PLAYER TO WATCH

USF senior defensive end **George Selvie** will play his final game at Raymond James Stadium on Saturday. It will close one chapter of arguably the most accomplished player in USF history. The two-time All-American holds multiple USF records and is just 7.5 tackles for loss away from breaking the NCAA career record for TFLs. Saturday will be his USF record 48 career start and he will don Keeley Dorsey's No. 10 jersey for his last home game.



THE GAME

The University of South Florida football team (7-3 overall, 3-3 BIG EAST) hosts in-state power No. 19/21 Miami at Raymond James Stadium on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. Eastern

THE SERIES

USF and Miami have met one previous occasion, a 27-7 Hurricane win in Miami in 2005. Saturday will be the first ever meeting between the two in Tampa.

THE BROADCASTS

The game will be carried live to a split national audience by ABC. Mike Patrick (play-by-play), Craig James (analyst) and Heather Cox (sideline) will provide the commentary USF's radio broadcast with Jim Louk, Mark Robinson and Mike Pepper can be heard on 14 affiliates statewide and nationally on Sirius satellite radio channel 158. In addition, 1300 WQBN will broadcast the game in Spanish with David Cuevas and Victor Rodriguez behind the microphones. Both USF radio broadcasts can be heard through BullsVision Radio on GoUSFBulls.com.

THE COACHES

USF: Jim Leavitt (Missouri '78) is the only coach in USF history. He has a career record of 94-55 (.631) and is in his 13th season at USF. Leavitt and the USF program are 63-17 in home games, 12-16 against ranked opponents with six wins in the past eight games, 10-1 against teams from the state of Florida, 0-1 vs. Miami and 4-2 against the ACC with four straight wins against the league dating back to a loss to NC State in the 2005 Meineke Car Care Bowl.
Miami: Randy Shannon (Miami, '88) has a 20-16 record as the head coach at Miami and is in his third season with the Canes.

THE PROGRAM

USF is the only FBS team to start 5-0 each of the last three seasons. The USF program has an all-time record of 67-37 at the NCAA FBS level and a 94-55 overall record. The Bulls FBS winning percentage of 64.7 at the start of the 2009 season was good enough to rank USF 16th among FBS schools in all-time winning percentage. Florida State, Florida, Virginia Tech, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Texas and USF are the only schools to make a bowl appearance in every season of eligibility as a BCS league member. The Bulls are the only school since 1998, to join a BCS member conference and make a bowl appearance every year (2005-08). The BCS era began in 1998 and USF played its first football season in the BIG EAST in 2005.

Any misuse of credentials will result in removal from RJS and the permanent voiding of the credential.

The daily practice schedule is listed below. Only Coach Leavitt and assistant coaches are available for interviews after practice. Players are only available on Tuesdays during the press conference. Every effort will be made to accommodate player requests on Tuesdays.

Under no circumstances should media members contact a USF student-athlete without prior consent and approval from the USF Communications office and/or football contact Chris Freet. The same policy applies to the family members of student-athletes.

STAFF INTERVIEWS

All interview requests for assistant coaches or athletics department staff members must also be approved and cleared by the USF Communications office and/or football contact Chris Freet.

POSTGAME POLICY

The USF locker room is closed at all times. Coach Leavitt and a handful of USF players will report to the media room for interviews. USF will take interview requests for players and assistant coaches at the beginning of the fourth quarter. On the road, USF will conduct interviews at the designated location by the host institution.

WRAPPING UP LOUISVILLE

The Bulls' victory improved their all-time record over Louisville to 4-3 ... USF has won two of its last three games against the Cardinals and three of its last five ... In addition, the Bulls are now 4-0 against UofL at Raymond James Stadium ... This season, USF is honoring former player Keeley Dorsey by wearing his No. 10 jersey ... Senior QB Matt Grothe donned the jersey ... Dorsey passed away after a team conditioning workout on Jan. 17, 2007 ... This season would have been his senior year ... The attendance of 49,388 marked the 15th time in the last 16 home games that USF has had 40,000 or more fans in the house ... Redshirt-freshman B.J. Daniels had 445 yards of total offense (304 passing, 141 rushing) on the day ... Daniels' total outgained Louisville as a team, which had 313 yards on the day ... Daniels became the first quarterback in school history to surpass the 300-yard passing and the 100-yard rushing marks in a single game... He is the first Big East player with 300 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the same game and the 28th player in FBS history to do so ... QB B.J. Daniels ran for a 20-yard touchdown with 9:30 left in the third quarter ... The run put Daniels over 100 yards (103 yards at the time of the score) for the fourth time this season ... In addition to Saturday's 141 yards, Daniels also reached the century yard mark against Charleston Southern (105) on Sept. 19, Florida State (126) on Sept. 26 and West Virginia (104) on Oct. 30 ... Daniels had career highs in passing yards (304), rushing yards (141), completions (20) and attempts (34) ... It was also his second highest number of rushing attempts (22) ... Daniels recorded his second touchdown of the afternoon on a one-yard run with 5:09 left in the game ... It was his sixth TD of the season and career ... He now leads the team with six rushing touchdowns in 2009, one better than Mo Plancher's five ... RB Mo Plancher, S Nate Allen, LB Kion Wilson, DE George Selvie and QB Matt Grothe were USF's captains for today's game ... Captains

will be announced throughout the season by coach Jim Leavitt on a game-by-game basis ... QB B.J. Daniels threw his 11th touchdown pass of the season - and the 11th of his career - with a 16-yard connection to WR Dontavia Bogan with 9:56 left in the first quarter ... WR Dontavia Bogan's 16-yard touchdown reception from QB B.J. Daniels with 9:56 left in the first quarter was Bogan's fourth TD catch of the season, and the sixth of his career ... RB Mo Plancher rushed for his fifth touchdown of the season and the 11th of his career with a two-yard scamper with 19 seconds left in the first quarter ... With his third catch of the game, Jessie Hester became the fifth player in school history with 100 career receptions ... Hester is currently fifth on USF's career receptions list with 102 ... Hester had five catches for 43 yards ... FS Nate Allen picked off his fourth pass of the season and the ninth of his career with 7:14 left in the third quarter ... K Eric Schwartz went 2-3 on field goal attempts including a 44-yard boot with 7:14 left in the third quarter ... WR A.J. Love surpassed the 100-yard reception plateau today with 121 yards on 4 receptions ... That marks a career-high for Love and the first time he has recorded 100 yards or more. He previous high was 83 against Kansas in 2008 and 80 against Rutgers on Nov. 12 ... Senior LB Kion Wilson led the Bulls in tackles for the fourth consecutive week with 12 tackles (6 solo, 6 assists) ... Wilson now has a team best 91 tackles in 2009 ... USF had 538 yards of total offense, which was the second high total of 2009 and the second time the Bulls have eclipsed 500 yards this season ... The season high was 547 against Charleston Southern ... It is only the third time that USF has produced 500 yards of total offense in a BIG EAST game and the first time it was not against Syracuse ... USF had 500 plus against Cuse in 2006 & 2007.

SENIORS MAKE THEIR MARKS ON USF RECORD BOOK

A total of 16 players (Nate Allen, Delbert Alvarado, Dexter Baldwin, Craig Breen, Ben Busbee, Colby Erskin, Matt Grothe, Aaron Harris, Jessie Hester, Kenneth Luberic, Jerome Murphy, Moise Plancher, Chris Robinson, George Selvie, Kion Wilson, Theo Wilson) will be making their final home appearance Saturday against Miami, and the senior class is the winningest in USF history (33 wins). Additionally, they have left their marks on the USF program and its all-time records.

Quarterback Matt Grothe owns or shares most of USF's passing records with current program assistant and former Bull Marquel Blackwell. Grothe ranks right behind Blackwell in career attempts (1,148), completions (717), yards (8,669) and touchdown passes (52) and owns the highest completion percentage mark in school annals (62.5 percent). Grothe also leaves USF with four of the top five passing games in school history in terms of yards. In addition, Grothe ranks first in most rushing attempts in school history (542) as well as third in rushing yards (2,206). Grothe also leaves USF with the most yards of total offense (10,875), also the BIG EAST all-time record.

George Selvie has a stranglehold on defensive records that may not be broken for a while. He owns the records for most tackles for loss (68) and sacks (29) as well as tackle for loss and sack yardage (300, 172), and for most forced fumbles (9). Selvie also stands alone with most career starts at 47.

Wide receiver Jessie Hester has made his mark on USF's receiving records, ranking fifth in career receptions (102), sixth in touchdown passes (8) and seventh in yards (1,135). Hester's junior season saw him post the second-most receptions in a season ever with 54, while his mark of 22 straight games with a reception stands as the top mark in program history.

Senior Jerome Murphy can tie Stephen Nicolas' record for career games played against Miami and can own the record outright should he not miss any games this season, while George Selvie will rank second all time at season's end. Seniors Chris Robinson, Ben Busbee, Aaron Harris, Nate Allen and Delbert Alvarado will all move up the all-time games played list as well (see right). Alvarado has the third-best punt average in school history.

KEVIN PATRICK TO FACE HIS ALMA MATER

During his playing days, USF defensive line coach Kevin Patrick was an All-American defensive end at the University of Miami from 1989-93.

He was a major contributor on the Hurricane team that claimed two National Championships with wins over Nebraska in the 1992 Orange Bowl and over Alabama in the 1990 Sugar Bowl. Patrick also played in the Cotton and Fiesta Bowls during his career.

He is the second individual in the USF program to have earned BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honors. Patrick claimed his in 1993, while two-time All-American George Selvie earned that honor last season.

Patrick earned his All-America honors and team MVP accolades in 1993 when he collected 10 sacks. During his career he tallied 174 tackles and 23 sacks, which ranks fifth in program history.

Notes

- Patrick was coached on the defensive line by current UM head coach Randy Shannon in 1992.
- Information on Patrick and his All-American season in 1993 can be found on page 151 of the current Miami media guide.
- Current Miami assistant Michael Barrow was a teammate of Patrick and also earned All-American honors during his career. Barrow was an All-American in 1992.

USF & MIAMI PREGAME NUGGETS

- Miami has 57 players from the state of Florida on its online roster.
- USF has 92 players from the state of Florida on its online roster.
- USF and UM only have one common opponent this season, Florida State. Miami beat the Seminoles in the season opener, 38-34. USF beat Florida State, 17-7, in week four. Both games were played in Tallahassee.
- USF is 10-1 against schools from the state of Florida, including one game against Miami. This is the Bulls second meeting with Miami and the first of five consecutive years that the programs will meet.
- Miami has an all-time record of 101-64-6 against schools from the state of Florida.
- USF has won seven straight against teams from its home state, while UM has won four straight against teams from its home state.
- Miami, a former BIG EAST member, is 83-21-2 against current members of the BIG EAST. The only current member it has not faced is UConn. UM has winning records against the seven BIG EAST schools it has played.
- USF is 4-2 against current members of the ACC and has won four straight against the conference.
- The University of Miami was founded in 1925 and has been playing football since 1926.
- USF was founded in 1956 and has been playing football since 1997.
- UM has an enrollment of 15,323 and USF has the ninth largest enrollment in the country at 46,174.
- UM has been ranked in the AP top 10 three times in 2009.
- USF was last ranked in the top 10 in 2008, but was also in the top 10 during the 2007 season.
- Randy Shannon (5-7) and Jim Leavitt (5-6) both won five games in their inaugural seasons with their current Universities.
- USF is 12-16 all-time versus teams ranked in the top 25.
- Since USF joined the FBS in 2005, they own a record of 39-22. During that time UM is 36-25.

MORE ON COACHING CONNECTIONS

- USF co-defensive coordinator David Blackwell was 1-1 against Miami during his time at Clemson. Both games were overtime contests, with Clemson winning on the road (24-17) in 2004 and losing in three overtimes at home in 2005 (36-30).
- While serving as the linebackers coach at Pitt from 2000-02, Blackwell was on the losing end of three games against Miami.
- Carl Franks was at two schools with significant histories against UM - Duke and Florida - from 1987-2003, yet he never faced the Canes until he came to USF and the Bulls played at Miami in 2005.
- As a coach John Hendrick was defeated by Miami once at Pitt (1984), twice at Temple (1993, 1994) and never faced the Canes while a student-athlete at Pitt.
- Tight ends coach Steve Bird fell to Miami three times while on the staff at Pitt (1993-95) and three times while at West Virginia (2001-03).
- USF director of high school relations Rich Rachel was the secondary coach at the University of Tampa when they lost to Miami, 28-26, in 1974.
- The younger brother of USF recruiting assistant Mary Trump is A.J. Trump, the starting offensive guard for the Canes.

MAKING A NAME FOR HIMSELF

USF junior defensive end Jason Pierre-Paul started training camp 14 days late, but that hasn't stopped his progress on the field. Pierre-Paul leads USF with 12.5 tackles for loss and is tied for the team lead with 4.5 sacks. Throw in an interception and a touchdown, a forced fumble, three pass breakups and six quarterback hurries and it is obvious why he has opponents on full alert. Pierre-Paul is third in the BIG EAST in TFL per game with an average of 1.25 and ranks fourth in total TFL. Nationally, Pierre-Paul is tied for 27th in TFL per game.

Pierre-Paul & George Selvie have arguably formed the most feared tandem of defensive ends in the BIG EAST. Their efforts have freed up the inside where Craig Marshall (4.5 TFL, 4 sacks), Terrell McClain (4.0 TFL, 1.5 sacks), David Bedford (2.5 TFL, 1 sack) and Aaron Harris (4 TFL, 4 sacks) have helped form arguably the best defensive line in the BIG EAST.

Pierre-Paul is a full-blooded Haitian, who has an 81-inch wing span and can do a backflip in full pads. The 6-6, 265 Deerfield Beach product was a basketball player until his junior year of high school.

WILSON NAMED DEFENSIVE POY

USF senior linebacker Kion Wilson was named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 2. Despite being a game time decision (groin), Wilson led a Bulls defense that limited West Virginia to 323 yards of total offense and held Heisman-candidate Noel Devine to 42 yards rushing. Wilson had a game-high 12 tackles, one interception and 2.5 tackles for loss. Wilson was also named the CollegeFootballPerformance.com co-national linebacker of the week.

INTERCHANGEABLE PARTS

Disregard the starting lineup on the defensive line because defensive coordinator Joe Tresey and defensive line coach Kevin Patrick feel like they have 10 capable players. The only starter each and every week is two-time All-American George Selvie. Otherwise seven other players have started. The only players that have not started and appear on the USF depth chart are Patrick Hampton (behind Selvie) and juco transfer Leslie Stirrups. Seven of the 10 defensive linemen have registered at least one tackle for loss and all of them have at least three tackles. The defensive line has accounted for 39 of the team's 66 tackles for loss and 19.5 of the team's 23 sacks.

MEET SKINNY

USF junior defensive back Mistral "Skinny" Raymond might be the best story on the 2009 team. After playing a bit role in 2008, he is a key cog on Joe Tresey's defense. As defensive graduate assistant and former NFL standout J.R. Reed said, "He's impressed me from day one. He can step in at any position in the secondary and help us."

What makes his story even better is that Raymond did not participate during the spring. Yet he's practiced at such a level that he is a trusted backup at every position in the secondary and has earned four starts. His story came to the forefront when he picked off a pass against WKU. He has 23 tackles and one interception this season. Raymond spent two seasons at Ellsworth Community College in Iowa - one as a redshirt - before joining the Bulls. He led Ellsworth with 67 tackles in 2007.

DEFENSIVE TRENDS

- Kion Wilson has led USF in tackles for five straight games and on six occasions this season.
- Wilson has recorded double-digit tackles in four straight games.
- The USF defense has intercepted a pass in 26 of the last 36 games and has 45 picks during that time ... The Bulls were fourth nationally with 23 interceptions in 2007 and are now led by defensive coordinator Joe Tresey, whose defenses have been characterized by their ability to produce turnovers.
- Since 2005, USF has forced 135 turnovers and if you include blocked kicks, the number jumps to 147.
- USF allowed just 27 points in the first four games, which is the lowest total over any four game stretch in program history and a large part of the reason the Bulls are No.23 nationally in scoring defense.
- The Bulls allowed just 47 points over the first five games, which is the second lowest point total in program history. The best stretch was 44 points in 1998.
- USF did not allow a passing touchdown in the first four games of the year. That streak was broken against Syracuse, which had two scoring connections between Greg Paulus and Mike Williams.

MR. CLUTCH

Playing in front of the largest crowd of his career, Allen gave the Seminoles a fit in Tallahassee, where he recovered one fumble and was responsible for two pass breakups and a tackle for loss. Allen has made a name for himself throughout his career by producing momentum-shifting turnovers in crucial moments. Here is the rundown:

2009 vs. FSU: Allen filled up the stat sheet with tackle for loss, fumble recovery and a pair of pass break ups, including one in the end zone that would have been a sure touchdown.

2008 vs. Kansas: With just 41 seconds left on the clock, Allen intercepted a Todd Reesing skinny post and returned it 40 yards to setup the game-winning field goal by Maikon Bonani.

2007 at Auburn: Allen had an interception, fumble recovery and forced fumble in the Bulls' upset win at Jordan Hare Stadium. He was named Nagurski National Player of the Week for his efforts.

2007 vs. West Virginia: In front of a sold out crowd, Allen had a fumble recovery and 44-yard return, plus a second-half interception in the Bulls' 21-13 win over the Mountaineers.

2007 at Pitt: With the score at 20-14, Allen intercepted a pass and returned it 37 yards for a touchdown. The TD keyed a 27-point swing that led to the Bulls 48-37 win over the Panthers.

ALLEN EARNS NATIONAL HONORS

After intercepting two passes against Syracuse and leading a defense that tied a program record by forcing seven turnovers, Nate Allen was named Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week. He was also named national defensive back of the week by CollegePerformance.com and the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week.

- Prior to Rutgers, George Selvie had been double or triple teamed on 186 of 442 snaps played this season. Against Western Kentucky he faced a double or triple team on 36 of 49 plays. Selvie played on 34 snaps against Charleston Southern and was double teamed 24 times. He was never left unblocked by CSU.
- Selvie put together a classic performance against No. 18/25 Florida State with one sack, two tackles for loss and a fumble recovery while facing the lowest number of double teams this season. Against No. 8/9 Cincinnati, Selvie had two tackles for loss, one sack and a forced fumble.
- The emergence of Jason Pierre-Paul has shifted team's ability to put multiple blockers on Selvie. His double team numbers dropped from 23 to 7 from week five vs. Syracuse to week six vs. Cincinnati.

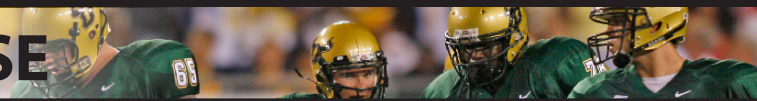

MITCHELL ON THE MOVE

Junior wide receiver Carlton Mitchell is having arguably the best season of his career with 29 receptions for a career high 542 yards and four touchdowns.

Can Mitchell break the USF career record for receiving yards in just his junior year? All he needs is one long pass from B.J. Daniels. With 1,484 career yards, he is just 40 shy of breaking Hugh Smith's record of 1,523.

Where he has already set himself apart from Smith is in his average yards per reception. Mitchell is averaging 15.8 yards per catch over his career and 18.7 this season, while Smith tallied 11.6 during his time in Tampa.

At his current rate Mitchell needs another three receptions to surpass Smith. Mitchell averaged 32.5 receptions his first two years at USF and already has 29 in 2009.

DEEP THREAT

Carlton Mitchell might be the BIG EAST's most deadly deep threat and with nine plays of 50 yards or more in his career, he is already the most prolific deep threat in USF history. He has been producing big plays since his redshirt-freshman year in 2007. Below is a breakdown of his long plays:

MORE 100 YARD GAMES TOO

With his 132 yard performance against West Virginia, Mitchell took sole possession of the USF career record for 100-yard receiving games. He now has five in his career and three this season, which also ties the USF single season record.

MORE MO PLANCHER

Senior RB Mo Plancher was a hard luck kid for USF for much of his career ... He was the starting running back in 2006 before suffering a knee injury in the opener ... In 2007 his role was limited because of his recovery from the knee injury ... During the spring of 2008, he injured his elbow, but was able to quickly turn the corner and make a splash in the 2008 opener ... Plancher had 65 yards on eight carries and scored two touchdowns ... He finished 2008 with 322 yards and a team-best six rushing touchdowns.

Then as the No. 1 back in the 2009 season opener, Plancher had a career-best 78 yards and two touchdowns ... He followed that up by rushing for another career-best 115 yards against Western Kentucky ... He was the first player in a span of 16 games to rush for 100 ... Plancher was also the first player to rush for two TDs in back-to-back games since Mike Ford had two scores in three straight games in 2007 (Syracuse, Louisville and Pitt) ... He became the 12th player in USF history to account for 10 rushing TDs during their career ... The Naples native had 89 hard-fought yards in the Bulls win over West Virginia and is second on the team with 461 yards and five touchdowns.

BOGAN RETURNS INTO RECORD BOOKS

As a sophomore Dontavia Bogan combined for 135 yards on two kickoff returns against UConn (Nov. 15, 2008) ... He set a USF and BIG EAST record for average yards (67.5) per return in a game, breaking the previous mark of 62.5 by Devin Hester of Miami in 2003 against Florida ... Bogan would set a career-high with a 71-yard kick return with less than a minute left in the first half ... In addition to it being a career-high, it also became the longest punt or kick return of the season for USF ... Bogan returned 29 kicks in 2008, which is a USF single-season record ... He also broke the USF single-season record for kickoff return yards with 770 and is currently tops in the USF career record book for average yards per kickoff return at 23.8.

In 2009, Bogan is averaging 20.2 yards per return. He has 29 returns for 586 yards.

LOVING LAMAR'S DEBUT

Lindsey Lamar was the undisputed star of training camp and that was based completely on reputation. The USF fan base had not even seen him run until his debut against Wofford. Lamar accounted for 63 all-purpose yards and one rushing touchdown. He had 39 rushing yards and 24 receiving yards on four receptions.

As far as true-freshman debuts, it is the best since Mike Ford posted 83 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns in the 2007 season-opening win over Elon.

OFFENSIVE TRENDS

- USF has posted 400 yards of total offense and scored 30 or more points in the same game in 15 of the last 32 outings.
- Mike Canales was the offensive coordinator at USF from 1996 (practice season) through 2000. He returned to that designation this season. Under Canales USF has:

- Scored 80 or more points: 1 time
- Scored 60-69 points: 1 time
- Scored 50-59 points: 3 times, 1 time in 2009
- Scored 40-49 points: 8 times, 1 time in 2009
- Scored 30-39 points: 8 times, 4 times in 2009

- Canales has been the OC at USF for 53 total games (44 in first turn from 1996-00) and the Bulls have averaged 28.1 points under his direction.

BONANI & GROTHE OUT

Two significant pieces of the USF attack will be out for the entire 2009 season. Starting kicker Maikon Bonani is expected to miss the entire year after cracking a vertebrae in his back following a mishap while working at Busch Gardens. Bonani was 15-21 on field goal attempts and 31-32 on extra points last season. He has returned to practice but is not expected to play in 2009.

Senior quarterback Matt Grothe is out with a torn ACL, which has already been surgically repaired. Grothe will pursue a professional career after finishing his Bulls career with more yards of total offense than any player in league history.0

USF TO HONOR DORSEY & BLEAKLEY

USF head coach Jim Leavitt announced that the football team will honor the memory of former player Keeley Dorsey throughout the 2009 season.

During each game, a player will wear the No. 10 jersey that Dorsey wore for the Bulls during the 2006 season. Dorsey passed away after a team conditioning workout on January 17, 2007 and the 2009 campaign would have been his senior season.

The idea to honor Dorsey began with equipment manager Jeremy Lees, who watched Missouri seniors honor former player Aaron O'Neal by wearing his No. 25 jersey during games in 2008. Lees and the senior class took the idea to the Coach Leavitt during the preseason and agreed upon starting the initiative.

USF had to approve the idea with the NCAA and will notify the opponent, referees and stat crew prior to each game.

Dorsey, who attended Lincoln High in Tallahassee, played in eight games his freshman season at USF, collecting 66 yards on 10 rushes. In his first game for the Green and Gold, Dorsey broke for a 52-yard touchdown run, the final play of USF's 41-0 season-opening victory over McNeese State on Sept. 2, 2006. Dorsey was 19 years old.

FRESH FACES

Against Wofford, cornerback Kayvon Webster and wide receiver Sterling Griffin became the first true-freshmen to start the first game of their careers since S.J. Green accomplished the feat against Alabama in 2003. Webster had three tackles in his debut. Griffin did not have a catch, thus couldn't break the premier record of Green who had four catches for 45 yards back in 2003. Both also started against CSU.

- Griffin is fourth on the team in receiving yards with 250. He has 13 total catches and one 73-yard touchdown against Florida State.
- Jason Pierre-Paul has 33 tackles, an interception and touchdown, 12.5 TFL, three PBU, one FF and 4.5 sacks. The 6-6, 260 pounder can also do a back flip in shoulder pads, owns an 81-inch wing span and hurdled an offensive tackle in the season opener.
- True freshman defensive end Ryne Giddens did not make his collegiate debut in Green and Gold until the second half of USF's win over Western Kentucky, but his impact was immediate. On just 11 snaps, the true-freshman Ryne Giddens registered two sacks against a WKU offense that was trying to narrow the margin in the Bulls 35-13 win. His single-game total was the best by a Bull this season until Craig Marshall matched that performance against Florida State.
- He's a returnee, but junior David Bedford shined in his first career start against WKU. Bedford had a sack and a tackle for loss against the Hilltoppers.
- Webster has quietly been a key cog in the Bulls defense. Webster registered his first career interception against Syracuse and has 24 tackles, one pass breakup and one fumble recovery.

MOMENT OF SILENCE FOR BLEAKLEY

USF also held a moment of silence prior to the season opener against Wofford, in honor alum of Will Bleakley, Oakland Raiders linebacker Marquis Cooper, and NFL free agent Corey Smith, who all passed away on a boating expedition this spring. Former USF walk-on Nick Schuyler survived the expedition and has spoken for the first time over the last month.

SEASON TICKET COUNT

USF distributed 24,185 season tickets in 2009, which is the second best mark in program history ... In 2008, USF distributed 27,879 season tickets to establish a new school record ... In 2007 USF distributed 20,043 season tickets, which ranks fourth now ... The previous record season ticket number of 20,619 was set in the inaugural season of 1997 ... The numbers do not include the largest student allotment in the BIG EAST of 12,501, which are all complimentary.

A MODEL OF EFFICIENCY

The Chronicle of Higher Education listed the recruiting budgets of every FBS football program during the summer of 2008 and USF, which had been ranked in the top-10 the two seasons prior, spent the least amount of recruiting money of any BCS football program. There are plenty of factors involved, including USF's focus on talent in Florida primarily and to a lesser extent in Georgia, Alabama and Mississippi. According to the study, USF spent \$468,813, which speaks to the program's ability to evaluate talent and get the most out of their players. West Virginia had the largest budget in the BIG EAST, at over \$1 million, while the top dollar figure surpassed \$2 million by Tennessee.

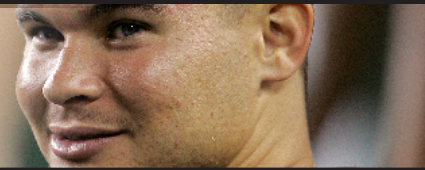

Grothe's Season Ends Early

University of South Florida senior quarterback Matt Grothe will be out for the remainder of the 2009 season after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in his left knee in last night's game against Charleston Southern.

"Obviously, I am disappointed because you never think this could happen to you," said Grothe. "It's a team game and I am still going to be very involved with my teammates and the coaches. I am going to do everything I can to help the Bulls continue to win."

USF head coach Jim Leavitt reiterated his thoughts from after Saturday night's game.

"Matt's a franchise guy and an even better human being," said Leavitt. "We all know that. What he's done in college football is extraordinary. He has been one of the greatest names out there. We all know that and our entire program feels bad for him. Matt is a special, special guy."

Grothe had been the starting quarterback for USF since his redshirt-freshman year in 2006 and had started 41 consecutive games for the Bulls. During that time he became the BIG EAST career leader in total offense with 10,875 yards.

Grothe rushed for 2,206 yards and scored 23 touchdowns over 42 career games. He passed for 8,669 yards and 52 touchdowns, both of which are the second best marks in USF history.

"Injuries are part of the game, but we're still devastated for Matt," said USF offensive coordinator Mike Canales. "It's tough losing a player and leader of Matt's caliber."

The Lakeland native accounted for 46.3 percent of the Bulls total offense this season with 121 rushing yards and 512 yards through the air.

The Bulls have two capable backups in redshirt freshmen B.J. Daniels and Evan Landi, and Daniels will step into the starting role, but neither has the experience that Grothe accumulated as the face of the program the last four seasons.

Beyond his statistical accomplishments, Grothe was named the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year in 2006, an honorable mention freshman All-American in 2006 and the magicJack St. Petersburg Bowl MVP in 2008. He was also named the USF offensive playmaker of the year by his coaches and teammates in 2007 and 2008.

KEEPING TABS ON GROTHE

Prior to going down with a season ending injury against Charleston Southern on Sept. 20, Grothe was named to the watch lists for the Maxwell, O'Brien, Unitas and Manning awards ... Coach Leavitt said that Matt Grothe had the best and most focused preseason of his career in 2009 ... Offensive coordinator Mike Canales compared Grothe to his former protege, Phillip Rivers of the San Diego Chargers, because of his addiction to watching film this offseason ... Broke the BIG EAST career total offense record on a 12-yard run at the 10-minute mark of the second quarter at Western Kentucky ... Also tossed his 50th career TD and completed his 700th pass against WKU ... Grothe was 19-23 for 155 yards, one touchdown and one interception in win over Wofford ... His completion percentage of 82.6 is a school record, breaking the previous mark of 80.4 by Marquel Blackwell against Southern Utah on Oct. 20, 2001 ... Also broke the USF career record for total offense against Wofford.

MOVE OVER PAT WHITE

At the 10-minute mark of the second quarter of the Western Kentucky game, Matt Grothe became the BIG EAST's all-time leader in total offense. He needed a 12-yard run to break the mark of West Virginia's Pat White (10,529). He finished the CSU game with 10,875 yards of total offense.

Below is the list of total offense records for BIG EAST schools, including those from players like Louisville's Brian Brohm, who didn't play in the BIG EAST for all four years of his career. The list marks the all-time total offense mark from any BIG EAST member institution school throughout all their histories.

TAMPA (AP) -- Moise Plancher ran for two touchdowns and Matt Grothe moved closer to becoming the BIG EAST's career total offense leader Saturday night, leading South Florida to a season-opening 40-7 rout of Wofford. Plancher scored on runs of 4 and 9 yards and finished with 78 yards rushing on 12 carries. Grothe threw a second-quarter touchdown pass to Theo Wilson and had 155 yards passing and 44 rushing to increase his four-year total to 10,441 yards -- 88 shy of Pat White's BIG EAST record. USF overcame a slow start, snapping a 7-7 tie on Grothe's touchdown pass to Theo Wilson and adding a safety to make it 16-7 before halftime. Plancher scored his second touchdown early in the third quarter, and the Bulls rolled from there. Wofford's wingbone offense was effective early, and the Terriers wound up rushing for 177 yards on 50 attempts. Fullback Eric Breitenstein gained 121 yards on 13 carries and scored on a 2-yard run in the first quarter. USF coach Jim Leavitt insisted that opening against Wofford, which won nine games and participated in the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs each of the past two years, would be a good test for a young, but talented team that expects to contend for the Bulls' first BIG EAST title. Wofford played South Carolina tough a year ago, losing 23-13 but drawing a glowing review from Gamecocks coach Steve Spurrier, who saluted the team's effort level. For most of the first half, the Terriers gave USF all it could handle, too. Sophomore quarterback Mitch Allen, making his first college start, answered Grothe's game-opening touchdown drive with an impressive march of his own. The Terriers moved 69 yards in 13 plays, tying the game 7-all on Breitenstein's 2-yard run. Wofford turned back one USF threat with Tommy Irvin's end zone interception of Grothe, whose 39-yard run got the Bulls inside the 10-yard line. Four plays later, the Terriers began unraveling. An errant snap on a punt set up Grothe's 6-yard scoring pass to Theo Wilson with 36 seconds left in the opening half. A second bad snap that sailed over Chris Tommie's head resulted in a safety, making it 16-7, when the Wofford punter ran down the loose ball and kicked it through the end zone with one second remaining. If Tommie had picked up the ball -- instead of kicking it intentionally -- just inside the 20, the final seconds of the half likely would have run out. Plancher's second TD run and Delbert Alvarado's 30-yard field goal extended USF's lead to 26-7 in the third quarter. Lindsey Lamar scored on a 13-yard run and Grothe's backup, B.J. Daniel, threw a 22-yard TD pass to Jeffrey Wilson in the fourth quarter.

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. (AP) -- Matt Grothe threw for 208 yards and two touchdowns, becoming the Big East's all-time leader in total offense to help South Florida pull away from Western Kentucky 35-13 on Saturday night. The senior quarterback added 53 yards rushing to boost his career total yardage to 10,702, breaking the record of 10,529 held by former West Virginia star Pat White as the Bulls (2-0) took control in the second half to pull away from the Hilltoppers. Grothe threw touchdown passes of 14 yards to Theo Wilson and 17 yards to Ben Busbee, helping the Bulls overcome a sluggish start and post their 13th straight regular season nonconference win. Moise Plancher added 115 yards rushing and two touchdowns for South Florida. WKU (0-2) saw its bid for an attention-grabbing upset fall short behind a slew of penalties (13) and an almost nonexistent passing game. Quarterback Brandon Smith ran for 105 yards but had little time in the pocket when dropping back to pass. He completed 13 of 26 passes for just 84 yards and was sacked three times. The Hilltoppers had hoped to turn the first-ever visit to LT Smith Stadium by a member of a Bowl Championship Series conference into a coming out party. While WKU certainly fared better than it did in a season-opening 63-7 mauling at Tennessee - a game in which the Hilltoppers amassed 83 yards of total offense - the Bulls made sure the second-largest crowd in WKU history went home early. The Hilltoppers have pointed to the Bulls as an example of how to make the jump from the Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision the right way. The Bulls made the step up 11 years ago and have become a perennial contender in the Big East. WKU's goals aren't quite so ambitious - at least, not yet - but South Florida showed the Hilltoppers there's still plenty of work to do. WKU trailed just 14-6 at the half, but South Florida snapped out of its doldrums when Grothe hit Carlton Mitchell for a 65-yard pass that set up a touchdown run by BJ Daniels. WKU responded with a 15-yard score by Marell Booker - thanks in part of a personal foul penalty by the Bulls on an incomplete third-down pass - to get within 21-13 with 27 seconds left in the third. Undaunted, Grothe took over. He led South Florida right back down the field and put the game away on a play that perfectly summarized his career. He dropped back to pass, ducked away from pressure then scrambled to buy enough time to find Busbee in the back of the endzone to put the Bulls up 28-13. WKU was stopped on fourth down on its next possession, and Plancher busted loose for a 20-yard score with 6:03 to play to finish it off. The easy victory hardly seemed possible during an ugly first half, when at times it was hard to tell which team was the FBS newcomer. During one sequence in the first quarter South Florida muffed a WKU punt, which the Hilltoppers recovered. The play was nullified by a penalty. On the rekick, the ball bounced off a South Florida player and the Hilltoppers recovered again. The rest of the half followed a similar pattern: the Bulls would make a mistake and the Hilltoppers would make a bigger one. Grothe threw a pick and WKU appeared to pull within four on a 14-yard touchdown run by Smith. It was called back by a penalty and the Hilltoppers had to settle for a field goal.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) -- South Florida fans didn't want to leave. Not even after more than three hours of sitting in 90-degree weather. Most of the more than 12,000 sun-drenched, green-clad boosters remained in their end zone seats chanting "USF, USF," for some 20 minutes after the Bulls defeated No. 18 Florida State 17-7 Saturday. It was the first meeting between the schools and came in front of Florida State's biggest home crowd in four years. The USF team stormed to the south end zone to salute their fans as the final seconds ticked off the clock. USF President Judy Genschaft, also in green, was leaving her air-conditioned skybox looking for the quickest way to the Bulls locker room. "Do you believe it?" she said happily as she hurried to an elevator. "You have to beat them to get talked about," South Florida coach Jim Leavitt said. "It changes history," he added. "You have to beat them to get talked about. Now I can say we should be talked about." It was USF's first win over the state's big three - Miami, Florida and Florida State. "They whupped us," said FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who talked all week about not being eager to play South Florida for the first time. "They're a lot better than I thought." Bowden and his staff are now also likely to face questions about how they could let a talent like USF quarterback B.J. Daniels get out of town. Daniels, a redshirt freshman who grew up in Tallahassee and was largely ignored by Florida State recruiters, dismantled the Seminoles' defense with one big play after another in his first career start. He was replacing four-year starter Matt Grothe, the Big East Conference's career total offense leader, who had a season-ending injury last week. "It feels good playing in front of your friends and your family," Daniels said. "I was very familiar with the people around so I definitely felt comfortable and it wasn't anything to get me nervous." Daniels ran for 126 yards, threw two touchdown passes and accounted for 341 of USF's 368 yards of offense. "He's a great athlete," Bulls defensive end George Selvie said. "I'm glad to have him as my quarterback." "He killed us," Bowden lamented after the game. "Boy, they've got a great one there." It was the first time since Nebraska's Steve Taylor ran for 139 yards against the Seminoles in 1986 that an opposing quarterback rushed for over 100 yards against them. The 6-1, 210-pound Daniels said after the game that he chose USF because the school allowed him to also compete in basketball, where he won playing time last winter at point guard. Florida State (2-2) lost four fumbles, including a critical one by quarterback Christian Ponder that allowed USF to ice the game. "The way we got beat up on offense, I didn't know we could get beat up like that," Bowden said. "They did everything faster than I thought." South Florida (4-0) stuffed Florida State's running game, sacked Ponder five times and continually had Florida State's offensive line on its heels. "The front four was absolutely relentless," Leavitt said. "To hold them to 19 yards rushing was really important." The Seminoles rushed for 313 yards a week ago in a 54-28 thrashing of then-No. 7 Brigham Young. Ponder completed 25 of 37 passes for 269 yards, most of it coming on short throws since he didn't have time to go downfield. South Florida stopped the Seminoles on four plays from the 3-yard line early in the second quarter. USF then needed just five plays to cover 99 yards to get the game's first touchdown. "That told the story right there," Bowden said. Daniels hit a wide-open Theo Wilson on a 77-yard pass to the Florida State 8 to set up a TD throw to Ben Busbee on the next play. That put the Bulls up 7-0. Another huge pass play, this one a 73-yard scoring pass from Daniels to Sterling Griffin, gave USF a 14-0 lead at the half. "It's a great story, a quarterback coming back home," Leavitt said. "Those things don't happen all the time, but it did today. It did today."

SYRACUSE, N.Y. (AP) -- B.J. Daniels dashed Syracuse's hopes just when the Orange had momentum, and the South Florida defense took care of Greg Paulus. Daniels hit Carlton Mitchell with an 85-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the second half to break open a one-point game. Defensive end Jason Pierre-Paul returned an interception 18 yards for another score, and the Bulls remained unbeaten, 34-20 over the mistake-prone Orange on Saturday in the Big East opener for both teams. "I had to put some points on the board," said Daniels, who a week ago led the Bulls to a stunning 17-7 win at Florida State in his first college start. "Carlton just came open deep, the corner was cheating inside, and I hit him long." Syracuse (2-3) had won two straight behind Paulus, who entered the game completing nearly 70 percent of his passes. But against one of the top defenses in the country the former Duke point guard faltered, throwing five interceptions as the Orange committed seven turnovers. Paulus finished 25 for 46 for 269 yards, was sacked three times, and equaled the school mark for interceptions set by Todd Norley in a 28-7 loss at Penn State in 1982. "I don't think I've had five interceptions before," said Paulus, a star quarterback in high school in Syracuse. "I've had eight, nine, 10 turnovers in basketball. You just can't do that against a good opponent. You start to press a little bit. It's all on me." Daniels' strike to Mitchell gave South Florida a 21-13 lead, but Paulus guided the Orange right back down the field to the USF 21, converting on third-and-long situations three straight times. But the fourth third down of the drive led to another turnover when Pierre-Paul hit Paulus' throwing arm as he released the ball and Kayvon Webster intercepted. Daniels then guided USF on a 48-yard scoring drive capped by Mike Ford's 5-yard run. Pierre-Paul made his critical interception on the Orange's next possession, laying back at the line of scrimmage on first down. "I saw it and I grabbed it," said Pierre-Paul, who scored untouched. "I was waiting and I was surprised." "I didn't see him," said Paulus, who had touchdown throws of 11 and 29 yards to Mike Williams. "They brought pressure. I thought I could throw it over the pressure. I probably should have thrown the ball away. We'll learn from this. Sometimes, you have to have an experience like this to take a couple of steps forward." Since joining the Big East, the Bulls are 22-5 out of conference, with wins over Auburn, Florida State, Kansas, North Carolina and North Carolina State. In conference, they are only 15-14 and have never finished better than 4-3. The lone exception has been Syracuse. South Florida is 5-0 against the Orange, having beaten them by a combined 174-53. But this one was by far the most difficult because, even though the Bulls scored four times off SU turnovers, they also lost three fumbles. "We needed all of them for us to win that game," South Florida head coach Jim Leavitt said. "You can't imagine how difficult it was for him (Daniels) to come in here today, after the game he had last week with all the pressure, and face a group that defended him well. He kept his head about him and finished the game out, and that is pretty impressive." Ford also scored on a 26-yard run in the first quarter and Mitchell caught a 33-yard TD pass from Daniels in the second. The first 5 minutes of the game featured five turnovers. Syracuse lost two fumbles and Paulus was intercepted deep in USF territory. Orange nose tackle Arthur Jones recovered fumbles by the Bulls on their first two plays from scrimmage. Daniels fumbled his first snap of the game and wideout Dontavia Bogan lost another fumble right after Nate Allen picked off a Paulus pass at the USF 17. "It was like high school after the first five minutes," said Daniels, who was 12 for 20 for 208 yards and gained 32 yards rushing. "I guess our focus wasn't all the way there." The Bulls settled down after their shaky start. Mitchell had six catches for 139 yards, more than offsetting another stellar performance by his counterpart on the Orange. Williams had a career-high 13 catches for 186 yards for Syracuse.

TAMPA (AP) - Tony Pike left the field clutching his non-throwing arm, and unbeaten Cincinnati's high-powered, quick-strike offense kept rolling against South Florida. The eighth-ranked Bearcats got two touchdown passes from their senior quarterback before he left in the third quarter with a sprained left wrist, then backup Zach Collaros ran 75 yards for the first of his two rushing TDs in a 34-17 victory over the 21st-ranked Bulls on Thursday night. "We're kind of accustomed to it, which isn't a good thing. You never want to see your starting quarterback go down," Collaros said. "I just try to be as well-prepared as I possibly can." Collaros squirted through an opening in the middle of the defense for his long touchdown three plays after entering the game. Pike was injured late in the first half, then left after being hit as he released an incomplete pass on Cincinnati's first possession of the second half. Pike threw scoring passes of three and eight yards to Armon Binns in the second quarter, helping the Bearcats (6-0, 2-0 Big East) to a 17-10 halftime lead over South Florida (5-1, 1-1). The Bulls led early on B.J. Daniels' 28-yard touchdown pass to Jessie Hester, and closed within 24-17 late in the third quarter when safety Nate Allen intercepted an ill-advised pass by Collaros to set up a one-yard TD run by Daniels. But Collaros was not rattled by the mistake. He led a six-play, 70-yard scoring drive that restored the 14-point lead. "He's a gamer. He's a competitive kid," Kelly said. "He's athletic, and we did what we had to do with him in the game, and that was obviously run him, control clock, play good defense and get out of here with a win." The big play in the march was a 43-yard completion to Ben Guidugli, who stretched out to get the ball over the goal line for an apparent touchdown. The tight end was penalized for taking his helmet off in the ensuing celebration, and things got worse for the Bearcats when officials reviewed the play and determined his elbow was down at the 1. The penalty, which would have been walked off on the kickoff if it had been a touchdown, moved the ball back to the 16. After USF gave the stalled drive new life with a pass interference penalty on third down, Collaros scored on a three-yard run, making it 31-17. Collaros finished with 132 yards rushing on 10 carries. Pike, who threw a TD pass for the 16th consecutive game, was 12 of 25 for 140 yards without an interception. Moving up the polls hasn't been a problem for USF, which has climbed into the top-10 each of the past two seasons before tumbling out of contention when they got into the heart of the BIG EAST schedule. The Bulls started 6-0 in 2007 and were ranked No. 2 before three consecutive losses dropped them out of the Top 25. They were 5-0 last season before losing four of their next five, including their third straight loss to Cincinnati. South Florida coach Jim Leavitt said the Bulls will regroup and prepare for next week's conference game at Pittsburgh. "I'm going to look at the film, tell them what they did right and what they did wrong ... and we'll move on," Leavitt said. "I don't have any other magical formula I can use." The Bearcats have one of the most prolific offenses in the nation, but they've been so efficient in moving the ball and scoring quickly that Kelly has been concerned by a time of possession imbalance that's kept his defense on the field for too long this season. The defending BIG EAST champions had the ball for just 16 and 19 minutes in victories over Fresno State and Miami (Ohio). They had one scoring drive of four seconds on Thursday, set up by Aaron Webster's interception and 83-yard return to the USF 3.

PITTSBURGH (AP) - Bill Stull rarely hears himself mentioned in the same sentence as Dan Marino. He is now. Stull is one of college football's biggest surprises and, if Pitt Panthers keep playing this way, they might be, too. Stull threw for two touchdowns, Dion Lewis ran for two and No. 20 Pitt scored on all five possessions in the first half to rout South Florida 41-14 on Saturday and extend its best start in 27 years. The Panthers (4-0 in Big East) opened up a 31-7 lead at halftime in improving to 7-1 for the first time since 1982 - Marino's senior season and the last time Pittsburgh was ranked No. 1. "I don't know how it could have come together any better than what happened today," coach Dave Wannstedt said. Pitt made what was expected to be a difficult game look easy as Stull completed his first 11 passes against a Bulls defense that appeared geared to stopping Lewis, a freshman who came in No. 3 nationally in rushing. After that, Lewis took over and ran for 111 yards in three quarters to push his season's total to 1,029 yards. "A defense cannot serve two masters," Stull said. "If you try to stop our running game, we're going to be able to make some big plays through the air and vice versa." Stull, whose senior season statistics to date exceed Marino's, hit Jonathan Baldwin for completions of 40, 34 and 35 yards while repeatedly finding receivers open by several steps behind South Florida defenders. Baldwin made six catches for 144 yards, while Stull was 18 of 25 for 245 yards and two scores and wasn't sacked once. Stull, a senior who played so poorly at the end of last season he was forced to compete for his starting job during spring ball, has 16 touchdown passes and only four interceptions. Marino threw for 17 TDs as a senior. "It's his confidence," tight end Dorin Dickerson said. "He goes out there every game, straight-faced, and doesn't worry about nothing else but playing, and it shows." Pitt leads the Big East and is in position to win 10 games for the first time since the 1981 Panthers went 11-1. However, the three biggest games of the season await in Notre Dame and No. 22 West Virginia next month and No. 5 Cincinnati on Dec. 5. "We always talk about wanting to get all cylinders rolling and today we took a first step toward that," Stull said. "It's great that we're starting to play better and better toward the end of the season." Lewis and Stull were pulled along with most of the Panthers' regulars with Pitt ahead 34-7. Lewis, who has five 100-yard games, is only the fourth Pitt freshman to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Tony Dorsett (1973), Curvin Richards (1988) and LeSean McCoy (2007). "It's nice, but I'm not really thinking about that stuff," Lewis said. South Florida (5-2, 1-2) repeatedly hurt itself early with penalties - the Big East's most-penalized team drew the game's first eight penalties and ended with 71 penalty yards - and never got into an offensive rhythm. The Bulls have been outscored 75-31 in losses to Cincinnati (34-17) and Pitt after moving into the Top 25. "They just whupped up. They whupped us," coach Jim Leavitt said. "They're a better team than we are right now... We've got to play defense, and we didn't play defense. We've played really poor defense since the second half of the Cincinnati game." The Bulls had as many penalty yards (40) as offensive yards (40) late in the first quarter and ended up being outgained 486-212. Stull was repeatedly given time to throw by an offensive line that effectively controlled Bulls pass rushers George Selvie and Jason Pierre-Paul. He found Dickerson for 20 and 22 yards on Pitt's first possession to set up his 2-yard scoring pass to backup tight end Mike Cruz, the freshman's first college catch. Dickerson later made his ninth TD catch of the season. "We were surprised how much they passed," Selvie said. "We didn't have any pressure and they were able to find guys deep." Pitt went ahead 14-0 on Stull's 40-yard scoring pass to Baldwin on an improvised pass route. South Florida answered with Mike Ford's 3-yard TD run, but Pitt needed only six plays to make it 21-7 on Lewis' 1-yard run. Later in Pitt's 24-point second quarter, Lewis' 48-yard run set up his second 1-yard TD run. By winning, the Panthers assured themselves of a second consecutive bowl appearance, the first time they've done that since 2003-04.

PITTSBURGH (AP) - South Florida's B.J. Daniels gave West Virginia fits with his arm and his feet. The entertaining redshirt freshman quarterback threw for 232 yards and rushed for 104 more to account for more offense than the 20th-ranked Mountaineers managed as a team in the Bulls' 30-19 victory Friday night. Daniels threw for three touchdowns, and the Bulls rebounded from two subpar defensive performances to frustrate West Virginia running back Noel Devine and beat their Big East rival for the third time in four years. The Bulls (6-2, 2-2) allowed 75 points and 887 yards in conference losses to Cincinnati and Pittsburgh the previous two weeks, yet found a way to hold Devine to his lowest rushing total of the season. In stopping their two-game slide, they hope they have pulled out of a funk that contributed to midseason swoons that also followed promising starts that lifted them into the Top 25 in 2007 and 2008. "I guess a lot of people doubted us and thought we were going to go down the same patch we did the last two years," said Daniels, who had 336 yards total offense to West Virginia's 323. "That was a lot of garbage that our team didn't listen to." West Virginia (6-2, 2-1) drove 80 yards after the opening kickoff to take a 7-0 lead, but never really got into a rhythm offensively. "There's some young hurting guys in there, both physically and mentally. And they should be," West Virginia coach Bill Stewart said. "That was a hard-fought game. I cannot fault our effort." Daniels threw TD passes of 49 yards to Carlton Mitchell, 11 yards to A.J. Love and 6 yards to Sterling Griffin. Eric Schwartz's third field goal, a 44-yarder 3 minutes into the fourth quarter put the Bulls up 30-19. Jarrett Brown scored on runs of 3 and 11 yards, however West Virginia's senior quarterback had sporadic success throwing against a defense geared to stop the run. Devine, who grew up 2 hours south of Tampa, was limited to 42 yards on 17 carries in what was a homecoming of sorts for him and a number of other Mountaineers from Florida, including Brown and leading receiver Jock Sanders. Devine entered averaging 130.3 per game - third in the nation - and 89 shy of topping 1,000 for the second straight season. "We talked a lot about him," South Florida coach Jim Leavitt said. "We didn't want to let him get outside - we wanted to keep him hemmed up inside. ... He's such a great back. If he gets out, he's gone." Down two scores in the fourth quarter, the Mountaineers were forced to throw on virtually every down. Brown finished 19 of 32 for 205 yards and one interception, while Devine only carried the ball twice in the fourth quarter. In a come-from-behind victory over Connecticut last week, the speedy 5-foot-7, 176-pound Devine set up one second-half touchdown with a 62-yard run, then scored the winning TD on a 56-yard burst. West Virginia was trying to remain unbeaten in the Big East, along with Cincinnati and Pittsburgh. The Mountaineers lost to South Florida in 2006 and 2007 and have lost three of five games overall in the budding rivalry. Daniels improved to 3-2 since replacing Big East career total offense leader Matt Grothe, who suffered a season-ending knee injury in the third week of the season. He kept West Virginia offbalance with his mobility and made some of his biggest throws while scrambling to buy time. "They were expecting me to run once I got outside the pocket, so a lot of the DB's had their eyes on me, and our guys got behind them," Daniels said. Besides his 49-yard catch for a touchdown, Mitchell nearly scored on a 69-yard reception. Officials ruled he was pushed out of bounds at the West Virginia 9 as he tightroped up the sideline and into the end zone. Three plays later, Daniels rolled to his right and - looking like a threat to run - found Love wide open for an 11-yard TD pass as the Mountaineers converged on him as he broke containment. Daniels also had a 45-yard completion to Love and finished 13 of 26 without an interception. "We haven't seen a guy like that (this year), but at the same time that's no excuse for our defense," West Virginia safety Robert Sands said. "We've still got to go out there and make plays. He broke contain too many times, and he burned us."

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (AP) - Instead of getting even with Rutgers, No. 23 South Florida didn't even get on the scoreboard for the first time in a regular-season game in its 13-year history. Tom Savage threw for two touchdowns and Rutgers forced four turnovers, blocked a punt and recorded seven sacks in defeating the error-prone Bulls 31-0 in a nationally televised game on Thursday night. The victory was the fourth straight for Rutgers (7-2, 2-2 Big East) over South Florida (6-3, 2-3), and this one made the Scarlet Knights bowl eligible for the fifth straight season. The only other time South Florida was shut out was 14-0 in the Meineke Bowl in 2005 against North Carolina State. Savage threw touchdown passes of 25 yards to Mohamed Sanu and 26 yards to Tim Brown. Joe Martinek ran for 128 yards, including a 37-yard score. San San Te kicked field goals of 36, 26 and 49 yards. South Florida came into this game seeking revenge. The Bulls thought the Scarlet Knights ran up the score last year in a 49-16 victory and they promised to make amends, noting that coach Jim Leavitt had been discussing the Rutgers game since training camp opened. But on the second play from scrimmage, cornerback Jerome Murphy was flagged for hitting Brown out of bounds and nothing went right for South Florida the rest of the night. Rutgers went 80 yards on that initial drive, capped by Savage's touchdown pass to Sanu, who broke a tackle by Kayvon Webster at the 15. The first half was awful for South Florida, although it trailed only 13-0. B.J. Daniels threw two interceptions and lost a fumble on a scramble, Faron Hornes muffed a punt, and Rutgers' Devin McCourty blocked a punt by Delbert Alvarado late in the half. Rutgers, however, managed only two field goals off the turnovers. Te missed a 51-yard attempt and he never got a chance to kick a 23-yarder after Hornes' fumble because holder Teddy Dellaganna didn't catch the snap. Rutgers broke the game open in the second half. Savage (15 of 30 for 194 yards) connected with Brown on a touchdown pass midway through the third quarter. Sanu stretched the lead to 21-0, running in a 2-point conversion out of a wildcat formation. Te kicked his 49-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter and Martinek closed the scoring with his 37-yard run around left end. Daniels, who engineered a win over then-No. 20 West Virginia in South Florida's previous game, finished 7 of 17 for 129 yards. He also carried 16 times for 11 yards. The Bulls finished with seven first downs and 159 yards in total offense, including 30 yards rushing.

TAMPA (AP) - B.J. Daniels rebounded from the worst game of his young career to throw for 304 yards and run for 141 more in the University of South Florida's 34-22 victory over struggling Louisville on Saturday. Daniels, shut down in a 31-0 loss to Rutgers last week, threw for one touchdown and ran for two others while leading four scoring drives of at least 75 yards. With a combined 445 yards, the red-shirt freshman finished 12 shy of the school record set by Big East career total offense leader Matt Grothe in 2007. USF (7-3, 3-3) was limited to 159 yards against Rutgers, with Daniels going 7 of 17 for 129 yards and two interceptions passing and rushing for just 11 yards on 15 attempts. He was 20 of 34 passing Saturday and compiled his fourth 100-yard game rushing on 22 carries. Louisville (4-7, 1-5) lost for the ninth straight time on the road. The Cardinals assured themselves a second straight losing season under coach Steve Kragthorpe, who has a three-year record of 15-20. Daniels threw a 16-yard TD pass to Dontavia Bogan on USF's first drive of the game and later scored on runs of 1 and 20 yards. Mo Plancher had a 2-yard scoring run and Eric Schwartz kicked field goals of 22 and 44 yards. Adam Froman threw for 232 yards, one touchdown and one interception for Louisville, which erased an early 14-point deficit but couldn't manage much offense after halftime. Scott Long had a 20-yard TD reception, Trent Guy scored on a 60-yard punt return, and Darius Ashley's 1-yard run trimmed USF's lead to 27-22 on the first play of the fourth quarter. Daniels put it out of reach, leading a 75-yard march that he finished with his second touchdown. Midseason slides have knocked USF out of the Top 25 each of the past three years after 5-0 starts. The Bulls had dropped three of their previous four games, losing to Cincinnati, Pittsburgh and Rutgers by a combined 106-31. Louisville, coming off an ugly 10-9 victory over Syracuse that stopped a nine-game conference losing streak, dropped to 3-13 on the road in three seasons under Kragthorpe. The Cardinals finish 0-6 away from home this year and were outscored 191-107, including 59-7 in the opening quarter. USF surpassed last week's production against Rutgers its first two possessions alone. In the opening half, Daniels threw for 149 yards and ran for 85 more, including a pair of 18-yard scampers that set up Schwartz's 22-yard field goal for a 17-16 lead on the last play of the second quarter. Daniels opened the second half with another 80-yard drive, covering the final 20 yards on a nifty run that put him over 100 rushing for the fourth time. He's the first USF quarterback to top the century mark rushing and throw for 300 in the same game.
