### The Game

The University of South Florida (28-18) baseball team returns to Tampa for a non-conference three-game series with No. 24 Georgia Tech (27-17) May 5-7 at Red McEwen Field. The Bulls and Yellow Jackets meet at 6 p.m. on Saturday, and noon on Sunday and Monday.



On Saturday and Monday the games can be heard live on the USF Press Pass, with Jim Louk and Garrett Woolvard calling the play-by-play.

The Sunday game will be broadcast live on both Catch 47, the official cable partner of USF athletics, and on Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS). The broadcast will be re-aired on Catch 47 on Monday, May 7 at 9 p.m. Jim Louk will provide play-by-play on Sunday and former Major League Baseball All-Star Fred McGriff will be on hand as the color analyst.

games have been in Tampa, which was the Feb. 20-21 set in 1988. USF's only win was a 7-2 victory on March 11, 1989 in Atlanta.

### USF vs. Georgia Tech

USF is 28-18 overall this season following a 1-2 weekend with Louisville in Kentucky. The Bulls are batting .291 with 445 hits and 312 runs scored, driving in 279 RBI from 17 home runs, five triples and 68 doubles. USF pitchers own a 4.36 ERA, allowing 428 hits and 255 runs while posting 319 strikeouts.

Georgia Tech, ranked 24th nationally by Collegiate Baseball, is 27-17 after their 1-2 weekend with the No. 17 Clemson Tigers in South Carolina. GT has produced 298 runs from 437 hits for a .288 average this season. The Yellow Jackets have connected on 33 home runs, 16 triples and 95 doubles, drawing 238 walks along the way. On the mound, GT has allowed 427 hits and 226 runs for a 4.33 ERA, all while striking out 346 opponents.

### Players To Watch

Juniors Walter Diaz and Dexter Butler lead the Bulls with .377 and .359 batting averages, respectively. Diaz leads the team with 72 hits, 52 runs, 11 doubles, 88 total bases and 14

stolen bases. Butler is second on the team in RBI (38), doubles (10), hits (61) and total bases (74).

RHP Danny Otero owns a 2.91 ERA to lead the team, striking out a team-high 73 batters in 92.2 innings. Senior Yuri Higgins is second on the team with 70 strikeouts in 64.0 innings.

Outfielder Danny Payne paces the Yellow Jackets with his .377 batting average, producing 16 doubles and three triples on his way to 63 total hits. He has drawn 46 walks and scored 50 runs, both of which are team-highs. Catcher Matt Wieters has connected for seven home runs, collecting 99 total bases and 42 RBI. His .361 average is second on the team.

Pitcher David Duncan's 2.76 ERA is the best on the team, along with his 76 strikeouts and 81.2 innings pitched. He has a 5-2 record in 12 games started.

### What's Next For USF?

Following the series with GT, the Bulls travel to South Orange, N.J., to play Seton Hall May 11-13.

### Prado Returns To UofL

On April 27 USF Head Coach Lelo Prado, who coached Louisville to a 320-301-1 record the past 11 years at the helm of the program, coached against Cardinals for the first time since he returned home to Tampa to coach the Bulls. Prado and the Bulls won the first meeting 10-4 on Friday, but lost 4-0 on Saturday and 4-2 on Sunday.

### Delaney Tagged With First Loss

The April 28 loss to Louisville was junior right handed pitcher Chris Delaney's first of the season after starting the year a perfect 8-0 in 10 starts. Delaney struck out five, but allowed four runs from nine hits while walking three Cardinals in 5.2 innings.

son-low, which was set March 2 against Central Michigan. The 4-0 shutout was the Bulls' second of the season, the first was a 1-0 loss on March 23 at Notre Dame.

**Back To Winning**

The Bulls snapped their four-game losing streak Friday, April 27 with a 10-4 victory over the Louisville Cardinals in Kentucky. USF had lost three games to Rutgers and one to UCF the previous week, which was the Bulls' longest losing streak of the year.

**Diaz On Howser Trophy Watch List**

Junior shortstop Walter Diaz is one of 50 standouts selected for consideration of The Dick Howser Trophy, given to the top player in collegiate baseball, as announced by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association, working in conjunction with the St. Petersburg Area Chamber of Commerce.

Diaz was selected to the watch list for college baseball's top honor due to his .382 season batting average, including 68 hits, 11 of which are doubles. The Miami native leads the team with 28 RBI, 49 runs, 28 walks and 13 stolen bases.

The Dick Howser Trophy, given in memory of the former Florida State University All-America shortstop and major league player and manager who died of brain cancer in 1987, is regarded by many as college baseball's most prestigious award. Criteria for consideration for the trophy include performance on the field, leadership, moral character and courage, qualities that were exemplified by Dick Howser's life.

**Diaz Ends Hitting Streak at 24**

Junior shortstop Walter Diaz ended his hitting streak at 24 games on April 24 at UCF. Diaz' streak began at the Miami (Ohio) game on March 13.

Diaz was 40-for-98 (.408) in those 24 games with 18 RBI and 24 runs scored. He registered three doubles, a triple and a home run while drawing 21 walks, one of which was intentional. Diaz also had eight stolen bases in that time.

Diaz' streak passed the Bulls' longest hitting streak posted in the past nine years, which was Johnny Raburn's 20 consecutive-hit games in 1999 and 2000.

### Delaney Ends With No Decision

Junior right handed pitcher Chris Delaney tossed an eight-inning no decision for the Bulls on April 21 against Rutgers, allowing three runs from seven hits with three strikeouts and one walk. Delaney is 8-0 this season in 10 starts.

### Stranding Runners

The Bulls stranded seven runners in the April 22 game against Rutgers and left 53 on base in the six BIG EAST games from April 13-22.

### Extra, Extra

The April 21 contest with Rutgers was USF's second extra-inning game of the year and the second in the past eight days, both of which were losses. The first was a 3-2 loss to Villanova on April 13 in Pennsylvania and the second a 7-5 loss to the Scarlet Knights.

Prior to this season, the Bulls' last overtime game was April 25, 2006, an 11-inning loss (12-9) to Stetson at Red McEwen Field in Tampa, and USF's last extra-inning game on the road was an 11-inning victory (6-4) over UCF on April 18 in Orlando.

### Winless In Rutgers Series

The University of South Florida lost its first three-game series of the season April 20-22 to Rutgers at Red McEwen Field in Tampa. USF lost 5-2, 7-5 (10) and 10-5 in the three BIG EAST games. The last time a conference team swept the Bulls was the 2006 Notre Dame series when USF lost 9-6, 10-4 and 10-1 in Tampa.

### Sanford On Midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List

Freshman right handed closer Shawn Sanford has earned a spot on the third annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award Midseason Watch list, announced by the association April 19. Sanford is one of 40 players to be selected to the watch list for the award recognizing the top relief pitcher in Division I college baseball. The native of Cinnaminson, N.J., is one of five freshmen on the list. Sanford has made 10 saves this season, and posted a 1-1 record, while registering a 3.05 ERA. In 38.1 innings, Sanford has 29 strikeouts and allowed 28 hits and 13 runs. He has only recorded three extra-base hits in 23 appearances.

## Awards

Junior Walter Diaz batted .533 in four games (March 12-18), with eight hits in 15 at bats, earning a BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll accolade and the College Baseball Foundation National Honor Roll "Player of the Week" award.

The Miami native notched his first home run of the season and his ninth double of the year last week while drawing three walks.

The Brooks Wallace Award is presented annually to the national college baseball player of the year.

### You're Out, You're Out, You're Out

In the fourth inning of the third game against Pitt, USF turned a triple play after Addison Maruszak fielded a ball hit to third base, doubled up the runners at second and first, then first baseman Brandin Daniel threw to catcher Brad Karns, who tagged out the third player, completing the triple-play.

### Bulls 6-0 In Conference Openers

Following Friday night's 4-2 victory over Pittsburgh, USF has won six consecutive conference openers, including two in the BIG EAST and four as a Conference USA school.

### Taborelli Streaks Through BIG EAST Opener

Senior Ty Taborelli recorded a seven-game hitting streak, beginning with the March 8 game against Michigan State and ending with

the game on March 18 against Pitt. During his streak, the Tampa native had two home runs and a pair of doubles, along with eight RBI. Two of those seven games were multiple-hit outings. He also drew five walks in those seven outings.

### Playing Dodgeball

As of March 20, the USF baseball team had taken one for the team 43 times this season, led by Addison Maruszak's 13. Maruszak was hit by a pitch in five of the first six games this season. Junior shortstop Walter Diaz had been struck six times and two others had four HBP in the books.

### USF Scores In The First ... Again

Against Miami (Ohio) on March 13, USF scored in the first inning for the sixth-straight game, dating back to the second Central Michigan game on March 4.

### Taborelli Earns BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll Award

Senior outfielder Ty Taborelli batted .417 for the week and had two home runs, earning the Tampa native his first BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll award.

Taborelli, from Gaither High School, blasted home runs in back-to-back games, collecting 12 total bases, off of five hits in 12 at bats this week. His first bomb was a three-run shot against Michigan State on March 8, and his second was a solo in the bottom of the ninth against Quinnipiac, the following game.

His .417 batting average was complimented by a 1.000 slugging percentage, and his .533 on base percentage led the team.

Taborelli scored five runs and notched two RBI with his two bombs and one double. He was also walked three times, had zero strikeouts and a sac bunt, and was a perfect 6-of-6 in the outfield for a 1.000 fielding percentage.

### Maruszak Goes Streaking

On March 10, sophomore Addison Maruszak ended a nine-game hitting streak, dating back to the second game of the Manhattan series (Feb. 24). The 2006 BIG EAST Rookie of the Year had 16 hits in 36 at bats for a .444 average throughout those nine games.

### Higgins Retires 10

Senior right hander Yuri Higgins earned his first start of the season, his ninth appearance, against Quinnipiac on March 9. In 5.0 innings, Higgins struck out 10 of his 29 batters faced. Higgins retired five of his first 10 batters.

### Taborelli x 2

In the bottom of the ninth on March 9 against Quinnipiac, junior Ty Taborelli cracked his second home run of the season, a solo shot over the right field fence, to bring the score within one, but the Bulls could not pull

out the win, dropping their fifth game of the season, 5-4. The previous game, Taborelli blasted a three-run shot against Michigan State (March 8).

### Collecting Hits

The Bulls tallied 19 hits against the MSU Spartans on March 8, tying the season-high, which was recorded in the second game against Central Michigan on March 4. USF has tallied double-digit hits in 11 games this season.

### Back-To-Back Bombs In The Sixth

With one out in the sixth against Michigan State on March 8, senior outfielder Ty Taborelli blasted a three-run home run, immediately followed by a solo shot from sophomore Addison Maruszak. The home run was Taborelli's fifth bomb in his four years at USF, while Maruszak's was the second of his career.

### Bulls Break Up Stetson's Streak

USF beat Stetson for the first time in six tries with a 6-5 victory March 6 at Red McEwen.

The Bulls also broke the Hatters' 13-game Tuesday-night winning streak, which included three contests this season, and the rest dating back to last season.

### Lucky Sevens

Sophomore Addison Maruszak is currently riding a seven-game hitting streak, dating back to the second game of the Manhattan series. The 2006 BIG EAST Rookie of the Year has 20 hits in 49 at bats for a .408 average this season.

### Hits, Hits, Hits

In the fourth week of the season (Feb. 27-March 4) the Bulls and their opponents (UF and CMU) scored 76 runs off of 96 hits. In the Florida game, both teams produced a dozen hits and in the first game on March 4, the teams combined for 36 hits - CMU had 24 and USF added 12.

### Errors Prove Costly

The Bulls committed 12 errors over four games Feb. 27-March 4, 10 of which were against CMU. Prior to this week, USF had 18 miscues in the first 10 games of the season.

### Back-To-Back Bombs

Junior outfielder Joey Angelberger rocked two homeruns against the Chippewas this weekend, a pair of bombs over the left field fence, one apiece in each of the first two games.

### Daniel Doubles Up As Well

Junior first baseman Brandin Daniel added a two-run homer of his own in the series against the Chippewas, his second of the season, a shot over the CMU right fielder in game two.

The Bulls played the Florida Gators on Tuesday, Feb. 27, at Red McEwen Field in front of a crowd of 2,426 fans, which was the highest attendance recorded in at least the past eight years. (Attendance prior to the 1999 season is unknown)

**Bulls Receive Votes In NCBWA Poll**

For the second-straight week, USF has

received votes in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association national poll. At 9-1, USF is the only BIG EAST Conference team listed in the poll.

Two of the Bulls' 2007 opponents - Georgia Tech and Stetson - are also ranked by the outlet. The 6-4 Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets, who USF will play May 5-7 in Tampa, are No. 22. In-state rival Stetson, who beat USF 9-4 on Feb. 20, but will meet the Bulls again both March 6 and April 10, also received votes.

**Back-To-Back Conference Pitcher Of The Week Awards**

The BIG EAST Conference has selected University of South Florida senior right-handed pitcher Danny Otero as the Conference Pitcher of the Week, for the week ending Feb. 25.

Otero, the reigning BIG EAST Pitcher of the Week (Feb. 19), pitched a complete game on Feb. 23 against Manhattan, a 3-0 USF shutout. Otero struck out eight of his 31 batters faced (four over a game minimum), walking two and allowing four hits in his third win (3-0) of the season.

The Coral Gables, Fla., native, who owns a 0.41 ERA, has pitched 22.0 innings this season, striking out 14 and walking just four.

**Otero Earns CBF Player Of The Week Award**

Two-time BIG EAST Pitcher of the Week Danny Otero earned his first College Baseball Foundation National Honor Roll "Player of the Week" award on Feb. 27 following his complete game against Manhattan Feb. 23.

**Bulls No. 30 In National Poll**

USF broke into the national polls Feb. 26 as *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* placed the Bulls 30th in the NCAA Division I poll. Georgia Tech (6-4), who the Bulls play May 5-7 in Tampa, is ranked 14th. The Bulls are off to their best start since the 1986 season, and are 9-1 for only the fourth time in the history of USF baseball (1974, 1982, 1986 and 2007).

**Home Sweet Home**

With one out in the bottom of the second inning against High Point on Feb. 11, junior shortstop Walter Diaz stole home, scoring one of USF's seven runs of the inning. As of Feb. 20, Diaz led the Bulls with three stolen bases.

Diaz doubled up his feat Feb. 25 against Manhattan when he stole home in the bottom of the fourth.

**Complete Game No. 1**

Senior right hander Danny Otero pitched a complete game as USF beat Manhattan College 3-0 Feb 23 at Red McEwen Field. Otero struck out eight of his 31 batters faced, walking two and allowing four hits in his third win (3-0) of the season.

Otero's feat was the first nine-inning complete game since the 2003 season, when Travis Rios beat Cincinnati, 4-1, on April 20 at Red McEwen Field. In 2004 Casey Hudspeth pitched a six-inning complete game, the first of a double-

### **Pardo Earns CBF National Honor Roll 'Player Of The Week' Award**

Catcher Braulio Pardo earned a spot on the College Baseball Foundation's National Honor Roll "Players of the Week" list for the week ending Feb. 19.

Prior to the Feb. 20 game at Stetson, the Lutz, Fla., native was batting .619 in six games played (five started) including a team-leading 13 hits in 21 at bats. Pardo was riding a five-game hit streak, all of which were multiple-hit games. Pardo, who led the Bulls to the first 6-0 start since 1982 and only the third time in school history, had scored four runs and was second on the team with eight RBI. His 13 total bases was atop the team leaderboard, as was his .625 on-base percentage. Pardo was a perfect 2-2 stealing bases and had struck out just once. As a catcher, Pardo had 33 putouts - including two runners caught stealing - seven assists and no errors.

Pardo was one of 46 players across the country to be chosen for the weekly award.

### **Bulls Capture Two BIG EAST Player of the Week Awards**

The BIG EAST Conference selected catcher Braulio Pardo and pitcher Danny Otero as the BIG EAST Players of the Week for the week ending Feb. 18.

Pardo, a sophomore, is batting .619 in six games played (five started) including a team-leading 13 hits in 21 at bats. The BIG EAST Player of the Week has scored four runs and is second on the team with eight RBI. His 13 total bases is atop the team leaderboad as is his .625 on base percentage. Pardo is a perfect 2-2 stealing bases and has struck out just once. Pardo is currently riding a five-game hit

streak, all of which were multiple-hit games.

Senior right hander Danny Otero is 2-0 with six strikeouts in 13.0 innings pitched this season. Otero started both Friday night games for the Bulls so far this year, beating High Point in the season-opening game 14-0 and a week later the Bulls earned a 10-9 victory over Jacksonville. The BIG EAST Pitcher of the Week threw seven innings against HPU, striking out three and walking just one. Against JU Otero again struck out three and only one Dolphin drew a walk in six innings pitched.

### **Bulls Undefeated Through Six**

USF opened the 2007 season 6-0 for only the third time in school history, along with the 1982 and 1974 seasons. In 1982 the Bulls went 45-13, won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament and made an NCAA Tournament appearance. USF ended the 1974 season with a 3-13 skid to conclude the year 21-16-1.

### **USF Knots Series With JU at 49**

After the three-game sweep of the Dolphins Feb. 16-18, USF has knotted the all-time series with Jacksonville at 49.

The teams are 3-3 in the last six outings, with USF now on a three-game winning streak. The Bulls have won 13 of the last 18 meetings with the Dolphins, with the last USF victories prior to 2007 being a four-game streak from three contests in 2005, including an 11-inning win on Feb. 26, added to the Feb. 22 10-inning game in 2004.

The split weekend of two-away and one-home dates back to 2002 when USF played two games in Jacksonville, then traveled to Tampa two days later to end the three-game series. The Bulls won the set that season, 2-1, earning two victories in Jacksonville, 6-1 and 12-4, but dropping the Tampa contest, 7-6.

### **Diaz Hits The Record Books**

Junior shortstop Walter Diaz tied the school's single-game hit record on Feb. 16 at Jacksonville. Diaz was 5-for-6 at the plate with two runs scored. Diaz ties the record with 23 other USF players on at least 28 occasions. Most recently, Jeff Baisley had five hits at UAB on May 14, 2004.

### **Taborelli Earns CBF National Honor Roll 'Player Of The Week' Award**

Outfielder Ty Taborelli earned a spot on the College Baseball Foundation's National Honor Roll "Players of the Week" list for the week ending Feb. 12.

The senior batted .714 during opening weekend for the Bulls, registering five hits in seven at-bats. He was a perfect 3-for-3 in the first game of the season, cracking a double, while picking up two RBI and three runs scored. In Game Two against High Point, Taborelli, who attended Gaither High School, drew three walks, and in the final game, he was 2-for-3 with two runs scored. In all, he led

the Bulls to three victories by batting .714, scoring five runs off of five hits, including one double, and collecting two RBI. He also drew four walks and made three put outs in the outfield.

Taborelli was one of 42 players across the country to be chosen for the weekly award.

### **600 Career Wins For Coach Prado**

Coach Lelo Prado earned his 600th-career win Saturday, Feb. 10, as the University of South Florida baseball team beat High Point, 5-2, at Red McEwen Field. Prado's two wins at USF are added to his 320 wins in 11 years at the University of Louisville and his 278 wins in seven seasons at the University of Tampa, where he won two Division II national championships.

### **Bulls Sweep Panthers In Season-Opening Series**

The Bulls swept the High Point Panthers in three games to open the 2007 USF baseball season Feb. 9-11. The Bulls outscored the Panthers 32-13 in three games, by scores of 14-0, 5-2 and 13-11. USF batted .357 after recording 35 hits, including six doubles, in 98 at bats. The Bulls registered 27 RBI over the weekend.

Senior outfielder Ty Taborelli led the team with a .714 batting average, while sophomore catcher Braulio Pardo batted .625 with five hits in eight at-bats.

Senior right-handed pitcher Danny Otero was the Friday-night starter against HPU, registering three strikeouts in seven innings. Junior RHP Daniel Thomas recorded five strikeouts in four innings as the starter on Saturday as freshman RHP Matt Quevedo threw four innings, striking out three of his 13 batters faced, allowing zero runs and no hits as a reliever on the same night.

### **USF Baseball Prepares For 2007 Season**

The USF baseball team has a new look as it enters season two in the BIG EAST Conference, including a new coaching staff and 13 new Bulls. Lelo Prado took over the helm in June and immediately loaded his staff with former MLB player Tino Martinez, pitching coach Lazer Collazo and infield coach Bryant Ward, while retaining Greg Parris, a six-season USF veteran coach, who is the Director of Baseball Operations.

The Bulls return 18 players, comprised of 10 position players and eight pitchers. USF's 13 newcomers arrived in the form of eight freshmen, three juniors and two seniors. Of the 31 players on the roster, 28 hail from the state of Florida.

USF ended the 2006 campaign 23-35 overall with a 12-15 conference record, finishing eighth in the league and earning a spot in the BIG EAST Conference Championship. In 2006 the Bulls batted .268 in 58 games, scor-

ing 299 runs off of 541 hits. Defensively, USF posted an overall .959 fielding percentage, converting 2,300 chances into 1,568 putouts. The Bulls' pitching staff registered a 4.79 ERA, allowing 588 hits and 278 earned runs. USF's pitchers posted 457 strikeouts, which was second-best in the BIG EAST, and just 254 walks.

The Bulls look for leadership from seven top returners including infielders Addison Maruszak (So., 3B, 2007 Wallace Watch list and 2006 Louisville Slugger All-American), Brandin Daniel (Jr., 1B), Dexter Butler (Jr., 2B); outfielder Joey Angelberger (Jr.); and pitchers Daniel Thomas (Jr., RHP), Yuri Higgins (Sr., RHP) and Davis Bilardello (Jr., LHP).

Transfers Walter Diaz (Jr., SS, Miami) and Danny Otero (Sr., RHP, Duke) will make an immediate impact while freshmen Shawn Sanford (RHP, Cinnaminson, N.J.), Ryan Soares (2B, Harwich, Mass.) and J.C. Suarez (OF/LHP, Tampa, Fla./Tampa Catholic) will make moves within the lineup throughout the season.

### **USF Baseball Picked To Finish Sixth In The BIG EAST**

In the 2007 BIG EAST Preseason Poll, the University of South Florida baseball team was picked to finish sixth, as voted by the league's head coaches.

The BIG EAST officially expanded from 10 to 12 baseball members on July 1, 2005, with the addition of three schools - USF, Cincinnati and Louisville. Each member participating in the Conference baseball league competes in a round-robin rotational, one-division format; each team plays a three-game series versus nine of the 11 opponents on a rotating basis.

### **USF's Addison Maruszak Named To Wallace Watch List**

University of South Florida sophomore Addison Maruszak was named to the 2007 Wallace Watch List released Nov. 22 by the College Baseball Foundation. The Brooks Wallace Award is presented annually to the national college baseball player of the year. The 2006 winner, Brad Lincoln of Houston, signed last summer to play professionally for the Pittsburgh Pirates.

A 2006 *Louisville Slugger* Freshman All-American, Maruszak was named the BIG EAST Rookie the Year in 2006. Maruszak posted a .284 average with 30 runs scored, 14 doubles, one triple, one home run and 26 RBI on the year. The infielder played above his freshman status becoming one of the team's most consistent leaders on and off the field. His 14 doubles led USF and his on-base percentage of .390 was the best on the team. The Pinellas Park, Fla., native finished the season ranked second on the team in hits with 58, while his 26 RBI were the fourth-best by a Bull in 2006. Maruszak becomes the seventh play-

er at USF to be named a *Louisville Slugger* All-America by Collegiate Baseball.

The Wallace Watch list will be trimmed to 12 semi-finalists by late May. Then the selection committee will narrow the list to three finalists following the NCAA Super Regionals, prior to the College World Series. The finalists, their head coaches, and their parents will be invited to Lubbock, Texas, for a schedule of special events tied to the award banquet, which will again be nationally televised by Fox Sports Network and Fox College Sports.

### **BIG EAST Baseball Championship Heads To Historic Brooklyn, N.Y.**

Brooklyn, N.Y., is a city rich in baseball tradition with legends such as Jackie Robinson, Roy Campanella, Duke Snider and Pee Wee Reese having roamed the diamond at historic Ebbets Field. In 2007, the BIG EAST Conference will take its baseball tradition to Brooklyn. The BIG EAST, in conjunction with Minor League Baseball's Brooklyn Cyclones, announced Friday that the 2007 BIG EAST Conference Baseball Championship will be held at KeySpan Park in Brooklyn, N.Y. on Tuesday through Saturday, May 22-26. KeySpan Park is home to the Brooklyn Cyclones - the Short-Season Class A affiliate of the New York Mets.

## Lelo Prado

### Head Coach

*University of Tampa, 1985*

*First Season at USF*

*Career Record: 598-425-2*

On June 16, 2006, Lelo Prado, a native of Cuba who grew up in Tampa before embarking on an ultra-successful college coaching career that includes back-to-back NCAA Division II National Championships in his hometown, returned to Tampa to become the fifth coach in the USF baseball program's history.

Prado, 43, joins USF from the University of Louisville, where in 11 seasons he became that school's all-time winningest coach with 320 victories. In 18 seasons as a head coach, including seven at the University of Tampa and 11 at Louisville, Prado is 598-425-2 with two Division II National Championships (1992, 1993), eight NCAA appearances and three Division II World Series appearances. At Louisville, he took the program to its first-ever NCAA appearance in 2002 and he was the 2002 Conference USA Coach of the Year, the same year he won USA Baseball Coach of the Year honors.

During his time at Louisville, Prado compiled more wins than any other coach in Cardinal history. He surpassed Dr. John Heldman Jr. (309) when he registered win No. 310 on May 7, 2006 (a 9-6 win over the No. 8-ranked Notre Dame Fighting Irish). The Cardinals closed the 2006 season with a 12-game winning streak before falling in the championship game of the BIG EAST Conference Championship, posting a 31-29 record with a third-place regular season finish (17-10) in the team's initial year in the BIG EAST.

Prado guided the Cardinals to 11-consecutive conference tournament appearances, including 10-straight in Conference USA as Louisville was one of three teams in the league that advanced to the C-USA Tournament in each of conference's first 10 seasons, joining Southern Miss and Tulane.

He was the only coach in Louisville baseball history to record more than two 30-win seasons, tallying seven (31 in '98, 37 in '99, 32 in '01, 39 in '02, 34 in '03, 32 in '05 and 31 in '06).

Under Prado, the team earned its first-ever postseason appearance in 2002, advancing to the NCAA Regional in Atlanta, Ga. Prado led UofL to a single-season record 39 wins in 2002, as well as an all-time best conference record of 21-9, placing second. During the 2002 season, Prado also guided the USA Baseball National Team as its head coach, the first coach in C-USA history to do so, leading the collegiate amateur squad to a 23-7 record, and a silver medal at the first-ever FISU World University Baseball Championships in Messina, Italy. The team also captured the gold medal at the Haarlem Baseball Week in Haarlem, The Netherlands, and defeated the Japanese Collegiate All-Stars three games to two, in the 31st annual USA/Japan Collegiate Championship Series.

In 2000, he was one of three assistant coaches on the under-22 USA National Team, which posted an all-time best 27-3-1 record and featured col-

lege stars like Mark Teixeira, Mark Prior, Xavier Nady and fellow C-USA member Jake Gautreau. Prado served on the USA Baseball selection committee from 1995-1998 and helped select the '96 Olympic bronze medal winning squad.

During his 11 years at Louisville, Prado has seen 20 players (Matt Berger, Danny Haas, James McAuley, Jorge Maduro, Mike Davis, Brian Bentley, Sean Green, Chad Petty, Justin Woodrow, Bill Gatti Jr., Key Voshell, Adam Haley, Grant Williams, Josh Bolen, Carlos Fernandez, Ron Braun, Mark Jurich, Scott Barber, J.T. LaFountain and Brian Halford) make the pro ranks.

Before he was hired at Louisville in June of 1995, Prado spent seven seasons as the head coach at the University of Tampa. In his seven seasons at Tampa, Prado compiled a 278-124-1 record, the winningest record in UT's history, averaging nearly 40 wins per season. His .691 winning percentage ranks among the top 10 in Division II history. In addition to the two national championships, his teams also reached the College World Series in 1990, finishing third, and were an NCAA South Region finalist in each of his other four seasons as head coach (1989, 1991, 1994 and 1995).

He was named the ABCA National Coach of the Year in 1992 and 1993, and he was the South Region Coach of the Year in 1990, 1992 and 1993. He also won conference coach of the year in 1989, 1990 and 1995 and was inducted into the Sunshine State Conference Hall of Fame in 1995. His No. 1 jersey is retired at Tampa.

Prado coached 17 first or second team All-America selections at Tampa, including national player of the year Sam Militello in 1990, two Academic All-Americans, 43 All-South Region picks and 32 All-Sunshine State Conference Selections.

During his tenure at Tampa, seven Spartans were drafted by major league clubs, nine of whom played pro ball and four have reached the major leagues, including Tino Martinez (Yankees), Jeff Carter (Chicago White Sox), Ozzie Timmons (Chicago Cubs) and Militello (Yankees).

Prado served as Assistant Director of Athletics at Tampa, focusing on fundraising and community support coordination. Prado has also worked with the Nicaraguan National Baseball Team.

After playing two seasons at Hillsborough Community College, he completed his college career at Tampa in 1985, where he earned a bachelor's degree in adult fitness.

He was an assistant coach at Hillsborough one year (1985) before accepting a similar position at Tampa, where he worked as an assistant for three seasons (1986-88) prior to his advancement as the Spartans' head coach. His first coaching experience was leading the District VI All-Stars to the 1982 Big League World Series.

Prado and his wife, Pam, have three sons, Jason, Tyler and Zach.
