OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Tony Pike • Sr. • QB • Cincinnati • Cincinnati, Ohio

Pike returned to the starting lineup for the first time since Oct. 15 and showed no signs of rust as he completed 32 of 46 passes for 399 yards and a school-record six touchdowns in the Bearcats' 49-36 win against Illinois. Pike threw four touchdown passes as part of a 35-point first half that effectively put the game out of reach. Despite missing three games due to injury this season, Pike has thrown for 2,048 yards and 23 touchdowns against just three interceptions.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Robert Sands • So. • FS • West Virginia • Opa Locka, Fla.

Sands was the catalyst on a West Virginia defense that limited ninth-ranked Pittsburgh to a season-low 16 points in the Mountaineers' 19-16 win. Sands had seven tackles, three pass breakups and a pivotal fourth-quarter interception that allowed West Virginia to take a two-possession lead on the ensuing possession. Sands leads the BIG EAST with five interceptions and 13 passes defended this season.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Tyler Bitancurt • Fr. • K • West Virginia • Springfield, Va.

Bitancurt kicked four field goals, including the gamewinner from 43 yards as time expired, to give West Virginia a 19-16 win against ninth-ranked Pittsburgh. Bitancurt scored 13 of the Mountaineers' 19 points, including three field goals in the second half. In addition to the gamewinner, Bitancurt was successful from 20, 43 and 39 yards.



WEEKLY HONOR ROLL

Mardy Gilyard, WR, Cincinnati — Had 260 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns in a 49-36 win against Illinois. Had seven catches for 102 yards and two TDs and scored on a 90-yard kickoff return.

Lawrence Wilson, LB, Connecticut — Had a game-high 17 tackles with one sack in a 56-31 win against Syracuse.

Mohamed Sanu, WR, Rutgers — Had 18 carries for 148 yards and two touchdowns and one reception for 10 yards in a 34-14 win against Louisville.

Greg Paulus, QB, Syracuse — Was 24-of-32 for 296 yards and two touchdowns in a 56-31 loss at Connecticut. Set school records for completions (193) and completion percentage (67.7) in a season.

Cincinnati has clinched at least a share of its second consecutive BIG EAST championship after Pittsburgh's loss at West Virginia last Saturday.

It's Automatic

The winner of Saturday's game between Cincinnati and Pittsburgh will receive the BIG EAST's automatic bid to the Bowl Championship Series. A Cincinnati win would give the Bearcats a two-game lead in the final conference standings, while a Panther win would forge a tie for first place in the final standings and give Pitt the tiebreaker based on head-to-head results.

History In The Making

Saturday's game between Cincinnati and Pittsburgh will mark the first time in BIG EAST history that the league's BCS bid will be decided in a head-to-head matchup in the last week of the season.

The BIG EAST's .800 winning percentage in 2009 is good for second among FBS conferences.

Kelly Named Finalist For Munger Award

Cincinnati head coach Brian Kelly is one of three finalists for the George Munger Award as the 2009 national coach of the year. Kelly, who was chosen as BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007 and 2008, joins Temple's Al Golden and Texas Christian's Gary Patterson as finalists for the honor.

Head Of The Class

West Virginia linebacker Reed Williams has been named one of 16 finalists for the 2009 William V. Campbell Trophy, given by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The BIG EAST had six semifinalists for the award. The award, formerly known as the Draddy Trophy, last went to a BIG EAST player in 2006, when Rutgers' Brian Leonard earned the honor.

McKenzie, Williams Named To ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Team

Syracuse center Jim McKenzie and West Virginia linebacker Reed Williams were named to the 2009 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Team, as chosen by the College Sports Information Directors of America. McKenzie was honored as a first-team selection, while Williams was named to the second team.

Dickerson Finalist For Mackey Award

Pittsburgh tight end Dorin Dickerson is one of three finalists for the Mackey Award as the nation's top tight end. Dickerson leads all tight ends nationally with 10 touchdown receptions. His competition includes Florida's Aaron Hernandez and Brigham Young's Dennis Pitta.

Perfection

Cincinnati is 11-0 for the first time in program history.

First Impressions

Pittsburgh running back Dion Lewis has rushed for 1,446 yards in his freshman season, a BIG EAST record for a first-year player. Lewis broke the old mark of 1,328, set by former Pittsburgh standout LeSean McCoy in the 2007 season.

Scarlet Success

Rutgers' 31-0 win against USF Nov. 12 made the Scarlet Knights bowl eligible for the fifth consecutive year. The Scarlet Knights have won three straight bowl games.

Bulls Here To Stay

USF's win against Louisville Nov. 21 made the Bulls eligible for a bowl game for a program-record fifth straight year.

Third Time's A Charm

Connecticut has become bowl eligible for the third consecutive season following the Huskies' Nov. 28 win against Syracuse.

Going Bowling

Following the 2008 season, BIG EAST schools are 13-4 in their last 17 bowl games. The conference was 4-2 in bowl games in 2008, 3-2 in 2007 and 5-0 in 2006.

There's A Chance

If all six BIG EAST bowl-eligible teams win their bowl games this season, the conference would finish with a 38-8 nonleague record, which would rank as the best mark in conference history. The BIG EAST went 37-8 (.822) in the 2006 season, including a 5-0 postseason record.

POLL EXPLANATION & ABOUT THE BCS:

To derive a team's poll percentages in the Harris Interactive and *USA Today* polls, each team's point total is divided by a maximum 2825 possible points in the Harris Interactive Poll and 1475 possible points in the *USA Today* Poll. Teams are assigned an inverse point total (25 for No. 1, 24 for No. 2, etc.) for each of their respective computer poll rankings to determine the overall computer component. The highest and lowest ranking for each team is dropped, and the sum total of the remaining four rankings is divided by 100 (the maximum possible points). This figure produces a Computer Rankings Percentage. The six computer ranking providers are Anderson & Hester (A&H), Richard Billingsley (B), Colley Matrix (CM), Kenneth Massey (M), Jeff Sagarin (S) and Peter Wolfe (W). Each computer ranking accounts for schedule strength within its formula. The BCS Average is calculated by averaging the percent totals of the Harris Interactive and *USA Today* Polls, and Computer rankings. The highest BCS Average receives the No. 1 ranking, the second highest receives No. 2, and so forth.

The BCS is a five-game arrangement for post-season college football that is managed by the 11 Bowl Subdivision conferences and Notre Dame. Its purpose is to match the two top-ranked teams in the final BCS standings in a national championship game and to create competitive match-ups in the four other BCS bowl games. The No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the Dec. 6 BCS standings will play in the BCS National Championship Game presented by Citi Jan. 7, 2010 in Pasadena, Calif. The winner of the game will be presented the American Football Coaches Association National Championship Trophy.

BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES



About the BCS

The Bowl Championship Series (BCS), which enters its 12th season in 2009-10, is a five-game arrangement for postseason college football that is designed to match the two top-rated teams in a national championship game and to create exciting and competitive matchups between eight other highly regarded teams in four other BCS games.



The BIG EAST has been a charter member in the championship agreement. The league continues as an automatic qualifier in the new BCS agreement that began in 2006.

The Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, FedEx Orange Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl and Rose Bowl presented by Citi have joined with the BIG EAST, Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Pacific-10 and Southeastern Conferences and the University of Notre Dame to form the Bowl Championship Series. In the existing BCS agreement, which began in 2006, each bowl will host two games once every four years - its traditional game plus the BCS National Championship contest approximately one week later.

The BCS is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision conferences, the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame and representatives of the bowl organizations. The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 FBS programs.

The BCS conferences have a contract with Fox Sports to televise the Fiesta, Orange and Sugar Bowls through 2010 and the National Championship Games through 2009. ABC has an agreement to continue to televise the 2010 National Championship Game and the Rose Bowl through 2014.

The BIG EAST has fared particularly well in the BCS. The conference has produced three winners in BCS games in the last four years.

BCS Automatic Qualifications

1. The top two teams in the final BCS Standings will play in the national championship game.
2. The champions of the Atlantic Coast, BIG EAST, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences automatically qualify for BCS games each year.
3. One team from among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference, the Sun Belt Conference, or the Western Athletic Conference automatically qualify for a BCS game if either: A. Such team is ranked in the top 12 of the final BCS Standings, or, B. Such team is ranked in the top 16 of the final BCS Standings and its ranking in the final BCS Standings is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls.
4. Notre Dame will automatically qualify for a BCS bowl if it is in the top eight of the final BCS Standings.
5. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 4, and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 3 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
6. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 5, and if Step No. 5 has not been applied and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 4 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
7. If any slots remain unfilled after the placement of all teams qualifying for an automatic berth, then the bowls shall choose their participants from the "pool of eligible teams" (see below.)

Pool of Eligible Teams

If berths are available after the automatic qualifiers have been identified, then the bowls shall select at-large participants from the "pool of eligible teams," which shall include any FBS team that is bowl-eligible and meets the following requirements:

- A. Has won at least nine regular-season games, not including exempted games, and
- B. Is among the top 14 teams in the final BCS Standings

BIG EAST 2009 BOWL LINEUP



In addition to the Bowl Championship Series, the BIG EAST Conference also has agreements with a number of other postseason bowl games.

The BIG EAST and Big 12 Conferences — along with Notre Dame — forged a bowl partnership beginning in 2006 and ending with the 2009 season. This agreement assured both BCS Conferences' and Notre Dame's participation in the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl and Brut Sun Bowl over a four-year period. The Konica Minolta Gator Bowl or Brut Sun Bowl chooses a BIG EAST team after the league's representative to the Bowl Championship Series has been determined. The Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposition in the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl and the Pac-10 Conference participates in the Brut Sun Bowl.

The Gator Bowl has the first selection at the conclusion of each season and will select a BIG EAST team or Notre Dame in 2009.

The Meineke Car Care Bowl is now in its sixth year with the BIG EAST Conference. The Meineke Car Care Bowl, which is played in Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C., picks after the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl or Brut Sun Bowl.

The BIG EAST aligned itself with two additional bowls beginning in the 2006 season. The International Bowl, played at the Rogers Centre in Toronto, pairs the BIG EAST representative against an opponent from the Mid-America Conference, while the PapaJohns.com Bowl in Birmingham, Ala., matches the BIG EAST selection against a school from the Southeastern Conference. The St. Petersburg Bowl at Tropicana Field will put the BIG EAST's representative against a team from Conference USA.
