OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jordan Todman • Jr. • RB • Connecticut • North Dartmouth, Mass.

Todman rushed for 175 yards and three touchdowns on 31 carries to lead Connecticut to a 38-17 win against Cincinnati and lift the Huskies into a three-way tie for first place in the BIG EAST standings. Todman scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to break open what had been a one-possession game and put Connecticut in the driver's seat in the BIG EAST race.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Brandon Hogan • Sr. • CB • West Virginia • Manassas, Va.

Hogan had a hand in two first-half turnovers to lead West Virginia to a 35-10 win at Pittsburgh, forging a three-way tie atop the BIG EAST standings. Hogan had a 53-yard interception return to the 2-yard line on the first series to set up the Mountaineers' first touchdown of the day and he added a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the second quarter. Hogan finished with six tackles as part of a West Virginia defense that has not allowed more than 21 points in a game this season.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Justin Brockhaus-Kann • So. • P • USF • Winter Springs, Fla.

Brockhaus-Kahn helped tilt the field in USF's favor in the Bulls' 23-20 overtime win at Miami (Fla.). He averaged 41.0 yards on 10 punts, hitting two punts of 50 yards or more and dropping two inside the 20-yard line. He helped limit Miami's punt return unit to just 28 total yards on seven returns.



WEEKLY HONOR ROLL

Kendall Reyes, DE, Connecticut — Had 2.5 tackles for loss and set up a touchdown with a 79-yard interception return in a 38-17 win against Cincinnati.

Johnny Patrick, CB, Louisville — Had two interceptions, three pass breakups and two tackles in a 40-13 win at Rutgers.

Bilal Powell, RB, Louisville — Rushed for 123 yards and a touchdown on 23 carries and had two touchdown receptions totaling 28 yards in a 40-13 win at Rutgers.

Through 50 home dates in 2010, the average attendance at BIG EAST stadiums has been 45,402, which would stand as the second-best mark in conference history. The best year at the turnstiles for BIG EAST teams was in 2003, when the conference averaged 47,292 spectators.

The Possibilities

Five of the eight BIG EAST teams remain alive in the hunt for at least a share of the 2010 conference title. Three remain alive in their pursuit of the BIG EAST's Bowl Championship Series bid. Here are the possibilities for each team in contention.

Connecticut (4-2 BIG EAST, 7-4 overall)

Remaining: at USF

- Would win the BIG EAST's BCS bid with a win against USF or with a loss to USF and losses by West Virginia and Pittsburgh.
- Would win outright BIG EAST title and BCS bid with a win against USF and losses by West Virginia and Pittsburgh.
- Wins every tiebreaker scenario against any team or combination of teams that could tie for the title.

West Virginia (4-2 BIG EAST, 8-3 overall)

Remaining: vs. Rutgers

- Would clinch a share of the BIG EAST title with a win against Rutgers or with a loss to Rutgers and losses by Connecticut and Pittsburgh.
- Would win outright BIG EAST title and BCS bid with a win against Rutgers, and losses by Connecticut and Pittsburgh.
- Holds head-to-head tiebreakers against USF and Cincinnati.

Pittsburgh (4-2 BIG EAST, 6-5 overall)

Remaining: at Cincinnati

- Would clinch a share of the BIG EAST title with a win at Cincinnati or with a loss to Cincinnati and losses by Connecticut and West Virginia.
- Would win outright BIG EAST title and BCS bid with a win at Cincinnati and losses by Connecticut and West Virginia.
- Holds head-to-head tiebreakers against Syracuse and USF.

Syracuse (4-3 BIG EAST, 7-5 overall)

Remaining: Regular season complete

- Would clinch a share of the BIG EAST title with a Connecticut loss to USF, a West Virginia loss to Rutgers and a Pittsburgh loss to Cincinnati.
- Can not earn the BIG EAST BCS bid.

USF (3-3 BIG EAST, 7-4 overall)

Remaining: vs. Connecticut

- Would clinch a share of the BIG EAST title with a win against Connecticut, a West Virginia loss to Rutgers and a Pittsburgh loss to Cincinnati.
- Can not earn the BIG EAST BCS bid.

Century Club

Connecticut's Jordan Todman has rushed for at least 100 yards in 12 of his last 14 games.

Versatility

The BIG EAST has 25 active players, including two quarterbacks and two wide receivers, who have rushed for at least 100 yards in a game during their careers. Fifteen different players have had 100-yard games this season alone.

POLL EXPLANATION & ABOUT THE BCS:

To derive a team's poll percentages in the Harris Interactive and *USA Today* polls, each team's point total is divided by a maximum 2850 possible points in the Harris Interactive Poll and 1475 possible points in the *USA Today* Poll. Teams are assigned a point total for each of their respective computer poll rankings to determine the overall computer component. The highest and lowest ranking for each team is dropped, and the sum total of the remaining four rankings is divided by 100 (the maximum possible points). This figure produces a Computer Rankings Percentage. The six computer ranking providers are Anderson & Hester (A&H), Richard Billingsley (B), Colley Matrix (CM), Kenneth Massey (M), Jeff Sagarin (S) and Peter Wolfe (W). Each computer ranking accounts for schedule strength within its formula. The BCS Average is calculated by averaging the percent totals of the Harris Interactive and USA Today Polls, and Computer rankings. The highest BCS Average receives the No. 1 ranking, the second highest receives No. 2, and so forth.

The BCS is a five-game arrangement for post-season college football that is managed by the 11 Bowl Subdivision conferences and Notre Dame. Its purpose is to match the two top-ranked teams in the final BCS standings in a national championship game and to create competitive match-ups in the four other BCS bowl games. For more information, visit www.bcsfootball.org. The No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the Dec. 6 BCS standings will play in the Tostitos BCS National Championship Game Jan. 10, 2011 in Glendale, Ariz. BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

About the BCS

The Bowl Championship Series, which enters its 13th season in 2010-11, is a five-game arrangement for postseason college football that is designed to match the two top-rated teams in a national championship game and to create exciting and competitive matchups between eight other highly regarded teams in four other BCS games.

The BCS has been undeniably successful in achieving those goals. Thanks to the BCS, the top two teams have played each other 12 times in 12 years by BCS measurements and nine times in the last 12 years according to the Associated Press poll. Additionally, it has provided more access to the major bowls for all 11 conferences, more television exposure and more postseason revenue than ever before.

The BCS also allows for preserving the significance of the regular season, which is the most meaningful in sports. It also maintains the bowl season to the benefit of dozens of universities each year.

The BIG EAST has been a charter member in the championship agreement. The league continues as an automatic qualifier in the new BCS agreement that began in 2006.

The Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, Discover Orange Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl and Rose Bowl Game joined with the BIG EAST, Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Pacific-10 and Southeastern Conferences and the University of Notre Dame to form the Bowl Championship Series. In the existing BCS agreement, each bowl will host two games once every four years - its traditional game plus the BCS National Championship contest approximately one week later.

The BCS is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision conferences, the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame and representatives of the bowl organizations. The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 Division I-A programs.

The BCS conferences have a contract with ESPN to televise the games through the 2013-14 season.



BCS Automatic Qualifications

1. The top two teams in the final BCS Standings will play in the national championship game.
2. The champions of the Atlantic Coast, BIG EAST, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern conferences automatically qualify for BCS games each year.
3. One team from among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference, the Sun Belt Conference, or the Western Athletic Conference automatically qualify for a BCS game if either:
A. Such team is ranked in the top 12 of the final BCS Standings, or, B. Such team is ranked in the top 16 of the final BCS Standings and its ranking in the final BCS Standings is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls.
4. Notre Dame will automatically qualify for a BCS bowl if it is in the top eight of the final BCS Standings.
5. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 4, and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 3 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
6. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 5, and if Step No. 5 has not been applied and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 4 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
7. If any slots remain unfilled after the placement of all teams qualifying for an automatic berth, then the bowls shall choose their participants from the "pool of eligible teams" (see below.)

Pool of Eligible Teams

If berths are available after the automatic qualifiers have been identified, then the bowls shall select at-large participants from the "pool of eligible teams," which shall include any Bowl Subdivision team that is bowl-eligible and meets the following requirements:

- A. Has won at least nine regular-season games, not including exempted games, and
- B. Is among the top 14 teams in the final BCS standings.

BIG EAST 2010 BOWL LINEUP

The New Lineup

In addition to the Bowl Championship Series, the BIG EAST Conference also has agreements with a number of other postseason bowl games. The conference's new lineup, which begins with the 2010 season, has the BIG EAST paired against three of the other five automatic-qualifying Bowl Championship Series conferences in the postseason, giving the BIG EAST its strongest bowl partnerships in its history.

The BIG EAST announced a four-year agreement with Florida Citrus Sports and the Champs Sports Bowl to send a team to the Orlando, Fla., game beginning in the 2010 season.

The Champs Sports Bowl will have the first selection from the BIG EAST after the league's BCS representative has been determined. The BIG EAST's opponent in the Champs Sports Bowl will be from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Champs Sports Bowl will have the opportunity to select Notre Dame, in place of a BIG EAST team, once during the four-year agreement.

The BIG EAST has extended its agreement with the Meineke Car Care Bowl in Charlotte, N.C., through the 2013 season as well. The Meineke Car Care Bowl will have the BIG EAST's third selection, after the BCS and Champs Sports Bowl.

The BIG EAST has been aligned with the Meineke Car Care Bowl since the inception of the game in 2002. The game has averaged more than 62,000 fans and was named one of the five best startups in sports in the previous five years by Sports Business Journal.

The 2010 season will feature the introduction of a new bowl game in New York City when the BIG EAST participates in the first New Era Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium. The New Era Pinstripe Bowl will pit the fourth overall selection from the BIG EAST against a team from the Big 12 Conference for each of the next four seasons. In the event that the Big 12 is unable to supply a team for the game, Notre Dame could step in as the opponent of the BIG EAST's representative.

The BIG EAST completed its bowl lineup in April 2010 by renewing deals with the BBVA Compass Bowl in Birmingham, Ala., and the Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl in St. Petersburg, Fla. The conference also announced a new agreement with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tenn. The BIG EAST will send teams to two of those three games in each of the 2010-13 seasons.

The BBVA Compass Bowl pairs a BIG EAST team against an opponent from the Southeastern Conference at Legion Field in Birmingham. BIG EAST teams are a combined 4-0 in the Birmingham Bowl.

If a BIG EAST team is chosen for the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, the conference's representative would face either the Conference USA champion or an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl will be played for the third time in 2010 with the BIG EAST scoring wins in each of the first two games. The BIG EAST will face Conference USA at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg.
