SCOUTING CONNECTICUT

Connecticut comes into its match with USF boasting a 5-0-1 record following a sweep on its southern trip to South Carolina where it defeated Kentucky (3-0) on Sept. 17 and the Gamecocks (4-0) on Sept. 19 ... The Huskies are ranked eighth in the latest National Soccer Coaches Association of America Top 25 poll ... UConn has been one of the more dominating offensive teams in the country this season scoring 19 goals and allowing only two in six games.

The Huskies have six players netting six or more points on the year, led by Mamadou Diouf with 11 points (5G-1A) and Carlos Alvarez with eight points (2G-4A) ... Stephane Diop (3G-1A) and Tony Cascio (2G-3A) each have seven points, while Alan Ponce and Max Wasserman each have six points apiece (1G-4A).

Josh Ford has seen all but 32 minutes of action this year for UConn in goal ... He has 16 saves and posts a 0.34 goals against average and a .889 save percentage.

THE SERIES HISTORY VS. THE HUSKIES

Friday's game marks the eighth meeting between USF and Connecticut with the Huskies holding a commanding 7-0-0 all-time series lead ... The Bulls and UConn have not met since the 2007 season when they met three times - once during the regular season, once in the BIG EAST Tournament, and then again in the NCAA Tournament.

UConn holds a 5-0-0 advantage against USF in Storrs.

The USF men's soccer team gets back to work on Friday looking for its fifth consecutive win when it faces Connecticut in the BIG EAST opener for both schools ... Friday's match against the Huskies is the third of three straight that USF will play on the road ... Following Friday's match, the Bulls will open a short two-match home stretch on Sept. 29 when they take on Rhode Island at 7:30 p.m. ... USF is coming off a weekend sweep while winning the Embassy Suites Kickoff Classic at Florida Gulf Coast University. During the two games in Fort Myers, the Bulls defeated No. 6 Ohio State 2-1 on Sept. 16, and Drexel, 1-0, on Sept. 18 ... Bernardo Anor leads the team in scoring with seven points (3G-1A) while Shawn Chin is a close second with six points (3G-0A) ... Hasani Sinclair has three points (0G-3A) and Kevin Olali and Shane Wixted have two points apiece (1G-0A) ... All-America goalkeeper Jeff Attinella has made 29 saves this season and has a 0.48 goals against average and a .906 save percentage with three shutouts.

THE LAST TIME OUT

USF earned its fourth straight win, after starting the season 0-1-1, with a 1-0 triumph over previously unbeaten Drexel on Sept. 18 in the final day of action at the Embassy Suites Kickoff Classic at Florida Gulf Coast University.

USF dominated the contest out shooting the Dragons 7-4, including a 6-1 mark in the first half of play ... Bernardo Anor scored the games only goal in the 16th minute off assists from Hasani Sinclair and Ben Sweat.

The second half would prove to be a defensive standoff as the two teams combined for just four shots in the final 45 minutes of play ... The Bulls' defense would continue to dictate the tempo of the match as the Dragons never posed a serious threat ... Of Drexel's shots in the second half, two of the attempts would go high and wide right, while the third shot was blocked.

Despite not recording any saves, All-America goalkeeper Jeff Attinella logged his 21st career shutout with the win.

Bernardo Anor comes into Friday's match at Connecticut as USF's leader in the scoring column with seven points on the year (3G-1A) ... He has scored a goal in the last two games and in three of the past four outings.

Anor is coming off a big weekend last week at the Embassy Suites Kickoff Classic at

Florida Gulf Coast University in Fort Myers ... Anor tallied five points in the Bulls' two wins over No. 6 Ohio State (2-1) on Sept. 16 and Drexel (1-0) on Sept. 18 ... He scored the game winner in both contests and had an assist on the first goal of the game against the Buckeyes.

Anor, who finished the 2009 season third on the team in scoring recorded his first goal of the year on Sept. 7 vs. Stony Brook ... The score came on the Bulls' second penalty shot of the season ... Anor was taken down driving to the net in the 73rd minute of play and awarded the chance ... He buried the shot past Seawolves keeper Danny Bonomini to give USF a 2-0 lead.

WITH ATTINELLA ... JUST BELIEVE THE HYPE

Senior goalkeeper Jeff Attinella has followed his All-America year of 2009 showing that his successes of last season were no fluke and that he is arguably the best net minder in the nation this year ... Attinella recorded three straight shutouts this season - against Saint Louis (T, 0-0) on Sept. 4, Stony Brook (W, 2-0) on Sept. 7, and Virginia Tech (W, 0-0) on Sept. 10 - before the streak was snapped against No. 6 Ohio State on Sept. 16 ... Attinella has since started a new streak shutting out Drexel on Sept. 18 in a scoreless tie.

Attinella came into the Ohio State match on Sept. 16 having not allowed a goal in 300 minutes of action ... That stretch continued until the 18 minute mark of the game with the Buckeyes when Chris Hegngi got past Attinella ending the streak at 318 straight minutes ... ANOTHER QUICK HIT FOR CHIN

For the second time this season Shawn Chin has helped lead the charge out of the gate quickly with a goal scored in the first eight minutes of play ... On Sept. 16, against No. 9 Ohio State, Chin buried the ball into the back of the net beating Buckeyes keeper Matt Lampson in the seventh minute of play and giving the Bulls a 1-0 lead.

In the first home match, after USF had its nation-best 30-game home unbeaten streak snapped against Florida Gulf Coast, Chin wasted no time in trying to help the Bulls get off on the right foot in starting a new streak against Stony Brook on Sept. 7 ... After a Seawolves foul, Chin took a free kick from approximately 30 yards out on the far left side of the field (near the Stony Brook bench) ... Chin would bend the ball left around the Seawolves wall and short hopped it past Stony Brook goalkeeper Danny Bonomini and into the net - just 1:16 into the match - for his first goal of the season.

Chin continues his hot play as he comes into the Connecticut game on Saturday ... In the Bulls' matches against Stony Brook (Sept. 7) and Virginia Tech (Sept. 10), Chin recorded the game winning goals in each contest.

This year, Chin is second on the team in scoring, just behind teammate Bernardo Anor, with six points (3G-0A) in six games ... He had his three-game goal scoring streak snapped against Drexel on Sept. 18

Last season Chin recorded two points (1G-0A) in 13 matches ... His lone goal of 2009 came against Virginia Tech on Sept. 11, the game winner for USF against the Hokies.

OLALI RECORDS FIRST CAREER GOAL

USF sophomore forward Kevin Olali scored the Bulls' only goal of the night, and the first of his career, in USF's 2-1 loss to Florida Gulf Coast on Sept. 1 ... Coming into the 2010 season, Olali has recorded just two points on two assists last year against Villanova, on Oct. 24, and No. 21 Notre Dame on Nov. 8.

Olali logged his first career goal in the game in which he also made his first career start.

WIXTED RECORDS FIRST CAREER GOAL

Freshman midfielder Shane Wixted had a memorable night in his first career start ... The Melbourne Beach, Fla., native logged his first career goal on Sept. 10 on national television in the Bulls' win over Virginia Tech ... Wixted took a rebound off the left post - off a Bernardo Anor miss - and buried it home from three yards out in the 81st minute against the Hokies.

Wixted has played in all six matches this season for USF with his first career start coming against Virginia Tech ... He comes into the Connecticut match tied for fourth in scoring with two points.

KIEFER CLOSES IN ON THE CENTURY MARK

USF head coach George Kiefer comes into the Connecticut match with an impressive 97-48-20 career coaching record and just three games shy of reaching the 100-win mark.

Kiefer's last two "milestone wins" - 80 and 90 - both came last season ... He logged his 80th career victory with a 2-1 win over UCF in the season opener on Sept. 1, and the 90th against Villanova in a 3-1 triumph on Oct. 24.

BULLS PERFECT ON PENALTY KICKS

In goal, All-America goalkeeper Jeff Attinella recorded 14 saves in the three exhibition games, including 10 against Akron.

Villanova is picked to finish fourth (65 points) while Rutgers is slated for fifth (64 points) and DePaul sixth (44 points) ... Syracuse and Cincinnati picked to finish in a tie for seventh with three points apiece.
