

### USF Bulls (II-IO, 2-5 BIG EAST) vs. Marquette Golden Eagles (I8-4, 5-2 BIG EAST)

The University of South Florida men's basketball team continues its three-game BIG EAST homestand versus No. 15 Marquette Sunday afternoon. Game time at the Sun Dome is set for 2 p.m. Television coverage isn't scheduled, but the game can be viewed live on GoUSFBulls.com. Sunday's matchup with Marquette marks the first between the two programs as members of the BIG EAST conference. The Golden Eagles own a 12-2 all-time series lead, with a majority of those meetings coming in Conference USA action. The Bulls last defeated MU during 1988-99 campaign.

#### BULLS POST RECORD-SETTING LEAGUE VICTORY

USF's 62-40 BIG EAST victory over Rutgers Wednesday night was important for a number of reasons.

**USF'S LAST TIME OUT**: The Bulls picked up their second league victory with a 62-40 win over Rutgers. Four Bulls finished with double figures in points, led by Kentrell Gransberry's 13.

**MU'S LAST TIME OUT**: Marquette's fifth-straight win came with an 89-76 decision over Seton Hall. Four players reached double figures and the Golden Eagles shot 57.9 percent from the floor.

The win kept USF in the race for one of the 12 positions in the league tournament and with victories over the Scarlet Knights and Cincinnati, USF would hold the tiebreaker over both programs, should the final standings remain as closely contested as they are right now.

The team's defensive effort held Rutgers to just 27.6 percent (16-of-58) from the field, the fifth-lowest by a USF opponent in school history. That mark included a 1-of-17 (5.9 percent) effort by the Scarlet Knights from behind the 3-point line.

#### VERDEJO JUMP STARTS OFFENSE AGAINST RUTGERS

After coming off the bench in each of his previous two appearances, sophomore guard Jesus Verdejo returned to the starting lineup against Rutgers.

The Arizona transfer provided an early offensive spark for the Bulls, netting all of his 10 points in the opening 16 minutes of the game. He finished 4-of-6 from the field and 2-of-3 from long distance. He also chipped in three assists, three steals and two rebounds in 25 minutes of action.

#### SUN DOME A WELCOME SIGHT FOR USF

USF's current three-game homestand will allow the Bulls to remain in Tampa for nearly three weeks and more importantly keep the squad from traveling to nationally ranked foes.

Three of the first four conference

Three of the first four conference road outings (No. 14 Connecticut, No. 10 Pittsburgh and No. 20 Notre Dame) came against opponents ranked in the top-25 at the time of the matchup. The fourth came at West Virginia, which dropped out of the rankings just two days prior to the game.

Of the four road contests to date in BIG EAST action, only Notre Dame fea-

tured a destination the Bulls had visited in 2005-06. USF played UConn and West Virginia at home and didn't face PITT at all last year.

#### SIZING UP THE RACE IN THE BIG EAST

As the midway point of the 2006-07 BIG EAST schedule rapidly approaches, the only thing for certain is that many questions will be left to be answered in the closing days of the regular season.

As of Jan. 26, nine of the 16 conference programs own three-or-fewer league victories and only preseason favorite Pittsburgh has managed to collect six wins.

The Bulls hope to finish among the top 12 programs in the regular season and earn their first-ever bid to the conference tournament at Madison Square Garden.

#### BOZEMAN RECEIVES RUDE INTRODUCTION TO BIG EAST

After displaying the ability to contribute offensively on a consistent basis during the non-conference portion of the schedule, freshman Solomon Bozeman has found the transition tougher in BIG EAST action.

In USF's 14 non-league contests, Bozeman reached double figures in 10 outings. He averaged 14.0 points, 4.6 assists and 3.3 rebounds per game while shooting over 38 percent from the floor.

In seven conference games to date, the rookie guard has netted 10-ormore points in a single outing just once. He is chipping in just 5.1 points, 3.9 assists and 2.3 boards per night, while shooting 28.6 percent from the floor overall and 21.1 percent from long distance.

#### STARTERS RESPONSIBLE FOR SCORING LOAD

Injuries have played a key role in depleting the depth of the USF roster, making it difficult for the Bull coaching staff to get any type of consistent offensive production from the team's reserves.

Through 21 games this season, USF is averaging just 8.3 points per game off the bench and has collected a total of just 30 points (10 points by Verdejo at WVU) from its non-starters in the first seven BIG EAST contests of the campaign.

The starting five is currently producing 94.0 percent of USF's 57.9 points-per-game in conference matchups.

If you exclude the matchup with Norfolk St., when Kentrell Gransberry and Jesus Verdejo came off the bench in their respective USF debuts, Bull reserves are contributing just 5.7 points per game.

#### **GRANSBERRY MUST WAIT TO RANK AMONG BEST**

In the latest BIG EAST statistics, junior center Kentrell Gransberry's scoring (14.9 ppg.), rebounding (10.8 rpg.) and field goal percentage (.693) are all good enough to rank among the league's best.

Unfortunately for the mid-year transfer, a player must see action in 75 percent of his team's games to qualify for the national standards. Gransberry has played in 14 games since becoming eligible and should he play in each of the squad's remaining outings, he would suddenly show up in the rankings following the Feb. 24 matchup at DePaul.

In league games only, Gransberry does rank among the conference's best in scoring (8th, 16.1 ppg.), rebounding (2nd, 9.9 prg.), field goal percentage (10th, .558), offensive rebounds (1st, 4.43 orpg.) and defensive rebounds (8th, 5.43 drpg.).

#### LOVETT GETS A CASE OF SENIORITIS

Walk on Eddie Lovett, who joined the team last season, is on track to graduate this spring. His desire to complete his athletic eligibility, however, led him to pick up a second major. His senior season with the Bulls will now come in 2007-08.

#### MATTIS HOLDING BLOCK PARTY ON A NIGHTLY BASIS

Just 50 games into his USF career, senior forward McHugh Mattis can already find his name on the program's career block list.

At just 6-6, 190, Mattis is not the prototypical shot blocker. He swats a majority of his shots while helping out on a teammate's man or closing out on the perimeter.

Mattis is averaging 3.9 blocks per game this season to rank first in the BIG EAST and fourth in the nation through games of Jan. 21.

His 62 blocks last year was the

seventh-best single-season mark at USF and he has already surpassed that mark in 2006-07.

Mattis has stopped 144 opposing shot attempts already and has a realistic shot to move into USF's top three before his career concludes.

#### Robert McCullum



**Fourth Season** 39-68 (USF) 83-114 (Overall)



The 2006-07 USF men's basketball campaign will mark the fourth under the direction of head coach Robert McCullum.

While McCullum's brief tenure thus far at USF has included just three seasons, the program has already encountered a pair of significant markers since his arrival.

The first came with McCullum's hiring in the spring of 2003 as he began to put his stamp on USF's product and the second came with the team's debut in arguably the toughest conference in the nation in 2005-06, the BIG EAST.

In a 2005-06 season characterized by adversity and competitive play, the year was capped by a victory over nationally ranked Georgetown in the season finale. The Hoyas became the third squad ranked among the top-25 in the nation to be defeated by a Robert McCullum coached team at USF, more wins than any other coach in program history.

For the third-straight season at least one USF player was tabbed to the all-conference squad as senior Solomon Jones (Honorable Mention All-BIG EAST) developed into one of the league's top big men.

Numerous players (20-to-30) have improved their skills enough under McCullum to earn positions on professional rosters around the world, from the National Basketball Association to the European leagues.

The Bulls doubled their win total in 2004-05 from his inaugural campaign (2003-04) in Tampa, highlighted by a record-setting run at the 2005 Kelly Tires C-USA Tournament. USF advanced to the tourney semifinals for the first time in program history, knocking off a pair of higher-seeded squads in the process.

The McCullum era at USF officially began April 18, 2003, when he was introduced as the program's eighth head basketball coach.

#### MATTIS NOT SATISFIED WITH DOUBLE EFFORT

In possession of five double-doubles this season, senior forward McHugh Mattis reached new heights in the victory over Winston-Salem State on Dec. 7.

The North Lauderdale, Fla., native collected the second triple-double in program history against the Rams, finishing with 22 points, 10 rebounds and 10 blocks in 40 minutes of action. He was 8-of-8 from the floor.

The only triple-double by a USF player previously came Dec. 4, 1996. Adrian Hillman posted 13 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists in a 76-68 victory over the Owls.

#### TRIPLE-DOUBLE NOT THE ONLY ACCOMPLISHMENT

McHugh Mattis' triple-double included several related marks also worthy of recognition.

His 10 blocks marked the second-best single-game total in program history and he matched his own record for field goal percentage (1.000) with a perfect 8-of-8 night. Mattis was 10-of-10 from the floor versus lowa State as a junior. He has now finished three games in his career without missing shot after attempting at least seven field goals.

Jones, a 6-4, 205-pound guard, will arrive on campus this summer and have four seasons of eligibility with the Bulls.




#### HOLMES TRANSFERS TO USF: ELIGIBLE NEXT WINTER


USF has added one of the most decorated prep players to ever play basketball in the greater Tampa area with the transfer of Aaron Holmes from Florida State.

The University of South Florida Bulls shot 63.6 from the field in the second half of the season opener to defeat the University at Buffalo Bulls 77-61 Monday night in the Sun Dome.

USF senior forward Melvin Buckley scored a career-high 29 points, grabbed eight rebounds and made five steals in the non-conference match-up while freshman guard Solomon Bozeman added 23 points and five assists in his first-career game as a Bull.

Buckley and senior forward McHugh Mattis scored the Bulls' first 13 points of the contest – including a 3-point play and a trey from Buckley – on their way to a 3-point, 31-28, halftime lead.

Buckley ended the first half with 17 points, including two long range shots and a 7-of-10 performance from the charity stripe.

Within the first four minutes of the second half, USF took an early seven-point lead, but Buffalo chipped away at the score, bringing the game within three points following a three by sophomore Eric Moore.

In the final five minutes, USF extended the lead by as many as 18 points due to two long-range conversions from Buckley and one from Bozeman.

USF shot just 31.8 percent from the field in the first half, but came out of the locker room gunning, making 63.6 of its attempts after the break. The Bulls from Tampa also hit 62.5 percent from behind the arc, making 8-of-17.

USF hit 27-38 free throws while Buffalo made 13 of their 30 attempts in game with 42 fouls, 26 from Buffalo.

#### South Carolina State 69 USF 82

Senior forward McHugh Mattis recorded his eighth-career double-double, ripping 12 boards and scoring 18 points while blocking a career-high seven shots in the University of South Florida's 82-69 victory over South Carolina State.

In the first half of the non-conference match-up, USF hit 47.8 percent (11-23) of its field goals and converted 13-of-17 (76.5 percent) from the charity stripe, while SCSU shot 40.5 (15-37) from the field and missed its only free throw attempt.

Mattis blocked three Bulldog shot attempts, while scoring eight points and grabbing seven boards in the first period. Senior guard Melvin Buckley and freshman guard Adamu Saaka added seven points apiece to USF's first-half one-point lead.

Immediately after the half, the Bulldogs hit a jumper to take a 38-37 lead, but a matching field goal from senior forward Melvin Buckley at the 19-minute mark put the Bulls up for good.

Following an 11-2 USF run, SCSU brought the game within five points halfway through the final period before USF again extended the lead, this time to 14 points, with six minutes remaining.

Buckley ended the night with 18 points while freshman guard Solomon Bozeman collected nine assists and six points.

Senior guard Chris Capko recorded his first-career 3-pointer just two minutes into the contest and added a second with eight minutes remaining in the game. Capko tied his career-high scoring effort of 10 points while dishing four assists.

In his USF debut, Saaka scored 12 points and had four assists. Saaka's first possession of the ball resulted in an assist to a Mattis 3-point play.

#### FIU 50 USF 79

After hitting 12 of their first 13 field goals, the University of South Florida (3-0) men's basketball team downed Florida International (2-3) 79-50.

The Golden Panthers were first to put numbers on the scoreboard, but would never lead again in the game due to the Bulls' 70.8 shooting percentage in the first half (17-of-24).

USF took a 16-point lead into the intermission, by a score of 43-27.

USF senior forward McHugh Mattis was a perfect 7-of-7 from the field and hit 4-of-4 at the line to score 18 points in the first half, and finished the game with 22 points, hitting 9-of-11 from the field.

Along with Mattis, seniors Melvin Buckley and Melvyn Richardson each scored in double-digits in the first half with 10 apiece. Richardson was a perfect 5-of-5 from the field and Buckley hit two of his four treys.

In the second half, USF dominated FIU, outscoring the Panthers 40-20 in the paint and 19-10 off of turnovers, and grabbing seven more rebounds (28-12).

Mattis recorded his ninth-career double-double, his second in as many games, with 14 rebounds (10 offensive) and 22 points added to his five blocks, three assists and three steals.

Buckley, the BIG EAST Player of the Week (Nov. 19), finished the game with 15 points while Richardson's 15 points were a career-high. Richardson was one rebound short of his first career double-double.

# Stetson 72 USF 20T - 77

USF forward Melvin Buckley scored 29 points and grabbed 12 rebounds in the Bulls' 77-72 double-overtime victory over Stetson Monday night at the Sun Dome.

Buckley opened the contest with 11 of USF's first 15 points, including three treys. Freshman guard Amu Saaka scored six of the Bulls' next eight points as USF took the 23-15 lead with 9:24 remaining in the first half

A 14-6 run by Stetson over the next nine minutes knotted the game at 29 going into the locker rooms for halftime.

After the five-minute mark, McHugh Mattis forced a turnover, which led to a three by Buckley, his fifth of the night, narrowing the Stetson lead to just one field goal.

Buckley's layup at 1:40 tied the game, but the Hatters quickly answered with a two-point bucket of their own. With 16 seconds remaining, freshman guard Solomon Bozeman toed up to the line, hitting both free shots to tie the game at 59.

A missed 15-foot jumper by Stetson with one second remaining in regulation sent the game into overtime.

Down by four halfway through the extra period, Buckley stole a Stetson inbounds pass then assisted a Mattis layup to bring the score within two, 64-66. Mattis then tied the game at 66 apiece with 30 seconds remaining, forcing the contest into double-overtime.

With 51 seconds left in the second extra period, Saaka converted a layup to put the Bulls up by four, but the Hatters answered with two free throws. In the end, Bozeman hit 3-of-4 from the charity stripe to secure the 77-72 USF victory.

USF hit 17-of-21 free throws in the final 15 minutes of the game.

In the final contest of the University of South Florida's five-game homestand, the men's basketball team lost 56-46 to the Richmond Spiders.

The Bulls dropped to 4-1 on the season while the Spiders left Tampa with a 4-3 record.

The Bulls battled back, bringing the score within three, 41-38, with five minutes remaining, but two long range buckets from the Spiders in the next two minutes put the game out of reach for USF.

In the second half USF improved its shooting percentage, hitting 10-25 shots (40 percent) and won the battle of the boards with the Spiders, ending the game with an eight-rebound advantage.

Mattis recorded his third double-double of the year and 10th of his career with his 21-point, 10-rebound outing. Freshman guard Solomon Bozeman added 11 points and six assists.

### WSSU 43 USF 63

Senior forward McHugh Mattis collected the program's second triple-double in school history, helping the University of South Florida men's basketball team (5-1) pull away for a 63-43 non-conference road victory at Winston-Salem State (1-11).

The North Lauderdale, Fla., native completed the evening with 22 points, 10 rebounds and 10 blocks in 40 minutes of action. He was 8-of-8 from the floor and also created three steals. His 10 blocks is the second-best single-game total in school history and his perfect night from the floor matches a school record he shares with two others.

The Bulls trailed 22-21 at the intermission after turning the ball over 14 times in the first half and shooting just 44 percent from the floor (8-of-18) and free throw line (4-of-9).

The Rams moved ahead 29-23 early in the second half, but a thunderous dunk by Mattis that shook the 3,200-seat arena started a turnaround for USF. Mattis netted nine points during a 21-4 run over the course of the next eight minutes, turning a four-point deficit into a 13-point advantage.

With leading scorer Melvin Buckley struggling from the field for the second-straight game, USF received valuable contributions from freshman Solomon Bozeman and senior walk-on Eddie Lovett. Bozeman finished with 17 points and six rebounds and Lovett scored five points in a career-high 22 minutes. Lovett's efforts included his first career 3-pointer.

The Bulls shot 61.1 percent (11-of-18) from the field in the second half, while WSSU connected on just 7-of-22 (31.4 percent) of its opportunities.

# EAST CAROLINA USF

The University of South Florida men's basketball team (6-1) used a balanced scoring attack to post a 65-52 non-conference road victory against East Carolina (4-4) Saturday night.

Every USF player to see extended minutes contributed at least two points, led by senior Melvin Buckley's 20 points. Freshman Solomon Bozeman also chipped in 16 points, five rebounds and three assists in the win.

The Bulls dominated the boards at both ends of the court, finishing with a 51-28 advantage overall and a 15-7 margin at the offensive end. Senior McHugh Mattis topped the roster with 14 boards and sophomore Aris Williams chipped in nine points and 10 rebounds in his first career start.

The two teams traded the lead early in the first half, but it was the Bulls who held a 28-23 advantage at the intermission. The Pirates shot just 29.0 percent from the field in the opening frame, but 11 USF turnovers led to 13 ECU points to keep the Bulls from extending the lead even further.

USF cut down its turnovers in the second half, with just four following the break, and as a result the Bulls moved ahead by as many as 11 points midway through the period. ECU had one last run left, cutting the gap to 43-39 with 11:06 left. A trey by Buckley, however, pushed the advantage back to seven points and the Pirates would get no closer than five points the rest of the way.

Free throw shooting down the stretch proved to be the difference. USF concluded the night 18-of-24 (75 percent) from the line, thanks to a 10-of-10 performance by Bozeman.

### Norfolk St. 56 USF 87

Kentrell Gransberry had a game-high 24 points and 11 rebounds and Jesus Verdejo added 20 points as the USF men's basketball team beat Norfolk State 87-56 Sunday night in the opening game of the Duel In The Desert, hosted by UNLV.

Gransberry and Verdejo, mid-year transfers last season from LSU and Arizona, were both making their respective USF debuts.

Verdejo, a sophomore guard, hit his first five shots in helping USF jump out to an early double-digit lead. His 3-pointer with 9:38 to play in the first half capped a 19-6 run and gave the Bulls (7-1) a 24-11 advantage.

Gransberry opened strong with 11 first-half points and had a double-double with 10:59 to play.

South Florida's Melvin Buckley added 15 points and Solomon Bozeman added 13 points.

Norfolk State (1-6) scored the first points of the game, but Buckley hit a 3-pointer and USF led the rest of the way.

Calvin Brown had a team-high 23 points for the Spartans, and Corey Lyons added nine.

### Wake Forest USF

Kentrell Gransberry made three clutch free throws in the final minute to finish with 17 points and 15 rebounds Friday night, helping USF snap a four-game losing streak with a 75-67 victory over Wake Forest.

Jesus Verdejo, Solomon Bozeman and Melvin Buckley scored 15 apiece for the Bulls (8-5), who surpassed their win total for last season despite squandering most of a 16-point second-half lead and only scoring once from the field in the last three minutes.

Wake Forest (7-5), which shot 37 percent and misfired on 19 of 23 attempts from 3-point range, methodically trimmed the deficit to 70-67 on Jamie Skeen's 3-pointer with 37.7 seconds to go.

Verdejo's layup, off a pass from Gransberry, gave South Florida some breathing room, and the Bulls made three of four free throws the rest of the way to put the game away.

Kyle Visser led the Demon Deacons with a career-high 27 points and 14 rebounds. Freshman Ishmael Smith had 12 points and 11 assists.

USF took advantage of Buckley's hot hand and poor shooting by Wake Forest to build a 35-21 halftime lead, with Buckley scoring 11 before the break and the Bulls using an 18-3 run to pull away.

L.D. Williams trimmed Wake's deficit to 47-40 with a three-point play with just over 12 minutes to go. A layup by the Deacons' freshman got his team within five before USF answered the 19-8 surge that carried Wake back into the game with a 9-0 spurt that restored the lead to double-digits.

#### Bethune-Cookman 49 USF 82

Freshman guard Solomon Bozeman scored a career-high 24 points as the University of South florida men's basketball team beat Bethune-Cookman 82-49 on Sunday.

Melvin Buckley added 13 points for USF (9-5), which opens Big East Conference play Tuesday at No. 12 Connecticut.

Bethune-Cookman (2-8), which has lost seven straight games, got 10 points from Dewayne Pettus. Jimmy Hudson, who entered averaging a team-best 14.9 points, was held to eight points.

Bozeman had a four-point play to put USF up 32-13 with 7:42 left in the first half. He was fouled while making a 3-point jumper and then made the ensuing free throw.

USF went ahead 65-38 with 9:17 to play after Bozeman hit four consecutive free throws after Bethune-Cookman coach Cliff Reed was given two technical fouls and ejected for arguing with the referees.

Bozeman went 4-for-5, all from 3-point range, from the field. He also made 12 of 13 free throws.

Jeff Adrien and Jerome Dyson both scored 16 points and No. 18 Connecticut bounced back from its first loss of the season with a 69-50 victory over USF on Tuesday night.

UConn (12-1, 1-1 Big East), which lost at West Virginia on Saturday, led by 14 points at halftime and scored the first 11 points of the second half.

USF (9-6, 0-1) didn't make a field goal in the second half until Melvin Buckley hit a 3-pointer with 14:25 left that made it 50-28.

Buckley led the Bulls with 17 points.

UConn went up 57-32 when 7-foot-3 freshman Hasheem Thabeet blocked a shot that sparked a fast break that ended when A.J. Price found Stanley Robinson for a two-handed slam.

UConn went underneath early to Adrien, who had nine points and nine of his 15 rebounds in the first half. But the Huskies began pulling away after going to a three-guard lineup.

Freshman guard Doug Wiggins came off the bench with UConn leading 8-7 five minutes into the game and immediately hit a 3-pointer and then a jumper. He was 4-of-6 from the field in the half, scoring all nine of his points.

Dyson and Craig Austrie both had two 3-pointers to help UConn take a 39-25 half-time lead.

Austrie also had nine points, and UConn's bench outscored USF's 22-0.

The Bulls shot 55 percent from the field in the first half, but hit just 35 percent over the final 20 minutes.

USF's McHugh Mattis, leading the conference in blocked shots, had five, while Thabeet had five for UConn.

### No. IO/IO Pittsburgh 69 USF 48

Pittsburgh overcame another ineffective game by star Aaron Gray, turning to a smaller unit to open an 11-point lead over USF in the first half and the No. 10 Panthers were never pushed after that in a 69-48 victory Sunday.

Junior center Kentrell Gransberry led the Bulls with 14 points and also grabbed nine rebounds. Sophomore Jesus Verdejo had 12 points and senior Melvin Buckley added 10 points in the second-straight loss to a nationally ranked opponent.

The 7-foot Gray, the Big East preseason player of the year, scored in single digits for the fourth game in a row -- he had seven points on 2-for-7 shooting in only 20 minutes. Also, 6-10 power forward Levon Kendall was held to five points by the smaller Bulls.

Pitt led 16-15 before going on a 10-0 run late in the first half with both Gray and Kendall on the bench. Antonio Graves hit a 3-pointer and scored on a driving layup and backup guard Ronald Ramon followed with a 3-pointer to make it 26-15.

The Panthers, playing the Bulls (9-7, 0-2) for the first time in the Big East, then limited USF to four points in the first 8½ minutes of the second half while opening a 42-26 lead. During that stretch, Sam Young made three free throws during an 8-0 run.

Pitt came into the game shooting 39 percent from 3-point range, only to make 10-of-16 (63 percent) with Levance Fields going 3-of-4 and Ramon 3-of-5. Fields was Pitt's only double-figure scorer with 11 points, but the balanced Panthers had seven players with seven or more points.

#### West Virginia USF

USF cut a double-digit second-half deficit to three points, but couldn't get any closer in a 69-58 BIG EAST loss at West Virginia Wednesday night.

Senior forward McHugh Mattis led a group of four Bulls in double figures, finishing with 18 points and 11 rebounds for the double-double. Classmate Melvin Buckley chipped in 17 points and junior Kentrell Gransberry contributed 11 points and nine rebounds in 25 foul-plagued minutes.

The Bulls fell behind 16-4 in the opening minutes as the Mountaineers came out clicking offensively from behind the 3-point line. WVU finished with eight trevs in the game, but only one came following intermission.

Trailing by 11 points at halftime, the Bulls began to close the gap in the opening minutes of the second stanza. USF used a 10-2 run to set the score at 43-40 with 13:20 on the clock, but would get no closer the rest of the way. WVU recorded an 8-1 run of its own to push the team comfortably ahead and it never looked back.

USF finished with a 39-33 advantage on the boards, but shot just 9-of-20 from the charity stripe. WVU was also able to turn Bull miscues into 16 points.

#### No. 20 Notre Dame 82 USF **58**

An extended first-half scoring drought proved to be the difference in an 82-58 loss by USF at No. 20 Notre Dame.

Senior Kentrell Gransberry led the way with his sixth double-double in 13 games. finishing with 23 points and 11 rebounds.

Senior forward McHugh Mattis chipped in 10 points, three rebounds and three blocks before fouling out with 12:14 left in the second half. The injury depleted Bulls entered the game with just eight scholarship players, which included Amu Saaka. Saaka attempted to play on the injured ankle that limited him to less than a minute at West Virginia, but couldn't give more than four minutes Sunday.

USF's offensive attack came out firing in the opening minutes of the first half. The Bulls led by as many as five points early before the wheels started to come off. Leading 24-23 with 8:32 left in the opening stanza, Notre Dame would close the half with a 19-2 run and owned a 42-26 advantage at the break.

The Bulls, who were well over 50 percent from the field in the first 10 minutes, finished 37.5 percent (9-of-24) from the floor and nine USF turnovers led to 10 Fighting Irish points.

USF made its final run in the opening moments of the second half. After falling behind by 19 points, the Bulls closed the gap to 48-38 with some strong work underneath by Gransberry. Trailing by 10 and in possession of the ball, USF turned it over just before the first media timeout. ND responded with a 3-point play and a trey on back-to-back possessions to end the momentum.

The Bulls concluded the game at 41.2 percent from the field.

#### Rutgers 40 USF 62

Junior center Kentrell Gransberry recorded his seventh double-double of the season in the University of South Florida men's basketball team's 62-40 BIG EAST victory over Rutgers Wednesday night at the Sun Dome.

Gransberry scored 13 points and had 13 rebounds in his 14th game of the season.

The Bulls (11-10, 2-5 BIG EAST) opened fire on the Scarlet Knights in the first half, hitting 15-24 from the field, a 62.5 percent clip, to take a 38-18 halftime lead.

USF also converted 5-of-8 from long range in the first half, with two bombs apiece from senior forward Melvin Buckley and sophomore guard Jesus Verdejo.

After the intermission Rutgers tried to make a run at the Bulls, but couldn't get any closer than 18 points, partly due to an eight-point second-half performance by freshman guard Chris Howard.

Howard was one of four Bulls to notch double-digit scoring, dropping 10 points along with dishing four assists and snatching two steals. Verdejo also registered 10 points, three assists and three steals, while Buckley added 11 points and eight rebounds.

The Bulls ended the game hitting 22-47 (46.8 percent) overall and 35.7 percent (5-14) from behind the 3-point line.

The 22-point victory snapped a twogame losing streak and marked the largest victory in the squad's short BIG EAST history. Rutgers' shooting percentage (27.6 percent) marked the lowest (fifth-lowest ever) by a USF opponent since Jacksonville connected on just 27.1 percent of its chances in 1996.






