### Television/Radio

The USF—Elon College game will be carried throughout much of Florida via the Bulls Radio Network. The flagship station is Tampa Bay's 50,000-watt Sports Radio 820.

Jim Louk will handle play-by-play duties while former Buccaneer Mark Robinson will provide color commentary.

The pregame show with Jim Lighthall begins one hour prior to kickoff at 6 p.m. The postgame show, also hosted by Lighthall, ends approximately one hour following the game.

The affiliates also carry "Jim Leavitt's Bull Session" each week. The show airs each Thursday at 7 p.m. Louk and WZTM program director Rob Weingarten host the one-hour show which will originate from area Beef O'Brady's and Hooters locations.

SportsChannel is broadcasting six USF games while WTOG-TV in Tampa is carrying three of the six. The Southern Illinois game Oct. 18 is USF's next television game.

Al Keck, sports director at WTSP-TV, is the play-by-play announcer. He'll be joined by color analyst and former Tampa Bay Buccaneer defensive coordinator Doug Graber.

SportsChannel will also televise the Georgia Southern and Davidson contests. The SIU and Davidson games will be live broadcasts while the Georgia Southern game will be broadcast the following day.

WTOG and SportsChannel carry "The Jim Leavitt Show" each Saturday. The show can be seen at 9 a.m. on WTOG and at 11:30 a.m. on SportsChannel. The show is hosted by WTOG sports director Beasley Reece.

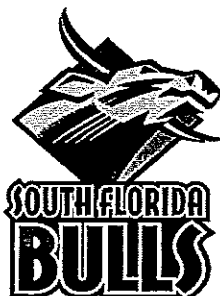

## USF Season Gains Momentum As Bulls Travel to Elon College

South Florida answered the two challenges it faced last week -- establishing its running game and stopping the nation's top offense on the way to a 33-17 win against Morehead State.

The challenge in week six is similar as the Bulls (2-3) head to Elon College (3-2). Kickoff Saturday at Burlington Memorial Stadium in Burlington, N.C., is at 7 p.m.

### The Fightin'

Christians, football veterans of 75 seasons but competing at the I-AA level for the first time, average 36.2 points per game on the strength of a offense that gains 298.6 yards per game on the ground.

"Elon averages 298 yards a game rushing the ball," said USF coach Jim Leavitt. "Wow! The bottom line in any game is you have to stop the run. We're being hit (by Elon's rushing attack) in the area where we really need to excel, so that's good. We want to work at what we need to excel at every week -- stopping the run."

The Bulls take momentum from perhaps their most impressive effort of the season to Elon.

After throwing the ball nearly 60 percent of the time in its first four games, game five saw a departure from the pass and a move toward the run.

Along the way, South Florida picked up 222 net rushing yards (57 more than it had gained on the ground in its previous three games) in the 33-17 win over Morehead State. The win stopped a three-game losing streak.

The previously pass-happy Bulls gained 170 yards through the air on 20 attempts -- 62 yards and 18 attempts below their four-game average.

The defense limited the nation's top scoring (46.3 points per game) and offensive (575.3 yards per game) club to just 355 yards -- 220 yards below its average.

"I'm encouraged with the whole picture at South Florida," said Leavitt. "I'm happy we got the win against Morehead State. But regardless of how many we win, I'm encouraged that our direction is very strong and positive."

**Marshall Smith Earns Independent Honor**

Linebacker Marshall Smith was selected the NCAA I-AA Independent National Defensive Player of the Week for his effort against Morehead State.

The 5-11, 205-pound freshman from St. Cloud, Fla., had 13 tackles including eight solos in the 33-17 USF victory. Smith led the Bulls' defense that limited the nation's top yardage offense (578.3) to 355 yards. The Eagles were also held 29 points below their scoring average.

**Riggs Bounces Back With Four Field Goals**

Two weeks after his potential game-winning 49-yard field goal attempt fell just short against Drake, Steve Riggs connected on four field goals to help South Florida overpower Morehead State.

"I was real disappointed in myself two weeks ago," said Riggs, a senior from Clearwater who played at Weber State. "I took it upon myself as a challenge to make sure I turned my season around. I think I did tonight. I was starting to lack a little confidence after that kick that I missed. But after that first field goal, then I started to feel more comfortable and definitely after that 45 I really felt a lot more comfortable out there."

Riggs earned honorable mention honors in NCAA I-AA Independent National Special Teams Player of the Week balloting.

"It's really satisfying. Right now I have to thank the offensive line. They did a heckuva job blocking for me. (Ryan) Benjamin my snapper, perfect snaps ... Glen Gauntt, perfect holds ... and I just had the easy job of putting them through."

Riggs is 7-of-9 through the season.

**Williams, Smith, Riggs, Offensive Line**

**Share Coaches' Accolades**

Rafael Williams, Marshall Smith, Steve Riggs and the offensive line earned "player of the week" honors from the USF coaching staff following the win over Morehead State.

Williams 179 yards rushing were more than the Bulls had gained on the ground as a team in the previous three weeks. The freshman running back carried the ball 30 times and scored a first-quarter touchdown that tied the game at 7-all.

"When somebody's got a hot hand, you just keep them in the ballgame and keep them going," said USF coach Jim Leavitt. "I thought he really broke out and did some nice things."

Smith led the defense with 13 tackles including eight solo tackles.

Riggs kicked field goals from 22, 27, 43 and 45 yards and moved into a tie at No. 9 nationally with 1.40 field goals per game.

**Elon Quarterback Moore Ranked Among National Rushing Leaders**

Elon quarterback Derrick Moore is ranked No. 23 among national Division II rushing leaders while averaging 106.8 yards per game on the ground. The 5-11, 180-pound freshman leads the Fightin' Christian wishbone after directing a similar offense at the prep level three seasons. The rookie led his high school teams to a three-year mark of 25-6.

DeWayne Thomas, a sophomore fullback, is averaging 32.1 yards after 10 kickoff returns. The figure is tied at No. 11 nationally.

Elon is No. 6 in rushing offense (298.6 yards per game) and No. 10 in scoring offense (36.2 points per game).

Elon is playing at the NCAA I-AA for the first time after six seasons of Division II football. The Fightin' Christians are ineligible for the I-AA playoffs until 1999 and will be listed statistically among D-II schools until then.

Elon had previously played NAIA football and won back-to-back national championships in 1980 and 1981.

**Barnhardt Leading Offense to Over 350 Yards Per Game**

Chad Barnhardt passed for a career-high 299 yards against Drake three weeks ago while also setting career bests for attempts (42) and completions (24).

The transfer from the University of South Carolina enters the sixth game of the season averaging 212 yards per game through the air. He's completed 57.5 percent of his attempts (92-of-160). The offense is accumulating 353.8 yards per game — 220 passing and 133.8 rushing.



Barnhardt has thrown five touchdown passes and two interceptions.

The native of Lake Wales enjoyed directing USF's run-oriented attack against Morehead State. "They came out tonight and took the game over. They proved a point."

Barnhardt was 13-of-20 Saturday for 170 yards. He connected with Darren Bishop on an 11-yard touchdown pass, Barnhardt's fifth of the season.

**Transfers Making An Impact**

Four USF starters are Division I transfers and all four are making significant contributions.

Quarterback Chad Barnhardt directs an offense that is averaging 353.8 yards per game. The junior transfer from South Carolina is 92-of-160 for 1,060 yards. He has five touchdown tosses.

Receiver Clif Dell (Florida State) has 15 receptions for 220 receiving yards including a 52-yard touchdown catch from Barnhardt.

Tight end Trevor Hypolite (Kentucky) has 19 catches for a team-high 247 yards. He caught five passes for 50 yards against Western Kentucky. Barnhardt and Hypolite connected on a 13-yard toss that took the Bulls to the Hilltopper 7-yard line.

Cornerback Glen Davis (Purdue) is sixth on the team with 20 tackles (15 solo) and picked up his second interception at Western Kentucky. He had a tackle for a loss as well as a pass broken up against Morehead State.

**McCready's Season Ends With ACL Tear**

Wide receiver Scott McCready tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee at practice Sept. 22 and is out for the season.

The freshman from Tampa's King High School appeared in the season's first three games and caught six passes for 103 yards. His long was for 38 yards against Drake.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt From His Weekly Press Luncheon (Tuesday, Oct. 7)

### On the first five weeks of the season ...

We were encouraged a lot by the football team mainly because I just thought they improved. From week to week we felt like after our first game we had a very good game against Kentucky Wesleyan, we played, we thought, well against The Citadel. We didn't win the game but I felt encouraged by the effort and how they improved. I felt like we dropped off against Drake. I did not think we played the kind of game we could have or should have against Drake. I was disappointed in that whole ballgame. I was happy with the effort they put forth at Western Kentucky. I thought we went up there and at least played hard and I thought we started building from there to Morehead. I really felt like we went through the game and played pretty hard.

### On the Elon game ...

My biggest concern right now is to make sure we keep improving. Like I've said from the beginning, we've got to get better. We can't just drop back off like we did before. If we do then we're not going to be successful. We've got to get better against Elon to be able to beat Elon. We've got to improve. If we don't then we're going to struggle. Morehead was a very good football team. I felt like that we did some good things but we've got to improve on a number of areas, as well.

### On the offense ...

We've got to improve on offensive consistency in the red zone. We've got to be able to put the ball in the end zone. We had a great night from (placekicker) Steve Riggs but we've got to be able to put the ball in the end zone. We've got to be able to continue to run the ball and have balance. I said from day one that we always want balance in our offense. That's never changed and we'll continue to always want that.

### On the defense ...

Defensively we've got to be able to stop the run and stop the big play and until we do that we're not going to have a real strong defense. At times we do real good in that area and at times we don't. So we're looking for consistency there but the guys are working real hard to get that, to get better at that. But I feel very good about these players and about the effort they're giving.

### On practice sessions ...

The practices have been strong. They haven't changed one bit as far as the practices go. We didn't play the Drake game as well as I wanted but they did practice pretty good (that week). They've always come to practice and worked hard. We are still learning to practice hard. They're still learning to do that. We're not necessarily great at it right now but we're improving, and we're getting better. The guys understand that you've got to practice awfully hard to be successful during those games and we're learning that. I'm real encouraged. I know this program will someday be very strong. And like I've said before I don't when

that will be. I just want to keep improving and if we do that we'll get there.

### On Elon's wishbone offense ...

Elon is a very good football team. We have not faced the wishbone yet. These players have never faced wishbone. Obviously they haven't played a season before this season so since this is the first wishbone we've faced, this is the first wishbone this team has ever faced. They present a number of problems. They're very well-coached. They have most of their starters back so they've had a year where they can play games and get ... coach Seagraves, this is their second year there, so they've had a year with most of these people in place which is a great advantage I think. It really helps you and they know what they're doing. They're well-coached. They execute real well. They're right around 300 yards a game rushing. It's going to be very difficult because you have to make sure you have someone always on the dive, always on the quarterback, always on the pitch. You've got to be very disciplined and that's hard for experienced players that have been through it a number of times. And to try to get young guys to do that requires a great deal of work and our defensive coaches are working real hard at trying to simulate what we'll see this weekend. But that's hard to simulate what you'll see when your offense doesn't even run the option so how do you get a scout team to go out there and run that look. It's nearly impossible so we're doing the best we can with it.

### On the Elon defense ...

Defensively they really have some good looking players. Inside they're big and strong. They're both, I think, 6-4, 290, in that range. And their defensive ends are both athletic. And they're both rangy, about 6-4, 6-5, about 225-230. They do a nice job with their front four. They'll be a better front four that what we faced last week. And last week's front four, really they had a couple very good players. The linebackers are much, much better than Morehead was. Two linebackers are both 240 pounds, one's 245 and the other one's 235 and the other linebacker is a very athletic player. He's about 200 pounds who really moves around the field well. The secondary is good, they're solid. They prevent the big play. They've given some things up in that part of the defense but I'm sure just like last week I'm sure their coach is working hard at those type things. You've still got to have balance or you're not going to be very successful. Their defense has probably done a lot like ours, just inconsistent at times but they do have some pretty good people on their defense. Like us, they're a young team in some areas so they're getting better all the time.

### On the Elon game in general ...

This team is a better team than Morehead. They really are. They'll be a real challenge for us. We think it will be a heckuva game. It will be a real good game. I think that our guys will compete and that's all you can ask in the fourth quarter. Hopefully, we'll get to the fourth quarter with a chance to win and then you just see what happens there. I just want our guys to compete and play hard. I can live with a lot of things if our guys will really, really play hard and give everything they've got. We're on the road we haven't won on the road yet. That's something we'd like to do someday. Really our guys haven't changed. Home or road they've gone out and played. We played hard against The Citadel, we played hard against Western

Kentucky. That's been good, we go about business. Nothing really distracts us, we just go out and play. One of the worst games we've played so far this year has been a home game. So it will be a heckuva challenge, it really be.

**On the variety of offenses USF has faced ...**

We've had a lot of different offenses that we've faced with a young group which is difficult. You go a lot of one-back your opening game with some two-back then you go right into the trap option and lead draw and then you go third game and they do a lot of various formations with one different formation that I could ... double-flank when they go twin-open formations you don't see with Drake with their lead draw and with a number of traps and the you go to the stack-I and then you come right back to four-wide and wing-T offense and then you go back over to the wishbone. I have no idea what Southern Illinois does nor do I care right now. It's good because our guys are seeing a lot of things and they've got to be able to learn this system to adjust to a lot of things. I can't imagine that we'll have to adjust too much more. Honestly, I've never had to adjust to so many things at Kansas State. There's a lot of different variety in their offenses. We have seen some similar things with the 4-3 defense quite a bit week-in and week-out.

**On the Elon kicking game ...**

Their kicking game is very good. They have blocked a number of punts. Coach Seagraves does a real good job with their special teams. You can tell he really focuses on them. We think this will probably be the best special teams group that we'll have faced. We're going to have to do very well on special teams to have a chance. That will be very important to us. We need to work very hard on that area.

**On what he expected to see this season ...**

Everything that has happened since I've been here has gone about as I've expected. I expected us to play a little bit better in the Drake game. It surprised me that Drake was able to run the ball like they did on us and that bothered me. Other than that I've been pretty happy. I've been pleasantly surprised with our offense. It's very difficult to get your offense to come around in a short period of time. I feel like our defensive players have scrapped and played hard. I didn't have real high expectations. I had expectations on laying a proper foundation. You don't focus on wins and losses right away or you're going to miss the boat on laying a proper foundation, red-shirting a number of players you need to red-shirt, developing people with the fundamentals of the game and you'll get going in the wrong direction. The wins will take care of themselves if we build and lay the proper foundation. We've got a ways to go. We feel like we'll have a pretty competitive I-AA team ... it might get into our third year because you have to get two red-shirt classes through and then you've got that one red-shirt class that's starting to play with a year of experience. It takes at least that. It really wasn't losing or winning the Drake game that bothered me it was the fact that we just didn't play hard enough to stop the running game. I thought Drake was a pretty good football team. I would imagine if they lose any they'll lose only one. Probably come down to them and Dayton I would imagine. We probably have a little bit more athletic talent on this team that I probably thought we'd have right now. But you're not going to see all your wins and losses because of talent. It's work ethic, practicing hard, learning the system. It takes around three years to learn our system, it really does.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt From Post-Game Press Conference

(Saturday, Oct. 4)

### On the win, placekicker Steve Riggs, the offense and the defense ...

I'm just really proud of Steve Riggs and what he did in the kicking. A few games ago we missed a long field goal but he came back tonight and really did a nice job tonight. I was really proud of him. I'm really proud of the way the offense ran the ball. I thought they did a great job. The way the offense controlled the ball, they did a fantastic job with that. Defensively we did some good things when we had to. We played good enough defense to win and we played good enough offense to win.

### On USF's improvement ...

There were some areas that we did improve on and I guess more than the win, that's more important to me is just if we're getting better, we're fighting and those type things. It's hard to evaluate how much we've improved until we really see film and see how guys are doing. Morehead is a very good football team. They are leading the nation in offense. I think they were averaging 43 points a game and to hold that team to 17, I'm real proud of the defensive guys even though at times it seemed like we were really struggling out there. I thought they fought the whole time. And they were averaging over 550 yards a game. They're not a bad team.

### On the running game ...

We need both Rafael (Williams) and Jermaine (Clemons) and we need Brian (Surey) and Derrick (Rackard), all of them. But I'm real proud of Rafael. He's a very good running back. Jermaine is a very good running back. We need both of them. I get real careful about giving all the accolades to Rafael. I'm real proud of him and I think he did a great job. He's just very hard to tackle and I thought he really did some nice things. I want to make sure that everybody knows we need both those guys. We feel like we have to pretty good running backs right now. When somebody's got a hot hand, you just keep them in the ballgame and keep them going and Rafael was and that's all. He ran real well tonight. I thought he really broke out and did some nice things. Marcus Rivers did an excellent job. Blocking that punt was huge and he made I know one nice catch. But I think the story really is the running game.

### On the defense ...

They didn't get a lot of big plays. We've got guys that are just still learning -- learning a great deal. We see so many different offenses. For a young team that's seen this many offenses week to week, it's amazing. I was really proud of the guys that they just hung in there. We were making adjustments throughout that game and I thought our coaches at halftime did a very good job defensively of making some adjustments. They got one touchdown in the second half so that's not bad.

### On the crowd ...

I really appreciate the people. I thought it was a great crowd. The crowd really got us going. The third quarter, the fourth quarter. I thought it was really, really significant.

### On winning versus getting better as a team ...

Everybody wants to win. That's the bottom line. I just don't want to evaluate this team on wins and losses this year and I really mean that. We can't lose sight of the win as opposed to getting better in the fundamentals. We could win a game against a lesser team and not improve is what I'm saying. We could play a much stronger team and not win and improve and I guess that's my point. Morehead was a very good team, one of the better teams we've played thus far. They're big, they're a good football team and I think they'll win a number of games.

### On the USF offense ...

We knew that our offense needed to play this week. We're facing the number one offense team in the nation and we had to keep the ball away from them. We knew that we had to run the ball. We really have to run the ball.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt From Sunday Press Briefing

(Sunday, Oct. 5)

### On the differences in USF's rushing game ...

We're doing the same things and practicing the same way. The teams we play are so different. That's why we can't use wins as a barometer. You could go out and schedule an 11-0 season if you wanted. Our guys just picked up the pace at practice. Our guys focused on the run more. Not timewisem but the intensity was higher. We practiced harder. We still need to practice even harder. As a group we still need to learn how hard to practice. We have some guys who have learned that, but we need to do that as a group. This group is as good as any freshman group as I have ever been around, but they're all playing. I don't know if we'll win any more games or not but I just want to see us improve and practice harder.

### On an ideal amount of rushing yards ...

I'm aiming for whatever amount of rushing yards it takes to win a game. Whatever that number is, it's all very relative. We're going to do what we feel defenses will allow us to do.

### On Elon's rushing attack ...

Elon averages 298 yards a game rushing the ball. Wow! The bottom line in any game is you have to stop the run. We're being hit in the area where we really need to excel, so that's good. We want to work at what we need to excel at every week, stopping the run.

### On the direction the the season ...

I'm encouraged with the whole picture at South Florida. I'm happy we got the win against Morehead. But regardless of how many we win, I'm encouraged that our direction at South Florida is very strong and positive.

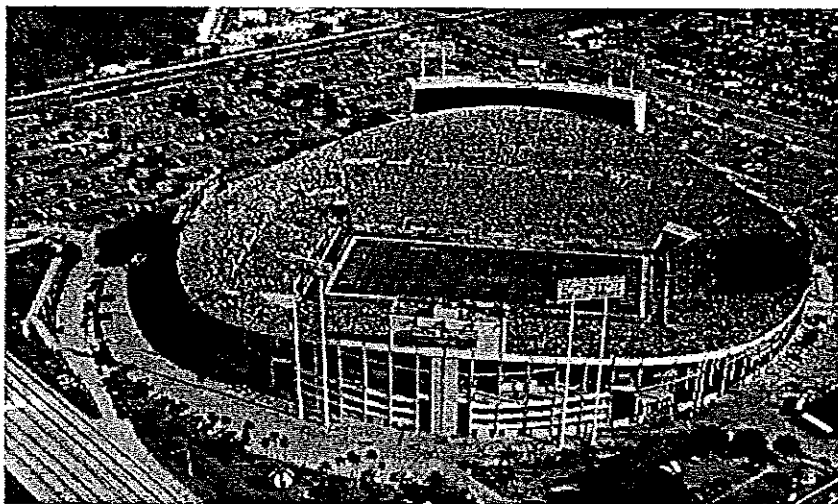
## Tampa Stadium

## NCAA Division I-AA

### Celebrates Its 20th Season

USF is believed to be the fourth university to begin football at the NCAA Division I-AA level. The others have been Monmouth in 1993, Robert Morris in 1994 and Fairfield in 1996.

After a 56-year absence LaSalle is reinstating football at the I-AA level this fall. USF is the only school in the group to offer scholarships.

The classification is celebrating its 20th anniversary in 1997, having originated in 1978.

The football classification story goes back further, however. College football teams played in either the NCAA's university division or college division until 1972.

At that point NCAA football membership was divided into Divisions I, II and III beginning with the 1973 season. Five years later, Division I was divided into I-A and I-AA.

Still more changes came just three years ago when schools that played Division I basketball and Division III football were pushed into the I-AA football ranks.

**Game 1**

**South Florida 80, Kentucky Wesleyan 3  
Tampa Stadium (49,212)**

South Florida's historic first game featured a handful of marks that could stand in the record book for some time. The most outstanding highlights from the first

statistics sheet?

- Obviously, 80 points — including 28 in the third quarter.
- Jermaine Clemons' four touchdowns (three rushing) included an 80-yard run that helped the freshman running back average 18.9 yards a carry.
- Kicker Steve Riggs was perfect with 10 PATs.
- The game attracted an overflow crowd of 49,212 to Tampa Stadium. It sold out at 4 p.m. Saturday, three hours prior to kickoff.

The opening-night numbers also included 548 total yards of offense, 23 first downs and scoring drives on 12 of 16 possessions. The defense limited the Panthers to 74 yards and had seven sacks.

"I really thought we would win," said coach Jim Leavitt. "I knew our talent level was better than what they had. I would have been surprised if we hadn't won. Kentucky Wesleyan was in a very difficult situation, coming down on a bus and playing in front of a crowd like we had. The emotion and all the momentum was in our favor."

The Bulls offense was a balanced one. USF gained 280 yards rushing and 268 yards in the air. Seven backs carried the ball, three quarterbacks saw action and connected with eight receivers.

**Game 2**

**The Citadel 10, South Florida 3  
Johnson Hagood Stadium (12,154)**

It didn't seem like a battle between a program playing its second game and a program playing its 854th. Rather, USF's first road game at The Citadel was a tight battle that

was not decided until an interception with less than two minutes remaining sealed a 10-7 victory for the Bulldogs.

The Citadel (2-0) broke a 7-all tie when Skinner connected on a 35-yard field goal with two minutes left. The drive was aided by a personal foul call that turned a 20-yard pass play into one for 35 yards.

Predictably, the Bulls weren't satisfied with the near miss. "I'm a guy who doesn't like gray areas," said coach Jim Leavitt. "I don't like to lose, it bothers me and that's all there is to it. They were better than us, they beat us, that's all there is to it."

The Bulldogs broke on top with the only score of the first half, a one-yard run from Antonio Smith that capped an 11-play, 70-yard drive.

USF (1-1) tied the game in the third quarter with a season's best 97-yard drive. Marcus Rivers ran a slant across the middle for the 12-yard touchdown catch with 4:46 left in the third. Quarterback Chad Barnhardt was nearly perfect on the drive, connecting on 9-of-11 passes including a pair of third down completions: a 26-yarder to Trevor Hypolite and a 14-yarder to Cliff Dell.

Barnhardt ended the night 21-of-41 for 189 yards. Hypolite was his favorite target with seven completions for 75 yards. Dell had four catches for 38 yards.

**Game 3**

**Drake 23, South Florida 22  
Tampa Stadium (33,827)**

Drake, a team with experience at winning, scored the game's final two touchdowns to come from behind and defeat South Florida 23-22.

One of the nation's top NCAA Division I-AA "non-scholarship" programs, Drake improved to 34-9-1 since 1993 with the win. The win over USF was the 16th in that stretch on the road.

The Bulls (1-2) built a 22-10 lead when Chad Barnhardt connected with Marcus Rivers for a 32-yard touchdown with 5:39 remaining in the third quarter.

Drake, though, answered with a pair of touchdowns to improve to 3-0.

Charlie Schimberg capped a seven-play, 45-yard drive with a seven-yard run with 2:05 left in the third to slice the USF lead to 22-16. Drake's two-point conversion attempt failed.

The Bulldogs mounted a nine-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a Jason Grove two-yard run at 4:53 in the fourth. The key play in the winning drive was a 44-yard pass from Solon Bell to Geoff Boyer that took Drake to the USF 18-yard line.

Barnhardt passed for 299 yards with 24 completions in 42 attempts. All of the junior quarterback's numbers were season-highs. Barnhardt's touchdown toss to Rivers was his fourth of the season. The TD was Rivers' second.

**Western Kentucky 31 South Florida 3  
L.T. Smith Stadium (11,200)**

Western Kentucky scored three second-quarter touchdowns including a pair in the final 1:38 of the half and handed South Florida its third consecutive loss.

The Bulls (1-3) struck first against the nation's No. 3-ranked Division I-AA club when Steve Riggs connected on a 21-yard field goal. Riggs third field goal of the season capped a 13-play, 61-yard drive with 3:40 remaining in the first quarter.

The scoring drive was highlighted by Chad Barnhardt's passing as he was six of seven (to six different receivers) including a 13-yard toss to Trevor Hypolite that took the Bulls to the Hilltopper seven-yard line. A one-yard gain by Jermaine Clemons was followed by a fumble and an incomplete pass as the drive stalled at the four-yard line.

Former Manatee High School quarterback Willie Taggart guided the Hilltoppers (5-0) to 31 unanswered points, however.

Western put together an 11-play, 80-yard drive on the next series and took a 7-3 lead. Taggart scored from the USF nine-yard line.

USF held the nation's top-ranked rushing offense on its next two possessions. After the Bulls failed to convert a fourth-and-one at its own 40, the Hilltoppers took over and built a 14-3 lead when Verron Haynes scored from five yards out to cap a quick seven-play drive.

WKU took a 21-3 lead into the half when Taggart hit Jade Gummer on a 40-yard touchdown strike.

The Hilltoppers added a field goal in the third quarter and a touchdown in the fourth to put the game out of reach.

The Bulls were hampered by nine penalties, including a pair that were particularly inopportune.

Trailing 21-3 in the third quarter, Charlie Jackson returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown that was called back by a holding call. Another third-quarter holding call brought back a 29-yard pass from Barnhardt to Hypolite that had taken the Bulls to the Western 17-yard line.

**South Florida 33, Morehead State 17  
Tampa Stadium (30,050)**

After throwing the ball nearly 60 percent of the time in its first four games, game five saw a departure from the pass and a move toward the run.

Along the way, South Florida picked up 181 net rushing yards (16 more than it had gained on the ground in its previous three games) and defeated Morehead State 33-17. The win stopped a three-game losing streak.

The previously pass-happy Bulls gained 170 yards through the air on 20 attempts -- 62 yards and 18 attempts below their four-game average.

The defense limited the nation's top scoring (46.3 points per game) and offensive (575.3 yards per game) club to just 355 yards -- 220 yards below its average.

After falling behind 7-0, the Bulls put together an 80-yard drive that featured Rafael Williams on nine of the 13 plays. He scored from 1-yard out on his way to a season's-best 179-yard night.

A pair of Steve Riggs field goals from 22 yards and a season-long 45 yards in the second quarter gave the Bulls a 13-7 halftime lead.

A field goal sliced the lead to 13-10 with 6:49 to go in the third quarter but USF put the game away with two third-quarter touchdowns. Chad Barnhardt connected with Darren Bishop for an 11-yard touchdown pass and Otis Dixon recovered a Williams fumble in the end zone as the Bulls pushed ahead 27-10.
