read with students, sang songs and created an engaging, uplifting environment that reflected his genuine commitment to mentorship and community.
- Together, these visits underscored Maiava’s dedication to empowering Hawaii’s youth through education, faith, service and authentic leadership, reinforcing his mission to invest in the communities that helped shape him.
- Beyond his work in Hawaii, Maiava has consistently dedicated his time to serving communities throughout Los Angeles, partnering with organizations focused on food insecurity, youth development and community outreach.
- He has volunteered multiple times with the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank, helping sort and pack thousands of pounds of fresh produce for families in need, including supporting relief efforts for residents displaced by the January 2025 wildfires.
- Maiava has also demonstrated a strong commitment to addressing food insecurity through his

... Across three volunteer shifts at the Dream Center, he helped prepare and serve more than 1,300 meals for individuals experiencing food insecurity, while at The Midnight Mission he worked alongside staff to prepare and distribute meals to individuals and families seeking support, reflecting his hands-on approach to serving those most in need.

... In addition to his volunteer service, Maiava has invested in mentoring and empowering young people through organizations including the Boys & Girls Club, Angel City Sports' Youth Weekend and The Young Shakespearians.

... Whether coaching and encouraging local youth, participating in adaptive sports alongside children with physical disabilities or celebrating students' achievements in the arts, he has consistently used his platform to promote inclusion, confidence, education and personal growth while building meaningful connections throughout the community.

CATCHING FIRE

... The USC aerial attack continues to be dominant with a wide variety of players making an impact on the field.

... USC sophomore **WR Corey Simms** caught all four of his targets for a career-high 72 yards and the first TD of his collegiate career in the Trojans' 42-35 road victory over Rutgers.

... With USC facing third-and-14 from its own 48-yard line, Simms hauled in a 52-yard touchdown pass to give the Trojans a 17-7 lead early in the second quarter.

... The 52-yard score was the longest reception of Simms' career and USC's longest offensive play of the game.

... Simms generated 33 yards after the catch, including 23 on his TD, displaying the explosiveness to turn a critical third-down opportunity into a game-changing score.

... His 72 receiving yards ranked second on the team, while his 18.0 yards per reception led all Trojans with multiple catches.

... **WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt** led USC with 5 receptions for 77 yards, averaging 15.4 yards per catch against Rutgers.

... Dixon-Wyatt also caught the two-point conversion that gave USC a 35-21 lead.

... Dixon-Wyatt leads USC with 18 receptions and 258 receiving yards on the season. He has also caught two TD passes and a two-point conversion.

... Dixon-Wyatt is averaging 14.3 yards per reception and has recorded at least three catches in every game.

... **WR Tanook Hines** caught 3 passes for 33 yards, including a 15-yard reception on the opening play of USC's first touchdown drive.

... **WR Zachary Williams** turned his lone reception into a 27-yard gain.

... USC had four receivers finish with at least 30 yards against Rutgers: Dixon-Wyatt (77), Simms (72), Hines (33) and **TE Mark Bowman** (32).

The No. 15 Trojans fell 27-42 at No. 7 Oregon in front of a crowd of 59,588 at Autzen Stadium in Eugene, Ore. This was USC's third loss of the season.

USC QB Jayden Maiava went 25-of-43 (.581) for 311 yards with 3 TDs and 2 INTs. WR Tanook Hines led the Trojans with 141 receiving yards on 6 catches (23.5 avg.) with 1 TD. WR Makai Lemon scored two TDs (in addition to a passing TD) and TE Lake McRee also found the end zone. LB Desman Stephens led the Trojans with a career-high 17 tackles.

Going into Saturday, the Trojans ranked seventh nationally in red-zone defense, allowing opponents to score on just 71 percent of their red-zone trips. Without starting safeties Kamari Ramsey and Bishop Fitzgerald, who were out with injuries, the Trojans didn't have any red-zone magic defensively. USC also struggled in the run game, averaging just 1.9 yard per carry.

The Trojans scored on the opening kickoff on an 11-play 75-yard TD drive to take an early lead. Maiava hit WR Ja'Kobi Lane with a 27-yard reception before Lemon scored on an 8-yard TD. It was the first opening drive TD Oregon has allowed all season.

K Ryon Sayeri kicked out of bounds on the kickoff and Oregon started at its own 35-yard line. The Ducks responded with a TD from RB Jordon Davidson to tie up the game.

USC was forced to punt on its next drive, but was called for catch interference to give Oregon a short field. TE Kenyon Sadiq scored on a 8-yard pass from QB Dante Moore to take a 14-7 lead.

The Trojans drew up a trick play as Maiava tossed a screen to Lemon who hauled a deep ball to Hines in the end zone. Hines used his athleticism to make an incredible catch and get his foot down in the end zone while the Duck DB was on top of him to tie the game at 14-14.

The two teams exchanged punts, but the Trojans outkicked their coverage on a line drive and Duck returner Malik Benson returned Johnson's punt 85-yards for a TD. The return gave Oregon a 21-14 lead.

Maiava threw a pick on the next Trojan drive and Oregon took over at the 44-yard line following a Trojan unsportsmanlike penalty on Lane. The Trojan defense held Oregon to a field goal, but LB Desman Stephens was called on a leaping foul and a 15-yard penalty (as Oregon's kicked missed the field goal). Oregon resumed the drive on first down, and LB Bryce Boettcher lined up at running back to score a TD for the Ducks.

As the Trojans got the ball back, Maiava connected with Hines on a 51-yard pass to put USC in the red zone. After not converting, USC had to settle for a field goal, but Sayeri missed the 27-yard attempt.

After halftime, the USC defense had a huge energy play and stopped the Ducks on four-and-1 to regain possession. Unfortunately, Maiava was picked off on the next series.

The defense continued to perform as S Kennedy Urlacher recorded his first INT. Urlacher's pick resulted in points as Maiava connected with Lemon to score and close the point gap to 21-28.

Oregon scored once again on its next offensive drive to go up 35-21.

The Trojans continued to fight and McRee scored a TD, but USC was unable to convert a two-point play so the score remained 27-35.

Oregon scored once more to extend to 42-27, and the Trojans were unable to bounce back as the clock ran out.

BACKS IN BUSINESS

... USC redshirt freshman **RB Riley Wormley** scored a career-high 2 TDs against Rutgers.

... Wormley produced 54 yards from scrimmage and two TDs on just four touches, rushing three times for a career-high 52 yards and catching a 2-yard TD pass.

... His TD reception was the first of his career.

... He averaged an explosive 17.3 yards per carry, with each of his three rushing attempts gaining at least 12 yards and producing a first down or TD.

... Wormley accounted for both of USC's offensive TDs in the second half

... After Rutgers cut USC's advantage to 27-21, Wormley sparked the ensuing possession with a career-long 27-yard run and finished the 75-yard drive with a 12-yard TD rush.

... With Rutgers again within seven points in the fourth quarter, Wormley gained 13 yards to set up first-and-goal before catching a 2-yard TD pass on third down to restore USC's two-score lead.

... Head coach **Lincoln Riley** praised Wormley as one of USC's strongest competitors: "'I think they (Wormley and Simms) are two of our stronger competitors on the team," Riley said. "Two guys who I never have to worry about their effort or physicality or competitiveness. I think because of that they both were able to stay on the field."

... **RB King Miller** recorded his second 100-yard rushing performance of the season against Rutgers, gaining 102 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries.

... Miller averaged 6.4 yards per carry, and none of his 16 rushing attempts resulted in negative yardage.

... Miller rushed for 24 yards on two consecutive carries following **S Christian Pierce's** interception, scoring on an 11-yard run to give USC a 10-0 lead.

... With USC protecting a seven-point lead on its final possession, Miller carried five times for 34 yards and three first downs.

... Miller, a former walk-on, leads USC with 338 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 64 carries, averaging 5.3 yards per attempt in 2026.

... Miller has rushed for 100 yards in consecutive games, recording 128 yards against Louisiana and 102 at Rutgers.

... **RB Waymond Jordan** added 46 yards from scrimmage, rushing eight times for 26 yards and catching one pass for 20 yards.

PROTECTION PERFECTION

... USC's offensive line helped the Trojans average 5.9 yards per carry and surrender only one sack.

... Trojan running backs combined for 180 yards and 2 touchdowns on 27 carries, an average of 6.7 yards per attempt.

... USC's running backs did not record a negative rushing attempt.

... The offensive line paved the way for 12 rushing first downs.

... **OL Tobias Raymond** has now started in every position on the offensive line except right guard.

The last offensive lineman to play in four different positions on the line for the Trojans was Jonah Monheim (every position except left tackle).

TAKE YOUR PICK

... USC's secondary accounted for both Trojan interceptions and 115 interception-return yards.

... USC redshirt senior **S Prophet Brown** delivered the game-changing play by intercepting a pass at the USC 1-yard line and returning it 99 yards for a touchdown.

... Brown's 99-yard pick-six was the second interception and first pick-six of his collegiate career.

... He tied a 90-year old record: the longest interception return in USC history (Bud Langley, 1936, versus Notre Dame).

... The play produced a dramatic swing in a one-score game. With USC leading 20-14, Rutgers had driven to the Trojan 9-yard line and was positioned to take its first lead. Brown instead took the ball the length of the field to extend USC's advantage to 27-14.

... His TD ultimately provided the decisive points in USC's seven-point victory.

... The interception ended a 10-play Rutgers possession that had consumed more than four minutes and advanced 66 yards, immediately reversing the momentum in the Trojans' favor.

... Brown added four tackles, including two solo stops, to his 99-yard interception return TD.

... The performance came after Brown missed the entire 2025 season with a season-ending injury suffered during fall camp, making his career-defining play part of an impressive return to the field.

... **S Christian Pierce** delivered a complete performance with a game-high 11 tackles, 6 solo tackles, one INT and two pass breakups.

... Pierce intercepted QB Dylan Loneragan on Rutgers' second play of the game and returned it 16 yards to the Rutgers 24-yard line.

... USC scored two plays later, making Pierce's INT responsible for setting up the Trojans' first TD.

... The Ducks are averaging 49.7 points and 501.3 yards per game, including 340.7 passing yards per game.

... Oregon produced 726 yards, 43 first downs and 12 touchdowns in its 84-0 win over Portland State. The Ducks converted 11-of-14 third downs and scored touchdowns on all six of their red-zone trips.

... QB Dante Moore has completed 61-of-89 passes (68.5%) for 849 yards and nine touchdowns without an interception.

... Moore completed 19-of-23 passes for 280 yards and four touchdowns against Portland State before giving way to the reserves.

... Backup QB Dylan Raiola completed all 11 of his attempts for 124 yards and three touchdowns in his Oregon debut.

... Oregon has completed 70.0% of its passes and thrown 12 touchdowns without an interception through three games.

... WR Evan Stewart leads the Ducks with 15 receptions for 222 yards and two touchdowns, while WR Dakorien Moore has added 11 catches for 192 yards and a team-high three touchdowns.

... Oregon has spread the ball throughout its offense, with 16 different players recording a reception and 8 players catching a touchdown pass.

... RB Jordon Davison leads the rushing attack with 194 yards and four touchdowns on 33 carries, averaging 5.9 yards per attempt.

... Davison rushed for 81 yards and two touchdowns against Portland State as Oregon accumulated 273 rushing yards and five scores on the ground.

... The Ducks are averaging 160.7 rushing yards per game and 4.5 yards per carry but have allowed seven sacks through three games.

... Oregon's defense is allowing 310.3 yards and 22.0 points per game. Opponents have averaged just 110.7 rushing yards per game and 3.6 yards per carry.

... The Ducks held Portland State to 103 total yards, two rushing yards and five first downs in the shutout. The Vikings finished 0-for-9 on third down and committed four turnovers.

... Oregon has limited opponents to a 22.0% third-down conversion rate, allowing conversions on just nine of 41 attempts.

... The Ducks have intercepted five passes while allowing opposing quarterbacks to complete just 53.3% of their attempts.

... DB Jett Washington leads Oregon with two interceptions, while LB Devon Jackson returned an interception 96 yards for a touchdown earlier this season.

... DB Koi Perich leads the team with 16 tackles, followed by DL Bear Alexander with 15 and LBs Jerry Mixon and Aaron Flowers with 14 apiece.

... Oregon has recorded four sacks through three games. DL Teitum Tuioti leads the team with two tackles for loss, while Alexander, Tuioti, DL Matayo Uigalelei and DL Aydin Breland have each recorded a sack.

... P Bailey Ettridge is averaging 48.6 yards on nine punts, with five kicks of at least 50 yards and five placed inside the 20.

... K Gage Hurych is 3-for-3 on field-goal attempts with a long of 44 yards and 14-for-14 on PATs.

... Oregon has been penalized 24 times for 221 yards, an average of 73.7 penalty yards per game.

TV OUTLETS

... USC has appeared live on 35 different television broadcasting outlets. The Trojans have won on the air on all but 3 of those outlets (KTLA, Innovative and a local Memphis station). USC has appeared on live national, regional or local telecasts 609 times.

BLOOM IS THE HOME OF USC FOOTBALL

- Bloom is now the home of USC Football.
- Every aspect of the facility was designed specifically for football, from the size and scale to the equipment and finishes.
- Every square foot serves a football purpose.
- Football players will still go to the John McKay Center for academics and Little Galen for meals, but now the team has a true home of its own.
- Bloom also allows USC to reimagine the John McKay Center to benefit student-athletes from all 23 sports.

PURPOSE-DRIVEN DESIGN

- Every square foot has a purpose.
- Nothing is included simply for show.
- Every feature is designed to develop student-athletes to help the USC football team win championships.

TRADITION MEETS INNOVATION

- The building reflects the collision of USC's tradition and the future of college football.
- The program's history is celebrated and honored throughout the facility while embracing modern innovation needed to build a championship program for the future.

THE LOBBY

- Houses USC's 8 Heisman Trophies, 11 national championship trophies, individual player awards, a Pro Football Hall of Fame display with a gold jacket from the Hall, an NFL Draft Wall, and an immersive showroom.
- Tells the USC Football story in one place.
- Open to the public on gameday.
- Highlights team and togetherness.
- 11 crystal footballs were commissioned, and USC connected with the governing bodies of the College Football Awards to purchase trophies for the lobby.
- USC has never had all these items from its history in one place before – now fans will be able to engage with them.
- It's hard to win a trophy or a Hall of Fame jacket; it's equally hard to get these awards in hand for display. The work that the staff had to put in to obtain these items was immense.

Collaboration with USC School of Cinematic Arts

- Opportunity to collaborate with USC's School of Cinematic Arts to tell stories on the video board and immersive showroom in the lobby.
- Create content that builds excitement around game day.
- Opportunity to involve fans and donors in the storytelling experience.
- Fans will be able to see the content from outside the building.

LEVEL 1 – ALL ABOUT THE PLAYER

The building was designed around the player.

Player Experience & Player Development

- Everything starts with the player experience.
- Player development was the driving philosophy behind every decision.
- The facility supports recruiting, retention and development.
- It's about attracting elite talent, developing them and helping

them succeed.

- The goal is simple: train players to win on the field.

Natural Light

- The previous facility had virtually no natural light.
- Bloom features 30-foot-tall garage doors that open directly onto the practice field.
- Sports medicine and recovery areas are filled with natural light.
- The design intentionally places players in environments with daylight and energy.

Recruiting & Player Development

- This facility is not exclusively a recruiting tool – it's about player development.
- It demonstrates USC's commitment to investing in its student-athletes.
- It helps recruit, retain and develop elite talent.

Performance Technology – Weight Room & Sport Science

- The facility is centered around measurable player development.
- USC is the first collegiate program to have Nike Strength custom weight racks.
- Perch technology tracks every lift – bar speed, velocity-based training and power and explosiveness.
- Video boards in the weight room showcase stats and foster a competitive environment.
- The weight room's adjacency to the turf field lets players carry what they're doing on the rack out to football-specific movement on the field – central to Coach Truman Carroll's training philosophy.
- Catapult performance vests support data-driven development throughout the program.

Fueling Station

- Located right outside the weight room; houses a dedicated space for nutrition.
- The Bod Pod now has its own home rather than being housed in an office.

Locker Room & Players' Lounge

- Lockers are full-recline, promoting rest and recovery.
- A barbershop promotes team bonding.

Equipment

- USC has never had a loading dock before – now it does.
- Level 1 includes a significantly expanded equipment space.

Walk-Through Room

- Features a 45-foot-wide video wall.
- Allows players to get mental repetitions before stepping onto the field, catering to different learning styles and optimizing rest.

LEVEL 2 – WHERE THE PROGRAM COMES TOGETHER

Players are on Level 1, coaches are on Level 3, and Level 2 is where the program meets together.

Learning & Development

- Three learning environments work together: the Meeting Room, the Walk-Through Room, and the Practice Field – for verbal, visual and participatory learning.
- The progression helps players learn faster, get valuable mental reps, accelerate development for freshmen and transfers and better understand the cerebral side of football.

Walk-Through Room – Event-Ready Space

- This building will help generate revenue, including this room.
- Presentation-ready event space.

••• Pushed to the furthest edges of the building, away from coaches and players.

••• Events can be hosted in this space and on the surrounding deck without disrupting players on Level 1.

- A true campus asset.

Team Room

- Two-story team room equipped with theater-quality surround sound.
- USC has never had a space that fits the entire team and staff.

Meeting Rooms

- All position meeting rooms (12 total) are located on Level 2.

Recovery & Sport Science

- Recovery is a major competitive advantage – infrastructure USC previously lacked.
- Built in collaboration with a sports scientist who holds a medical doctorate from Keck Medicine.
- Recovery technology matches what's used in the NFL and MLB.
- Amenities were cherry-picked to keep players healthy through all 16 games – “you can't peak in Week 3 and taper off in Week 11.”
- Recovery room features: float beds, infrared therapy beds, sleep pods, AI-powered massage chairs from Japan, premium hot and cold plunge areas that feel like a luxury resort, and zero-gravity chairs.

Creative & Content

- Represents an investment in the future of the program.
- Three dedicated creative studios built to support content creation and storytelling.
- Designed with future student-athlete content opportunities and NIL opportunities in mind, as well as revenue-generating production opportunities.

Additional Level 2 Program Spaces

- NFL alumni locker room.
- Dedicated space for NFL scouts.
- Recruiting terrace overlooking the practice fields.

LEVEL 3 – COACHES & STAFF EXPERIENCE

The building serves as the home base for the entire football program. Coaches

- McKay was built for a much smaller staff.
- Bloom creates a modern workspace that reflects today's football operations.

Office Design

- Defensive coaches overlook the practice field.
- Offensive coaches overlook the atrium.
- Glass walls create openness and collaboration.

Staff Amenities

- Multiple fueling stations throughout the building.
- Kitchen and lounge areas are designed to encourage staff interaction.
- Family-oriented environment that feels like home.
- Coaches have access to wellness amenities to help them stay refreshed during the long season.

The Goal

- Make USC the choice destination for coaches.
- Create an environment where elite coaches want to work.

Football Front Office

- Dedicated front office suite.

- Space for the General Manager, personnel staff, graduate assistants and student workers.
- Built for collaboration, film study and roster management.
- Located directly across from the coaching staff.
- Designed to mirror NFL front office operations.
- Provides room for continued program growth.

Rooftop Deck

- Like the Walk-Through Room, it's an event-ready space.
- Accessible without ever interacting with coaches or players.
- Houses a large video board, TVs, a pickleball court, ping pong tables and pool tables.
- Doubles as a second players' lounge.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA ADVANTAGE

Lean into what makes USC unique.

- Hollywood Sign and Downtown LA views from Level 3.
- Maximizes outdoor space wherever possible.
- Indoor and outdoor spaces take full advantage of the Southern California environment.
- The building's exterior and surrounding landscape are part of the experience.
- Extensive glass keeps the building open and visually accessible.

BRANDING & USC IDENTITY

Every branding element was intentional.

- Themes throughout the building include Fight On, team accomplishment, championship culture and player development.

Highlights

- National Championship displays greet players upon entry to the team room.
- The All-American Walk celebrates both individual and team success.
- A display showcasing undefeated seasons at the Coliseum promotes competition.
- Specific messages were intentionally emphasized at specific locations throughout the building.

PRACTICE FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS

The project extends beyond the building itself.

- Two full-length outdoor practice fields – one turf, one natural grass.
- New high-tech cameras for the video team to promote efficiency.
- New audio system to simulate crowd noise.
- New lights.
- New scoreboards.
- Enhanced practice fields.
- A fully integrated football performance center and practice complex.

CONSTRUCTION & PARTNERSHIP

- Clark Construction was a key partner on the project.
- Art Vasconcelos, VP at Clark Construction, is a proud USC alumnus managing the project – he was a student manager under head coach Pete Carroll and served as head student manager his senior year.
- It's a green building anticipated to achieve LEED Platinum certification, with rooftop solar infrastructure and high-performance, energy-efficient building systems.
- This is one key piece of Athletics West – USC enhanced and invested in multiple programs' facilities.
- With football in its own space, training times open for all other sports.
- Utilizes an innovative mass timber structural system – exposed Cross-Laminated Timber (CLT) and glulam elements – placing Bloom among a select group of collegiate athletic facilities built this way,

creating warm, naturally daylit interiors while supporting large-span flexibility for a modern football program.

Nuvean-Deniz led UCLA to Women's College World Series appearances in each of her four years, including 1999 when the Bruins captured the NCAA Championship. She is in the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame. His father, Mark, played football at Northern Arizona.
 - **QB Will Doherty**'s grandfather, Bill Bond, was the 1964 NCAA Men's Tennis Doubles Champion at USC and was a member of the Trojans' 1962, 1963 and 1964 NCAA Championship Teams. Bond was a two-time First Team All-American in 1962 and 1964. He competed on the USC men's tennis from 1962-64. Bond was inducted into the ITA Men's Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame in 2003.

... **QB Sam Huard's** father, Damon, played quarterback at Washington, lettering from 1993 through 1995, and finished his career as Washington's all-time leading passer. He went on to 12-year career in the NFL, winning two Super Bowls with the New England Patriots. He currently works in the Washington athletics department as Director of Community & External Relations and as a Special Advisor to the Athletic Director. His uncle, Brock, was also a starting quarterback at Washington (1996-98) and broke his older brother's passing yards record before playing for the Colts and Seahawks in the NFL. He is now a college football analyst on FOX. USC offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Luke Huard is also his uncle. His sister, Brooke, is a redshirt freshman volleyball player at Washington.

... **LB Talanoa Ili's** father, Glen, played football at Mt. SAC, winning a state and national championship in 1997. His team was inducted into the Mt. SAC Hall of Fame in 2017. He also played football at New Mexico Highlands, winning in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Championship in 1999. Ili was named to the All-RMAC Team. His mother, Teulia, played basketball at Mt. SAC. His uncles, Talalemotu, (Azusa Pacific) and Willhans (Utah State/Idaho State/New Mexico Highlands) both played college football.

... **OL Cash Jacobsen's** mother, J'Anna played basketball at Oklahoma, and his father, Seth, wrestled at Oklahoma.

... **QB James Johnson's** father, Erik, played football at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo.

... **DE Simote Katoanga** has two brothers who played college football: Rocky (Washington State) and Spencer (UNLV).

... **CB Brandon Lockhart's** brother, Justin, played football at San José State and was an undrafted free agent who signed with the Kansas City Chiefs.

... **QB Jayden Maiava's** uncle is former Trojan linebacker, Kaluka Maiava.

... **TE Fisher Melton's** father, Tracy, was a long snapper at USC.

... **WR Trent Mosley's** family is very athletic. His older brother, Emmett V, is a wide receiver at Texas. His older sister, Jalyn, played soccer at Iowa. Both of his parents attended Notre Dame with his father, Emmett IV, playing on the football team and his mother, Cindy, starring on the soccer team, winning the Herman Trophy, which goes to the nation's top soccer player.

... **LB Ryan O'Connell's** father, Robert, was a linebacker on the football team at TCU.

... **S Christian Pierce** and **CB Carrington Pierce's** father, Colby, played basketball at Austin Peay. Their other brother, Camren, played basketball at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo.

... **LB Ta'Mere Robinson's** brother, Bruce, played football at Clarion University.

... **CB Isaiah Rubin's** cousin, Jordan Anderson, is a freshman wide receiver at Oregon State.

... **CB Shawn Sehra's** brother, Sunil, played ice hockey at the University of Toronto.

... **WR Cameron Sermons** and **CB RJ Sermons'** father Rodney Sermons, was a running back at USC from 1994-97.

... **DE Braylan Shelby's** father, Shannon, is a former Arkansas defensive end and his brother, Ty, played defensive end at Louisiana Monroe.

... **DE Ty Swanson's** father, Pat, played tight end and long snapper at USC.

... **OL Hayden Treter's** father Jon, was a linebacker at Colorado.

... **S Kennedy Urlacher's** father, Brian, was an All-American football player at New Mexico. He then was drafted with the No. 9 overall pick in the 2000 NFL Draft by the Chicago Bears. While in Chicago, he was named the 2000 NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, the 2005 NFL Defensive Player of the Year, a four-time First Team All-Pro and an eight-time Pro Bowl selection. His number, 44, is retired at New Mexico.

... **DT Alex VanSumeren's** brother, Ben, played football at Michigan State and went on to play in the NFL for the Philadelphia Eagles.

... **DE Luke Waffle's** father, David, played football at Duke. His brother, Owen, is currently a redshirt sophomore defensive tackle at Duke.

... **P William Weisberg's** mother Jillion, was a dual-sport athlete at SMU, competing in soccer and track.

... **CB Jontez Williams'** father, Andrew Williams played football at Miami and went on to play in the NFL for the San Francisco 49ers and the Denver Broncos.

... **CB Marcelles Williams** has two older brothers who played college football: Max who was a safety at USC and Macen who was a defensive back at Arizona State. His father, Maxzell, played defensive back at Nevada.

... **WR Zacharyus Williams'** brother, New Zealand, was a linebacker at San Diego State.

... **WR Seth Zamora's** brother, Josiah, was also a wide receiver on the USC football team.

... Head coach **Lincoln Riley's** brother, Garrett, is the quarterbacks coach at Missouri, after previously coaching at Clemson, TCU, SMU, Appalachian State, Kansas, East Carolina and Augustana College and playing quarterback at Texas Tech and Stephen F. Austin.

... Defensive line coach **Shaun Nua's** cousin, laneta Le'i, played softball (first base) for 4 seasons (2003-06) at BYU, where she was a 3-time All-American and then served as an assistant coach (2007-13). His cousin, Futi Tavana, was a middle blocker on BYU's men's volleyball team (2009-12), where he was a 2-time All-American first teamer (2011-12) and then played for the USA National Team (2012-16). His cousin, Devin Tavana, was an offensive lineman at Southern Utah (2010-11).

... When **Quincy Watts** was named USC's director of track and field and cross country in June of 2021, he became the third former Trojan football player to be USC's head track coach. Watts, most noted as a 2-time gold medalist (400 meters and 1600-meter relay) at the 1992 Olympics, was a wide receiver on the 1990 USC football team (he didn't get into a game). Jess Hill and Jess Mortensen (who both lettered in football as running backs in 1928 and 1929, including on the 1928 national champs) guided the Trojan tracksters; Hill did so in 1949-50 and in 1962 (winning 2 NCAA titles), while Mortensen did so from 1951 to 1961 (getting 7 NCAA crowns).

... USC football boasts some impressive track athletes:

... **S Prophet Brown** was a member of the California state champion 400-meter relay team and has personal bests of 10.90 in the 100 meters and 22.71 in the 200.

... **S Alex Graham** recording a 10.9 in the 100-meter dash as a junior at IMG Academy. As a youth athlete, he took first in the Boys 10u Triathlon (high jump, shot put, 400) at the AAU Junior Olympic Games in 2017.

... **WR Tanook Hines** posted times of 10.45 in the 100 and 20.71 in the 200 (one of the best marks in the nation) as a junior which earned silver in Texas 6A. He placed third at regionals with a 10.53 100.

... **WR Romero Ison** ran a personal best 10.85 in the 100 in 2023 at the Adidas Outdoor Nationals during his sophomore year. He also broke a school record and PR for his 22.15 as a sophomore in the Varsity 200.

... **CB Chasen Johnson** also ran track and was part of a 4x400 team that won the regional title and took second at the Florida 4A State Meet. He also competed in the 100m where he posted an 11.31 time in 2022.

... **CB RJ Sermons** was also a talented sprinter who posted times of 10.30 in the 100m and 20.88 in the 200m as a junior in 2025. At the 2025 Baseline League Track Championships, Sermons placed first in the 100m with a 10.30 time and the 200m with a time of 20.88. Both times were the second-best mark in California in those respective races in the 2025 track season. Sermons also won the CIF Division 1 Championship in both events as well running a 10.36-100m and 20.96-

200m. As a sophomore in 2024, he recorded personal best times of 10.48-100-meters and 21.34-200m. Sermons finished fifth in the CIF Division I Final with a time of 10.70-100m and sixth in the 200m with a 21.51 time. As a freshman in 2023, Sermons ran a personal best time in the 100m of 10.85 and 22.60-200m. He also competed on the 4x100m relay team that finished seventh in the California State Championships with a 41.82 time, and he had season best time of 41.39.

••• As high schoolers, USC football players also competed in a wide range of other sports. In addition to track and field (above), they played primarily basketball (**S Prophet Brown**, **DE Kameryn Crawford**, **OL Chase Deniz**, **CB Derek Deniz**, **QB Will Doherty**, **OL Aaron Dunn**, **LB Austin Engroff**, **DE Zuriah Fisher**, **TE Josiah Jefferson**, **TE Walter Matthews**, **RB Cian McKelvey**, **OL Elijah Paige**, **CB Carrington Pierce**, **OL Tobias Raymond**, **DE Jadyn Ramos**, **LB Ta'Mere Robinson**, **CB Shawn Sehra**, **OL Kannon Smith**, **TE Carson Tabaracci**, **WR Roderick Tezeno**, **TE Taniela Tupou**, **OL Elijah Vaikona**, **LB Jadyn Walker**, **WR Luc Weaver** and **CB Jontez Williams**) and baseball (**TE Manoa Leiato**, **OL Tobias Raymond** and **OL Kannon Smith**). SCHEDULE

••• The Trojans opened the 2026 season with a Week Zero game on Aug. 29 at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum against San José State. The Trojans won 42-36, and now USC holds a 7-0 all-time record over the Spartans, who are led by head coach Ken Niumatalolo.

••• USC then shutout Fresno State of the Pac-12 Conference 39-0 on Sept. 5. The Bulldogs, who are led by former USC assistant head coach for defense / linebackers coach Matt Entz, returns to the Coliseum for a fifth time in series history. USC is now 5-1 all-time against Fresno State (not including 1 win vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 6-1).

••• USC wrapped up nonconference play and the team's three-game homestand on Sept. 12 with a matchup against Louisiana. USC defeated the Ragin' Cajuns, led by head coach Michael Desormeaux, 49-30.

••• USC opened Big Ten Conference play on the road at Rutgers on Sept. 19. USC won the game 42-35. It was USC's first trip to Piscataway, N. J. and SHI Stadium.

••• The Trojans return home to host Oregon on Sept. 26 for the Coliseum's Big Ten opener. USC holds a 38-24-2 all-time lead in its series with Oregon (not including 1 win vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 39-24-2), last falling to the Ducks 27-42 at Autzen Stadium in 2025.

••• Another home game awaits the Trojans as they welcome a familiar foe, Washington, to Los Angeles on Oct. 3. USC boasts a 51-32-4 record over the Huskies (not including 1 win vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 52-32-4), last falling to them 21-26 in Seattle in 2024.

••• USC then travels back to the east coast to challenge Penn State and new head coach Matt Campbell on Oct. 10. The Trojans have not visited Happy Valley since 1994. USC leads the series with the Nittany Lions 6-5 all-time, last falling to them 30-33 in an overtime game in the Coliseum in 2024.

••• After enjoying a bye week Oct. 17, USC travels to Wisconsin on Oct. 24. The Trojans are 7-1 versus the Badgers, last defeating them 38-21 in the Coliseum in 2024.

••• The Trojans return home to welcome Ohio State to the Coliseum on Halloween, Oct. 31. USC is 13-10-1 against the Buckeyes, last falling to them 7-24 in the 2017 Cotton Bowl at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

••• After its second bye week on Nov. 7, USC travels to Bloomington, Ind. to challenge the reigning national champion, Indiana, on Nov. 14. The Trojans boast a 4-0 record over the Hoosiers and haven't visited Bloomington since 1981 when USC defeated Indiana 21-0.

••• USC returns to the West Coast for its final home game of the 2026 campaign on Nov. 21, welcoming Maryland to the Coliseum for the first time. USC is 0-1 versus the Terrapins, falling to them 28-29 in 2024.

••• USC wraps Big Ten play by challenging crosstown rival UCLA and new Bruin head coach Bob Chesney on Nov. 28 at the Rose Bowl. USC leads its series with UCLA, 52-34-7 (not including Troy's 2004 and 2005 victories that were vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 54-34-7).

••• The 2025 season will conclude with the annual Big Ten Football Championship Game on Dec. 5, which will feature the top two teams in the overall conference standings at the end of the regular season, with the winner earning the Big Ten Championship. Tiebreaking procedures will be announced at a later date.

PROJANS IN THE NFL

••• With its outstanding football heritage, it's no surprise that USC players have made quite a mark in the pros.

••• USC is second behind Notre Dame's 544 for most NFL draft picks produced (536), not counting 28 picks by the AFL before it merged with the NFL. USC was the first school with 500 NFL draft picks.

••• USC and Michigan are the only schools with an NFL draftee every year since 1939.

••• USC has the longest active streak (25 years) with a player drafted in the Top 3 rounds. USC has the most picks in the common draft era (since 1967), with 370 (next is Ohio State's 366 and Notre Dame's 330).

••• There have been 548 USC players who since 1920 played in the NFL (or its sister leagues, the AFL or All-America Football Conference).

••• USC's 87 first round NFL draft picks is second most behind Ohio State's 99. With Williams' No. 1 overall selection in 2024, USC holds the record for most players (6) selected as the top pick of the NFL draft (Ron Yary in 1968, O.J. Simpson in 1969, Ricky Bell in 1977, Keyshawn Johnson in 1996, Carson Palmer in 2003 and Caleb Williams in 2024).

••• USC and Oklahoma are the only schools to have the No. 1 pick for 2 consecutive years (Yary and Simpson).

••• USC has had three of the most highly-drafted classes in history. The 1953 class (following the 1952 season) had 15 players drafted while both the 1975 and 1977 classes had 14 players selected. USC had more players selected in the 2011 (9), 2009 (11), 2008 (10), 2006 (11) and 1990 (10) drafts than any school.

••• USC had more players drafted than any school in the 10-year periods from 2002-11 and 2005-14 (69, 6 more than LSU) and the 5-year period from 2007-11.

••• USC's 12 first round picks in the 1990s tied for third in the nation with Tennessee; 8 of those Trojan first rounders were selected in the Top 10.

••• In the decade of the 1980s, Troy had more first round picks than any school (16). USC's 5 first round picks in the 1968 draft was an NFL record for 36 years.

••• A Trojan has appeared in all but 8 of the 60 Super Bowls (there have been 120 USC representatives overall).

- Three Trojans (Lynn Swann in 1976, Marcus Allen in 1984 and Malcolm Smith in 2014) have been the Super Bowl MVP.
- In 1977, 9 USC alums played in the Super Bowl.
- Trojans have been selected to play in the Pro Bowl 250 times (a USC alum has appeared in every Pro Bowl [except the 2024 Pro Bowl] since the game's inception in 1951; there was no game in 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic but a team was chosen, however no Trojan was picked). USC has the most Pro Bowl selections in history.
- Fourteen former USC players (most of any other school) and 4 ex-assistant coaches are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

LOUISIANA NOTES

- USC closed out non-conference play with a 49-30 victory over Louisiana late on Saturday evening.
- USC opens the 2026 season 3-0.
- The Trojans accumulated 483 yards of total offense, including 269 passing and 214 rushing, for their first 200-yard rushing and 200-yard passing performance of the season.
- USC averaged 6.8 yards per play while running 71 offensive plays and controlling the ball for 33:14.
- The Trojans converted 11-of-15 third downs (73.3%), their highest conversion rate of the season.
- USC converted its only fourth-down attempt and finished 4-for-4 in the red zone, with all 4 trips resulting in TDs.
- The Trojans scored 7 TDs: 5 passing, 1 rushing and 1 punt return.
- The Trojans punted only once and did not allow a sack.
- Louisiana did not record a first down in the first quarter. USC possessed the ball for 11:01 and outgained the Ragin' Cajuns by 132 yards during the period.
- USC is outscoring its opponents 86 to 10 in the first half of games so far in 2026.
- Maiava went 19-of-29 for 261 yards with a career-high 5 TDs and 1 INT against Louisiana.
- He posted a 191.1 passing efficiency rating while averaging 9.0 yards per attempt and 13.7 yards per completion.
- On third-down pass plays, Maiava completed 8-of-11 attempts for 129 yards and 4 TDs, with all 8 completions moving the chains or reaching the end zone.
- Maiava's performance helped USC produce 483 yards of offense, earn 25 first downs, convert 73.3% of its third downs and score TDs on all 4 of its red-zone opportunities.
- Freshman **TE Mark Bowman** recorded 6 receptions for 83 yards (13.8 avg.).
- This marks the most receiving yards by a tight end in a single game since Anthony McCoy recorded 153 yards against Notre Dame in 2009.
- Bowman scored twice for the Trojans, marking the first 2 touchdowns of his USC career.
- The last tight end to score 2 TDs for the Trojans in a single game was Josh Falo on Oct. 15, 2022 in a 42-43 loss to Utah.
- This is the second week in a row that a freshman has scored 2 receiving TDs in a single game for the Trojans.
- With 1 minute remaining in the first quarter, Bowman made a SportsCenter-worthy highlight as he hauled in a pass from Maiava over the middle, turned upfield and spectacularly hurdled two Louisiana defenders in a single bound. Bowman landed on his feet and powered ahead for nine more yards, completing a 35-yard reception that moved USC from its own 41-yard line to the Louisiana 24.
- Per PFF, Bowman recorded a 90.3 offense grade (second in the Power Four & first in the Big Ten among TEs) and a 90.8 receiving grade (third in the Power Four & first in the Big Ten among TEs).
- Bowman was named to the PFF Week 2 Big Ten Team of the Week.
- Freshman **WR/RET Trent Mosley** continued to impress the college football world.

- In another spectacular showing, Mosley scored a TD on an 86-yard punt return with 1:24 left in the first half.
- The last Trojan to return a punt for a TD was Zachariah Branch when he returned a 75-yarder against Stanford on Sept. 9, 2023.
- This also marked the longest punt return by a Trojan since Nelson Agholor returned a 93-yarder for a TD against California in 2013.
- Mosley continued to impress as he opened the second half with a TD on a 21-yard acrobatic reception.
- This marked Mosley's second TD of the game, his fourth receiving TD as a Trojan, and his third-straight game with a receiving TD.
- Prior to Mosley, just five Big Ten freshmen have caught a TD pass in each of their first 3 career games since 2000: Jeremiah Smith (Ohio State, 2024), Jackson Anthrop (Purdue, 2017), Ted Bolser (Indiana, 2010), Deon Butler (Penn State, 2005) and James Hardy (Indiana, 2005).
- The last Trojan to record a receiving TD and return a punt for a TD in a single game was Tyler Vaughns against Arizona State in 2018. Vaughns caught a 48-yard TD pass from QB Jack Sears and returned a 82-yard punt for a TD.
- Freshman **WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt** caught 3 passes for 43 yards and his second TD of the season.
- **WR Zacharyus Williams'** only reception was a 44-yard TD, the first TD of his USC career.
- Williams' 44-yard TD came on third-and-14 and was USC's longest offensive play of the game.
- **TE Tucker Ashcraft's** first USC reception was a 12-yard conversion on fourth-and-3.
- USC's tight ends combined for 7 receptions, 95 yards and 2 TDs.
- USC generated 117 yards after the catch, representing 43.5% of its 269 passing yards.
- **RB King Miller** rushed for a game-high 128 yards and 1 TD on 18 carries, averaging 7.1 yards per attempt.
- Miller produced five runs of at least 10 yards, including a game-long 29-yard run.
- Miller surpassed 100 yards for the first time in 2026 and recorded USC's first individual 100-yard rushing performance of the season.
- Miller was named to the PFF Week 2 Big Ten Team of the Week.
- **RB Waymond Jordan** added 47 yards on 10 carries and caught 1 pass for 5 yards, giving him 52 yards from scrimmage.
- **RB Shahn Alston** averaged 6.8 yards per carry, gaining 34 yards on 5 attempts with a long of 15.
- USC's three primary running backs combined for 209 yards and 1 TD on 33 carries, averaging 6.3 yards per attempt.
- The Trojan offensive line kept **QB Jayden Maiava** clean throughout the game, with 6 offensive linemen playing at least 30 snaps and earning PFF grades of 70.0 or better.
- They also powered a rushing attack in which **RB King Miller** averaged 7.1 yards per carry and Waymond Jordan averaged 4.7 yards per carry.
- USC's offensive line did not allow a sack on 31 team pass attempts.
- The offensive line helped USC convert 11-of-15 third downs and its only fourth-down attempt.
- The entire offensive line earned PFF Week 2 National Offensive Line of the Week.
- **OL Elijah Paige** and **OL Hayden Treter** earned placement on the PFF Week 2 National Team of the Week, while Paige, Treter and **OL Tobias Raymond** were named to the PFF Week 2 Big Ten Team of the Week.
- Per PFF, Treter earned a 91.4 run block grade (first in the Power Four and first among Big Ten offensive guards).
- Per PFF, Paige earned a 90.6 offense grade (first in the Power Four and first among Big Ten offensive tackles).
- USC freshman **DE Luke Waffle** delivered a disruptive, highly active performance in the Trojans' 49-30 victory over Louisiana.
- Waffle led USC with a career-high 7 tackles, including a game-high 6 solo stops and 1.0 tackle for loss.

- Despite lining up along the defensive front, he finished as the Trojans' leading tackler and recorded a tackle on seven of Louisiana's 52 offensive plays.

- Wafle consistently defeated blocks and affected plays at or near the line of scrimmage.

- His first-quarter tackle for loss dropped Louisiana RB Steven Blanco for a one-yard loss and helped force a three-and-out immediately after USC took its first lead.

- Six of Wafle's seven tackles came against the run, and four of his five solo run stops limited Louisiana to two yards or fewer.

- Wafle's combination of penetration, pursuit and tackling allowed the freshman to impact the game well beyond his official stat sheet total.

- Wafle became the first USC defensive lineman to lead the team outright in tackles in a game since Tuli Tuipulotu recorded 7 against Stanford in 2021.

- **DT Jide Abasiri** tied for second on the team with a career-high 5 tackles, including 3 solo stops.

- Abasiri was named to the PFF Week 2 Big Ten Team of the Week.

- **DE Zuriah Fisher** recorded USC's only sack, dropping Louisiana QB Lunch Winfield for a 4-yard loss.

- Fisher's sack also produced the game's only forced fumble.

- **LB Deven Bryant** recorded a career-high 5 tackles, all solo.

- **LB Desman Stephens II** added 5 tackles, including 3 solo stops.

- **S Christian Pierce** recorded 3 tackles, while LB Jadyn Walker also finished with 3.

- **CB Jontez Williams** recorded USC's only pass breakup.

- The Trojans did not allow a completion longer than 37 yards.

- USC held Louisiana to 16 completions and 8 passing first downs.

- **K Caden Chittenden** converted all 7 PAT attempts.

- **K Ryon Sayeri** recorded 4 touchbacks on 8 kickoffs.

- In the third quarter, **P Lachlan Carrigan** booted a 50-yard punt, the longest of his Trojan career, and the only punt of the game.

FRESNO STATE NOTES

- The Trojans secured a statement win with a 39-0 shutout of Fresno State under the Friday night lights on Sept. 4

- The 39-0 win marked USC's first shutout since defeating Utah State 48-0 in 2024. It was USC's second shutout under **Lincoln Riley**.

- USC held its opponent to zero points in the first half in back-to-back games to open the 2026 season. This is the first time the Trojans have held their opponent scoreless in the first half in back-to-back games since the 2009 season. On Sept. 26, the Trojans shut out Washington State in the first half of play, and on Oct. 3, they also shut out California in the first half.

- Fresno State was held scoreless in a game for the first time since the team lost to San Diego State 0-23 on Oct. 25, 2025.

- USC is the first FBS team since at least 1996 to throw for 400 yards and complete at least 93% of its passes.

- USC had 13 different players catch a pass.

- Five different Trojans recorded a reception of at least 20 yards.

- USC outgained Fresno State 552-116, a margin of 436 yards.

- The Trojans possessed the ball for 38:52, including 13:15 of the third quarter

- Maiava went 23-of-25 (.920) for 349 yards and 3 TDs.

- Maiava's 92.0% completion percentage is the highest single-game completion percentage by a USC quarterback since at least 1995 (minimum 25 attempts). He broke the mark he set last week against San José State (86.2% going 25-of-29).

- His 92.0% completion percentage was just three percentage points shy of USC's single-game record for a passer with at least 15 completions: Matt Barkley's 19-of-20 performance (.950) against Colorado in 2012.

- Maiava completed 17-of-18 passes for 284 yards and 3 TDs in the

first half.

- He was a perfect 8-for-8 for 166 yards and 2 TDs in the second quarter.

- Maiava had a stretch of 15 straight completions. The last time a USC quarterback had 15+ consecutive completions in a single game prior to Saturday was 17 by former Trojan and Heisman Trophy winner Caleb Williams on Sept. 30, 2023 at Colorado in a 48-41 win. Last week against San José State, Maiava had a stretch of 14-straight completions.

- Maiava was named **Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week** for his performance against Fresno State.

- The 68-yard TD throw from Maiava to **WR Trent Mosley** was his longest completion and TD toss since Sept. 6, 2025 against Georgia Southern when he completed a 74-yard TD pass.

- Freshman **WR Trent Mosley** recorded 4 receptions for 104 yards (26.0 avg.) and 2 TDs in USC's 39-0 shutout of Fresno State.

- Mosley's 68-yard TD with 12:27 left in the second quarter pushed the Trojans ahead 14-0.

- Mosley's 68-yard touchdown reception was USC's longest play of the game.

- Mosley scored a second TD on a 9-yard pass from Maiava with 4:07 left in the second quarter.

- Mosley is the first USC freshman with 100+ yards in consecutive games since former Trojan

WR Drake London accomplished the feat in 2019 (in a win over Cal; 6 rec. for 111 yards and a win over UCLA; 8 rec. for 142 yards).

- Fellow freshman **WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt** led the Trojans in receptions with 6 and notched 102 receiving yards (17.0 avg.).

- This was the first time that two freshmen receivers have recorded 100+ yards in the same game since records available in 1973.

- It also marked the first time USC had two 100-yard receivers in one game since Mario Williams recorded 145 yards and Jordan Addison had 106 against Utah on Oct. 15, 2022.

- Freshman **TE Mark Bowman** tallied a career-high of 30 receiving yards.

- Back from injury, **WR Tanook Hines**' first reception of the season in the first quarter resulted in an 8-yard TD. This marked Hines' third career touchdown as a Trojan.

- **TE Walter Matthews**, with his 6-6, 305-pound frame, showed off his hands as he made his first catch as a Trojan with a 12-yard reception.

- **RB Waymond Jordan** led the Trojans with 11 carries for 67 rushing yards (6.1 avg.) and 1 TD.

- Freshman **RB Deshonne Redeaux** scored his first career TD as a Trojan on a 5-yard rush.

- USC's offensive line kept the pocket clean throughout the Trojans' victory over Fresno State, allowing zero sacks on 31 pass attempts.

- Behind the unit, USC's quarterbacks completed 29-of-31 passes (.935) for 412 yards and 3 TDs, while the offense accumulated 552 total yards and averaged 8.1 yards per play.

- The Trojans recorded 27 first downs and controlled the ball for 38:52, including 20:45 in the second half.

- USC's defense held Fresno State to 116 yards of total offense. That is the fewest total yards allowed since USC held Notre Dame to 91 total yards on Nov. 29, 2008.

- The Trojans allowed only 39 rushing yards on 29 attempts, an average of 1.3 yards per carry against Fresno State.

- Fresno State completed only 7 passes, recorded 9 first downs and averaged just 2.6 yards per play.

- USC's 412 passing yards alone were nearly four times Fresno State's total offensive output.

- The Trojans recorded 5 sacks for 28 yards and 7 tackles for loss totaling 34 yards.

- Fresno State did not produce a play longer than 17 yards.

- Fresno State was 0-for-3 on third down in the second half and 0-for-1 on fourth down.

- The Bulldogs reached the red zone only once, advancing to the

USC 8-yard line on their final possession before being stopped on downs.

- Fresno State possessed the ball for only 1:45 in the third quarter, compared with USC's 13:15.

- Four different Trojans recorded at least one sack: **S Kennedy Urlacher**, **S Alex Graham**, **DE Jadyne Ramos** and **DT Jide Abasiri**.

- Though he only recorded one tackle, **DT Jide Abasiri's** impact goes far beyond the stat sheet. His penetration and disruption was the catalyst for several of the big plays made by the Trojan defense.

- Freshman **DE Luke Wafle** continues to impress with his physicality. He recorded 2 tackles against the Bulldogs.

- **DT Floyd Boucard** recorded his first career fumble recovery against Fresno State.

- Fresno State reached the USC 8-yard line on its final possession, but USC **DE Jadyne Ramos** recorded a sack on fourth-and-goal to preserve the shutout. Ramos finished with 3 tackles, a sack and a tackle for loss.

SAN JOSÉ STATE NOTES

- With the 42-26 victory over the Spartans, No. 14 USC begins the season 1-0. San José State opens the 2026 campaign at 0-1.

- Riley is now 10-0 in season openers.

- USC produced 505 yards of total offense, including 341 passing and 164 rushing.

- The Trojans recorded 29 first downs, converted 9-of-13 third downs (.692) and held the ball for 37:15.

- USC scored TDs on 4 of its first 5 possessions and built a 28-0 halftime lead.

- USC led 35-3 through three quarters and held San José State without a TD for the first 45 minutes.

- The Trojans produced 4 rushing TDs, scored by four different players: **QB Jayden Maiava**, **RB Riley Wormley**, **RB King Miller** and **RB Shahn Alston**.

- USC also recorded 2 receiving TDs from **WR Trent Mosley** and **WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt**.

- USC put together scoring drives of 77, 91, 80, 74 and 75 yards. Five of its six TD drives covered at least 74 yards.

- USC had only five penalties for 34 yards and did not lose a fumble.

- Riley's average points per game against Group of Five teams is 55 points.

- Riley is 75-15 when scoring 30 points or more and 52-7 when playing at home.

- The temperature at kickoff was 94 degrees. This tied for the hottest USC game in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since Riley's debut in 2022, when it was also 94 degrees in the Coliseum on Sept. 3 in a 66-14 win over Rice.

- USC is the only FBS program to win 20 season openers since 2006. Ohio State has won all 20 openers played from 2006-2025, but its 2010 win was vacated.

- Maiava finished the game going 25-of-29 (.862) for 286 yards and 2 TDs. He also scored 1 TD on the ground.

- Maiava completed 86.2% of his passes, the highest single-game completion percentage of his USC career.

- His 86.2% completion percentage is also the highest single-game completion percentage by a USC quarterback since at least 1995 (minimum 25 attempts).

- Maiava was named the AP National Player of the Week for his performance against San José State.

- Maiava completed passes to nine different receivers. As a team, USC had 10 players record a reception.

- Maiava is now No. 2 among USC quarterbacks in the last 30 seasons with most career games with 200+ passing yards, 1 passing TD and 1 rushing TD with 6 games behind Caleb Williams with 12. Matt

Leinart and Carson Palmer each had 5 career games with those stats.

- He scored the Trojans' first TD of the season on a 1-yard run with 8:55 left in the first quarter, which marked his 11th rushing TD as a Trojan.

- Maiava had a stretch of 14 straight completions. The last time a USC quarterback had 14+ consecutive completions in a single game prior to Saturday was 17 by former Trojan Caleb Williams on Sept. 30, 2023, at Colorado in a 48-41 win.

- Maiava surpassed 5,000 career passing yards as a Trojan on Saturday. He now has 5,198 career passing yards at USC.

- He recorded an 88.1 PFF grade against San José State.

- **WR Trent Mosely** finished Saturday's game with 7 receptions for 118 yards (16.9 avg.) and 1 TD.

- Mosely scored the first TD of his Trojan career with a 14-yard pass from Maiava with 2:28 left in the third quarter.

- Mosley's 118 receiving yards are the most by a USC true freshman in his debut since former Trojan WR JuJu Smith-Schuster had 123 receiving yards versus Fresno State in 2014 in his freshman debut.

- Mosely is the first Power Four freshman with 7+ receptions, 100+ yards and a TD in his debut since Purdue's Rondale Moore in 2018.

- He was PFF's highest graded true freshman from Week 0 and led all WRs nationally with a grade of 90.3

- Six of Mosley's seven receptions resulted in first downs or a TD.

- He averaged 5.36 yards per route.

- Five true freshmen started for the Trojans: **WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt**, **TE Mark Bowman**, **WR Trent Mosely**, **WR Tron Baker** and **DE Luke Wafle**.

- Dixon-Wyatt caught 4 passes for 36 yards and scored his first collegiate TD on a 9-yard reception.

- USC RB Riley Wormley (R-Fr), WR Mosley, and **RB Shahn Alston** each scored the first touchdown of their collegiate careers.

- 20 true freshmen saw action in the season opener

- **OL Elijah Paige**, **OL Tobias Raymond**, **OL Alani Noa** and **OL Justin Tauanuu** were named to the PFF Team of the Week for Week 0.

- USC **DT Jide Abasiri** led the defense against San José State with a career-best 2.5 tackles for loss. He recorded 4 total tackles.

- One of his TFLs was on a massive 4th-and-1 stop in the second quarter as San José State was on the USC 7 to force a turnover on downs.

- USC **DE Luke Wafle** recorded 2 tackles, including 0.5 for loss and a pass breakup in his collegiate debut.

- **RET Trent Mosley** notched 2 punt returns for 56 yards (28.0 avg.) with a long of 41 against San José State.

- His 41-yarder was the longest punt return for a Trojan since former Trojan Zachariah Branch's 61-yard punt return against Utah on Oct. 21, 2023.

- After Week 0, Mosley led the nation in punt returns.

PRESEASON NOTES

JAYDEN MAIAVA

- USC returns the nation's best quarterback in redshirt senior **Jayden Maiava**. The 2025 All-Big Ten Third Team quarterback led the nation with a 91.2 QBR, led the Big Ten with 3,711 passing yards in 2025 and has 31 career starts under his belt.

- With another year under offensive coordinator **Luke Huard** and Riley, who is the only head coach to tutor three Heisman Trophy winning quarterbacks, have 3 quarterbacks selected No. 1 overall in the NFL Draft and has the most No. 1 overall draft selections in the common draft era, Maiava is expected to continue to make large strides.

- As USC's starting quarterback, Maiava started in all 13 games for the Trojans in 2025. He completed 265-of-403 passes (65.8%) for 3,711 yards and 24 TDs with 10 INTs, plus he rushed for 157 yards on 54 carries (2.9 avg.) and 6 TDs. He also recorded 1 tackle and 1 forced fumble (one of two quarterbacks in the FBS to do so in 2025).

... As a Trojan, he has hit 63.9% of his passes (366-of-572) for 4,912 yards and 35 TDs with 16 INTs. He has rushed for 202 yards on 74 carries (2.7 avg.) with 10 TDs.

... In 2025, he was named to the All-Big Ten Third Team, the Phil Steele All-Big Ten Third Team and the Pro Football Sports Network All-Big Ten Third Team. Maiava was also a Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award Finalist and was a Davey O'Brien Award Semifinalist. He was a two-time Davey O'Brien Great 8 recipient and a Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honoree.

DEPTH UNDER CENTER

... USC returns veteran redshirt senior **Sam Huard**. Huard, who transferred to USC in the spring of 2025 from Utah, saw action in 2 games (Missouri State and Northwestern). Against Northwestern, in one of USC's most memorable plays of 2025, Huard, who officially changed his number to No. 80, came into the game on a fake punt play and executed a 10-yard completion resulting in a crucial first down that gained national recognition.

... The Trojans welcomed the 2025-26 Gatorade Illinois Football Player of the Year, freshman **Jonas Williams** in the spring. A 2026 Navy All-American Bowl invitee, Williams holds Illinois High School Association State Record for 11,347 passing yards and 147 TDs throughout his career. He arrives at Troy, ready to compete.

... Williams got his first action as a Trojan going 5-of-7 (174) for 55 yards with 1 INT in the fourth quarter against San José State.

... USC welcomed junior **Will Doherty**, who transferred to USC from Santa Barbara City College in January of 2026, to the quarterback room. Doherty's grandfather, Bill Bond, was the 1964 NCAA Men's Tennis Doubles Champion at USC and was a member of the Trojans' 1962, 1963 and 1964 NCAA Championship Teams. Bond was a two-time First Team All-American in 1962 and 1964. He competed on the USC men's tennis team from 1962-64. Bond was inducted into the ITA Men's Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame in 2003.

... In the summer, redshirt freshman **James Johnson**, who transferred from Holy Cross, and true freshman **Alex Medyn** of Chino Hills joined the Trojan squad as quarterbacks.

RUSH HOUR

... Led by Assistant Head Coach for Offense / Running Backs Coach

Anthony Jones Jr., the Trojans are positioned to boast one of the most dynamic and explosive running back rooms in the country in 2026.

... The Trojans return one of the nation's best backs, senior **Waymond Jordan**, a Midseason All-American and the 2024 JUCOWeekly Trophy winner (junior college's equivalent to the Heisman Trophy), who burst onto the scene and rushed for 576 yards on 88 carries (6.5 avg.) with 5 TDs through just six games as a junior in 2025. He also recorded 7 receptions for 55 yards. Jordan will return healthy after suffering a season-ending injury versus Michigan which sidelined him for the remainder of 2025.

... One of the most exciting stories of the 2025 college football season was **King Miller**. Miller earned national recognition as USC's showcase running back after injuries plagued the running back room, and he returns as a redshirt sophomore in 2026. Miller, now on scholarship, rushed for 972 yards on 156 carries (6.2 avg.) with 8 TDs while appearing in all 13 games with 7 starts. He also recorded a successful two-point conversion and tallied 16 receptions for 11 yards. On special teams, he served as a kick returner, collecting 2 returns for 45 yards (22.5 avg.) with a long of 25. He was named a 2025 All-Big Ten Honorable Mention and was selected to The Athletic Freshman All-American Second Team.

... Miller is up 15 pounds from last season and now weighs 225 pounds to pair with his 6'0" frame.

... Miller led the USC ground attack against the Spartans with 15 carries for 63 yards and 1 TD.

... Redshirt freshman **Riley Wormley** (5 carries for 18 yards) and

redshirt junior **Cian McKelvey** (1 carry for 4 yards) also return in 2026.

... Two freshmen joined the roster in the spring of 2026: **Shahn Alston** and **Deshonne Redeaux**. Alston, a Navy All-American Bowl invitee and 2025 Division III All-Ohio First Team honoree, tallied 172 carries for 1,548 yards (9.0 avg.) and 29 TDs as a senior at Thomas W. Harvey (Ohio) in 2025. Redeaux, a 2026 Polynesian Bowl All-Star and 2026 Navy All-American Bowl invitee recorded 156 carries for 1,447 yards (9.3 avg.) with 15 TDs as a senior at Oaks Christian in 2025.

... In the summer, **Kayne Miller**, a three-time Calabasas High Football MVP and little brother of **King** and **Kaylon Miller**, and **Tyson Park** of IMG Academy joined the running back room.

AERIAL ASSAULT

... USC is known for its outstanding wide receivers, especially in Lincoln Riley's electric offense. Led by Assistant Head Coach / Co-Offensive Coordinator / Wide Receivers Coach **Dennis Simmons** and Inside Receivers Coach / Pass Game Coordinator Chad Savage, the Trojan wideouts are in good hands.

... After Makai Lemon put an exclamation point on a historic season by winning the 2025 Biletnikoff award, the unit is looking ahead to continue that standard of excellence in 2026.

... The wideouts will be led by **Tanook Hines**. Although just a sophomore, he brings the most experience to the room. Hines saw action in all 13 games making 8 starts and recorded 34 receptions for 561 yards (16.5 avg.) and 2 TDs.

... Hines exploded at end of last season, recording 335 receiving yards over the final three games, and he's ready to roll that momentum into 2026.

... Redshirt sophomore **Zacharyus Williams** returns healthy in 2026. He played in just 5 games with 1 start in 2025 due to an injury suffered early in the season. He collected 3 receptions for 80 yards (26.7 avg.) in 2025. After playing through spring ball and fall camp, Williams feel comfortable in his connection with Maiava.

... Sophomore **Corey Simms** (1 rec. for 6 yards), who mostly saw action on special teams, redshirt freshmen **Romero Ison** and **Cameron Sermons**, and redshirt sophomore **Seth Zamora** all return in 2026.

... From the portal, USC welcomed **Terrell Anderson**. The junior from NC State tallied 39 receptions for 629 yards (16.1 avg.) with 5 TDs while appearing in all 13 games with 5 starts for the Wolfpack in 2025.

... Four stellar freshmen wideouts joined the squad last spring adding a new set of weapons for Maiava. **Tron Baker**, a 2025 All-Mission League First Teamer, tallied 40 receptions for 626 yards (15.7 avg.) with 8 TDs for Sierra Canyon in 2025. **Kayden Dixon-Wyatt**, a 2026 Navy All-American Bowler and All-CIF Division I First Teamer, recorded 42 receptions for 693 yards (16.5 avg.) with 8 TDs as a senior at Mater Dei. **Trent Mosley**, a Navy All-American Bowl invitee, led the Santa Margarita Catholic Eagles with 47 receptions for 648 yards (13.8 avg.) and 4 TDs as they won the CIF Southern Section Division 1 Championship. Coached by former USC Heisman Trophy winner Carson Palmer, Mosley won a plethora of awards including 2025 CIF Division I Offensive Player of the Year, 2025 MaxPreps California High School Football Player of the Year and was named to a variety of All-American First Teams. Finally, **Luc Weaver**, a 2025 All-CIF Division III Teamer and 2025 All-Mission League First Teamer, recorded 22 receptions for 397 yards and 7 TDs for Notre Dame as a senior in 2025.

... Summertime brought another wave of wideouts to Troy. Highly acclaimed freshman **Ethan "Boobie" Feaster**, a 2026 Polynesian Bowl All-Star, an Under Armour All-American and one of the top receivers in the nation out of Desoto High, reclassified and elected to forgo his senior year of high school to join the Trojans for the 2026 season. Fellow December signee, freshman **Roderick Tezeno**, an All-State receiver out of Opelousas Catholic (La.), arrived in Los Angeles this summer.

... Freshman **Griffin Brahm** (Santa Margarita Catholic) and redshirt senior **Luke Degner** (transfer from the University of Chicago) also joined the wide receiver corps this summer.

“GOD DIDN'T MAKE MANY OF THOSE PEOPLE...”

... Head coach Lincoln Riley is correct. The tight end position must be able to do it all, and they are a rare find.

... “Seriously. In the general population, there’s not that many people that are big enough and strong enough to block like an offensive lineman, but nimble enough to go catch balls like a receiver and then smart enough to be able to process and handle all that,” Riley said.

... Tight Ends Coach **Chad Savage** will have an extremely talented tight end room to utilize in 2026. It looks to be the deepest tight end unit that the Trojans have had in many years.

... Redshirt senior **Carson Tabaracci** returns as the oldest member of the group. In 2025, he saw action in 10 games with 1 start and recorded 3 receptions for 32 yards and 1 TD.

... Redshirt sophomore **Walter Matthews** (saw action in 11 games, predominately on special teams) and redshirt freshmen **Taniela Tupou** (2 receptions for 26 yards (13.0 avg) and a successful two-point conversion) and **Fisher Melton** all look to increase their roles in 2026.

... From the portal, USC welcomes redshirt junior **Tucker Ashcraft** from Wisconsin. He was limited by injury throughout the season, but recorded 2 receptions for 10 yards (5.0 avg.) while appearing in 4 games with 1 start in 2025. He immediately has built a leadership role for himself both on and off the field entering 2026.

... Junior college transfer junior **Josiah Jefferson**, the No. 1 JUCO tight end in the nation, arrived at Troy in January. An All-Pacific Athletic Conference Team and All-California Community College Region III First Team selection, he recorded 36 receptions for 444 yards (12.3 avg.) and 4 TDs in 2025.

... Highly-regarded freshman **Mark Bowman**, who reclassified and elected to forgo his senior year of high school at Mater Dei and enrolled at USC in the spring of 2026, looks to immediately compete for playing time at tight end as a true freshman. The five-star, regarded as MaxPreps 2025 Top Tight End was a constant difference-maker in the Trinity League. As a junior in 2025, he recorded 31 receptions for 370 yards (11.9 avg.) and 2 TDs.

... Freshman **Manoah Leiato** out of Mater Dei, sophomore **Patrick O'Brien**, formerly a member of the Trojan men's basketball team, and freshman **Grant Woods** out of Crespi added to the tight end room this summer.

BLOCK PARTY

... USC has one of the most experienced offensive lines in the country. Led by Offensive Line Coach / Run Game Coordinator **Zach Hanson**, who has proven to be one of the best offensive line coaches in the nation, the Trojans will be formidable to face in the trenches.

... Entering 2026, USC was the only team in the country to return all five starting offensive linemen. Unfortunately, projected starting center **Kilian O'Connor** suffered an injury that will cost him the entire 2026 season. The Trojans lose a veteran offensive lineman and a beloved member of the program, but he will continue to maintain a critical role off the field.

... USC finished the regular season in 2025 ranked No. 7 in the nation and No. 1 in the Big Ten in passing offense (297.3) and No. 10 in nation in total offense (471.6) and second in the Big Ten. **Alani Noa** and **Justin Tauanuu** both earned All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2025.

... Noa and Tauanuu both earned placement on the 2026 Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award Watch List, and Noa was named to the Outland Trophy Watch List.

... Hanson put an emphasis on position flexibility and being able to slot players into different positions.

... USC showcased eight different starting offensive line combinations throughout 12 games in 2025.

... There are a variety of options for the center position. **Tobias Raymond** cross-trained at center in the spring while O'Connor was still out.

... Redshirt sophomore **Kaylon Miller**, who saw action in 10 games

stepping in for a variety of injured starters in 2025, returns ready to continue building on his impressive foundation and was recently put on scholarship. Before he started the final three games at guard in 2025, Miller was taking practice reps at center when O'Connor suffered his first significant knee injury.

... Redshirt freshman **Willi Wascher** and freshman **Kannon Smith** also add depth at that spot.

... Also on the line, redshirt freshmen **Aaron Dunn**, **Cash Jacobsen**, **Elijah Vaikona**, redshirt sophomores **Ratumama Bulabalavu**, **Travis Leonard**, **Hayden Treter** and redshirt juniors **Erwin Taomi** and **Jack Susnjar** all return looking to contribute in 2026.

... USC welcomed seven freshmen early enrollee offensive linemen in the spring. **Chase Deniz** (offensive lineman MVP at Cathedral Catholic), **Vlad Dyakonov** (Navy All-American Bowl invitee and MaxPreps All-California First Teamer of Folsom High), **John Fifita** (CIF Central Coast Section Division 1 Champion at Saint Francis), **Breck Kolojay** (MaxPreps All-America Second Teamer out of IMG Academy [Fla.]), **Keeneyi Pepe** (2025 Polynesian Bowl All-Star, 2025 Under Armour All-American and 2025 MaxPreps All-America First Team out of IMG Academy [Fla.]), **Kannon Smith** (Colorado Prep Varsity Top 2026 Offensive Tackle out of Valor Christian [Colo.]) and **Esun Tafa** (three-time 6A State Champion and 2025 MaxPreps Second Team All-American out of Corner Canyon [Utah]) all are eager to compete and push for playing time in the trenches.

... In the summer, **Ryan Pauley**, a redshirt senior transfer from Valparaiso, joined the offensive line room.

THE RETURN OF COACH P

... The **Gary Patterson** 4-2-5 defense is legendary. A multiple defense where the secondary has its own assignments from the front six, and then they two are split in half with the ability to play man coverage on one side and zone on the other; it's designed to confuse opponent offenses. However, don't expect the defense to look the same as Patterson has called it in the past.

... “Coach P plays the 4-2-5. Not really,” Patterson said. “There’s some things that are the same, but in 28 years, when you run the same stuff and you stay somewhere 25 years, you have to be able to tweak it, and you have to evolve. The fun thing about being here at USC is there’s things that they did really well defensively last season, and we’re going to keep those. There’s things that we may need to tweak or maybe it wasn’t quite as good, and then we’ll add new stuff in.”

... The time is now for defense.

... “It’s time for us to be great on defense. Plain and simple,” said Riley. “The players are here. The setup is here. It’s time to step up into that next level of defensive play consistently.”

... Riley knew Patterson was the right person to take the Trojan defense there.

... “It’s hard to find a guy who’s been as consistently productive as a head coach, as a defense coach and a guy who’s been able to evolve in so many different ways with so many different skillsets,” said **Riley**. “A lot of the times, he did it with skill sets that were maybe not equal to the teams he was having to play against. We competed against each other for so long. Even back to my early years at Texas Tech, we were on staffs going against each other. He was always a pain in the a** to deal with. His ability to take away team’s fast balls, his ability to make offenses uncomfortable, his ability to take defensive groups that were able to play better than maybe what the sum of their talent was – I just saw it year after year. We can give him better players, more depth, more talent, and we can give him an opportunity where he’s not having to worry about all the different head coach stuff that goes on and put all that energy into the defense at USC. You bring people into your organization who are going to make everyone else better. This guy makes me better, and he makes other people in our building better. His experience is so unique. Anyone that knows Gary, knows there’s no halfway with this guy. He’s an absolute psycho. When he goes, it’s full speed. I don’t know if he’s left the office since he’s been in LA, but that’s him. He’s recharged, he’s

motivated, he's got an edge to him and chip on his shoulder. He's really excited to be at USC, and we're thrilled to have him."

SETTING THE TONE IN THE TRENCHES

••• The Trojans will not be skipping a beat as new defensive tackles coach **Skylar Jones** steps in to lead the room. He'll continue to elevate the play of the already talented room.

••• Junior **Jide Abasiri** returns as the veteran leader of the defensive line. The 2026 Big Ten Media Day representative recorded 26 tackles, including 4 for loss of 24 yards (with 3.5 sacks for minus 24 yards), 2 QB hurries and 1 forced fumble while appearing in all 13 games with 9 starts in 2025. He was named to Bruce Feldman's 2025 Freaks List for his intriguing athleticism, having clocked 19.22 mph at nearly 300 pounds. More impressively, Abasiri's 10-yard split was 1.60, and he's squatted 700 pounds.

••• Abasiri recently earned USC's Bob Chandler Award. Awarded to an underclassman, based on athletic ability, academic scholarship, and character on and off the field, including the individual's leadership, courage, tenacity, discipline, loyalty, and high standards of morals and values. The award funds a scholarship for the player's tuition, room and board for the following year. The recipient wears a #10 sticker on his helmet (Chandler's jersey number), and the trophy is donated by the Bob Chandler Foundation.

••• Redshirt junior **Jamaal Jarrett**, a fan-favorite, will make an impact in the trenches in 2026. Jarrett, who transferred to USC in the spring of 2025 from Georgia, recorded 3 tackles, including 0.5 a tackle for loss of 2 yards, and 1 INT returned for a TD in 2025. He suffered an injury that sidelined him for the majority of the second half of the season. In one of the most memorable plays of the 2025 season, Jarrett notched his first career INT versus Purdue and returned it 70 yards for a TD. The play was dubbed the "Thicc Six".

••• Sophomore **Jahkeem Stewart**, a Freshman All-American, looks to build on an impressive foundation and return to the field, healthy and ready to compete on the defensive line in 2026. Stewart, who enrolled at USC in the spring of 2025 after reclassifying and forgoing his senior year of high school, had a stellar collegiate debut making an immediate impact on the Trojan defensive line by decorating his stat sheet with 18 tackles, including 7.5 for loss of 27 yards (with 1.5 sacks for minus 11 yards), 1 INT returned for 4 yards, 1 fumble recovery returned for 22 yards and 1 QB hurry. Stewart recorded these stats while playing through a stress fracture in his foot the entire season.

••• Stewart was named an FWAA Freshman All-American and a PFF Freshman All-American. He was selected to the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award Watch List. FOX Sports named Stewart to the nation's Top 10 impact freshmen ahead of the 2025 college football season.

••• Also returning is fellow high-ceiling sophomore, **Floyd Boucard**, who looks to be a key contributor in the trenches in 2026. He recorded 9 tackles, including 2 for loss of 13 yards (with 1 sack for minus 9 yards) and 2 QB hurries while appearing in 10 games in 2025.

••• Redshirt sophomore **Brendan Cho** rounds out the returners in the defensive tackle room.

••• USC welcomed redshirt senior **Alex VanSumeren** from the portal out of Michigan State. In 2025, he recorded 52 tackles, including 2 for loss of 10 yards (with 1.5 sacks for minus 10 yards), 2 QB hurries and 1 PBU for the Spartans, and looks to immediately contribute in 2026.

••• VanSumeren was selected as one of USC's three representatives at Big Ten Media Day and has immediately stepped into a leadership role.

••• "It's an honor to be in this position," VanSumeren said at Big Ten Media Days. "I realize that there's a bunch of young guys on the team. I had leaders in my past that helped me, so now, I get to pay it forward. It goes along with being a good teammate. I'm going to give everything I have to this university and to my teammates and to the football program."

••• Four talented freshmen joined the Trojans in the spring. Though injured in his senior season, **Jake Johnson** looks to dive into learning the

Trojan defense. As a junior in 2024, he recorded 50 tackles, including 12 for loss with 1.5 sacks, 1 PBU and 1 forced fumble. He earned placement on the 2024 All-North Texas First Team and the 2024 Star Local Media All-Area Football Second Team while competing for Prosper in Texas.

••• **Braeden Jones** tallied 85 tackles, including 15 for loss with 9.5 sacks and 6 PBUs for Mount Carmel in Illinois.

••• One of the nation's top recruits, **Tomuhini "Tom Tom" Topui Jr.**, recorded 25 tackles, including 9 for loss (with 2.5 sacks), 3 PBUs, 2 forced fumbles and 2 QBHs for Mater Dei in 2025. He was named a 2026 Polynesian Bowl All-Star and 2026 Navy All-American Bowl invitee.

••• **Jaimeon Winfield**, a five-star and 2025 Navy All-American Bowl invitee recorded 55 tackles, including 22 for loss with 6 sacks, 14 QBHs, 2 PBUs, 1 forced fumble, 1 fumble recovery, 3 blocked field goals and 2 TDs for Richardson in Texas. He was named the 2025 7-6A District MVP.

••• **Jordan Abarca**, a sophomore transfer from UCLA, also joined the Trojan squad over the summer.

LIVING ON THE EDGE

••• Defensive Ends Coach **Shaun Nua** has a healthy mix of experienced veterans and talented newcomers to utilize in 2026.

••• Senior **Braylan Shelby**, a veteran presence on the defensive line, will be a leader of the group in 2026. He recorded 29 tackles, including 7 for loss of 20 yards (with 4.5 sacks for minus 17 yards), 1 INT returned for 18 yards and 4 QB hurries while appearing in all 13 games with 6 starts in 2025.

••• Shelby's academic prowess is quite notable. He is majoring in Business Administration at USC. He was named a 2026 Stevens Scholar for earning a cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.5 or higher. He was named a 2026 David X. Marks Scholar for having an overall GPA of 3.0 or better. He earned the 2025-26 Chi Alpha Sigma Honor Award which recognizes student-athletes who achieve junior academic standing or higher after their fourth full-time semester and earn a 3.5 or higher cumulative GPA. He earned placement on the 2025 College Sports Communicators Academic All-District Team. He was named to the 2024 Big Ten Fall All-Academic Team and the 2025 Big Ten Fall All-Academic Team. He has earned placement on the Dean's List each semester at USC.

••• Shelby was also selected to speak at the formal opening of the Bloom Football Performance Center alongside USC Athletic Director **Jen Cohen** and Head Coach **Lincoln Riley**. Shelby also introduced USC President **Beong-Soo Kim**.

••• In his speech, Shelby said, "This building is an investment in every player who walks through these doors. As Trojans, my teammates and I are part of the greatest tradition and legacy in college football. It's our responsibility to honor that investment by going to work every day and making the Trojan Family proud."

••• Junior **Kameryn Crawford** returns to be a difference-maker in 2026. He recorded 41 tackles, including 10.5 for loss of 42 yards (with 5.5 sacks for minus 34 yards), 1 fumble recovery and 1 QB hurry while appearing in all 13 games and making 8 starts in 2025.

••• Redshirt freshman **Jadyn Ramos** looks to gain valuable experience this spring. He participated in 3 games in 2025 and tallied 3 tackles.

••• **Zuriah Fisher**, a redshirt senior transfer from Penn State, will compete for playing time on the defensive line in 2026. Fisher tallied 19 tackles, including 3.5 for loss of 22 yards (with 2 sacks for minus 20 yards), 1 forced fumble, 1 PBU and 1 QB hurry for the Nittany Lions in 2025.

••• Three talented early enrollee freshmen will bolster the defensive line room. **Simote Katoanga**, a 2026 Polynesian Bowl All-Star, helped Santa Margarita with the CIF Southern Section Division 1 Championship under first year head coach, former USC Heisman winner, Carson Palmer by recording 35 tackles, including 11.5 for loss with 3 sacks and 2 PBUs. He earned placement on the All-CIF Division I Team.

••• One of the most well-known recruits in the class, **Luke Wafle**,

was named the No. 1 recruit in the 2026 class by Rivals/On3. Waffle earned a plethora of accolades including 2026 Navy All-American Bowl invitee, Navy All-American Bowl MVP, 2025 Maxwell Football Club High School All-American, The Sporting News 2025 High School First Team All-American, 2025 MaxPreps First Team All-American, 2025 All NJ Prep "A" Football First Teamer and 2025 All-USA East Football Teamer. As a senior, he recorded 99 tackles, including 37 for loss with a school record 23 sacks for The Hun School of Princeton in New Jersey.

- **Andrew Williams**, who has only played football for two years, recorded 64 tackles, including 12 for loss with 10 sacks at John C. Freemont. He looks to gain more experience heading into the 2026 season.

- Redshirt junior **Ethan Brougham**, a transfer from Rice, **Sam Smith**, a freshman out of JSerra, and **Ty Swanson**, a true freshman out of Santa Margarita Catholic, added to the defensive end room this summer.

THE DEN

- According to Linebackers Coach **Mike Ekeler**, there are two types of people in this world: lions and sheep. And the linebacker room as appropriately been dubbed "The Den" as it is filled with Lions.

- Under the leadership of Ekeler, the Trojan linebacking corps is poised to reach new heights.

- Junior **Desman Stephens II** returns as the leader of the unit. He recorded 89 tackles, including 3 for loss of 6 yards, 1 forced fumble and 1 QB hurry while appearing and starting in all 13 games in 2025.

- Redshirt senior **Roman Marchetti**, who was recently put on scholarship, saw action in all 13 games, primarily on special teams, in 2025 and will continue to be a vocal leader of not just the linebacking corps, but the entire USC football team.

- Redshirt junior **Ta'Mere Robinson**, also primarily saw action on special teams last season, but looks to have an increased role in 2026.

- Redshirt sophomore **Elijah Newby** also brings depth to the linebacking corps and looks to gain valuable reps this spring. In 2025, saw action in all 13 games, predominately on special teams and recorded 8 tackles.

- Redshirt sophomore **Jadyn Walker** has just begun to scratch the surface of his potential. After seeing action in all 13 games, including 5 starts in 2025, he will build on that foundation this spring to take the next step in his game. Last season, he recorded 33 tackles, including 4 for loss of 17 yards (with 1 sack for minus 5 yards) and 1 PBU.

- Senior **Nick De Fina** also adds important depth to the linebacker room.

- Redshirt junior **Deven Bryant** transferred to USC from Washington in January and looks to compete for playing time right away. In 2025, he tallied 62 tackles, including 2 for loss of 2 yards, and 2 PBUs while appearing in 12 games with 10 starts for the Huskies.

- Three freshmen linebackers joined the group in the spring. **Talanoa Ili**, a 2026 Polynesian Bowl All-Star, recorded snaps all over the field as a senior, splitting time between MIKE, WILL and SAM while also being featured as a large nickel and a hand-in-the-dirt edge. He earned placement on the 2025 MaxPreps All-America Second Team while competing for Kahuku in Hawaii.

- **Taylor "Taybo" Johnson** recorded 201 tackles, including 17.5 for loss with 6.5 sacks, 10 QBHs, 2 forced fumbles and 2 INTs for El Cajon as a senior in 2025. He was named to The Sporting News 2025 High School All-America Third Team and the 2025 All-CIF Division IV Team.

- **Shaun Scott**, ranked the No. 1 linebacker in Orange County by PrepRedZone California, tallied 53 tackles, including 21 for loss with 13.5 sacks, 10 QBHs, 5 PBUs, 4 forced fumbles and 1 fumble recovery for Mater Dei in 2025. He earned placement on the 2025 MaxPreps All-America Second Team, the 2025 MaxPreps All-California First Team and the All-CIF Division I Team.

- **Austin Engroff**, a true freshman out of Timberline (Idaho), **Ryan O'Connell**, a redshirt senior transfer from UPenn, and **GianCarlo Rufo**, a senior transfer from Georgetown, all added depth to the Trojan

linebacking corps this summer.

NO FLY ZONE

- With new Safeties Coach / Defensive Pass Game Coordinator **Paul Gonzales** at the helm, the Trojan safeties are ready to level up this season.

- Redshirt senior **Prophet Brown** looks to be an impact player in the fall after incurring a season-ending injury in fall camp and not seeing action in 2025.

- Senior **Christian Pierce** returns as an integral piece of the Trojan secondary in 2026. He recorded 64 tackles, including 2.5 for loss of 12 yards (with 1 sack for minus 10 yards), 3 PBUs, 1 INT and 1 forced fumble while appearing in 13 games with 9 starts in 2025.

- Junior **Kennedy Urlacher** made the most of his opportunities after transferring from Notre Dame in 2025. He saw action in all 13 games with 3 starts towards the end of the season, and recorded 26 tackles, including 1 for a loss of 1 yard (with 1 sack for minus 1 yard), 1 INT and 1 PBU.

- After sustaining an injury at the beginning of the season, redshirt freshman **Alex Graham** showcased his talent towards the end of 2025. He recorded 15 tackles, including 2 for loss of 5 yards, while appearing in 5 games with 2 starts and looks to build on that foundation in 2026.

- Redshirt sophomores **Marquis Gallegos** (5 tackles, including 2 for loss of 7 yards) and **Isaiah Rubin** (5 tackles and 1 fumble recovery) and sophomore **Kendarius Reddick** (6 tackles) predominately played on special teams in 2025. They each hope to increase their roles in 2026, as well as redshirt freshman Trestin Castro (1 tackle).

- Three freshmen joined the safeties as early enrollees in the spring. **Peyton "Man Man" Dyer** (the 2025 AAA Region 3 Safety of the Year out of Tyner Academy in Tennessee), **Madden Riordan** (2025 MaxPreps All-California First Team, All-CIF Division I Team and 2025 All-Mission League MVP out of Sierra Canyon in Los Angeles) and **Joshua Holland II** (18 tackles, 2 INTs and 5 PBUs for St. John Bosco in 2025) look to gain valuable experience this spring.

- True freshman **Peter Sciarrino** out of Loyola joined the Trojans this summer.

THROW AT YOUR OWN RISK

- Under the tutelage of Cornerbacks Coach **Trovon Reed**, the USC corners will display needed depth this spring and will return many players to full health in 2026.

- Redshirt senior **Jontez Williams**, the No. 1 ranked cornerback in the portal, transferred to USC from Iowa State. As a redshirt junior in 2025, Williams played and started the season's first five games before suffering a season-ending knee injury against Arizona. He tallied 15 tackles, including 1.5 for loss of 2 yards, 2 PBUs and 1 INT. He was an All-Big 12 Conference selection in 2024.

- Similarly, redshirt sophomore **Chasen Johnson**, suffered a season ending injury against Purdue that sidelined him for the season, will return healthy and back in the mix in 2026.

- Redshirt sophomore **Marcelles Williams** made large strides last season as he saw action in all 13 games and started in 11 recording 41 tackles and 5 PBUs.

- Redshirt freshmen **RJ Sermons** and redshirt junior **Shawn Sehra** (2 tackles) each look to increase their roles in 2026.

- Six newcomers join the Trojan cornerback room this spring: four freshmen and two transfers.

- Freshman **Jayden Crowder** helped Santa Margarita win the CIF Southern Section Division 1 Championship under first year head coach, former USC Heisman winner, Carson Palmer, by recording 33 tackles, including 1 for loss, 7 PBUs, 2 INTs and 2 blocked field goals.

- Freshman **Elbert "Rock" Hill IV**, a five-star, tallied 47 tackles, including 5 for loss, with 9 INTs, 33 PBUs, 3 TDs and 1 FG block for Archbishop Hoban in Ohio in 2025.

- Freshman **Brandon Lockhart** tallied 30 tackles, 12 PBUs and 1

fumble recovery for Sierra Canyon in 2025.

- Redshirt sophomore **Carrington Pierce**, the brother of fellow Trojan Christian Pierce, transferred to USC in January of 2026 from Oklahoma State and looks to get acclimated with a new defense this spring.

- True freshman **Derek Diniz** out of the Stevenson School joined the cornerback room over the summer.

SPECIAL OPS

- The 2026 season will be **Mike Ekeler**'s tenth as a special teams coordinator and has led some of the best special teams units in the nation. He has transformed special teams units into a part of the game that opponents fear. Ekeler, working hand-in-hand with Co-Offensive Coordinator / Specialists Coach **Ryan Dougherty**, looks to make the Trojan special teams a dominant unit.

- Redshirt sophomore **Ryon Sayeri** was one of the best stories of the 2025 season. After earning the starting role, he hit 21-of-25 field goals and all 48 of his PAT tries. He totaled 89 kickoffs for 5,715 yards (64.2 avg.) with 63 touchbacks. He broke USC's single-season field goal record (19) and set a new one with 21. He was named to the All-Big Ten Third Team and was a Lou Groza Award Semifinalist. He was a two-time Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week. Sayeri is expected to continue to perform at a high level in 2026.

- Redshirt sophomore **Caden Chittenden** suffered a season-ending injury in fall camp and did not see action as a sophomore in 2025. He was named to the 2025 Walter Camp Preseason All-America Second Team and the 2025 Lou Groza Award Watch List and returns healthy in 2026.

- Sophomore **Lachlan Carrigan** transferred from Memphis and looks to compete to be USC's punter in 2026. He averaged 43.4 yards on 46 punts totaling 1,994 yards, of which 20 pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line and 7 went for 50+ yards, while appearing in all 13 games in 2025.

- Carrigan will compete with redshirt senior **Rey Sanchez**, redshirt senior transfer out of Valparaiso **Nate Hillenburg** and redshirt freshman **William Weisberg**, who appeared in 1 game in 2025 and recorded 1 kickoff for 65 yards, and true freshman **Zachary Nandlal**.

- Redshirt senior **Dylan Black**, a transfer from Oregon State and redshirt freshman **Luke Brown** will compete to be USC's starting long snapper in 2026.

Lincoln Riley is one of the nation's most successful coaches. He's had more success by the age of 40 than any other head coach in college football history. Riley has been a head coach for 9 seasons and has developed three of the last nine Heisman Trophy winners. In addition to being the only head coach to tutor three Heisman Trophy winning quarterbacks, Riley is the only coach to have three quarterbacks selected No. 1 overall in the NFL Draft and has the most No. 1 overall draft selections in the common draft era. Just eight Power Four coaches currently hold a .500 or better career winning percentage against ranked teams, including Riley. From coaching 3 Heisman Trophy winners, to having a 77 percent winning record, to appearing in 3 College Football Playoffs, Lincoln Riley's coaching achievements set a standard of excellence.

USC Tenure (2022–Present)

- Hired in November 2021 as USC's head football coach after a historic run at Oklahoma
- Immediate impact in 2022 leading USC to an 11-3 record, tying the biggest single-season win turnaround in school history (+7 wins)
- Guided USC to a Pac-12 Championship appearance and Cotton Bowl berth
- USC finished undefeated at home (7-0) for the first time since 2017
- Broke six USC offensive records, including most TD passes (43) and most games scoring 40+ points (10)
- Offense ranked Top 5 nationally in multiple categories, including scoring, total offense, and turnover margin
- Tutored 2022 Heisman Trophy winner Caleb Williams who won numerous national awards under Riley
- Produced five First Team All-Americans in 2022 – USC's most in a season since 2007

- Caleb Williams selected No. 1 overall in 2024 NFL Draft by the Chicago Bears cementing Riley as the greatest quarterback developer in college football and the common draft era
- In USC's Big Ten debut in the 2024 season, the Trojans posted a 7-6 record; all five Big Ten losses by 7 points or less and four occurred within the last minute of the game
- USC bookended its season with victories against No. 13 LSU and a Texas A&M team that was just shy of competing in the conference championship to go 2-0 versus the SEC in 2024
- Offensively, the Trojans finished the season ranked in the national Top 25 in passing offense (10, 291.9), third down conversion percentage (25, 0.448), total offense (23, 437.2) and first downs offense (24, 303).
- USC had the most improved defense in the nation under newly appointed DC D'Anton Lynn and allowed 10 fewer points per game than in 2023 and lept up the national rankings boards in almost every defensive statistical category
- Trojan punter Eddie Czaplicki became USC's 177th First Team All-American and USC's first-ever Ray Guy Award winner for being the nation's best punter
- RB Woody Marks became USC's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2017
- Ended season with a Las Vegas Bowl win and the largest comeback in USC bowl history
- WR Makai Lemon won the 2025 Biletnikoff Award, and he and S Bishop Fitzgerald earned First Team All-American status.

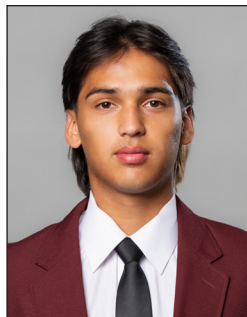

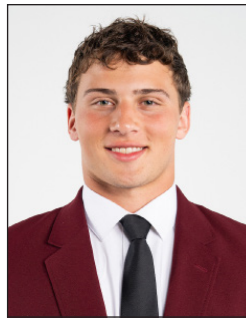

GAME SUMMARIES

USC 42, San José State 26

Aug. 29, 2026 • Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum • Los Angeles

In USC's 2026 season opener, the Trojans defeated the San José State Spartans 42-26 in front of a crowd of 51,144 in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. USC produced 505 yards of total offense, controlled the ball for 37:15.

USC QB Jayden Maiava delivered an excellent performance to kick off his 2026 campaign, completing 25-of-29 passes (.862) for 286 yards and 2 TDs while adding a 1-yard rushing score. Maiava completed passes to nine different Trojans and guided the offense to touchdowns on five of its first seven possessions. He finished the first half 17-of-20 for 201 yards, a passing TD and a rushing TD as USC built a commanding 28-0 lead.

The Trojans made a statement from the opening whistle, marching 77 yards on 13 plays and taking 6:05 off the clock. Maiava capped the methodical drive by powering across the goal line on a 1-yard quarterback keeper to put USC ahead 7-0.

USC WR Trent Mosley provided an early spark on special teams, returning San José State's first punt 41 yards to set the Trojans up deep in Spartan territory. He finished the game with 174 all-purpose yards, including a career-high 118 receiving yards on 7 catches and 56 yards on 2 punt returns.

Early in the second quarter, RB Riley Wormley took the handoff and burst through the left side for a 5-yard TD. The score, the first of Wormley's Trojan career, extended USC's lead to 14-0.

USC's defense kept the Spartans off balance throughout the first half, forcing punts on their first two possessions before USC DT Jide Abasiri shut down a crucial fourth-down attempt in the second quarter. San José State was held scoreless through the first 30 minutes of action.

With 2:46 remaining in the half, WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt slipped open over the middle and hauled in a 9-yard strike from Maiava for a TD. The scoring play punctuated a 12-play, 91-yard drive and marked the first TD of Dixon-Wyatt's Trojan career.

The Trojans were not finished. After the defense forced another Spartan punt, USC raced 80 yards in just 1:14. Maiava connected with Mosley for gains of 17 and 33 yards before RB King Miller punched the ball into the end zone on a 4-yard rush, sending USC into halftime with a 28-0 advantage. Miller led the Trojan rushing attack with 63 yards and a TD on 15 carries.

San José State opened the second-half scoring with a 22-yard field goal, but USC responded with another lengthy drive. Maiava ultimately found Mosley for a 14-yard TD to push the lead to 35-3. Mosley recorded the first 100-yard receiving performance of his Trojan career.

The Spartans found the end zone for the first time on a 28-yard pass from QB Luke Weaver to WR Jerry McClure early in the fourth quarter. Weaver then connected with TE Kamaehu Kopa-Kaawalaule on the 2-point conversion to make the score 35-11.

USC QB Jonas Williams saw his first Trojan action and led a 10-play, 75-yard drive that took 5:14 off the clock. RB Shahn Alston capped off the drive with a 1-yard rushing TD score to extend the Trojans' lead to 42-11. Alston finished with 30 yards on 7 carries in his USC debut.

San José State scored twice in the final 5:11, first on a 3-yard TD pass from Weaver to WR Jordan Anderson and then on Weaver's 7-yard rushing score.

The Trojan offense finished with 29 first downs and converted 9-of-13 third-down attempts.

USC K Caden Chittenden was a perfect 6-for-6 on extra-point attempts, while the Trojans did not commit a fumble. Defensively, DT Jide Abasiri led USC with 4 tackles, including 2.5 for loss, and DE Jady Ramos recorded the Trojans' lone sack.

Coch Lincoln Riley said...

"It's good to get the first one under our belt. It was kind of a tale of two games for us. The first three quarters there was a lot of good football out there. All three sides of the ball were playing complementary to one another. We really dominated the game through three quarters, so a lot of exciting ball. There were a lot of guys in their first games as Trojans making a lot of big plays, so that was obviously the highlight of it. The fourth quarter was not up to our standards. A bunch of guys had opportunities, and we had several that did not play the way that we anticipated. There'll be a lot to learn and grow from today because we're going to need the depth of this roster. Typically the first and second game is when you make a lot of improvements. When you get the first chance to go play against someone, it reveals a lot. We have to go attack this short week in order and get ready for Friday night."

WORTH NOTING...

- USC is the only FBS program to win 20 season openers since 2006. Ohio State has won all 20 openers played from 2006-2025, but its 2010 win was vacated.
- QB Jayden Maiava completed 86.2% of his passes, the highest single-game completion percentage of his USC career.
- His 86.2% completion percentage is also the highest single-game completion percentage by a USC quarterback since at least 1995 (minimum 25 attempts).
- Maiava is now No. 2 among USC quarterbacks in the last 30 seasons with most career games with 200+ passing yards, 1 passing TD and 1 rushing TD with 6 games behind Caleb Williams with 12. Matt Leinart and Carson Palmer each had 5 career games with those stats.
- Maiava had a stretch of 14 straight completions. The last time a USC quarterback had 14+ consecutive completions in a single game prior to today was 17 by former Trojan Caleb Williams on Sept. 30, 2023, at Colorado in a 48-41 win.
- WR Trent Mosley's 118 receiving yards are the most by a USC true freshman in his debut since WR JuJu Smith-Schuster had 123 receiving yards versus Fresno State in 2014 in his freshman debut.
- Mosely is the first Power Four freshman with 7+ receptions, 100+ yards and a TD in his debut since Purdue's Rondale Moore in 2018.

USC 39, Fresno State 0

Sept. 4, 2026 • Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum • Los Angeles

In USC's second game of the 2026 season, the Trojans shut out the Fresno State Bulldogs 39-0 in front of a crowd of 53,014 in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. USC outgained Fresno State 552-116 and controlled the ball for 38:52 as the Trojans improved to 2-0.

USC QB Jayden Maiava delivered another impressive performance, completing 23-of-25 passes (.920) for 349 yards and 3 TDs. He did not throw an interception or take a sack. Maiava finished the first half 17-of-18 (.944) for 284 yards and 3 TDs as USC built a 30-0 halftime lead.

The Trojans set the tone with a methodical opening drive, marching 82 yards on 12 plays and taking 5:33 off the clock. On third-and-goal, Maiava connected with USC WR Tanook Hines for an 8-yard TD to give USC an early 7-0 advantage.

Fresno State crossed midfield on its opening possession, but USC S Prophet Brown intercepted QB Jayden Mandal at the Trojan 15-yard line to end the threat. It was Brown's first interception of his career.

Early in the second quarter, Maiava found USC WR Trent Mosley over the middle for a 68-yard TD, the longest reception of Mosley's Trojan career. Mosley finished with 104 receiving yards and 2 TDs on 4 catches, recording his second consecutive 100-yard receiving performance.

USC's defense added to the lead midway through the second quarter. After an intentional-grounding penalty backed Fresno State up to its own 1-yard line, USC S Kennedy Urlacher sacked Mandal in the end zone for a safety. Urlacher finished the game with 3 tackles, a career-high 2.0 sacks, 2.0 tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

The Trojans scored again with a five-play, 65-yard TD drive. Maiava connected with Mosley for 22 yards before USC RB Waymond Jordan recorded consecutive rushes of 9 and 16 yards. Maiava then found Mosley for a 9-yard TD to extend USC's lead to 23-0.

USC's defense created another scoring opportunity late in the first half. Urlacher stripped Mandal on a sack, and USC DT Floyd Boucard recovered the fumble at the Fresno State 38-yard line. Five plays later, Jordan powered into the end zone on a 2-yard rush to send the Trojans into halftime with a 30-0 lead.

The Trojans dominated the second quarter on both sides of the ball, outgaining Fresno State 228 to minus-1. Maiava completed all 8 of his passes in the quarter for 166 yards and 2 TDs, while USC's defense held the Bulldogs to just one first down.

USC WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt led the Trojans with 6 receptions for 102 yards, marking his first 100-yard receiving performance of the season. Dixon-Wyatt and Mosley became the first pair of Trojans to each record 100 receiving yards in the same game since records available in 1973.

USC's defense produced its second safety of the night following a Trojan fumble at the Fresno State 7-yard line. On the Bulldogs' first play after the turnover, USC S Alex Graham sacked Mandal in the end zone to push the lead to 32-0. Graham finished with 4 tackles, 1.0 sack, 1.5 tackles for loss and a QB hurry.

The two safeties marked the first time since records available in 1971 that the Trojans recorded two safeties in a single game.

USC QB Jonas Williams completed all 6 of his pass attempts for 63 yards in relief of Maiava. Williams directed a 10-play, 79-yard drive that took 6:47 off the clock in the fourth quarter. USC RB Deshonne Redeaux capped the drive with a 5-yard rushing TD, the first of his Trojan career, to produce the final score of 39-0.

Jordan led the Trojan rushing attack with 67 yards and a TD on 11 carries, averaging 6.1 yards per attempt. USC RB King Miller added 45 yards on 15 carries as the Trojans finished with 140 rushing yards and 2 rushing TDs.

USC's defense held Fresno State to 9 first downs, 77 passing yards and 39 rushing yards on 29 attempts. The Bulldogs averaged just 2.6 yards per play and converted only 2-of-10 third-down attempts. USC recorded 5 sacks, 7 tackles for loss and 2 takeaways while holding Fresno State scoreless on its lone trip to the red zone.

Fresno State ran just four offensive plays and totaled minus-2 yards during the third quarter. The Bulldogs did not record a first down in the period and possessed the ball for only 1:45.

Fresno State reached the USC 8-yard line on its final possession, but USC DE Jaden Ramos recorded a sack on fourth-and-goal to preserve the shutout. Ramos finished with 3 tackles, a sack and a tackle for loss.

USC finished with 27 first downs, averaged 8.1 yards per play and converted 5-of-8 third-down attempts. USC K Caden Chittenden was a perfect 5-for-5 on extra-point attempts.

Coach Lincoln Riley said...

"Excited about the win. Really excited about the shutout. Obviously, it's hard to do. Doesn't happen very often in college football these days. We played at our standard for a higher level tonight, and that was really great to see on all sides. I think the excitement, energy in the Coliseum, energy with our football team was pretty consistent the whole way through. I think we played better as a football team than we did in week one. And that's what you got to do. It may sound boring, cliché, whatever, but that's how you get good, right? You just have to keep taking steps."

... **Maiava's** 92.0% completion percentage is the highest single-game completion percentage by a USC quarterback since at least 1995 (minimum 25 attempts). He broke the mark he set last week against San José State (86.2% going 25-of-29).

... **Maiava** had a stretch of 15 straight completions. The last time a USC quarterback had 15+ consecutive completions in a single game prior to Saturday was 17 by former Trojan and Heisman Trophy winner Caleb Williams on Sept. 30, 2023 at Colorado in a 48-41 win. Last week against San José State, **Maiava** had a stretch of 14-straight completions.

... His 92.0% completion percentage was just three percentage points shy of USC's single-game record for a passer with at least 15 completions: Matt Barkley's 19-of-20 performance (.950) against Colorado in 2012.

USC 49, Louisiana 30

Sept. 12, 2026 • Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum • Los Angeles

In USC's third game of the 2026 season, the No. 14 Trojans defeated the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns 49-30 in front of a crowd of 60,019 in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. USC recorded 483 yards of total offense, converted 11-of-15 third-down attempts and controlled the ball for 33:14 as the Trojans improved to 3-0.

Louisiana intercepted USC **QB Jayden Maiava** on the opening possession and turned the takeaway into a 47-yard field goal. The Trojans responded with a methodical 13-play, 79-yard drive that took 6:21 off the clock. Maiava capped the possession with a 5-yard TD pass to USC **TE Mark Bowman**, the first TD of Bowman's Trojan career, to give USC a 7-3 lead.

USC's defense did not allow Louisiana to record a first down in the opening quarter, while the Trojan offense outgained the Ragin' Cajuns 150-18. Bowman continued his breakout performance on USC's ensuing possession, hurdling two Louisiana defenders during a career-long 35-yard reception. He later caught a 9-yard TD pass from Maiava to extend USC's lead to 14-3 early in the second quarter.

After Louisiana cut the lead to 14-10, the Trojans answered with a 12-play, 87-yard scoring drive. USC converted three third downs during the possession, including a 19-yard TD pass from Maiava to USC **WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt**. USC **WR/RET Trent Mosley** then broke the game open late in the first half, escaping a pair of tackles and racing 86 yards for a punt-return TD to send the Trojans into halftime with a 28-10 lead.

USC forced a three-and-out to open the second half before taking possession at the Louisiana 41-yard line. Seven plays later, Maiava connected with Mosley for a 21-yard TD to extend the lead to 35-10. Mosley finished with 127 all-purpose yards, recording 33 receiving yards, 8 rushing yards and 86 punt-return yards.

Louisiana responded with an 81-yard TD drive, but USC quickly regained control. Early in the fourth quarter, Maiava found USC WR Zacharyus Williams for a 44-yard TD, the first of Williams' Trojan career, to push the advantage to 42-17.

The Ragin' Cajuns answered with a 32-yard TD run by QB Lunch Winfield, but USC responded with a seven-play, 75-yard scoring drive. USC **RB King Miller** carried the ball four times for 55 yards during the possession, including a 12-yard TD run that produced the Trojans' final points of the night.

Maiava completed 19-of-29 passes for 261 yards and a career-high 5 TDs, distributing his scoring passes among four different receivers. The Trojan offensive line did not allow a sack for the second consecutive game.

USC **DE Luke Wafle** led the Trojan defense with a career-high 7 tackles, including a team-best 6 solo tackles and 1.0 tackle for loss. USC **DE Zuriah Fisher** recorded a sack and forced a fumble in the fourth quarter as the Trojans held Louisiana to 3-of-10 on third-down attempts.

USC finished with 25 first downs, averaged 6.8 yards per play and scored TDs on all four trips to the red zone. USC **K Caden Chittenden** was a perfect 7-for-7 on extra-point attempts.

Coch Lincoln Riley said...

"I think if we'd set a goal here in the beginning, it would have obviously been to win the first three games. Get a chance to play a bunch of guys, develop our roster, put a lot of guys out there to see where they're at, and give us a chance to evaluate and develop, which we've been able to do. This is what you do it for -- to go into conference play, to get out on the road, which we're looking forward to. So we have to have a great week and get ready for a little bit of travel out there and get ready to play."

USC 42, Rutgers 35

Sept. 19, 2026 • SHI Stadium • Piscataway, N.J.

In USC's fourth game of the 2026 season, the No. 12 Trojans defeated the Rutgers Scarlet Knights 42-35 in front of a crowd of 43,045 at SHI Stadium in Piscataway, N.J. USC recorded 461 yards of total offense and averaged 7.3 yards per play as the Trojans improved to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in Big Ten Conference play.

USC opened the game with a 12-play, 58-yard drive that took 5:30 off the clock. USC **K Caden Chittenden** capped the possession with a 35-yard field goal, the first of his Trojan career, to give USC a 3-0 lead.

USC **S Christian Pierce** intercepted Rutgers QB Dylan Loneran on the Scarlet Knights' second offensive play of the game and returned the ball 16 yards to the Rutgers 24-yard line. USC **RB King Miller** carried the ball on each of the ensuing two plays, scoring on an 11-yard run to extend the lead to 10-0.

After Rutgers cut the lead to 10-7, USC answered with a six-play, 75-yard scoring drive. USC **QB Jayden Maiava** connected with USC **WR Corey Simms** for a career-long 52-yard TD, the first TD of Simms' Trojan career, to push the advantage to 17-7 early in the second quarter.

Rutgers responded with a 14-play, 95-yard TD drive, but the Trojans added points before heading back to the locker room. Maiava completed passes of 25 and 14 yards during an eight-play, 61-yard drive before Chittenden connected on a 32-yard field goal to send USC into halftime with a 20-14 lead.

Rutgers drove to the USC 9-yard line on the opening possession of the second half, but USC **S Prophet Brown** intercepted Loneran at the 1-yard line and returned it 99 yards for a TD. Brown tied USC's record for longest interception return (99-yards, Bud Langley, 1936 versus Notre Dame). The pick-six extended USC's lead to 27-14 and marked the Trojans' second takeaway of the game.

After Rutgers responded with a TD, USC answered with a seven-play, 75-yard scoring drive. USC **RB Riley Wormley** opened the possession with a career-long 27-yard run and later scored on a 12-yard rush. Maiava then connected with USC **WR Kayden Dixon-Wyatt** for a successful two-point conversion to give USC a 35-21 lead.

Rutgers cut the advantage to 35-28 and stopped USC on fourth down early in the final quarter. The Trojan defense responded by forcing a turnover on downs at the Rutgers 24-yard line. Five plays later, Maiava found Wormley for a 2-yard TD to extend USC's lead to 42-28.

Rutgers pulled within 42-35 with 4:24 remaining, but the Trojans did not allow the Scarlet Knights to regain possession. Miller carried the ball six times for 41 yards on USC's final drive, converting three first downs as the Trojans ran out the clock.

Maiava completed 20-of-32 passes for 277 yards and 2 TDs without an interception. Dixon-Wyatt led the Trojans with 5 receptions for 77 yards, while Simms recorded a career high 72 receiving yards with 1 TD.

Miller recorded his second 100-yard rushing performance of the season, gaining 102 yards and scoring 1 TD on 16 carries. Wormley added a career-high 52 rushing yards and 1 TD on 3 carries while also catching his first career receiving TD.

Pierce led the Trojan defense with a career-high 11 tackles, including 6 solo tackles, 1 interception and 2 pass breakups. USC scored 14 points off its two interceptions, while **LB Desman Stephens II** and **DE Kameryn Crawford** combined for the Trojans' lone sack.

Coach Lincoln Riley said...

"Excited to get the win. Lively game. Saw some things tonight that I've never seen in my career, but this is the road. And proud of us for getting it done. We had contributions from all three sides and we'll build on those. But, we gave up some big plays on all three sides and gave up too many big plays defensively. Not pleased at all with how we played there. We made some big play too – the pick-six was massive, and Christian's pick earlier in the game was really good. We still need to clean up penalties. We're not going to take road wins for granted; in this league, they're all hard. We did nice job closing the game out."
