The University of Louisville football team will hit the road for the final time this season when the Cardinals travel to Tampa, Fla., to face South Florida on Saturday, Nov. 17. The game will be shown live on ESPNU.

The Cardinals are making their third visit to South Florida and have yet to win on the Bulls' home field. In their last trip into the Sunshine State, the ninth-ranked fell to USF, 45-14, in 2005.

Louisville is coming off a disappointing 38-31 loss to seventh-ranked West Virginia in Morgantown, W. Va. Patrick White scampered 50 yards for the game-winning score with 1:36 to play after **Art Carmody** tied the score with a 37-yard field goal. The loss was the Cardinals fifth loss by 10 points or less. The Cardinals battled back from a 31-14 deficit on touchdowns by **Brock Bolen** and **Mario Urrutia** to close the gap to 31-28.

Senior quarterback **Brian Brohm** broke the BIG EAST record for 300-yard games in a season with seven after throwing for 345 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Running back **George Stripling** caught a career-best eight passes for 105 yards. Senior wide receiver **Harry Douglas** also caught seven passes for 98 yards.

The Louisville defense held the potent West Virginia offense to 397 yards of total offense and forced three fumbles. Steve Slaton was limited to 60 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries.

Brohm's 300-Yard Games

Brohm recorded another stellar performance in the loss to West Virginia on November 8. Brohm, who already owns the BIG EAST record for 300-yard games in a season, set a new league record with his seventh 300-yard game this season. Brohm already owns the league mark for career 300-yard contests with 18. Louisville is 13-5 when the former Trinity High product throws for 300-yards in a game.

Player Interviews

- All player interviews must be arranged through Rocco Gasparro, Assistant Sports Information Director and Football Contact, at least one day in advance. Players are available in person at head coach Steve Kragthorpe's Monday Press Luncheon in the recruiting lounge and Tuesday and Wednesday following practice, pending class schedules and availability.

- Please consult with Rocco Gasparro regarding availability. Player availability at other times will vary from week to week. A time mutually convenient for the player and the member of the media can be set up by Gasparro. During a traditional game week, there will be no player interviews after Wednesday.

Steve Kragthorpe Interviews

- All interview requests must be arranged through Rocco Gasparro in the Sports Information Office. Coach Kragthorpe will be available to the media on the BIG EAST Conference call on Monday at 11:10 a.m., Monday at his 1:30 p.m. press luncheon and after practice on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Covering Practice

- Practice is open to the media for the first 15 minutes on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Please contact Rocco Gasparro in the Sports Information Office if anyone plans to shoot practice.

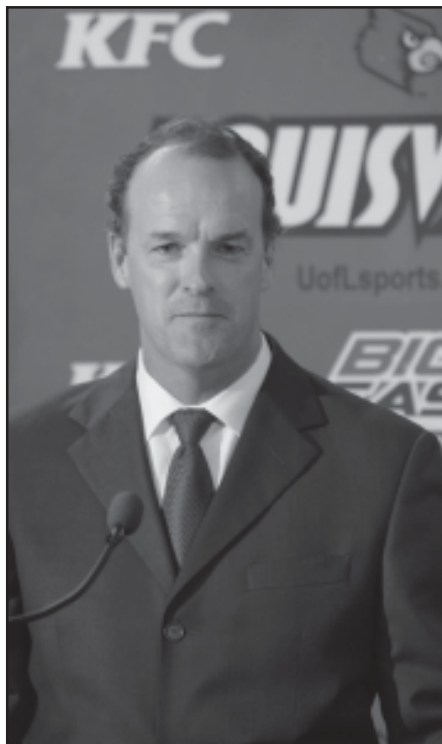
Filming at Practice

About South Florida

South Florida was one of the nation's best squads, reaching as high as No. 2 in the country. However, the Bulls stopped its three-game losing streak with a 41-10 win over Syracuse last Saturday in the Carrier Dome. The Bulls rushed for 346 yards and three touchdowns and threw for 236 yards and two scores. Defensively, the Bulls held the Orange to 15 yards rushing.

USF quarterback **Matt Grothe** is a dual threat athlete as he leads the team in rushing and passing. The talented sophomore has rushed for 698 yards and eight touchdowns, while throwing for 2,120 yards and 11 scores. Freshman **Mike Ford** is a talented runner with 434 yards and eight touchdowns. The Bulls are averaging 189.4 yards per game on the ground. **Carlton Mitchell** has caught 28 passes for 451 yards and three scores. The Cardinals will face one of the nation's toughest defenses as the Bulls yield just 312.5 yards per game. **George Selvie** is one of the best at rushing the passers in the nation, recording 14.5 sacks and 30.5 tackles for loss.

Last Meeting in Tampa

Receiver **Amarri Jackson** ran for two touchdowns and threw for a third to lead South Florida to the biggest victory in the school's brief football history, a 45-14 rout of No. 9 Louisville in the Bulls' BIG EAST debut. Jackson was Mr. Versatile in helping South Florida (3-1) beat a ranked opponent for the first time in six tries and stop the nation's third-longest Division I-A winning streak at nine

games. Jackson, who had two receptions for 15 yards in South Florida's first three games, set up Andre Hall's 1-yard, first-quarter TD run with a 57-yard catch-and-run on the Bulls' second offensive play. The 6-foot-5 receiver scored on a 51-yard reverse up the right side of the field to make it 14-0, then circled left end on a 12-yard reverse for a 21-0 lead midway through the second quarter.

Running back **George Stripling's** career has been full of ups and downs. In the loss to West Virginia on Thursday night, Stripling had another up as he caught a career-best eight passes for 105 yards, including a 44-yard reception. He has caught 17 passes for 205 yards and is averaging 12.1 yards per catch. The 6-0 junior has caught 31 passes for 471 yards.

Moral Victories

Head coach Steve Kragthorpe is definitely not into moral victories. But for some reason, the Cardinals have had trouble in close games. The Cardinals have lost all games by 10 or less points, including four by seven points or less. The Cardinals lost on a last second play at Kentucky and in the final minutes against Connecticut and West Virginia — all three of which are ranked in the top 25. The nine-point loss to Utah on Oct. 5 was the largest defeat for the Cardinals this season. Louisville's average margin of defeat is 5.8. The run game has been the most telling stat as the Cardinals are averaging just 66.0 yards per game in their losses.

The Cardinals are 4-0 this season when leading after three quarters. They have played well in the second half this year, out-scoring the opposition 177-127, in 2007, including 98-72, in the fourth quarter.

■ Louisville was held to less than 400 yards of total offense for the third straight game — the first time the Cardinals have been held to less than 400 yards of total offense since 2002 when they were limited to less than 300 yards in back-to-back games against Houston and Marshall.

■ Junior running back **George Stripling** caught a career-high eight passes for a career-best 105 yards. His previous career-mark for receiving yards was 82 against Temple in 2006.

■ Louisville rushed for 37 yards in the loss to West Virginia — the fifth time they've been held to less than 100 yards rushing in a game. It was the second-lowest this season. The Cards' were held to 26 against Utah on Oct. 5.

■ Senior wide receiver **Harry Douglas** caught seven passes for 98 yards and is just 23 yards short of reaching the 1,000-yard plateau for the second straight season.

■ The Cardinals were a season-low 3-of-13 on third down against West Virginia. The third time this season the Cardinals were held to less than a 30 percent conversion rate.

■ Louisville ranks fourth in the nation in passing offense (360.9), sixth in total offense (529.75), sixth in passing efficiency (159.26) and 15th in scoring offense (37.0).

Air Raid

Louisville has shown this season that it will sling the ball all over the field, causing quite a workout for senior quarterback **Brian Brohm**. Brohm has attempted 35 or more passes in seven of ten games this season, including a school record 65 attempts against Syracuse. Brohm has attempted 414 passes through 10 games, which is the fifth-highest total in school history. In 2006, Brohm never threw more than 35 passes in a game.

Topping 200

Throwing for more than 200 yards has become the norm for Brohm as he has topped the 200-yard plateau in 14 straight games, dating back to the 2006 season. The last time he failed to throw for 200 yards was last year against Rutgers (163 yds) on Nov. 9 — almost a year to the date of the West Virginia game this season.

You Complete Me

Brohm is on pace to set another school mark — completions in a season. The 6-4 signal caller has 278 completion in 10 games, which is already third in school history and the third most in the history of the BIG EAST Conference. He's on pace for 334 completions, which would break Chris Redman's old mark of 317 set in 1999. He has completed 25 or more passes in seven of 10 games, including a school record 45 against Syracuse on September 22. Brohm is on pace to smash the BIG EAST record for completions in a season of 295 by Ryan Hart of Rutgers in 2004.

Brohm Closing in on League Passing Record

Senior quarterback **Brian Brohm** has played just three BIG EAST seasons, but it hasn't stopped him from reaching the league record books. Brohm has thrown for 9,506 yards in his two-plus BIG EAST seasons. With his 345 yards against West Virginia, Brohm became the fifth quarterback in league history to throw for 8,000 yards in a career. Brohm's 9,506 yards are the second-most in league history and needs just 60 more to pass Ken Dorsey of Miami (1999-02), who holds the league record with 9,565 yards. Tyler Palko of Pittsburgh joined the 8,000 club last season with 8,343 yards. Brohm's also just the eighth player to throw for 50+ touchdowns in league history.

Second in Nation

Senior quarterback **Brian Brohm** is having his best season statistically in his final campaign at Louisville. Brohm stands second in the country in passing yards with 3,574 — 1,304 yards behind the national leader Graham Harrell of Texas Tech, who has thrown for 4,878 yards. Brohm is also eighth in the nation in completion percentage at 67.21 percent. The senior from Louisville, Ky. averages 27.80 completions per game, which is fifth in the nation.

Brohm Fourth in Total Offense

Senior quarterback **Brian Brohm** is fifth in the nation in total offense, averaging a career-high 353.2 yards per game. He has thrown for 3,574 yards and rushed -42 yards this season. Graham Harrell of Texas A&M is the national leader at 436.4 yards per game.

Brohm is Points Responsible

Senior quarterback **Brian Brohm** is tied for ninth nationally in points responsible for with an average of 18.00 points per game. He is tied with Dennis Dixon of Oregon. Brohm has thrown for 26 touchdowns and rushed for another. Colt Brennan of Hawaii has thrown for 26 scores and rushed for six more — an average of 27.43 points per game.

Quickie Notes on Douglas

- Douglas has caught 164 passes for 2,742 yards and 14 touchdowns. He averages 16.8 yards a catch for his career.
- His 164 receptions are the fifth most in school history and his 2,742 yards are the third most.
- Has caught a pass in 23 straight games.
- Set a school record with 223 yards receiving against Kentucky.
- Became the first wide receiver in school history to record back-to-back 200-yard receiving games when he tallied 223 yards against Kentucky and 205 versus Syracuse.
- Ranks fourth in the nation in receiving yards per game (122.1) and sixth in receptions (7.86). Ranks 11th in the country in receiving yards with 977.
- Has five games with seven or more receptions.

Douglas Looks for Back-to-Back 1,000-Yard Seasons

Senior wide receiver **Harry Douglas** is having a record-breaking season for the Cardinals. Despite missing two whole games, Douglas has caught 62 passes for 977 yards, which ranks fourth in the country. The 5-10 speedster is on pace to catch 90 passes for 1,592 yards. He's on pace to shatter his school record for receiving yards in a season of 1,265 yards. Douglas is also on pace to become just the third player to record back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. Deion Branch was the last player to do it in 2000-01, while Arnold Jackson also did it in 1998-99.

Douglas Has Outside Chance for League Receiving Mark

Senior wide receiver **Harry Douglas** is quietly approaching a league record that no one would ever think he could've achieved. Despite only playing three BIG EAST seasons, Douglas needs just 305 yards in his final two games to break the league's all-time receiving yards record of 3,003 set by Dietrich Jells of Pittsburgh, who broke the record in 1995.

Douglas Sets School Record Versus Syracuse

Senior wide receiver **Harry Douglas** had a huge game against Syracuse on September 22 in a 38-35 loss. The 5-10 wideout caught 13 passes for a career-high and school record 223 yards. He broke the old school mark of 214 yards set by Ibn Green against East Carolina in 1998.

Douglas Looks For Back-to-Back Record-Setting Seasons

Senior wide receiver **Harry Douglas** had a huge start to his senior season before missing two games with an ankle injury. Before getting hurt, Douglas had 38 catches for 679 yards in his first four games. Since returning to the lineup, he's only caught 24 passes for 298 yards. He's still on pace to catch 78 passes for 1,254 yards. He set the school record last season for yards in a season with 1,265.

Douglas Ranks Third in the Nation in Receiving Yards

Despite missing a pair of games, **Douglas** still stands third in the nation in receiving yards per game, averaging 122.1 yards a contest. Michael Crabtree of Texas Tech is the national leader at 155.18 and Jordy Nelson of Kansas State is second at 134.00. Douglas' 977 yards receiving stands as the 11th-best total in the nation behind Crabtree's 1,707 yards. Douglas leads the BIG EAST Conference in yards per game and receptions per game.

Battling through a variety of injuries for most of the season, junior defensive end **Maurice Mitchell** has been a leader on the defense. The 6-5 product from Glasgow High School leads the team with 8.5 tackles for loss. He also has 30 tackles and a pair of sacks.

10 and 10

Senior quarterback **Brian Brohm** knows how to spread the football around. The Cardinals have ten players on the squad who have 10 or more receptions this season, including three players with 27 or more. Senior **Harry Douglas** has a team-high 55. Against Pittsburgh, Brohm completed passes to ten different receivers, including five players who caught two or more passes.

Wood Continues Start Streak

Junior center **Eric Wood** has been a iron man for the Cardinals since taking over as the center during his red-shirt freshman season. Wood has started 35 straight games for the Cardinals, starting every game since 2005. He was a second-team All-BIG EAST selection in 2006. Wood has been named on the Rimington Award and the Outland Trophy Watch List.

Red-Zone Success

The Louisville offense had a 92.3 percent success rate last season in the red zone. Louisville converted 60-of-65 chances last season in the red zone, including 43 touchdowns. So far through 10 games, the Cardinals are 46-of-50 (92.0). In the win over Murray State, the Cardinals were even better than a year ago, converting all eight of their chances in the red zone and were a perfect 7-of-7 against Middle Tennessee. The Cardinals have also scored 37 touchdowns in 50 chances in the red zone this season.

Defense Showing Signs of Improvement

At the beginning of season the Cardinals defense was one of the worst in the nation. However, over the last three games, the Cardinals might be playing their best football in recent weeks. The Cardinals have allowed just 25.3 points per game and 324.0 yards of total offense. After giving up 44 points to Utah on October 5, the Cardinals hadn't allowed more than 24 points to an opponent until yielding 38 to West Virginia.

Myles leads the team with a career-high 106 tackles. He's the first player to record over 100 tackles since Robert McCune tallied 115 stops in 2004.

Palmer Steps Up His Play

Senior safety **Deon Palmer** has stepped in and played well at safety. Entering the 2007 season with just nine career tackles, Palmer, who is the son of former Chicago Bull Horace Grant, is fourth on the team with 38 tackles, including 29 solo tackles, which is the third-highest total on the squad.

Buchanan's Switch Pays Off

Junior safety **Bobby Buchanan** talked to coach Kragthorpe about making the switch to safety in order to get on the field, and that switch has paid off for everyone involved. Buchanan is second on the team in tackles with 45 after recording a career-best 11 stops and a forced fumble against West Virginia. He had an apparent interception that was overruled by instant replay.

Walker Makes Impact

With mounting injuries on the defensive front, the Cardinals needed players to step up, and that's what sophomore **L.T. Walker** did against West Virginia. The 6-4 tackle recorded a career-best six tackles and a tackle for loss. He also recovered a fumble.

Cardinals in the State of Florida

The University of Louisville has always recruited the state of Florida well over the last few years, and the 2007 squad is well-represented by the Sunshine State. The Cardinals have 18 players from Florida, which is the 10th-most of any school in the country, not in the state of Florida. Army has 30 players, while Troy is second with 29.

Offense Needs To Get Going

The Cardinals have always been one of the top offensive units in the country. However, since recording a season-high 628 yards of total offense against Syracuse on September 22, the Cardinals have sputtered. Since that game, Louisville has averaged a respectable 416.7 yards of total offense and 27.3 points per game. But in their last three games, the Cardinals have averaged 353.0 yards of total offense and 24.0 points. Louisville hasn't been over 400 yards of offense since gaining 447 yards against Cincinnati.

Defense Steps Up in League Play

The Cardinals struggled defensively in non-conference play, yielding 440.4 yards of total offense and 29.2 points. However, since starting BIG EAST Conference play, the defense has allowed just 379.4 yards of total offense, 27.6 points per game and 135.2 yards on the ground. The Cardinals were 3-2 in non-conference action and 2-3 in the BIG EAST.

Brohm and Douglas in the BIG EAST

Senior quarterback **Brian Brohm** is pushing for Player of the Year honors in the BIG EAST Conference. The 6-4 signal-caller has thrown for an average of 342.0 yards per game and is completing 68.2 percent of his passes. Brohm has thrown 12 touchdown passes in those games and just seven picks in 220 throws. Senior wide receiver **Harry Douglas** has caught 36 passes for 503 yards and two scores in league games.

Cardinals Go for 400

The Cardinals might need some help in the last two games to continue their scoring streak of scoring 400 points in a season. Louisville has scored 364 points, averaging 36.4 points per game. Louisville has scored more than 400 points in four straight seasons. The last time the Cardinals failed to score 400 points was in 2002 when they tallied 374 points. The 36.4 average would be the lowest since 2003 when they scored just 34.6 points per game.

It was the sixth time in his career that he buried three or more field goals in a game. For his career, Carmody has blasted 57-of-70 attempts (81.43 percent), which is fifth among active kickers for percentage made. His 57 field goals made is the third-most among active placekickers. He is the NCAA's leader in points scored with 390.

Carmody Sets One NCAA Mark; Closes In On Another

Senior placekicker **Art Carmody** is easily the best kicker in the school's history and now is close to becoming one of the best in the history of the NCAA. Carmody, who owns numerous school records, is closing in on a pair of NCAA scoring records. Carmody broke the NCAA mark for points-after-touchdown to break the NCAA mark of 226 career PATs, set by Shawn Suisham of Bowling Green (2001-04). The 5-8 kicker has 246 career PATs. Carmody also needs just seven points to break the mark for points in a career. The Shreveport, La., native has 417 points (57 FG and 246 PAT) and is closing in on Roman Anderson's (Houston) record of 423 points (70 FG and 213 PAT) from 1998-91.

Guy Nets Two Special Teams Scores Already

Sophomore wide receiver and return specialist **Trent Guy** is rapidly becoming one of the most dangerous special teams players in the nation. Guy tied a school record for the longest kickoff return in school history with 100-yarder against Kentucky on September 15. It was Guy's second special teams score in 2007 after returning a punt 54 yards in the season opener against Murray State. Guy has three special teams scores in his career after he returned a punt 40 yards against West Virginia last season.

Carmody On Target

Senior PK **Art Carmody** became Louisville's all-time leader in scoring and field goals to cap off one of the best seasons in school history for a placekicker. Carmody also became the NCAA leader for career PATs with 241. In 2006, Carmody was named the Lou Groza Award Winner as the nation's best kicker. This season, Carmody is 10-of-14 on field goal attempts and a perfect 46-of-46 on PATS. He made three field goals in the win over NC State on September

29. He is first among active kickers in scoring (417) and third in field goals made (57). Passing Offense Falls to Fourth in the Country

After averaging 232.0 yards per game in the last two contests, the Cardinals are fourth in the nation in passing offense, averaging 360.9 yards per game. Louisville has thrown for more than 350 yards per game in every game, but three so far this season. In the win over Cincinnati, senior quarterback **Brian Brohm** recorded his sixth 300-yard game this season with 350 yards. The 360.7 yard average would be the second-best in school history. The Cardinals are also fifth in the nation with 26 touchdown throws.

Barnidge One of the Top Tight Ends in the Game

Tight end **Gary Barnidge** has quietly become one of the best tight ends in the nation and the BIG EAST Conference. Barnidge leads the conference in receptions by a tight end with a career-high 47 for 581 yards. Barnidge is sixth in the nation for receptions by a tight end. Travis Beckum of Wisconsin has a national-best 68 catches, while Martin Rucker of Missouri has 66.

Bolen Grabs Career-High in Receptions

Junior running back **Brock Bolen** seems to just do a little bit of everything in the Cardinal offense. Bolen rushed for 60 yards against Connecticut on 16 carries, but also caught a career-high five passes for 32 yards. His previous high was four receptions against Cincinnati on October 13. Bolen is second on the team in rushing with 259 yards and has also caught 11 passes for 97 yards.

Running Back Receptions

The Cardinals seem to be getting the football to the running backs in 2007. The backs have combined to catch 56 passes this season out of the backfield, which is more than they caught all of last year. Sophomore running back **Anthony Allen** has caught a team-high 19 passes for 133 yards. Junior **Brock Bolen** has also 12 balls for 109 yards and junior **George Stripling** has 17 receptions for 205 yards. Stripling caught a career-high eight passes for 105 yards against West Virginia on Thursday.

Tight End Production

Offensive coordinator Charlie Stubbs loves to use the tight end in his offense and the 2007 production portrays that. The Cardinals' tight ends have combined to catch 64 passes for 746 yards and nine touchdowns. **Gary Barnidge** has caught 47 passes for 581 yards and **Scott Kuhn** has added 14 receptions for 165 yards and two scores. Kuhn caught a huge 27-yard pass that set up the Cardinals' final touchdown in the win over Pittsburgh on October 27.

Points on the Board

It has been a long time since Louisville's football team has headed off the field without putting points on the board. Since a 32-0 loss to second-ranked Florida State on September 23, 2000, the Cardinals have gone 93 straight games without being shutout. During that stretch, the Cardinals have never been held without a touchdown.

Cardinals Seventh In the Nation in Total Offense

After being held to 382 yards of total offense in the loss to West Virginia, the Cardinals dropped to seventh in the nation in total offense with an average of 497.6 yards per game. Louisville is still averaging 6.5 yards per play, including 12.8 yards per completion. However, over the last five games, the Cardinals have averaged 401.2 yards of total offense, which was way off from the 595.4 yards of total offense that Louisville averaged in the first five games of the year.

Barnidge Reaches 100

Tight end **Gary Barnidge** has quietly had an outstanding career. He has 102 receptions for 1,417 yards. He became the fourth tight end in school history to record 100 or more career catches. Ibn Green has 217, while Jamie Asher has 153 and Ronnie Ghent owns 120. Barnidge's ranks third all-time in school history for receiving yards by a tight end. He has caught a pass in 14 straight games.

Taj Smith caught four passes for 173 yards and two touchdowns for the Orange (1-3, 1-0 Big East) as Syracuse ended Louisville's 20-game home winning streak by dominating the listless Cardinals (2-2, 0-1). The victory was Syracuse's first road conference win and first victory over a ranked team since beating Boston College at the end of the 2004 season.

Brian Brohm completed 45-of-65 passes for a career-high 555 yards and four scores for Louisville, but the Cardinals' defense allowed Syracuse - which entered the game ranked near the bottom nationally in every offensive category - to pile up 465 yards and make big play after big play.
