### New Hampshire Unranked But Not Untested

Two of South Florida's final four opponents are ranked among the NCAA Division I-AA's Top 25 this week. New Hampshire is not one of them. But maybe it should be.

"New Hampshire is a very good football team," said USF coach Jim Leavitt. "It just gets tough every week. We're going to be facing a real tough Atlantic 10 team."

The Bulls, 5-2 and ranked No. 17 in both The Sports Network and *USA Today*/ESPN polls, close a stretch of four home games tonight at Raymond James Stadium. Kickoff is at 7 p.m.

New Hampshire, 3-3 overall but 1-3 in the Atlantic 10 Football Conference, has won two straight including an impressive victory over current-No. 25 Stephen F. Austin two weeks ago. One of the Wildcats' three losses was by just a touchdown to No. 14 James Madison in mid-September.

And, the Wildcats won't be impressed with USF's No. 17 national ranking. New Hampshire's home, the Atlantic 10, produced last fall's national champion, Massachusetts. The Minutemen, who snuck by New Hampshire 27-26 last season, were one of three A-10 teams that advanced to the 16-team playoff. Five teams were nationally-ranked in 1998 and three of those clubs spent much of the season among the top 10.

This season has seen much of the same success for the football league whose schools play basketball in the America East, the Colonial and the Atlantic 10. This week's poll features three A-10 teams -- Delaware, James Madison and

Massachusetts.

New Hampshire appears to have a statistical edge on USF, as well. The Wildcats are gaining 226.8 yards-per-game on the ground, 232.5 yards through the air and 459.3 yards overall. USF, held to a school-record-low 150 yards against Illinois State including 22 yards rushing on 34 carries, are gaining 263.6 yards-per-game. The Bulls are rushing for 105.3 yards-per-game and passing for 158.3. All three numbers are record-season-lows.

USF, though, has had a knack for overcoming its statistics sheet and is coming off one of its biggest wins in its three seasons. The Bulls defeated then-No. 6 Illinois State Saturday, 14-13. The win improved USF's record at Raymond James to 8-1 and its overall home record to 14-4.

Leavitt believes New Hampshire will be just as tough as Illinois State. "We knew we needed this game if we're going to have a chance at the playoffs," said Leavitt following the game. "But it won't matter if we don't get New Hampshire. I mean New Hampshire is very, very good. I believe New Hampshire will be just as talented as Illinois State."

**Controlling the Ball**

Although it hasn't shown the ability to produce long scoring drives on a consistent basis, USF is winning the battle of the clock.

The Bulls are controlling the ball an average of 31:35 per game to their opponents' 28:25. Opponents won the clock battle 30:28 to 29:32 a year ago after the Bulls had averaged a seven-second edge (30:06-to-29:59) in 1997.

The offense established a new possession record in the season opener at San Diego State, controlling the ball 33:09 and surpassing the mark of 33:02 set at The Citadel in 1997. The record moved again against Southern Illinois when the Bulls controlled the ball 35:02, Oct. 2.

USF is 3-2 when winning the time of possession battle in 1999 and 9-5 all-time (3-2 in 1997, 3-1 in 1998).

When the opponent controls the clock, USF is 2-0 in 1999 and 9-4 all-time.

**Inside the Red Zone**

USF has shown a remarkable ability to score in the red zone, capitalizing on 16 of its 18 opportunities once inside its opponents' 20-yard line.

In five of the seven games, the Bulls have been perfect from within the red zone -- 3-3 at San Diego State (one touchdown and two field goals), 1-1 against Southwest Texas (one field goal), 1-1 at Western Kentucky (one touchdown), 3-3 against Southern Illinois (three touchdowns), and 1-1 against Illinois State (one touchdown).

The offense scored on three of four trips into the red zone at Troy State (two touchdowns, one field goal) and on four of five against Liberty (four touchdowns).

On the two occasions the Bulls failed to score, Bill Gramatica missed a 27-yard field goal at Troy State and Marquel Blackwell fumbled on the 2-yard line against Liberty.

While the Bulls score 88.9 percent of the time inside the 20, opponents are scoring at a 76.5 percent clip (13-of-17).

**Game Themes**

Tonight's game is just New Hampshire's second non-Atlantic 10 Conference contest as well as its final game out of the league ... The Wildcats defeated current-No. 25 Stephen F. Austin in their only other non-conference game ... The Bulls are 4-0 at Raymond James Stadium this

fall, 8-1 overall and 14-4 at home overall including a 6-3 record at Tampa Stadium ... USF is playing an Atlantic 10 member for the first time but will face another one next weekend at No. 11 James Madison ... The Bulls' schedule features six games against teams from the nation's top I-AA leagues with two games against Gateway Conference teams (wins over Illinois State and Southern Illinois), two games against Southland Conference teams (a win over Southwest Texas and a loss to Troy State) and two games against the Atlantic 10 ... New Hampshire is ninth in the 11-team Atlantic 10 standings this week, just ahead of 0-3 Northeastern and Rhode Island ... The Wildcats lead the A-10 in total offense (452.0 yards per game) and in rushing offense (229.5 yards per game) ... The Bulls are ranked No. 17 in both The Sports Network poll and in the *USA Today*/ESPN poll ... The ranking is the highest for USF in the *USA Today* poll (the Bulls were also No. 17 in the Sept. 20 poll) ... USF has been ranked as high as No. 16 by The Sports Network on Sept. 20 ... USF is No. 15 in this week's Teamlink.com poll ... With a victory, the Bulls would be 6-2 for the second straight season ... USF will try to even its "television record" tonight; the Bulls, 2-2 on television this fall, are 8-9 all-time ... SportsChannel will broadcast the New Hampshire game to a state-wide audience; USF is 4-3 on SportsChannel.

**Umholtz Picks Up Fourth Consecutive Honor**

There's the Heisman and the Lombardi. Soon there may be the Umholtz.

Tony Umholtz was named Division I-A Independent Special Teams Player of the Week for the fourth straight week after averaging 43.8 yards through nine punts against Illinois State Saturday. The senior from Largo also hit two extra-point attempts in the 14-13 victory.

Umholtz, the only punter in USF's three seasons, has been handling placekicking duties over the last two weeks after Bill Gramatica pulled a groin muscle two weeks ago against Southern Illinois.

Here is a look at Umholtz's last for (award-winning) games:

Troy State -- six punts, 276 yards, 46.0 average, long of 57 yards.

Southern Illinois -- eight punts, 340 yards, 42.5 average, long of 53 yards, 1-

of-1 PATs.

Liberty -- five punts, 193 yards, 38.6 average, long of 52 yards, 4-of-4 PATs.

Illinois State -- nine punts, 394 yards, 43.8 average, long of 58 yards (also a career long), 2-of-2 PATs.

Umholts has punted a school-record 52 punts in 1999. He had 48 punts in 1997 and 39 punts in 1998 and is just 11 shy of 150 career punts.

### Gauntt Leaves the Program

Glen Gauntt, a member of USF's original recruiting class in February, 1996, and a backup for two years to quarterback Chad Barnhardt, quit the team Monday.

Gauntt, a junior from Sarasota's Booker High School, was USF's starting quarterback the first two games of the season at San Diego State and against Southwest Texas.

He ended his USF career with 58 completions in 104 attempts, 742 yards, five touchdowns and four interceptions.

Gauntt completed 12 of 26 passes at San Diego State for 93 yards before being lifted for red-shirt freshman Marquel Blackwell.

Gauntt also started game two against Southwest Texas and was lifted after two series. He was 2-of-3 for 21 yards in the first quarter that was played in a driving rain.

### Close Call

USF's 14-13 victory over Illinois State Saturday was the first one-point win in the program's history.

The Bulls have suffered two one-point losses in their 29-game history. Drake handed the Bulls a 24-23 loss in 1997 and seven weeks later Georgia Southern, then ranked No. 8, won 24-23. Both games were at Tampa Stadium.

USF brought a 1-5 record in games decided by a touchdown or less into the season. The Bulls, though, have won 17-10 against Southwest Texas, 21-14 against Southern Illinois and 14-13 against Illinois State to improve to 4-5 in games decided by seven or fewer points.

### Five Bulls Feature I-A Experience

Five USF players, including three at the top of the depth chart, had I-A football experience prior to the season-opener at I-A San Diego State game.

Rj Anderson, Bill Gramatica, Dyral McMillan, Mike Usry and LaFann Williams transferred to USF from I-A schools.

Anderson caught four passes over two seasons at Brigham Young in 1996 and 1997.

Gramatica played in four games at Florida State in 1997 after red-shirting in 1996. He was 10-of-12 on PATs and hit two of four field goal attempts.

McMillan played two seasons at Miami (Fla.). He made a pair of starts and played in nine games as a true freshman in 1995 and was second on the team with 354 yards on 81 carries. He led Miami a year later with 565 yards on 111 carries that included four touchdowns.

A University of Georgia graduate, Usry has two years of eligibility remaining after playing in the 1997 and 1998 seasons. His two-year statistics include eight completions in 13 attempts for 88 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions.

Williams played in 10 games over two seasons at Pittsburgh in 1996 and 1997. He rushed for 103 yards on 20 carries with 100 of those yards on 19 attempts in 1996.

### Captains Include Two Original Bulls

With this week's departure of quarterback Glen Gauntt, the Bulls are down to two active team captains.

The season began with four veterans — middle linebacker Jason Butler, quarterback Gauntt, free safety Anthony Henry and offensive center Joey Sipp — captaining the team.

Three of those four — Gauntt, Henry and Sipp — were members of the program's first-ever recruiting class from February, 1996.

Sipp is the only Bull to start all 29 games in the program's history. Henry, started the first 24 games before being sidelined with a knee injury suffered in a late-week practice prior to the Western Kentucky game.

Henry missed the game against the Hilltoppers, played -- but did not start -- against Troy State and Southern Illinois and then had arthroscopic surgery following the SIU game. He did not play

against Liberty but returned to action in the second series last week against Illinois State.

Butler had started 17 of 18 games before suffering a season-ending knee injury against Southwest Texas State.

Gauntt, a backup to Chad Barnhardt the last two seasons, made his second collegiate start at San Diego State and also started against Southwest Texas State the following week.

### And Then There Was One

When free safety Anthony Henry sat out at Western Kentucky with a bruised knee, it ended his streak of 24 consecutive starts which covered every USF game. And, now center Joey Sipp is the lone Bull to have started in each of USF's 29 games

### A Long Drive

USF's two longest scoring drives of the season were against Liberty two weeks ago.

The Bulls opened the game with a 10-play drive that featured four rushes for 28 yards by Dyral McMillan and ended when Marquel Blackwell hit Scott McCready from five yards out.

USF put together an 11-play march in the third quarter. Like drive one, McMillan had four rushes, this time for 41 yards. Jermaine Clemons scored USF's third touchdown with a four-yard run.

Prior to Saturday, the longest scoring drives of the fall had been a pair of nine-play drives.

The Bulls used nine plays against San Diego State to begin the second half of the season opener. The result was a Bill Gramatica career-long-tying 44-yard field goal. Ironically, McMillan keyed that drive, as well, with four rushes for 38 yards.

USF chummed out another nine-play series in the second quarter at Western Kentucky, Sept. 18. This one, though,

ended in the end zone when Marquel Blackwell connected with Deandrew Rubin on a six-yard pass. McMillan was responsible for the drive's key play, an 18-yard rush up the middle.

### Shut Down and Shut Out

USF's defense recorded its fourth shut out in 28 games against Liberty two weeks ago.

Liberty was shut out for just the 11th time in its 272-game history and for the third time in coach Sam Rutigliano's 11 seasons.

The Bulls also blanked Cumberland 44-0 in 1997, Valparaiso 51-0 and Charleston Southern 24-0 in 1998. Both the Cumberland and Charleston Southern games were on the road.

### Umholtz Forced Out of Placekicking Retirement

USF punter Tony Umholtz hadn't performed placekicking chores outside a practice since his 1994 senior season in high school. But, the Osceola High School graduate was called out of "retirement" when USF's starting kicker Bill Gramatica injured a groin muscle during the second half kickoff of the Southern Illinois game, Oct. 2.

Umholtz, who was 21 of 23 on PATs in 1994, is now 7-7 in his college career, having booted the final point in USF's 21-14 win over SIU, four extra-points against Liberty and what turned out to be the winning margin against Illinois State. Umholtz has also handled USF's last nine kickoffs.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt From His Weekly Press Luncheon (Oct. 19)

### On the win over Illinois State ...

"Concerning last week, it was a good win, we won the game, but the way it happened at the end, I don't think we played particularly that great of football. But I thought we played hard and defensively we really played hard all the way through the game. They certainly got some plays on us, but they're a good football team and they're going to get some good plays. But we won the football game and that's what counts. We certainly have to get much better as a football team or we're going to struggle. We have to find ways to get our offense on track and our defense has to play with more consistency. We can't give up the big plays that we've been giving up, or it's going to cost us a game coming up."

### On the offense against Illinois State ...

"We just didn't play as good as we need to, we need to play better. But the one thing that is impressive is that the offense battled after having a really horrible first half. They came out in the third quarter, scored a few times and did what we needed to do to win the ball game. Illinois State is a good football team, but we need to play better."

### On New Hampshire Saturday ...

"I'm really concerned about New Hampshire, they're very big, very strong, very well-coached. They lined up 18 different offensive formations in their last game. Obviously our defensive coaches have a lot of work to do. They (New Hampshire) just scored 33 points against Northeastern, another Atlantic 10 team, so they can play. If you look at who they have lost to, they lost to some pretty darn good football teams. It should be a good matchup. I can imagine that it will be like every game we have played this year and go down to the fourth quarter."

### On quarterback Glen Gauntt leaving the team Monday ...

"You know it's very difficult for a young man to work his tail off for three years, as a walk-on athlete, and earn a full scholarship. To battle through winter and summer and all of that and to not be the starting quarterback. You can imagine what you go through because he does care a great deal. He wants to get in there and play. I respect that part of it. I know it's very difficult and he has done an awful lot for our program. When Chad Barnhardt went down (in game eight against Charleston Southern a year ago) we certainly needed someone to come through and he put us in a position last year, even entertained thoughts about playoffs, and we certainly couldn't have done that without Glen. However I'm disappointed. For his sake I'm disappointed at this point that he is making that decision. Sometimes emotion gets in the way of what I think is clear thinking and as tough as it is I've certainly been in it, and others have, too. You want to hang in there and battle. However, I respect his decision, it's his life, he has to do what's best for his life and I certainly have no negative thoughts

about Glen, I think he's a wonderful person."

### On backup quarterback Mike Usry ...

"Mike did a good job last night (Monday night practice), he took a lot of snaps and I was impressed with the way we toughened him up, with a little defensive end work. He is one snap away from being our starting quarterback. The checks he made last night, the coaches just looked at each other and said, "wow." The guy is sharp, the guy is tough. He's a good quarterback."

### On USF's playoff potential ...

"I have not even thought about it. I really haven't. We have way too many games against top teams for us to even be considered at this point. Last year I said we wouldn't even consider it until the last week of the season and we'll see where we're at then and I don't feel any differently now. I mean New Hampshire is

San Diego — South Florida's first journey into the land of I-A football at San Diego State was much better than the misadventure indicated by the 41-12 score.

While USF was overpowered by the Aztecs, a team coming off a Western Athletic Conference championship and a bid to the Las Vegas Bowl, the game provided a bench-mark for the soon-to-be I-A Bulls.

The highlights:

Marquel Blackwell took his first collegiate snaps and was impressive, completing six of nine attempts for 90

yards. The red-shirt freshman led the Bulls into the end zone in the fourth quarter, capping an eight-play, 63-yard drive with a 20-yard pass to freshman Reshod Durant. The reception was one of three for the rookie.

On the ground, Dyral McMillan had a solid game while grinding out 78 yards on 12 carries. His longest rush, 26 yards, set up Bill Gramatica's third-quarter field goal.

The field goal, a 44-yarder, was Gramatica's second of the game and tied his career long.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt Following the San Diego State Game (Sept. 4)

### On San Diego State and the game in general ...

"They're better than us. That was obvious. They're a good football team. One game isn't going to make a season. We certainly have some things we have to do. We have to get better. I knew it would be a tough challenge tonight and it was but I thought we might come out and play a little bit better. I thought we might make it a lot closer. I guess in my wildest dream I thought we might have a chance to win if we do all the right things but maybe I was crazy."

### More on the offense, defense and special teams ...

"I believe very much in this team. I believe we have all the talent, we just didn't execute near good enough. We certainly have to play better defense. We can't allow them to move up and down the field like we did. Defensively to me is where it started and we didn't do a good job there. I'm very disappointed they blocked a punt. That's the first time in three years that we've had a punt blocked and we didn't do a good job there and we'll get that shored up. Offensively, we have to protect our quarterback better. We have to get it into the right call and the right checks and I thought that wasn't good."

### On some individual efforts ...

"I thought (fullback) Dyral McMillan did a real nice job running the ball. I thought he did a heckuva job. I'm real happy with (quarterback) Marquel (Blackwell), the way he came in at the end there. I thought for scrambling like he did, I thought he did a pretty good job. I'm real happy with some true freshman. (wide receiver) Reshad Durant made some catches. I can't be more excited about (right tackle) Joe Condron, what a great job he did tonight. A true freshman playing like that."

### On the future ...

"I'm proud of this team, not necessarily for what we did tonight but we'll pick our heads back up and we'll get going. We have a real tough job ahead with Southwest Texas. We certainly have to play a whole lot better than tonight if we think we're going to have a chance to beat them."

### On the six San Diego State sacks ...

"We just didn't always get in the right checks that we wanted and obviously we didn't get all the protection that we needed."

### On playing I-A San Diego State ...

"There's no doubt I'm glad we played them. I'm glad we played this game. For us to move into Division I-A we have a little ways to go, or a long ways to go really. I'm not discouraged. I know this program is going to be very strong, very good and very successful. It's our third year of football and it's the 23rd game ever playing. Nobody likes to lose. That's no fun. They got beat pretty good tonight, so I imagine they're pretty dejected, licking their wounds."

### On what the Bulls will take from the loss ...

"Hopefully (we'll take) a lot. With execution, realizing that we have a ways to go, that you've got to fight, scratch and bleed every game. We've got some talent, believe me, we have some talent, but man we have to play a lot harder. We have to really come out and play sounder, tougher and harder football."

### On quarterback protection ...

"We put our DBs in some tough situations and we didn't get much of a pass rush. Two of the biggest keys were that they protected their quarterback and we didn't protect ours. That was pretty obvious."

### On Glen Gauntt's interception ended USF's first series ...

"You don't want that to happen. Not against a pretty good team like that. Then the fact that our defense didn't keep them out. If we could have held them to a field goal there it would have been nice."

### More on the game in general ...

"I thought we were still okay even at halftime. What was it, 24-3? If we could have just got some things going and we started out the third quarter doing a few things but then we just didn't get it done."

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt Following the Southwest Texas Game (Sept. 11)

### On the game in general ...

"I tell you what, I'm tired and I didn't play one snap. The negative first. We have to hang on to the ball, obviously. We tried to give that thing away. I don't care if it's raining or not, that's something we can't do. And our kicking game again. We had a punt blocked second game in a row and ultimately that's my responsibility and we're not getting it done. Believe me, we'll work on it. We'll continue to work on it. If you're a real good football team you don't have those things happen."

### On the positives in the game ...

"I was really proud of the character of this football team. I told them that. I thought a lot of teams would have probably folded their tent with all the things that happened against them and I was really proud of that. I was proud of the fact that Marquel (Blackwell) came in there and made that run. Obviously, it shows he has some running ability. I was disappointed he fumbled and he knows that but he did do a nice job on the run. I really was not disappointed with the offense at all except when we got the turnovers. That's the only thing I was disappointed in. I couldn't be more proud of the defense. I told our defense that I had been a defensive coordinator for the number one defense in the country. We have had some great defensive efforts in my years as a defensive coordinator but I could never be more proud of (defensive coordinator) Rick Kravitz, his defensive staff and our defense. I thought that was as good as effort as I have ever been around. It was just continually, their backs were to the wall and they rose up and I'm real proud of them. The thing our offense has to realize is it may be a reverse someday where our offense has to score, score, score, and they will. I believe in the character that they have and I believe they will."

### On the win ...

"I was very proud of this football team, they're a great group of guys, they really are, I keep telling you that. I think the world of them. We work very hard and they just continue to work and continue to keep their heads up and I believe that's what won this football game. I really do. I believe it's that character and the way we work and the discipline that we have in our program I believe won that football game. I don't believe you can win that football game if you didn't have that in your program I just really don't. It was too many things. Again, I'm just really proud of the defense."

### On quarterback Marquel Blackwell ...

"I am proud of Glen Gauntt. I think Glen Gauntt is a heckuva a quarterback. I really do. We had decided in the game that if we weren't going to move right away we were going to go to Marquel (Blackwell) and just let him go and see what he could do and that was just the way it was. We need Glen Gauntt and we need Mike Usry to be ready too. We need all three of those quarterbacks. I'm telling you we need them all. But that was the only reason really. We just stayed with it. We were winning the

ballgame, we had some momentum, we felt like he could run. You know, maybe do some quarterback draws and sweeps and boots, those types of things. Not that Glen can't because Glen can. Glen is very good."

### On the weather ...

"That was the hardest rain I've ever been in and I've been coaching for a little while. Over 20 years and that's the most rain I've been involved in and I've been in snow and sleet and ice and been in some cold days and some rough weather but never a driving rain like that. We practice in it, we do. I wouldn't practice in the lightning but we practice in the rain. But I agree. I think that was a huge change of pace and emotional level."

### On the weather's effect on the game ...

"You had to really reduce your offense. We really wanted to try to do some things and keep the ball in the quarterback's hands a little more. But when they load up a million people in the box you got to have the ability to go outside a little bit or try to throw the ball a little bit but I really felt like a big key to this game was going to be the kicking game and here we get a punt blocked. We overcame a blocked punt which was pretty fortunate because our defense played so well. A couple of pro scouts came up before the game to me and said that they were here to watch (Southwest Texas quarterback) Spergon (Wynn) play so you know he's a pretty good quarterback. That's a real tribute to our defense, I think."

### On the quarterback situation ...

"We have to look at Marquel pretty hard. But Glen, it's hard to say. I would like to sit down with (quarterback coach) Mike (Canales) and we'll visit. But Marquel is the guy probably right now but Glen is right there. It might shift right back again. If Marquel doesn't move that offense it might be the same thing and Glen gets right back in there. Or Mike Usry. Mike Usry needs to continue to work. We need to move the ball. Our offense needs to really move. That's important. So I guess it will become a depth chart deal like any other position. Whoever is moving the offense, we're going to go. But Marquel did some nice things. He made some mistakes, he's a freshman."

### On the weather's affect on play at the line ...

"I think it was real hard on the offensive line first of all. Obviously if you can't get footing, you can't get timing. Our defensive line, we backed them up a little bit because we felt like even if we get penetration, if we got on the ground too much then we wouldn't hold our position, we couldn't run to the ball. So we just backed up 12 inches and played across the line a little deeper and (defensive line coach) Earl Lane really did those things to try to give us a little more room and try to stay on our feet. We really wanted to stay on our feet so we weren't as aggressive as we normally are."

USF 2-1, Western Kentucky 2-1

Bowling Green, Ky. — Potential. The South Florida offense showed it and the defense lived up to it in a 21-6 victory at Western Kentucky.

The combination was enough to put 21 first-half points on the scoreboard and shut out the Hilltoppers in the final three quarters.

USF won for the first time in three attempts against Western Kentucky.

The highlights:

Several young players stepped forward to lead a defense that limited the Hilltoppers to 264 yards and a single touchdown. Western Kentucky entered the game averaging 387.5 yards and 44.5 points-per-game. In two previous games against USF, the Hilltoppers had averaged 362.5 yards and 31 points.

Jay Mize and Bernard Brown led the effort with 16 and 11 tackles, respectively.

Marquel Blackwell passed to seven receivers for a career-high 169 yards in his first collegiate start. The red-shirt freshman tied the USF record for touchdown passes in a game with three.

Another red-shirt freshman, Deandrew Rubin, was on the receiving end of the final two touchdown passes — a 26-yard pass with 2:28 left in the first quarter and a 6-yard pass with 9:28 remaining in the second.

Blackwell connected with Scott McCready on a 48-yard pass to give USF a 7-0 lead in the first quarter.

WKU lost for just the third time at home in three seasons. The Hilltoppers had compiled a 16-2 record at home since 1996.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt Following the Western Kentucky Game (Sept. 18)

### On the offense and special teams play ...

"It was great, the offense, what they did coming out in the first half. I thought you saw some of the potential on offense. I was just disappointed in the second half we didn't continue to move. I was real happy we didn't get a punt blocked. That was big, that was huge. They got one return but I knew it was offside right away because we were just hurrying up, they couldn't get the guys on so we kind of caught them there. I'm real proud of our offense, I thought they did a real nice job. I thought they did what they needed to do to win. We just got to be able to play the second half."

### On the defensive effort of several key individuals ...

"Defensively what do you say? I mean, you got Jason Butler down, you got (free safety) Anthony Henry down. Neither captain on defense is there and here comes (linebackers) Kawika Mitchell, Marshall Smith and Anthony Williams in the middle and then you got (free safety) Jay Mize. What a warrior. Jay Mize is a guy who walked onto our program, works his tail off, sits behind Anthony Henry. Never complains, never says a word. Do you realize he was on every special team and played every snap at free safety? What do you say to that? It was a great, great effort on his behalf."

### On the defensive effort in general ...

"(defensive coordinator) Rick Kravitz and the defensive staff did an outstanding job getting our defense ready this week. He had a great gameplan and a very similar gameplan that we used against Georgia Southern last year with a few wrinkles in it. Just an outstanding job and I think that we had such great leadership on that defense in the second half. They just kept going out and banging away at it."

### On Western Kentucky ...

"Western Kentucky is an awfully good football team, I think. They beat us 31-3 here two years ago and then last year the way they beat us at Raymond James when we had the lead. It was just a tribute to them and they did a great job. I think they have an outstanding program, an outstanding team, outstanding coaches. They're always a very tough battle. This college football, it's exciting, it's just a lot of fun. I even talked to (former Hilltopper quarterback Willie who rushed for 206 yards and three touchdowns in 1998 game) Taggart before the game and I told him, 'I was really proud of you, of how you led the team to the win' and that will be the biggest game of his life. It crushed us but for him and his life it will be something he'll always remember as will we this year. And then we play Western Kentucky next year again and so it will be a barn-burner again I think. We beat a real good team."

### On quarterback Marquel Blackwell and his receivers in the second half ...

"Pretty good. I thought he did a real good job. He'll get better, he'll keep getting better. I thought he threw some nice balls in the second half, they got dropped. Those were catchable balls. Our receivers have to do a better job than that. The one on a third and 14 I believe to Cory Porter (in the third quarter), it was behind him but he should have caught it. And then Scott McCready, who caught the one touchdown pass, should have caught the one that hit him right in the chest. We just got to keep in rhythm in the second half but a pretty good job. Deandrew Rubin, a freshman ... we got a lot of freshman out there playing you know. We only had I guess four or five seniors on that field."

### More on the win in general ...

"This was really a big game for us. There's no doubt about it. To come into this place to get the win is very difficult. To have a real good football team that's what you have to be able to do."

### More on the defense ...

"Both captains on defense didn't play. To me, that's the storyline. Jay Mize and the linebackers to rise up ... some people sometimes say 'well, you don't have this guy, you don't have that guy.' Hey, we've always had injuries. We just go, we just work."

### On the Otis Dixon injury in the first half ...

"He hurt his knee a little bit, I think he bruised it. It doesn't look like anything that's going to be serious. That was the first indication I got but we'll wait and see. From what I'm told he's okay. He probably could have played if we needed him to."

Troy, Ala. — South Florida turned over its opportunity to earn its first win over a ranked opponent.

Troy State, ranked No. 3 in the *USA Today*/ESPN poll and No. 5 in the The Sports Network poll, took advantage of four miscues on the way to a 41-24 victory.

It was USF, though, that took advantage of Troy State turnovers early to build a 21-7 lead with 13:19 remaining in the second quarter.

Anthony Williams recovered a fumble at the TSU 30-yard line on the game's third play to wset up USF's first score. Tchecoy Blount recovered a fumble at the TSU 21-yard line at the beginning of

the second quarter to set the stage for the Bulls' third touchdown and the Bulls led 21-7.

Troy State outscored USF 34-3 the rest of the way. Three touchdowns were direct results of USF turnovers: interception returns of 71 and 43 yards and a fumble at the USF 11-yard line.

The teams combined for nine turnovers — the most ever by USF and its opponent. Troy State turned the ball over five times, the most by an opponent since Kentucky Wesleyan turned the ball over five times in USF's first ever game in 1997.

The Bulls fell to 0-6 against ranked teams.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt Following the Troy State Game (Sept. 25)

### On the game in general ...

"We got beat by a better team tonight. You can't turn the ball over like we did and expect to win ever against anybody. You can't fumble the ball, you can't throw the interceptions. That was obviously the big thing. Our guys battled pretty well but you're not going to play against anybody and turn the ball over like that and expect to win a football game. It's just crazy."

### On the kicking game and the defense ...

"I thought we did some good things in the kicking game. I thought our defense played fairly good at times. You can't give up the deep ball. We broke down there, we shouldn't have. The defense has to get better against the run. They ran the ball too good on us. That's something that we've got to shore up. We've got to figure out what we're doing wrong there because we can't give them balance. If they get balance then we've got problems."

### On the turnovers ...

"We've just got to be smarter as a football team. The turnovers, that's the big thing. We've got to shore that up. If we don't turn the ball over, we have a shot at this. We go into the fourth quarter and I think we're down three. Then we turn the ball over twice and gave them two touchdowns. Then we gave them the third touchdown. I mean we gave them three touchdowns when the defense wasn't on the field basically."

### On scoring three points in the second half of the last two games ...

"We're not very good in the second half offensively. It's a concern. We better do something. We've got to get ourselves going. We have a very poor offense in the second half. I don't know what it is. We just didn't play well in the second half. Defensively we played pretty well in the second half last week. This week we didn't play as well in the second half."

### On turning the ball over on consecutive plays in the third quarter ...

"That killed us. That was the ballgame right there to me. I mean a big part of the game."

### On replacing quarterback Marquel Blackwell with Glen Gauntt in the third quarter ...

"Marquel had just thrown the pick. We gave him a couple series, we thought we would keep him out. We let Glen go in there to see if he could get something going because it's been the second week that our offense hasn't done anything in the second half so we figured we'd do something. We didn't last week, we didn't make the change. This week we decided to see if we could get something jolted. After Glen threw the interception I wanted to keep him in there. We weren't going to win the ballgame at that point and I wanted Glen to go in there and play it out. Marquel does some good things, he's a good quarterback. He'll be good,

he's just got to be more consistent. He does some great things. He did some great things in the first half again."

### On Troy State ...

"They battled and they played a heckuva game. You've got to give them credit. They're the ones that made the plays. They picked the ball off, they got the fumbles with the hitting, I mean they were all over there. Shott, I thought we had a chance to win this game. They beat us and that's all there is to it. You can't turn the ball over and win, you just can't. We didn't deserve to win. You don't deserve to win if you turn the ball over like that."

### On Troy State's five turnovers ...

"We got our share of turnovers and that is good. I don't know how many we got. We had a punt blocked which is good. But defensively we gave up the big play. We gave up two touchdown passes. The run game, they ran the ball too easy on us and that wasn't good. They moved the ball on the ground right up inside on us too many times."

### On the fourth quarter ...

"I thought those were two pretty good teams playing tonight and they won the turnover battle and they won the fourth quarter. If we would have won the fourth quarter then we had the game won we just didn't get that done. I thought we were still in good shape at 10 points down. I was thinking we were still going to win the thing but when it went farther than that we had no chance."

**Tampa, Fla.** — For the second consecutive week, turnovers were costly for both South Florida and its opponent. Southern Illinois paid the higher price, though, as the Bulls forced a fumble at the SIU

Bernard Brown recovered a fumble forced by Marshall Smith at the SIU 34-yard line with 4:28 left in the game and the Bulls took advantage.

A pair of Marquel Blackwell passes to Rj Anderson took the Bulls to the SIU 6-yard line. Three plays later Blackwell scored from two yards out and USF scored its first second-half touchdown in two weeks.

Both the Bulls and their opposition have taken advantage of miscues over the

last two weeks. The Salukis scored both their touchdowns after USF turnovers.

The USF defense turned in a solid effort, limiting SIU to 242 yards of offense including 123 rushing and 119 passing. The Salukis entered the game averaging 188.5 rushing yards (No. 22 nationally), 250.3 through the air (No. 26) and 438.75 yards of total offense (No. 22).

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt Following the Southern Illinois Game (Oct. 2)

### On the defense ...

"I thought our defense played another great game. I really did. I thought they probably could have played better but I thought they really played a great game at the end when we really had to have them."

### On the second-half offense ...

"Offensively, we struggled again in the third quarter. We struggled in the fourth quarter. But the thing that was really great was the fact that when we had to have the offense play they really came through and played and then they got the touchdown. Of course we got the turnover but they fed off it and got the touchdown."

### More on the defense ...

"What I was disappointed in is our defense didn't do very well when we made turnovers. We didn't stop them. They got two touchdowns that way."

### On the team's effort ...

"That's a good football team and I think at times we're a good football team and at times we're not. It was a great effort by our players. The fact that they battled like they did. The fact that they just rose up and just played their hearts out. I really thought you saw a great effort. It's a great thing to be home. That's definitely an advantage. I'm very proud of our football team and I'm proud of the effort they gave."

### On nose tackle Ron Johnson's knee injury in the third quarter ...

"Ron, we don't know. He had a knee injury. You hate to say how it is. These knee injuries have been a lot of season-ending injuries and hopefully Ron's isn't but they're saying it doesn't look good. If that is the case then it's disappointing for Ron. He's certainly playing extremely well. We just have to have the next guy step up and play. Who will that be? I don't know."

### More on the second-half offense ...

"I'm not altogether sure. We've had some different guys playing in our offense. You know we didn't have (left tackle) Kenyatta (Jones) tonight. Kenyatta played really on one leg and I thought he did a great job by going out there and playing. He was hobbling, he couldn't even move. We could not run the ball with him in there basically. We had to try to throw it with him in there and have him try to stand in front of somebody. We had (right guard) Jimmy Fitts down and he didn't play because his knee was bothering him so we had to put Billy Attix, who's usually playing center, at left tackle. And I think when you lose that kind of continuity it gets a little bit more difficult. I think Marquel just needs more experience, more time. When you get a rush on a little bit ... I think (quarterback) Marquel Blackwell did one heck of a job, I really did. He battled. But he's just got to

keep getting better and getting us in different protections. But we've had so much movement on that offensive line. I think that's part of it and then they get tired going into that second half because the same guys are having to go and we don't have really any depth there. I don't like to make that as an excuse, though, because I'm not one to talk about those things. We have some guys that are banged up. Everyone knows that; you could write a book on it but I don't like to talk about. We have to have some other guys step up and play and we need to get some more production out of some our back-up players that we quite frankly haven't. They need to come up and stand up and start really doing some more things so we can trust them and get them in the games.

### On the defense improving ...

"Our defense has got to get better. They know that. The one time after the turnover they ran the ball right off tight end and went all the way into the end zone. There was a number of people at fault for that — coaches and players. We didn't do the right things at that juncture. But I'm very proud of (defensive coordinator) Rick Kravitz and his defensive staff again. You can see the defense has been playing dang good for the last three or four games. We had some breakdowns at Troy and we had some breakdowns against San Diego State, about three or four plays. Other than that they've been playing pretty steady. We still have to get better against the run game. I don't know how many yards they had and all that stuff but our defense I thought did a pretty good job. They got some big turnovers and they ran to the ball well and did some nice things."

### On the running backs ...

"I really was happy with our running backs tonight. I thought our running backs really ran hard and blocked hard. Sometimes there just wasn't anywhere to run at all and they made things out of nothing. Rafael Williams made some runs that were great. (Dyral) McMillan ran hard even though it seemed like were four guys on him every time he had the ball."

### On the receivers and Rj Anderson ...

"The receivers can play better. We dropped too many balls again tonight. Rj (Anderson) made a real nice catch in the end but he dropped one earlier that I know he would be upset about but he did make the big catch when he needed to at the end of the game — a couple big catches."

### On placekicker Bill Gramatica ...

"We had to use another kicker. (Bill) Gramatica couldn't kick. He had hurt his groin so that was kind of a struggle when we were getting in there whether we were going to kick a field goal or not."

Tampa, Fla. — South Florida put together its most complete game of the season and stopped Liberty 28-0.

The shutout was just the 11th in Liberty's 272-game football history and the second in coach Sam Rutigliano's 11 seasons. It was also the fourth time USF had held an opponent scoreless.

The offense enjoyed three long scoring drives including its two longest of the season.

The first was a 10-play drive to open the game that was capped off by a Marquel Blackwell to Scott McCreedy five-yard pass.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt Following the Liberty Game (Oct. 9)

### On the game ...

"I thought it was a great effort. Obviously, it was a great effort by our defense on getting the shutout. Offensively we made too many mistakes with penalties. But I thought our guys played hard, they played tough."

### On the offense ...

"I think it was important to get our offense uncoiled a little bit and get that going and I think the fact that they played good through the second half really helps. It helps their confidence. We have to get rid of the mistakes. We had about seven holding calls and you can't win against a real good football team and do that. If that doesn't get shored up we're going to be in trouble."

### On fullback Dyral McMillan ...

"I thought Dyral McMillan really ran well. He had some great runs in there."

### On punter and (now) placekicker Tony Umholtz ...

"Tony (Umholtz) is a remarkable player. He did all the kickoffs and did our extra points and missed the one field goal and that was disappointing. I was really disappointed with somebody blowing the whistle in the stands. I heard the whistle right before the kick and that really throws you off. I really believe that threw Tony off. The whistle came right on his approach and he didn't know whether that was an inadvertant whistle or not and he missed it. I'm telling you that was really a key part of it. When you hear a whistle from an official you think 'stop the action.' So when you hear a whistle in the stands like that it just throws you totally off because you think you have to stop action and it was right on his approach. So whoever blew that whistle is an absolute fool if they're for South Florida. They're absolutely out of their mind. It's just absolutely senseless."

### On the offense ...

"I was real happy with the effort of our offense I thought they did some really good things. But what disappointed me so much was they worked so hard and they played so hard and did so many good things and they were just shooting themselves in the foot and it makes no sense. You have to play with effort, you have to play hard but you have to play smart. You've got to execute. You've got to play like you're well-coached and with that I was real disappointed in for them because they work so hard. We should have went in 21 or 28 nothing at the half. We had every opportunity. We're knocking at the end zone and we can't put it in."

### On Liberty ...

"Liberty is a good team but they're not in the same category as the teams we're going to play the next number of weeks. We have some awfully stronger teams coming up quite frankly. I was a little concerned about Liberty because I didn't know where our guys were at. We had beaten them last year. I didn't know their mindset. When you're not in a conference and you don't have

rivalries ... I know they'll be up for Illinois State and I know they'll be up for some of those ranked teams but when you have a team that's coming in that's beaten a couple Division II schools you're afraid of a lull. And then we didn't have our kicker and that was a concern. We've had so many different combinations and all of it together was a little concern for me."

### On various individuals ...

"Lee Roy Selmon Jr., what a great job he did. But we knew that. I've been telling you that all along that he's a very good football player. Greg Walls, that was his first start, and Matt Dunkle, those are three of the four guys in our inside are all freshman. That's three freshman and Therriman Edwards. Our defensive ends, none of them are seniors, and then you have Kawika Mitchell, a freshman, playing, I thought he did a real nice job tonight. Marshall Smith, Brian Wilson have been great. Anthony Williams, Vassay (Marc), those guys did a great job. You can't say enough about our secondary. In our secondary we had to keep our starters in there because we're pretty thin all the way around."

### On cornerback LaFann Williams ...

I thought he did a good job. LaFann can do better, even better than that. I thought he did a real good job but he can do better. You have to remember LaFann is on every kicking game, every single one, and played secondary. How many times did they go deep on him? A lot. And that wears you out."

### On offensive balance ...

"We always want to run the ball, we really do. We want to be able to do some things where we can really run the ball. I agree, though, I think if you create more balance I think it does take some pressure off that (quarterback) Marquel (Blackwell) has to do every little thing. We've got capable running backs. Dyral (McMillan) can run. Rafael Williams, what a great job he did again and Jermaine Clemons can run. Hugh (Smith) can run. We've got some guys that can go if we can just get some running lanes in there."

### On Mike Usry ...

"I thought he did a pretty good job. I was hoping he would get a sack in there. He was coming around the corner and he's got a long body and he did pretty good. You might see him at cornerback, you might see him at the defensive end, you might see him at tight end. He's just a good athlete and he just wants to play. He's a wonderful young man."

### On Illinois State ...

Tampa, Fla. — Raymond James Stadium — or at least its end zones — could be referred to as simply “Rj” in South Florida’s 14-13 victory over Illinois State. “Rj” not as in “Raymond James” but as in Rj Anderson. Quarterback Marquel Blackwell found the senior wide receiver twice in the end zone and the Bulls won its first game ever over a ranked NCAA Division I-AA opponent.

Anderson entered the game with a team-high 23 receptions but had not caught a touchdown pass in nine games.

That drought ended on the opening possession of the second half. Trailing 7-0, the Bulls drove 65 yards in seven plays. The first Blackwell-to-Anderson touchdown was a 25-yard strike.

Illinois State, which had taken a 7-0 lead on a three-yard rush by quarterback Dusty Burk to cap a 57-yard drive at the end of the first half, answered immediately.

Burk found Ricky Garrett on a 13-yard pass play but Jon Chivas blocked the extra-point attempt and USF trailed 13-7.

USF took the lead when Blackwell found Anderson again, this time on third-and-goal from the four. Tony Umholtz nailed his extra-point attempt and USF led 14-13.

The Bulls hung on for the victory, their first over a ranked club in seven attempts, when Jake Strader’s 24-yard field goal attempt with :10 left in the game was wide left.

## Quoting Coach Jim Leavitt Following the Illinois State Game (Oct. 16)

**On the excessive celebration penalty at the end of the game ...**  
"The penalty flag was on me. I'll admit it. But I knew it wasn't after a touchdown so I knew all we had to do was down the ball so I didn't care. That was the appropriate call, too, because I was running all over the field."

**On the game in general ...**  
"I couldn't be prouder of our football team. They played their hearts out, they fought and battled and absolutely played their hearts out. Really, really, a great, great win for us."

**On the offense ...**  
"I can't say enough for our offense, the way they battled. We weren't playing inspired football in the first half. We weren't very emotional. We didn't play with purpose, we didn't play with focus and we were just kind of flailing around out there. I was really proud of the way we came back and battled in the second half. For our offense to come back and battle like they did. To go down and score right away in the third quarter was huge and then to come back and battle again and the way our offense went down and scored the second time was huge. No question."

**On ISU's fourth and 12 pass-play on its final drive ...**  
Fourth and 10, fourth and 12 and I thought they guy made a great catch and throw. You've got to give them great credit. That's the sixth-ranked team in the country and they're going to make plays like that. I don't think that ball could have been thrown any better than what Illinois State did on that one throw. It as high, it was away from the receiver, we had people all around. What do you do. They made a play."

**More on the game in general ...**  
"We made some coaching errors that we've got to shore up but we will. But also our defense played great again. I mean, that's an explosive offense. They're averaging 400-and-something yards a game. I know they moved the ball on us but they didn't get in the end zone enough and we got the win. What a great, great job our defense did at the end there and a great effort. Just a great football game. We're battling. We're battling and we're fighting and we're scratching. That's the thing I like to see about this football team more than anything else. I think you see the great fire and the great passion they have for the game and for each other. It will be real important to enjoy tonight and enjoy the game but we've got to get back to doing some better things on the football field. Our offense, we've got to shore up some things. People bring the house and we've got to be able to protect and get our running game and passing game going."

**On New Hampshire next Saturday ...**  
"New Hampshire is a very good football team. I believe they won against Northeastern today. It just gets tough every week. So we're going to face a real tough Atlantic 10 team next weekend. But we'll enjoy tonight, enjoy the game, and get working again on Monday."

**On the offense ...**  
"There was a lot of time left. There was three minutes to go. That would have taken a drive all the way to the end to score a touchdown. I was more not worried about the clock, I just

wanted us to get first downs. I wanted us to be able to run and throw the ball and that was more disappointing. I was real disappointed we lost some field position there. When Marquel (Blackwell) got sacked at the end there we really lost some good field position there and that bothered me because I wanted to get it back down to their red zone and that was a 14-yard loss and that shouldn't have happened. We'll have to shore that up."

**On Tony Umholtz and special teams ...**  
"Give a lot of credit to Tony Umholtz and our punt team. Our kicking game really came out and did a great job tonight. Our kickoff team was great. Tony hit both extra points, he punted great. We tackled, well we didn't tackle great all the time, but we got down and shored it up pretty good. I thought we should have blocked a punt, we had one real close. Our punt return, it was hard because we didn't get any real good punts from their end but our kicking game was great. Tony Umholtz did a great job tonight. Great second half, his punts."

**On Jon Chivas' PAT block ...**  
"It was a great job. Jon (Chivas) got up over the top and got his hands out and just did a great job. That was a great play by Jon Chivas. Jon has done some good things on special teams."

**On running back Jermaine Clemons' third-quarter injury ...**  
"It's a knee injury and those haven't been very good. I don't know. I don't want to really comment too much until I know but I don't think it's a surgery-type situation. I hope not."

**On the effect Monday's announcement USF would move into Conference USA in 2003 instead of 2001 had on the team ...**  
"I think some of the guys were disappointed which I understand but they had a game to play and Illinois State was in the way. I think after that all happened, it was a bump that you had to kind of cross over and that showed the character of the football team. They just focused on Illinois State. We didn't spend much time on that. We're going to play I-A football in 2001 and 2002. We'll have plenty of competition."

**On the significance of defeating a ranked opponent after bringing an 0-6 record against ranked I-AA teams into the game ...**  
"We just weren't good enough at times. We just needed to improve as a football team. That was all. I never really got into that and I never mentioned that to our team ever. I just wanted to win. We knew we needed this game if we're going to have a chance at the playoffs. But it won't matter if we don't get New Hampshire. I mean New Hampshire is very, very good. They'll be as talented as this team. I believe New Hampshire will be just as talented as this team we faced tonight. I believe they're that good."

**On his reaction to the ISU field goal attempt with :10 left ...**  
"Honestly, I didn't know if it was good or not. I went right to the official and when I saw him say no, it was overwhelming. I was overwhelmed. I knew that I could run out there because it wasn't after a touchdown."
