MEDIA POLICIES

The 2005 USF volleyball media guide is designed to assist members of the media in its coverage of the Bulls volleyball program. Additional information, including press releases and photographs, may be obtained by contacting USF Assistant Sports Information Director Rachel Constantine at (813) 974-0415. Please take a moment to review the following policies and services that are intended to assist you in your coverage of USF volleyball this season.

Media Credentials

All requests for press, broadcast and photo credentials for USF home volleyball games should be directed to SID Rachel Constantine via e-mail (rachelc@admin.usf.edu), phone (813-974-0415) or fax (813-974-5328). All requests should be made at least one week prior to the event.

As a general rule, working space is allocated on the following basis: (1) daily newspapers/beat writers and wire-service writers covering for next-day publications; (2) radio and television personnel for broadcast origination; (3) newspaper and television photographers.

Media Will Call

A media pass list will be left at MEDIA WILL CALL at Gate 1 of the USF Sun Dome.

Media Parking

Parking for all USF home volleyball games is located in the Visitor Parking Lot north of the Sun Dome. Parking is free two hours prior to the start of the game on weekdays and all day during the weekend.

Player Interviews

All media requests for interviews with USF volleyball players should be directed to SID Rachel Constantine (office: 813-974-0415), preferably 24 hours in advance. The best time for in-season interviews, either in

person or on the phone, is following practice. Most USF practices begin at 3 p.m. and end at approximately 6 p.m. Because the team usually travels on Thursdays or Fridays, the best time to attend practices are Monday through Wednesday. Practices are held at The Corral (located in the Sun Dome). Members of the media should contact SID Rachel Constantine 24 hours in advance to attend practice. Interviews conducted following practice should be held to a brief Q & A session. With advanced notice, interviews with players can be arranged for other hours.

Calling players at home or on cell phones without permission from SID Rachel Constantine will not be tolerated. The players' dorms, training room and weight room are also off limits. On game days, players are unavailable until after the game.

Head Coach Interviews

All interviews with Head Coach Claire Lessinger should be arranged through SID Rachel Constantine (office: 813-974-0415).

Postgame Interviews

Head Coach Claire Lessinger and requested players will be available for postgame interviews following a brief cool-down period. All interviews will be conducted outside the locker room. Postgame procedures for visiting teams is at the sole discretion of the visiting SID.

Media members can access biographical data on the entire coaching staff and the current roster. **2005
PREVIEW**



The 2005 USF volleyball season will prove to be the most challenging season in the program's history. With USF entering its inaugural season in the BIG EAST Conference, the Bulls will be elevated to a higher level competitively and to the nation's forefront in collegiate athletics. USF's volleyball team has been highly successful through the years, achieving seven NCAA postseason berths in 12 years and four Conference USA Titles. As the Bulls begin a new era in its athletics, the volleyball team will look to make its mark in its new conference.

In addition, after missing out on the NCAA Tournament the past two years and with a coaching change prior to the 2004 season, the Bulls are positioned to have a highly successful season as they return seven players (five starters) to the 2005 squad. Second-year Head Coach Claire Lessinger, who has been with the USF volleyball program as an assistant from 1999-03, will use her BIG EAST experience as an assistant with Boston College (1998) to help the Bulls make an immediate impact in its new league. In addition, the Bulls come into the 2005 season with a 13-person squad compared to last season's nine-player roster, providing the 2005 club with depth and talent at each spot.

"The BIG EAST is a powerful volleyball conference and we are thrilled to elevate our level of competition week in and week out," Lessinger said. "This is an exciting time for the volleyball program as well as USF athletics. The energy from our administration all the way down to our players is very positive and enthusiastic."

Outside Hitters

The position of the outside hitter for the 2005 squad will feature the return of senior Flavia Silveira and sophomore Michelle Stalbaum.

A transfer to the 2004 volleyball team, Silveira proved to be one of the most consistent players last season. An all-around player,

the Fortaleza, Brazil, native led the team in kills per game (4.18) and hitting percentage (.228). She was also ranked third in kills per game (4.18) and fifth in points per game (4.59) last season in Conference USA. As one of three seniors on this year's team, she will be looked to provide leadership on the floor while continuing to be one of the key components to USF's success in the BIG EAST.

With one year under her belt playing and starting in all 29 matches last year, Stalbaum already has a feel for Lessinger's system and will look to improve upon her freshman season in which she made an immediate impact. Besides playing in all of USF's matches, the sophomore tallied a team-high 13 double-doubles on the year in 2004. A threat in both the front row and the back row, the Gainesville, Fla., native finished the 2004 season ranked first in services aces per game (0.29) and ranked second in kills per game (3.22).

The Bulls welcome three freshmen - Stephanie Augustavo, Stephanie Bradley and Falin Daniel - to the 2005 team in the outside hitter role. The incoming hitters will not only provide versatility to the position, but could also provide depth in more than one offensive role.

Augustavo enters her freshman year at USF coming off a stellar high school playing career. While at Bishop Blanchet High School, she was the team's MVP from 2002-04 and was a first team All-Metro selection from 2002-04, as well as a PrepVolleyball.com All-America in 2004. Bradley joins the Bulls after leading her high school team, Middleburg High, in kills and blocks for three seasons, while finishing her senior year as the school's record holder in kills and aces. Daniel is a freshman walk-on that has also had a stellar high-school playing career. The Port Charlotte, Fla., native will give depth to the roster as she can play both the outside and right side hitter role.

"The outside hitter position offers the most depth we have ever had," commented Lessinger. "Every player brings a different dynamic to the game which will allow us to be very strategic against opponents. Flavia and Michelle will be great role models for the incoming freshmen because they are experienced and comfortable in the current system. All the outside hitters on our roster are offensive as well as highly-skilled defensive players. The competition in practice will be intense and exciting."

Middle Blocker/Right Side Hitter

The middle blocker position features only one returning player and two newcomers. However, the returning player, Kristina Fabris, was named C-USA Freshman of the Year in 2004 and the freshmen, Ashley McDowell and Nakia Williams, possess athletic ability that will complement the experience and talent of Fabris.

Fabris recorded a stellar freshman season at USF in 2004 and will be looked upon to continue her high-level of play as a middle blocker. A native of Sudbury, Ontario, Canada, Fabris was the only Bull to start in all 29 matches and play in all 102 games. She finished third on the team in kills (312) and second in blocks (72).

McDowell and N. Williams are both highly-decorated high school players who will be looked upon to make an immediate impact with their level of ability and tremendous potential.

"Kristina is our only returning middle blocker," Lessinger said. "She has spent the summer with her Team Ontario team competing at the international level. I know she will be physically and mentally prepared for another great year. Nakia and Ashley are both physical athletes with drive and determination. We expect both of them to do great things."

Although Johari Williams is also the Bulls' only returning right side hitter, any one of the middle blockers - Fabris, McDowell, N. Williams - can add depth if needed to this position or challenge for a starting role because of their versatile style of play.

J. Williams is a dominant returning starter with great athleticism. She played in every match except one last year and finished third on the team in blocks per game (0.61) and fourth in kills per game (2.84).

"Johari Williams is our returning right side player," Lessinger added. "The competition for this position will come from the versatility and athleticism of our athletes. Ashley McDowell, Stephanie Bradley, Nakia Williams and Kristina Fabris are all potential right side players. The important thing is that we have size and an offensive weapon in this position. Johari did a great job last year, but with her athleticism we never know where we might need her."

Setters

The setting position may prove to be the most competitive position this season. With the return of two seniors and a highly-touted freshman, each player has a different style of setting that will

complement the team. Juliana Nogueira and Kelsi Andrew-Wasylik are both senior setters while Kate Verhoff is an incoming freshman. While Nogueira and Andrew-Wasylik have veteran experience, Verhoff's stellar high school career as well as her elite ability will allow her to challenge for the setting position. All players are and will be highly capable of "quarterbacking" the team.

Last season, Nogueira led the team in assists (1,102) and assists per game (11.72), placing her seventh in C-USA in her per-game average. A native of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Nogueira transferred to USF before the 2004 season and proved how and why she led her junior college team to the Region 16 Championship in 2002 and 2003.

A senior this year, Andrew-Wasylik tallied 109 digs and averaged 1.79 digs per game, all while finishing second on the team in assists (152) last season. Although she has had an injury-stricken career, her athleticism has been a key factor to her success.

Verhoff comes to USF from Elyria, Ohio. While at Elyria High, she was a four-year starter and two-year captain. In her senior year, she tallied 62 aces and 630 assists and tallied 206 points on serve. She has received many accolades based on her natural ability in this position and will be looked upon to continue her success at the college level.

"It is rare to have three setters on a roster," Lessinger said. "With Juliana and Kelsi recovering from injury we felt it was important to bring more depth to this position. We are very excited about all three players and their different styles. It will be a very competitive situation for all of them but will also create a very hard-working environment."

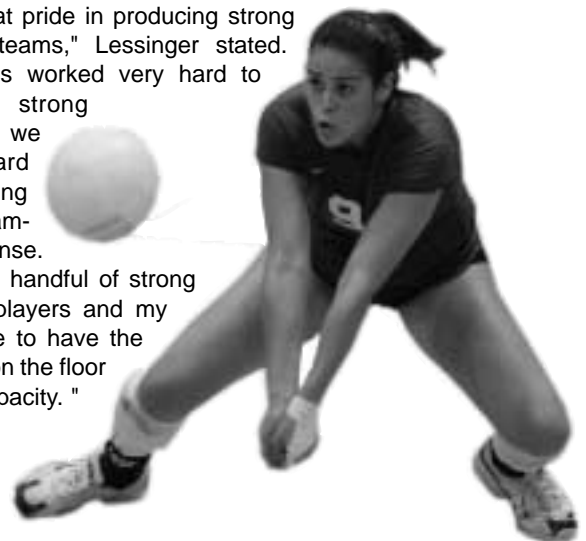
Libero/Defensive Specialist

The libero is the only position that does not feature a specific newcomer. Ashley Reavis returns for her junior season after playing in all 29 matches last year primarily in the libero position. Leading the team in digs (302) and digs per game (2.99), Reavis had a solid 2004 season for the Bulls after adapting to a new defensive style. There are a handful of current/incoming players that are elite defensive players. With 13 players on the roster there will definitely be competition for a defensive role and/or the libero position.

"I take great pride in producing strong defensive teams," Lessinger stated.

"Ashley has worked very hard to become a strong libero and we look forward to her setting a great example on defense.

We have a handful of strong defensive players and my goal will be to have the best ones on the floor in some capacity."

After one season under her belt as the head coach of the USF volleyball program, Claire Lessinger learned lessons that even her five years as a collegiate player and six as an assistant coach didn't prepare her for.

"With any job comes challenges; it is how you go about those challenges that is the key to overcoming them," Lessinger said. "I understand that success comes with hard work and my staff and I are dedicated to the success of this program. We also realize that you can't plant a seed and have a tree overnight. The biggest goal for me as a head coach is to stay patient and realistic as well as know that we have great players in place that will positively impact

the new foundation for this program. We have day-to-day goals, week-to-week goals, and year-to-year goals. If we stay on pace with them, we will be thrilled with the outcome."

In her first season at the helm and with just one key returning starter, no seniors, four freshmen and two junior college transfers on the roster, Lessinger took her team to a 9-20 finish and an appearance in the Conference USA Tournament in a season that was dubbed a "rebuilding year" from the beginning. Her young squad showed significant signs of improvement throughout the season and will only get better as everyone from the 2004 squad will return for 2005.

"I was truly pleased with the mental and physical improvements this team made throughout the season. We set realistic goals for this young team and focused mostly on player and team development. We realized with seven new players on the roster that we needed to emphasize team chemistry, discipline and hard work. We got all that and much more. We are fortunate to return all starters with a year of experience under their belt and hopefully players that are more comfortable in their leadership roles. Understanding and accepting roles will have a huge impact on the success of the 2005 season."

The Bulls' nine victories on the season were a deceiving number as they fought hard, falling in two tough five-game matches to East Carolina and Saint Louis, and falling just two points shy of forcing a fifth game in several others.

"It is no secret that the 2004 squad had some disappointing and heartbreaking losses," commented Lessinger. "There is a famous quote that expresses, 'You always learn more from a loss than from a win.' Let me say that we did a lot of learning this year. I attribute those close games and matches to youth, inexperience and lack of leadership. Talent was never our problem, and I believe those tough losses will have an everlasting emotional impact on these players. They know that our record did not reflect positively on what was truly accomplished this season and the Bulls are motivated to improve in 2005."

The team's greatest victory of Lessinger's young career came on Nov. 6 when the Bulls stunned the Memphis Tigers, who at the time were ranked third in the conference, with a 3-2 victory in The Corral.



After falling in games one and two by sizable margins, USF fought back for wins in games three, four and five, despite playing without one of their starting outside hitters for all three of those games.

"I have never been so proud of a team in all my life. I told these players that the Memphis match was one of the most exciting matches I have ever been a part of as a player and a coach. I am truthful when I say they were "in the zone" and played flawless volleyball the last three games to create the come-from-behind win. The win was at a great time in our season. It instantly boosted the team moral and proved we could compete at the highest level in our conference. It was rewarding to see the players grasp the concept of never giving up because in this sport, anything is possible."

Lessinger took over as head coach at USF on March 18, 2004, after serving as the assistant coach under former head coach Nancy Mueller for the previous five seasons.

In those five years, Lessinger helped lead USF volleyball to two Conference USA regular-season championships (2000 and 2002), a C-USA Tournament title (2002) and two trips to the NCAA Tournament (2000 and 2002). In her five years with the program, the Bulls have amassed a record of 106-60 (.639), including a 48-18 (.727) mark at home.

"Being named the head coach at an institution that I was already one hundred percent invested in and very passionate about made for an easy transition," she said. "The familiarity of USF and Tampa allowed me to not waste any time on adjusting to my surroundings but focus on the program and the success of the team. A native of Tampa, I am surrounded by a tremendous support staff and a community that I grew up in. It personally doesn't get any better than this for me."

Originally a middle blocker who was forced to play defensive specialist after several knee surgeries, Lessinger has worked with USF's middle blockers since joining the Bulls in 1999, and every one of her athletes has received All-Conference recognition. Rachelle Paul and Shameka Mitchell were first team selections in 2000 and 2003, respectively, while Bonnye Glover was named to the third team in 2002 and Rachel Jobs and Mitchell were on the all-freshman team in 2001.

Lessinger played volleyball at the University of Florida from 1993-97 and helped lead the Gators to five consecutive SEC titles and three trips to the Final Four. She was also with the team when the program received its first-ever recognition as the nation's No. 1 team.

Hampered by knee injuries much of her career, Lessinger worked herself into one of the best defensive specialists in the country. In honor of her hard work and dedication as a player, the UF volleyball program established the "Claire Roach Defensive Award", which is presented annually to the best defensive player. In 1996 she was named the "Best Defensive Specialist in the Country" by Collegiate Volleyball Updates.

"I was very fortunate to be given the opportunity to play at the University of Florida under Mary Wise, who is the most highly-respected female coach in the country," Lessinger said. "She is the ultimate motivator and makes you thrive on success. Playing for the Gators

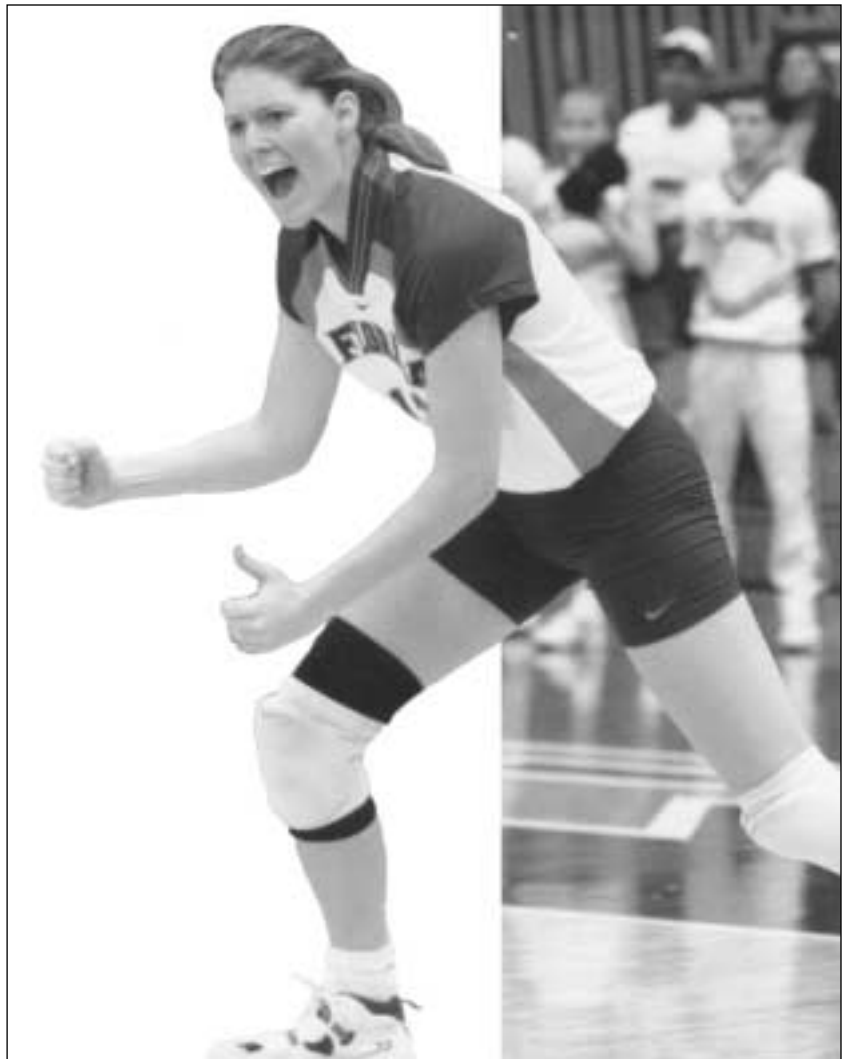
allowed me to know what it takes to be a CHAMPION, and I try to instill those values in our USF players daily. I remind myself all the time that 'actions speak louder than words,' and that keeps me motivated to overachieve."

Lessinger's athletic career began well before even attending college, though. A three-sport standout at Clearwater Central Catholic High School in volleyball, basketball and softball, she was inducted into her high school Hall of Fame on May 5, 2001. She was named the Tampa Tribune's 1992 High School Athlete of the Year and the 1993 High School Female Athlete of the Year.

Lessinger graduated from Florida in 1997 with a bachelor of science degree in exercise and sports science with a concentration in sports management.

Before coming to USF, Lessinger, 29, was an assistant volleyball coach at Boston College for the 1998 season.

Lessinger and her husband Mike, who were married in January 2004, live in Tampa.

Nikki Shade begins her second season as the associate head coach for the USF volleyball program. Hired on April 26, 2004, she was the first of two hires for first-year Head Coach Claire Lessinger with ties to the University of Florida.

Shade, who played with Lessinger at Florida for five seasons, came from the University of Houston where she served as an assistant coach for four years under Head Coach Bill Walton, making her the second USF coach to come to Tampa via Houston. Previous Head Coach Nancy Mueller was an assistant under Walton from 1995-98 before taking over the USF program in 1999.

"I feel so privileged to have Nikki Shade working with me," Lessinger said. "She is easily one of the most highly-touted assistant coaches in the country. She will be a vital part of taking this program to the next level. Her strengths are endless, and I am thrilled about the experience she will bring to all aspects of the job. She is an extraordinary player and a workhorse in the office."

A setter for the Gators from 1993-97, Shade "quarterbacked" the Gators to three NCAA Final Four appearances (1993, 1996, 1997) and one Elite Eight appearance (1995).

After leading the SEC in assists for two seasons, she was a two-time consensus First Team all-conference selection in 1996 and



1997. She completed her collegiate career ranked fourth in assists with 3,429 and averaged 12.9 assists her last two years with the team. She once passed out 73 assists and led UF to a 3-0 sweep of nationally-ranked UCLA. A versatile athlete, she also set the school record for block assists in a single match with 11.

In addition to her athletic accolades, Shade was a force in the classroom, earning numerous schol-

arships throughout her career, including the NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship in 1998. She was named to the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1995, 1996 and 1997, and was a GTE CoSIDA Academic All-American in 1996 and 1997.

"Playing in college, and particularly being coached by an excellent staff, has given me insight into how to train and motivate players," Shade said. "After experiencing various situations as a collegiate athlete over five years, the transition from player to coach was very smooth. Also, I feel fortunate to have begun my coaching career learning from one of the most knowledgeable and well-respected coaches in collegiate volleyball."

Prior to joining the staff at Houston, Shade worked as the Volleyball Administrative Camp Director for the University of Florida Athletic Association. In addition she served as a personal volleyball instructor. She performed both jobs while doing post-graduate work in exercise and sports sciences at Florida.

A native of New Orleans, La., she attended Duncanville High School in Duncanville, Texas. She led her high school team to a 41-1 district record during her varsity career, four-straight district championships and was named All-State by the Texas Coaches Association.

As a club player, Shade was invited to the U.S. Junior Elite Camp where she was chosen to serve as a team captain for the Junior National Team. She played in the 1991, 1992 and 1993 Junior Olympics and was named a World Scholar-Athlete in 1993.

Shade graduated from Florida in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in engineering sciences with a concentration in biomedical engineering and a minor in biomechanics.



Shade was a two-time all-SEC First Team Honoree in addition to being named a GTE CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Erik Peterson enters his second season as assistant coach for the USF volleyball team. Peterson, who was hired on July 12, 2004, came to USF after having worked with the USA Women's National Team from February 2004 to July 2004 in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Peterson, just like Lessinger and Associate Head Coach Nikki Shade, possesses a University of Florida connection after serving as a volunteer coach for the Gators in 2003 when they made their run to the national championship game.

"Making it to the national championship match in 2003 was an unbelievable experience—one that I will never forget and one that I cannot wait to experience again," Peterson said.

Peterson's primary duties while working with the Gators were assisting with on-court training and individual sessions, scouting of opponents offensive tendencies as well as charting video for the all-american selection committee

"It is a huge asset to have all three members of the volleyball staff know what it is like to be at the Final Four competing for a national championship," Lessinger said. "We all share similar experiences that will help create a competitive environment and hopefully breed championship teams.

"Erik is an extraordinary player and a motivated young coach. His experiences at the University of Florida and with our Women's National Team prove his credibility and his desire to be in coaching."

Peterson came to USF straight from Colorado Springs where he worked with the Women's National Team as an assistant coach from February to July of 2004. In that role he assisted the head coach in all facets of practice progression and also performed administrative duties for the team.

"I was extremely fortunate to be able to learn from such great coaches as Mary Wise and Toshi Yoshida," he said. "I am looking forward to bringing this knowledge to USF's program and helping build for the future."

In addition, he has extensive experience in both the high school and club levels.

His coaching career began at McIntosh High School in July 1999 as the head coach of the freshman team which he led to a 15-1 record. He then moved into club coaching as the assistant coach of the South Atlanta Volleyball Club from October 1999 to April 2000. In 2002, he returned to McIntosh High to serve as the head coach of the junior varsity team and the interim head coach of the varsity team for one year. He led the varsity team to its first-ever appearance in the Elite Eight before entering the club ranks once more with the Atlanta Juniors Volleyball Club.

Peterson remains actively involved in the USA Volleyball Development Program. This past summer he was an assistant coach at the A2 High Performance Camp in Colorado Springs, Colo. He has also served on camp staffs at Florida and Georgia and was the camp director for the Peachtree City Department of Parks and Recreation in June of both 2002 and 2003.

A graduate of Concordia College in Bronxville, N.Y., with a bachelor's degree in biology, Peterson was a member of the men's intercollegiate volleyball team from 1994-98, serving as captain his from 1996-98. He was distinguished as the Concordia College Freshman Athlete of the Year in 1995 and was named to numerous all-tournament teams. During his senior season he set a new NCAA record for career digs with 1,103.

Currently Peterson is the head coach of the Tampa Bay Juniors 16 Black Team, which he led to the Junior Olympic National Championship in Salt Lake City, Utah, this past summer.

2004 USF Volleyball Review

Bulls Struggle During 2004 Campaign But Gain Valuable Experience for Young Team

When five-year assistant coach Claire Lessinger was promoted to head coach of the USF volleyball team in March 2004, and with the return of only three players from the 2003 squad, the Bulls had a whole new look about them in 2004.

Forced to play their first 10 matches on the road after their season-opening tournament was canceled due to Hurricane Frances, the Bulls found it difficult to pull together and find their identity with three freshmen, two junior college transfers and only one returning starter.

USF kicked off its season with easily the most difficult match, traveling to Gainesville, Fla., to spar with the fourth-ranked Gators, the alma mater of both Lessinger and Associate Head Coach Nikki Shade.

Despite the 3-0 loss, the Bulls nearly pulled off one of the biggest upsets in recent history against Florida when they threatened to win game three. At that point in time, the Gators had won 54-straight games at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center, dating back to Dec. 14, 2002.

USF then traveled to Chattanooga, Tenn., to take on the Chattanooga Lady Mocs and picked up its first win, and Lessinger's first win as a head coach, 3-0. The Bulls followed that up with a 3-0 win against Southeast Missouri State at the Western Kentucky Tournament, before hitting a wall.

Despite tough play and the ability to come back, the Bulls dropped their next seven matches, including consecutive 3-1 losses to in-state rivals Florida Atlantic and UCF, before figuratively starting the season over when they picked up a 3-0 win over Charlotte in their first Conference USA match on Oct. 1. It also marked the first home match for all the new Bulls.

A heart-breaking 3-2 loss to East Carolina two days later made USF 1-1 in the conference, but back-to-back losses to Louisville and Cincinnati left them 1-3 in C-USA play.

The Bulls returned home and dropped another conference match, this time to Marquette in spite of winning the first game of the match. They redeemed themselves the next day, though, with a powerful 3-0 win over DePaul.

The win over the Blue Demons was the beginning of a three-match win streak for the Bulls as they proceeded to down both Florida International and UAB. Against the Blazers, USF notched its best hitting percentage of the season at .360.

The next night, despite falling to 25th-ranked Florida A&M, 3-1, the Bulls managed to take game three from the Rattlers, ending their 36-game win streak.

USF's road woes continued the following weekend when the Bulls dropped matches to both TCU and Houston, 3-0, in Texas, only to return and fall to rival Florida State, 3-0, in The Corral.

The down times were over for the Bulls as the next weekend they picked up their first conference sweep of the season with wins over Saint Louis and Memphis. Against the Tigers, who entered the match on Nov. 6 sitting third in the conference, the Bulls came

back after dropping games one and two to dominate in the final three games and claim a thrilling 3-2 victory. Freshman Kristina Fabris, who had a career-high 22 kills against Memphis, was named Conference USA Player of the Week the following Monday, marking only the second time this season that a freshman received the honor.

Despite the high of the come-from-behind victory, the Bulls closed out their final regular-season conference weekend with back-to-back 3-0 losses to Southern Miss and Tulane.

As a warm-up for the 2004 Conference USA Tournament, which the Bulls received the No. 10 seed, USF rescheduled its Jacksonville match, originally supposed to be played in the first tournament of the season, for Nov. 16, the Tuesday before the beginning of the tournament.

USF dominated the Dolphins in the first game, but fell in games two and three to force them into a must-win situation in game four. The Bulls pulled through admirably and took the fourth game, forcing the fifth game, in which they were again victorious, giving them their ninth win of the season.

Pitted against Saint Louis in the conference tournament two weeks to the day after the Bulls defeated the Billikens, 3-0, in The Corral, USF suffered a gut-wrenching, 3-2 loss, making it the second-straight year that they lost a 3-2 match in the first round of the tournament.

USF finished off its season on Nov. 24 with an in-state match-up with Miami. Still reeling from their disappointing loss in the C-USA Tournament, the Bulls were unable to pull together anything offensively and fell to the Hurricanes, 3-0.

Despite finishing the season on a two-match losing streak, the Bulls have much to boast for the future of USF volleyball. Prior to the conference tournament Fabris was named the 2004 Conference USA Freshman of the Year. In addition, junior Flavia Silveira, who led USF offensively this season, finished third in the conference in kills per game at 4.18 and fifth in points per game at 4.59.

The future looks bright for the Bulls, who, with no seniors, will return all players and starters for the 2005 season.

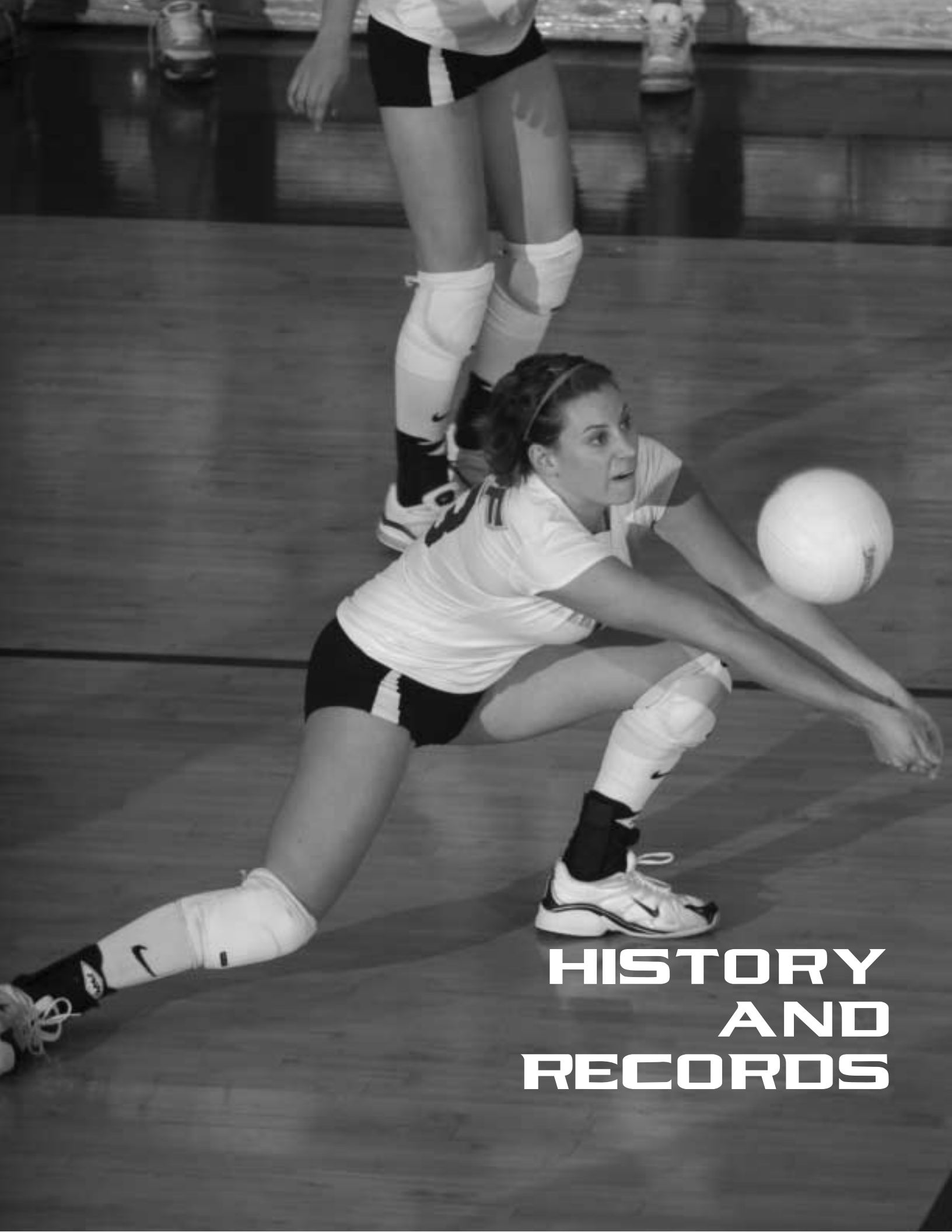

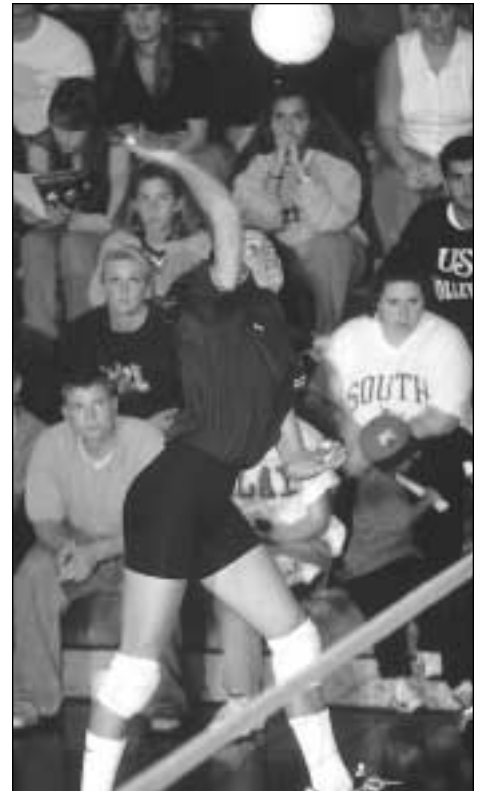

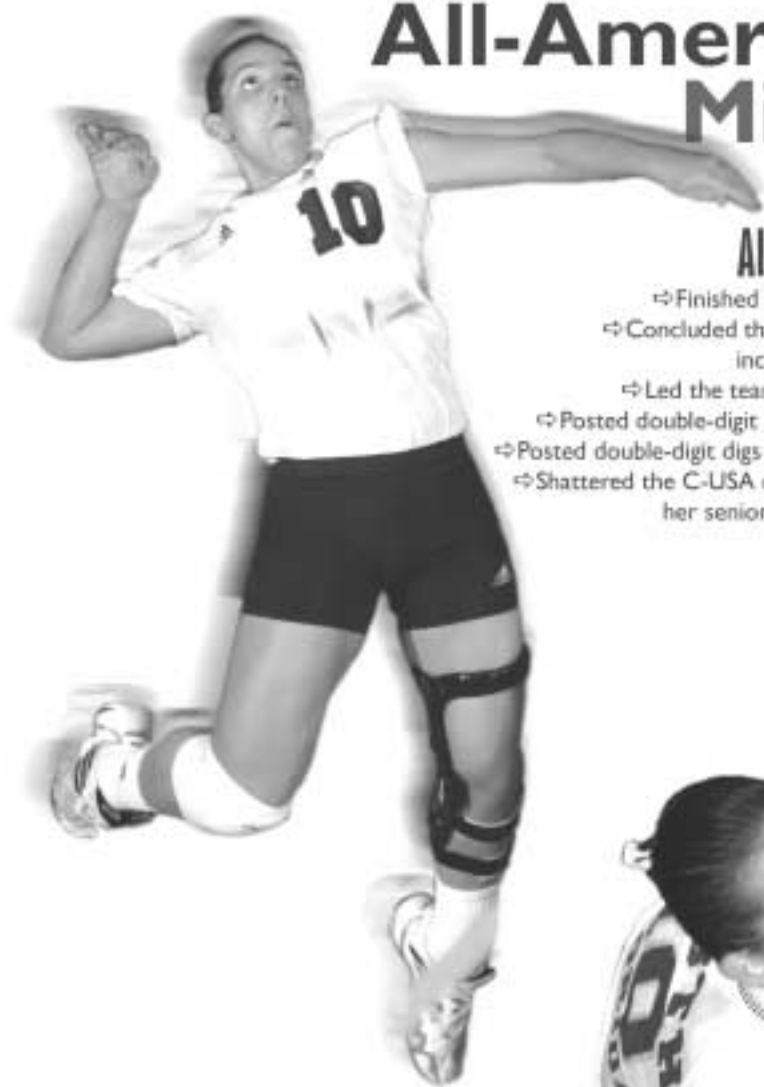

All-American Michelle Collier

All-American Season (2002)

- ⇒ Finished sixth in the country in kills/game with 5.63.
- ⇒ Concluded the season with 26 double-doubles in 37 matches, including three 20/20 double-doubles.
- ⇒ Led the team in kills on 33 occasions and in digs 20 times.
- ⇒ Posted double-digit kills 37 times, including 20 or more kills in 18 matches.
- ⇒ Posted double-digit digs in 27 matches, including 20 or more digs in three matches.
- ⇒ Shattered the C-USA career kill record on Sept. 5, 2002, just four matches into her senior season. The record now stands at 2,729.



On Dec. 18, 2002, Michelle Collier became the first-ever All-American for the USF volleyball program when she was named to the AVCA All-America Third Team. In addition, she became the first player in the history of Conference USA to earn the All-American distinction. In her five years with the USF volleyball team, Collier led the Bulls to four of their most successful seasons in the history of the program. In her four seasons USF never finished lower than second in the C-USA standings, and she also led the team to the 2002 C-USA Tournament Championship, the program's first since 1996. She was the only C-USA player ever to be a four-time All-C-USA First Team selection and also took home two Player of the Year honors and a Freshman of the Year plaque. She was named to the AVCA All-Region Team all four years she played and was on the C-USA All-Tournament team in 1998, 2000 and 2002. Only four matches into her senior campaign, on Sept. 5, 2002, Collier broke the C-USA career kill record with the 2,053rd kill of her career. She also holds USF career records in kills and digs, single-season records in kills, attacks and kills per game, and match records in kills and attacks. In four years she helped take the team to three NCAA tournaments, including a tie for the program's best-ever finish in 2002, making it to the second round of the championships.

USF's state-of-the-art volleyball facility, The Corral, opened to near-capacity when the Bulls hosted the final Metro Conference Tournament at the close of the 1994 season.

The three-day event attracted 2,288 fans and USF has continued to put up impressive numbers in the facility since.

In just over 10 seasons that the Bulls have been playing in the electric atmosphere of The Corral, they have amassed a 118-28 (.808) record, including four near-undefeated home seasons. In 1995, 1997, 2000 and 2002, USF dropped just one match each season in The Corral. In addition, the Bulls have posted a 59-14 Conference USA record in The Corral, including three-straight undefeated C-USA seasons at home before dropping their first conference game in 1998 to Houston. USF has had a total of four undefeated C-USA seasons at home.

Top teams such as Kansas State, Georgia Tech, Michigan State and Florida have all visited The Corral, while the Bulls have also hosted numerous tournaments in the 1,000-seat capacity gym.

The Corral is a part of the Sun Dome, one of the finest multi-purpose buildings in the Southeast. The Sun Dome received a \$5 million facelift in the early 1990's that included construction of The Corral and made the Sun Dome lobbies, concession stands and restrooms much more user-friendly.

During the summer of 2002, The Corral lockerroom underwent a \$25,000 re-construction that included the addition of new lockers, carpeting and a viewing area.

The most recent addition to The Corral has been the \$100,000 construction of the volleyball office, which overlooks The Corral floor. The suite includes three coaches offices, a reception area and a conference room, and the staff moved into it in April of 2003.

THIS IS USF



As the 21st Century begins, the State of Florida is the fourth most populous state and the Tampa Bay Region is among the nation's most dynamic and rapidly growing metropolitan areas. Florida's population grew from 2 million to 15 million between 1950 and 2000. The growth has made Florida a cosmopolitan, mostly urban state, with extensive cultural, economic and social transformation.

Along with the achievements of the boom years have come vast challenges in education, health care, social services, arts, the environment, transportation and economic development. The University of South Florida is uniquely positioned to assist the state with the challenges of rapid development by providing increased opportunities for the education of Florida's citizens and outstanding research outcomes to improve the quality of life.

Since opening for classes in 1960, USF has developed into one of the nation's major public research universities. USF is classified as Doctoral/Research Extensive by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and is ranked among the top 100 public research universities in the annual report "The Top American Research Universities." USF's main goal in the next five years is to become one of the top 50 public research universities in the nation and is on track to do so as the University had its eighth consecutive record-breaking year in 2003-04 for the amount of research contracts and grants, totaling \$290 million.

With more than 42,000 students from all 50 states and 124 countries, USF awards more than 5,000 bachelor's degrees and 2,000 master's degrees annually on campuses in Tampa, St. Petersburg, Sarasota/Manatee and Lakeland. The University confers more than 160 doctorates in 31 fields and more than 90 Doctor of Medicine degrees a year. In its short history, USF has awarded more than 220,000 degrees.

A Higher Education

Students come to USF from every state in the nation and more than 100 countries. They represent all ages, cultures and ethnic backgrounds. Over one quarter of the student population is African American, Hispanic, Asian American, Native American or other nationality.

The students choose from more than 200 undergraduate, masters, specialist and doctoral programs, including the doctor of medicine. The average high school GPA for the 2003-04 entering freshman class was 3.7 with an SAT score of roughly 1108.

- ◆ USF is among the top 35 universities in the country for educating Hispanics, according to the 2002 Hispanic Outlook for Higher Education.
- ◆ USF has one of the largest metropolitan colleges of education in the nation, providing student teachers to public schools throughout the Tampa Bay region. Florida principals have rated USF education graduates the best prepared teachers in the state.
- ◆ During the decade of the 90's, USF was No. 1 in the nation with the highest percentage of candidates with advanced degrees passing all parts of the CPA exam taken.
- ◆ USF has the third largest graduate certificate enrollment in the country.
- ◆ USF is the nation's top location for students transferring to another location, according to U.S. News & World Report.

Economic Impact

USF is key in the creation and development of the Florida High Technology Corridor from Florida's East Coast along Interstate-4 to the Gulfcoast. This area has become the state's high-tech leader, encompassing some 60 percent of Florida's high-tech industries.





- ◆ USF's Center for Entrepreneurship and its business incubator are noted for success in moving discoveries from basic research to applied research, and into companies in the community. USF was ranked in the top ten nationally for the creation of start-up companies by the Association of University Technology Managers.

- ◆ Among 71 national research universities surveyed, USF ranked fourth in the number of inventions licensed to start-up companies and first among universities with similar profiles.

- ◆ More than 90,000 of 195,000 graduates since the first commencement in 1964 live in the Tampa Bay area.

Research

USF is proud to be a student centered national research university. Students have the advantage of working directly with world-class researchers in fields from aging, to education, psychology, engineering and transportation.

- ◆ USF is one of the top 60 public research universities in the country.

- ◆ USF is one of the nation's top centers in conducting research aimed at new treatments for Alzheimer's, Parkinson's and Huntington's diseases. It has pioneered the concept of brain repair -- placing cells in the brain to help fix the damage of disease or injury.

- ◆ USF is the only university that has been designated as one of the five National Centers for Water Treatment Technologies in the country. These centers are sponsored by the National Water Research Institute (NWRI) and the U.S. Dept. of Interior's Bureau of Reclamation.

Outreach and Engagement

Virtually everyone in the Tampa Bay region - and beyond - enjoys some benefit from USF through countless outreach and engagement activities. USF contributes to the well being of its immediate urban neighborhoods through health care and networks of social research and service projects.

- ◆ In 1988, USF began a program for at-risk migrant children to complete their high school equivalency. More than 90 percent of the 1,200 students since then have now completed their high school equivalency and many have gone on to college or have careers that have taken them out of the migrant fields.

- ◆ H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute at USF annually ranks among "America's Best Hospitals" for cancer care by U.S. News & World Report. Moffitt has become the third-busiest cancer center in the nation.

- ◆ The USF College of Public Health is the only public health college in the state accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health. The college is a leader in health promotion and disease prevention.

- ◆ USF conducts more than 700 programs annually through Continuing Education, serving more than 16,000 people and awarding more than 35,000 hours of continuing education units.

Just east of downtown Tampa, Ybor City, one of only three Florida National Historic Districts, mixes the past with the present.

The area, which was famous for its flourishing cigar industry during the late 19th and early 20th centuries, is now famous for its rich culture and exciting nightlife.

Centro Ybor, a former cigar factory itself, is now a popular spot for shopping and dining. Ybor City also offers art studios and Spanish-Cuban ethnic restaurants with a true taste of the local cuisine. But the fun doesn't stop when the sun goes down. At night, Ybor City comes alive with nightclubs showcasing the blues, jazz and rock. The area becomes a street party as music flows into the streets from local clubs. For those who enjoy somewhat quieter nights, Centro Ybor, at the heart of the city, offers a more family type atmosphere with shops, restaurants and a movie theater. The facilities for these franchises are as first class as the many fans that attend the various events. So much so, Tampa Bay is among only a handful of cities nationally to attract a Super Bowl, Final Four and NHL All-Star-Game.

Tampa Bay hosted its third Super Bowl in 2001. The University of South Florida played host school for the 1994 NCAA Southeast Region First & Second Round Men's Basketball Tournament, the 1998 Sweet 16 and the 1999 Final Four at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg. The Tampa Bay Lightning's home - The St. Pete Times Forum - hosted the 1999 NHL All-Star-Game and the 2003 NCAA First & Second Rounds in Men's Basketball.

Tourism

Dr. Judy Genshaft*President*

Judy Genshaft was appointed president of the University of South Florida in July 2000, bringing with her more than 25 years of experience in higher education. As president, Genshaft is leading a new era of excellence and innovation

in teaching and learning, research and service.

President Genshaft leads one of the 20 largest universities in the nation. With campuses in Tampa, St. Petersburg, Sarasota/Manatee and Lakeland, USF serves nearly 42,600 students in more than 200 undergraduate, master's, specialist and doctoral programs, including the doctor of medicine. USF has 12,400 employees and a budget of \$1.3 billion, including \$290 million in research contracts and grants.

USF is poised to become one of the top 50 public research universities in America, as ranked in the elite group of The Top American Research Universities. Its growing prominence has earned consistent rankings in America's Best Graduate Schools and U.S. News & World Report.

President Genshaft led the development and implementation of a five-year strategic plan that focuses USF resources on strategic priorities. The plan strengthens USF's faculty and program quality, student selectivity and achievement, research quality and productivity, and private support.

As a leader of a metropolitan research university, President Genshaft has established herself as a leader for economic development, especially related to high-technology and bioscience. President Genshaft has focused on partnering university research with corporate and entrepreneurial partners. She launched the university's high-tech business incubator and is developing USF's Research Park as a hub for bioscience research and entrepreneurship. Recognizing USF's role in the community as a metropolitan university, President Genshaft is Florida's first university president to chair a chamber of commerce's economic development committee. She also holds leadership positions in several other economic development efforts in the Tampa Bay area.

Since joining USF, President Genshaft has focused on raising the university's academic profile and enhancing student life. She created the USF Honors College, which is now the largest in Florida and serves students with the highest SAT scores in the state. President Genshaft's support for students' academic success has resulted in the development of a more service-oriented university that is committed to providing students the necessary classes to be successful in their majors and graduate in a timely manner. She empowered USF's regional campuses to address the unique needs of their communities. Under President Genshaft's leadership, the USF Health Sciences Center created an integrated model for health care education and delivery to provide better care for patients.

President Genshaft spearheaded funding and construction for the university's new 110,000-square-foot athletic training facility - the headquarters for USF NCAA teams as they head into the BIG EAST Conference in the 2005-2006 academic year. In 2003, President Genshaft successfully negotiated a move from Conference USA to the BIG EAST, raising the level of competition of USF athletics and dramatically raising the national profile of USF, which now counts prestigious institutions such as Pittsburgh, Rutgers and Syracuse among its peers.

President Genshaft's administration also secured national basketball tournaments for the Tampa Bay area: the Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Basketball Tournament in 2007 and the NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four in 2008. USF is the host institution for both tournaments, which will be held at the St. Pete Times Forum.

Prior to joining USF, President Genshaft served as provost and vice president for Academic Affairs at the University at Albany, where she also served as dean of the College of Education. She served as professor, department chair, associate provost and faculty senate president at Ohio State University. President Genshaft has a bachelor's degree in social work and psychology from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, a master's degree in school psychology and a Ph.D. in counseling psychology-both from Kent State University. A national leader in the field of school psychology, she is the author and co-author of 69 journal articles and three books.

Dr. John T. Romeo*Faculty Representative*

In his 28th year at the University of South Florida, Dr. John T. Romeo is in his seventh year as the faculty athletics representative.

Romeo is a professor of biology in the College of

Arts and Sciences. His doctorate is from the University of Texas at Austin.

He represents USF in matters with the NCAA and the BIG EAST, in addition to chairing the University Athletics Council. The Council, whose charge is to monitor the intercollegiate athletics program, is advisory to the president and the athletic director. Romeo is also involved in the certification process of USF student-athletes and serves as the University's voting delegate in NCAA issues in the absence of the president. He served on the NCAA Management Council for two years and on an NCAA committee to study the 20-hour rule. He also chaired the Conference USA Faculty Athletics Representatives group and served on the C-USA basketball task force.

Romeo is a past director of the Graduate Program in Biology and served as the department chairperson from 1992-1998. He received University recognition for outstanding undergraduate teaching in 1985, 1990 and 1993. He developed a NASA-funded project to create an interactive course in "Space-Age Biology" for non-science majors. This effort was a collaborative one involving both the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Education. He currently is the director of the Biology Undergraduate Honors Program, and he is also a campus faculty advisor to the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi.

Romeo's research interests involve the chemistry of tropical plants. The search for natural insecticides, herbicides and medicinal drugs is part of this focus.

Doug Woolard
Director of Athletics



Doug Woolard assumed command of the University of South Florida Department of Athletics in 2004 at a moment in time that was pivotal in the school's athletic history. With a successful launch of football already in

place, USF will emerge as a player in the BIG EAST Conference in 2005. Woolard's leadership role is one he is fit to assume and one in which he has experience.

In October 1994, Woolard assumed leadership of the Saint Louis University Department of Athletics as its director and guided the program through a historic period that included the school's inclusion as a founding member of Conference USA, and more recently its acceptance of membership in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

While overseeing a department that was progressive in its competitive success, Woolard also proved to be a large asset in a community, that like Tampa Bay, presents the challenge of finding a niche with professional football, baseball and hockey in the market.

The Saint Louis men's basketball team has consistently ranked among the top 30 in the nation in annual attendance during Woolard's decade at the helm. Three times the program was among the nation's top 10, peaking with an average attendance of 17,708. Furthermore, the men's soccer program at Saint Louis is consistently in the nation's top 10 in attendance by averaging over 2,800 fans a game in a stadium that was constructed for the men's and women's teams under Woolard's watch.

Further enhancing the community partnership, Woolard has remained committed to bringing all Billiken athletic events back on campus. In addition to constructing a new soccer stadium, Saint Louis has added a new softball facility and nine new tennis courts on campus. Planning and fundraising are now underway to construct a \$70 million on-campus multi-purpose facility where Saint Louis can play its men's and women's basketball games.

Woolard's leadership has extended beyond competitive success and a strong community setting into an ultra-successful academic environment. Saint Louis student-athletes have not only been the frontrunners among their Conference USA peers, but they have developed an outstanding reputation nationally for their achievement. Saint Louis student-athletes achieved a 69 percent graduation rate in 2002-03 - the highest in Conference USA - and the University won the league's institutional academic excellence award for the eighth straight season, representing every season in C-USA history at that time.

To achieve the many successes at Saint Louis over the past decade, Woolard has kept a keen eye on the financial foundation of the program. He added the first-ever in-house development director to the program to maximize the revenue streams for an NCAA Division I program. He also negotiated the Billikens' first department-wide shoe and apparel contract with Nike, and he renegotiated a radio and television syndication package that enhanced the school's revenue base. The television package included locally televised games for men's and women's soccer and volleyball.

While maintaining an outstanding department at Saint Louis, Woolard has also become a prominent figure on national committees. Presently he is a member of the NCAA Sports Wagering Task Force, which has been charged with recommending strategies to counteract sports wagger-

ing by student-athletes. He is a past chair of the Conference USA Directors of Athletics Committee and he also served as the league's representative on the NCAA Academic/Eligibility/Compliance (AEC) Cabinet, where he chaired the amateurism and agents subcommittee. Woolard has also served as C-USA's alternate to the NCAA Management Council, the most powerful committee in the NCAA governance structure.

Prior to joining Saint Louis, Woolard worked for the nationally respected Jim Livengood at Washington State University. Under Livengood, who is now the director of athletics at Arizona and a past chair of the NCAA Men's Basketball Committee, Woolard was the associate director for external operations from 1989-94 after one year (1988-89) as an assistant director of athletics.

While at Washington State, Woolard was a key member of the senior management staff that oversaw a successful football program, and he played a prominent role in the entire department's relationship with the community.

Woolard and his wife, Cherrie, have two children, Chris and Amy. Chris graduated from UCLA and is currently in his second year as the director of championships at Conference USA. Amy graduated from Saint Louis University and currently teaches preschool in St. Louis.

Lee Roy Selmon

*President - USF Foundation
Partnership for Athletics*



Perhaps the most recognizable figure in the Tampa Bay community, Lee Roy Selmon, a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and popularly considered a "gentlemen's gentleman," took on a new challenge in 2004 to build financial support for USF's move to the BIG EAST Conference in 2005. This role came after 12 years at USF, including three as the director of athletics from 2001-04. He had been associate director for eight years.

Attesting to Selmon's status as an outstanding role model is his elite status as a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame, the College Football Hall of Fame and the Verizon Academic All-America Hall of Fame. Only a handful of men can claim membership in all three Halls.

Selmon first joined USF in 1994 after his ultra-successful football career, which was followed by a banking career, considered every bit as successful. His hiring came in advance of USF's initiation of intercollegiate football in 1996, and his primary duties included oversight of all external affairs, including sports information, marketing, promotions, corporate partnerships and fundraising.

Selmon's original appointment came in July 1993, two weeks after USF announced a \$10 million fundraising effort to begin an NCAA intercollegiate football program. He joined the Bulls after an ultra-successful banking career that actually began while he was still playing for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He had risen to vice president for public relations and marketing at Barnett Banks well before his move to USF. He started his banking career as an officer at First Florida in 1978 and progressed to a sales and service officer managing an account portfolio in

excess of \$10 million. In January 1989, he was named vice president at First Florida and held that position even after Barnett purchased First Florida.

Immensely popular in the Tampa Bay area, Selmon holds the distinction of having a major Hillsborough County expressway named in his honor (Lee Roy Selmon Expressway). His popularity in the community dates back to 1976 when he became the very first draftee of the Tampa Bay Buccaneer NFL expansion franchise. He was the NFL's overall number one selection that season, following a brilliant career at Oklahoma, where he was one of a trio of famous Selmon brothers, including Lucious and Dewey. Selmon remains one of the most decorated players in modern football history.

He earned consensus All-America honors at Oklahoma in addition to the 1975 Outland and Lombardi Trophies as the top lineman in the nation. In addition to excelling on the field, he earned a degree in special education in four years and distinction on the GTE Academic All-America Team. In 1996, he was named to College Sports Magazine's All-Time College Football Team.

In nine seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers - a career cut short by back injury - Selmon was selected to the Pro Bowl six times. He played in 121 games, with 742 tackles, 78-1/2 sacks, 380 quarterback pressures and 28-1/2 fumbles caused. He was a four-time All-Pro (1979, 80, 82, 84) and the 1979 NFL Defensive Player of the Year when he led what many consider to be one of the NFL's all-time best defenses. The Buccaneers reached the NFC Championship Game that season, succumbing 9-0 to the Los Angeles Rams just one game shy of the Super Bowl.

After injuring his back in the 1985 Pro Bowl, Selmon missed the entire 1985 season and retired in April 1986. On Sept. 7, 1986, his "63" Buccaneer jersey was retired and

remains the only Buc jersey with that distinction. Nine years later, on July 29, 1995, Selmon was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. One year prior to that, on May 28, 1994, Selmon was inducted into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame. Known widely as a "family comes first" gentleman, Selmon had his brother, Dewey, introduce him for the induction in both halls.

A perennial finalist for the NFL's Byron "Whizzer" White Award for Humanitarian Service, Selmon remains a constant presence on the charity scene, donating time to an endless list of service groups.

Born and raised as the youngest of nine children in Eufala, Okla., Lee Roy and his wife, Claybra, have three children of their own, and they are quickly becoming USF's "First Family".

In addition to Selmon's position at USF, his wife, Claybra, is employed as a nurse in the USF Health Services Department. Their children, Brandy, Lee Roy, Jr., and Christopher have all attended USF.

Barbara Sparks-McGlinchy*Senior Associate**Director of Athletics*

A member of the University of South Florida Athletic Department family since March 1982, Barbara Sparks-McGlinchy was elevated to senior associate athletic director in 1998.

Coinciding with Sparks-McGlinchy's increasing responsibilities within the athletic department, there has been a rapid growth period within the overall athletic program. During her tenure, USF has added women's cross country, men's and women's track and field, women's soccer, football and women's sailing.

At the same time, USF moved first from the Sun Belt Conference (1976-1991) into the Metro Conference in 1991. Following four seasons in the Metro Conference, USF became a member of Conference USA in 1995 and transitioned into the BIG EAST in 2005. Along with that transition came a steady increase in USF's competitive demands, and the Bulls have responded impressively, especially within the Olympic and women's programs, two areas of primary managerial oversight for Sparks-McGlinchy.

USF's volleyball team won back-to-back Conference USA Championships in 1997 and 1998 and has made four NCAA appearances in the past nine years, while the women's tennis team won the 1997 and 2000 Conference USA titles and had been to four-straight NCAA Championships from 1997-2000. Meanwhile, the softball team has reached the NCAA Championships seven of the last 10 seasons, while the men's soccer team has been to four of the last nine NCAA Championships, including the Elite 8 in 1997. The men's tennis and women's golf teams have also been regulars in postseason NCAA competition.

In her current role, Sparks-McGlinchy has administrative supervision of five athletic teams at USF, including men's baseball and soccer and women's sailing, softball and volleyball. Sparks-McGlinchy also serves as USF's senior woman administrator and has oversight responsibility for Title IX compliance. She was an integral part of the team that planned, designed and oversaw construction of the Athletics Training Facility and she is the Athletics' staff liaison to the USF Board of Trustees Academics and Campus Environment workgroup.

Selected to the National Collegiate Athletic Association's Business and Finance Cabinet in 1997, Sparks-McGlinchy was also a member of

that cabinet's marketing committee. She represented USF on the State Council on Equity in Athletics for over 15 years and served as chair of the Finance Committee for the Council. Additionally, she was the chair of the Conference USA Senior Woman Administrators for 1999-2000.

Sparks-McGlinchy has a bachelor's degree in business management and a master's degree in guidance and counselor education, both from the University of South Florida. She counts golf and walking among her recreational activities, and she resides in Temple Terrace with her husband, John. They have three grown children, Shawn, John and April.

Barry Clements*Associate Director -**Sports & Programs*

An employee in the USF Department of Athletics since 1983, Barry Clements was promoted to his current position as associate director of athletics for Sports and Program Services in 2002. Clements provides oversight to eleven of USF's eighteen sports:

women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, women's indoor track, men's and women's outdoor track, and men's and women's tennis. Additionally, Clements administratively oversees the Equipment Area, the Sports Medicine Department, the Strength and Conditioning Department and the Video Area.

Clements has overseen the sports medicine area since 1983 when he first came to USF. In January 1993, he was promoted to assistant director of athletics. Over the course of his tenure, Clements has built a comprehensive Sports Medicine Department and Program that is one of the best in the country. He has former students placed throughout the country as well as here at USF. He has developed a network of the Tampa Bay area's top physicians, covering every facet of healthcare to serve USF's student-athletes. Clements has and continues to stay involved in providing sport medicine services to the community. Clements is also responsible for building the Strength and Conditioning Department. As in sports medicine, Clements served as the head person in that area and remains certified by the National Strength and Conditioning Association.

A certified member of the National Athletic Trainers Association and the Southeastern Athletic Trainers Association, Clements is also a past president of the Athletic Trainers Association of Florida. During his presidency, that organization became incorporated and tax-exempt while achieving registration and

licensure. Clements is also a Doping Control Officer for the United States Anti Doping Agency, formerly the United States Olympic Committee of which he also served as an athletic trainer for men's and women's volleyball during the Olympic Festival in 1993 at San Antonio. He was invited to be the men's volleyball athletic trainer for the World University Games in 1995.

Clements won the 1993 Florida Athletic Trainer of the Year Award, and he also was the 1992 winner in the college and professional sports division. In addition, He has been a lecturer on sports medicine, including tours of Sweden, Finland and Russia. In 1994, he became the first American trainer to work in the European Championships.

In 2003, Clements was inducted into the Athletic Trainers Association of Florida Hall of Fame.

Clements, 46, graduated from Ball State, where he was named an Outstanding Young Alumnus in 1994, and he also has a master's degree from Kent State. Prior to coming to USF he was the head athletic trainer at Stebbins High School in Dayton Ohio. He was also the director of Dick Baumgartner's Basketball Shooting Camps during the early to mid eighties. At the time the camps were the largest in the country. Other previous experience includes athletic trainer positions with the Cleveland Browns, the Orlando All-Star Classic, Baseball Fantasies Camp and the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, just to mention a few.

Clements is a native of Richmond, Ind. He and his wife, Melissa, reside in Temple Terrace with their daughter, Nicole (9).

Rick Costello*Associate Director -**Chief Financial Officer*

Rick Costello was appointed the first chief financial officer and associate athletic director for USF Athletics on July 31, 2003. In this role, Costello provides leadership and administrative oversight for the planning, directing and fiscal management of the

USF Athletic Department. These responsibilities include directing the development and implementation of the \$22 million intercollegiate athletic department budget. As part of the Athletics' executive management team, Costello supervises and manages the areas of Finance, Human Resources, Information Technology, Facilities, Ticket Office and the Sun Dome.

Costello came to USF after serving as the assistant athletic director for business operations at San Jose State University from 2001-03. Costello was responsible for the business and fiscal affairs, including the procurement, travel, payroll and internal control functions. In addition, he supervised the ticket office as well as directing all event management operations for football and men's basketball.

His experience as a college administrator also includes four years (1997-01) at Lehigh University as a senior budget analyst. Complementing this administrative experience, Costello served as an Assistant Men's Basketball Coach for three years (1991-94) at Lehigh University.

Recognized by his peers for excellence, Costello received the 1999 Residential Services Distinguished Service Award at Lehigh University. He is currently a member of the College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA) and serves on the association's membership committee. In addition, Costello also serves on the Finance Committee at the University of South Florida.

Costello is a 1988 graduate of Muhlenberg College, cum laude. After graduation, Costello gained experience in public and private accounting. In 1994, Costello earned a master's degree in business administration from Lehigh University.

Costello and his wife, Amy, have three children, Kelsea (8), Lauren (5) and Ryan (3). They reside in New Tampa.

Steve Horton
Associate Director - Compliance



After having worked as an assistant athletics director since February 1998, Steve Horton was promoted to his current title in March 2002, managing all of USF's compliance activities in conjunction with the NCAA and now the BIG EAST Conference.

In addition, Horton is now involved in a number of additional areas, including football scheduling and game contracts.

Prior to joining USF, Horton served as a consultant with the University of Texas-El Paso, assisting with the school's compliance efforts and directing its 1997 NCAA Committee on Infractions appeal.

From 1988-96, Horton was assistant director of athletics at Virginia Tech where he established a comprehensive system of internal

controls related to NCAA and conference rules, including eligibility, certification, financial aid and recruiting. In addition to his compliance responsibilities, Horton administrated Virginia Tech's tennis, swimming, wrestling, soccer and volleyball programs, and he assisted with football gameday operations. Horton also spent part of his tenure at Virginia Tech supervising the marketing and promotions area.

Prior to joining Virginia Tech, Horton was a legislative assistant for the NCAA from 1986-88 and also worked as an administrative assistant in the University of Georgia Athletic Association from 1984-85.

Before beginning his career in intercollegiate athletics, Horton worked in marketing and public relations for Honeywell Information Systems and the University of Georgia.

Horton earned a bachelor's degree in journalism from Georgia in 1971 and a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports management in 1985. He attended the Sports Management Institute at the University of Notre Dame in 1993 and has also taken additional graduate work while at Georgia and Virginia Tech.

Horton and his wife, Diane, who works in the Undergraduate Admissions Office at USF, reside in Tampa, Fla.

Vicki Mitchell
Associate Director - Development



Vicki Mitchell joined the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics in May 2002 after 15 years with the USF Development Office. She came to USF in 1986 from the Florida Board of Regents Office where she served on the legislative relations staff for the State University System.

After terms as director of development research and director of major gifts at USF, Mitchell was appointed associate vice president for university development in 1993. In that position, she was responsible for oversight of all university fund raising and charged with planning a comprehensive fund-raising campaign that launched in 1995.

A veteran of two major fund-raising campaigns at USF, Mitchell led efforts that raised more than \$40 million for the University. Most recently, she served as campaign director for the "Great Achievements-Great Expectations Campaign" that brought in \$256 million before

ending in June 2001.

Mitchell is a native of Miami, Fla., and a graduate of Florida State University.

Tom Veit
Associate Director - External Affairs



Tom Veit was named to his current position in July 2002, marking a return to his alma mater, well situated as a top marketing professional in the athletic profession.

Over the past three years, Veit has overseen a consistent raise in revenue for the athletic department. Under Veit's direction, USF revamped licensing and merchandising programs, including the creation of new logos and marks for USF athletics. This resulted in one of the largest increases in yearly sales in the NCAA, propelling USF into one of the Collegiate Licensing Corporation's Top 50 Universities for merchandise sales

Before his return, Veit was vice president/general manager for the Orlando Rage, an XFL franchise that exceeded all revenue goals while operating within budget guidelines. Under Veit's direction, the franchise was number one among all league franchises in gameday ticket sales and had the highest single-game paid attendance in the league.

Prior to joining the Rage in 2000, Veit served as senior vice president of sales and marketing for the Tampa Bay Mutiny, a Major League Soccer franchise. With the Mutiny, Veit supervised sponsorship sales, marketing and broadcasting.

From 1996-99, Veit was the director of sports marketing and sales for Clear Channel Communications - departments he was charged with creating from scratch. While with Clear Channel, Veit negotiated with various sports teams to acquire broadcast rights, including USF football and basketball.

Veit also worked as the director of marketing and operations with the Tampa Bay Storm of the Arena Football League from 1993-96. With that franchise, Veit oversaw all revenue streams, while bringing all marketing services in-house, including advertising, print layout, radio spots, television media script and sponsorship sales.

Veit has a Bachelor of Arts degree from USF in liberal arts. While a student at USF, he was president of student activities and he was named an Outstanding Senior Leader.

The opening in June 2004 of the Academic Enrichment Center ensures continued success. The Center includes a computer lab, a study lounge, six tutorial rooms, a distance learning room and five staff offices. The computer lab and study lounge generate most of the attention from USF student-athletes, probably because they played a large role in the development of the facility.

If anyone doubts USF's emphasis on "student" in the term "student-athlete," we offer an invitation to tour the sparkling Academic Enrichment Center. Located on the second floor of the USF Athletics Training Center, the 8,000-square-foot area is in many respects the crown jewel of USF's new athletic home.

USF student-athletes have annually been at or very near the top of their Conference USA peers in terms of team GPA, scholar-athlete awards and post-graduate scholarship awards. Today, the accomplishments of USF student-athletes of the past -- and the promise of future success -- are embodied in the state-of-the-art facility.

The Academic Enrichment Center is designed to provide the academic support and the learning environment so that each student-athlete has the opportunity to reach their goals. It is the home of comprehensive services including advising, tutoring and counseling, available to all USF student-athletes.

It has been USF's association with Conference USA for the past 10 seasons, and now its association with the BIG EAST Conference starting in 2005, that has provided motivation -- and competition - for academic success.

The 2004-05 academic year was a typical one for USF student-athletes. USF placed 171 student-athletes on the 2004-05 C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll (3.0 GPA or better), second among C-USA's 14 members and just two from the leader, Cincinnati. Twenty-five USF student-athletes, the fifth-most among league schools, earned the C-USA Commissioner's Academic Medal (3.75 GPA or better). In 2004, Kristina West, a pole vaulter with medical school in her future, was one of six recipients of a C-USA Post-Graduate Scholarship, and USF was one of five institutions with multiple C-USA Scholar-Athlete Award winners as cross country runner

The tutoring rooms provide Academic Services' staff the ability to meet with students in a comfortable, private environment for the first time. The distance learning room is one of the facility's unique features where students can check out a laptop, utilize a room specifically designed for distance learning classes, participate in their Internet classes or do their schoolwork on the Internet.

Accessibility to the Academic Enrichment Center for USF student-athletes may be as crucial to its success as much as the resources inside, as all the features provided for student-athletes are located centrally in one facility, along with other key staff of the USF Athletic Department.

Through the Athletics Training Center, USF and its donors have invested in the future success of the student-athletes that represent the school on the athletic field. The Academic Enrichment Center is evidence that USF takes as much pride in the academic achievements of its student-athletes.

USF Academic Facts

- Since USF joined Conference USA in 1995, 22 student-athletes have been named Scholar-Athlete of the Year in their respective sport. This includes a school-record five Scholar-Athletes of the Year in 1998-99 and USF has had at least two such award winners in eight of its 10 seasons in the league. Tiffany Stewart (Softball) and Christa Benton (Cross Country) won this award in 2005.
- In that same 10-year span in Conference USA, eight USF student-athletes have earned C-USA Post-Graduate Scholarships, including USF men's soccer player Chris Raye in 2005.
- Between 1995 and 2003, 10 USF teams won a C-USA Sports Academic Award, which goes to the team with the highest grade point average in each respective conference sport. Men's soccer and men's basketball received this award for the 2003-04 school year. In 2001-02, USF won four such team awards.
- Conference USA awards a Commissioner's Academic Medal to all league student-athletes who achieve a 3.75 or higher grade point average for an entire school year. In USF's 10 seasons in C-USA, 224 student-athletes have earned this honor, including 25 in 2004-05.
- In 2004-05, 171 student-athletes compiled a grade point average of at least 3.0, which was second in C-USA and only two shy of Cincinnati who placed 173 student-athletes on the list. USF has had as many as 176 student-athletes achieve that level in any given academic year. Since 1995-96, USF's academic services program has paid huge dividends as the members of the 3.0 Club have increased from 42 in 1995-96 to 164 in 2003-04.
- Fifteen USF student-athletes have been named an Academic All-American since 1985. Most recently was USF softball player Tiffany Stewart and men's soccer player Chris Raye who received this honor in 2005.

The health of every student-athlete at the University of South Florida is the primary concern of the USF Sports Medicine Staff, a group that covers every facet of the health care spectrum.

Under the guidance of Assistant Athletic Director and Head Football Trainer Steve Walz, and Associate Athletic Trainers Robb Duncanson and Lisa Osterbrock, the USF Sports Medicine staff offers comprehensive health care with special emphasis placed on injury prevention methods. The Sports Medicine staff offers daily service to every student-athlete.

Walz has been with USF Sports Medicine in several different capacities since 1992. He returned to USF most recently in 2000 after working as the Sports Medicine Director at Shawnee Mission Medical Center in Kansas City, Kan. Walz was the first-ever football athletic trainer for USF from 1996-98.

Walz oversees all aspects of the sports medicine program while serving as the primary athletic trainer for USF football.

A 1992 graduate from the University of Missouri, Walz also holds a Master's degree from USF, which he obtained in 1994 when he was the men's basketball athletic trainer for two seasons. Following the 1993-94 basketball season, he accepted a position with the Florida Orthopedic Institute, where the USF student-athletes received care and underwent injury rehabilitation. During his

stint at FOI, Walz also served as Head Athletic Trainer for the Tampa Bay Storm of the Arena Football League during their 1996 World Championship season.

Walz was elected to the Athletic Trainers Association of Florida Executive Board in January 2003 as the West Coast Representative. Walz was awarded Outstanding USF Staff Member in 2005.

Walz and his wife, Shelley, have a three-year-old son, Henry.

Jennifer Ross is in her second year as the athletic trainer for the USF volleyball team. She came to USF with an extensive background in sports medicine, having worked as an athletic trainer for several schools and companies over the past four years.

Most recently she worked as an athletic trainer for Tampa Bay Orthopedic Specialists, St. Anthony's Hospital, Northeast High School and Eckerd College.

Ross received her Bachelor of Science degree in athletic training from Eckerd College in May 2001, where she served as a student athletic trainer all four years she attended the college.

She has also done work with several professional teams, including the Tampa Bay Hawks and Tampa Bay Extreme (men's and women's soccer semi-professional), the Clearwater Phillies (single A major league baseball) and the St. Petersburg Parrots (semi-professional ice hockey league).

The Sports Medicine Staff is comprised of seven graduate assistant certified athletic trainers, which complementing Head Athletic Trainer Walz, and Assistant Athletic Trainers Robb Duncanson and Lisa Osterbrock.

The USF Sports Medicine Department is privileged to be affiliated with the very best physicians in the Tampa Bay area. USF student-athletes benefit from the close proximity, both in relationship and geography, with the Florida Orthopedic Institute. Drs. David Leffers, Seth Gasser, Scott Welsh and Adam Morse serve as the teams' Orthopedic Surgeons. Larry Collins (PA-C, ATC/L), a physician assistant and certified athletic trainer, also assists the staff.

USF Sports Medicine also has a close relationship with the USF Medical School and is privileged to have several faculty members serve as team physicians. Their on-campus location helps USF Sports Medicine provide fast and comprehensive medical care.

Drs. Eric Coris and Arnold Ramirez serve USF student-athletes as team physicians with an emphasis on sports medicine, and they are assisted by Dave Kotun, PA-C.

The University of South Florida Sports Medicine Department is housed in both the Sun Dome, and in the brand new Intercollegiate Athletic Facility. This new facility of over 5,200 square feet is equipped with the latest tools and technology. The department also works closely with the USF Athletic Training Education Program and provides clinical experiences for athletic training students.

It is the mission of the USF strength and conditioning program to maximize the genetic potential in every component of athleticism and decrease the potential for injury in a manner that is safe and intense for each student-athlete.

In this regard, yearlong strength and conditioning programs at USF are designed specific to each student-athlete. Each program is tailored to be sport and position-specific by assessing the muscular and metabolic demands of the respective sport. Programs are evaluated and monitored continuously and adjusted as necessary to reach optimal gains.

With the new intercollegiate athletic facility - opened in June of 2004 - USF's student-athletes have a state-of-the-art 10,900 square foot strength room to meet their conditioning needs. The spacious facility has been designed to provide student-athletes with everything they need to succeed, including Mondo Sport impact flooring, Power Lift combo racks, Iron Grip custom urethane plates and dumbbells, Useaka bumper plates and bars, cardio equipment, mirrors, and a state-of-the-art stereo system with 40 speakers.

Specific to volleyball, each player is trained to maximize on-field performance. Strength and power training, speed development, lateral speed and agility, anaerobic conditioning and flexibility are all considered when designing a players program. The strength and conditioning staff also strives to educate the student-athletes on nutrition, dietary supplements and related issues.

The strength and conditioning program is administered by USF Associate Director of Athletics Barry Clements and operated day-to-day by Head Strength Coach Ronnie McKeefery, who manages a staff of four additional strength coaches. Together they are responsible for designing and implementing strength and conditioning programs for the student-athletes.

McKeefery is in his sixth season at USF. A former all-conference defensive back at Ottawa University in Ottawa, Kan., he earned bachelor's degrees from Ottawa in biology and physical education in 1997 while also being named a two-time Academic All-American. In addition, he earned his master's degree in education from the University of South Florida in 2004.

After one year as coach at Ottawa, he made the switch to strength and conditioning, working first as an intern with the Kansas City Royals. He then worked as a part-time assistant for two years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers before becoming the head strength coach for the Berlin Thunder in NFL Europe.

McKeefery joined the USF program prior to the 2000 football season. He is a member of National Strength & Conditioning Association (NSCA) Certified Strength & Conditioning Specialist, the Collegiate Strength & Conditioning Coaches Association (CSCCA) Strength & Conditioning Coach Certified, and is certified with the United States Weightlifting Federation (USAW).

Beth Spak is in her fourth year with the USF strength & conditioning department, working directly with the volleyball, softball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's golf and men's tennis programs.

Prior to joining the Bulls, Spak held several internships. She worked at Velocity Sports Performance in the summer of 2000, Boston University in the summer of 2001 and Georgia Tech in the spring of 2002.

Spak earned her bachelor's in education from Georgia in 2000 and her master's in education from Springfield College in 2002.

Also part of the strength and conditioning team is Travis Larimore, Graham Anderson and Keith Short. Larimore and Anderson work with the football team, while Short works with Spak on USF's Olympic Sport programs.

The BIG EAST Conference moves into 2005-06 with an emphasis on the word "Big" as the league becomes the largest Division I-A conference in the nation with 16 outstanding academic and athletic institutions. The goal of the BIG EAST has always been to compete at the highest level and to do so with integrity and sportsmanship.

In 2005-06, the league welcomes five new members: University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top 33 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Milwaukee and Cincinnati. With the incoming members, the BIG EAST markets will contain almost one fourth of all television households in the U.S.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 25 national championships in six different sports and 123 student-athletes have won individual national titles. Last year, Providence's Kim Smith won the NCAA women's country championship. The Notre Dame women's soccer team took the 2004 national title.

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. More than 300 student-athletes have earned Academic All-America honors.

In 2003-04, three BIG EAST student-athletes were named the national scholar-athletes of the year in their respective sports - Connecticut's Emeka Okafor in men's basketball, Notre Dame's Vanessa Pruzinsky in women's soccer and St. John's Chris Wingert in men's soccer.

BIG EAST student-athletes also have continued their success after leaving the classrooms and playing fields. Former Connecticut women's basketball standout Dr. Leigh Curl was inducted into the Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 1999. Former Georgetown men's basketball star Dikembe Mutombo was



named a winner of the President's Service Award, the highest honor in the U.S. for volunteer service.

The BIG EAST continues to thrive in the basketball arena. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA titles in the same season. With the Syracuse men and the UConn women grabbing NCAA crowns the previous year, the BIG EAST also became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in consecutive seasons. In fact, the BIG EAST has won five of the last six women's basketball crowns and three of the last seven men's titles.
