JOHN THOMPSON

HEAD COACH • FIRST YEAR



On December 20, 2002, a standing-room-only crowd that included media, ECU alumni, and fans filled the Murphy Center's Harvey Hall to welcome the 18th head football coach in East Carolina University history.

Enthusiasm and excitement have followed John Thompson around the Greenville campus and eastern North Carolina ever since.

One of the most highly regarded defensive coaches in the country, Thompson's appointment ushered in a new era of the storied ECU football program. The 47-year-old native of Forrest City, Ark., came to ECU from the University of Florida, where he served the 2002 season as the Gators' defensive coordinator and led his unit to a top-25 national ranking in total defense.

Thompson's 21-year collegiate coaching career includes 19 seasons as a defensive coordinator with stops at four schools in the Southeastern Conference—Florida, Alabama, Arkansas, and LSU. He has also held assistant coaching positions at Conference USA members Memphis and Southern Miss, along with appointments at Louisiana Tech and Northwestern (La.) State.

In all, Thompson has coached three defensive units that have led their respective conferences in total defense, and has guided one of the nation's top 25 defensive units in four of the past six years. Twenty-five of his defensive players have been drafted or signed by NFL teams, 40 have earned all-conference honors, five have been named All-America, and one—former Northwestern State linebacker Gary Reasons—has been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame.

Thompson began his coaching career in the high school ranks in 1977 while pursuing his bachelor's degree at the University of Central Arkansas. He graduated with a bachelor of science degree in physical education in 1978 and went on to serve as an assistant coach at Conway, Forrest City, and Arkadelphia High Schools, all in his native state, before moving on to the college ranks at the University of Arkansas as a graduate assistant under head coach Lou Holtz for the 1982 season.

His first full-time assignment as a collegiate coach came at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, La., where he served as defensive coordinator and coached the secondary and linebackers from 1983-86. His 1984 NSU defensive unit led all of NCAA Division I-AA in scoring defense. After a one-year stint as linebackers coach under Bill Curry at the University of Alabama in 1987, he returned to Northwestern State for the 1988 and 1989 seasons, serving in the same capacity as his first tenure with the Demons and helping them to a conference championship upon his return in '88.

In 1990, Thompson moved about 80 miles north to serve as defensive coordinator, linebackers coach, and defensive ends coach at Louisiana Tech University. He served two seasons (1990 and 1991) on the Bulldogs' staff and led the defensive unit to a No. 23 ranking in total defense, No. 19 in scoring defense, and No. 8 in rushing defense.

Thompson was the mastermind behind the dominant Southern Miss defense of the mid-1990s as he took over the position of defensive coordinator for the Golden Eagles in 1992, was given the additional title of assistant head coach in 1993, and remained with that program until 1998. Along the way, Southern Miss won or shared two Conference USA titles, ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring defense twice, and made two bowl appearances. His 1996 Golden Eagle defense finished third in the country in turnover margin and eighth in rushing defense.

He had comparable accomplishments in 1999 as defensive coordinator at Memphis as his Tiger defense ranked 11th nationally in scoring defense. He turned around a defensive unit that had finished 106th in the nation in total defense the previous season and led it to a ranking of 23rd in the final statistics of 1999.

In December 1999, Thompson made his move to the SEC when he was named Nick Saban's first defensive coordinator at LSU.

The move was shortlived as he took advantage of an opportunity to move back to his home state in January 2000 as defensive coordinator at Arkansas. As co-coordinator in 2000, his Razorbacks were second in the nation in pass defense and led the SEC in both pass defense and total defense. As the sole coordinator in 2001, he helped guide the team to a 2002 Cotton Bowl appearance as the Razorbacks improved in sacks, tackles for losses, and turnover margin.

He was appointed as defensive coordinator at Florida in February 2002 and helped the Gators to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Outback Bowl against Michigan. Allowing just 162.4 passing yards per game, his Florida pass defense ranked seventh in the nation and was the best by a UF team since 1989.

Thompson's playing career includes time spent as a prep quarterback at Forrest City (Ark.) High School and two seasons at defensive back at Central Arkansas.

He still maintains ties to his home town as Thompson sponsors an annual charity golf tournament in Forrest City each summer. "The Ralph," named in honor of his late father who coached and played football, raises money to benefit the East Arkansas Fellowship of Christian Athletes as well as other charities.

Thompson and his wife, Charleen, have two children, Cabe (7) and Hays (5).

PIRATES LOOK TO RE-ESTABLISH HOMECOMING STREAK

Homecoming Day games have been highly successful for East Carolina's football team as the Pirates have won 40 of the 48 homecoming games played since 1955. That historical fact, however, was lost on the University of South Florida last season as the Bulls marched into Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium and snapped ECU's 13-game homecoming win streak with a 46-30 win. It was ECU's first loss on homecoming since 1988. This Saturday's game marks the latest date in a season that an ECU homecoming game has been played on since 1978, when homecoming was played on Nov. 11.

TOWNES NAMED C-USA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK ON OCT. 20

Junior tailback **Marvin Townes** exploded for three consecutive 100-yard rushing games, including a career-best 184-yard performance at Army which netted him Conference USA Offensive Player-of-the-Week honors on Oct. 20. Townes is the first ECU player to put together three straight 100-yard games since Leonard Henry, currently with the NFL's Miami Dolphins, had six straight midway of the 2001 season. Townes' workhorse performance at Army saw him carry the ball 39 times, which is a school record for most carries in a game by a junior and was three totes shy of the overall school mark of 42 set by Scott Harley in 1996. The 39 carries also set a Michie Stadium record for most rushing attempts by an Army opponent. Prior to the Army game, Townes rushed for 100 yards against North Carolina and 118 versus Houston.

ROBINSON ON TARGET

Junior quarterback **Desmond Robinson** is currently eighth in the nation in completion percentage. For the season, Robinson has completed 66.2 percent of his passes (133 of 201) and has ranked as high as second nationally in that category this season. Robinson is well above pace to break the ECU season record for best completion percentage, currently held by David Garrard who completed 61.6 percent of his attempts as a rookie in 1998. Robinson has already put his name on the school record for single-game completion percentage as his 80.8 percent (21-of-26) passing against West Virginia earlier this season set a new ECU standard.

BOOMING PUNTS

Redshirt freshman **Ryan Dougherty** continues to rate among the nation's top punters as his season average of 44.8 is currently 11th. Dougherty, who has been named to this season's Ray Guy Award Watch List, has helped the Pirates' special teams coverage unit to a No. 6 national ranking in net punting (41.5), which factors in opposing teams' punt return yardage. He has pinned opponents inside their own 20-yard line with 12 of his 46 punts this season and has only allowed 23 to be returned.

INJURY BUG BITES HARD

A rash of recent injuries has thinned the ranks of experienced players on ECU's current two-deep depth chart. Over the past two weeks, five players who have made starts this season and one significant reserve have missed time due to injuries. In the week leading up to last Saturday's game at Memphis, tight end **Tutu Moye**, wide receiver **Bobby Good**, and offensive lineman **Corey Schmidt** all suffered knee injuries that caused them to miss the trip. Good, who had come on strong in recent play and caught five passes the previous week against Louisville, is out for the season. During the game at Memphis, starting quarterback **Desmond Robinson** suffered an ankle injury which forced him out of the game in the second half. Also, starting cornerback **Donald Whitehead** and reserve defensive end **Sammie Walden** left the game with an arm and knee injury, respectively, and will likely not play in this coming Saturday's game.

COPPER CLIMBS THE CHARTS

Wide receiver **Terrance Copper** is enjoying a record-breaking senior season and could make more history before the year is over. Copper has already broken the school record for most receptions in a season as his 68 receptions have surpassed the old school season record of 54, set by Troy Smith in 1997. In addition, Copper is currently fourth on ECU's career receptions chart with 114 and has climbed to seventh in career receiving yardage at 1,505. Copper leads Conference USA and is tied for second in the nation in total receptions. Copper has had three games with 100-plus receiving yards this season, including a career-high 142 vs. Louisville. The Pirates have never had a wide receiver named All-Conference USA in seven years in the league. The last ECU receiver to earn postseason honors was Mitchell Galloway, who was named second team All-South Independent honors in 1995.

ECU ATTENDANCE REMAINS STRONG

ECU's struggles on the field to start the 2003 season have not put a damper on the enthusiasm of Pirate fans as ECU ranks third in Conference USA in home game attendance through last weekend's games. The Pirates have drawn an average of 36,700 fans for four home games, including a crowd of 44,040 for the Oct. 11 game against in-state rival North Carolina, which ranks as the third-largest attendance ever in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium history. If the Pirates maintain their current attendance pace, it will be the fourth time in the past five years that ECU has averaged over 36,000.

PIRATE WALK THIS WAY

Coach John Thompson has implemented the "Pirate Walk" prior to each home football game this season. Scheduled for two hours prior to kickoff, the Pirate team unloads buses near the left field entrance of Harrington Field, ECU's baseball stadium. The players then take a five-minute hike through a heavily populated tailgating area while being accompanied by the ECU Marching Pirates and cheerleaders en route to the team locker rooms located in the Ward Sports Medicine Building. Thompson hopes the walk becomes part of ECU's pregame tradition similar to team walks at Tennessee, Ole Miss, and Auburn. This Saturday's Pirate Walk prior to the USF game will begin promptly at 12 noon.

BROADWELL GETTING HIS KICKS

Cameron Broadwell has quietly gone about business in the Pirates' place-kicking department, an area of the team which many fans have taken for granted in past years. Broadwell has made 10-of-11 field goal attempts this season and, including his 34-yarder at Memphis last Saturday, has now been successful on nine consecutive attempts. Broadwell, who originally made the team as a walk-on in 2000, won the starting job this fall by beating out four other walk-on hopefuls in an intense competition. Over the previous four seasons, the kicking position had been anchored by Kevin Miller, who finished his ECU career as the school's all-time leading scorer with 287 points. Broadwell's only miss this season was a 39-yarder at the Orange Bowl against Miami. His 46-yarder at Wake Forest was the longest by a Pirate kicker in 13 games.

KICK RETURNER FOX PROVIDES FIREWORKS AT MEMPHIS

Junior **Damarcus Fox** had a standout day on special teams during last Saturday's game at Memphis. The Greenville native returned a kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. It was the sixth-longest kickoff return in school history and ECU's first kickoff return for a touchdown since Marvin Townes had a 93-yard scoring return against Army in 2001. Later in the game, Fox nearly broke another kickoff return as he brought it back for a 55-yard gain. He also had a spectacular open-field tackle to stop a Tiger punt returner in his tracks for no gain.

JEAN SHINING IN ECU SECONDARY

ECU cornerback **Erode Jean** is beginning to make a case for himself for Conference USA All-Freshman Team honors. Jean has made five straight starts for the Pirates with progressive results each time out. He recovered and returned a fumble against both Houston and North Carolina, then made a big play at Army when he picked off a Black Knight pass in the first quarter and returned it 22 yards. The following week against Louisville, Jean turned in a career-high 11 tackles and two pass breakups. Last Saturday at Memphis, he had his second straight double-digit tackle game with 10 stops and added two more pass breakups. He currently leads the team in PBUs with six.

MOORE IS NCAA'S TOP TACKLER

Sophomore linebacker Chris Moore continues to lead the nation in tackles as he has racked up an astounding 114 tackles in just eight games (14.3 per game). His figures are even more impressive considering the fact that Moore has been battling season-long knee problems which forced him to sit out ECU's game at Miami. Moore has been in double-digits in tackles in seven of the eight games in which he has played. He began the season by matching ECU's single-game record with 24 tackles at Cincinnati.

DOWDY-FICKLEN TO HOST ITS 200TH GAME

Saturday's contest between East Carolina and USF will be the 200th college football game played in ECU's Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium. The facility, which features 43,000 permanent seats, is in its 40th year as home to the Pirates as it hosted its first contest in 1963. The Pirates defeated Wake Forest, 20-10, in front of 17,000 people in the first game played there on Sept. 21, 1963. Since then, ECU has compiled a record of 132-66-1 (66.6%) in games played at Dowdy-Ficklen while entertaining a grand total of 4,926,867 spectators.

ECU'S YOUTH MOVEMENT

The rapid development of several rookies and a string of injuries to key veterans has seen ECU's depth chart evolve into a very youthful group of Pirates. For Saturday's game, well over half (26 of 44) of the players on the two-deep depth chart are either freshmen or sophomores. A total of nine true freshmen have seen the field this season and five of those -- WR Brian Howard, TE Josh Coffman, LB Eric Johnson, CB Erode Jean, and WR Bobby Good -- have made appearances in the starting lineup. Two more--defensive backs Kyle Chase and Kasey Ross--could possibly start in the ECU secondary in Saturday's game.

STREAKING PIRATES

Several veteran Pirate football players have long personal streaks intact this season. Senior offensive tackle Brian Rimpf has made 34 consecutive starts for ECU while fellow offensive lineman Charlie Dempsey, a junior, has made 21 straight starts. Senior wide receiver Terrance Copper has made at least one catch in 16 straight games and has not missed a game during his four-year ECU career, a streak that currently is at 45 games. As a team, the Pirates have gone 75 consecutive games without being shut out, a streak that dates back to October 1997.

ROAD TRIPS SPECIAL FOR PIRATE PLAYERS

The 2003 season has been a learning experience for the Pirate football team in more ways than one. On each of its last four road trips, East Carolina has made side ventures for community service and civic awareness. In mid-October en route to West Point, N.Y., the team took a detour into New York City where the players were guided on a tour of the former site of the World Trade Center where over 3,000 citizens lost their lives on Sept. 11, 2001. On previous road trips to Miami and Wake Forest, stops at a center for the developmentally disabled, a children's hospital, and a special learning center were all part of the itinerary.

The Pirates made a special gesture on its trip to West Point as the entire team joined the Black Knights and corps of cadets for the traditional playing of Army's alma mater following the Oct. 18 game.

The latest trip to Memphis included a stop at that city's Civil Rights Museum, located at the site of the 1968 assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

"There's a whole lot more to education than books and football, and we want to be a part of it," Coach John Thompson said.

FIRST-TIME PLAYERS

Pirates who have seen their first collegiate action in the first nine games are: LB Sammie Walden, OL Eric Graham, WR Brian Howard, WR Bobby Good, PK Nate Steinbacher, S Kyle Chase, CB Kasey Ross, WR Will Bland, S Pierre Parker, DB Dontae Bibbs, P Ryan Dougherty, TB Robert Tillman, S Antonie Nealy, LB Dustin Bowden, DL Dontré Brown, WR Kevin Roach, TE Kort Shankweiler, TE Josh Coffman, LB Eric Terry, PK Cameron Broadwell, CB Erode Jean, and DE Shauntae Hunt. Of those 22, nine are true freshmen--Howard, Good, Steinbacher, Parker, Tillman, Jean, Chase, Ross, and Coffman. Junior college transfer TB Kevin Fain also made his ECU debut.

WAITING IN THE WINGS

While juniors Desmond Robinson and Paul Troth were involved in a close battle for the starting quarterback job during the 2003 preseason, the competition at the signal-caller position could be even more of a log jam in 2004. Waiting in the wings is Patrick Dosh, who transferred to ECU from the University of Florida this past June and will sit out this season due to eligibility rules. Dosh, who will be a sophomore next season, redshirted in 2002 with the Gators. He passed for 8,648 career yards in high school, the most in the state of Virginia prep history.

PRESEASON ALL C-USA

Three Pirates were selected preseason All C-USA by the league's coaches. Senior running back **Art Brown** and senior offensive tackle **Brian Rimpf** were each selected to the first-team offense. Senior wide receiver/punt returner **Terrance Copper** was picked for first-team special teams.

CHANGE AT THE TOP

The new look for the East Carolina football program in 2003 starts at the top with first-year head coach John Thompson. Thompson became the 18th head football coach in ECU history when he was appointed to that position on December 20, 2002. He replaced Steve Logan, who compiled a 69-58 record over the previous 11 seasons. Thompson, widely recognized as one of the college game's top defensive minds, served last season as defensive coordinator at Florida and has also made notable impacts in that role at Arkansas, Memphis, Southern Miss, Louisiana Tech, and Northwestern (La.) State. His first ECU coaching staff reflects Thompson's strong ties to Arkansas and Florida as eight of his 12 staff members coached and/or played in either the Sunshine State or the Natural State. The assistant coaching staff is among the younger groups in NCAA Division I as the average age of the nine on-field assistants is 37. Three are 28 or younger.

BROWN LOST FOR SEASON

Senior running back **Art Brown**, a preseason All-Conference USA selection and Doak Walker Award candidate, will miss the entire 2003 season due to a knee injury. The announcement came about two weeks prior to the Pirates' season opener at Cincinnati. Brown was C-USA's top returning rusher in terms of yards per game (102.9) from last season. He was a second team All C-USA pick in 2002 when he rushed for 1,029 yards in 10 games. He ranked sixth in the nation in scoring as he reached the end zone 17 times (14 rushing TDs, three receiving TDs). Brown is eligible for a medical redshirt and is expected to play in 2004.

RIMPF ON LOMBARDI, OUTLAND TROPHY LISTS

Senior offensive tackle **Brian Rimpf** has been selected to the preseason watch lists for the Rotary Lombardi Award and the Outland Trophy. The Lombardi Award goes to the nation's best lineman—offensive or defensive—and the Outland Trophy is awarded to the best interior lineman. Rimpf is one of 39 Division I-A players named to the list for the 34th annual Lombardi Award and is one of 44 players named to the watch list for the Outland Trophy. The winners of the two awards will be announced live on the ESPN College Football Awards Show on Dec. 11.

OFFENSIVE LINE IS SENIOR-LADEN

The presence of five senior lettermen, one preseason All-American, and another strong all-conference candidate make ECU's offensive line one of the best in Conference USA for 2003. Tackle **Brian Rimpf** (6-6, 324) was the most heralded Pirate in preseason publicity as was named as a second-team preseason All-American by *College Football News* and was rated as the No. 16 offensive tackle in the nation by *The Sporting News*. **Doug White** (6-3, 302) is an All C-USA candidate at center after being listed as the No. 8 center in the nation by *The Sporting News*. He is considered one of the best centers at ECU over the past decade. **Brian Fox** (6-3, 302) has started 21 games at right guard, while fellow senior veterans **Corey Schmidt** (6-5, 309) and **Brandon Pope** (6-4, 282) have both made starts this season at right tackle. The five have all played significant roles on an offensive line that has paved the way for two consecutive 1,000-yard rushers and helped ECU average over 30 points a game over the past three seasons.

CLASSROOM ACCOLADES

One year after being named as one of the top 25 academic football programs in NCAA Division I-A, Pirate football players are continuing to turn in strong performances in the classrooms. More than 35 Pirates were named to the ECU Athletics Director's Honor Roll this past spring for gaining a grade point average of 3.0 for the semester. Fifteen compiled a 3.0 or higher GPA for the entire 2002-03 school year, including wide receiver **Richard Hourigan**, who was awarded the C-USA Commissioner's Academic Award for having a GPA of 3.75 or higher. Hourigan and offensive tackle **Brian Rimpf** were both voted to the 2002 Verizon Academic All-District III football team last November.

LENDING A BIG HAND

In addition to receiving numerous honors on the playing field, senior offensive tackle **Brian Rimpf** has been nationally recognized for his contributions to the community. Last fall, Rimpf was one of just 11 players in NCAA Division I-A named to the AFCA Good Works Team in recognition of outstanding community service and civic involvement. The 6-6, 324-pound Rimpf dedicates an average of nine hours per week throughout the academic year to community service. Among the groups he has aided are Young Life, a mission program committed to reaching adolescent youth, and Sportworks Ministries. He is a frequent speaker to church youth groups and Boys and Girls Clubs and has volunteered time to a local juvenile detention center, the Methodist Children's Home SummerFest, and the Cerebral Palsy Telethon. Along the way, he has found time to earn his undergraduate degree with a double major in accounting and finance in four years, completed this past May, and is now pursuing his MBA, plus got married one week after graduation.

LAST MEETING

2002 USF 46, ECU 30

(Greenville) Turnovers proved to be the undoing of the Pirates as South Florida took advantage of four ECU miscues to post a 46-30 non-conference win and spoil East Carolina's Homecoming Day.

The Bulls improved to 5-2 and did not suffer a turnover of their own. USF quarterback Marquel Blackwell passed for 321 yards and accounted for all five of the Bulls' offensive touchdowns.

The loss overshadowed the Pirates' best offensive output of the season as ECU compiled 510 yards. Sophomore quarterback Paul Troth completed 25-of-46 passes for 339 yards, the 12th best passing game in ECU history, and junior running back Art Brown rushed for a career-high 188 yards and scored twice.

After trailing 15-10 at halftime, the Pirates came out of intermission and put together a 10-play, 80-yard scoring drive to take a 17-15 lead. However, the Bulls used a 54-yard scoring strike from Blackwell to regain the lead, then the USF quarterback threw two more touchdowns in a three-minute span to give the Bulls a commanding 36-17 lead through three quarters. The latter two scores were set up by a short ECU punt and 18-yard return by USF's DeAndrew Rubin, and an interception that put the ball at the ECU 15.

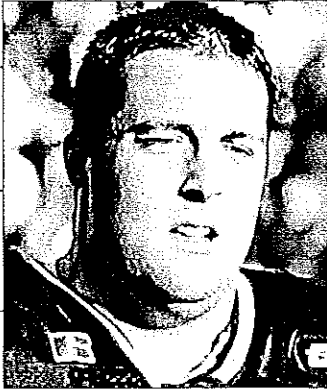

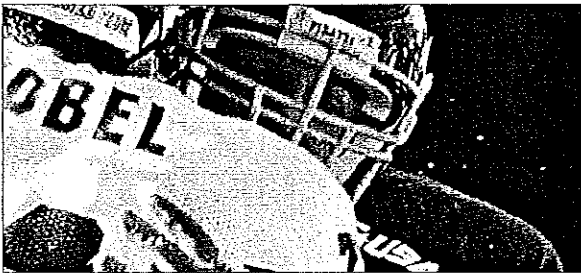
