**THIS WEEK'S GAME:** The Wildcats have put together two consecutive wins and appear to be on the right track after losing three straight in September. The team sits at the .500 mark with a 3-3 record and will be traveling to Tampa, Fla., this week for a matchup with South Florida, a team that has been quite successful at 5-2. UNH posted a satisfying victory over Northeastern last week (33-31) thanks to a very impressive offensive performance put together by senior fullback and co-captain **Dan Kreider** (Mount Joy, Pa.) who compiled a career-best 184 yards rushing on just 18 carries for an average of 10.2 yards per rush. South Florida has an outstanding scoring threat in R.J. Anderson who caught two touchdown passes in the 14-13 win over Illinois State. The teams will be playing in the same stadium as the Tampa Bay Bucs of the NFL.

**THE SERIES:** These two teams will be meeting for the first time ever. However, South Florida will be playing another Atlantic 10 team later this season when the squad travels to James Madison University on Oct. 30. The team will also battle Eastern foe Hofstra on Nov. 13 in Florida. The squad plays in Raymond James Stadium, which is the same home venue for the NFL's Tampa Bay Bucs and holds no less than 41,441 fans. The squad is coached by two-year head coach Jim Leavitt, who was 13-9 entering this season. South Florida is an independent and not affiliated with any conference. Nicknamed the Bulls, USF runs a pro set on offense and a 4-3 defensive scheme. All 11 starters returned to the squad on defense which should make it tough for the Wildcats to move the ball as well as they have this season, averaging 459.3 yards per game.

**UNH OFFENSE IS OUTDISTANCING OPPONENTS IN TOTAL OFFENSE:** The Wildcats are both outrushing (1,361-1,121 yards) and outpassing (1,395-1,275) their collective opponents. Those numbers add up to 2,756 yards of total offense for the 'Cats. Here is a look at the impressive yardage the UNH offense has racked up thus far in the 1999 season.

**UNH WILDCATS LEAD THE ATLANTIC 10 IN TOTAL OFFENSE AND THIRD DOWN CONVERSIONS AND IS SECOND IN FIRST DOWNS MADE:** The UNH Wildcat offense is tearing it up. In terms of total offense, the Wildcats are ranked first in the Atlantic 10 with an average of 452 yards per game. UNH also leads the conference in third-down conversions with 53 out of 100 chances made for a percentage of .530. The Wildcats also are giving up the fewest sacks of any conference team with just nine for 33 yards which says a lot for its large offensive line. UNH also leads the conference in field goal percentage with .833 (5x6).

**UNH FOOTBALL PLAYERS AMONG THE ATLANTIC 10 FOOTBALL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL LEADERS:**

**UNH WINS CAT AND DOG FIGHT VS. HUSKIES OF NORTHEASTERN, 33-31:** None of the UNH seniors had ever won a game at Northeastern until this year, as the Wildcats posted a hard-fought 33-31 road victory over the Huskies in Brookline, Mass. Senior fullback Dan Kreider (Mount Joy, Pa.) was the star of the day as he averaged an incredible 18.2 yards per carry on the day after rushing 18 times for a career-high 184 yards. The Wildcats led the entire game, leading 10-0 in the first quarter, 23-14 in the second, and 30-17 in the third. The difference in the game was a 27-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Peter Carbonara (Queens, N.Y.), who gave the Wildcats a 33-24 advantage with 3:59 to play in the game. A Fred Vallett 10-yard touchdown run closed the gap to 33-31, but UNH ran out the clock and took home the victory. Sophomore quarterback Ryan Day (Manchester, N.H.) was extremely efficient connecting on 19x23 passes for 171 yards and a touchdown. On the defensive side of things, junior linebacker Brett Bashaw (Newburyport, Mass.) recorded a team-high tackles on the afternoon, while redshirt freshman sensation Czar Wiley (North Bergen, N.J.) came up with his second career interception.

**1998 WALTER PAYTON AWARD WINNER JERRY AZUMAH IS BACK, SORT OF?** A statement like that could put opponent head coaches in a panic, but they need not worry, as Azumah has no more eligibility with the Wildcats. He will, however, be around for the Wildcats' contest vs. South Florida. It seems the Chicago Bears (Jerry's new team) are playing the Tampa Bay Bucs on the Sunday following the

UNH game in the very same stadium, Raymond James Stadium to be exact. As a result, many UNH alumni in the area will be treated to not only a quality UNH football game, but they will also be able to watch Azumah play in the NFL. Not a bad weekend if you are a UNH fan.

**CZAR WILEY NAMED ATLANTIC 10 FOOTBALL CONFERENCE ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:** Redshirt freshman defensive back Czar Wiley (North Bergen, N.J.) was named the Atlantic 10 Football Conference's Rookie of the Week after compiling a career-high 13 tackles in the Wildcats' impressive 38-28 victory over the Lumberjacks of Stephen F. Austin on Oct. 2. In addition, 10 of his 13 total tackles were made unassisted, and he finished the day with two tackles for a loss of 2 yards. Wiley, a graduate of North Bergen High School, played for the 1997 Group 4 State Championship squad, competed in the North/South game, and played in the New Jersey/New York Governors' Bowl. He was also all-conference, all-league and all-state in 1997, while also being named the 1997 "Hudson Reporter Athlete of the Year".

**WILDCATS END LOSING SKID WITH 38-28 VICTORY OVER STEPHEN F. AUSTIN:** Dan Curran ran for two touchdowns on 101 yards as New Hampshire defeated Stephen F. Austin 38-28 on Saturday. Two fourth-quarter interceptions by New Hampshire's Wade Rowcliffe and Jody Trunfio helped the Wildcats (2-3, 2-3 Atlantic 10) hold off a surging Stephen F. Austin (2-2). The Lumberjacks trailed 21-3 at half-time, but cut New Hampshire's lead to 28-21 late in the third quarter when KaRon Coleman (147 yards rushing, two touchdowns) jumped over the pile for a 1-yard touchdown. New Hampshire kicked a field goal to extend the lead 31-21 at the end of the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, the two teams traded touchdowns as New Hampshire quarterback Ryan Day (172 yards passing) and Stephen F. Austin quarterback Wes Pate (300 yards passing) each rushed for a touchdown. Dan Kreider caught a 17 yard touchdown pass in the first half to put New Hampshire on the board 7-0. New Hampshire would hold the lead for the remainder of the game. Kreider added 105 yards rushing. In addition to 147 yards rushing, Coleman added 122 yards receiving in a losing effort.

**WILDCATS SUFFER ANOTHER TOUGH LOSS AT RICHMOND (27-17):** It was another tough day for the Wildcats in terms of turnovers as Richmond went on to a 27-17 victory at Richmond Stadium. The Spiders took advantage of nearly turnover and led 13-0 after the first quarter. However, UNH got back in the contest with a team safety, a 6-yard touchdown run by tailback Dan Curran (Chelmsford, Mass.) and

a two-point conversion on the TD from sophomore quarterback Ryan Day (Manchester, N.H.) to senior wide receiver Jermaine Washington (West Milford, N.J.). However, Richmond went on to score two straight touchdowns and led 20-10 heading into the final stanza. Curran finished off the scoring on the day for the Wildcats with a 6-yard reception from Day, but it was too little too late as Richmond went on to win. UNH fell to 1-3, 1-3, while the Spiders improved to 2-2, 1-2.

**WILDCATS FALL SHORT VS. JAMES MADISON (35-28):** Had it not been for three UNH fumbles recovered by James Madison, the outcome of this game might have been different. But as it stood, the three fumbles led to three JMU scores (two field goals and a touchdown). On the positive side, the UNH offense moved the ball well once again with a total of 450 yards of offense. Unfortunately JMU compiled 464 yards on the day. Senior tailback Dan Curran (Chelmsford, Mass.) had another big day stat-wise with 121 yards and two touchdowns. You also have to be impressed with the numbers posted by sophomore quarterback Ryan Day (Manchester, N.H.) who completed 20x35 passes for 268 yards, one touchdown and an impressive zero interceptions. After trailing 20-14 at the half, UNH kept it close and eventually held a 21-20 lead with 4:32 to play in the third quarter on a 10-yard TD run by Curran. UNH tied the score at 28 with 2:07 to play in the contest but it was not enough as JMU's Curtis Keaton ran for a 3-yard TD with 20 seconds to play to ice the win for the Dukes.

**WILDCATS SUFFER DEFEAT AT MASSACHUSETTS (34-19):** The Minutemen of UMass showed why the team is the defending national champion as it rolled over UNH on Sept. 11 by a 34-19 margin. After a scoreless first quarter dominated by solid defense on both sides, UMass took control, outscoring the Wildcats (21-3) in the second quarter. When the home team outscored UNH 13-0 in the third quarter to make it 34-3 the game was basically over. UNH played well in the second half, however, as junior wide receiver Kamau Peterson (Windsor, Ont.) caught a 30-yard pass from sophomore quarterback Ryan Day (Manchester, N.H.) and junior wide receiver Randal Williams (Westbury, N.Y.) grabbed a 10-yarder from Day. Day finished his day with a career-high 351 passing yards and completed 26x44 passes on the afternoon.

**WILDCATS OPEN SEASON IN STYLE WITH ATLANTIC 10 VICTORY AT RHODE ISLAND (UNH 37, URI 14):** First-year head coach Sean McDonnell said that he would like to have more than the 175 wins totaled by former head coach Bill Bowes.

Well McDonnell needs just 174 more after the team put together an impressive 37-14 victory at Rhode Island. The offense was explosive with 504 yards of total offense. Leading the way was senior tailback Dan Curran (Chelmsford, Mass.), who rushed for 167 yards and three touchdowns of one yard, 18 yards and a huge 63-yarder. All were career-highs as Curran has waited in the wings for the graduation of NCAA all-time leading rusher and Walter Payton Award winner Jerry Azumah. Also playing well on offense was sophomore quarterback Ryan Day (Manchester, N.H.), a local product out of Manchester Central, who connected on 15x26 passes for 223 yards and one touchdown to senior receiver Jermaine Washington. The Wildcats also received a strong effort on defense, as the team recorded three sacks and had a pair of interceptions. It looked as though the game would be close early, but 20 points in the first quarter alone by the Wildcats and three in the second and seven in each of the final two quarters helped the 'Cats to pull away.

**BIG-PLAY DEFENSE COMES UP BIG IN VICTORY OVER STEPHEN F. AUSTIN:** UNH took advantage of many fine defensive plays in the 38-28 victory over Stephen F. Austin on Oct. 2. Leading the way were senior defensive end (New Hartford, N.Y.) and senior strong safety Wade Rowcliffe (Caledonia, N.Y.), each with interceptions. Junior linebacker John Paul (Manchester, N.H.) recorded a sack and sophomore converted defensive lineman Mike Wells (Salem, N.H.) came up with a huge fumble recovery and a sack.

**MANCHESTER NATIVE JOHN PAUL TAKES ADVANTAGE OF STARTING OPPORTUNITY:** Sophomore linebacker John Paul (Manchester, N.H.) made the most of his first start of the season, following a knee injury to teammate Rudy Marciano (Moosic, Pa.). Playing at what is called the "SAM" position at middle linebacker, Paul was the top tackler in the Richmond game with a career-high 12 tackles. Coaches had high praise for his efforts after the game, as the entire defense is showing tremendous improvement week in and week out.

**MARCIANO RECORDS CAREER-HIGH 15 TACKLES AT MASSACHUSETTS:** Junior linebacker Rudy Marciano (Moosic, Pa.) recorded a career-high 15 tackles in the loss at Massachusetts on Sept. 11. He notched three unassisted tackles and 12 assists to surpass his previous record of 14 tackles recorded vs. Northeastern last season.

**BASHAW LEADS THE TACKLE LIST: FIVE OTHER DEFENDERS REGISTERING 30 TACKLES OR HIGHER FOR THE WILDCATS:** If you

look at the UNH defensive stat sheet you can see ONE Wildcat with over 40 tackles and five with 30 or more. Here's a look at UNH's top defenders so far this season. Junior linebacker Brett Bashaw (Newburyport, Mass.) leads the way with 45.

**RYAN DAY SHOWS PROMISE AT QUARTERBACK FOR THE WILDCATS AFTER FOUR WEEKS:** Sophomore quarterback Ryan Day (Manchester, N.H.) has proven to be a great choice to start at quarterback. In six games, he has connected on 115x192 passes for no less than 1,355 yards of offense and eight touchdowns. Not to mention the fact that he has thrown for three two-point PATs for the Wildcats. In his first season at quarterback, he is also highly ranked in the Atlantic 10 in passing yardage and total offense.

**DAN CURRAN NAMED ATLANTIC 10 OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Senior tailback Dan Curran (Chelmsford, Mass.) was named the Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week after rushing for 167 yards and three touchdowns of 1, 49, and 63 yards for the Wildcats at Rhode Island. The 67 yards was a career-high, the three touchdowns on the ground were a career-high, and it was his first career start after waiting in the wings for the graduation of the NCAA Division I-AA's all-time leading rusher, Jerry Azumah.

**IMION POWELL IS UNH'S LITTLE BIG MAN WHEN IT COMES TO RETURNING THE FOOTBALL:** He may be only 5-4 tall, but redshirt freshman Imion Powell (Berlin, N.J.) is UNH's own little big man when it comes to his ability to run with the football. In his role as a punt returner on Sept. 4, the season-opener at URI, Powell ran 88 yards for the endzone, burning two potential tacklers on his way down the field. Not only is he quick and shifty, he is a very powerful runner despite his 5-4 frame. Taking a look at his season stats as a punt returner, he has 5x113 yards in three games. Against Northeastern, he made a crushing hit that knocked the football loose and UNH recovered the fumble which led to a touchdown later in the series.

**UNH'S 37 POINTS VS. URI THE MOST SINCE 1997 VS. A CONFERENCE OPPONENT:** The Wildcats' 37 points in the victory over URI on Sept. 4 was the most scored vs. a conference opponent since the 1997 season. That year, the UNH offense scored 38

points vs. Boston University on a snowy Cowell Stadium football field.

**BREAKING THE SEASON-OPENING JINX:** UNH has not been that successful in season-openers over the past 10 years prior to the URI game. In fact, the team had won only three of those initial contests.

**UNH'S 37 POINTS AT URI THE MOST SCORED IN A SEASON-OPENER SINCE 1967:** UNH'S 37 points in the victory at Rhode Island was the most scored in a season-opener by the Wildcats since the team scored 42 in a 42-6 victory over Colby way back in 1967.

**DEFENSE A KEY IN WIN OVER URI:** While the offense had been in the spotlight after the first game at URI, the defense deserved all the credit in the world after holding the Rams to just 14 points. Interceptions were recorded by junior free safety Erik Mitchell (Atco, N.J.) and junior defensive back Jason Marshall (Piscataway, N.J.). Checking in with sacks on the afternoon were sophomore linebacker Jon Oosterhuis (Guelph, Ont.), junior defensive end Steve Dougherty (Middletown, N.Y.) and senior defensive end Russell Genest (Amherst, N.H.)

**ROWCLIFFE AND HAYES RETURN AS THIRD-TEAM ALL-ATLANTIC 10 SELECTIONS AND TOP CANDIDATES FOR POST-SEASON HONORS:** Senior strong safety Wade Rowcliffe (Caledonia, N.Y.) and senior offensive lineman Jeff Hayes (Arlington, Mass.) both return after being named third-team All-Atlantic 10 last season and could be considered top candidates for post-season honors. Hayes has missed much of the early season with a neck injury but may be back soon.

**COACHING CHANGES FOR THE WILDCATS:** The Wildcat coaching staff had some changes in titles and some additions prior to the 1999 campaign. First, defensive coordinator Mark Matlak was promoted from an assistant coach to associate head coach/defensive coordinator. First-year head coach Sean McDonnell also had to fill his own shoes on the staff, so he hired offensive line coach Chip Kelly as the new offensive coordinator. McDonnell then replaced Kelly with a brand new man to the staff in Darryl Bullock, a former player at Penn State and a former intern with the New England Patriots. His last collegiate coaching job was at Morgan State, as an assistant coach.

**SZWEDA AND KREIDER NAMED UNH WILDCAT CO-CAPTAINS:** Senior fullback Dan Kreider (Mount Joy, Pa.) and senior defensive back Mike Szweda (Shaker Heights, Ohio) were voted co-cap-

tains of the 1999 University of New Hampshire football team. "The character of these two kids falls in line with the strong tradition of captains here at the University of New Hampshire," said McDonnell. "Dan Kreider's physical ability, toughness and intensity will all be key components in what he provides in terms of leadership. He is a quiet guy who leads by example. Michael Szweda is an outstanding athlete who has shown tremendous improvement over his football career to become a top candidate for post-season honors. He has worked extremely hard and has earned the respect of the players and the coaching staff. Both will complement each other very well in giving the 1999 football team great senior leadership." Kreider, who was third on the squad in rushing last season with 53 carries for 291 yards is best known for his punishing running and blocking ability, not to mention his pass-catching prowess out of the backfield. Perhaps the stat that best captures what he can accomplish on the field is his average per carry, which last season stood at 5.5, an outstanding total for a fullback. Look for his number of carries to increase in 1999, according to the coaching staff, which believes that a healthy Kreider is capable of attracting NFL attention next season as the premier fullback in the Atlantic 10. Szweda, who worked his way up to a starting role, was a mainstay in the defensive backfield in 1998. Looking at his defensive statistics, he checked in as the squad's sixth leading tackler with a total of 58 last season (1-30-58). Szweda led UNH in pass deflections with a grand total of 11, while grabbing one interception, recording two sacks for a loss of 18 yards, recovering one fumble, while forcing another in 11 games played.

**SEAN MCDONNELL NAMED 19TH HEAD FOOTBALL COACH IN UNH HISTORY AFTER 27-YEAR HEAD COACH BILL BOWES RETIRES:** Sean McDonnell, a 1978 graduate of the University of New Hampshire and the offensive coordinator for the Wildcats over the past five seasons, was named the 19th head coach of the UNH football program. The announcement was made by Athletic Director Judy Ray. McDonnell, who in his young career is now 3-3 on the season, replaced 27-year head coach Bill Bowes. McDonnell served eight seasons as a Wildcat assistant and completed his fifth in 1998 as the team's offensive Coordinator. McDonnell rejoined the Wildcats as an assistant coach before the 1991 spring camp and in his first two seasons, McDonnell worked with the quarterbacks and receivers. In 1997, McDonnell was named the recipient of "The College Assistant Coach Award" by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston in recognition of his quality of performance, loyalty and longevity. A native of Saratoga Springs, N.Y., McDonnell was a standout defensive back for UNH. He started for the 1975 and 1976 Yankee Conference

Championship teams and came back to start for the 1978 squad. After his graduation from UNH in 1978, he spent one year as an assistant coach at Manchester (N.H.) Memorial High School and followed that up with a three-year stint at Manchester West (1980-82). McDonnell worked as the defensive coordinator at Hamilton College for two seasons (1983-84) and subsequently spent three years (1985-87) coaching the receivers and tight ends at conference-rival Boston University. During the 1988 campaign, McDonnell served as a graduate assistant coach at Boston College. He spent two seasons as an assistant at Columbia (1989-90) prior to his coaching debut in Durham. Sean and his wife, Jenny, live in Durham with their two boys, Timmy and Tommy.

**UNH WILDCAT FOOTBALL ON THE WEB:** UNH football fans will be able to get all of their Wildcat football news this year on the athletic department's brand new web site at [www.unhwildcats.com](http://www.unhwildcats.com). The new-and-improved site will be updated after every game with stories, statistics and other information that will be ready at your fingertips.

**UNH HOME TELEVISION SCHEDULE ON WMUR-TV:** The University of New Hampshire football team will be very visible on television this season, as the first four home contests will be shown live on WMUR-TV (Channel 9). Charlie Sherman will handle the play-by-play with color and sideline commentary being handled by the likes of Dave Long, Jamie Staton, Jason King and Brad Dupuis.

**UNH FOOTBALL ON THE RADIO:** The UNH athletic department and Dick Osborne have formed a new "UNH Sports Network" to provide radio coverage of UNH athletics for the 1999-2000 academic year. Veteran play-by-play announcer Jim Jeannotte, who has been broadcasting Wildcat athletics since 1973, will continue to anchor the show with the color analysis being provided by Mike Murphy. All 11 Wildcat contests will be broadcast live, with a pre-game show airing prior to kickoff. This year there is a new flagship station in WTSN, 1270 AM in Dover, which is the originating station. All games will also be heard on WFEA, 1370 AM in Manchester, which will carry UNH broadcasts for the first time and on WLTN, 1400 AM out of Littleton, N.H. Selected games will also be aired on WKXL, 1450 AM in Concord, the former flagship station.
