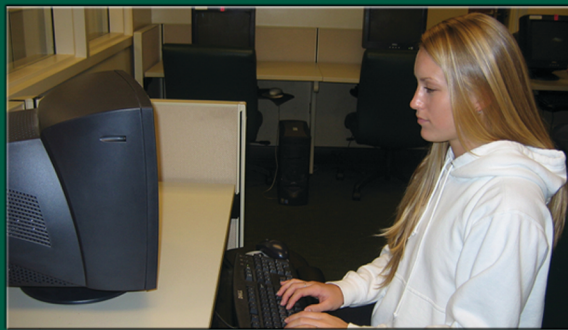

The 2006 USF softball media guide is designed to assist members of the media in its coverage of the Bulls' softball program. Additional information, including press releases and photographs, may be obtained by contacting USF Assistant Sports Information Director Rachel Constantine at (813) 974-0415. Please take a moment to review the following policies and services that are intended to assist you in your coverage of USF softball this season.

We Are "USF"

When referring to the University please be aware of the following policies regarding usage.

First references to the school and its intercollegiate athletics program should always be "University of South Florida."

The only secondary references used should be "USF" or "Bulls." Please refrain from using "South Florida, S. Florida, South Fla." or any other similar combination.

Media Credentials

All requests for press, broadcast and photo credentials for USF home softball games should be directed to Assistant SID Rachel Constantine via e-mail (rachelc@admin.usf.edu), phone (813-974-0415) or fax (813-974-5328). All requests should be made at least one week prior to the event.

As a general rule, working space is allocated on the following basis:

1. Live broadcast television and radio crews. Tampa Bay-area daily newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, daily newspapers from opponent area and USF student newspaper.
2. Other daily newspapers with a preference to those covering USF on a regular basis.
3. Non-daily newspapers with a preference to those covering USF on a daily basis.

Photographers

Photographers, including non-broadcast crews, are limited to working along the foul lines by first base and third base. Please be aware of your surroundings if you plan to take photographs due to foul balls and other events related to the game. There is a platform in center field that may also be used to photograph or shoot footage of the softball team.

Radio

Because of the limited availability of seating in the USF pressbox, radio capabilities may not always be available for visiting teams. Every effort will be made to accommodate visiting team's radio crews, including making it available to broadcast from the top row of the grandstands in front of the press box if necessary. Please contact SID Rachel Constantine if you plan on broadcasting the game as soon as possible.

Media Will Call

A media pass list will be left at the ticket gate of the USF Softball Field.

Media Parking

Parking for all USF home softball games is located in the Visitor Parking Lot south of the USF Softball Field and north of the Sun Dome. Parking is also available in the lot located southwest of the stadium on Maple Dr. Parking is free two hours prior to the start of the game on weekdays and all day during the weekend.

Player Interviews

All media requests for interviews with USF softball players should be directed to Assistant SID Rachel Constantine (office: 813-974-0415), preferably 24 hours in advance.

The best time for in-season interviews, either in person or on the phone, is prior to or following practice. Most USF practices begin at 2:45 p.m. and end at approximately 5:15 p.m. Practices are held at the softball practice fields (located to the northeast of

the USF Athletics Building). Members of the media should contact SID Rachel Constantine 24 hours in advance to attend practice. Interviews conducted prior to or following practice should be held to a brief Q & A session. With advanced notice, interviews with players can be arranged for other hours.

Calling players at home or on cell phones without permission from Assistant SID Rachel Constantine will not be tolerated. The players' dorms, training room and weight room are also off limits. On game days, players are unavailable until after the game.

Head Coach Interviews

All interviews with Head Coach Ken Eriksen should be arranged through SID Rachel Constantine (office: 813-974-0415).

Postgame Interviews

Head Coach Ken Eriksen and requested players will be available for postgame interviews following a brief cool-down period. All interviews will be conducted on the field.

Media Services

The USF softball pressbox is located at the top of the grandstands at the main field of the softball complex. Three phone lines are located in the pressbox. Power will be available for those who need it.

Media members can access biographical data on the entire coaching staff and current roster. The site also includes updated statistics for the team and individual players, game recaps, weekly notes packages, boxscores, photo galleries and several historical features.

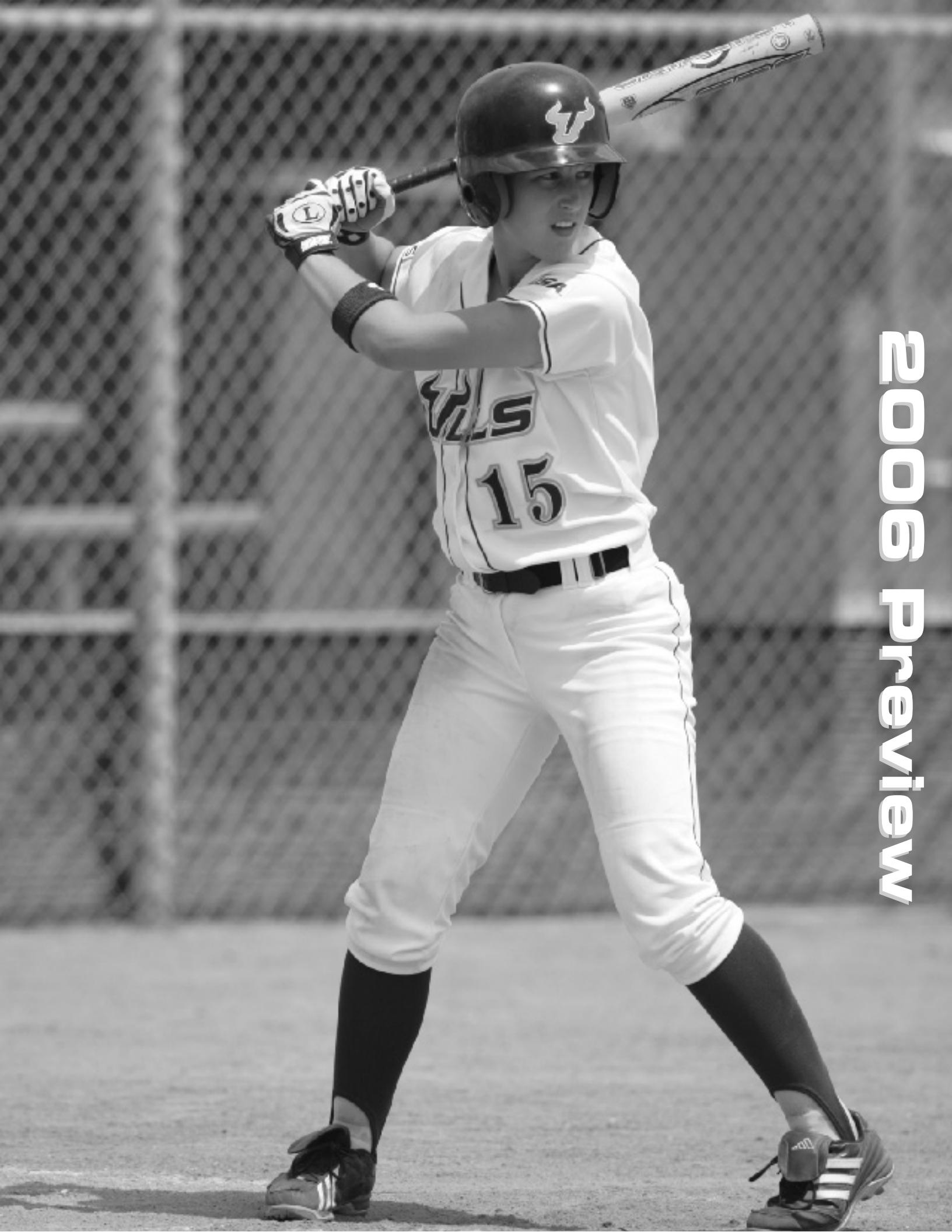

2006 Preview

The 2006 USF softball team could be one of the best teams to take the field in school history. With a mix of veteran leadership and newcomer talent, the 2006 squad is positioned to make its mark in its first year of BIG EAST action. As one of the dominant teams in Conference USA, the Bulls enter their new league poised to continue their streak of NCAA Regional appearances while challenging their new league foes for the BIG EAST title.

Only losing two seniors - one of which was a starter - the Bulls will feature eight seasoned veterans - six are seniors - that will anchor the team. Combining a mix of three returning starting pitchers for a total of 11 returning letterwinners, USF will have one of its most talented squads taking the field to enter a new era of athletics. Adding nine newcomers to the team, the Bulls will have depth at every position and will be able to spark their offense and defense if needed.

"I think that we're strong enough in elder leadership early in the season to get us through the first couple of months," head coach Ken Eriksen said. "And then with the experience that is gained by the very talented younger players, I think at the end you are going to see a unit that is going to know exactly what is going on at every single turn of the corner"

The 2006 club features six players that won accolades during the 2005 season, including two of its top returnees - All-American Tiffany Stewart in the outfield and Conference USA Freshman of the Year Bree Spence in the circle.

Under the direction of Eriksen, who enters his 10th season at the helm of the program and his 21st overall with the team, USF is equipped to make a run at the only thing that has eluded the softball program through the years: Oklahoma City.

"This team is a pretty smart team from the neck up," Eriksen said. "They know how to play the game; they know how to play the angles. They're very observant. They combine things that we have not been able to combine before. They combine speed with power, defense with offense and pitching with hitting. This is one of those types of teams that is a pretty well oiled machine. I am just looking forward to getting the right driver and letting the wheels go."

INFIELD

The USF softball team will return all of its infielders except one-first base. The infield is also one of the areas where some of the newcomers came in and challenged for starting roles.

With the loss of graduated senior and all-conference player

Carmela Liwag, first base will feature a new face after having Liwag man the corner for the past four years. Freshman Ashley Bullion will get the start in the corner after winning the job in the fall. A native of Dunnellon, Fla., she was a four-year All-Citrus County softball honoree at Crystal River High. Known for her stellar all-around play, she is a playmaker on the field and in the batter's box, hitting .377 as a junior and improving to .432 as a senior.

Freshman JoJo Medina will be backing up Bullion at first base. Known for her bat, Medina can make solid plays while giving USF offensive power. The Tampa, Fla., native ended her high school career at Chamberlain High with a batting average of .473, 142 hits, 14 home runs, 118 RBI, .641 on-base percentage and a .687 slugging percentage.

"Losing Carmela Liwag is definitely a huge gap to fill, but I think we have done that in Ashley Bullion, who stepped right in to the mix and has the same mental makeup as third baseman Krista Holle and shortstop Christie Chapman," Eriksen commented. "Backing her up over there who can absolutely hit like nobody else's business is JoJo Medina. So we're not hurting in that position at all."

The position of second base will also feature a new face, as freshman Britta Giddens won the spot in the fall. A four-year letterwinner in softball at Bartow High, she helped lead her team to four-straight state and district championships (2002-05). A member of the No. 1-ranked team in the nation in 2003, the Bartow, Fla., native has a career batting average of .410 and holds the school record in stolen bases, tallying 100 in only four years.

Junior Kattrina Dowd, who took a medical red-shirt in 2005 and was nursing an injury in the fall, will be back in top form to try to regain her spot at second base. Having two years of collegiate experience and tremendous hitting ability, it will be tough to keep her out of the lineup. The Clearwater, Fla., native finished the 2004 season ranked third in batting average (.374) while leading the team in runs scored (63).

"Britta Giddens, who we recruited as a shortstop, was able to fill in and win a starting position at second base for us while Kattrina Dowd was still nursing her injuries," said Eriksen. "But to have Kattrina back now and to challenge for a starting position, it's going to be very tough to keep her out of the lineup."

Senior Krista Holle will return to third base for the fourth-straight year. Manning the hot corner, Holle is an accurate fielder with good arm strength. Playing and starting in every game for the Bulls in 2005, she adds power with her bat to go along with her

defensive play. The Tampa, Fla., native batted .307, hit five homers, while finishing second in RBI with 41. She led the team in sac bunts with nine, while showing her bat control drawing 24 walks for the second highest total on the team. Medina will also be available to come in at third if needed.

Anchoring the infield as the shortstop is senior Christie Chapman. A three-year starter, Chapman is a solid fielder with quick instincts that makes the routine plays while coming up with the big ones when needed. Batting mostly in the leadoff spot last year, the Vancouver, British Columbia, native led the team in runs scored (51) and finished second in stolen bases (25). Also

a power hitter, Chapman tied for the lead in homers (9), while driving in 37 runs for the fourth-highest total.

"Just having Krista Holle and Christie Chapman on the left side of the infield just lends itself to a tremendously secure position for us," Eriksen stated. "I am really looking forward to going through a tremendous senior year with them."

Returning behind the plate will be senior Sarah Watson, who was moved over to second base after an injury limited her time as catcher last season. Her vast knowledge of the pitching staff combined with her hitting skills will prove to be an asset in this spot. Last season she batted .290, hit four out of the park and drove in 20 runs.

Sophomore Laura Wolf saw action behind the plate for over half the games in 2005 after Watson moved over to second base. The San Antonio, Texas, native brings a year experience in working with the pitching staff and along with solid fielding skills to the team. Freshman Liz Howell is another option at catcher, as she was named Lakewood Ranch High's Defensive Player of the Year all four years she started behind the plate. She also contributes as much on offense, as she batted .391 her senior year and helped lead her team to a record of 23-0.

"Behind the plate we've got some great experience in Sarah Watson," Eriksen said. "She's done a fabulous job and she's coming off an injury from last year that kept her out from behind the plate. We are hoping that she will regain her form from 2004 when

she and Leigh Ann (Ellis) combined to have a tremendous year. We also have Liz Howell behind the plate, who is a freshman that came in and did a fabulous job of solidifying herself as a game-type player for us. And then we have the steady and sure Laura Wolf. We've never had three catchers like this before. That bodes well for us and our pitching staff especially in a 65-70 game schedule."

Newcomers Jessica Landau and Caitlin Schneider will be USF's utility players, coming in and playing any spot when needed. All have extensive knowledge of the game and will be able to contribute in any position when called on.

OUTFIELD

The Bulls' outfield will showcase all their returners from last year. Left field will feature sophomore Carly Griffin returning to the spot she solidified last year. A native of Tampa, Fla., Griffin has a solid arm as she led the outfielders in assists, getting five runners out on the year. She was named the C-USA Hitter of the Week for the week ending Feb. 14, while finishing the season with the third-highest home run total (6).

Senior Samantha Ray will return for her final season in center field. She has tremendous speed and athletic ability that allows her to cover the biggest part of the field and make plays when needed. Starting and playing in every game for USF last season, Ray had a break-out year, offensively, in 2005. She improved to bat .370, tally the most hits (87) and lead the team in stolen bases with 28. After going two seasons without a triple, she posted five in 2005, while earning all-conference accolades.

All-American Tiffany Stewart rounds out the outfield in right. The senior led the Bulls in five offensive categories in 2005 - batting average (.399), slugging percentage (.627), on-base percentage (.500), walks (32) and total bases (121) - while tying for the lead in homers (9). She has speed on the base path, finishing third in stolen bases with 19, which helps her cover right field. A key asset

on defense, she started and played in right field in all 70 games. The Odessa, Fla., native only got better in league action, batting .449, tallying 31 hits and driving in 14 runs.

"I can't say enough about Samantha Ray and what she has meant to this program by coming in as a freshman and getting better and better each year," Eriksen said. "She was a very good clutch player for us last year, so for her to anchor the outfield I feel very good about that.

"When you look to her left and see Tiffany Stewart in right field coming back as an all American and getting better defensively all the time-I feel pretty good about that situation that I know the game is going to be played well. In left field we added some power last year and now Carly Griffin is becoming a very, very solid Division I defensive outfielder, and that's because of the work she has put into it."

Junior transfer Kelsey Zorc will be able to come into any one of these positions. The transfer from Indian River Community College helped lead her team to back-to-back state championships in 2004 and 2005. The Vero Beach, Fla., native's college team was ranked third in the nation in 2004 and moved to be the No. 2 team in the country in 2005.

Transfer Meghan Kowal will also provide some depth in the outfield. The junior has a year of collegiate experience under her, as she played a year at Palm Beach Community College. She was a solid high school player, as Kowal earned all-area honors and finished the season with a batting average of .350.

PITCHERS

The 2006 pitching staff is a veteran squad that features four returners and one newcomer.

2005 C-USA Freshman of the Year Bree Spence was the Bulls' No. 1 starter, breaking USF freshman records in innings pitched (243.2), games pitched (51) and wins (23). Getting the start in 38 games, she was the Bulls' workhorse last season and stifled batters with an earned run average of 1.87 and a strikeout total of 124. The Clearwater, Fla., native threw two shutouts and combined for three more. Now a sophomore, she only got better in league play last season, tallying an ERA of 0.92. She was also one of USF's offensive threats, finishing fourth in homers (5) and fifth in doubles (6). Spence also filled the role of the closer when needed, leading the team with three saves on the year.

"We have a healthy pitching staff for the first time in two years," Eriksen said. "You have an all-conference freshman coming back

who did a fabulous job down the stretch for us last year in Bree Spence. She broke some freshman records and proved that she is a big game pitcher. She did that as a freshman and that is very, very rare."

Junior Kasey Cash finished second on the team in ERA with 2.34. A lefty, the Palm Coast, Fla., native got the starting nod in the circle on 17 occasions. In 26 total appearances in the circle, she only gave up one home run. Cash continued her solid pitching into conference play, holding opposing C-USA batters to an average of .187.

Junior Danielle Urbanik saw the second-most action in 2005, pitching in 83 innings. In all games played, she held opposing teams to a batting average of .218, which was the second lowest total on the team. The Riverview, Fla., native threw two shutouts on the year to finish with a record of 8-6 while battling injury throughout the year. Also an offensive threat, she played in 44 games as the Bulls' designated player and ranked third in slugging percentage (.472) and fifth in batting average (.299).

Senior Nicole Christensen is depended upon to come out of the bullpen and close out games for USF. She made the second-most appearances in the circle last year (36) and provided the Bulls solid innings of work to either close out the game or come in when the team was in trouble. She tallied two saves - the second highest total on the team - while combining for four shutouts on the year. She stymied opposing batters to hit .217, which was the lowest average on the team.

Cristi Ecks is a freshman phenom out of Osborn High in Manassas, Va. She will immediately come in and take over a starting role. In her senior year alone, she tallied

366 strikeouts in 29 games, while registering an ERA of 0.07. She pitched a perfect game in 2005, striking out all batters faced (21 of 21). She will only improve an already tremendous pitching staff that has all the components to stifle opposing batters.

"Kasey Cash is a very crafty lefty who has shown that she can beat anybody in the country on any given day," Eriksen said. "But to have her healthy is a key for us right now. And then we added Cristi Ecks, a freshman from Manassas, Va., who came in the fall and increased her velocity, increased her strength, increased her movement and worked on a few different pitches. She probably gives us one of the strongest starting three that we have had in a long time.

"Danielle Urbanik is a power pitcher that is beginning to learn to pitch. And then to have our steady Eddie out of the bullpen in Nicole Christensen, who can come in at any time. Her strikeout to walk ratio is just fantastic and her control has gotten tremendously better. She is beginning now to challenge hitters, and someone out of the bullpen challenging hitters right off the bat is a key mental aspect and she can do those types of things for us. Nicole rounds out the pitching staff and is our go-to person in the bullpen."

SCHEDULE

In USF's inaugural season in the BIG EAST, Eriksen has put together another top-notch schedule that features 14 teams from the 2005 NCAA Softball Tournament, including two that made it to the Women's College World Series. The schedule will challenge USF as it seeks its fourth-straight and eighth overall berth to the NCAA Tournament.

"If you take a look at our schedule, it has to be one of the top non-conference schedules in the country," Eriksen said. "Then you add the three best teams from Conference USA to a great conference in the BIG EAST and you should be able to send six to eight teams to the NCAA Tournament from our league. I think we are probably looking at one of the better schedules we've ever had."

In addition to the premier teams that USF will have to face in 2006, the Bulls will also participate in eight tournaments - six of which they will host.

USF opens up its season hosting the Best Western Invitational at the USF Softball Complex from Friday, Feb. 10 through Sunday, Feb. 12. The Bulls welcome Western Kentucky, Jacksonville and Mississippi State.

The Bulls will then face in-state rival Florida (41-23) when they travel to Gainesville, Fla. on Wednesday, Feb. 15 at 5 p.m. This will be the first of two matchups for the Bulls and the Gators as they also meet on Wednesday, March 1 in Tampa. Both teams played each other last year with the Gators winning two out of three games.

On Sat., Feb. 18 through Mon., Feb 20, the Bulls will host the Wilson Invitational. The tournament will feature Hofstra, the College of Charleston, Jacksonville, Florida A&M and Temple. This tournament will have the Bulls up against three postseason teams from the

2005 season (Hofstra, the College of Charleston and FAMU).

From Friday, Feb. 24 through Sunday, Feb. 26 the Bulls will host the Louisville Slugger Invitational, which will feature Siena, Indiana and Kent State.

On March 3-5, USF will participate in the University of Arizona Tournament in Tucson along with Drake, Sam Houston State, Pacific and Long Beach. Long Beach earned its third-straight NCAA appearance last year, tallying a record of 39-14 while finishing the season ranked No. 24 in the country. Although the Long Beach-USF matchup will be tough, the feature game will be the Bulls versus Arizona. The game will headline the 2004 Team USA Olympic assistant coach, Eriksen, against the 2004 Team USA Olympic head coach, Mike Candrea. Posting a record of 45-12 (13-8 Pac-10) in 2005, Candrea led Arizona to its 17th trip to the Women's College World Series in 18 years.

The Bulls will then return home to host three tournaments: the adidas Tournament (March 9-12), the USF Spring Break Tournament (March 14-15) and the Speedline Invitational (March 17-18). The adidas Tournament will be held at the EC Moore Complex in Clearwater, Fla. and will feature 25 teams. One of USF's highlighted opponents will be Georgia Tech. The Jackets (49-12) won the ACC last year and received an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament - its fourth-straight berth.

USF will play doubleheaders against Illinois-Chicago on March 21 and Towson on March 22 before heading to Macon, Ga. to close out tournament action at the Mercer University Invitational.

BIG EAST action opens up for the Bulls the weekend of April 2-3. Unlike Conference USA's three-game format, BIG EAST matchups will feature doubleheaders. USF first welcomes Seton Hall and St. John's to the USF Softball Complex. The Pirates (34-15, 15-3 BIG EAST) were a 2005 NCAA Tournament team and the BIG EAST Tournament champion.

Overall, USF will play its toughest conference opponents at home this season. The Bulls will host 2005 BIG EAST regular season champion and regional finalist Notre Dame on April 29 and will follow that up with 2004 C-USA Tournament champion and Women's College World Series participant DePaul on April 30. The Bulls will host Pittsburgh and Syracuse at home in 2006 as well.

On the road in 2006, Louisville will prove to be the Bulls' toughest opponent, as the Cardinals were the C-USA Tournament runner-up and earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament. USF will also travel to Connecticut, Providence, Villanova and Rutgers, however Villanova (38-25, 10-8) is the only school out of the other three to finish last season with a winning record.

A mid-week doubleheader versus in-state foe Stetson on April 5 and UCF, the team that the Bulls knocked out of regionals last year, on April 12 concludes USF's non-conference portion of its schedule.

The BIG EAST Softball Tournament will be hosted by Notre Dame at the Belleville Softball Complex in Notre Dame, Ind. from May 10-13.

KEN ERIKSEN

► Head Coach ► 10th Season ► 415-214-1 (.660) ► USF 1984

The motto above the doorway in USF's locker room says a lot about Head Coach Ken Eriksen's expectations for the USF softball program. It reads:

**Expect Perfection,
Accept Excellence.**

Eriksen has tried to embody this philosophy first as a player, then as an assistant coach, and now as head coach--all at USF. Through it all, he has come out a winner. Now entering his 10th season as USF's head coach and his 21st overall with the softball program, Eriksen is imparting this wisdom to his players.

Since Eriksen has been head coach at USF, only one of his teams has ever ended a season with a losing record. In his nine years, he has led six teams to the NCAA Tournament and has won two conference titles.

In all, Eriksen has amassed a record of 415-214-1 (.660). He has coached four All-Americans, including two-time All-American Monica Triner (1998 and 1999), 10 All-Region selections and seven NCAA All-Regional Team members. Success has come off the field as well. Under Eriksen, USF has had six Academic All-Americans and nine Conference USA Commissioner's Academic Medal winners. In 2001 and 2003, USF finished first in C-USA among softball teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.24.

Eriksen has guided USF to eight winning seasons--four 50-plus win seasons and four 40-plus win seasons. The Bulls posted 44, 41 and 43-win seasons from 1999-2001. In 1999, USF had been ranked as high as No. 6 in the NFCA/USA Today Coaches Poll during the season. USF finished the 2003 season with a 54-19 record, and Eriksen was named the Conference USA Coach of the Year. In 2004, USF finished with a record of 60-14--the highest win total in school history--and ranked 12th in the NFCA/USA Today Coaches Poll.

The 1998 season was one of the most successful seasons for the Bulls, as they finished 57-14 and won their second-consecutive SASA (ACC) regular-season title. Eriksen, who garnered acclaim as the Southeast Region Coach of the Year, led the Bulls to the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight year. USF was one step away from its first ever College World Series appearance after falling to Texas in the NCAA Regional finals.

During his first year at the helm in 1997, Eriksen guid-

ed USF to its then-best-ever national ranking at No. 14 in the NFCA/USA Today Coaches Poll, finishing 50-13 and advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

Eriksen began his affiliation with USF over 25 years ago when the freshman from Stony Brook, Long Island, first appeared in Tampa as a baseball player for Baseball Hall of Famer Robin Roberts. It was under Roberts and current USF coach Eddie Cardieri that Eriksen learned the strategy and execution involved with quality ball. In four seasons, Eriksen posted a .315 batting average and a 2.84 ERA while playing five different positions for the Bulls. In 1982 he was named to the All-Regional Team as an outfielder.

After earning his bachelor's degree in political science, Eriksen decided to turn his attentions from the baseball diamond to the softball arena. He competed at the elite fastpitch level with the Clearwater Bombers from 1986-93, and he completed his playing career with Miller-Toyota of Salt Lake City, Utah, from 1993-95.

During his playing career, Eriksen amassed a wealth of international experience. He participated in eight ISC World Championships and eight ASA National Major

Championships. In 1988, he was a member of a select team that represented the United States against the Cuban National Team. In 1991, Eriksen was the catcher on the United States National Fastpitch Team that won a silver medal at the Pan American Games in Cuba. In 1992, he was named First Team All-World as a catcher and to the All-North American Team. Eriksen won three Olympic Festival silver medals along with an ASA National Championship in 1997 with the Tampa Bay Smokers. That year he was named the head coach for the Men's 19U World Team that represented the United States in St. John's, Newfoundland.

In 2001, Eriksen was named assistant coach with the United States Women's National Team and made history helping lead TEAM USA to an Olympic gold medal in 2004 while becoming the only USF coach in school history to accomplish such a feat. Eriksen, who still holds his position with the national team, primary responsibilities are pitching, catching and scouting.

Throughout his coaching and playing career, Eriksen has added to his workload with camps and clinics. He is also thoroughly devoted to his family. Eriksen lives with his wife Debra, his nine-year-old daughter Tatiana and his five-year-old daughter Natasha.

In the summer of 2004, University of South Florida coach Ken Eriksen accomplished a feat that no other coach in USF history had achieved - he helped bring home a gold medal for the United States in the 2004 Athens Summer Olympics.

run. Team USA's pitchers held their opponents to a dismal batting average of .097.

Since Eriksen joined the Olympic coaching staff in 2001, Team USA has gone 28-0 in international competition. In the three major international competitions, Team USA went 10-0 to become the 2002 World Champions, went 9-0 to win the 2003 Pan American games for the fifth-consecutive time and went 9-0 to win the gold in the Olympics.

For the past five years, Eriksen put his personal life on hold to be an assistant coach for the USA Softball Team. His prolific coaching skills and knowledge of the game that has lead the USF softball team to five NCAA Regional Appearances now were used in a global setting, helping Team USA win its third-consecutive Olympic gold medal.

Working primarily as the pitching coach, Eriksen helped develop aces Jennie Finch, Cat Osterman, Lori Harrigan and Lisa Fernandez into forces on the mound. The group recorded eight shutouts out of nine games and combined for an ERA of 0.12.

Only in the gold-medal game did Team USA give up its only run during the Olympics.

Team USA broke a total of 18 Olympic records in Athens, and under Eriksen's tutelage, the USA pitching staff rewrote the record books in four categories: fewest runs allowed, shutouts, lowest ERA and consecutive victories. In 56 innings during the Olympic games, the pitching staff combined for 57 strikeouts and only gave up a total of 18 hits, none of which were a home

Serving as head coach for Team USA at the 2001 Pan American Qualifiers, Eriksen led the team to a gold medal. As an assistant coach in 2002, he helped guide the team to four more golds in just a two-month span. Team USA won gold at the U.S. Cup in Honolulu, Hawaii, at the Canada Cup in Vancouver, B.C., at the ISF Women's World Championships in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, and at the Japan Cup in Yokohama, Japan.

While USA Softball has been a dominant force and the dominant team in the world, winning the last three Olympic games, it is the 2004 team that has been arguably the best to represent the United States of America, and Eriksen played a major role in making Team USA into the real Dream Team. He credits Head Coach Mike Candrea for allowing him to be a part of such a historic team.

COACH ERIKSEN ON HIS OLYMPIC EXPERIENCE:

"When they played the national anthem at the end, raised the flag and the gold medals were hanging around the players' necks, how can you not let the tears out—they just started flowing. It's just such a proud moment that is indescribable. It's tears of joy and it's a relief. How many people get that opportunity to not just represent the United States, but to represent your family, represent all the ideals of your government and carry on your experiences that you drew from as a collegiate student, athlete and coach at the University of South Florida?"

STACEY HEINTZ

► Associate Head Coach ► 10th Season ► UMass 1993

Stacey Heintz enters her 10th year as the associate head coach of the USF softball team. Heintz was promoted to her current position prior to the 2003 season after working as an assistant coach at USF for six years.

As head coach Ken Eriksen's "right-hand man," Heintz is responsible for many aspects of the day-to-day coaching duties. Off the field, she helps ensure that her players are maintaining expected academic standards and is instrumental in the recruiting process, serving as Eriksen's chief talent scout.

"Stacey does much, much more than the average assistant coach, and that's why we made her my associate head coach," Eriksen said. "Our players trust her dearly, both on and off the field. Without her help, this program would surely not be as successful as it is today. In other words, I'd be up a creek without a paddle."

On the field, Heintz helps the staff analyze hitting and works extensively with the Bull outfield.

"Where she has brought our outfield over the past five years has been a phenomenal turnaround," praises Eriksen.

A former outfielder herself, Heintz helped her 1992 University of Massachusetts squad to a third-place finish in the College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla. She also helped lead the Minutemen to four-straight Atlantic 10 titles and two NCAA Regional appearances and was honored as a member of the Atlantic 10 All-Tournament team in 1992. In her senior year, the UMass captain was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference team as well as Atlantic 10 All-Academic team.

After finishing her collegiate playing career, Heintz spent a year at Hofstra as an assistant coach before heading back to her alma mater to serve as an assistant for the next two seasons. She joined Eriksen's staff in his first year as head coach in 1997.

Heintz earned her bachelor's degree in sports management from UMass in 1993 and then earned her master's degree in higher education administration in 1996 from UMass as well.

Amber Wright enters her eighth season as the assistant coach of the USF softball team. A former Bull herself, Wright had a stellar playing career at USF from 1994-97 and now looks to continue her successes off the field by guiding younger players with her knowledge and experience of the game.

"Amber brings a serene, calm, confident leadership style to our staff that seems to really bode well with the players," coach Ken Eriksen said. "She possesses a keen game sense in that she can pull a player aside between innings and supply the exact pick-me-up speech that particular player needs."

While Wright focuses most of her attention on the infield and on analyzing hitting, she also helps the staff with its recruiting duties.

Having helped USF to a 151-65 overall mark and two conference titles (Southern Atlantic Softball Alliance '96, '97) from 1994-97, Wright was a mainstay in the infield under both former head coach Hildred Deese and current head coach Eriksen. She was a member of the 1996 and 1997 Bulls squad that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances--the program's first two ever.

Bringing with her the motivational style that she displayed as a member of the 1994-97 USF squad, Wright's experience in the professional ranks also lends to her success as a coach.

In 1997, Wright signed with the Tampa Bay Firestix of the Women's Professional Softball League. She spent the 1998 season with the Orlando Wahoos, where she was instrumental in the team's WPF Championship and, for her efforts, was a member of the all-star team. In 1999, she was traded back to the Firestix and helped lead the team to its first WPF Championship.

Wright earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from USF in 1998 and her received her master's degree in guidance and counseling from USF in 2005.

► Volunteer Assistant Coach ► Third Season ► USF 1999

Monica Triner returns to the USF softball program for her third season as the volunteer assistant coach. An All-American for the Bulls in 1998 and 1999, Triner will assist coach Eriksen with all aspects of the game primarily with batting practice duties. During the 2004 season, she worked with the pitching staff while coach Eriksen was fulfilling his obligations with the Olympic Team.

Triner came to the Bulls after spending three years as an assistant coach at Virginia Tech. While at Virginia Tech, she was responsible for working with the pitchers, recruiting, conditioning and arranging all travel plans. In her first season with the Hokies as pitching coach, her staff posted a team ERA of 1.23, the second-best in the BIG EAST Conference and the 18th-best in the country. Three years ago, she helped Ashlee Dobbe set or break nearly every pitching record at Virginia Tech, including wins, saves and strikeouts. She also saw her staff toss six no-hitters during the season.

"I don't think you can ask for a better volunteer assistant coach," Eriksen said. "She has tremendous experience coming back from coaching three years at Virginia Tech and being our volunteer coach the past two seasons. She played here and was an All-American here. She has a great understanding of both pitching and hitting. We are very blessed in that respect."

Triner graduated from USF in 1999, where she held 21 softball records and posted a career record of 92-33, with a school-record 37 shutouts. She currently holds six career records, two season records and two single-game records for the Bulls. She had a 0.95 ERA for her career and still holds records for career wins (92), complete games (109), innings pitched (788) and strikeouts (641). She is still among the all-time national leaders with 14 career saves.

A native of Gibsonton, Fla., Triner graduated from East Bay High in 1995. At East Bay, she hit over .400 each of her four seasons and had an ERA of 0.09 her senior year.

first team, received NFCA All-Region honors and was a CoSIDA Academic All-American.

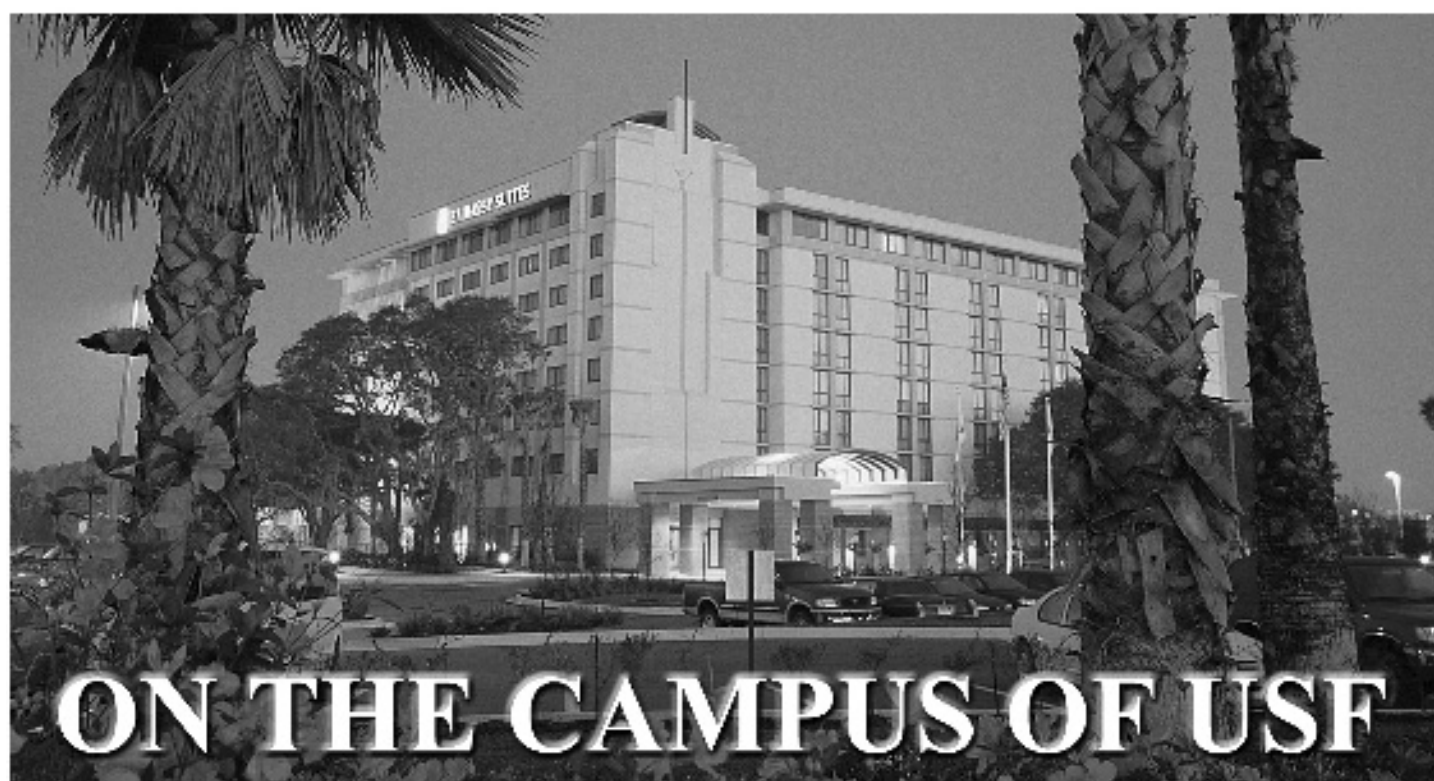

The University of South Florida

As the 21st Century begins, the State of Florida is the fourth most populous state and the Tampa Bay Region is among the nation's most dynamic and rapidly growing metropolitan areas. Florida's population grew from 2 million to 15 million between 1950 and 2000. The growth has made Florida a cosmopolitan, mostly urban state, with extensive cultural, economic and social transformation.

Along with the achievements of the boom years have come vast challenges in education, health care, social services, arts, the environment, transportation and economic development. The University of South Florida is uniquely positioned to assist the state with the challenges of rapid development by providing increased opportunities for the education of Florida's citizens and outstanding research outcomes to improve the quality of life.

Since opening for classes in 1960, USF has developed into one of the nation's major public research universities. USF is classified as Doctoral/Research Extensive by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and is ranked among the top 100 public research universities in the annual report "The Top American Research Universities." USF's main goal in the next five years is to become one of the top 50 public research universities in the nation and is on track to do so as the University had its eighth consecutive record-breaking year in 2003-04 for the amount of research contracts and grants, totaling \$290 million.

With more than 42,000 students from all 50 states and 124 countries, USF awards more than 5,000 bachelor's degrees and 2,000 master's degrees annually on campuses in Tampa, St. Petersburg, Sarasota/Manatee and Lakeland. The University confers more than 160 doctorates in 31 fields and more than 90



Doctor of Medicine degrees a year. In its short history, USF has awarded more than 220,000 degrees.

A Higher Education

Students come to USF from every state in the nation and more than 100 countries. They represent all ages, cultures and ethnic backgrounds. Over one quarter of the student population is African American, Hispanic, Asian American, Native American or other nationality.

The students choose from more than 200 undergraduate, masters, specialist and doctoral programs, including the doctor of medicine. The average high school GPA for the 2003-04 entering freshman class was 3.7 with an SAT score of roughly 1108.

► USF is among the top 35 universities in the country for educating Hispanics, according to the 2002 Hispanic Outlook for Higher Education

► USF has one of the largest metropolitan colleges of education in the nation, providing student teachers to public schools throughout the Tampa Bay region. Florida principals have rated USF education graduates the best prepared teachers in the state.

► During the decade of the 90's, USF was No. 1 in the nation with the highest percentage of candidates with advanced degrees passing all parts of the CPA exam taken.

► USF has the third largest graduate certificate enrollment in the country.

► USF is the nation's top location for students transferring to another location, according to U.S. News & World Report.

Economic Impact

USF is key in the creation and development of the Florida High Technology Corridor from Florida's East Coast along Interstate-4 to the Gulfcoast. This area has become the state's high-tech leader, encompassing some 60 percent of Florida's high-tech industries.





► USF's Center for Entrepreneurship and its business incubator are noted for success in moving discoveries from basic research to applied research, and into companies in the community. USF was ranked in the top ten nationally for the creation of start-up companies by the Association of University Technology Managers.

► Among 71 national research universities surveyed, USF ranked fourth in the number of inventions licensed to start-up companies, and first among universities with similar profiles.

► More than 90,000 of 195,000 graduates since the first commencement in 1964 live in the Tampa Bay area.

Research

USF is proud to be a student centered national research university. Students have the advantage of working directly with world-class researchers in fields from aging, to education, psychology, engineering and transportation.

► USF is one of the top 60 public research universities in the country.

► USF is one of the nation's top centers in conducting research aimed at new treatments for Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, and Huntington's diseases. It has pioneered the concept of brain repair -- placing cells in the brain to help fix the damage of disease or injury.

► USF is the only university that has been designated as one of the five National Centers for Water Treatment Technologies in the country. These centers are sponsored by the National Water Research Institute (NWRI) and the U.S. Dept. of Interior's Bureau of Reclamation.

Outreach and Engagement -

Virtually everyone in the Tampa Bay region-and beyond-enjoys some benefit from USF through countless outreach and

engagement activities. USF contributes to the well being of its immediate urban neighborhoods through health care and networks of social research and service projects.

► In 1988, USF began a program for at-risk migrant children to complete their high school equivalency. More than 90 percent of the 1,200 students since then have now completed their high school equivalency and many have gone on to college or have careers that have taken them out of the migrant fields.

► H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute at USF annually ranks among "America's Best Hospitals" for cancer care by U.S. News & World Report. Moffitt has become the third-busiest cancer center in the nation.

► The USF College of Public Health is the only public health college in the state accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health. The college is a leader in health promotion and disease prevention.

USF conducts more than 700 programs annually through Continuing Education, serving more than 16,000 people and awarding more than 35,000 hours of continuing education units.

East of the county, the country flavor of Plant City; to the west and south, the beauty of

the Pinellas County and Sarasota/Bradenton beaches.

Just east of downtown Tampa, Ybor City, one of only three Florida National Historic Districts, mixes the past with the present. The area, which was famous for its flourishing cigar industry during the late 19th and early 20th centuries, is now famous for its rich culture and exciting nightlife.

Centro Ybor, a former cigar factory itself, is now a popular spot for shopping and dining. Ybor City also offers art studios and Spanish-Cuban ethnic restaurants with a true taste of the local cuisine. But the fun doesn't stop when the sun goes down. At night, Ybor City comes alive with nightclubs showcasing the blues, jazz and rock. The area becomes a street party as music flows into the streets from local clubs. For those who enjoy somewhat quieter nights, Centro Ybor, at the heart of the city, offers a more family type atmosphere with shops, restaurants and a movie theater. No matter how you like to spend your evenings, Ybor City won't disappoint you.

And if you've never thought about Tampa Bay as a place where the arts flourish, think again. Our museums draw acclaim from visitors and critics alike. We enjoy a renowned symphony orchestra, an exciting theater scene and cultural performances in state of the art venues. Those venues - including the University of South Florida's own Sun Dome - also play host to most every national touring musical act. Weekends are never dull here. In addition to cultural events, the area offers theme

parks such as Busch Gardens and Adventure Island, professional sports, boating, year-round golf and places where families can escape to marvel at Florida's natural majesty.

Judy Genshaft was appointed president of the University of South Florida in July 2000, bringing with her more than 25 years of experience in higher education. As president, Genshaft is leading a new era of excellence and innovation in teaching and learning, research and service.

President Genshaft leads one of the 20 largest universities in the nation. With campuses in Tampa, St. Petersburg, Sarasota/Manatee and Lakeland, USF serves nearly 42,600 students in more than 200 undergraduate, master's, specialist and doctoral programs, including the doctor of medicine. USF has 12,400 employees and a budget of \$1.3 billion, including \$290 million in research contracts and grants.

USF is poised to become one of the top 50 public research universities in America, as ranked in the elite group of The Top American Research Universities. Its growing prominence has earned consistent rankings in America's Best Graduate Schools and U.S. News & World Report.

President Genshaft led the development and implementation of a five-year strategic plan that focuses USF resources on strategic priorities. The plan strengthens USF's faculty and program quality, student selectivity and achievement, research quality and productivity, and private support.

As a leader of a metropolitan research university, President Genshaft has established herself as a leader for economic development, especially related to high-technology and bioscience. President Genshaft has focused on partnering university research with corporate and entrepreneurial partners. She launched the university's high-tech business incubator and is developing USF's Research Park as a hub for bioscience research and entrepreneurship. Recognizing USF's role in the community as a metropolitan university, President Genshaft is Florida's first university president to chair a chamber of commerce's economic development committee. She also holds leadership positions in several other economic development efforts in the Tampa Bay area.

Since joining USF, President Genshaft has focused on raising the university's academic profile and enhancing student life. She created the USF Honors College, which is now the largest in Florida and serves students with the highest SAT scores in the state. President Genshaft's support for students' academic success has resulted in the development of a more service-oriented university that is com-

mitted to providing students the necessary classes to be successful in their majors and graduate in a timely manner. She empowered USF's regional campuses to address the unique needs of their communities. Under President Genshaft's leadership, the USF Health Sciences Center created an integrated model for health care education and delivery to provide better care for patients.

President Genshaft spearheaded funding and construction for the university's new 110,000-square-foot athletic training facility - the headquarters for USF NCAA teams as they head into the BIG EAST Conference in the 2005-2006 academic year. In 2003, President Genshaft successfully negotiated a move from Conference USA to the BIG EAST, raising the level of competition of USF athletics and dramatically raising the national profile of USF, which now counts prestigious institutions such as Pittsburgh, Rutgers and Syracuse among its peers.

President Genshaft's administration also secured national basketball tournaments for the Tampa Bay area: the Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Basketball Tournament in 2007 and the NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four in 2008. USF is the host institution for both tournaments, which will be held at the St. Pete Times Forum.

Prior to joining USF, President Genshaft served as provost and vice president for Academic Affairs at the University at Albany, where she also served as dean of the College of Education. She served as professor, department chair, associate provost and faculty senate president at Ohio State University. President Genshaft has a bachelor's degree in social work and psychology from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, a master's degree in school psychology and a Ph.D. in counseling psychology-both from Kent State University. A national leader in the field of school psychology, she is the author and co-author of 69 journal articles and three books.

In his 28th year at the University of South Florida, Dr. John T. Romeo is in his seventh year as the faculty athletics representative.

Romeo is a professor of biology in the College of Arts and Sciences. His doctorate is from the

University of Texas at Austin.

He represents USF in matters with the NCAA and the BIG EAST, in addition to chairing the University Athletics Council. The Council, whose charge is to monitor the intercollegiate athletics program, is advisory to the president and the athletic director.

Romeo is also involved in the certification process of USF student-athletes and serves as the University's voting delegate in NCAA issues in the absence of the president. He served on the NCAA Management Council for two years and on an NCAA committee to study the 20-hour rule. He also chaired the Conference USA Faculty Athletics Representatives group and served on the C-USA basketball task force.

Romeo is a past director of the Graduate Program in Biology and served as the department chairperson from 1992-1998. He received University recognition for outstanding undergraduate teaching in 1985, 1990 and 1993. He developed a NASA-funded project to create an interactive course in "Space-Age Biology" for non-science majors. This effort was a collaborative one involving both the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Education. He currently is the director of the Biology Undergraduate Honors Program, and he is also a campus faculty advisor to the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi.

Romeo's research interests involve the chemistry of tropical plants. The search for natural insecticides, herbicides and medicinal drugs is part of this focus.

Doug Woolard Director of Athletics



Doug Woolard assumed command of the University of South Florida Department of Athletics in 2004 at a moment in time that was pivotal in the school's athletic history. With a successful launch of football already in place, USF will emerge as a player in the BIG EAST Conference in 2005. Woolard's leadership role is one he is fit to assume and one in which he has experience.

In October 1994, Woolard assumed leadership of the Saint Louis University Department of Athletics as its director and guided the program through a historic period that included the school's inclusion as a founding member of Conference USA, and more recently its acceptance of membership in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

While overseeing a department that was progressive in its competitive success, Woolard also proved to be a large asset in a community, that like Tampa Bay, presents the challenge of finding a niche with professional football, baseball and hockey in the market.

The Saint Louis men's basketball team has consistently ranked among the top 30 in the nation in annual attendance during Woolard's decade at the helm. Three times the program was among the nation's top 10, peaking with an average attendance of 17,708. Furthermore, the men's soccer program at Saint Louis is consistently in the nation's top 10 in attendance by averaging over 2,800 fans a game in a stadium that was constructed for the men's and women's teams under Woolard's watch.

Further enhancing the community partnership, Woolard has remained committed to bringing all Billiken athletic events back on campus. In addition to constructing a new soccer stadium, Saint Louis has added a new softball facility and nine new tennis courts on campus. Planning and fundraising are now underway to construct a \$70 million on-campus multi-purpose facility where Saint Louis can play its men's and women's basketball games.

Woolard's leadership has extended

beyond competitive success and a strong community setting into an ultra-successful academic environment. Saint Louis student-athletes have not only been the frontrunners among their Conference USA peers, but they have developed an outstanding reputation nationally for their achievement. Saint Louis student-athletes achieved a 69 percent graduation rate in 2002-03 - the highest in Conference USA - and the University won the league's institutional academic excellence award for the eighth straight season, representing every season in C-USA history at that time.

To achieve the many successes at Saint Louis over the past decade, Woolard has kept a keen eye on the financial foundation of the program. He added the first-ever in-house development director to the program to maximize the revenue streams for an NCAA Division I program. He also negotiated the Billikens' first department-wide shoe and apparel contract with Nike, and he renegotiated a radio and television syndication package that enhanced the school's revenue base. The television package included locally televised games for men's and women's soccer and volleyball.

While maintaining an outstanding department at Saint Louis, Woolard has also become a prominent figure on national committees. Presently he is a member of the NCAA Sports Wagering Task Force, which has been charged with recommending strategies to counteract sports wager-

ing by student-athletes. He is a past chair of the Conference USA Directors of Athletics Committee and he also served as the league's representative on the NCAA Academic/Eligibility/Compliance (AEC) Cabinet, where he chaired the amateurism and agents subcommittee. Woolard has also served as C-USA's alternate to the NCAA Management Council, the most powerful committee in the NCAA governance structure.

Prior to joining Saint Louis, Woolard worked for the nationally respected Jim Livengood at Washington State University. Under Livengood, who is now the director of athletics at Arizona and a past chair of the NCAA Men's Basketball Committee, Woolard was the associate director for external operations from 1989-94 after one year (1988-89) as an assistant director of athletics.

While at Washington State, Woolard was a key member of the senior management staff that oversaw a successful football program, and he played a prominent role in the entire department's relationship with the community.

Woolard and his wife, Cherrie, have two children, Chris and Amy. Chris graduated from UCLA and is currently in his second year as the director of championships at Conference USA. Amy graduated from Saint Louis University and currently teaches preschool in St. Louis.

Barbara Sparks-McGlinchy
Senior Associate
Director of Athletics



A member of the University of South Florida Athletic Department family since March 1982, Barbara Sparks-McGlinchy was elevated to senior associate athletic director in 1998.

Coinciding with Sparks-McGlinchy's increasing responsibilities within the athletic department, there has been a rapid growth period within the

overall athletic program. During her tenure, USF has added women's cross country, men's and women's track and field, women's soccer, football and women's sailing.

At the same time, USF moved first from the Sun Belt Conference (1976-1991) into the Metro Conference in 1991. Following four seasons in the Metro Conference, USF became a member of Conference USA in 1995 and transitioned into the BIG EAST in 2005. Along with that transition came a steady increase in USF's competitive demands, and the Bulls have responded impressively, especially within the Olympic and women's programs, two areas of primary managerial oversight for Sparks-McGlinchy.

USF's volleyball team won back-to-back Conference USA Championships in 1997 and 1998 and has made four NCAA appearances in the past nine years, while the women's tennis team won the 1997 and 2000 Conference USA titles and had been to four-straight NCAA Championships from 1997-2000. Meanwhile, the softball team has reached the NCAA Championships seven of the last 10 seasons, while the men's soccer team has been to four of the last nine NCAA Championships, including the Elite 8 in 1997. The men's tennis and women's golf teams have also been regulars in postseason NCAA competition.

In her current role, Sparks-McGlinchy has administrative supervision of five athletic teams at USF, including men's baseball and soccer and women's sailing, softball and volleyball. Sparks-McGlinchy also serves as USF's senior woman administrator and has oversight responsibility for Title IX compliance. She was an integral part of the team that planned, designed and oversaw construction of the Athletics Training Facility and she is the Athletics' staff liaison to the USF Board of Trustees Academics and Campus Environment workgroup.

Selected to the National Collegiate Athletic Association's Business and Finance Cabinet in 1997, Sparks-McGlinchy was also a member of that cabinet's marketing committee. She represented USF on the State Council on Equity in Athletics for over 15 years and served as chair of the Finance Committee for the Council. Additionally, she was the chair of the Conference USA Senior Woman Administrators for 1999-2000.

Sparks-McGlinchy has a bachelor's degree in business management and a master's degree in guidance and counselor education, both from the University of South Florida. She counts golf and walking among her recreational activities, and she resides in Temple Terrace with her husband, John. They have three grown children, Shawn, John and April.

Barry Clements
Associate Director of Athletics -
Sports & Programs



An employee in the USF Department of Athletics since 1983, Barry Clements was promoted to his current position as associate director of athletics for Sports and Program Services in 2002. Clements provides oversight to eleven of USF's eighteen sports: women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, women's indoor track, men's and women's

outdoor track, and men's and women's tennis. Additionally, Clements administratively oversees the Equipment Area, the Sports Medicine Department, the Strength and Conditioning Department and the Video Area.

Clements has overseen the sports medicine area since 1983 when he first came to USF. In January 1993, he was promoted to assistant director of athletics. Over the course of his tenure, Clements has built a comprehensive Sports Medicine Department and Program that is one of the best in the country. He has former students placed throughout the country as well as here at USF. He has developed a network of the Tampa Bay area's top physicians, covering every facet of healthcare to serve USF's student-athletes. Clements has and continues to stay involved in providing sport medicine services to the community. Clements is also responsible for building the Strength and Conditioning Department. As in sports medicine, Clements served as the head person in that area and remains certified by the National Strength and Conditioning Association.

A certified member of the National Athletic Trainers Association and the Southeastern Athletic Trainers Association, Clements is also a past president of the Athletic Trainers Association of Florida. During his presidency, that organization became incorporated and tax-exempt while achieving registration and licensure. Clements is also a Doping Control Officer for the United States Anti Doping Agency, formerly the United States Olympic Committee of which he also served as an athletic trainer for men's and women's volleyball during the Olympic Festival in 1993 at San Antonio. He was invited to be the men's volleyball athletic trainer for the World University Games in 1995.

Clements won the 1993 Florida Athletic Trainer of the Year Award, and he also was the 1992 winner in the college and professional sports division. In addition, He has been a lecturer on sports medicine, including tours of Sweden, Finland and Russia. In 1994, he became the first American trainer to work in the European Championships.

In 2003, Clements was inducted into the Athletic Trainers Association of Florida Hall of Fame.

Clements, 46, graduated from Ball State, where he was named an Outstanding Young Alumnus in 1994, and he also has a master's degree from Kent State. Prior to coming to USF he was the head athletic trainer at Stebbins High School in Dayton Ohio. He was also the director of Dick Baumgartner's Basketball Shooting Camps during the early to mid eighties. At the time the camps were the largest in the country. Other previous experience includes athletic trainer positions with the Cleveland Browns, the Orlando All-Star Classic, Baseball Fantasies Camp and the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, just to mention a few.

Clements is a native of Richmond, Ind. He and his wife, Melissa, reside in Temple Terrace with their daughter, Nicole (9).

Rick Costello
Associate Director of Athletics -
Chief Financial Officer



Rick Costello was appointed the first chief financial officer and associate athletic director for USF Athletics on July 31, 2003. In this role, Costello provides leadership and administrative oversight for the planning, directing and fiscal management of the USF Athletic Department. These responsibilities include

directing the development and implementation of the \$22 million intercollegiate athletic department budget. As part of the Athletics' executive management team, Costello supervises and manages the areas of Finance, Human Resources, Information Technology, Facilities, Ticket Office and the Sun Dome.

Costello came to USF after serving as the assistant athletic director for business operations at San Jose State University from 2001-03. Costello was responsible for the business and fiscal affairs, including the procurement, travel, payroll and internal control functions. In addition, he supervised the ticket office as well as directing all event management operations for football and men's basketball.

His experience as a college administrator also includes four years (1997-01) at Lehigh University as a senior budget analyst. Complementing this administrative experience, Costello served as an Assistant Men's Basketball Coach for three years (1991-94) at Lehigh University.

Recognized by his peers for excellence, Costello received the 1999 Residential Services Distinguished Service Award at Lehigh University. He is currently a member of the College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA) and serves on the association's membership committee. In addition, Costello also serves on the Finance Committee at the University of South Florida.

Costello is a 1988 graduate of Muhlenberg College, cum laude. After graduation, Costello gained experience in public and private accounting. In 1994, Costello earned a master's degree in business administration from Lehigh University.

Costello and his wife, Amy, have three children, Kelsea (8), Lauren (5) and Ryan (3). They reside in New Tampa.

Steve Horton

Associate Director of Athletics - Compliance



After having worked as an assistant athletics director since February 1998, Steve Horton was promoted to his current title in March 2002, managing all of USF's compliance activities in conjunction with the NCAA and now the BIG EAST Conference. In addition, Horton is now involved in a number

of additional areas, including football scheduling and game contracts.

Prior to joining USF, Horton served as a consultant with the University of Texas-El Paso, assisting with the school's compliance efforts and directing its 1997 NCAA Committee on Infractions appeal.

From 1988-96, Horton was assistant director of athletics at Virginia Tech where he established a comprehensive system of internal controls related to NCAA and conference rules, including eligibility, certification, financial aid and recruiting. In addition to his compliance responsibilities, Horton administrated Virginia Tech's tennis, swimming, wrestling, soccer and volleyball programs, and he assisted with football gameday operations. Horton also spent part of his tenure at Virginia Tech supervising the marketing and promotions area.

Prior to joining Virginia Tech, Horton was a legislative assistant for the NCAA from 1986-88 and also worked as an administrative assistant in the University of Georgia Athletic Association from 1984-85.

Before beginning his career in intercollegiate athletics, Horton worked in marketing and public relations for Honeywell Information Systems and the University of Georgia.

Horton earned a bachelor's degree in journalism from Georgia in 1971 and a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports management in 1985. He attended the Sports Management Institute at the University of Notre Dame in 1993 and has also taken additional graduate work while at Georgia and Virginia Tech.

Horton and his wife, Diane, who works in the Undergraduate Admissions Office at USF, reside in Tampa, Fla.

Vicki Mitchell

Associate Director of Athletics - Development



Vicki Mitchell joined the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics in May 2002 after 15 years with the USF Development Office. She came to USF in 1986 from the Florida Board of Regents Office where she served on the legislative relations staff for the State University System.

After terms as director of development research and director of major gifts at USF, Mitchell was appointed associate vice president for university development in 1993. In that position, she was responsible for oversight of all university fund raising and charged with planning a comprehensive fund-raising campaign that launched in 1995.

A veteran of two major fund-raising campaigns at USF, Mitchell led efforts that raised more than \$40 million for the University. Most recently, she served as campaign director for the "Great Achievements-Great Expectations Campaign" that brought in \$256 million before ending in June 2001.

Mitchell is a native of Miami, Fla., and a graduate of Florida State University.

Tom Veit

Associate Director of Athletics - External Affairs



Tom Veit was named to his current position in July 2002, marking a return to his alma mater, well situated as a top marketing professional in the athletic profession.

Over the past three years, Veit has overseen a consistent raise in revenue for the athletic department. Under

Veit's direction, USF revamped licensing and merchandising programs, including the creation of new logos and marks for USF athletics. This resulted in one of the largest increases in yearly sales in the NCAA, propelling USF into one of the Collegiate Licensing Corporation's Top 50 Universities for merchandise sales

Before his return, Veit was vice president/general manager for the Orlando Rage, an XFL franchise that exceeded all revenue goals while operating within budget guidelines. Under Veit's direction, the franchise was number one among all league franchises in game-day ticket sales and had the highest single-game paid attendance in the league.

Prior to joining the Rage in 2000, Veit served as senior vice president of sales and marketing for the Tampa Bay Mutiny, a Major League Soccer franchise. With the Mutiny, Veit supervised sponsorship sales, marketing and broadcasting.

From 1996-99, Veit was the director of sports marketing and sales for Clear Channel Communications - departments he was charged with creating from scratch. While with Clear Channel, Veit negotiated with various sports teams to acquire broadcast rights, including USF football and basketball.

Veit also worked as the director of marketing and operations with the Tampa Bay Storm of the Arena Football League from 1993-96. With that franchise, Veit oversaw all revenue streams, while bringing all marketing services in-house, including advertising, print layout, radio spots, television media script and sponsorship sales.

Veit has a Bachelor of Arts degree from USF in liberal arts. While a student at USF, he was president of student activities and he was named an Outstanding Senior Leader.



Lee Roy Selmon
President - USF Foundation
Partnership For Athletics



Perhaps the most recognizable figure in the Tampa Bay community, Lee Roy Selmon, a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and popularly considered a "gentlemen's gentleman," took on a new challenge in

2004 to build financial support for USF's move to the BIG EAST Conference in 2005. This role came after 12 years at USF, including three as the director of athletics from 2001-04. He had been associate director for eight years.

Attesting to Selmon's status as an outstanding role model is his elite status as a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame, the College Football Hall of Fame and the Verizon Academic All-America Hall of Fame. Only a handful of men can claim membership in all three Halls.

Selmon first joined USF in 1994 after his ultra-successful football career, which was followed by a banking career, considered every bit as successful. His hiring came in advance of USF's initiation of intercollegiate football in 1996, and his primary duties included oversight of all external affairs, including sports information, marketing, promotions, corporate partnerships and fundraising.

Selmon's original appointment came in July 1993, two weeks after USF announced a \$10 million fundraising effort to begin an NCAA intercollegiate football program. He joined the Bulls after an ultra-successful banking career that actually began while he was still playing for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He had risen to vice president for public relations and marketing at Barnett Banks well before his move to USF. He started his banking career as an officer at First Florida in 1978 and progressed to a sales and service officer managing an account portfolio in excess of \$10 million. In January 1989, he was named vice president at First Florida and held that position even after Barnett purchased First Florida.

Immensely popular in the Tampa Bay area, Selmon holds the distinction of having a major Hillsborough County expressway named in his honor (Lee Roy Selmon Expressway). His popularity in the community dates back to 1976 when he became the very first draftee of the Tampa Bay Buccaneer NFL expansion franchise. He was the NFL's overall number one selection that season, following a brilliant career at Oklahoma, where he was one of a trio of famous Selmon brothers, including Lucious and Dewey. Selmon remains one of the most decorated players in modern football history.

He earned consensus All-America honors at Oklahoma in addition to the 1975 Outland and Lombardi Trophies as the top lineman in the nation. In addition to excelling on the field, he earned a degree in special education in four years and distinction on the GTE Academic All-America Team. In 1996, he was named to College Sports Magazine's All-Time College Football Team.

In nine seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers - a career cut short by back injury - Selmon was selected to the Pro Bowl six times. He played in 121 games, with 742 tackles, 78-1/2 sacks, 380 quarterback pressures and 28-1/2 fumbles caused. He was a four-time All-Pro (1979, 80, 82, 84) and the 1979 NFL Defensive Player of the Year when he led what many consider to be one of the NFL's all-time best defenses. The Buccaneers reached the NFC Championship Game that season, succumbing 9-0 to the Los Angeles Rams just one game shy of the Super Bowl.

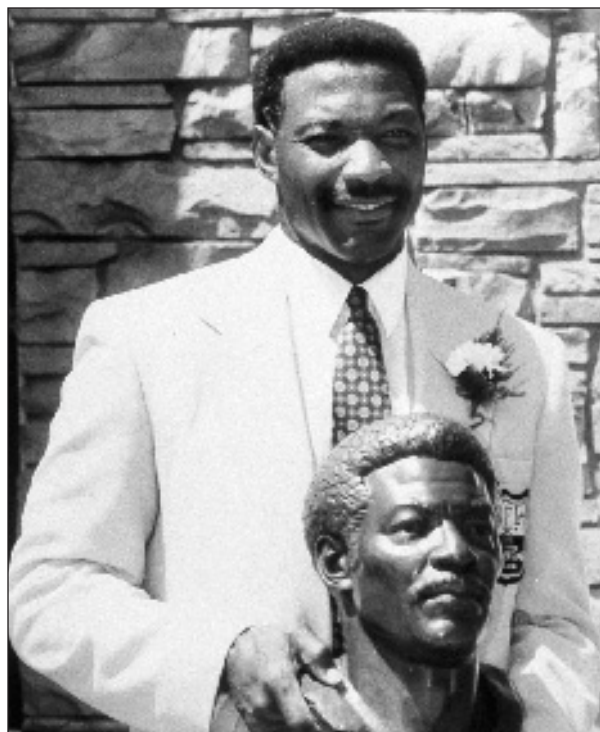
After injuring his back in the 1985 Pro Bowl, Selmon missed the entire 1985 season and retired in April 1986. On Sept. 7, 1986, his "63" Buccaneer jersey was retired and remains the only Buc jersey with that distinction. Nine years later, on July 29, 1995, Selmon was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. One year prior to that, on May

28, 1994, Selmon was inducted into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame. Known widely as a "family comes first" gentleman, Selmon had his brother, Dewey, introduce him for the induction in both halls.

A perennial finalist for the NFL's Byron "Whizzer" White Award for Humanitarian Service, Selmon remains a constant presence on the charity scene, donating time to an endless list of service groups.

Born and raised as the youngest of nine children in Eufala, Okla., Lee Roy and his wife, Claybra, have three children of their own, and they are quickly becoming USF's "First Family".

In addition to Selmon's position at USF, his wife, Claybra, is employed as a nurse in the USF Health Services Department. Their children, Brandy, Lee Roy, Jr., and Christopher have all attended USF.

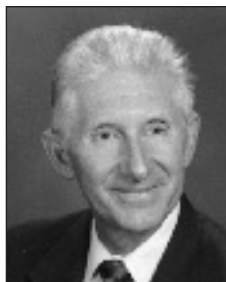

The BIG EAST Conference moves into 2005-06 with an emphasis on the word "Big" as the league becomes the largest Division I-A conference in the nation with 16 outstanding academic and athletic institutions. The goal of the BIG EAST has always been to compete at the highest level and to do so with integrity and sportsmanship.

In 2005-06, the league welcomes five new members: University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top 33 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh,

Hartford, Milwaukee and Cincinnati. With the incoming members, the BIG EAST markets will contain almost one fourth of all television households in the U.S.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 25 national championships in six different sports and 123 student-athletes have won individual national titles. Last year, Providence's Kim Smith won the NCAA women's country championship. The Notre Dame women's soccer team took the 2004 national title.

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. More than 300 student-athletes have earned Academic All-America honors.

In 2003-04, three BIG EAST student-athletes were named the national scholar-athletes of the year in their respective sports - Connecticut's Emeka Okafor in men's basketball, Notre Dame's Vanessa Pruzinsky in women's soccer and St. John's Chris Wingert in men's soccer.

BIG EAST student-athletes also have continued their success after leaving the classrooms and playing fields. Former Connecticut women's basketball standout Dr. Leigh Curl was inducted into the Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 1999. Former Georgetown men's basketball star Dikembe Mutombo was named a winner of the President's Service Award, the highest honor in the U.S. for volunteer service.

The BIG EAST continues to thrive in the basketball arena. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA titles in the same season. With the Syracuse men and the UConn women grabbing NCAA crowns the previous year, the BIG EAST also became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in consecutive seasons. In fact, the BIG EAST has won five of the last six women's basketball crowns and three of the last seven men's titles.

Whether it's the student-athletes or the league as a whole, moving proactively has been a consistent strategy for the conference that was formed in 1979. The Big East has continually turned challenges into opportunities to bolster its strength.

In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse to its growing list of sports. The inaugural women's golf championship was held in the spring of 2003.

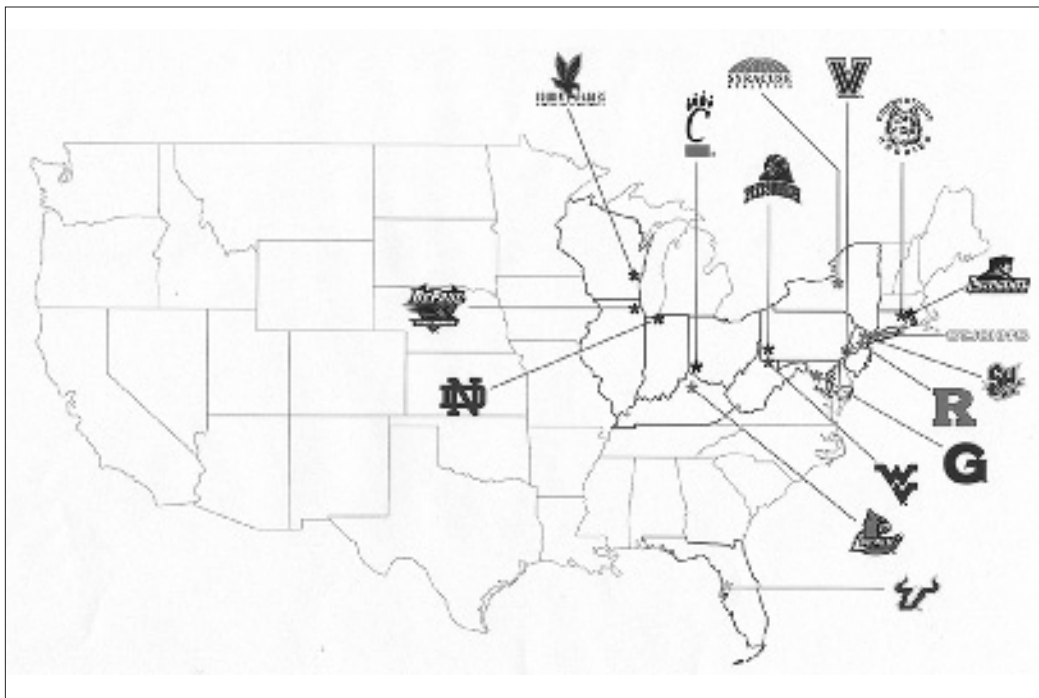

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. The BIG EAST Conference has enjoyed a leadership role nationally. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably show a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization needs outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Dave Gavitt, moved into the Commissioner's chair in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed long-standing



relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC. While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant at BIG EAST soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

More than 500 BIG EAST athletes have earned All America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams. Several athletes earned gold

medals in each of the last five summer Olympiads.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administrators to more than 5,500 athletes in 23 sports.

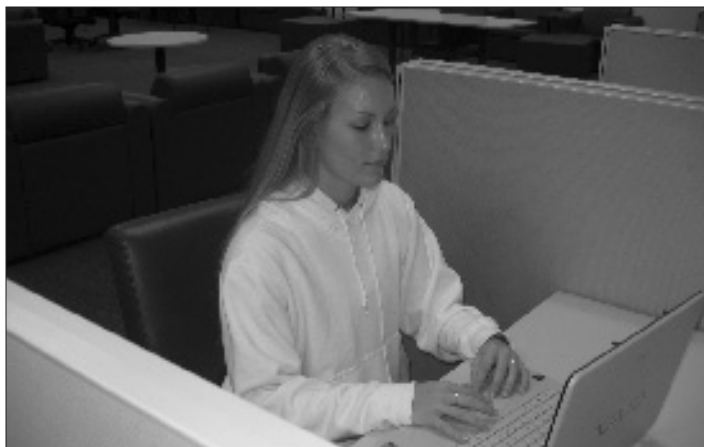

If anyone doubts USF's emphasis on "student" in the term "student-athlete," we offer an invitation to tour the sparkling Academic Enrichment Center. Located on the second floor of the USF Athletics Training Center, the 8,000-square-foot area is in many respects the crown jewel of USF's new athletic home.

USF student-athletes have annually been at or very near the top of their Conference USA peers in terms of team GPA, scholar-athlete awards and post-graduate scholarship awards. Today, the accomplishments of USF student-athletes of the past -- and the promise of future success --



- are embodied in the state-of-the-art facility.

The Academic Enrichment Center is designed to provide the academic support and the learning environment so that each student-athlete



has the opportunity to reach their goals. It is the home of comprehensive services including advising, tutoring and counseling, available to all USF student-athletes.

It has been USF's association with Conference USA for the past 10 seasons, and now its association with the BIG EAST Conference starting in 2005, that has provided motivation -- and competition - for academic success.

The 2004-05 academic year was a typical one for USF student-athletes. USF placed 171 student-athletes on the 2004-05 C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll (3.0 GPA or better), second among C-USA's 14 members and just two from the leader, Cincinnati. Twenty-five USF student-athletes, the fifth-most among league schools, earned the C-USA Commissioner's Academic Medal (3.75 GPA or better). Goalkeeper Dane Brenner and defender Chris Raye each earned the Commissioner's Academic Medal last season. In 2005, USF softball player Tiffany Stewart and women's cross country athlete Christa Benton were named the recipients of the 2004-05 Scholar Athlete of the

Dr. Jo-Ann Nester Assoc. Director of Athletics - Academics

Dr. Jo-Ann Nester begins her first year at the University of South Florida as associate director of athletics for academics. Dr. Nester comes to USF after serving as the sitting director of athletics at the University of San Diego.

Dr. Nester holds an Ed.D Doctor of Education with a concentration in sports administration from Temple University and enjoys expansive involvement in academics, both as a teacher and administrator.

She has been at San Diego since July 2002, first as associate director of athletics and senior women's administrator. Dr. Nester was then elevated to interim director of athletics in July 2003 and assumed that role permanently in September 2003.

Prior to arriving at San Diego, Dr. Nester was associate director of athletics for compliance and student services at Dartmouth College between 1993-02. In addition to managing all aspects of compliance and student services, Dr. Nester supervised nine varsity sports and the promotions

and marketing department. She had been the promotions and marketing director as well prior to hiring an assistant athletics director for that area.

Dr. Nester is also a past director of athletics and recreation at Saint Mary's College in Notre Dame, IN, where she also served as chair of the department of physical education. She held those roles at Saint Mary's from 1984-93, while she was also head tennis coach (1985-93) and head basketball coach (1991-93). Dr. Nester also completed the executive program with the Sports Management Institute - a prestigious co-operative between Notre Dame, Southern California and North Carolina - while she was at St. Mary's.

Between 1972 and 1985, Dr. Nester worked as a coach and teacher at three high schools and as an assistant professor and basketball coach at Hollins College (1980-82) and Glassboro State (1979-80).

Dr. Nester holds master's degree from West Chester State College (1976) and a bachelor's degree in health and physical education, also from West Chester State (1971).

Year Award in their respective sports and Raye was named a Post-Graduate Scholarship recipient. Raye also became the second player in USF men's soccer history to Academic All-America honors (Steinar Kvittf, first team in 1993).

The opening in June 2004 of the Academic Enrichment Center ensures continued success. The Center includes a computer lab, a study lounge, six tutorial rooms, a distance learning room and five staff offices. The computer lab and study lounge generate most of the attention from USF student-athletes, probably because they played a large role in the development of the facility.

The tutoring rooms provide Academic Services' staff the ability to meet with students in a comfortable, private environment for the first time. The distance learning room is one of the facility's unique features where students can check out a laptop, utilize a room specifically designed for distance learning classes, participate in their Internet classes or do their schoolwork on the Internet.

Accessibility to the Academic Enrichment Center for USF student-athletes may be as crucial to its success as much as the resources inside, as all the features provided for student-athletes are located centrally in one facility, along with other key staff of the USF Athletic Department.

Through the Athletics Training Center, USF and its donors have invested in the future success of the student-athletes that represent the school on the athletic field. The Academic Enrichment Center is evidence that USF takes as much pride in the academic achievements of its student-athletes.

USF Academic Facts

- ◆ Since USF joined Conference USA in 1995, 22 student-athletes have been named Scholar-Athlete of the Year in their respective sport. This includes a school-record five Scholar-Athletes of the Year in 1998-99 and USF has had at least two such award winners in eight of its 10 seasons in the league. Tiffany Stewart (Softball) and Christa Benton (Cross Country) won this award in 2005.

- ◆ In that same 10-year span in Conference USA, eight USF student-athletes have earned C-USA Post-Graduate Scholarships, including USF men's soccer player Chris Raye in 2005.

- ◆ Between 1995 and 2003, 10 USF teams won a C-USA Sports Academic Award, which goes to the team with the highest grade point average in each respective conference sport. Men's soccer and men's basketball received this award for the 2003-04 school year. In 2001-02, USF won four such team awards.

- ◆ Conference USA awards a Commissioner's Academic Medal to all league student-athletes who achieve a 3.75 or higher grade point average for an entire school year. In USF's 10 seasons in C-USA, 224 student-athletes have earned this honor, including 25 in 2004-05.

- ◆ In 2004-05, 171 student-athletes compiled a grade point average of at least 3.0, which was second in C-USA and only two shy of Cincinnati who placed 173 student-athletes on the list. USF has had as many as 176 student-athletes achieve that level in any given academic year. Since 1995-96, USF's academic services program has paid huge dividends as the members of the 3.0 Club have increased from 42 in 1995-96 to 164 in 2003-04.

- ◆ Fifteen USF student-athletes have been named an Academic All-American since 1985. Most recently was USF softball player Tiffany Stewart and men's soccer player Chris Raye who received this honor in 2005.

The health of every student-athlete at the University of South Florida is the primary concern of the USF Sports Medicine Staff, a group that covers every facet of the health care spectrum.

Assistant Athletic Director Steve Walz has been with USF Sports Medicine in several different capacities since 1992. He returned to USF most recently in 2000 after working as the Sports Medicine Director at Shawnee Mission Medical Center in Kansas City, Kan. Walz was the first-ever football athletic trainer for USF from 1996-98.

Walz oversees all aspects of the sports medicine program while serving as the primary athletic trainer for USF football.

A 1992 graduate from the University of Missouri, Walz also holds a Master's degree from USF, which he obtained in 1994 when he was the men's basketball athletic trainer for two seasons. Following the 1993-94 basketball season, he accepted a position with the Florida Orthopedic Institute, where the USF student-athletes received care and underwent injury rehabilitation. During his stint at FOI, Walz also served as Head Athletic Trainer for the Tampa Bay Storm of the Arena Football League during their 1996 World Championship season.

Walz was elected to the Athletic Trainers Association of Florida Executive Board in January 2003 as the West Coast Representative. Walz was awarded Outstanding USF Staff Member in 2005.

Walz and his wife, Shelley, have a three-year-old son, Henry.



Kyle Creasy
Softball Trainer

Kyle Creasy is in his first year with the USF Sports Medicine Department as a graduate assistant, serving as the athletic trainer for the softball team. Creasy also serves as a clinical instructor for the undergraduate athletic training program.

Creasy came to USF from Eastern Michigan University, where he served as an athletic training student from 2002 to 2005. Working with many of the varsity sports, he spent his senior year working with the women's soccer team.

In the spring of 2005, Creasy served as an athletic training intern with the Plymouth Whalers, a Junior "A" hockey team within the Ontario Hockey League. Creasy spent the second part of the season with the team as well, working with the Whalers during their playoff appearance.

Creasy graduated from Eastern Michigan in April 2005 with a bachelor's degree in sports medicine-athletic training.

The Sports Medicine Staff is comprised of seven graduate assistant certified athletic trainers, which complementing Head Athletic Trainer Walz, and Assistant Athletic Trainers Robb Duncanson and Lisa Osterbrock.



The USF Sports Medicine Department is privileged to be affiliated with the very best physicians in the Tampa Bay area. USF student-athletes benefit from the close proximity, both in relationship and geography, with the Florida Orthopedic Institute. Drs. David Leffers, Seth Gasser, Scott Welsh and Adam Morse serve as the teams' Orthopedic Surgeons. Larry Collins (PA-C, ATC/L), a physician assistant and certified athletic trainer, also assists the staff.

USF Sports Medicine also has a close relationship with the USF Medical School and is privileged to have several faculty members serve as team physicians. Their on-campus location helps USF Sports Medicine provide fast and comprehensive medical care.

Drs. Eric Coris and Arnold Ramirez serve USF student-athletes as team physicians with an emphasis on sports medicine, and they are assisted by Dave Kotun, PA-C.

The University of South Florida Sports Medicine Department is housed in both the Sun Dome, and in the brand new Intercollegiate Athletic Facility. This new facility of over 5,200 square feet is equipped with the latest tools and technology. The department also works closely with the USF Athletic Training Education Program and provides clinical experiences for athletic training students.





It is the mission of the USF strength and conditioning program to maximize the genetic potential in every component of athleticism and decrease the potential for injury in a manner that is safe and intense for each student-athlete.

In this regard, yearlong strength and conditioning programs at USF are designed specific to each student-athlete. Each program is tailored to be sport and position-specific by assessing the muscular and metabolic demands of the respective sport. Programs are evaluated and monitored continuously and adjusted as necessary to reach optimal gains.

With the new intercollegiate athletic facility - opened in June of 2004 - USF's student-athletes have a state-of-the-art 10,900 square foot strength room to meet their conditioning needs. The spacious facility has been designed to provide student-athletes with everything they need to succeed, including Mondo Sport impact flooring, Power Lift combo racks, Iron Grip custom urethane plates and dumbbells, Useaka bumper plates and bars, cardio equipment, mirrors, and a state-of-the-art stereo system with 40 speakers.

Specific to softball, each player is trained to maximize on-field performance. Strength and power training, speed development, lateral speed and agility, anaerobic conditioning and flexibility are all considered when designing a players program. The strength and conditioning staff also strives to educate the student-athletes on nutrition, dietary supplements and related issues.

The strength and conditioning program is administered by USF associate director of athletics Barry Clements and operated day-to-day by head strength coach Ronnie McKeefery, who manages a staff of four additional strength coaches. Together they are responsible for designing and implementing strength and conditioning programs for the student-athletes.

McKeefery is in his sixth season at USF. A former all-conference defensive back at Ottawa University in Ottawa, Kan., he earned bachelor's degrees from that school in biology and physical education in 1997 while also being named a two-time Academic All-American. In addition, he earned his

master's degree in education from the University of South Florida in 2004.

After one year as coach at Ottawa, he made the switch to strength and conditioning, working first as an intern with the Kansas City Royals. He then worked as a part-time assistant for two years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers before becoming the head strength coach for the Berlin Thunder in NFL Europe.

McKeefery joined the USF program prior to the 2000 football season. He is a member of National Strength & Conditioning Association (NSCA) Certified Strength & Conditioning Specialist, the Collegiate Strength & Conditioning Coaches Association (CSCCA) Strength & Conditioning Coach Certified, and is certified with the United States Weightlifting Federation (USAW).

Also part of the strength and conditioning team is Travis Larimore, Graham Anderson and Keith Short. Larimore and Anderson work with the football team, while Short works with Spak on USF's Olympic Sport programs.

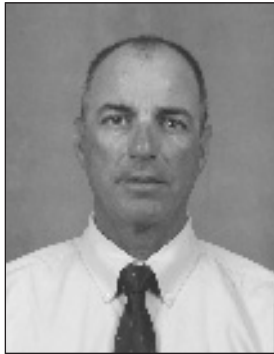

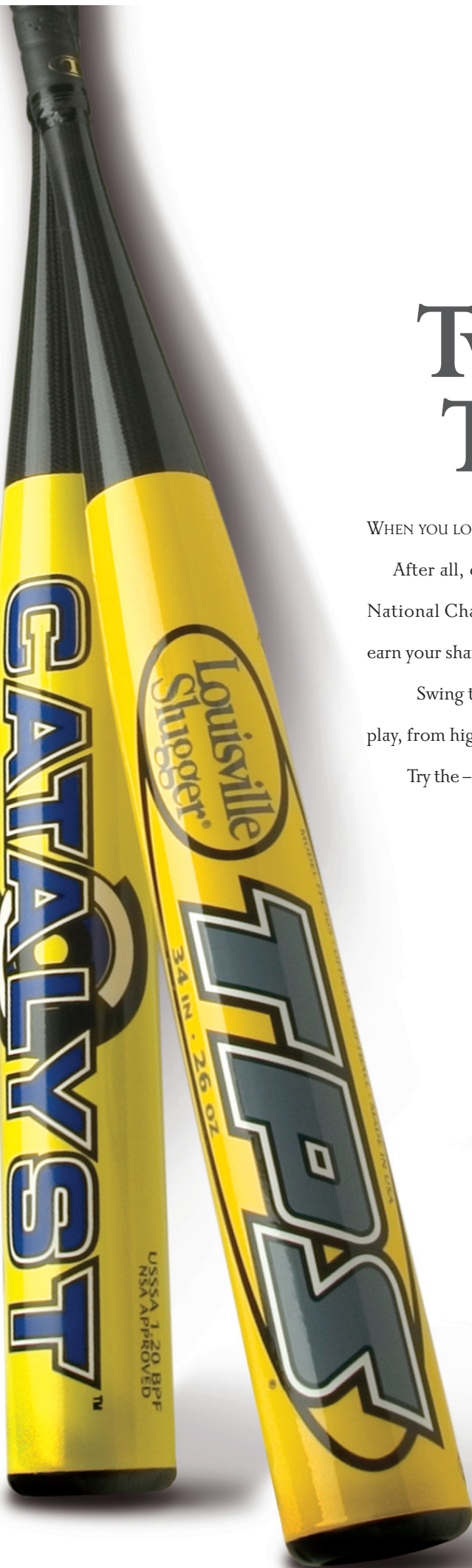
