### The Set-up

Returning home triumphantly with a streak-snapping, 54-28 victory at No. 7 Brigham Young, Florida State checks back into the national polls after a two-week absence just in time to play host to USF. This is the first meeting on the football field between the two schools, bringing to eight the total number of in-state teams FSU has faced in its 63-year history.

The Seminoles will recognize the school's 1999 national championship team as a part of the season-long, 10-year anniversary celebration of the lone unbeaten team in coach Bobby Bowden's 34-year tenure.

Jim Leavitt is in his 13th season as the coach and architect of the USF program, and has directed the Bulls to three consecutive winning seasons and is 63-35 over the last eight-plus seasons.

## Offensive Notes:

### FLORIDA STATE SETS COMPLETION RECORD

Florida State's quarterbacks Christian Ponder (21 of 26/80.8 percent) and EJ Manuel (1 of 2/.500 percent) completed 22 of 28 passes for a combined, single-game school record 78.6 team completion percentage. The previous record was 78.3 percent (36 of 46) set by Danny Kanell and Thad Busby on September 16, 1995 in a 77-17 victory vs. North Carolina State.

### PONDER AMONGST MOST ACCURATE PASSERS

On the heels of his career-best 80.8 percent completion rate in the Seminoles' victory over Brigham Young, junior quarterback Christian Ponder has moved into seventh place on Florida State's all-time career completion percentage chart.

### POINTS UNDER PONDER...

...Florida State's 54 points scored against Brigham Young were the most scored by the Seminoles' during the 17-game starting career of quarterback Christian Ponder. It was the most scored against an FBS team and the most since the Seminoles' defeated Western Carolina, 69-0, in his first career start on Sept. 6;

...Florida State scored points in each of the four quarters during its victory over Brigham Young. It marked the seventh time in the last two seasons that the Seminoles have scored points in each quarter during a game;

...The Seminoles scored 23 points in the second quarter of their victory over Brigham Young. It was the most points scored in a single quarter since Florida State scored 27 in the third quarter of its victory over Western Carolina to open the 2008 season;

...Florida State built its lead over Brigham Young to 30 points (44-14) in the third quarter and eventually 33 points (54-21) in the fourth quarter in its 54-28 victory over the Cougars. The 30 point lead over Brigham Young was its largest since the Seminoles defeated Rice, 55-7 (+48 points). The Seminoles led that game by 33 points (40-7) after a third quarter rushing touchdown by Lorenzo Booker and increased their lead to the eventual final score in the fourth quarter.

### PONDER ON THIRD DOWN THIS SEASON

Junior quarterback Christian Ponder was a perfect six of six passing for 75 yards and three touchdowns on third down conversions in Florida State's 54-28 victory over Brigham Young. Ponder has completed 65.5 percent of this third down passes for 263 yards and four touchdowns in the first three games of the season. Additionally, he has rushed for 62 yards on eight carries and has converted six of nine third down opportunities with the ball in the first three games of the season.

### PONDER COMPLETES PASSES AT RECORD RATE

Junior quarterback Christian Ponder completed a personal best 80.8 percent of his passes in the Seminoles' victory over Brigham Young. It marked the second time in his career that he completed at least 79 percent of his passes (also against Maryland in 2008) in a single game and the second consecutive game he has completed at least 62 percent of his passes. Ponder enters Saturday's game against USF with a career-high 65.7 percent completion percentage rate through the first three games of the 2009 season. His completion percentage this season is more than 12 percentage points higher than his career percentage entering the 2009 season (55.1 percent) and exactly 10 percentage points higher than his personal single season record of 55.7 during the 2008 season.

...Junior quarterback Christian Ponder has completed 61.4 percent of his passes in his last eight starts as compared to his completion percentage of 54.4 percent in the first eight starts of his career;

...Junior quarterback Christian Ponder has completed 63.0 percent of his passes in his last four games as compared to his completion percentage of 50.6 in the first four starts of his career.

...Junior quarterback Christian Ponder has attempted 33.3 passes per game in his last four starts as compared to 19.8 pass attempts per game in the first four starts of his career.

### FINDING THE TIGHT END

Florida State quarterbacks completed seven passes to three different tight ends in the Seminoles' victory over Brigham Young. Junior quarterback Christian Ponder completed five passes for 38 yards and one touchdown to Caz Piurowski and one pass for six yards for Beau Reliford. In the fourth quarter, redshirt freshman quarterback EJ Manuel completed the first pass of his career to sophomore Ja'Baris

Little who lined up at the tight end position on the play which resulted in a four-yard gain. It marked the first time since Nov. 10, 1990 against Cincinnati that three Seminole tight ends (Reggie Johnson, Warren Hart and Dave Roberts) caught a pass in the same game.

#### **SEMINOLE RUSHING ATTACK NETS 314 YARDS**

Led by sophomore running back Ty Jones' first career 100-yard rushing game (108 yards on 12 carries and one touchdown) the Seminoles outrushed Brigham Young by a 313-108 yard margin (+205 yards). It marked the first time since its victory over Miami on Oct. 4, 2008 that Florida State had rushed for more than 300 yards in a single game (310). It also marked the first time since that Miami game that Florida State have outrushed its opponent by more than 200 yards in a single game (310-51/+259).

#### **SEMINOLES' RECENT 300-YARD RUSHING GAMES**

Led by Ty Jones' career-high 108 yards in the Seminoles' victory over Brigham Young, Florida State rushed for a season-high 314 yards. It marked the sixth time since the beginning of the 2000 season that Florida State has rushed for 300 yards or more. The Seminoles are undefeated in each of those six games.

#### **FLORIDA STATE'S TIME OF POSSESSION**

Florida State enjoyed nearly a 2:1 time of possession advantage in its victory over Brigham Young. The Seminoles held the ball for 39:51 of the 60 minutes (65.8 percent of the game) as compared to the Cougars 20:09 time of possession (34.2 percent of the game). The Seminoles' overwhelming time of possession advantage led to the Cougars running only 53 offensive plays. It was the fewest offensive plays allowed by the Seminoles' defense since limiting Duke to 50 in a 25-6 Florida State victory over Duke on Oct. 27, 2007.

#### **SEMINOLES INSIDE THE REDZONE**

Florida State was a perfect eight of eight on scoring chances from inside the red zone against Brigham Young (seven touchdowns and one field goal) and has converted 10 consecutive red zone opportunities entering Saturday's game against USF. The Seminoles were two of two on scoring chances against Jacksonville State with their final chance from inside of the 20 resulting in a game-winning touchdown against the Gamecocks.

#### **SEMINOLES CONVERT ON THIRD DOWN**

Florida State converted on 75 percent (12 of 15) of its third down conversion opportunities in its victory over Brigham Young. The Seminoles were a perfect three of three on third down conversions in the pivotal first half when they outscored the Cougars 30-14 to take an insurmountable lead. The Seminoles converted on their first nine consecutive third down conversion attempts – a streak that ran into the third quarter and helped Florida State take a 44-14 lead. During the streak of nine consecutive converted third downs, quarterback Christian Ponder was five of five for 59 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed four times for 28 yards and four first downs.

#### **PONDER'S RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS**

Junior quarterback Christian Ponder scored the sixth rushing touchdown of his career in the third quarter on a six-yard run against BYU. Ponder scored one rushing touchdown in four consecutive games last season and added one against Miami in the opener, before racing around the left end against the Cougars.

### SEMINOLES MOVING FORWARD

In a total of 77 offensive plays against Brigham Young, the Seminoles suffered only two negative yardage plays (one rushing and one receiving). Ironically, the negative rushing play came by a receiver on a rushing attempt (Bert Reed – minus one yard on a first quarter rushing attempt) and by a running back on a pass reception (Ty Jones – minus one yard on a third quarter pass completion from Christian Ponder).

### FORTSON BUILDING UP HIS NUMBERS

Sophomore Jarmon Fortson led Florida State with a career-high six receptions for a team-leading 62 yards in the Seminoles' victory over Brigham Young. He enters Saturday's game against USF with more catches (11) and yards (148) in the first three games of the season than he had in 10 games last season (eight receptions for 137 yards).

### PONDER FINDS ONLY HIS RECEIVERS

Ponder completed 21 of 26 passes against Brigham Young and was interception-free for the fourth time in his last six starts. He has not been intercepted in eight of his 16 career starts. The Seminoles are undefeated (8-0) when Ponder completes a game without throwing an interception.

### RECENT 300-YARD PASSING GAMES

Ponder's first career 300-yard passing game against Jacksonville State (324 yards) was the first by a Seminole quarterback since Nov. 3, 2007 when Drew Weatherford passed for 354 yards in a 27-17 victory over No. 2 Boston College in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Ponder became the 13th quarterback in school history to throw for at least 300 yards in a single game at least once in his career.

### JONES FINDING HIS WAY

Sophomore running back Ty Jones ran for a career-high 108 yards on 12 carries against BYU in his second consecutive start. In three games he has run for 207 yards on 34 carries (6.1 ypc) and three touchdowns. He rushed for a career-high two touchdowns against Jacksonville State a week earlier. Jones has been the Seminoles' leading rusher in all three games this season and four in a row (counting FSU's Champs Sports Bowl victory over Wisconsin). Jones matched his four-game, 2008 season total for rushing yards (99) in two games this season. His per-game rushing average has jumped from 24.8 in

'08 to 69.0 in '09, which currently ranks fifth in the ACC.

### JONES RUNS DOWN SMITH'S STREAK

By leading the Seminoles in rushing for four consecutive games (vs. Wisconsin in the 2008 Champs Sports Bowl and against Miami, Jacksonville State and BYU in '09) Jones has tracked down Antone Smith's four-game streak set in 2007. Jones is the first FSU back to lead the team in four consecutive games since Smith strung together a five-game streak in 2007 against N.C. State (Oct. 6), Wake Forest (Oct. 11), Miami (Oct. 20), Duke (Oct. 27) and Boston College (Nov. 3). The Tampa native can match that mark Saturday against USF.

### GOODMAN BECOMING PONDER'S GO-TO GUY

With 14 receptions in Florida State's first three games, redshirt senior wide receiver Richard Goodman is developing quite a connection with quarterback Christian Ponder. He has caught 14 of Ponder's 67 completions (20.8 percent) this season, but was limited to one catch in the win over BYU. Goodman, who did not play during the 2008 season while recovering from a broken leg, has more than doubled his production in 2009 season (14-182), from his freshman and sophomore seasons combined (7-63). He is quickly approaching statistics that would rank as single-season, career-best numbers. Entering the USF game at Brigham Young, Goodman needs only seven receptions and 3 receiving yards to establish single-season career-highs.

### SEMINOLES SIZZLE IN THE RED ZONE

Florida State was a perfect on red zone scoring opportunities for a second consecutive week, converting eight of eight against BYU in a 54-28 victory. One week after sophomore tailback Ty Jones cashed in on two red zone trips with TD runs against Jacksonville State, freshman Lonnie Pryor duplicated the feat at BYU. The Seminoles are near-perfect on the year, converting 12 of 13 red zone chances for a 92 percent success rate.

### THE OWENS-GOODMAN RECEIVING TANDEM

Florida State's redshirt senior receiver tandem of Rod Owens and Richard Goodman is working to become the most productive pass-catching duo in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Through the first two games of the season, the pair has accounted for 24 receptions for 295 yards.

### CASHING IN WITH CAZ

Senior tight end Caz Piurowski has caught 10 passes for 149 yards - both career season-best standards - through the first three games of the 2009 season. Of those five catches, five have moved the chains



for a first down and seven have come on touchdown drives. That includes his 5-yard touchdown pass from Christian Ponder in the second quarter against BYU. It was Piurowski's second TD reception of the season. His 53-yard reception against Jacksonville State is the longest of the season for an FSU player, and the longest by a Seminole tight end since Lonnie Johnson (78 yds. vs. Clemson, 1993).

### **PIUROWSKI SETS NEW SEASON BESTS**

Senior tight end Caz Piurowski has caught 10 passes for 149 yards and two touchdowns in the first three games of the 2009 season. Those are already season-best marks for Piurowski's career. He came into the '09 campaign with 20 receptions for 195 yards and one touchdown. Piurowski is averaging a single-season career-high 3.3 catches per game and leads the team in TD receptions as well as yards per reception (14.9) among Seminoles with three or more receptions this season.

### **PONDER SURPASSES 500-YARD RUSHING**

Quarterback Christian Ponder rushed for a season-high 77 yards on 11 carries in Florida State's 54-28 victory at No. 7 BYU. Ponder is the Seminoles' second-leading rusher through three games with 112 yards on 26 carries, including two touchdowns. In just 17 games, Ponder has rushed for 586 yards on 150 carries, good for a 3.9 yards per rushing attempt average and a 34.4 yards per game average.

### **PONDER MOVES INTO ALL-TIME TOP-20**

With 813 passing yards in three games this season, including his two most productive games as a Seminole, Ponder has climbed from 20th to 17th on the all-time list for career passing yardage.

## 32 AND COUNTING

Bowden continues to build on his College of Football Hall of Fame legacy, one year at a time. Last season's 9-4 record extended the program's streak of consecutive winning seasons to 32 under his watch. The only losing season in his FSU career came in his first year on the job when Florida State posted a 5-6 record. Since then the Seminoles have won more than they have lost every year. No other university in the FBS can claim to have a streak of 32 consecutive winning seasons. Bowden has also led the Seminoles to 27 consecutive bowl appearances, which is also the nation's longest active streak.

## BOWDEN'S 500th GAME AGAINST COLORADO

Florida State's Bobby Bowden reached a milestone against Colorado in 2008 by coaching his 500th career collegiate football game. Bowden is only the third coach in college football history to coach in 500 or more games - joining the legendary Amos Alonzo Stagg (last coached at Pacific in 1946) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (currently active) who coached the 500th game of his Penn State career when he led his Nittany Lions into the Alamo Bowl in 2007. After Bowden and Paterno, the closest active coach is Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer, who has coached 335 games so far in his career. Bowden reached another milestone later last year, when he logged his 400th game at Florida State in a win over Clemson. ... Bowden was also at the helm when the Seminoles played their 700th game Saturday at BYU. It was his 406th game on the FSU sideline.

### ROBINSON LEADS SEMINOLES IN TACKLES

Senior safety Jamie Robinson, who leads the Seminoles in tackles with 20 through the first three games of the season, has led Florida State in tackles against Miami (seven tackles) and in the Seminoles' victory over Brigham Young (seven).

### DEFENSE EXTENDS SCORELESS STRETCH

Florida State's defense entered Saturday's game against No. 7 Brigham Young not having allowed a point in more than two quarters and a total span of 37:13 of playing time. The Seminoles pitched a first quarter shutout against the Cougars and extended their scoreless span to 56:59 before yielding the first of two TDs in the second quarter at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

### FSU DEFENSE RACKS UP SACKS VS. JAX STATE

Led by senior linebacker Dekoda Watson's career-high 3.5 sacks the Seminoles' defense earned a season-high seven total sacks in its victory over Jacksonville State. It was the most sacks in a game by the Florida State defense in four seasons, dating to its nine-sack barrage against rival Miami in a 10-7 victory on Sept. 5, 2005. Since the beginning of the 2005 season, Florida State has earned at least six sacks in the single games four times and is 4-0 in those games.

### MOODY GIVES FSU A LIFT IN FIRST CAREER START

Redshirt freshman rover Nick Moody, who was playing in his second career game and making his first career start against Jacksonville State, was tied for the Seminoles' lead in tackles with 10. After recording only one tackle in his debut as a Seminole against Miami, he led Florida State with seven unassisted tackles and shared a sack with senior linebacker Dekoda Watson for the first sack of his career. Moody's sack of JSU quarterback Ryan Perrilloux ended a Gamecock drive early in the fourth quarter of the Seminoles' victory.

### WATSON INVADES GAMECOCKS' BACKFIELD

Senior linebacker Dekoda Watson established a personal career-high with 3.5 sacks and tied his career-high with 3.5 tackles for loss in the Seminoles' victory over Jacksonville. His 3.5 sacks allowed the Seminoles to register a season-high seven sacks in the game. Collecting nine tackles, Watson was only one off of his career-high of 10 stops, set at Colorado on September 27, 2007. Watson was credited with 1.5 sacks in the fourth quarter – both of which came on a third down play and forced the Gamecocks to punt the ball to the Seminoles. He sacked JSU's Ryan Perrilloux with 3:00 remaining in the game and forced a punt that gave FSU the ball and began its game-winning drive. Watson ranks second in the ACC in both sacks and tackles for loss.

### WATSON MOVES INTO TOP 16 FOR CAREER TFL'S

With 3.5 tackles for loss in the Seminoles' victory over Jacksonville State, senior linebacker Dekoda Watson moved into 16th place on Florida State's all-time career list for tackles for loss. He is only 1.5

#### SMITH EARNS CARER-HIGH 10 TACKLES

Junior middle linebacker Kendall Smith recorded a career-high 10 tackles in the Seminoles' victory over Jacksonville State. After a five-tackle performance against Miami in the season-opener, Smith has 15 tackles in two games – one more than he had in 13 games as a true freshman and only nine fewer than he had in 13 games as a sophomore. Smith tied his career-high with five tackles against Miami and doubled his single-game career-high against Jacksonville State.

#### FROSH MCDANIEL GETS INTO THE DEFENSIVE ACT

True freshman defensive lineman Jacobbi McDaniel has six tackles in the first two games including five in the win over Jacksonville State. He has found his way behind the line of scrimmage in both games and is one of only two FSU defenders (also Dekoda Watson) with at least one tackle for loss in both games. McDaniel recorded one tackle for loss against Miami, two against Jacksonville State. He was credited with a sack and a forced fumble, which teammate Kevin McNeil picked up and returned 33 yards for the clinching TD with 21 seconds remaining in the game.

#### THREE SCORES FOR THE DEFENSE

Freshman cornerback Greg Reid joined the parade of Seminole defenders into the end zone with a game-turning, 63-yard interception return for a touchdown against BYU. Reid joins senior defensive end Kevin McNeil and junior defensive end Markus White have returned a fumble and an interception, respectively, for touchdowns this season. The Seminoles have seven defensive touchdowns and nine defensive scores in the last 16 games. Reid's pick-six was the fifth defensive score in the last seven games. White's interception return marked the second time in the last 10 months that an interior defensive lineman had returned an interception for a touchdown. White was lined up as nose guard when he dropped into coverage. Neefy Moffett, who was lined up as the nose guard, returned an interception in the Seminoles' 41-27 victory over Clemson on Nov. 8, 2008.

### **Special Teams Notes:**

#### SEMINOLES PLAYING WITH FEWER PENALTIES

Having been called for an average of only 6.6 penalties in their first three games of the 2009 season, the Seminoles are on pace to be the least penalized Florida State team since 1995; a year in which the Seminoles were flagged for an average of 6.3 penalties per game. Florida State finished with a 10-2 record, won the ACC championship, won the Orange Bowl against Notre Dame and finished ranked No. 4 in the AP poll.

#### REID CONTINUING KICKOFF RETURN TRADITION

True freshman athlete Greg Reid, who doubles as Florida State's top kickoff returner and is one of the Seminoles' top defensive backs, is keeping up the Seminoles' tradition of great kickoff returners. Taking over for Michael Ray Garvin, the greatest kickoff returner in school history, Reid has returned 11 kickoffs for a 29.6 yards per return average in the first three games of his career. Garvin set the single-season school record of 30.1 yards per return during the 2008 season. Reid is the Seminoles' leader in all-purpose yards per game with an average of 95.3 yards per game despite no offensive touches. He has accumulated a team-leading 63 yards on two interceptions and 16 yards on two punt returns.

#### HOPKINS IS A TOUCHBACK MACHINE

Freshman kicker Dustin Hopkins was a 12th defender for the Seminoles' special teams against Brigham Young, as seven of his nine kickoffs either sailed out of the end zone or were downed in the end zone by the Cougar return team. Brigham Young returned two kickoffs for a total of 23 yards and started seven of its nine drives at or before the 20 yard line. The Cougars best starting position after a Hopkins kickoff came at their own 30 yard line.

#### FSU THROWING ANOTHER BLOCK PARTY

With Kevin McNeil's fourth quarter blocked field goal against Jacksonville State – the first of the season by Florida State – the Seminoles pushed their blocked kick total to 128 in the Bobby Bowden era. That's a span of 406 games over the course of Bowden's 34 seasons, with the Seminoles averaging just over one blocked kick every three games. To provide a little more recent context to FSU's prowess, it ranks 10th among FBS schools for blocked kicks over the past eight seasons (2002-present).

#### **SEMINOLES STILL STRONG VS. TOP 10**

Florida State climbed back into the nation's conscience - and the national polls - Saturday with a 54-28 victory at No. 7 Brigham Young. The Seminoles leaped back into the rankings at No. 18 (AP) and No. 25 (Coaches) with the win, after being bounced from their preseason No. 18 slot with a 38-34 loss to Miami. FSU has not finished in the Top 10 since closing 2000 at No. 5, but it has had some success against Top 10 competition. The Seminoles are 5-3 over their last seven games against Top 10 opponents, including a 27-17 win at No. 2 Boston College on Nov. 3, 2007.

#### **RANKED TEAMS BRING OUT THE BEST**

Florida State is now 6-11 against Top 10 teams since losing to No. 1 Oklahoma 13-2 on Jan. 3, 2001 in the BCS Orange Bowl national championship game. The Seminoles, however, have been no push-overs. Of those defeats, six have been decided by 8 points or fewer, including a one-point loss at No. 1 Miami (2002), a two-point loss to No. 10 Miami (2004 Orange Bowl) and a three-point loss to No. 3 Penn State, 26-23 (2006 Orange Bowl) in triple-overtime.

#### **HUDSON: EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICAN**

Junior left guard Rodney Hudson is well on his way to becoming the most decorated offensive lineman in Florida State history. After earning Freshman All-American honors in 2007, Hudson gained some national attention as a sophomore, after earning first-team All-ACC honors. Entering his third season as a starter, the Mobile, Ala. native has been a consensus first-team All-American in the preseason publications. College Football News rates him as the No. 1 guard in the country. As a result, Hudson is a candidate for the Lombardi Award, presented to the nation's lineman of the year.

#### **PONDER THE SCHOLAR**

Redshirt junior quarterback Christian Ponder's star is rising on the football field, but his academic prowess is already in the "other-worldly" class. After earning his bachelor's degree in finance (3.72 gpa, Magna Cum Laude) in the summer of 2008, Ponder began working on his MBA and will graduate in May. He is currently carrying a 3.72 gpa in the post-graduate program. In a span of 4 1/2 years Ponder will have completed his undergraduate and graduate degrees, with a year of athletic eligibility remaining. A three-time ACC Academic Honor Roll member, he has been on the Dean's List at Florida State four times and posted a 4.0 GPA last fall as a graduate student.

#### **GRADUATES ABOUND**

Five current Seminoles have already picked up their degrees from Florida State, headed by Ponder, one of three players already in a

graduate school program. Long snapper Zach Aronson and cornerback Ochuko Jenije earned their undergraduate degrees in sports management and are now in the international marketing & management communications, and higher education graduate programs, respectively. Free safety Jamie Robinson and defensive tackle Kendrick Stewart are pursuing second bachelor's degrees after completing undergraduate work in social science and sports management, respectively. All five are projected starters against Brigham Young.

### **BEAR OF A SCHEDULE**

With 11 of 12 opponents on the Seminoles 2009 schedule coming off bowl appearances last season, FSU's slate ranks as one of the toughest in the nation. It features non-conference dates with Jacksonville State – an FCS opponent coming off an 8-3 season - BYU, South Florida and defending national champion Florida. Tack on the eight Atlantic Coast Conference games and the combined record of the Seminoles 12 foes is 101-55 – a .657 winning percentage. That's more wins by opponents than any other team in the country. Furthermore, FSU's FBS opponents were 93-49 (.645), which is also the most of any FCS program in the country.

### **FROSH COUNT CLIMBS TO 11**

Through three games this season, 11 true freshmen have seen action. First-year 'Noles Garrett Faircloth, Rodney Smith and Blake Snider upped the count with appearances against Brigham Young. Eight true freshmen played against Miami in the season-opener, significantly fewer than the 22 Seminoles who played in the 2008 opener against Western Carolina. Still, it was no less of a thrill for Greg Reid, Dustin Hopkins, Chris Thompson, Lonnie Pryor, Jajuan Harley, Brandon Jenkins, Willie Haulstead and Jacobbi McDaniel, who made their collegiate debuts.

### **HIGH MARKS FROM THE 4-LETTER NETWORK**

The Labor Day night clash between Miami and Florida State, nationally televised on ESPN, drew an amazing overnight rating of 5.6. That should not be surprising since Miami and FSU are responsible for drawing the top two regular season ratings games on ESPN in the network's history. To give Monday's game some context, last weekend's Oklahoma-BYU game drew a 3.1 overnight mark, just ahead of Navy-Ohio State (3.0). A year ago in the same television slot, Tennessee-UCLA earned a 4.4 share. Of course it didn't hurt that the 'Canes and 'Noles put on a good show. The 38-34 victory by the Hurricanes proved to be an Instant Classic and was replayed Tuesday on ESPN Classic.

### **FORMER 'NOLES NUMBER 31 ON NFL ROSTERS**

Florida State continues to be well-represented in the NFL, with 31 former 'Noles appearing on rosters. The list includes two rookies, led by Carolina Panthers defensive end and second-round pick Everete Brown and undrafted free agent long snapper Garrison Sanborn with Buffalo. At the opposite end of the experience spectrum is 13-year veteran offensive tackle Walter Jones (Seattle) and 12-year veterans, cornerback Samari Rolle (Baltimore) and offensive tackle Tra Thomas (Jacksonville). Kicker Sebastian Janikowski (Oakland) and wide receiver Laveranues Coles (Cincinnati) are 10-year veterans.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - The No. 18 Florida State football team fell in heartbreaking fashion Labor Day night to visiting Miami, 38-34.

With just five seconds remaining and the ball positioned on the Hurricanes' two yard-line, FSU quarterback Christian Ponder's potential game-winning pass to Jarmon Fortson hit the ground in the endzone as time expired.

Blitzing from the cornerback position, true freshman Greg Reid violently slammed into 'Canes quarterback Jacory Harris and forced a wobbly pass that was intercepted and returned 31 yards for the go-ahead score by FSU defensive end Markus White.

Showing his short memory and ability to bounce back from a big hit, Harris then led a scoring drive on Miami's ensuing possession that knotted the score at 31-31 with just over seven minutes to play.

Following a 45-yard field goal by Seminoles true freshman kicker Dustin Hopkins with 4:11 remaining in the game, the Hurricanes marched down the field once again and Miami tailback Graig Cooper bounded into the endzone from three yards to give his team what would turn out to be the game-winning score.

For the game, the Seminole defense allowed Harris to complete 21 of his 34 pass attempts for a career-best 386 yards and two scores.

Offensively, Ponder finished with a career-high 294 yards on 24-for-41 passing. He tossed two touchdown passes but also had an interception.

After completions to Goodman and Rod Owens put the 'Noles in scoring position, Ponder's nifty nine-yard touchdown run pushed the score to 16-14 before a missed extra point.

A few minutes later, Reid once again served as the catalyst for a Florida State scoring drive. After his interception of Harris deep in Seminole territory, the FSU offense kicked into high gear.

First Ponder hooked up with Goodman for a 28-yard gain and then a few plays later wide receiver Louis Givens took a reverse handoff 13 yards. Wide receiver Taiwan Easterling then proved the ruptured Achilles tendon he sustained in the spring was a thing of the past as he grabbed a pass and grinded out a 21-yard touchdown reception to put FSU on top 23-14.

Rated the consensus No. 1 kicker as a high school senior a year ago, Hopkins didn't wait long to make his presence known in a rivalry that has historically featured the kickers.

The Houston, Texas native put an exclamation point on a 64-yard drive as he set a new school record for an FSU player's first career kick with a 52-yard field goal. The lengthy three-point play put FSU on top 10-7 with 2:50 remaining before halftime.

Unfortunately for the Seminoles, the excitement of Hopkins' successful debut was short lived as Miami had an answer.

On the ensuing drive, Harris orchestrated a 75-yard drive that was culminated by a five-yard Javarris James touchdown dive.

FSU tried to answer but Ponder's attempted pass to Goodman in the endzone was intercepted by Miami safety Randy Phillips just before intermission.

Florida State scored its first touchdown of the young season on the team's very first offensive possession.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - The Florida State football team avoided the unthinkable Saturday night as the Seminoles escaped with a 19-9 victory over visiting Jacksonville State.

Trailing most of the game, FSU (1-1, 0-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) rattled off 12-straight points in the game's final three minutes thanks to a high-pressure offensive drive and a game-sealing defensive play.

Down 9-7, FSU senior linebacker Dekoda Watson's sack of Jacksonville State quarterback Ryan Perrilloux with three minutes remaining helped initiate what would become the Seminoles' comeback drive.

Starting from his own 42-yard line with just 2:45 remaining on the clock, Seminoles quarterback Christian Ponder hooked up with Richard Goodman on the drive's seventh play for a 24-yard gain.

The long pass-play was then followed a short time later by tailback Ty Jones' one-yard plunge as the clock ticked to 35 seconds left and the scoreboard moved to 13-9 in favor of the Seminoles.

McNeil blocked a field goal late in the third quarter but the offense couldn't turn it into any points. Senior wide receiver Louis Givens took a long pass-play down near the goal-line but fumbled at the end of the run.

The only real highlight for the Seminoles before the final few moments was Jones' seven-yard rumble into the endzone late in the first quarter. The scoring play, which put FSU on top 7-6, was set up by a career-best 53-yard reception by Piurowski.

For the game, Ponder broke the career-high he set against the Hurricanes as he finished the game against the Gamecocks with 324 yards passing.

Ponder's first-ever 300-yard passing game was made possible by his ability to spread the wealth. Just like he did against Miami, FSU's starting signal-caller connected with eight different pass-catchers.

Goodman led the 'Noles with eight catches for 80 yards while Rod Owens had four grabs for 47 yards. Piurowski added 78 yards on two catches.

Defensively, redshirt freshman rover Nick Moody made the most of his first-ever start as he finished with 10 tackles. Senior Kendall Smith also posted 10 stops from his Mike linebacker spot.

Defensive captain Dekoda Watson paced his unit with an impressive 3.5 sacks and nine tackles.

PROVO, Utah - The Cougars never had a chance ... and now the Seminoles will be bringing some turf back to the east coast.

Underdogs to the seventh-ranked team in the nation, the Florida State football team went out to Provo, Utah and blasted BYU 54-28 to put an end to the Cougar's 18-game home winning streak.

In doing so, Dekoda Watson will bring home a chunk of the turf to bury in the program's storied Sod Cemetery on campus.

FSU starting quarterback Christian Ponder was masterful in the mountains as he completed 21 of his 25 pass attempts for 195 yards, two touchdowns and no turnovers as the Seminoles (2-1, 0-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) moved to a perfect 7-0 when the redshirt junior doesn't throw an interception.

A stable of tailbacks held it down on the ground after struggling through the first two games of the year. Ty Jones led the way with 109 yards on 13 carries and Lonnie Pryor added 50 yards and two scores on seven rushes. Ponder amassed 79 yards and a score on 11 carries as FSU rushed for a team total of 313 yards.

Jarmon Fortson and Rod Owens had four catches each for a combined 90 yards. Bert Reed had 34 yards receiving and Caz Piurowski had 38 of his own for a Seminole offense that scored the second most points ever allowed by BYU (2-1) on its home field.

Defensively, the Seminoles had difficulty stopping a talented Cougars offense as quarterback Max Hall's unit posted 475 total yards. Still, FSU made plays when it had to as the team forced five turnovers and scored 17 points off those takeaways.

On the first drive of the evening, FSU marched 80 yards and Jones dove into the endzone from three yards out.

The Cougars were then threatening to score on their first drive but Budd Thacker forced a fumble and last week's hero, Kevin McNeil, scooped it off the turf. The stellar defensive play was followed up by another fantastic drive for FSU.

The 'Noles were methodical as they picked and popped the BYU defense on a commanding 18-play drive. Lining up at fullback, Pryor then scored his first TD as a Seminole as he slammed in for a one-yard score to push the FSU lead to 13-0 early in the second quarter.

BYU was able to respond on the ensuing drive with a touchdown but the FSU offense didn't care. After Greg Reid took the kick-off to the 40-yard line, Jones' highlight-reel run of 47 yards put FSU on the BYU nine-yard line. On the very next play, Pryor danced into the endzone from nine yards away for his second score.

After a BYU score cut the FSU lead to 20-14, Ponder orchestrated another beautiful drive. Playing in his first game for FSU, redshirt junior tailback Tavares Pressley's 12-yard run put the 'Noles on the BYU five-yard line and then two plays later Piurowski snared a five-yard pass in the back of the endzone as FSU jumped out to a 27-14 lead with 24 seconds left in the second quarter.

And they weren't done. On the following kick-off, true freshman safety Jajuan Harley forced a fumble and kicker Dustin Hopkins was then able to drill a 33-yard field as the first-half clock expired to give Florida State a 30-14 advantage at the break.

Looking to add to the lead, the Seminoles did just that at the start of the third quarter. With BYU moving down the field at ease, Reid stepped in front of Hall's pass and returned it 63 yards. The INT was Reid's second of his career and the score was his first.

On top 37-14 against a Cougars team that had allowed just an average of eight points per game prior to Saturday's contest, the FSU defense forced the first BYU punt of the night. The offense then scored again when Ponder dove into the endzone a few minutes later to extend the Seminoles' lead to a staggering 44-14.

The Cougars found the endzone again, however, as an 80-yard scoring pass trimmed the lead to 44-21.

A first-career interception by linebacker Nigel Bradham and a Hopkins field goal later, FSU's 47-21 lead then ballooned to 54-21 when Ponder connected with Fortson on a 16-yard touchdown pass for the team's final score.
