## OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Noel Devine • Jr. • RB • West Virginia • Fort Myers, Fla.**



Devine ran for 178 yards and a touchdown on 23 carries in the Mountaineers' 28-24 win against Connecticut, keeping West Virginia unbeaten in BIG EAST play. He had 171 rushing yards in the second half, including the deciding touchdown on a 56-yard run with 2:10 left in the fourth quarter. Devine registered his fifth 100-yard game of the season and enters this week's game at USF ranked third nationally at 130.3 yards per game.

## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Dom DeCicco • Jr. • SS • Pittsburgh • Jefferson Hills, Pa.**



DeCicco had a team-high 10 tackles, including nine solo stops, to key a Pittsburgh defense that limited USF to 212 yards of total offense in a 41-14 Panther win. USF entered the game averaging 379.4 yards and 30.9 points per game.

## SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Tavon Austin • Fr. • WR • West Virginia • Baltimore, Md.**



Austin returned the opening kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown in West Virginia's 28-24 win against Connecticut. He finished with 118 yards on two kickoff returns and became the first West Virginia player to score on a kickoff return since Darius Reynaud had a 96-yard TD against Maryland Sept. 14, 2006.

Following the 2008 season, BIG EAST schools are 13-4 in their last 17 bowl games. The conference was 4-2 in bowl games in 2008, 3-2 in 2007 and 5-0 in 2006.

The BIG EAST has a 28-7 nonconference record through seven weeks of the 2009 season. The aggregate record of the seven teams to defeat BIG EAST opponents this season is 33-19.

Seven of the eight BIG EAST teams were either ranked or received votes in one of the three major top-25 polls (Associated Press, USA Today, Harris Interactive) during the 2008 season.

## Head Of The Class

Six BIG EAST players have been named as semifinalists for the 2009 William V. Campbell Trophy, given by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. Semifinalists must be seniors or graduate students with cumulative GPAs of at least 3.2. The award, formerly known as the Draddy Trophy, last went to a BIG EAST player in 2006, when Rutgers' Brian Leonard earned the honor.

- Cincinnati is 7-0 for the fourth time in school history and the first time since the Bearcats went 8-0 to start the 1954 season.
- Cincinnati is one of seven unbeaten teams in the nation. The others are Iowa, Alabama, Texas, Boise State, Florida and Texas Christian.
- The Bearcats have won 13 straight regular-season games and nine straight home games.
- Cincinnati had 12 tackles for loss in the win against Louisville. The Bearcats entered the game as the national leader in tackles for loss at 10.2 per game.
- QB Zach Collaros made his first career start against Louisville.

- WR Jonathan Baldwin had a career-high 144 receiving yards on six receptions.

### POLL EXPLANATION & ABOUT THE BCS:

To derive a team's poll percentages in the Harris Interactive and *USA Today* polls, each team's point total is divided by a maximum 2825 possible points in the Harris Interactive Poll and 1475 possible points in the *USA Today* Poll. Teams are assigned an inverse point total (25 for No. 1, 24 for No. 2, etc.) for each of their respective computer poll rankings to determine the overall computer component. The highest and lowest ranking for each team is dropped, and the sum total of the remaining four rankings is divided by 100 (the maximum possible points). This figure produces a Computer Rankings Percentage. The six computer ranking providers are Anderson & Hester (A&H), Richard Billingsley (B), Colley Matrix (CM), Kenneth Massey (M), Jeff Sagarin (S) and Peter Wolfe (W). Each computer ranking accounts for schedule strength within its formula. The BCS Average is calculated by averaging the percent totals of the Harris Interactive and USA Today Polls, and Computer rankings. The highest BCS Average receives the No. 1 ranking, the second highest receives No. 2, and so forth.

The BCS is a five-game arrangement for post-season college football that is managed by the 11 Bowl Subdivision conferences and Notre Dame. Its purpose is to match the two top-ranked teams in the final BCS standings in a national championship game and to create competitive match-ups in the four other BCS bowl games. # BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES



## About the BCS

The Bowl Championship Series (BCS), which enters its 12th season in 2009-10, is a five-game arrangement for postseason college football that is designed to match the two top-rated teams in a national championship game and to create exciting and competitive matchups between eight other highly regarded teams in four other BCS games.



The BIG EAST has been a charter member in the championship agreement. The league continues as an automatic qualifier in the new BCS agreement that began in 2006.

The Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, FedEx Orange Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl and Rose Bowl presented by Citi have joined with the BIG EAST, Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Pacific-10 and Southeastern Conferences and the University of Notre Dame to form the Bowl Championship Series. In the existing BCS agreement, which began in 2006, each bowl will host two games once every four years - its traditional game plus the BCS National Championship contest approximately one week later.

The BCS is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision conferences, the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame and representatives of the bowl organizations. The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 FBS programs.

The BCS conferences have a contract with Fox Sports to televise the Fiesta, Orange and Sugar Bowls through 2010 and the National Championship Games through 2009. ABC has an agreement to continue to televise the 2010 National Championship Game and the Rose Bowl through 2014.

The BIG EAST has fared particularly well in the BCS. The conference has produced three winners in BCS games in the last four years.

## BCS Automatic Qualifications

1. The top two teams in the final BCS Standings will play in the national championship game.
2. The champions of the Atlantic Coast, BIG EAST, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences automatically qualify for BCS games each year.
3. One team from among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference, the Sun Belt Conference, or the Western Athletic Conference automatically qualify for a BCS game if either: A. Such team is ranked in the top 12 of the final BCS Standings, or, B. Such team is ranked in the top 16 of the final BCS Standings and its ranking in the final BCS Standings is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls.
4. Notre Dame will automatically qualify for a BCS bowl if it is in the top eight of the final BCS Standings.
5. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 4, and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 3 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
6. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 5, and if Step No. 5 has not been applied and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 4 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
7. If any slots remain unfilled after the placement of all teams qualifying for an automatic berth, then the bowls shall choose their participants from the "pool of eligible teams" (see below.)

## Pool of Eligible Teams

If berths are available after the automatic qualifiers have been identified, then the bowls shall select at-large participants from the "pool of eligible teams," which shall include any FBS team that is bowl-eligible and meets the following requirements:

- A. Has won at least nine regular-season games, not including exempted games, and
- B. Is among the top 14 teams in the final BCS Standings

# BIG EAST 2009 BOWL LINEUP



In addition to the Bowl Championship Series, the BIG EAST Conference also has agreements with a number of other postseason bowl games.

The BIG EAST and Big 12 Conferences — along with Notre Dame — forged a bowl partnership beginning in 2006 and ending with the 2009 season. This agreement assured both BCS Conferences' and Notre Dame's participation in the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl and Brut Sun Bowl over a four-year period. The Konica Minolta Gator Bowl or Brut Sun Bowl chooses a BIG EAST team after the league's representative to the Bowl Championship Series has been determined. The Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposition in the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl and the Pac-10 Conference participates in the Brut Sun Bowl.

The Gator Bowl has the first selection at the conclusion of each season and will select a BIG EAST team or Notre Dame in 2009.

The Meineke Car Care Bowl is now in its sixth year with the BIG EAST Conference. The Meineke Car Care Bowl, which is played in Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C., picks after the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl or Brut Sun Bowl.

The BIG EAST aligned itself with two additional bowls beginning in the 2006 season. The International Bowl, played at the Rogers Centre in Toronto, pairs the BIG EAST representative against an opponent from the Mid-America Conference, while the PapaJohns.com Bowl in Birmingham, Ala., matches the BIG EAST selection against a school from the Southeastern Conference. The St. Petersburg Bowl at Tropicana Field will put the BIG EAST's representative against a team from Conference USA.
