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USF: USF, which went 28-11 at home last season (including games played in Clearwater, Fla.), will host 27 regular season games at Eddie C. Moore Complex in Clearwater and 14 games at the USF Softball Stadium. The Bulls will host a total of four tournaments, part of the USF Series, which will also be held at the Eddie C. Moore Complex. The Bulls will play the last three conference series in Clearwater in 2010 due to the construction that is planned on USF's new softball stadium during the Spring.

The Bulls return 19 players, including 10 seniors and All-Region and All-BIG EAST members senior catcher Cat Olnick and sophomore outfielder Janine Richardson. USF also adds three freshmen to the team and one junior transfer.

Canisius: The Golden Griffins enter their 2010 season competing at the USF Wilson-DeMarini Tournament at Eddie C. Moore Complex. Canisius finished the 2009 season 26-25, earning an automatic bid into the NCAA tournament. The Griffins have claimed the MAAC's league championship three years in a row, returning 11 letterwinners and six starters from last year's squad. The team is led by preseason All-MAAC Selection senior Michelle Fridey and junior Lauren Hope. Fridey hit .306 against MAAC opponents while Hope holds the Canisius record in stolen bases.

The Series vs. Canisius

The first matchup of the season against Canisius will mark the sixth meeting between the teams. The Bulls are leading the series, 4-1, defeating the Golden Griffins in a doubleheader, 2-1 and 3-0 in 2008.

Illinois State: The Redbirds begin their 2010 campaign picked to finish fifth in the Missouri Valley Conference according to the Preseason Coaches' Poll. The 2009 Redbirds finished fifth in the conference with a 24-26 overall record. Junior Abby Olson was the only Redbird selected for the Preseason All-Valley Team. Olson is joined by five other starters and 11 letterwinners. Olson led the 2009 team with a .338 batting average, a .432 on-base percentage and 11 home runs.

The Series vs. Illinois State

The matchup against Illinois State will mark the fourth meeting between the teams. The Bulls are leading the series, 3-1, defeating the Redbirds, 4-1 and 4-0 in 2005 and 2009, respectively.

Florida: The nationally ranked Gators enter the USF Wilson-DeMarini Tournament third in the USA Today/NFCA preseason poll and fifth in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll. The Gators went 63-5 in 2009 and return 10 letterwinners and four All-Americans to the 2010 squad. The team was led by All-Americans Francesca Enea, Stephanie Brombacher, Kelsey Bruder and Aja Pacubla. Enea and Brombacher were also named to the Collegiate Player of the Year Preseason Watch List. Brombacher went 22-0 on the season as a sophomore pitcher and was third in the nation with 0.84 ERA, while Enea batted .339 and had a .494 on base percentage with 70 RBI and 18 home runs.

The Series vs. Florida

The matchup against Florida will mark the 39th meeting between the teams. The Gators are leading the series, 26-12. The Bulls fell to the Gators twice in UF's home tournament, 8-0 and 9-1, last season.

East Carolina: The Pirates open their 2010 campaign with a Preseason Conference USA Pitcher of the Year and two Preseason All-Conference USA members. Junior Toni Paisley will look to earn the Pitcher of the Year title and seniors Cristen Aona and Christina Merrida will look to earn All-Conference awards. The 2009 Pirates were led by Paisley who was Pitcher of the Year and had 30 wins and an ERA of 1.22, third

baseman Aona who drove in a total of 31 runs, and center fielder Merrida who stole 16 bases and had a 1.000 fielding percentage.

The Series vs. East Carolina

The matchup against East Carolina will mark the 19th meeting between the teams. The Bulls are leading the series, 12-6. The Bulls defeated the Pirates, 1-0, in 2005. The history between these teams dates back to 1985, the first year of fastpitch for USF.

Georgia Tech: The nationally ranked Yellow Jackets enter the year with their highest preseason ranking to date, 13th in the National Fastpitch Coaches Associations' Preseason Poll. After having their best year in program history, finishing 13th in the NFCA and ESPN.com top 25 polls, the Yellow Jackets are led by Jen Yee and Kelsi Weseman. Both middle infielders were named to the USA's Softball Player of the Year Watch List after posting impressive 2009 seasons. Redshirt senior second baseman Yee boasted a .415 batting average with 43 RBI and a .534 on-base percentage, while sophomore shortstop Weseman boasted a .406 batting average with 48 RBIs and a .510 on-base percentage.

The Series vs. Georgia Tech

The matchup against Georgia Tech will mark the 19th meeting between the teams. The Bulls are leading the series, 15-3. The Bulls fell to the Yellow Jackets, 9-2, in 2008 in the NCAA Regional Tournament.

Leadoff Banquet

USF head baseball coach Lelo Prado and head softball coach Ken Eriksen announced the 2010 Embassy Suites Lead-Off Banquet.

The annual banquet, featuring the USF Softball and Baseball teams, will take place on Thursday, February 18 starting at 7 p.m. at the Embassy Suites USF/near Busch Gardens located at 3705 Spectrum Blvd.

The banquet will feature a number of celebrity guests, including Olympian Jennie Finch and New York Yankees manager Joe Girardi.

Finch pitches for the USA national softball team. The team won the gold medal at the 2004 Summer Olympics and a silver medal at the 2008 Summer Olympics. Although she is listed on the roster as a pitcher, Finch sometimes plays first base. She is widely regarded as the most famous softball player of all time. Finch played for the University of Arizona, where she was a three-time All-American pitcher and first-baseman and "Honda Award" winner for the Player of the Year as a member of the Wildcat softball team.

This past fall, Girardi led the New York Yankees to the American League pennant as well as their 27th World Series title. Girardi was a former Major League catcher for the Chicago Cubs, the Colorado Rockies, the New York Yankees, and St. Louis Cardinals. He was also manager of the Florida Marlins in 2006, where he was named National League Manager of the Year.

In the past the likes of Derek Jeter, Goose Gossage, Tino Martinez and Joe Girardi have shown their support for the Bulls while softball Olympians Michele Smith and Lovie Jung have attended the annual season starter as well.

The banquet will consist of a sit-down dinner, a meet and greet with both teams and a question-and-answer session with the attending celebrities.

Bulls, Notre Dame Set For National Television

The BIG EAST Conference and USF are proud to announce



several conference games that will be covered nationally by CBS College Sports.

The matchup between USF and Notre Dame on April 11 starts the softball package. The noon contest will be broadcast live from Notre Dame, Ind., and carried across the country on the CBS College Sports Network.

The network also will carry three games from the BIG EAST Softball Championship, where the Bulls have competed all four years since joining the BIG EAST. The semifinals are set for May 14 at 2:30 p.m. and 5 p.m., while the title game is set for May 15 at 5 p.m. The championship will take place at Ulmer Stadium in Louisville, Ky.

Bulls Tabbed Fourth

The BIG EAST Conference coaches have selected the USF softball team to finish fourth in the league this season, according to the 2010 BIG EAST preseason poll.

Four squads received first-place votes and topped 110 points in this year's poll. Six of the BIG EAST's 13 head coaches gave the Cardinals first-place votes, edging out defending BIG EAST regular-season champion DePaul by two votes as Louisville finished with 137 total points. Notre Dame also received two first place votes and the Bulls rounded out the first place votes with one.

All Student-Athletes get a MacBook Pro

USF announced a unique educational program providing all of its student athletes with access to a MacBook Pro 13-inch notebook computer every semester. The MacBook Pro notebooks provided to all student-athletes will give them the opportunity to work on course assignments and view academic materials at any time and in any location. As part of the program, USF will be adding new lectures to iTunes U, an area of the iTunes Store dedicated to educational material. With the MacBook Pro and a wireless internet connection, USF athletes will be able to access the lectures and other learning materials no matter where they are.

A New Home

The USF Athletics Department is one step closer to launching the next phase of its Athletics District after receiving approval from the university's Board of Trustees for the construction and financing of the \$30 million project, including the building of a new softball stadium.

The softball stadium is expected to feature a new lighted natural grass sports field, step-down team dugouts, bullpens, covered batting cages, multiple party pavilions, a press box and a 700-seat spectator grandstand with a shade canopy, an elevated, shaded entertainment or hospitality deck and service amenities. The overall capacity of the stadium is expected to exceed 1,500 and is being designed to accommodate NCAA Regionals and Super Regionals.

Bulls Ink Five For 2011 Season

Head coach Ken Eriksen announced the signing of five players, Stephanie Medina, Kourtney Salvarola, Sara Nevins and twin sisters Ashli Goff and Courtney Goff, to NCAA Letters of Intent during the November signing period. All will join USF as freshmen in the 2010-11 class.

Bulls Academic National Top Ten

The USF softball team GPA of 3.454 was good enough to be ranked in the top 10 nationally for all Division I softball teams.

Due to a technical glitch, the USF Bulls will not be recognized formally by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association. The individual members of the team will be recognized by the NFCA, however the team's grade point average (which was the highest team GPA for all USF teams in '08-'09) will not be officially recognized.

Eriksen Helps Lead Team USA To Title in 2009 Canada Cup

Head coach Ken Eriksen helped lead the USA Softball team in claiming the 2009 Canada Cup. The Bulls skipper was named to the coaching staff for the USA Softball Women's National Team in the middle of May 2009.

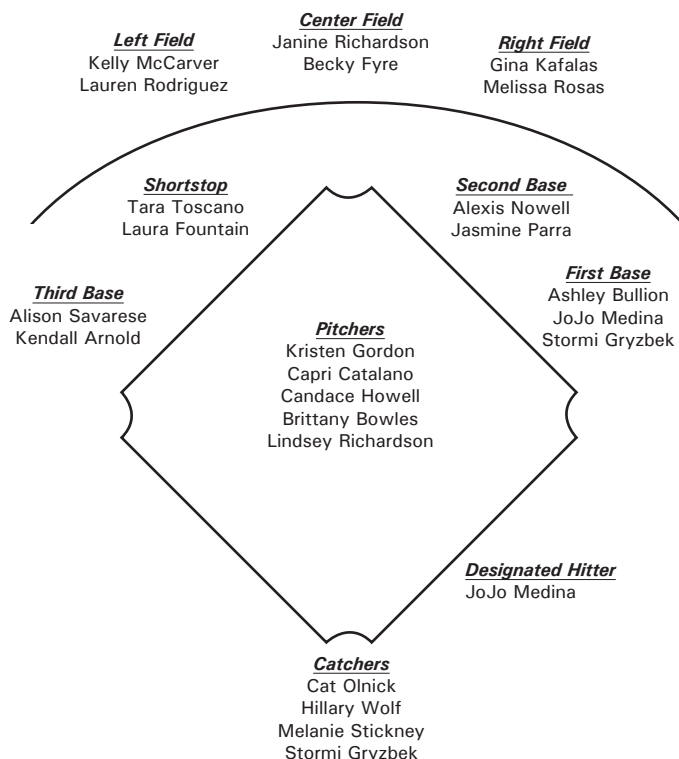

The motto above the doorway in USF's locker room says a lot about Head Coach Ken Eriksen's expectations for the USF softball program. It reads:

**Expect Perfection,
Accept Excellence.**

Eriksen has tried to embody this philosophy first as a player, then as an assistant coach, and now as head coach--all at USF. His philosophy of paying attention to all the details has provided the Bulls softball program success on and off the field. Through it all, he has come out a winner. Now entering his 14th season as USF's head coach and his 25th overall with the softball program, Eriksen is imparting this wisdom to his players.

Since Eriksen became head coach in 1997, he has ended the season with a winning record on 12 occasions. While at the helm of one of the most successful programs on campus, Eriksen has led eight teams to the NCAA Regional, won a Regional Championship in 2006, made a Super Regional appearance that same year and has won three conference titles, the latest being the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship in 2008.

In all, Eriksen has amassed a record of 587-303-1 and became the winningest coach in the history of the program. He has coached four All-Americans, including two-time All-American Monica Triner (1998 and 1999), 15 All-Region selections and seven NCAA All-Regional Team members. Success has come off the field as well. Under Eriksen, USF has had six Academic All-Americans, nine Conference USA Commissioner's Academic Medal winners and one BIG EAST Institutional Female Scholar-Athlete. In 2001 and 2003, USF finished first in C-USA among softball teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.24. Last fall, the team finished with a 3.41 GPA and was more impressive with a 3.47 GPA in the spring.

Eriksen has guided USF to one 60 win season, five 50-win seasons and six 40-plus win seasons. In 1999, USF was ranked as high as No. 6 in the NFCA/USA Today Coaches Poll during the season. USF finished the 2003 season with a 54-19 record, and Eriksen was named the Conference USA Coach of the Year. In 2004, USF finished with a record of 60-14--the highest win total in school history--and ranked 12th in the NFCA/USA Today Coaches Poll.

In 2009, the Bulls made their fourth consecutive BIG EAST Conference appearance since joining the league in 2006. They also claimed the USF Under Armour Invitational and The Game Tournament Championship. The Bulls finished the season ranked

in the Top-100 in several categories: earned run average, batting average, W-L percentage, triples per game and double plays per game.

In 2008, Eriksen and his Bulls made their ninth appearance in the NCAA tournament while claiming their first BIG EAST Regular Season Championship. USF finished 16-4 in BIG EAST games in 2008.

In 2006, the Bulls entered their first year with a new conference - the BIG EAST - and made an immediate impact, finishing second in the league with a record of 17-3. USF made history by making its fourth-consecutive trip to the NCAA Regional and then went on to win the Gainesville Regional (FAU, UF, UNC-Chapel Hill), posting a perfect record of 3-0. USF then represented the conference by being the lone BIG EAST team to advance to the Super Regionals. For the third time under his direction, the Bulls were one step away from making a trip to the Women's College World Series.

The 1998 season was one of the most successful seasons for the Bulls, as they finished 57-14 and won their second-consecutive SASA (ACC) regular-season title. Eriksen, who garnered acclaim as the Southeast Region Coach of the Year, led the Bulls to the NCAA tournament for the third-straight year. USF almost made an appearance in Oklahoma City, but fell to Texas in the NCAA Regional finals. Even though they did not make it to College World Series that year, they still finished eighth in the last NCAA Poll for 1998.

During his first year at the helm in 1997, Eriksen guided USF to its then-best-ever national ranking at No. 14 in the NFCA/USA Today Coaches Poll, finishing 50-13 and advancing to the NCAA tournament. In total, six of Eriksen's teams have finished the season ranked in the Top 25.

Eriksen began his affiliation with USF

over 25 years ago when the freshman from Stony Brook, N.Y., first appeared in Tampa as a baseball player for Hall of Famer Robin Roberts. It was under Roberts that Eriksen learned the strategy and execution involved with quality ball. In four seasons, Eriksen posted a .315 batting average and a 2.84 ERA while playing five different positions for the Bulls. In 1982 he was named to the All-Regional Team as an outfielder.

After earning his bachelor's degree in political science, Eriksen decided to turn his attentions from the baseball diamond to the softball arena.

He competed at the elite fastpitch level with the Clearwater Bombers from 1986-93, and with Miller-Toyota of Salt Lake City, Utah, from 1993-95. In 1997 he retired after winning an ASA Men's national championship ring with the Tampa Smokers.

During his playing career, Eriksen amassed a wealth of international experience. He participated in eight ISC World Championships and eight ASA National Major Championships. In 1988, he was a member of a select team that represented the United States against the Cuban National Team. In 1991, Eriksen was the catcher on the United States National Fastpitch Team that won a silver medal at the Pan American Games in Cuba. In 1992, he was named First Team All-World as a catcher and to the All-North American Team. Eriksen played in three Olympic Festivals winning a silver medal in 1993. In 1997 after retiring from playing, he was named the head coach for the Men's 19U World Team that represented the United States in St. John's, Newfoundland.

In 2001, Eriksen was named assistant coach with the United States Women's National Team and made history helping lead Team USA to an Olympic gold medal in 2004 while becoming the only USF coach in school history to accomplish such a feat. Eriksen, who still holds his position with the national team, has the primary responsibilities of pitching, catching and scouting for Team USA. He recently led Team USA to the 2009 Canada Cup title.

Throughout his coaching and playing career, Eriksen has added to his workload with camps and clinics.

He is also thoroughly devoted to his family. Eriksen lives with his wife Debra, his 12-year-old daughter Tatiana and his eight-year-old daughter Natasha.

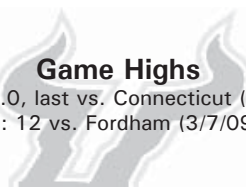

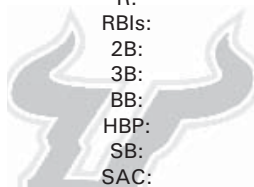
