OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Mardy Gilyard • Sr. • WR • Cincinnati • Bunnell, Fla..

Gilyard had nine receptions for a career-high 177 yards and two touchdowns, making the most of Cincinnati's limited time of possession in the Bearcats' 28-20 win against Fresno State. Gilyard, who finished with 226 all-purpose yards, had touchdown receptions of 11 and 23 yards to lead a Bearcat offense that was on the field for just 16:18.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jason Pierre-Paul • Jr. • DE • USF • Deerfield Beach, Fla.

Pierre-Paul had four tackles, three tackles for loss and a pivotal fourth-quarter strip sack that helped USF secure a 17-7 win at No. 18/25 Florida State. He led a USF defense that limited the Seminoles to 19 rushing yards and just 288 total yards to help the Bulls remain unbeaten.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Teddy Dellaganna • Jr. • P • Rutgers • Templeton, Calif.

Dellaganna helped Rutgers win the field position battle in the Scarlet Knights' 34-13 win at Maryland. He averaged 40.6 yards on five punts, forcing three Terrapin drives to start inside the 12-yard line and hitting a 51-yard punt from deep inside Rutgers territory to help protect a fourth-quarter lead.



WEEKLY HONOR ROLL

Lawrence Wilson, LB, Connecticut — Had 12 tackles, two sacks, three tackles for loss and a forced fumble in a 52-10 win against Rhode Island. Helped hold the Rams to five first downs and 148 yards.

Antonio Lowery, LB, Rutgers — Had eight tackles, one tackle for loss and a 36-yard interception return for a touchdown on Maryland's first offensive play in a 34-13 road win.

Joe Martinek, RB, Rutgers — Had 19 carries for a career-high 147 yards and two fourth-quarter touchdowns in a 34-13 win at Maryland. Had 130 rushing yards in the fourth quarter.

B.J. Daniels, QB, USF — Had 341 yards of total offense and two touchdown passes in 17-7 win at No. 18/25 Florida State. Had 23 carries for 126 yards in his first career start.

Delone Carter, RB, Syracuse — Scored four touchdowns in a 41-24 win against Maine. Ran for three TDs and 72 yards on 19 carries and had his first career touchdown reception.



Better Than Ever

Under its current alignment, which is in its fifth season, the BIG EAST is a combined 143-58 in nonleague games. (.711). That would stand as the best five-year nonleague record in the history of the conference.

Just Win

Six of the eight BIG EAST teams are either unbeaten or have one loss. The BIG EAST is the only conference in the nation that does not have more than two two-loss teams. The BIG EAST, Big 12 and SEC are the only conferences that do not have a three-loss team to date.

Going Bowling

Following the 2008 season, BIG EAST schools are 13-4 in their last 17 bowl games. The conference was 4-2 in bowl games in 2008, 3-2 in 2007 and 5-0 in 2006.

Feels Like The First Time

The BIG EAST has crowned a first-time champion in each of the last three years (Louisville in 2006, Connecticut in 2007 and Cincinnati in 2008).

Genuine Draft

The BIG EAST had 27 players chosen in the 2009 NFL Draft, good for second in conference history. The BIG EAST record was set in 2004, when the conference had 28 players chosen.

Depth Perception

Seven of the eight BIG EAST teams were either ranked or received votes in one of the three major top-25 polls (Associated Press, USA Today, Harris Interactive) during the 2008 season.

Top Of The Charts

USF quarterback Matt Grothe became the BIG EAST's career total offense leader in the Bulls' win at Western Kentucky. Grothe has 10,875 career yards, surpassing former West Virginia quarterback Pat White, who had 10,529 yards from 2005-08. Grothe ranks third among active FBS players in career total offense.

West Virginia fell to 2-1 following a 41-30 loss at Auburn Sept. 19 ... The Mountaineers had defeated Liberty and East Carolina to open the season and come off a bye ... West Virginia has scored at least 30 points in each of its three games thus far ... QB Jarrett Brown leads the BIG EAST and ranks sixth nationally in total offense (335.3 yards per game) ... Brown has completed 68.5 percent of his passes (61 of 89) and has thrown for 798 yards, five touchdowns and five interceptions ... WR Jock Sanders is averaging a BIG EAST-leading 9.7 receptions per game and is third nationally ... Sanders is averaging 103 receiving yards per game to rank third in the BIG EAST ... The Cardinals play at home for just the second time this season after playing consecutive road games at Kentucky and Utah ... Louisville defeated Indiana State 30-10 in the only home game to date ... Louisville has both scored and allowed 71 points through three games, though the Cardinals have averaged 65 yards per game more than their opponents ... Pittsburgh looks to rebound from its first loss of the season as the Panthers fell 38-31 at North Carolina State ... The Panthers are 13-5 in their last 18 games, marking the best such stretch since the 2001-02 seasons ... Pittsburgh is 7-2 in its last nine road games ... The Panthers are looking for their fifth 4-1 start since the 2000 season, but have not had such a start in an odd-numbered year this decade ... The Panthers are 20-for-21 in red zone scoring (95 percent), leading the BIG EAST ... Pittsburgh's defense has registered 17 sacks through four games while the Panthers' offensive line has allowed just two sacks ... USF and Syracuse have met four times prior to Saturday's game ... The Bulls have won all four previous meetings, including a 45-13 win Oct. 18, 2008, at Raymond James Stadium ... USF QB Matt Grothe threw for 248 yards and three touchdowns in last year's game ... Both teams' starting quarterbacks have played Division I basketball — USF's B.J. NOTES

USF has scored wins against teams ranked No. 5 and No. 13 in the past two years, but the Bulls gained what might have been their program's most important win last Saturday as USF got a 17-7 decision at Florida State ... QB B.J. Daniels made his first career start against the Seminoles and has registered back-to-back games with at least 100 rushing yards ... Daniels came off the bench against Charleston Southern to replace QB Matt Grothe, who had suffered a season-ending knee injury ... While the quarterbacks have been the focus of most of the attention, the Bulls' defense has been quietly dominant ... BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES



About the BCS

The Bowl Championship Series (BCS), which enters its 12th season in 2009-10, is a five-game arrangement for postseason college football that is designed to match the two top-rated teams in a national championship game and to create exciting and competitive matchups between eight other highly regarded teams in four other BCS games.



The BIG EAST has been a charter member in the championship agreement. The league continues as an automatic qualifier in the new BCS agreement that began in 2006.

The Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, FedEx Orange Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl and Rose Bowl presented by Citi have joined with the BIG EAST, Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Pacific-10 and Southeastern Conferences and the University of Notre Dame to form the Bowl Championship Series. In the existing BCS agreement, which began in 2006, each bowl will host two games once every four years - its traditional game plus the BCS National Championship contest approximately one week later.

The BCS is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision conferences, the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame and representatives of the bowl organizations. The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 FBS programs.

The BCS conferences have a contract with Fox Sports to televise the Fiesta, Orange and Sugar Bowls through 2010 and the National Championship Games through 2009. ABC has an agreement to continue to televise the 2010 National Championship Game and the Rose Bowl through 2014.

The BIG EAST has fared particularly well in the BCS. The conference has produced three winners in BCS games in the last four years.

BCS Automatic Qualifications

1. The top two teams in the final BCS Standings will play in the national championship game.
2. The champions of the Atlantic Coast, BIG EAST, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences automatically qualify for BCS games each year.
3. One team from among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference, the Sun Belt Conference, or the Western Athletic Conference automatically qualify for a BCS game if either: A. Such team is ranked in the top 12 of the final BCS Standings, or, B. Such team is ranked in the top 16 of the final BCS Standings and its ranking in the final BCS Standings is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls.
4. Notre Dame will automatically qualify for a BCS bowl if it is in the top eight of the final BCS Standings.
5. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 4, and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 3 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
6. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 5, and if Step No. 5 has not been applied and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 4 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
7. If any slots remain unfilled after the placement of all teams qualifying for an automatic berth, then the bowls shall choose their participants from the "pool of eligible teams" (see below.)

Pool of Eligible Teams

If berths are available after the automatic qualifiers have been identified, then the bowls shall select at-large participants from the "pool of eligible teams," which shall include any FBS team that is bowl-eligible and meets the following requirements:

- A. Has won at least nine regular-season games, not including exempted games, and
- B. Is among the top 14 teams in the final BCS Standings

BIG EAST 2009 BOWL LINEUP



In addition to the Bowl Championship Series, the BIG EAST Conference also has agreements with a number of other postseason bowl games.

The BIG EAST and Big 12 Conferences — along with Notre Dame — forged a bowl partnership beginning in 2006 and ending with the 2009 season. This agreement assured both BCS Conferences' and Notre Dame's participation in the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl and Brut Sun Bowl over a four-year period. The Konica Minolta Gator Bowl or Brut Sun Bowl chooses a BIG EAST team after the league's representative to the Bowl Championship Series has been determined. The Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposition in the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl and the Pac-10 Conference participates in the Brut Sun Bowl.

The Gator Bowl has the first selection at the conclusion of each season and will select a BIG EAST team or Notre Dame in 2009.

The Meineke Car Care Bowl is now in its sixth year with the BIG EAST Conference. The Meineke Car Care Bowl, which is played in Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C., picks after the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl or Brut Sun Bowl.

The BIG EAST aligned itself with two additional bowls beginning in the 2006 season. The International Bowl, played at the Rogers Centre in Toronto, pairs the BIG EAST representative against an opponent from the Mid-America Conference, while the PapaJohns.com Bowl in Birmingham, Ala., matches the BIG EAST selection against a school from the Southeastern Conference. The St. Petersburg Bowl at Tropicana Field will put the BIG EAST's representative against a team from Conference USA.
