FINALISTS ANNOUNCED FOR THE NCAA® DIVISION I MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SOCCER DIVISIONS OF THE LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

(Kansas City, MO) – Finalists for the **Lowe's Senior CLASS Award** in the men's soccer and women's soccer divisions were announced today, launching a nationwide balloting process to determine the 2008 award winners for the nation's premier tribute to NCAA Division I collegiate seniors.

This marks the second year for both soccer divisions. The 2008 men's finalists are: **Matt Besler** (University of Notre Dame), **Sam Cronin** (Wake Forest University), **Dylan Curtis** (University of California Davis), **Michael Fucito** (Harvard University), **Adam Gartner** (Eastern Illinois University), **A.J. Glubzinski** (United States Military Academy), **Garret Guthrie** (University of Missouri Kansas), **Yohance Marshall** (University of South Florida), **Dylan Sheehan** (Brown University) and **O'Brian White** (University of Connecticut).

These 20 names (10 from each division) will be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote beginning October 16 and concluding November 19. Votes from coaches and media will be coupled with fan balloting to determine the recipient of the award. Fans can vote online during this time period at www.seniorclassaward.com. Winners will be announced during the 2008 NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship in Cary, North Carolina, scheduled for December 5-7, and during the 2008 NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Championship in Frisco, Texas, scheduled for December 12-14.
