TOREROS DEFINED



The University of San Diego, which sponsors sixteen NCAA Division I intercollegiate teams, competes under the athletic nickname of Toreros. In 1961, the Most Reverend Bishop Buddy, the founding father of USD, announced that the school's nickname would change from Pioneers to Toreros. "The name Toreros is keeping with the friendly relationship which exists between San Diego and Mexico," His Excellency said at the time. Torero comes from the Spanish term toro, the bull, and from the word torear, to fight bulls. All of the contestants in the ring are called toreros. Torero is a general term describing a bullfighter and signifies courage, honor and fidelity. USD student-athletes, like the Torero, represent a willingness to stand alone in the ring and accept the challenge.

The 2005-2006 school year marks the 45th anniversary with Toreros as the official nickname for USD athletic teams.

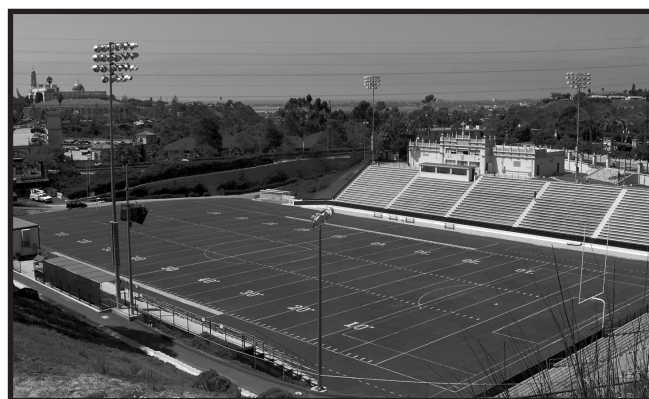


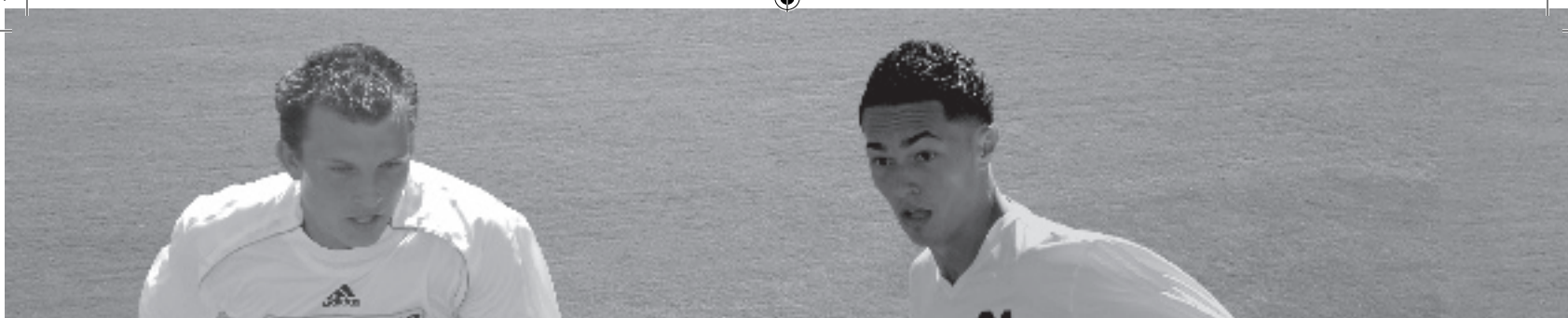
TORERO STADIUM

Torero Stadium, home to USD soccer and football, also was home to the San Diego Spirit, the women's professional soccer team that played three seasons in the WUSA (2001-03). With that, Torero Stadium received numerous upgrades that make it one of the best facilities of its size on the west coast.

New seating behind the east endzone, as well as on the south side of the field, expands the stadium seating capacity to 7,000 seats. Torero Stadium also received a new grass turf, new lighting and sound system, and additional press box space. A little over a year ago the field was widened by 7 yards; it is now 72 yards wide for soccer.

Torero Stadium has also been the host site for numerous men's and women's NCAA Postseason Tournaments.





FRESH LOOK FOR USD WILL PAY OFF IN THE LONG RUN

The University of San Diego men's soccer team lost only four starters this past season and will return 15 letter winners, including senior front-man Dusting Guerrero and senior defender Brett Hiroto for the 2007 season. The Torero coaching staff will look heavily to the upperclassmen to guide this year's squad to the post season. However, the underclassmen, including sophomore defensemen Ryan Peterman and sophomore forward J.T. Howlan (three goals in 2006), should not be overlooked.

"There are a lot of different variations we can use with this squad," said head coach Seamus McFadden. "It's just a matter of fitting the right peg in the right hole."

The Toreros were recognized by the conference with numerous All-WCC honors in 2006. Three seniors (Ryan Guy, Michael Caso, and Kevin Meissner) all earned first team All-Conference honors. While returner Tim Grey earned both Honorable Mention and All-Freshman honors. Sam Reeder also made the Honorable Mention team, and Ryan Peterman made the All-Freshman team as well. With returners like Grey, Peterman, and Reeder, the Toreros will make a strong presence in the WCC.

"We've got lots of experience and now we need to translate this into performance." Said McFadden

In the WCC pre-season coaches' poll, USD was picked to finish third after leading the conference with 47 goals last season and tying a WCC record with 22 goals against league opponents. The Toreros will look to improve upon that mark this upcoming season with last year's rookie squad gaining more experience on the field.

"We initiated a new system in the spring and it worked well for us," explained McFadden. "We had good results and hopefully some of that success can carry over from the spring."

The Captains

The team chose seniors Dustin Guerrero and Colin Jennings, and junior Sam Reeder to lead the 2007 squad.

Up Front

Returning to the front line this season are sophomores JT Howlan and Chase Tangney. Tangney posted three assists in his 15 appearances last season while Howlan recorded three goals and four assists in his 19 appearances. Looking for field time at the striker position will be Kyle Ochoa and Brandon Kelley.

"Depending on the situation, we'll be working on a substitution pattern to integrate Ochoa and Kelley up front," said McFadden.

Ochoa, a 6-foot freshman from Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. was a four year scholar-athlete scoring 25 goals for Etiwanda, and was a high school teammate of Mike Barbeito. Kelley, a 6-foot freshman comes from Snohomish, Wash. where as an upperclassman he combined to score 48 goals and was named team MVP and Gatorade State Player of the Year as a senior.

In The Middle

Backing up the forward attack and thwarting off the opposition will be seniors Tannen Wels, Colin Jennings, and Dustin Guerrero. Jennings will play a powerful role in the middle with his ability to make plays happen when the pressure is on. Guerrero is USD's leading goal scorer (4) returning in 2007 while tallying three assists and taking seven shots on goal, followed by Wels with three goals last season.

"Traditionally Guerrero gives us a good work ethic and drops back in a hurry and works really hard in the midfield," commented McFadden.

Helping out the seniors in the midfield will be sophomore Mike Barbeito, who scored two goals in 11 appearances. Freshman Kegan Johnson from Bend, Ore. also has great potential in the future for USD. Johnson was team captain, two-time All-League, All-State as a senior, and helped lead his team to an undefeated season until the championship game where they finished second in the state.

The Backfield

The defensive side of the field will be led by seniors Brett Hiroto and Blaine Smith, and junior Sam Reeder. Junior Dane McCleary and sophomores Ryan Peterman, Tim Grey, Tony Ortega, and Fabrice Gautrat will also play vital roles in rounding out the defense. The freshman defenders include Chris Busch, Max Blumenshine, JD Penilton, and Josh Converse who will all compete for playing time in 2007. Busch, a 5-foot-9 freshman, joins the team from Santa Cruz, Calif. where as a junior he helped lead

his team to the Central Coast Championships and then to the finals his senior year. His teammate, Josh Converse, was named WCAL Honorable Mention playing for the Santa Cruz Country Breakers club team. Blumenshine, a 5-foot-11 freshman, was named All-League as a senior.

The Last Line...

Kelin Briones is due up to take control of the box. The 5-foot-11 junior tallied 223 minutes in five appearances during the 2006 campaign. Briones had two goals against and recorded one save, one win, and one shutout. Competing for time in goal will be freshman Adam Campbell and Mike Sinodis. Sinodis is a walk-on freshman from Gilbert, Ariz. Campbell, a 6-foot-4 freshman, was named Team MVP, League MVP, was named first team All-League, and first team All-CIF.

Tommy McClain, currently recovering from an injury he sustained prior to the start of non-conference action, could also see time in the keeper box later in the season Coach McFadden said.

The Schedule

The toreros face another grueling schedule battling against tough non-conference & West Coast Conference opponents. Six teams USD will face in 2007 made it to post season action last year (Cal Berkeley, Hofstra, Brown, University of San Francisco, and Santa Clara University) including the runners up in the title match, UCLA.

"It's going to be tough," explained McFadden. "It will be a big test for us. But we feel we can beat anyone on the day."

The always difficult double round robin format calls for USD to play every WCC team once at home and once on the road. The schedule does not let up once conference action starts with Santa Clara ranked in the top ten in the nation.

"We want to do better in conference," said McFadden "It's a difficult schedule just looking at it. We want to present ourselves well against each team but the focus is conference."

Coach McFadden went on to explain that the new system they tried out in the spring will hopefully help them once conference play begins and bring them better consistency against WCC opponents.

The Coaching Staff

Returning for his 29th season as head coach of the men's soccer program is Seamus McFadden. McFadden holds a 283-202-43 overall record and a 66-50-11 West Coast Conference mark. Assisting him in his third year with the Toreros is Mike

Nicholson. Joining the coaching staff in his first year is Brian Quinn.

"The staff this year is great," commented McFadden. "I'm real excited with 'Nico' (Mike Nicholson) and 'Quinny' (Brian Quinn). I think both Nicholson Quinn are great coaches, both very dynamic, and are all on the same game plan together. They have a lot of knowledge about soccer. Quinn played for the national team and brings a wealth of experience. Nico is just as talented, and I think they both could be coaching at the division I level."

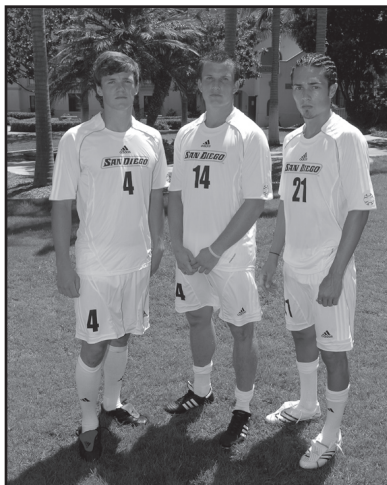
With the new addition to the coaching staff, McFadden described how excited with anticipation he was for the first match to see how things fall into place.

The Season Opener

"We want to get back to the tournament," stated McFadden. "That's our priority, and win the conference title. We'll take it one step at a time. We've been working hard to get the recruits here to balance the team and we've got the talent."

The Toreros open up against the Cal Berkeley Golden Bears on August 31 at home. West Coast Conference play will begin on October 7 when USD faces Santa Clara at Torero Stadium.

"We've got lots of youth and experience and now we just have to see the performance."

SEAMUS McFADDEN

Head Coach - 29th Season

With all of the success enjoyed by the Torero soccer teams the last several years - eleven NCAA Tournament appearances in thirteen seasons - it is easy to overlook the remarkable job Coach **Séamus McFadden** has done building the program from the ground up.

McFadden has been named West Coast Conference Coach of the Year a record seven times (2000, '99, '98, '95, '94, '92, '86); won five WCC championships; has coached eight WCC Defensive Players of the Year, six WCC Offensive Players of the Year and two WCC Freshman Players of the Year. The 2006 squad was a mix of youth and experience finishing 10-8-1 overall, XXXXX.

In 2003 his squad went 12-4-4, placed second in the highly competitive WCC, and reached the 2nd round of the NCAA Tourney. In 2002 he directed USD to a 14-6 mark and first round appearance in the NCAA Tourney. In 2001 the Toreros went 12-4-1 and four seasons ago he directed his Toreros to a 16-2-2 record, another WCC title and its eighth trip to the NAAs since 1990. The Toreros reached a national ranking as high as 3rd before finishing the season tenth overall (program-best).

McFadden arrived at USD in 1979 and fielded USD's first team in the fall of 1980. That same year he was quoted in the team's yearbook as saying: "I have no doubts that in the near future the University of San Diego will become a force to be reckoned with in Southern California intercollegiate soccer." How prophetic his words turned out to be.

The 1986 Toreros won 19 of 24 games. The 1990 squad, led by the first of McFadden's four All-Americans, dropped just three games the entire season and advanced to the NCAA Second Round. Those who know McFadden closely could see the writing on the wall many years earlier, when the Irishman led Mesa JC to a 30-4 record over two seasons while at the same time guiding Clairemont High to consecutive CIF-San Diego Section titles and the La Jolla Cup.

The whole puzzle came together in 1992 when McFadden had in place several of San Diego's best local talent. Student-athletes, who in the past had looked outside the city to showcase their talents, were suddenly arriving at Alcalá Park. The 1992 Toreros showed remarkable poise under their leader, compiling a 19-5 record and advancing to the NCAA Championship Game.

The 54-year-old McFadden seems to save his best coaching for the big games. Twice the Toreros have marched onto UCLA's home turf and walked away with stunning upsets over the heavily-favored Bruins. In 1994, USD shutout No. 6 ranked N.C. State, 3-0, in front of a national cable television audience. In 1998, USD upset Cal State Fullerton, the No. 7 seed in the NCAA Tournament, at Titan Stadium in first round action. In 1999 the Toreros defeated then No. 1-ranked Santa Clara on the road, 2-1 in overtime. USD is 8-10 in NCAA Tournament games under McFadden's direction.

McFadden played collegiately at San Diego State, where he received a B.A. degree in History in 1976. That same summer he was with the San Diego Jaws of the North American Soccer League.

Keeping true to his native roots, McFadden took the 1997 squad on a trip to his homeland Ireland during the summer for exhibition games against Ireland and Britain's elite. In the summer of 2002 he is took his players to England. A native of Donegal, Ireland, Séamus and his wife davette have two daughters (Hadley & Rorye) and a son (Conor). The McFaddens reside in Rancho Penasquitos.

Assistant Coach - 3rd Season

Michael “Nico” Nicholson returns for his second season as an assistant coach to Seamus McFadden and the University of San Diego men’s soccer program. Nicholson comes to Alcalá Park after serving as an assistant coach to the University of California, San Diego women’s soccer program from 1994-2005. During his stint with UCSD, the Tritons captured three NCAA Division II and three NCAA Division III national championships.



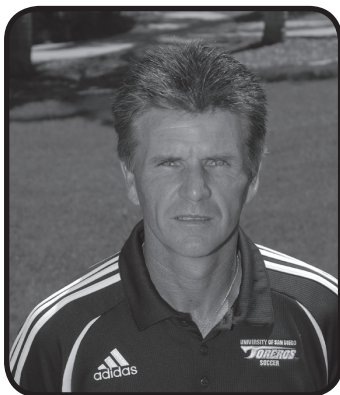
From 2003-05, Nicholson was also the director of the Temecula/Murrieta Soccer Club and from 1998 to 2003, he acted as the Head Boy’s Coach for the San Diego Surf. Many of the club teams at the Surf achieved Regional and State success and many of his players were placed on national teams. In 1994, he coached the Nomads Boy’s Under 16 club that won a national championship.

In addition to his tremendous wealth of coaching experience, Nicholson also spent time with the United Systems of Independent Soccer League, a men’s semi-professional league. He played three seasons for the San Diego Top Guns from 1993-95 and guided his team to the Regional Finalists in 1994 and 1995.

Nicholson graduated from the University of Leeds in England, where he earned a degree in Sports Science in 1989. He captained his soccer team to the national finals in 1989 and his team won the national championship in 1986.

BRIAN QUINN

Assistant Coach - 1st Season

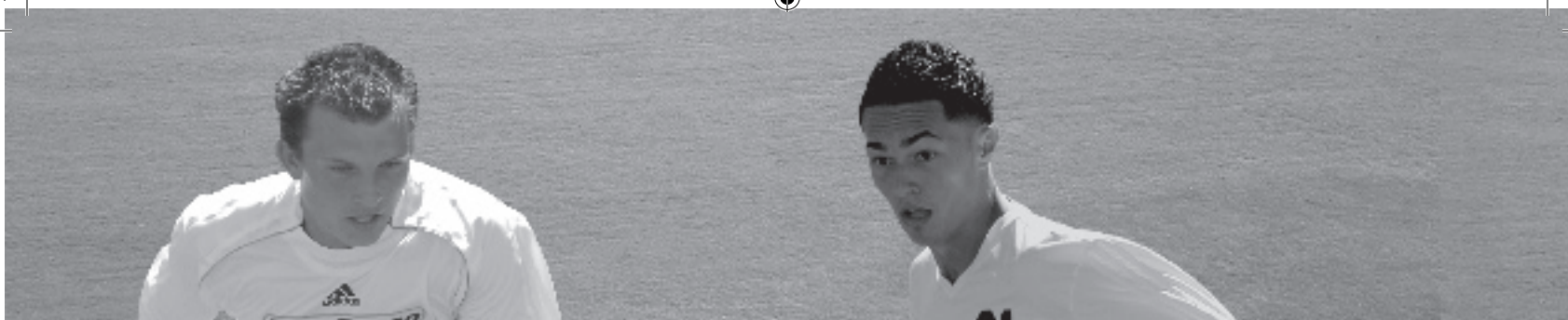


Born in Belfast, Ireland, Brian Quinn joins the USD men's soccer program for his first year with the Toreros. He has many years of both playing and coaching at the highest level to accompany his distinguished 16 year professional career dating back all the way to 1978.



Quinn holds a USSF 'A' Coaching license. He coached the San Diego Sockers in the CISL from 1995-96. In 1997-99 coached the San Jose Clash/Earthquakes of the MLS before returning for a second term with the San Diego Sockers from 2000-04 in the MISL. The former Director of Coaching of Poway Youth Soccer Club (1991-94), Quinn currently is the Director of Boys coaching for F.C. San Diego, Program Development Advisor AYSO Matrix and is a Technical Director for adidas ESP developmental program. He also coached The Bishop’s School, La Jolla girls varsity soccer team.

Quinn was an 8 time Champion with the San Diego Sockers, 8 time All-Star, 4th all time scorer in Sockers history, 2nd All time playoff Scorer, 2 Time MVP in playoff championship Series (1986 & 1990), 1991 Gold Cup Winner - US National Team, 1992 US Cup Winner - US National Team, was the youngest coach in Major League Soccer history in 1997, and co-host of "Inside Soccer" internet radio show.

The University of San Diego

The University of San Diego is an independent Catholic institution of higher education. Founded in 1949, USD is located on 180 acres overlooking Mission Bay, San Diego Harbor and the Pacific Ocean. The campus is named Alcalá Park and is located just 10 minutes from downtown San Diego and the world famous San Diego Zoo. Historic Old Town is just minutes away as well. The city of San Diego along with this campus traces their origins to fifteenth century Spain. The campus was named after a Spanish village near Madrid - Alcalá de Henares. Founded by the Greeks as Complutum, the village was later renamed Al Kala (the Castle) by the Moslems. Christians recaptured the village centuries later and founded a university, the University of Alcalá, whose buildings became the inspiration for USD's style.

The Campus

The USD campus is regarded as one of the most architecturally unique institutions in the country, featuring major buildings designed in an ornamental 16th century Spanish Renaissance style. Since 1984, USD has completed numerous major construction and expansion projects. In 2000, the Jenny Craig Pavilion, a 5,100-seat athletic center, opened its doors as home to USD volleyball and basketball. In the fall of 2001, the Joan B. Kroc Institute for Peace and Justice opened on the west end of campus and a new Science and Technology Center recently opened for the 2003-04 academic year.

A five-story Spanish Renaissance parking garage (1,100 spaces) was completed in 1998. A landscaped fountain plaza was finished in the fall of 1995, connecting the entrances of the Immaculata and Hughes Administration Center.

In 1992, the university completed the 45,000 square-foot Loma Hall, which includes an expanded bookstore, a larger mail center, classrooms, and laboratories.

Alumni Center is a three-story, 28,000 gross square foot structure that provides on campus facilities for alumni programs, information and social functions. It houses the departments of University Relations and Development.

Academics

USD enrolls more than 7,600 students who have a choice of more than 60 undergraduate and graduate degree programs. The university's academic units include the College of Arts and Sciences, and the Schools of Business Administration, Education, Law, and Nursing. Class size generally averages between 15-25 students with the student to teacher ratio being 14:1. Over 97 percent of USD's full-time faculty hold doctorates.

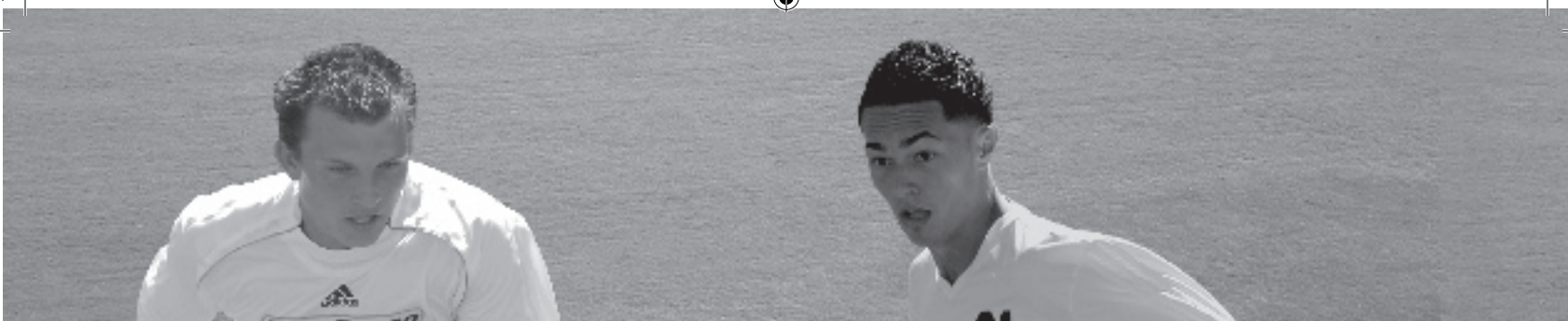
In the annual ratings of the country's colleges and universities, published by U.S. News & World Report, USD moved from the regional to national category in 1994. The university now consistently ranks among the top schools in the United States.

Athletics

The University of San Diego is a member of the West Coast Conference for nearly all sports and competes in 16 intercollegiate sports on the NCAA Division I level. The football team just completed its 14th season in the Pioneer Football League. Women's sports include: basketball, cross country, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. Men's sports

include: baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, football, rowing, soccer and tennis. Since 1990, USD teams have made 52 NCAA post-season appearances; garnered 66 All-American selections; had 37 Conference Coaches of the Year; won 18 conference championships; and 4 WCC Scholar Athletes of the Year.

KY SNYDER - Executive Director of Athletics

Ky Snyder was named Executive Director of Athletics at the University of San Diego on December 10th, 2003. Dr. Mary E. Lyons, USD President, introduced Snyder who returns to USD where he was Director of Athletic Development between 1990-1996. He came back to USD from the San Diego International Sports Council where he held the position of President.

With the San Diego International Sports Council, the Snyder's primary responsibility was to promote San Diego/Tijuana as the preferred region for sporting events and activities that benefit the community both economically and socially. Recent accomplishments of the Sports Council bid efforts include securing for San Diego the 1997 and 1998 ESPN Summer X Games, the Suzuki Rock 'n' Roll Marathon, the 1999 Major League Soccer All-Star Game, the inaugural Bank of America/U.S. Olympic Cup, NCAA Division I Men's Basketball First & Second Round (2001) contests, the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championships (2001) and Super Bowl XXXVII.

In the spring of 2001, Snyder was named the President of the San Diego Super Bowl XXXVII Host Committee. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the San Diego NFL Youth Education Town and the San Diego Super Bowl Task Force. Snyder was also the Executive Director of the San Diego International Sports Foundation.

Prior to joining the SDISC, Snyder was the Director of Athletic Development at the University of San Diego for six years. At USD he was responsible for establishing the Torero Athletic Association, fund-raising efforts for athletics, managing athletic special events and generating corporate sponsorship of athletics.

At USD he oversees an athletic department with sixteen NCAA Division I intercollegiate teams and approximately 400 student-athletes. He is responsible for all administrative, management and supervisory aspects of the Department of Athletics. Additionally, he oversees the strategic long-range planning and monitoring of budgets, personnel, programs, facilities, fundraising, promotions and marketing, and public relations for an NCAA Division I program consisting of eight sports for men and eight sports for women. He serves on the NCAA Division I Football Rules Committee, the West Coast Conference TV Committee, Marketing Committee and Women's Basketball Committee.

Snyder played football at San Diego State University. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Marketing from San Diego State University and has studied in the Master's Leadership Program at the University of San Diego. He is a guest lecturer at the University of San Diego's MBA Sports Management program and the SDSU Hospitality Management program.

Snyder, who has been a San Diego resident for 24 years, has a very athletic family. His wife, Sue, was a former standout member of the United States women's national volleyball team who played at San Diego State and also coached the Aztecs and University of San Diego's women's volleyball teams. In addition, Snyder's father, Lester, held the position as President of the United States Tennis Association. The Snyder's reside in Poway with their son Riley (age 13), daughter Sydney (age 10) and daughter Cammy (age 7).



USD Academic Support

The USD Athletic Academic Support program is designed to promote the academic development of student-athletes. The primary objective is to offer the necessary resources for the academic success of student-athletes as they work to earn their degree. Academic Support services are designed to enhance the student-athlete's overall collegiate experience and encourage development and attainment of academic and career goals.

Sarabeth Pollock is in her first year as the Coordinator of Athletic Academic Support for USD Athletics. She has worked as a tutor in the Athletic Department since the fall of 2001. Pollock earned her B.A. degree in Political Science and History, with a minor in Spanish. A 5th generation San Diegan, she resides in Point Loma.

All USD student athletes have access to advising, tutoring and mentoring services. The mentoring program, Torero Blue and Men Torero, were developed in 2005 and team a graduate student in the Counseling program with an athlete who would like to enhance study skills, learn about campus resources and receive guidance on goal development and attainment. Student-athletes also have access to a quiet area where they can study or work in the computer center. In addition, student-athletes are encouraged to utilize the campus learning centers including the Writing, Math and Logic Centers as well as to take advantage of the resources available to them in the Career Center, Counseling Center and Computer Labs.

"The greatest challenge to a Division I athlete is to balance the demands of sport while taking full advantage of the educational experience offered. The purpose of our program is to assist student-athletes in meeting this challenge by offering tutoring, advising, mentoring and a quiet environment to study. Torero Strength and Conditioning

The University of San Diego athletic department recognizes the need for all athletes of all sports to engage in a comprehensive strength and conditioning program. The USD strength and conditioning program has been designed to develop functional strength, speed, power and endurance. The development of these physical attributes is ineffective if the athletes are not able to carry them over to the playing field. Adhering to a properly designed program of strength training, conditioning and nutrition can enable our men and women to become the best possible athletes they can be, while simultaneously reducing the incidence of injury.

The heart of the strength and conditioning program is the Jenny Craig Pavilion fitness center (3,800 square feet) and the USD Sports Center weight room (5,000 square feet). Both weight rooms contain Olympic platforms, free-weights, selectorized machines, dumbbells and cardiovascular equipment, and are open exclusively to student-athletes at specific times each day.

USD student-athletes receive intensive instruction on proper weight training technique; speed, power and agility development; and sport-specific conditioning. Their strength and conditioning programs are specific to the nature of their sport or position. Each athlete is individually monitored throughout their program to ensure the greatest chance of athletic progress.
