FOOTBALL FACES LOUISVILLE IN BIG EAST OPENER SATURDAY AT PAUL BROWN STADIUM

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati football team begins a challenging stretch Saturday, taking on USF at noon inside Raymond James Stadium in the first of four road games over the next five contests. The Bearcats have won four straight and sit at 5-1 (1-0 BIG EAST Conference) on the season, needing one win to gain bowl eligibility after not playing in the postseason a year ago. USF (4-2, 0-2 BIG EAST) has dropped two-straight league road games to Pittsburgh and Connecticut after a 4-0 non-conference start.

THE SERIES

- ▶ Saturday marks the ninth matchup between the Bulls and Bearcats. Prior to last year's 38-30 win by USF at Nippert Stadium, the Bearcats had won four straight in the series. In two games against the Bulls, QB Zach Collaros is 34-of-60 for 535 yards and three touchdowns along with 20 rushes for 159 yards and two touchdowns. In 2010, WR DJ Woods had nine grabs for 137 yards.

THE COACHES

- ▶ BUTCH JONES is in his second season at the helm of the UC program and is 9-9. Jones most recently led Central Michigan University to a pair of Mid-American Conference Championships and three-straight bowl appearances. He holds a 36-22 overall record and a 23-8 mark in league games.
- ▶ SKIP HOLTZ is in his second season at USF with a 12-7 record. In 12 years as a collegiate head coach with stops at Connecticut, East Carolina and USF, he holds an 84-58 career mark. He is 1-0 against the Bearcats as a head coach.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS ...

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati, one of the five oldest football programs in college football, is in its 124th football season with an all-time record of 555-551-51 (.502).
- ▶ Head coach Butch Jones is in his second season at the helm of the program, returning 16 starters, including nine on defense.
- ▶ UC also brought back the BIG EAST Conference's top returning passer (Zach Collaros), rusher (Isaiah Pead), tackler (JK Schaffer) and leader in all-purpose yards and receptions (DJ Woods) along with 51 letterwinners from the 2010 squad.
- ▶ With its 5-1 record, UC has surpassed its 2010 win total (4).
- ▶ UC enters the week leading the BIG EAST in scoring offense (41.7), rushing defense (70.7), punting (39.9) and fewest penalties (36.7) while ranking second in scoring defense (16.5), pass efficiency (143.8), rushing offense (213.7), interceptions (10), kickoff coverage (45.0), field goals (0.8), 3rd-down conversions (46.2), opponent 3rd-down conversions (32.6), 4th-down conversions (50.0) and turnover margin (2.0).
- ▶ UC's defense has not allowed an offensive touchdown in nine quarters and its last three opponents are averaging 14 yards rushing per game.
- ▶ The Bearcats are +12 overall in turnover margin and are averaging 2.0 tpg which ranks second in the FBS behind Rutgers (2.2).
- ▶ UC's 10 interceptions, which surpasses its total number of eight picks in 2010, ranks tied for 11th in the FBS.
- ▶ UC has outscored its opponents 141-51 in the first half this season, despite being held to only 13 first-half points in the last two games.
- ▶ UC's 27-0 win over Miami was its first shutout since Sept. 2, 2006.
- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead was named BIG EAST Offensive POTW after rushing for 151 yards and a TD against UofL. He is averaging a BIG EAST leading 6.8 yards per carry (sixth nationally) and has scored at least one TD in each of UC's six games.
- ▶ DT Derek Wolfe had a career-best 11 tackles against UofL and leads the BIG EAST in both sacks (0.8) and tackles for a loss (1.7).
- ▶ QB Zach Collaros (5,525) recently became the fifth UC signal caller to crack the 5,000-passing yards plateau.
- ▶ LB JK Schaffer leads the defense with 46 tackles, four pass break ups and three interceptions.
- ▶ P Pat O'Donnell leads the league in punting, averaging 44.1 yards per kick. He has six punts of 50 or more yards and has dropped 11 inside the 20-yard line.

UC WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

The Bearcats hold a weekly media luncheon each Tuesday in the second floor Bob Goin Team Room of Richard E. Lindner Center. Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., selected players are available for one-on-one interviews from 11:45-12:15, and head coach Butch Jones takes the podium at 12:15.

PRACTICES

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on either Tuesday or Wednesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact UC Sports Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regular-season practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching, warm ups and the first 20 minutes (four periods). At the conclusion of practice, head coach Butch Jones will address the media on the field. First-

year players, including freshmen and transfers, will be made available to the media only after they have made a significant contribution or at the coach's discretion.

WEB VIDEO CONTENT

Per UC's multimedia contract with IMG College, UC coaches, players, and administrators are not permitted to take part in one-on-one interviews or feature stories that will be made available exclusively for internet distribution.

PEAD EARNS BIG EAST WEEKLY HONORS

- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead was named the BIG EAST Conference Offensive Player of the Week and the Rivals.com BE POTW.
- ▶ Pead rushed for 153 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries in a 25-16 win against Louisville, the Bearcats' BIG EAST opener.
- ▶ Pead keyed Cincinnati's comeback from a 16-7 halftime deficit by breaking free for a 50-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter that gave the Bearcats the lead for good.
- ▶ Pead has rushed for 624 yards and eight touchdowns this season and ranks second in the BIG EAST in rushing at 104.0 yards per game.
- ▶ Pead's 6.78 yards per carry leads the BIG EAST and ranks sixth nationally among backs who have 10 carries per game.
- ▶ His career mark of 6.63 yards per rush ranks third among active NCAA FBS players.

HOLDING THE LINE

- ▶ UC's defense has not allowed an offensive touchdown in nine quarters and its last three opponents are averaging 14 yards rushing per game.

- ▶ The Bearcats limited Louisville to 70 rushing yards and have held their last three opponents to a combined 41 yards.
- ▶ UC limited Miami (Ohio) to minus-3 yards and N.C. State to minus-26 yards.

SECOND HALF ADJUSTMENTS

- ▶ UC has outscored its opponents 59-7 in the second half during the last three games. The Bearcats have outscored their last two foes 39-0 in the second stanza, including a 21-0 margin against Miami (Ohio) and an 18-0 margin against Louisville.

WRAPPING UP THE KEG OF NAILS

- ▶ Cincinnati's 25-16 win over Louisville marked the first Bearcats victory after trailing after three quarters since their 45-44 win at Pittsburgh on Dec. 5, 2009.
- ▶ The Bearcats have won the last four meetings against the Cardinals for the Keg of Nails, the rivalry's traveling trophy.

PAUL BROWN STADIUM NUGGETS

- ▶ Attendance for the UC-UofL game was 40,971 at Paul Brown Stadium, the third-highest attendance figure at a UC home football game in school history behind Ohio State (66,319) on Sept. 21, 2002 and Oklahoma (58,253) on Sept. 25, 2010.
- ▶ The 25-16 come-from-behind win over the Cardinals was UC's first at PBS, moving its all-time record to 1-2 in the downtown venue, home to the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals.
- ▶ The Bearcats dropped a 31-29 thriller to then-No. 8 Oklahoma on Sept. 25, 2010 and a 23-19 decision to then-No. 6 Ohio State on Sept. 25, 2010.

LONG TIME BETWEEN TWO POINT CONVERSIONS

- ▶ QB Zach Collaros found TE Adrian Robinson in the end zone for the two-point conversion to give UC a 22-16 lead against UofL.
- ▶ It was UC's first two-point conversion since Dec. 5, 2009 at Pittsburgh, a span of 18 games.

MITCH'S MISSION

- ▶ The Bearcats adopted Mitch Stone, a 13-year old brain cancer patient, through the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation in 2009.
- ▶ Mitch, a Cincinnati native who attends Nagel Middle School, was diagnosed with a primitive neuroectodermal brain tumor (PNET) in Feb. 2009.
- ▶ He underwent surgery to remove the tumor, four bouts of chemotherapy, and 31 radiation treatments.
- ▶ Mitch has been cancer free since November of 2009.
- ▶ The Stone family has dubbed his battle Mitch's Mission.
- ▶ Mitch has attended numerous games and practices, and has led the team out of the tunnel on three occasions.
- ▶ Student-athletes, coaches, and support staff wear red white and blue wrist bands that say 'Mitch's Mission.'
- ▶ UC was the first NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision team to adopt a child through FOJ.
- ▶ In December of 2009, Mitch started 'Mitch's Mission', a non-profit organization that raises funds to send children with cancer and blood diseases to summer camp.

2011 CINCINNATI FOOTBALL

TRACKING #23

- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead's 151 yard performance against Louisville was his third 100-yard rushing game of the season and eighth for his career.
- ▶ In two games at Paul Brown Stadium, he has compiled 320 rushing yards on 41 carries and one touchdown (7.8 ypc).
- ▶ He ran 21 times for 169 yards against Oklahoma last year at PBS.
- ▶ Pead's rushing TD against the Cardinals gave him 23 career rushing scores to grab sole possession of fifth place on the UC charts, moving past Bob Heuck (1910-12) who ran for 22.
- ▶ His eight career 100-yard rushing games ranks eighth in school history.

COLLAROS MOVING UP THE CHARTS

- ▶ QB Zach Collaros was 18-of-26 for 152 yards and a TD against UofL. He also ran 13 times for 41 yards and a TD.
- ▶ He is tied for fourth on the UC career pass completions list with Tony Pike (2007-09) at 421.
- ▶ Collaros climbed into sixth place on the career pass attempts list with 670, passing Dustin Grutza (2005-08) at 646; Greg Cook (1966-68) at 655 and Danny Barrett (1980-82) at 658.
- ▶ He has four rushing TDs on the season and 12 in his career.

KEEP SENDING THE WOLFE

- ▶ DT Derek Wolfe recorded a career-high 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss and a sack against Louisville earning a spot on the BIG EAST Conference weekly honor roll.
- ▶ His 15th career sack moves him into a tie with Derrick Ransom (1994-97) for ninth-place all-time.
- ▶ He leads the BIG EAST in both sacks (0.8) and tackles for a loss (1.7).

CONSISTENCY IN THE MIDDLE

- ▶ LB JK Schaffer registered 11 tackles, two tackles for loss, a sack and a pass break up in the win over Louisville.
- ▶ The senior ranks among the BIG EAST leaders in tackles (t-6/7.7), passes defended (t-2/1.2) and interceptions (t-2/0.5).

WOODS CLIMBING THE SCORING LISTS

- ▶ WR DJ Woods moved into a four-way tie for seventh place at UC in career touchdown receptions with 14.
- ▶ He caught a 26-yard strike from QB Zach Collaros in the second quarter vs. UofL to record his second TD of the season.

WOODS CLIMBING THE SCORING LISTS

- ▶ DB Dominique Battle recorded his second interception of the season and the fourth of his career when he picked off a Teddy Bridgewater pass at 10:47 of the third quarter vs. UofL.
- ▶ Battle missed all but three games of the 2010 season after suffering a knee injury against Oklahoma.

FILLING THE VOID

- ▶ Freshman OL Eric Lefeld made his first collegiate start against Louisville at right tackle, spelling an injured Sean Hooley.
- ▶ It marked the first time in six games in 2011 UC did not start the same combination of offensive linemen.

TURNING THEM OVER

- ▶ UC ranks fifth in the NCAA FBS with 19 turnovers gained.
- ▶ The Bearcats have 10 interceptions and nine fumble recoveries over four interceptions and three fumbles lost.
- ▶ UC's number of TOs gained in 2010 was 13.
- ▶ The Bearcats are +12 overall in turnover margin and are

averaging 2.0 turnovers per game which ranks second in the FBS behind Rutgers (2.2).

- ▶ UC's nine interceptions, which surpasses its total number of eight picks in 2010, ranks tied for eighth in the FBS.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

- ▶ Through six games in 2011, the Bearcats sit at +12 (2.0 tpg) in turnover margin, ranking second in the NCAA FBS.
- ▶ In 2010, UC did not have its 13th takeaway until the season finale against Pittsburgh on Dec. 4, 2010 and only had 14 takeaways the entire season.
- ▶ UC's turnover struggles of a year ago have been well documented with 14 fumbles lost and 15 interceptions thrown.
- ▶ UC's interceptions (8) and sacks (27) from 2010 were its lowest totals since 2005 (7 interceptions, 24 sacks).

SMALLER STORY, BUT I'M SURE YOU'RE FOLLOWING IT

- ▶ Punter Pat O'Donnell kicked a 41-yard punt to pin Louisville on its own 1-yard line at 8:19 in the second quarter.
- ▶ Eleven of his punts have been downed inside the 20-yard line this season and six are boots of 50 yards or more.
- ▶ O'Donnell leads the BIG EAST in net punting, averaging 44.1 yards per punt.

THE RARE GOOSE EGG

- ▶ The 27-0 decision over Miami (OH) marked UC's first shutout since a 31-0 win over Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 2, 2006.
- ▶ It's the first UC shutout in the series since Sept. 25, 1976 (UC W, 17-0) and the first UC shutout of MU in Oxford since 1898.
- ▶ Its was UC's first shutout over an NCAA FBS team and its last shutout on the road was a 16-0 win at Virginia Tech on Sept. 16, 1995.

DING DING

- ▶ UC defeated Miami (OH) for the sixth straight year, marking the first time in the 116-year old series a team had won six consecutive games over another.

ALL THEY NEED IS A PLACE TO STAND

- ▶ On the opening drive of the third quarter, Miami (OH) had a 66-yard pass play from Zac Dysert to Nick Harwell which put the ball on the UC one-yard line.
- ▶ With their backs against the wall, the Bearcats defense held and MU missed a 34-yard field goal attempt.
- ▶ Four plays later, UC scored to take a 13-0 lead.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES FOR COLLAROS

- ▶ QB Zach Collaros was 8-of-17 for 82 yards a touchdown and an interception in the first half against Miami (OH).
- ▶ He was 8-of-13 for 169 yards in the second half.
- ▶ He finished 16-of-30 for 251 yards, one TD and one INT.
- ▶ Collaros rushed eight times for 66 yards in the first half and finished with a season-high 89 yards on the ground.
- ▶ His 72-yard toss to TE Adrian Robinson was UC's longest passing play and longest play from scrimmage this season.

- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead rushed 18 times for 49 yards and two touchdowns against Miami (OH).
- ▶ Pead had a 3-yard TD scamper in the third quarter, his sixth rushing TD of the year.

TIGHT ENDS GETTING INVOLVED

- ▶ UC's tight ends Travis Kelce and Adrien Robinson are certainly making the most of their opportunities in 2011.
- ▶ Kelce got UC on the board against Miami (OH) with a 30-yard touchdown strike from Collaros with 6:08 left in the second quarter.
- ▶ It was his first career touchdown reception and his third career touchdown (2 rushing TDs in 2009).
- ▶ Robinson had a career-long 72-yard reception in the third quarter that set up UC's second TD.
- ▶ He caught the ball one handed around his shoelaces. The play was No. 2 on ESPN SportsCenter's Top-10 Plays of the Night.
- ▶ Robinson has four catches for 102 yards and two touchdowns on the year along with a two-point conversion.

ANYTHING THIS GUY CAN'T DO?

- ▶ LB JK Schaffer recovered a fumbled Miami punt snap and returned it 17 yards for the touchdown.
- ▶ It was the first touchdown of his career.
- ▶ Schaffer led the defense with seven stops, 2.5 tackles for a loss, a forced fumble and a sack.

STREAK ENDED

- ▶ K Tony Miliiano missed his first extra point attempt of the game at Miami (OH), snapping a streak of 21 straight PATs made.

DUO EARN BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- ▶ P Pat O'Donnell and LB J.K. Schaffer were named the BIG EAST Conference Special Teams and Defensive Player of the Week, respectively, following UC's 44-14 win over NC State.
- ▶ O'Donnell was pivotal in establishing field position against the Wolfpack, averaging 59.7 yards on three punts, pinning the NC State inside the 20 twice. The Wolfpack's average starting field position in the first half was its own 17-yard line, which helped the Bearcats build a 24-7 halftime lead.
- ▶ Schaffer had a team-high nine tackles with an interception to key the UC defense. His 16-yard interception return set up a Cincinnati scoring drive and helped the Bearcats take an early 21-0 lead.
- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead was named to the league's weekly honor roll. He rushed for a season-high 167 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries and had three receptions for 24 yards and a TD.

FIRST TIME'S THE CHARM

- ▶ Isaiah Pead has scored on his first carry in two of UC's first three games. Pead had a 40-yard touchdown run in the season-opener against Austin Peay and broke free for a 65-yard touchdown against Tennessee.
- ▶ He added a 1-yard TD scamper on UC's first drive against Akron, giving him three scores in three games on the ground on the Bearcats' opening drives.

HERE'S WHERE A NEGATIVE IS A POSITIVE

- ▶ The UC defense limited N.C. State to minus-26 yards rushing. It was the third-lowest rushing total for a UC opponent in school history and the fewest since allowing minus-37 yards

to Wichita State in 1974.

- ▶ The UC defense also recorded a season-high 17 tackles for loss to go along with five sacks.

THE BEST OFFENSE

- ▶ Cincinnati scored three defensive touchdowns in the Bearcats' 59-14 win against Akron, finding the end zone on two interception returns and a fumble return.
- ▶ After a forced fumble by Derek Wolfe, Maalik Bomar scooped the ball and returned it 54 yards for the score with 8:21 left in the first quarter.
- ▶ On the first play of the second quarter, Dominique Battle returned an interception 36 yards for a TD and Camerron Cheatham added a 53-yard pick six with 1:41 left in the first half to complete the touchdown trifecta.
- ▶ It marked UC's first fumble recovery ran for a touchdown since Angelo Craig returned a fumble recovery 16 yards for a score at Syracuse on Nov. 24, 2007.
- ▶ It also marked UC's first defensive touchdown since Brandon Underwood returned an interception 20 yards for a score at Hawaii on Dec. 6, 2008.
- ▶ It was the first time UC had two interception returns for touchdowns since a game against Memphis in 1998.
- ▶ Cincinnati is the first BIG EAST team to score three defensive touchdowns since Miami did it in a 41-10 win against West Virginia Sept. 23, 2000.

NIPPERT STADIUM - IN 3D

- ▶ The UC-NC State game was a part of Blackout night at Nippert Stadium and was televised by ESPN and ESPN3D.
- ▶ It marked the first football game in BIG EAST Conference history televised on ESPN3D.
- ▶ UC moved to 4-1 in ESPN Thursday Night primetime games.

GOING STREAKING

- ▶ UC has won 21 consecutive home non-conference games at Nippert Stadium, dating back to a three-overtime, 30-24 win over Temple on Sept. 20, 2003.

YOU GIVETH, WE TAKETH

- ▶ In a season-long trend, UC continues to take advantage of opponent turnovers.
- ▶ UC has scored 94 points off 19 opponent turnovers (13 touchdowns and one field goal) this season.
- ▶ UC has scored on 14 of 19 forced turnovers.

NIPPERT DOMINANCE

- ▶ The Bearcats have outscored their opponents 175-38 at Nippert Stadium this season.
- ▶ UC also has outscored its opponents 48-0 in the first quarter and 114-7 in the first half at home.

SPEAKING OF NIPPERT

- ▶ Following the 44-14 win over NC State inside Nippert Stadium on Sept. 22, UC will go for 71 days without playing at Nippert.
- ▶ UC's next two home games against Louisville (10/15) and West Virginia (11/12) will take place at Paul Brown Stadium.

DUAL-THREAT QUARTERBACK

- ▶ UC quarterback Zach Collaros completed 25-of-34 pass attempts for 263 yards and two touchdowns against NC State while also running for a season-high 52 yards and two

touchdowns.

- ▶ Collaros' two rushing TDs against the Wolfpack – a 14-yard run at 4:07 in the first quarter and a 10-yard run at 11:52 in the second quarter, gave him 11 for his career.
- ▶ It marked the third-time during his career he has recorded two rushing touchdowns in a game (Connecticut on Nov. 7, 2009 and at South Florida on Oct. 15, 2009).
- ▶ He had his first interception of the season with UC driving inside the Wolfpack red zone in the second quarter. It was Collaros' first interception in 86 pass attempts this season.

A GOOD NIGHT'S WORK FOR PEAD

- ▶ Isaiah Pead rushed 27 times for 167 yards and caught a touchdown pass against the Wolfpack.
- ▶ He earned his second 100-yard rushing performance of the season and the seventh of his career.
- ▶ Caught a 25-yard touchdown reception from Collaros at 7:16 in the third quarter to give the Bearcats a 34-7 lead. It was Pead's first touchdown reception of the season and the fourth of his career.
- ▶ In two games against BCS AQ conference opponents Pead has total 322 yards on 41 carries for an average of 7.9 yards per run.

ON THE JOB TRAINING

- ▶ Placekicker Tony Miliano converted a single-game high three field goals and made all five PATs against the Wolfpack.
- ▶ He converted a career-long 48-yard field goal at 12:51 in the third quarter.

I DUB THEE THUNDERFOOT

- ▶ UC punter Pat O'Donnell booted the second-longest punt in school history when he kicked a 76-yard punt at 11:39 in the first quarter of the NC State game.
- ▶ It was two yards shy of tying the school record of 78 yards, held by Mike Connell against Louisiana-Lafayette in 1976.
- ▶ O'Donnell finished with three punts for 179 yards and a 59.7 yard average. Two of his punts were downed inside the 20-yard line.

SETTING THE TABLE

- ▶ WR Ralph David Abernathy IV, a true freshman, returned the season's opening kickoff 60 yards in his first-career return.
- ▶ In 2010, UC did not have a kickoff return of more than 40 yards until the 10th game of the season and did not record a return of 50 yards or more.
- ▶ He ranks second in the BIG EAST and ranks 33rd nationally with a 25.3yards per return average.

KEEP AN EYE ON THIS ONE

- ▶ RB Jameel Poteat earned his first career rushing touchdown, a seven-yard run, at 14:26 in the fourth quarter against Akron, to give UC a 59-0 lead.
- ▶ Poteat recorded 10 rushes for 55 yards – both career highs – including his first collegiate touchdown, a seven-yard run, at 14:26 in the fourth quarter.

FRESHMAN MAKING HIS MARK

- ▶ LB Clemente Casseus led the Bearcats defense against Akron with a career-best five tackles, including one tackle for loss.
- ▶ The true freshman walk on joined UC in early August and earned his spot during training camp.

CHEATHAM IMPACTFUL

- ▶ DB Camerron Cheatham earned his first interception of the season and the second of his career against Akron when he picked off a Clayton Moore pass and returned it 53 yards for a touchdown at 1:41 in the second quarter.
- ▶ At Tennessee, Cheatham finished with a career best nine tackles and he ranks second on the team and first among the UC defensive backs with 23 stops this season.

DRANE COMING ON

- ▶ DB Deven Drane earned his first career interception against Akron after picking off a Clayton Moore pass at 10:38 in the third quarter.
- ▶ Drane had his second career interception in the fourth quarter at Miami (OH).
- ▶ He returned it for 43 yards, a career-best interception return.
- ▶ He has seven tackles on the year, along with six passes defended, five pass break ups and a fumble recovery.

STEADY IN THE BACK

- ▶ DBs Drew Frey and Wesley Richardson rank fourth and fifth on the squad with 29 and 28 tackles, respectively.
- ▶ Frey has an interception, four passes defended and three pass break ups to his credit while Richardson tallied his first career forced fumble against NC State.

A STRONG OPENING ACT

- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead opened up the 2011 season with a bang, scampering 40 yards for a touchdown on the Bearcats' first play from scrimmage.
- ▶ He recorded his second touchdown of the day six minutes later on a 13-yard rush.
- ▶ Pead finished the night with seven carries for 88 yards, an average of 12.4 yards per carry.
- ▶ He was the top returning running back in the BIG EAST Conference entering the season and led the league and ranked in the Top-10 nationally in yards per carry.

BALANCING IT OUT

- ▶ Spend five minutes with any head coach and you will likely hear the words offensive balance.
- ▶ In 2011, UC has run 409 offensive plays with 242 (60%) rushes and 167 (40%) pass attempts.
- ▶ The Bearcats' 213.7 rushing yards per game is second in the BIG EAST while the 421.7 yards of total offense ranks third.
- ▶ UC is averaging 41.7 points per game which ranks 11th in the NCAA FBS while leading the BIG EAST.
- ▶ A year ago, when UC led the BIG EAST in total offense (417.3 ypg) the run pass split was 52% passing to 48% rushing.

AKRON QUICKIES

- ▶ The Bearcats improved to 4-2 all-time against Akron, including a 3-1 mark in Cincinnati. UC head coach Butch Jones moves to 3-0 all-time against the Zips.
- ▶ Cincinnati grabbed four interceptions and forced two fumbles against Akron. The Bearcats returned one fumble for a score and two interceptions for touchdowns – all in the first half.
- ▶ The Bearcats' six forced turnovers, four interceptions and 103 interception return yards are the most for UC since forcing seven against Oregon State on Sept. 6, 2007.
- ▶ Cincinnati's 49 points in the first half were its most points in the first half since leading Southeast Missouri State 49-3 at halftime on Sept. 12, 2009.

- ▶ UC has won 21 straight home non-conference games at Nippert Stadium, dating back to a 30-24 win over Temple in three overtimes on Sept. 20, 2003.
- ▶ UC is 15-0 on the home turf in non-conference play since the 2007 season.

SELLOUTS AT NIPPERT

- ▶ Including the 2010 campaign, Nippert Stadium has enjoyed a total of 21 sellouts in its lengthy history.
- ▶ Four of UC's six home games in 2009 were sellouts.

NIPPERT STADIUM

- ▶ Construction began on UC's home field, Nippert Stadium in 1916 and was completed in 1923.
- ▶ UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1902, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- ▶ Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium, which was built in 1917.
- ▶ Head coach Butch Jones calls Nippert the 'Wrigley Field' of college football.

GOING STREAKING

- ▶ UC had a 14-game Nippert Stadium winning streak snapped in 2010 against USF. The streak dated back to the 2008 season.
- ▶ Spanning the 2008-09 seasons and the first two home games at Nippert in 2010 (UC played Oklahoma at Paul Brown Stadium), marked the first time in UC history the Bearcats went undefeated at home in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ The school-record streak of 15-straight wins was set during a span from Nov. 8, 1952-Nov. 13, 1954.
- ▶ Ten of the Top 12 crowds in Nippert history, including a stadium record of 35,106 against Illinois in 2009, have occurred since 2007.
- ▶ Since 2007, UC has set four-straight attendance records and over 800,000 fans (853,281) have come through the Nippert and Paul Brown Stadium turnstiles.

CHARTING THE NON-CONFERENCE OFFENSE

COMPARING THE OFFENSE - NON-CONFERENCE PLAY (FROM THE PDJ FILES)

- ▶ Through five non-conference games, UC has shown great offensive balance with 1,104 yards rushing and 1,096 yards passing, an average of 440.0 yards per game.
- ▶ It's 1,104 rushing yards are the team's most in non-league play over the past five seasons.

LOOKING BACK AT ROCKY TOP

- ▶ The attendance at Neyland Stadium was 94,207, marking the largest crowd UC has played in front of since playing in front of 84,476 at Oklahoma on Sept. 6, 2008.
- ▶ Dominique Battle started at defensive back instead of Deven Drane. It was Battle's first appearance of the 2011 season and his first start since suffering a season-ending knee injury against Oklahoma on Sept. 25, 2010.
- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead carried five times in the first quarter for 104 yards and a touchdown, an average of 20.8 yards per carry.
- ▶ QB Zach Collaros completed his first six passes of the game.
- ▶ Collaros completed a 13-yard touchdown pass to TE Adrien Robinson. It was Robinson's third career touchdown, the first TD for a UC tight end in 2011 and Robinson's first TD since the Oklahoma game on Sept. 25, 2010.
- ▶ WR DJ Woods tallied nine catches for 111 yards, the fifth 100-yard receiving game of his career.

MILESTONE ANNIVERSARY

- ▶ Former UC kicker Henk Hartong, who kicked the first soccer style field goal 50 years ago this season, served as an honorary captain for the NC State game.

POTENT POTPOURRI FROM THE OPENER

- ▶ The Bearcats moved to 77-38-10 in home openers.
- ▶ Cincinnati's 72-10 win was its largest margin of victory since it defeated Southeast Missouri State, 70-3, on Sept. 12, 2009.
- ▶ UC's 72 points were its most since it beat Kentucky Wesleyan, 115-0, on Oct. 22, 1921.
- ▶ Cincinnati's 41 points in the first half was its most in one half since Nov. 20, 2010 against Rutgers.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT

- ▶ UC opened the Austin Peay game with an 18-second one-play scoring drive, when RB Isaiah Pead ran for 40 yards, which was its quickest drive since Oct. 9, 2010 against Miami (OH), when Pead recorded a touchdown on a career-long 80-yard rush in 13 seconds.
- ▶ The Bearcats had a 14-play, 95-yard scoring drive to start the second quarter, which was their longest under second-year head coach Butch Jones.

GROUND POUNDING

- ▶ UC had 71 offensive plays in the season opener against Austin Peay and ran the ball on 69 percent of those (49/71).
- ▶ The Bearcats 49 carries were split among 12 players.
- ▶ Six of the Bearcats' 10 touchdowns came on running plays.
- ▶ The Bearcats 387 rushing yards were their most since they ran for 389 yards against Xavier in 1946.
- ▶ It marked the fourth time in the Butch Jones era UC has

rushed 40 or more times and the team's most rushing attempts since they rushed 55 times against Eastern Michigan in 2005.

HOFFMAN A VERSATILE CHOICE

- ▶ Senior offensive lineman Alex Hoffman leads the offense with his 31 career starts.
- ▶ What makes that note unique is that Hoffman, now the starter at left tackle, is at his third different starting position and fourth slot overall in three years.
- ▶ As a sophomore, he was an All-BIG EAST right guard, and last year he started at right tackle. He has also played left guard.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- ▶ UC will feature something new in 2011 as the team will have two season-long captains for the first time since 2006.
- ▶ Senior quarterback Zach Collaros and senior linebacker J.K. Schaffer were unanimous selections by the team as UC's permanent captains for the 2011 season.
- ▶ The team will elect two additional captains for each game.
- ▶ For the opener, that honor went to OL Alex Hoffman and WR OJ Woodard along with Collaros and Schaffer.
- ▶ Kenbrell Thompkins and John Hughes were selected at UT.
- ▶ Randy Martinez and DJ Woods had the honor against Akron.
- ▶ For the NC State game, it was Isaiah Pead and Walt Stewart.
- ▶ Camerron Cheatham and Evan Davis had the Miami game.
- ▶ Isaiah Pead and Derek Wolfe took the UofL honor.

OFFENSE COMES OUT HOT

- ▶ Cincinnati's offense was clicking on all cylinders in the Bearcats' 72-10 win against Austin Peay.
- ▶ UC had 12 offensive possessions, scored touchdowns on 10 of them, had a field goal on another, and was stopped on downs on its lone non-scoring drive.
- ▶ The Bearcats' scoring drives ranged from a one-play, 40-yard drive to a 14-play, 95-yard possession that started the second quarter.

YOUNGSTERS MAKING DEBUTS

- ▶ Twenty six student-athletes made their first appearance in the season opener for UC, including eight true freshmen, eight redshirt freshmen, six transfers and four others.
- ▶ Eight true freshman played in the opener, marking their first collegiate action, including: WR Ralph David Abernathy IV, LB Clemente Casseus, WR Alex Chisum, LB Dwight Jackson, RB Jameel Poteat, RB Akise Teague, LB Nick Temple, and WR Shaq Washington.
- ▶ Eight redshirt freshman played for the first time, including: Demetri Beal, Camaron Beard, Brad Harrah, Eric Lefeld, Dyjuan Lewis, Corey Mason, Tony Miliano, Solomon Tentman,

2011 CINCINNATI FOOTBALL

- ▶ Junior college transfers Damon Julian, Malcolm Murray and Kenbrell Thompkins all played in their first collegiate game.
- ▶ Transfers Jordan Luallen, Ben Pooler and Shane Popham all saw their first action in the Red and Black.
- ▶ Other first-timers included: Adam Dempsey, Anthony King, Sean McClellan, Dan Sprague

THE ALL-NAME TEAM

- ▶ UC sophomore quarterback Munchie Legaux and freshman defensive lineman Silverberry Mouhon were two of 25 players named to CNBC sports business reporter Darren Rovell's 2011 College Football All-Name Team.

YOUTH MOVEMENT 2011

- ▶ After featuring only 12 seniors a year ago, UC has 20 in the 2011 class.
- ▶ UC starts five seniors on defense after having the nation's youngest BCS defense a year ago.
- ▶ Over half of UC's roster, 57 of UC's 105 players (18 sophomores, 39 freshmen), are at a sophomore level or below.

CRANKING OUT THE YARDAGE

- ▶ UC surpassed 600 yards of total offense twice in 2010, with a season high 661 coming against Rutgers and 609 yards against Miami (OH).
- ▶ UC produced 567 yards of total offense in the 2011 opener against Austin Peay.
- ▶ Over a six-game span, UC averaged 478.5 yards of total offense, 32.7 points per game, 184.0 yards rushing and 294.5 yards passing along with 16 passing touchdowns and 10 rushing scores.

KELCE RETURNS

- ▶ TE Travis Kelce returned to the lineup in 2011 after sitting out 2010 due to a violation of team rules.
- ▶ His older brother Jason, a four-year standout on the offensive line, was drafted by Philadelphia and earned the starting center role for the Eagles.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati football team achieved an all-time team record with its 2.9 team grade point average in the recently ended 2011 Winter Academic Quarter.
- ▶ The team GPA, reflecting 83 student-athletes enrolled in classes, is an all-time high for the Bearcats football program.
- ▶ Thirty-eight of the 83 players (46 percent) achieved a 3.0 or better for the quarter, while 11 student-athletes ranked between a 3.5 and 4.0.
- ▶ Defensive lineman Eric Lefeld (Coldwater, Ohio/Coldwater) took home top GPA honors with his 3.956.
- ▶ Since Coach Jones' arrival in the winter of 2009, the team GPA

has stayed consistently above a 2.7.

- ▶ In 2010, 19 student-athletes were named Academic All-BIG EAST and John Goebel (Milford, Mich./Brother Rice) earned the 2010 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year award.
- ▶ UC was awarded the 2011 BIG EAST Academic Excellence Award, recognizing the top team GPA among the league's eight football schools.

NOTING THE SIGNING CLASS

- ▶ Of UC's 30-member signing class, six were state champions (Chisum, Jackson, Moore, Phillips, Teague, Washington), two were four-star recruits (Murray, Poteat), 21 were three-star recruits, three hail from the City of Cincinnati (Coyne, Mitchell, Murray), and two were Mr. Football Award Winners in their respective states (Teague-Ohio, Temple-Ind.).

FAMILY LEGACY

- ▶ Freshman running back Ralph David Abernathy IV has a family name that should ring a historical bell.
- ▶ Abernathy's late grandfather, Ralph Jr., was a leader in the American Civil Rights Movement, a minister and a close friend of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
- ▶ His father, Ralph III is a former Georgia State Senator.

THE FOOTBALL FAMILY

- ▶ UC true freshman quarterback Stephen Weatherford, one of nine children, is the fifth Weatherford brother to play college football.
- ▶ His brother Will, who was elected in 2006 to the Florida House of Representatives and is slated to become Speaker of the House in 2012, played football at Jacksonville University.
- ▶ Brother Drew started 33 games at quarterback at Florida State.
- ▶ Brothers Joe (QB) and John (LB) play at West Georgia.
- ▶ His grandfather, Bill Weatherford, played football at SMU in the same backfield with the legendary Doak Walker.
- ▶ His father Bill, also played football at SMU as a quarterback.

MORRISON ALREADY A RECORD HOLDER?

- ▶ Freshman wide receiver Max Morrison hauled in 289 catches during his high school career for 4,147 yards and 56 touchdowns.
- ▶ Those numbers would top the UC all-time record for receptions (Gilyard/Goodman/Vann: 204), reception yards (Gilyard: 3,003) and receiving touchdowns (Gilyard: 25).
- ▶ Morrison also has a UC historical tie as his late grandfather Joe played halfback, quarterback and defense at UC from 1956-58 before playing in the NFL for the New York Giants and later serving as the head coach at the University of South Carolina.
- ▶ Morrison's father Rick was a wide receiver at Ball State and his uncle is former University of Michigan head coach Gary Moeller.

ANOTHER OUTSTANDING RECEIVER IN THE MAKING

- ▶ True freshman WR Alex Chisum is yet another record-setting member of UC's 2011 signing class.
- ▶ Chisum helped lead Sandy Creek HS to a 15-0 season and a GHSAA 4-AAA State Championship in 2010.
- ▶ He caught 69 passes for 1,426 yards and 11 touchdowns, breaking three of former Sandy Creek and now NFL standout Calvin Johnson's school records Chisum was named the Georgia Coaches AAA State Offensive Player of the Year and a AAA First-Team All-State honoree.
- ▶ He also earned a spot on the 2010 U.S. Air Force Medium Schools All-American Team.

BEARCAT OLYMPICS

- ▶ When Head Coach Butch Jones arrived on the UC campus in January of 2010, he instituted the Bearcat Olympics.
- ▶ The program, which runs through the offseason, features players grouped into nine teams that compete in a number of activities, including academics, community service, and workouts.
- ▶ The culmination of the program's winter conditioning schedule, Night of Champions is one of the key components of the Bearcat Olympics.
- ▶ Each of the nine Bearcat Olympics teams competed in eight events at Night of Champions, including a bat relay, buddy relay, farmers walk, fast man relay, obstacle course, touchdown celebration, water balloon toss and bench press contest.

SIGMA SIGMA

- ▶ Two University of Cincinnati football players, Zach Collaros and JK Schaffer, hold the unique honor of being members of Sigma Sigma.
- ▶ A local honor fraternity, Sigma Sigma was founded in the summer of 1898 and lists its most important function as teaching loyalty to the University of Cincinnati.

CHANGING BODIES

- ▶ Director of football strength and conditioning Dave Lawson has led an overall change of body type for the Bearcats.
- ▶ Out are big and bulky lineman and in are the type of lean mass players who fit the Bearcats' spread offense.
- ▶ Two of the biggest benefactors of the change have been DE Walter Stewart and OL Andre Cureton.
- ▶ When he arrived at UC, Stewart was a 216-pound outside linebacker. Today he takes the field as a 245-pound def. end.
- ▶ Cureton went the opposite way, arriving at UC at 364 pounds. He suited up on opening day at 295 pounds. His loss of weight hasn't equaled a loss of power either as his squat, bench and power lifting numbers are all up.

DOUBLE DUTY

- ▶ UC radio play-by-play man Dan Hoard has added duties entering 2011 as the voice of the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals on the Bengals Radio Network.
- ▶ He joins Bill Hillgrove (Pittsburgh Panthers/Pittsburgh Steelers), Wes Durham (Georgia Tech/Atlanta Falcons), and Gene Deckerhoff (Florida State/Tampa Bay Buccaneers) as the only broadcasters in the country to handle radio duties for both an NCAA FBS and NFL team.

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- ▶ For the past 12 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- ▶ The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- ▶ Among many amenities, Higher Ground features a pair of 100-yard FieldTurf practice fields, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

OFF-CAMPUS TRAINING SITES

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati is one of seven schools who spend time at an off campus site during football training camp.
- ▶ The Bearcats 14-day stay at the Higher Ground Conference & Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind. ranks as the longest

visit among the six NCAA FBS schools this season.

- ▶ But is not the furthest camp distance from campus. That honor goes to UNLV, which travels yearly to Ely, Nev., a 248-mile trek from its Las Vegas, Nev. campus.

PASSING OUT PROMOTIONS

- ▶ UC head football trainer Bob Mangine was recently promoted to Associate AD/Sports Medicine.
- ▶ In his role, Mangine will continue to serve as the head trainer for football but will also oversee care and staffing for UC's entire sports medicine program.
- ▶ Mangine, who carries over 30 years of experience in the field, is in his 10th season with the football program.

NEW FACE ON THE COACHING STAFF

- ▶ TE coach Dave Johnson joined the UC staff in August.
- ▶ He brings 26 years of collegiate coaching experience along with 14 bowl game appearances. He has mentored 11 NFL players, four All-Americans and 28 all-conference selections.
- ▶ Prior to joining UC, Johnson was the offensive line coach at West Virginia University from 2008-10.
- ▶ He spent 2001-07 as the tight ends coach at the University of Georgia. The Bulldogs won 72 games, averaging more than 10 wins a season, three SEC East Division Championships, two SEC Championships, five bowl wins and five Top-10 national finishes during his time in Athens.
- ▶ Four of his tight ends, Randy McMichael, Ben Watson, Martez Milner and Leonard Pope are playing in the NFL.

EARNING THEIR STRIPES

- ▶ When newcomers take the practice field for the first time at Cincinnati, they find their helmets with a white stripe down the middle.
- ▶ The newcomer has to earn the right to have the white stripe removed, and it's the player's big brother calling the shots.
- ▶ As part of UC's peer intervention program, each newcomer is assigned a veteran on the team who as Coach Jones puts it, shows the newcomer how to 'Live the Bearcat Way.'
- ▶ Once the big brother feels his little brother has proven himself in practice and around the team, he brings him in front of the team following practice and removes the stripe from his helmet in front of the whole squad.
- ▶ The last two players to have their stripes removed this season were freshmen OL Parker Ehinger and Justin Murray.

SHEAKLEY ATHLETICS CENTER DEBUTS

- ▶ The Sheakley Athletics Center, which includes new practice fields for the Bearcats football team, made its long anticipated debut on Sept. 2, 2010.
- ▶ The ground breaking took place on March 16, 2010 for the project with an estimated construction cost of \$15.5 million.
- ▶ The first phase of construction, completed on Sept. 1, 2010, includes lighted 50- and 100-yard fields.

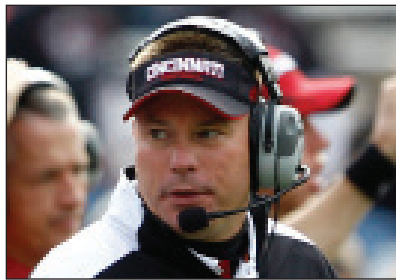

Butch Jones, named the head coach at the University of Cincinnati on Dec. 16, 2009, is in his second season with the Bearcats. Since arriving in Cincinnati, Jones has made an immediate impact, building a staff of championship-level coaches and teachers, as well as an atmosphere of competition and family, while also overseeing an academic program of great success. The team's GPA has stayed consistently at a 2.7 or above since Jones' arrival. In the winter 2010 quarter, 37 players achieved a GPA of 3.0 or above with 13 between a 3.5 and 4.0. Nineteen players were named Academic All-BIG EAST and John Goebel earned the 2010 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year award. UC was honored with the 2010-11 BIG EAST Team Academic Excellence Award.

In 2010, the Bearcats led the BIG EAST in scoring offense (27.1 ppg), total offense (417.3 ypg), passing offense (260.7 ypg), first downs (21.9 pg), third-down conversions (45.6 pct.) and touchdown passes (27). Wide receiver Armon Binns and quarterback Zach Collaros were both First-Team all-BIG EAST selections while five other teammates earned all-BIG EAST honors.

In four years as a collegiate head coach, Jones holds a 31-21 mark, a 22-8 record in conference play, three bowl appearances, and a pair of league championships.

Prior to leading the Bearcats, Jones spent three seasons at Central Michigan University, leading the Chippewas to a pair of Mid-American Conference Championships and three-straight bowl appearances from 2007-09.

At Central Michigan, Jones continued that program's renaissance, going 27-13 over the past three seasons, including a 22-3 mark in league games, winning a pair of MAC Championships (2007, 2009), playing in three-straight bowl games, and earning a postseason ranking of No. 23 in 2009. He is the only coach in CMU history to lead the team to consecutive bowl games and is the first in MAC history to do it in his first three seasons as head coach.

Jones coached 32 all-MAC performers, including two-time MAC Offensive Player of the Year and 2009 MAC Vern Smith Leadership Award winner Dan LeFevour, and two-time MAC Special Teams Player of the Year Antonio Brown. Under his tutelage, 13 student-athletes earned Academic all-MAC accolades.

LeFevour had an NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision Record 148 career touchdowns (101 passing, 46 rushing and one receiving). His 101 career passing TDs, are the most in MAC history.

CMU was 22-3 against MAC opponents during Jones' tenure, including victories in the 2007 and 2009 MAC Championship Games. The Chippewas were 12-1 in MAC road games under Jones and earned two-straight wins over Big Ten teams.

In 2007, Jones became only the ninth first-year head coach to lead his team to a Mid-American Conference championship. The Chippewas' eight victories marked the second-most of any CMU coach in his debut season, and Jones was one of three first-year head coaches nationwide to coach in a bowl game.

A native of Michigan and a former offensive coordinator at CMU, Jones returned to Mount Pleasant after spending the 2005 and 2006 seasons as an assistant coach under Rich Rodriguez at West Virginia University.

Jones spent a total of 11 seasons as an assistant at the Division I-A level. He served as the offensive coordinator at three different schools, spanning eight seasons, and worked directly with 24 all-conference selections in 15 years as a full-time position coach.

A 1990 graduate of Ferris State University where he was a two-year letterman on the football team, Jones broke into the coaching ranks while still an undergraduate by serving as intern for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 1987-89.

Jones, 42, and his wife Barb are the parents of three children: Alex, Adam, and Andrew.

CINCINNATI (AP) - Isaiah Pead ran for Cincinnati's first two touchdowns, and Zach Collaros threw for the next four—all in the first half—leading the Bearcats to a 72-10 victory over Austin Peay.

The Bearcats dominated, scoring the third-most points in their history. Cincinnati scored on six of its seven first-half possessions. Pead ran 40 yards for a touchdown on the Bearcats' first play. He also scored on a 13-yard run and finished with 87 yards.

Collaros, the Big East's top returning passer, played only the first half and was 12 of 19 for 134 yards. His 34-yard pass to D.J. Woods completed a 95-yard drive in the second quarter. Collaros also threw a pair of touchdown passes to Anthony McClung in the last 39 seconds of the first half for a 41-0 lead.

Their opener in head coach Butch Jones' second season was much better, though played in front of a crowd of 23,282. Last year, they went to Fresno State and got beat 28-14 in 94-degree heat, wearing down as the game went along. No such problems on Saturday in 93-degree weather against an overmatched opponent.

Cincinnati won the coin toss, and freshman Ralph David Abernathy IV returned the kickoff 60 yards. On the Bearcats' first play, Collaros handed off to Pead and threw a downfield block on safety Amius Smith, opening the way for the Big East's top returning runner to go 40 yards untouched.

The Bearcats had a 14-play, 95-yard drive in the second quarter that left the Governors' defense running on fumes. Collaros threw a 34-yard pass to D.J. Woods, who ran past cornerback Sheldon Wade to make the catch for a 27-0 lead.

Collaros threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to McClung with 39 seconds left, and Cincinnati recovered a fumble on the kickoff. Austin Peay dropped seven defenders into pass coverage, but Collaros found McClung wide open in the middle of the field for a 29-yard touchdown that made it 41-0.

Cincinnati went with its reserves in the second half.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - The University of Cincinnati football team fell to University of Tennessee 45-23 Saturday before a Neyland Stadium crowd of 94,207.

After Cincinnati tied the score 14-14 midway through the first quarter, Tennessee produced 21 straight points to build a lead the Bearcats were unable to overcome.

Cincinnati halfback Isaiah Pead rushed for 155 yards on 14 carries to lead the Bearcats attack. Senior quarterback Zach Collaros went 21-34 for 230 yards and two touchdowns. Senior receiver D.J. Woods had a team-high nine receptions for 111 yards. Junior receiver Kenbrell Thompkins, a one-time Volunteer signee, recorded career highs in catches (four) and receiving yards (58).

On the opening possession of the game, the Bearcats needed just three plays to score after Pead took his first carry down the right sideline for a 65-yard touchdown.

Tennessee responded with a seven-play scoring drive on their first possession, punctuated by a two-yard TD run by tailback Marlin Lane that tied the score 7-7 with 9:53 remaining in the first quarter.

Volunteers place kicker Michael Palardy recovered his own on-side kick on the ensuing kickoff to give Tennessee possession. Four plays later, Bray threw a 33-yard streak down the left sideline to sophomore receiver Justin Hunter for a touchdown.

Trailing 14-7, Cincinnati went on a five-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a Collaros touchdown pass to tight end Adrien Robinson, tying the score 14-14 with 6:38 left in the first quarter.

Cincinnati made the first defensive stop of the game after senior defensive back Dominique Battle forced Lane to fumble, which was recovered by UC linebacker Ben Pooler at the Bearcats 28-yard line. Cincinnati could not capitalize on the turnover and punted for the first time for either team on its third possession.

Through the first quarter both teams combined for 342 yards, including Pead's 104 yards rushing on five attempts, his sixth career 100-yard performance.

CINCINNATI - Following a stellar performance by the defense, the University of Cincinnati football team defeated Akron 59-14 at Nippert Stadium. Wide receiver DJ Woods led the offense with two catches for 62 yards, while linebacker Clemente Casseus paced the defense with five tackles.

Zach Collaros was 10-of-16 for 157 yards as one of four quarterbacks who saw action against UA. The Bearcats got off to a quick start with the help of senior running back Isaiah Pead, who touched the ball multiple times before capping a nine-play, 60-yard drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown. It marked the third-straight game he recorded a rushing touchdown and was the third-consecutive game UC scored on its opening drive.

Derek Wolfe got to UA quarterback Clayton Moore, knocking the ball loose and springing Maalik Bomar to run it back 54 yards for a touchdown with 8:21 remaining in the first.

On Akron's second possession, senior defensive back Dominique Battle intercepted a pass from Moore and scored his first-career touchdown on a 36-yard run, giving Cincinnati the 21-0 advantage.

After the Zips were forced to punt, the Bearcats marched down the field, yet again, on its next drive, which was highlighted by a 50-yard reception by senior wide receiver DJ Woods. Collaros pitched in another rushing touchdown - his first of the season - to make the score 28-0.

The defense recorded its third touchdown of the day when Camerron Cheatham picked off Moore and ran it back 53 yards to make the score 49-0 heading into the locker room.

Akron threatened to score on the opening drive of the second half, but Deven Drane denied any Zips' points by catching his first-career interception in the end zone with 10:38 left on the clock.

Following a field goal by freshman kicker Tony Miliano, the two teams traded two possessions each before freshman running back Jameel Poteat ran in his first-career touchdown - a seven-yard rush - to make the score 59-0.

CINCINNATI - After a dominating defensive performance, the University of Cincinnati football team (3-1) defeated the NC State Wolfpack (2-2), 44-14, at Nippert Stadium in front of 28,431 fans.

Two of UC's touchdowns came from takeaways, while the defensive held NCSU to -26 rushing yards. Isaiah Pead lit up the offense, recording his second 100-yard rushing game of the season with 167 yards, while Zach Collaros went 25-of-34 for 263 yards and two touchdowns, in addition to two rushing touchdowns.

Following one scoreless possession each, Pat O'Donnell kicked a 76-yard punt - the second longest in Bearcat history - pinning the ball at NC State's 3-yard line. Just as the Wolfpack was gaining yardage, Drew Frey made his first pick of the year, which eventually allowed Pead to continue his streak, putting Cincinnati's first points on the board for the fourth-consecutive game.

Kenbrell Thompkins converted a third-and-17 situation with a 44-yard reception and the Bearcats found themselves in the endzone a second time to give the hosts the 14-0 lead with 8:34 remaining in the first quarter.

JK Schaffer continued the defensive domination when he grabbed an interception with one minute remaining in the first quarter and then, as if by second nature, Collaros and company brought it in for another touchdown to make it 21-0.

Later on, Tony Miliano capped a nine-play, 54-yard drive with a 26-yard field goal to give Cincinnati the 24-7 edge heading into the locker room.

UC didn't show any signs of letting up in the second half, as sophomore wide receiver Anthony McClung single-handedly gave the Bearcats 57 yards on the drive and allowed for a 48-yard field goal by Miliano to increase the lead, 27-7.

After a scoreless NCSU drive, Cincinnati began its longest drive of the evening, which was highlighted by a 25-yard touchdown pass to Pead.

OXFORD, Ohio - Isaiah Pead ran for a pair of touchdowns, and Cincinnati's dominating defense opened the second half with a goal-line stand that set up a 27-0 victory over Miami of Ohio.

Cincinnati (4-1) has won the last six games in the nation's oldest nonconference rivalry, played 116 times since 1888. The Bearcats' defense made this one a reference point--Cincinnati's first shutout in Oxford since a 22-0 victory in 1898.

The Bearcats overcame a season-high four turnovers, including Zach Collaros' two end-zone interceptions and his fumble at the Miami 12-yard line. Collaros was 16 of 30 for 251 yards and scrambled 15 times for 89 yards against a defense that emphasized pass coverage.

It was Cincinnati's first shutout since a 31-0 win over Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 2, 2006. The Bearcats' last shutout in the rivalry--played for the "Victory Bell" traveling trophy--was 17-0 in Cincinnati. Miami finished with minus-3 yards on 38 rushes. Miami hadn't been shut out at home since 1983, the year Yager Stadium opened.

Cincinnati's defense opened the second half with a goal-line stand that crushed Miami's chances of a comeback. Zac Dysert surprised Cincinnati with a 66-yard pass down the middle to Nick Harwell, who was tackled at the 1-yard line by safety Drew Frey. After two runs lost a yard, Harwell was called for pushing off to get open on a catch in the end zone. Mason Krynski hooked a 34-yard field goal try, starting a celebration on the Bearcats sideline.

Three plays later, Collaros completed a 72-yard pass to tight end Adrien Robinson, who made a juggling at-the-knees catch while safety Pat Hinke interfered with him. Pead's 3-yard run made it 13-0.

Cincinnati then put it away with two touchdowns in an 89-second span. Pead scored on a 4-yard dive, and linebacker J.K. Schaffer returned the ball 17 yards for a touchdown off a bad snap on a punt attempt for a 27-0 lead late in the third quarter.

CINCINNATI - The University of Cincinnati beat the Louisville Cardinals 25-16 at Paul Brown Stadium to win the Battle for the Keg of Nails for the fourth-straight year. It was a career-high day for senior defensive lineman Derek Wolfe, who had a career-best in tackles (11) and tackles for loss (2.5) in front of 40,971 fans for homecoming weekend - the third largest home crowd in UC history.

The windy field conditions provided a battle of its own for senior quarterback Zach Collaros, who went 18-of-26 for 152 yards and relied heavily on senior running back Isaiah Pead, who finished with 20 carries for 153 yards - his eighth career 100-plus rushing game. Collaros pitched in an additional 22 yards on 13 rushes.

The UC offense got off to a slow start, but the defense managed to hold the Cardinals to two field goals to make the score 6-0 after the first 15 minutes.

After a scoreless 10 minutes to start the second quarter, UC forced Louisville to a three-and-out on its own seven-yard line. The Bearcats got the ball back in UofL's territory, where it began its first productive drive of the afternoon - a four-play, 37-yard scoring drive capped with a 26-yard touchdown pass to Woods to give the Bearcats the 7-6 lead with five minutes left in the half.

Cincinnati's offense began clicking on all cylinders as they marched 53 yards down the field to UofL's one-yard line. Faced with a fourth-and-goal situation, Collaros ran it for the touchdown to pull within two of the guests, 16-14, after three.

Cincinnati wasted no time adding points, this time in way of Pead, who ran 50 yards to the endzone to make it his sixth-straight game with a rushing touchdown. Following the 16-second drive, senior tight end Adrien Robinson caught a two-point conversion pass to make it, 22-16, with 12:13 remaining.

Freshman kicker Tony Miliano tacked on an 21-yard field goal in the final minutes to make the final score 25-16.
