Three aired on WTOG-UPN 44 and one, the Hofstra game, was be televised by Fox Sports Net.

Al Keck, sports director at WTSP-TV, is the play-by-play announcer. He'll be joined by color analyst and former Tampa Bay Buccaneer defensive coordinator Doug Graber.

Seven of the eight broadcasts will be live as the Valparaiso game was shown on a next-day tape-delay.

THE BULLS RADIO NETWORK FLAGSHIP station is Tampa Bay's 50,000-watt Sports Radio 820.

Jim Louk will handle play-by-play duties while former Buccaneer Mark Robinson will provide color commentary.

The pregame show with Jim Lightall begins one hour prior to kickoff. The postgame show, also hosted by Lightall, ends approximately one hour following the game.

carry "Jim Leavitt's Bull Session" each week. The show airs each Thursday at 7 p.m. Louk hosts the one-hour show which will originate from Hooter's on Bruce B. Downs Blvd.

USF Ends Second (Regular) Season Against Morehead St.

SOUTH FLORIDA'S SECOND SEASON may or may not come to an end tonight when the Bulls host Morehead State at Raymond James Stadium. Kickoff is at 7 p.m.

The Bulls fell to 7-3 and hurt their NCAA Division I-AA playoff chances with a 28-23 loss at top-ranked Georgia Southern last Saturday.

Morehead State, unheralded despite a 9-1 record, brings a high-powered offense into the game. In fact, for the second straight week, USF will face the nation's second-ranked offense. Morehead State gained 541 yards against Kentucky Wesleyan Saturday and improved its per-game average to 494.00 yards-per-game.

USF will be trying to overcome more than the Morehead State attack, though. The Bulls will be attempting to move past the program's biggest disappointment — the near-miss at Georgia Southern that cost the program a possible playoff bid in just its second season.

"First of all we would have had to win next week which is no given," said USF coach Jim Leavitt while discussing the lost playoff possibility following the loss. "We're facing a team that I know has not played the same schedule but they're 9-1. They're coming in with a lot of confidence and our guys are going to have to get over this game."

The Bulls are 4-4 over the last two seasons the week following a loss and 1-1 this fall.

"The last time we went through a game like this was Western Kentucky and we didn't get over it and we went up and stunk up the field at Hofstra. If we don't get over this we'll do it again this week so we have to get over it and move on and press on and try to put this behind us which is not going to be easy.

"It's going to be very, very difficult," ended Leavitt.

Noting the Morehead State Game

CHAD BARNHARDT RESUMED CONTROL of the USF offense Saturday after missing the Cumberland game while recovering from a shoulder separation suffered at Charleston Southern three weeks ago. Although Barnhardt threw for the fewest yards (82) in his 20 games at USF, he did lead the offense with an outstanding running game at Georgia Southern, where the Bulls ran for 244 yards.

The senior from Lakes Wales has enjoyed a stellar senior campaign and was putting together another solid effort against Charleston Southern prior to getting knocked out just prior to the half. He was 4-for-6 for 68 yards and had a touchdown.

Barnhardt was coming off a career-high four-touchdown day at Hofstra the previous week, a day which also saw him throw for a career-best 331 yards.

Barnhardt also:

- eclipsed his 1997 touchdown total with two against Western Kentucky four weeks ago and now has 16. Barnhardt threw 10 a year ago.
- enjoyed his fifth multiple-touchdown game of the season at Hofstra three weeks ago.
- is averaging 185.2 yards passing after nine games, just under his 214.7 yards a year ago. His 57.1 percent (104-of-182) completion rate is equal with last season's rate when he completed 57.1 percent (186-of-326). He has passed for at least 100 yards in 17 of his 20 games.
- has a career average of 207.7 yards-per-game.
- has had just three non-100-yard passing days over his career and all can be attributed to injury. Barnhardt's numbers were hurt a bit against The Citadel five weeks ago when he left the game after the Bull's first series of the second half with a bruised hand. He did not return and finished the game with 97 yards, the first non-100-yard passing day of his USF career.

GLEN GAUNTT STEPPED IN FOR AN injured Chad Barnhardt at Charleston Southern and guided the Bulls to 10-second-half points and a 24-0 victory before handling the entire game against Cumberland last week.

Gauntt, a sophomore from Sarasota's Booker High School, has seen his most extensive action ever as a Bull in the last 10 quarters.

In his first start against Cumberland he threw for 266 yards while completing 13 of his 19 attempts. He tossed three touchdown passes.

Gauntt came off the bench at Charleston Southern, completing six of his 10 pass attempts for 99 yards and throwing a touchdown.

THREE BULLS HAVE STARTED EVERY GAME at USF over the last two seasons — right tackle Ivan Alicot, safety Anthony Henry and center Joey Sipp. With a start tonight, Chad Barnhardt will have started 21 of USF's 22 games behind center.

THE BULLS CAME WITHIN A FIELD GOAL of notching its second straight shutout two weeks ago. USF shut down Charleston Southern 24-0 three weeks ago and took a 48-0 lead into the fourth quarter of the Cumberland game. The Charleston

Southern shut out was USF's third ever. The first was last season at Cumberland.

Statistically, the Bulls have dropped off a bit on the national scene. Opening the season 5-0, USF was ranked No. 1 in both points allowed and yards allowed. But after surrendering 81 points and 1,008 yards in losses to Western Kentucky and Hofstra, the rankings dipped to No. 18 in both scoring and total defense.

The defense limited Charleston Southern to 165 yards three weeks ago and Cumberland 177 yards a week later and the Bulls enter tonight's game No. 12 in total defense (280.4 yards-per-game) and 10th in scoring defense (15.6 points-per-game).

"Rick Kravitz had the No. 1 defense there for awhile," said Jim Leavitt, "and then I think we had the worst defense for awhile and then we go right back and shut out a team so you have to give a lot of credit to Rick and the defensive staff for hanging in there and battling."

BARRING A PLAYOFF BID, A DOZEN USF PLAYERS will play their final game for the Bulls tonight. The 12 include offensive tackle Ivan Alicot, defensive end Brett Avery, quarterback Chad Barnhardt, wide receiver Darren Bishop, defensive tackle Derek Busciglio, wide receiver Cliff Dell, wide receiver Dudley Hill, tight end Trevor Hypolite, tight end Wes Marshall, defensive tackle Rafael Perez, defensive back Mike Sandy and linebacker Cedric Tate.

Eleven of the 12 transferred to USF after they began their collegiate careers prior to a program's existence on the Tampa campus. Only Busciglio is not a transfer. A graduate of Plant City High School, he enrolled at USF prior to the program existing, and he chose to walk on once the program did begin.

LONG DISTANCE TOUCHDOWNS have been a common occurrence for the 1998 Bulls. Among the 46 (42 offensive, three defensive, one special teams) touchdowns this season for USF, 19 have been for 20 yards or more, 12 have gone 40 yards or more and six have been for 50 yards or more. Twice this season, Chad Barnhardt has thrown for a 75-yard touchdown pass to Cliff Dell. And, Rafael Williams has an 86-yard touchdown run.

USF COACH JIM LEAVITT is one 12 finalists for The Sports Network's Coach of the Year Award. The honor is actually known as the Eddie Robinson Award.

The other finalists include Randy Ball of Western Illinois, Todd Berry of Illinois State, L.C. Cole of Tennessee State, Kevin Higgins of Lehigh, Cliff Hysell of Montana State, Billy Joe of Florida A&M, Paul Johnson of Georgia Southern, Bobby Keasler of McNeese State, Mark Whipple of Massachusetts, Mike Williams of Jacksonville State and Alvin Wyatt Sr. of Bethune-Cookman.

BILL GRAMATICA NEEDED JUST NINE GAMES to become USF's single-season and career scoring leader. The sophomore placekicker had two field goals and nine extra points against Cumberland and has now scored 86 points. He surpassed kicker Steve Riggs who scored 76 points in 1997.

These records assume Elon College is classified as a I-AA scholarship team although the program is currently in the second year of a two-year probationary period as they move from Division II football.

NOW WITH SEVEN WINS, USF has eclipsed last season's victory total of five. And, the Bulls' improvement shows up in more places than the win column. The Bulls have shown substantial improvement on the statistics sheet, as well.

The offense, which averaged 27.9 points-per-game last season, is currently scoring at a clip of 36.4 points-per-game. The offense is covering 29 more yards per game than last season (402.5 vs. 373).

Currently it is the rushing that is responsible for the increase. The ground game is covering 38 more yards-per-game (180.5 vs. 142.1) than a year ago while the Bulls passing numbers are nearly identical to 1997 (221 vs. 231).

The Bulls have more ground weapons in 1998. USF had just two in the backfield who rushed for more than 10 yards a game in their first season when Rafael Williams and Jermaine Clemons averaged 66.3 and 62.4 yards-per-game.

The current backfield features five who rush for at least 20 per game. Rafael Williams leads the group with 46.7 yards followed by newcomer LaFann Williams at 45.8, Otis Dixon at 38.9, Clemons at 27.4 and Dyrall McMillan at 25.4.

THE NEW WEAPONS INCLUDE A VETERAN, sophomore fullback Otis Dixon. The Clearwater native is an outstanding blocker who paved the way for Rafael Williams and Jermaine Clemons a year ago.

And, after rushing for just 32 yards on 11 attempts as a freshman, Dixon has become a threat with the ball, not just in front of it.

Although he had just one carry in the first two games, Dixon has rushed for 387 yards in 63 carries in the last eight games. He's found the end zone 10 times in those eight games (eight times rushing, twice on a reception) and averaging 6.1 yards-per-rush.

He has set career rushing highs in each of three games against ranked opponents - Western Kentucky, Hofstra and Georgia Southern. He had a then-career-best 71 yards on 10 carries against Western Kentucky. His night was highlighted by a career-

long 23-yard rush in the second quarter after his 18-yard run — his then-second longest — set up a Bill Gramatica field goal in the first quarter.

Those numbers were all bettered at Hofstra. Dixon rushed for a team-high 72 yards on seven carries with a long of 21 yards. He caught a pair of passes for 54 yards including a career-best 48 yard touchdown pass.

At Georgia Southern, he did it again with 89 yards on 12 carries, including a career long 55-yard run. He also had two touchdowns in the game.

A PAIR OF TRANSFERS have impacted the backfield, as well. LaFann Williams, a native of Pahokee, Fla., who played at Pittsburgh in 1996 and 1997, is averaging 6.1 yards-per-carry and 45.8 yards-per-game.

Dyrall McMillan, a native of Bradenton, Fla., who played at Miami in 1995 and 1996, is coming off his top game as a Bull. The junior rushed for a game-high 102 yards and scored three touchdowns against Cumberland. He is just the second Bull to score three rushing touchdowns in a game. Jermaine Clemons had three rushing touchdowns (and one touchdown reception) in USF's inaugural game against Kentucky Wesleyan in 1997.

McMillan also had a solid game against Elon six weeks ago, rushing for a then-season-high 42 yards on six carries. Forty of those yards came on one series in the fourth quarter — a series which ended when McMillan took the ball into the end zone from two yards out.

He's averaging 5.2 yards-per-rush after 44 carries.

A MONTH AGO THE BULLS WERE ENJOYING a Jeff Sagarin computer ranking of No. 87 — seventh among I-AA teams and ahead of 32 I-A teams.

USF, though, is No. 137 after losses to Western Kentucky and Hofstra and wins over Charleston Southern and Cumberland.

The Bulls are still in front of seven I-A teams — Conference USA member Cincinnati, independent Southwestern Louisiana, Western Athletic Conference member Hawaii, and Mid-American Conference teams Northern Illinois, Eastern Michigan, Ball State and Kent.

USF'S RED ZONE OFFENSE continued to be impressive against Charleston Southern, Cumberland and Georgia Southern. The Bulls capitalized on 17 of its 18 scoring opportunities inside the 20-yard line over the last three weeks. USF scored on all nine of its red zone visits against Cumberland and all four at Georgia Southern.

USF has been inside the red zone 41 times and has scored points 37 times. USF has put the ball in the end zone 27 of those 37 times and connected on 10 field goals. Once inside the 20, USF has not been intercepted or lost a fumble.

EQUALLY IMPRESSIVE IN THE RED ZONE have been USF opponents, although the Bulls have done a good job of keeping opposition from reaching that area.

With 21 red zone opportunities, opponents have scored touchdowns on 16 occasions and kicked field goals three times. That includes 14 rushing touchdowns and two through the air.

The Bulls have stopped offenses just twice in the red zone all season. The first was at Hofstra four weeks ago and the second was three weeks ago at Charleston Southern when the Buccaneers had a first-and-goal at the three-yard line. Charleston

Southern had a one-yard loss, a one-yard gain and a pair of incomplete passes as the Bulls took over on downs.

USF IS 3-3 WHEN IT CARRIES a national ranking into a game but is 0-5 against nationally-ranked opponents. The Bulls had protected their Top 25 ranking over two weeks with lopsided wins over The Citadel and Elon before falling to Western Kentucky and to Hofstra.

Western Kentucky had been No. 20 in The Sports Network poll and No. 21 in the ESPN/USA Today poll. Hofstra was No. 18 according to ESPN/USA Today and No. 20 by The Sports Network. Georgia Southern was the consensus #1 when the Bulls played there last week.

USF played two ranked opponents in 1997, losing 31-3 at Western Kentucky and 24-23 to Georgia Southern at Tampa Stadium.

FOR THE THIRD WEEK IN A ROW Bill Gramatica leads the nation's field goal kickers.

The sophomore is tied with Hofstra's Chad Johnson with 1.50 field goals-per-game. Gramatica led the nation through mid-October before reclaiming the position.

He is 15-of-18 with a career-long of 44 yards. Gramatica is tied at No. 15 in scoring with 9.00 points-per-game.

Chad Barnhardt moved up from seventh to sixth in pass efficiency.

ALTHOUGH THEY'RE NOT RELATED, Rafael Williams and LaFann Williams share many backfield characteristics from a statistical point of view.

Rafael has averaged 46.7 yards per game and 5.2 yards per carry and LaFann is churning out a nearly identical 45.8 yards per game and 6.1 yards per carry.

The two have combined for seven touchdowns. LaFann's have been explosive scores from 57, 45 and 15 yards. Rafael's have been on runs of 86 (a USF record), 21 yards, four yards and one yard.

DARREN BISHOP, ISAAC BRISTOL & TONY UMHOLTZ ARE ON THE GTE Academic All-District III ballot. Bishop, a senior wide receiver, is making a bid for his second GTE honor. The English major was a GTE District III Academic All-American a year ago.

Bishop was honored at halftime of last week's game as the Burger King Division I-AA College Football Scholar Athlete of the Week. Burger King donated \$10,000 to USF's general scholarship fund in Bishop's name.

Bristol, a sophomore offensive tackle, started eight games a year ago and plays significantly this fall. He's majoring in education and is considering a career working in special education.

Umholtz is a business major and is averaging just under 40 yards per punt, while allowing an average return of just two yards.

USF'S ROSTER FEATURES 13 PLAYERS WHO HAVE "come home" to Florida or, more specifically, to the Tampa Bay area.

That includes six newcomers, five of which are on the Bulls' depth chart: junior wide receiver Rj Anderson (Brigham Young), sophomore defensive tackle Djems Don (Pittsburgh), sophomore placekicker Bill Gramatica (Florida State), junior running back

Seven transfers who made major contributions a year ago return. That group, which includes five on the two-deep list, includes senior defensive end Brett Avery (Rutgers), senior quarterback Chad Barnhardt (South Carolina), junior cornerback Glenn Davis (Purdue), Clif Dell (Florida State), senior tight end Trevor Hypolite (Kentucky), senior cornerback Mike Sandy (Rutgers) and senior linebacker Cedric Tate (Duke).

SEASON TICKETS CONTINUE TO BE a hot commodity in USF's second season. USF sold 21,629 a year ago and 15,950 this fall. Individual game tickets are available through TicketMaster at (813) 287-2844.

OVER HALF OF USF'S PLAYERS are Tampa Bay-area natives. Forty-four players on the 86-man roster played prep football in Hillsborough, Pinellas, Sarasota, Manatee, Pasco and Polk counties.

Pinellas County leads the list with 18 players followed by Hillsborough County with 16. Manatee, Pasco and Polk are each represented by four players while Sarasota has two and Pasco one.

MIKE SNELLGROVE AND DEVIN SANDERSON ARE UNIQUE AMONG the 86 Bulls. Snellgrove, a native of Dothan, Ala., and Devin Sanderson, a native of Mullica Hills, N.J., are the only Bulls who are not Florida natives.

Snellgrove, a tight end, was exposed to the USF program through his prep coaches who attended a USF football coaching clinic.

Sanderson is a punter.

Both are the first non-Floridians to play at USF. Two out-of-state walk-ons passed through the program in preseason a year ago although neither were on the squad's opening day roster.

NATURALLY, USF HAS ENJOYED many football-firsts over since receiving approval to initiate its program from the Florida Board of Regents in September, 1995.

One of the most anticipated was the move into Raymond James Stadium. The Citadel game was the first of five USF games at RJS this fall. USF has 10 one-year contracts to play at the \$168.5-million facility.

Other tenants include the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and, possibly, the Tampa Bay Mutiny. Annual events held at RJS include the Outback Bowl, Superbowl of Motorsports, Supercross and the American Invitational equestrian competition.

While RJS seats 65,321, the Bulls use only the lower bowl, including both end zones, and capacity is 41,441.

All seats are theatre-style with cup holders. The configuration includes 12,332 club seats.

The stadium is located at 4201 N. Dale Mabry Highway and is accessible off of Interstate 275. RJS features its own web site at www.stadianet.com.

FOUR CAPTAINS LEAD A STILL-YOUNG Bull squad. The quartet includes senior guard Ivan Alicot, who also captained the inaugural team, along with senior quarterback Chad Barnhardt, junior free safety Anthony Henry and sophomore linebacker Demetrius Woods.

TAMPA STADIUM AND RAYMOND JAMES STADIUM ARE AMONG the nation's largest facilities that feature NCAA Division I-AA football tenants.

In fact, the facilities' total capacities are the largest in I-AA while the configurations used for USF games rank the capacities behind a handful of stadiums.

The Yale Bowl lists a capacity of 64,269 followed by Jackson State's Memorial Stadium (62,512), Pennsylvania's Franklin Field (60,546), Princeton's Palmer Stadium (45,725) and Harvard Stadium (37,967).

USF used a configuration of 46,500 at 74,301-seat Tampa Stadium and will use a configuration of 41,441 at 66,321-seat RJS. Tampa Stadium, then, ranked fourth among I-AA facilities and RJS ranks sixth.

TAMPA — South Florida struck quickly and often en route to its 39-10 season-opening thumping of Slippery Rock at Tampa Stadium.

The Bulls' eight scoring "drives" consisted of just 31 plays as the Bulls used only 13:57.

After USF's first two drives ended with a pair of Bill Gramatica field goals from 37 and 38 yards, the fast-moving Bull offense needed just one play — a 75-yard pass from Chad Barnhardt to Cliff Dell — to build a 13-0 lead.

Slippery Rock, a NCAA Division II team that brought a preseason ranking of No. 12 into the game, struck back with a 29-yard touchdown pass from Randy McKavish to David Flick. That would be

one of just four completions for McKavish, though, the 1997 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Player of the Year.

LaFann Williams gave the Bulls a 19-7 lead midway through the second quarter with a 45-yard dash up the middle.

The second half was more of the same with two Gramatica field goals (from 37 yards in the third quarter and 27 in the fourth), another Barnhardt-to-Dell touchdown (this one a 56-yard strike in the third) and a 21-yard run from Rafael Williams in the fourth.

While the offense scored 39 points, the defense limited the Rockets to just 185 total yards, had seven tackles for a loss, two interceptions, broke up 10 passes and recovered a fumble.

The Bulls scored seven touchdowns, including five in the first half, to blow out Valparaiso 51-0 in the last football game ever at the 32-year-old stadium. The Bulls scored 11 touchdowns too upend Kentucky Wesleyan in USF's inaugural game in 1997.

Gramatica delivered the most significant kick in South Florida's short history and sent the Bulls past Liberty 24-21.

Gramatica, who entered the game leading the nation's field goal kickers with 2.50 per game, tightened his grip on the top position with a pair of third quarter field goals that gave the Bulls a 13-7 advantage.

It was his final field goal that will go down in the record book, though.

After Liberty knotted the score at 21-all at 3:33 in the fourth, the Bulls put together their fifth scoring drive of the second half. The nine-play drive covered 53 yards and featured Otis Dixon rushing for 18 yards on four carries as well as a 30-yard pass from Chad Barnhardt to Rj Anderson that took the Bulls to the Liberty 24-yard line.

That set up a 44-yard Gramatica field goal as time expired. The kick was the longest in the kicker's early career.

Liberty put the only points of the first half on the board with an 80-yard pass play in the second quarter.

But USF scored on all three of its third-quarter drives to build a 13-7 lead. A 10-yard pass from Barnhardt to Leon Matthews tied the score and was followed by two Gramatica field goals.

Liberty took the lead with a quick four-play drive that covered 67 yards and was capped off by a Stacey Nobles 15-yard run early in the fourth quarter and USF was forced to come from behind again.

The Bulls answered with 90-yard drive that ended with a five-yard run from Otis Dixon gave the Bulls a 21-14 lead with 6:04 to play.

Liberty, though, took advantage of a 45-yard kickoff return and, eventually, a fourth-down holding call that kept the drive alive and took the ball to the USF 22 yard line. Nobles second touchdown of the fourth quarter tied the score at 21.

TAMPA, FLA. — What was more impressive? South Florida's new \$168.5 million Raymond James Stadium, an offense that lit up the first-half scoreboard for 35 points or a defense that held The Citadel to 36 rushing yards?

Doesn't matter.

The three elements combined to make USF's 45-6 destruction of The Citadel, a team that knocked off the Bulls 10-7 a year earlier, nearly as memorable as the program's inaugural game in 1997.

The Bulls entered the game ranked No. 23 by The Sports Network and No. 25 by ESPN/USA Today and showed they are ready to move up.

Chad Barnhardt connected with Charlie Jackson on the game's third play for a 48-yard touchdown strike with less than a minute off the clock.

Roy Manns intercepted a Stanley

Myers pass on The Citadel's second play of its first drive, returned it 32 yards for a touchdown, and with 13:10 left in the first quarter the rout was on.

Rafael Williams and Otis Dixon scored on rushes of four yards and one yard in the second quarter as the Bulls built a 28-0 lead. A 50-yard pass from wide receiver Charlie Jackson to wide receiver Leon Matthews allowed USF to take a 35-0 lead into the half. The touchdown reception was Matthews team-high third of the season.

Jermaine Clemons entered the game with just 25 yards on three 1998 carries but led the rushing attack with a season-high 91 yards on nine carries. LaFann Williams added 90 yards and Rafael Williams became USF's first 1,000-yard career rusher with 60 yards. He surpassed the mark with a two-yard run in the third quarter.

TAMPA, FLA. — For the second consecutive week South Florida avenged a blemish from its inaugural season.

The Bulls handled Elon College 35-7, easing the pain somewhat of last season's 41-13 loss to the Fightin' Christians.

The win came just a week after USF dismantled The Citadel in similar fashion. in a 45-6 rout.

After Chad Barnhardt opened The Citadel game with a 48-yard touchdown strike to Charlie Jackson, the two connected again, opening USF's scoring activity against Elon with a 46-yard touchdown pass.

Less than two minutes later, Barnhardt found Cliff Dell just past midfield who took the ball in for a 75-yard score, and, just like a week earlier, the Bulls took a 14-0 advantage into the second quarter.

Barnhardt threw his third touchdown pass to Rj Anderson, this one a 40-yarder across the middle, and the Bulls led 21-0 with 4:08 remaining in the first half.

Otis Dixon scored on a five-yard rush in the third quarter — again, just as he had to highlight USF's third period a week earlier — and USF led 28-0 with 1:22 left.

Dyral McMillan put together his most productive game while gaining 40 of his season-high 42 yards on one series in the fourth quarter. The transfer from Miami who led the Hurricanes with 565 yards in 1996, capped off the drive with a two-yard run with 8:56 left in the game.

Elon avoided the shut out when Shawn Ferguson scored from two yards out with :30 remaining in the game.

Barnhardt passed for three touchdowns for the second time in his career while enjoying his third multiple-touchdown game of the season and the fifth of his career.

TAMPA, FLA. — South Florida followed its 1998 script by building a big first-half lead but ad-libbed the second half and dropped its first game of the season 31-24 to Western Kentucky.

The loss was the first for USF at Raymond James Stadium and also ended a six-game winning streak dating back to 1997.

The Bulls, ranked a season-high No. 12 in both The Sports Network and the ESPN/USA Today polls, were playing their first ranked opponent of the season. The Hilltoppers were No. 19 in The Sports Network poll, No. 21 in the ESPN/USA Today poll.

USF built a 17-point lead midway through the second quarter with a 27-yard field goal from Bill Gramatica, a 14-yard pass from Chad Barnhardt to Rj Anderson and a 12-yard run by Otis Dixon.

The defense, though, ranked No. 1 in the nation while allowing just 206.6 yards and 8.8 points-per-game, could not contain Hilltopper option-quarterback Willie Taggart.

The Sarasota native led the Hilltopper offense to 380 yards on the ground — gaining 206 of them himself. He surpassed the 3,000-yard career rushing plateau and also completed five-of-nine passes for 56 yards.

He led the Hilltoppers back with a 64-yard run in the second period to set up Western's first touchdown before putting the ball in the end zone with a two-yard rush.

That touchdown was the first of his three. His seven-yard run in the third quarter narrowed USF's lead to 17-14. A remarkable 28-yard run in the fourth with the game tied at 24-24, was the game-winner with 9:40 remaining.

HEMPSTEAD, N.Y. — Hofstra used an arsenal of offensive weapons, for which South Florida had little or no defense, en route to a 50-30 victory.

The Flying Dutchmen, ranked No. 18 in the ESPN/USA Today poll and No. 20 by The Sports Network, compiled 572 yards of offense — 315 through the air and 257 on the ground.

The yardage was the most ever allowed by USF. So were the points. The margin of defeat was the second-highest (USF lost by 28 points to both Western Kentucky and Elon in 1997).

The defense, ranked No. 1 nationally by both yardage and points allowed just two weeks earlier after opening the season 5-0, had not allowed a first-quarter score all season.

Hofstra, though, reached the end zone twice in the opening 15 minutes. Giovanni Carmazzi connected with Vaughn Sanders for both — an eight-yard

pass with 9:05 left and a seven-yard pass with 4:14 remaining.

Hofstra added to more touchdowns in the second frame — one a Carmazzi one-yard rush and the other a 22-yard interception return by Sal Alosi.

The Bulls used a 28-yard Bill Gramatica field goal and a Chad Barnhardt-to-Otis Dixon 48-yard pass to trail 26-10 at halftime.

Barnhardt kept the Bulls in the game with a 37-yard touchdown pass to Cliff Dell on USF's first possession of the second half.
