HONORING LEE ROY SELMON

USF Athletics announced that it will honor the beloved Lee Roy Selmon in numerous ways throughout the season and into the future. On Friday, Sept. 9, USF President Judy Genshaft announced that the home of USF athletics will now be named the Lee Roy Selmon Athletics Center. In addition, gameday and season-long initiatives honoring the former USF Director of Athletics and Hall of Fame great will include



the football team wearing a number 63 decal on their helmets for all football games, all 19 USF teams, including the football team, wearing the initials LRS on all uniforms in all games throughout the 2011-12 year and the university creating a number 63 flag, which the football team and spirit squads will carry onto the field for all home and away games.

THE GAMI

No. 18/17 USF (3-0) will host UTEP (2-1) on Saturday, Sept. 24 (7 p.m. ET/ESPN3) at Raymond James Stadium (65,787). This will be the first meeting between the two schools. The Bulls are coming off a 70-17 victory over Florida A&M, while the Miners topped New Meixco State, 16-10, on Saturday, Sept. 17.

THE BROADCASTS

The game will air on ESPN3 at 7 p.m. (ET). Kevin Corke (play-by-play), Doug Graber (analyst) and Angela Mallen (sidelines) will have the call. USF's radio broadcast with Jim Louk, Mark Robinson and Mike Pepper can be heard on 12 affiliates statewide and nationally on Sirius satellite radio channel 93. In addition, 1300 WQBN will broadcast the game in Spanish with David Cuevas and Angel Rodriguez behind the microphones. Both USF radio broadcasts can be heard through BullsVision Radio on GoUSFBulls.com.

THE PROGRAM

USF has an all-time record of 106-62 (.630). The Bulls overall winning percentage of 63.0 ranks 18th among FBS schools in all-time winning percentage. In addition, the Bulls have posted an 86-49 (.636) record since joining the FBS in 2000. Their winning percentage of .630 (76-43) from 2000-09 ranked 26th nationally over that time span. USF joined the BIG EAST in 2005 and is one of only six schools that has made a bowl appearance in every season as a BCS league member, joining Florida, Florida State, Georgia, Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech. It also is the only school since 1998 to join a BCS member conference and make a bowl appearance every year (2005-10).

EIGHT-WIN SEASONS

USF is one of just 15 teams nationally to produce five straight eight-win seasons and one of just 10 that play in BCS conferences. The Bulls have gone 8-5-in each of the last three season to go along with 9-4 records in 2006 and '07. The Bulls have posted at least eight wins in eight of their 14 seasons and have posted school-best, nine-win campaigns on three occasions (2007, '06 and '02). USF has produced seasons of .500 or better in 12 of its 14 years, including 11 winning seasons. The only years USF didn't reach .500 were its inaugural season in 1997 and again in 2004. The Bulls broke even in 2005, going 6-6.

BOWL STREAK

USF played in a bowl game for the sixth consecutive season in 2010. The Bulls are 4-2 in those six bowl games, including

victories in each of the last three seasons. USF is one of just four programs nationally that has won three consecutive bowl games. Last year, USF bettered Clemson in the Meineke Car Care Bowl, 31-26. In 2009, USF defeated Northern Illinois, 27-3, in the International Bowl. In 2008, the Bulls cruised past Memphis, 41-14, in the MajicJack St. Pete Bowl. Prior to 2008, USF fell to Oregon, 56-21, in the 2007 Brut Sun Bowl, won the 2006 Papajohns. com Bowl, 24-7, over East Carolina and dropped the 2005 Meineke Car Care Bowl, 14-0, against N.C. State in the program's inaugural bowl appearance.

GAME CAPTAINS

Prior to the season opener against Notre Dame, head coach Skip Holtz announced that seniors C Chaz Hine, CB Quenton Washington and S Jerrell Young and junior QB B.J. Daniels would serve as the teams captains, as voted on by the players. Of note, Daniels became the first non-senior to be elected captain under Skip Holtz.

USF IN THE POLLS

USF moved up to 18th in the latest Associated Press Poll and climbed five spots in the Coaches Poll to No. 17. The No. 18 ranking in The AP Poll is the Bulls highest ranking in that poll since they were ranked 14th in week eight of the 2008 season. USF broke a four-game losing streak when entering a game ranked with the win over Ball State and is now 13-9 as a ranked team.

USF AT 3-0

USF has opened the season 3-0 six times in its 15-year history, including five of the last six seasons. The Bulls opened the 2010 season 1-1 after running off four consecutive seasons of 3-0 starts. The Bulls also started 3-0 in 2002.

QUICK STARTIN' BULLS

USF has scored in the first four minutes in each of its three games this season (11:00 vs. Notre Dame; 14:52 vs. Ball State; 13:14 vs. FAMU) marking just the second time in program history that the Bulls have scored in the first four minutes in three consecutive games. USF is 3-0 during this year's span and went 2-1 during the 2007 season when it scored at 13:21 vs. Cincinnati (loss), 13:40 vs. Syracuse (win) and 14:52 vs. Louisville (win). Since 1997, USF is 30-6 (.833) when scoring in the first four minutes of the first quarter.

RECORD SETTING SHOW VS FAMU

USF's dominating 70-17 win over Florida A&M produced some of the best performances in USF history ... USF's 70 points were its second-most in program history only behind the 80 points it scored in the program opener in 1997 (80-3 win over Kentucky Wesleyan) ... The 70 points against the Rattlers were the second most a Florida A&M team had ever given up ... The Bulls' 49 points in the first half were the most ever recorded in the first half and tied the all-time USF record for points in any half ... USF's 745 yards of total offense set a BIG EAST record that had been held by Louisville since 2007 (729 yards, Sept. 6) ... A pair

of individuals posted record performances as well starting with OB B.J. Daniels who threw for a school-record tying 382 yards ... Daniels also set the record for most yards in a half after throwing for 355 over the first two quarters ... Daniels' 416 yards of total offense are the fourth-best in program history and his total passing yards over the last two games (741 vards) are the most by a USF OB in back-toback games in program history ... RB Darrell Scott became the first player in USF history to post both a 50+yard rushing and 50+yard receiving TD in the same season ... Scott's three rushing TDs tie for the second-most in a game in USF history and his 84-yard receiving TD is the third longest reception in USF history.

NOTRE DAME NUGGETS

Of the 122 schools to come to Notre Dame, USF was just the 14th to win in its first try ... USF handed Notre Dame just their 11th loss in 87 trys when the Irish opened the season at home ... Skip Holtz was the first Notre Dame alum to defeat the Irish in South Bend since 1940 ... Kayvon Webster's 96-yard fumble return TD was the longest defensive score in USF history and the longest fumble return by a Notre Dame opponent in Irish history ... USF forced five turnovers, the most since it forced seven at Syracuse in 2009 ... USF has only given up 500 yards of offense twice in the last 40 games but has won both games ... in both wins, USF did not commit a turnover, while forcing a total of six.

FIRST-YEAR SUCCESS

Skip Holtz was one of 22 head coaches on the FBS level that took over new programs last year. Out of the that group, Holtz was one of just five coaches that produced at least eight wins and one of just four that led their teams to a bowl victory. Jimbo Fisher at Florida State led the group with 10 wins, while three other coaches, Brian Kelly at Notre Dame, Lane Kiffin at USC and Tommy Tuberville at Texas Tech, each secured eight victories. Out of the five coaches who won at least eight games, only Holtz, Fisher and Kelly met or exceeded their team's win total from the previous season. Holtz, Kelly, Tuberville and Louisville's Charlie Strong were the coaches that won bowl games.

HOLTZ AS A HEAD COACH

Holtz is in his 12th season as a head coach after leading USF to an 8-5 record in his first year at the helm. Prior to joining the Bulls, he spent five seasons at East Corlina (2005-09:38-27, .585) and served as the head man at Connecticut (1994-98: 34-23, .596). Overall, Holtz is 83-55 (.601) as a head coach. He holds a conference record of 53-34 (.609) and a non-conference mark of 30-21 (.588). Holtz has led his teams to winning seasons in eight of his 11 years. He has only posted one season under .500 in conference play. He won his first conference championship in 2008 at ECU and followed that with another league title in '09.

HOLTZ TURNS IT AROUND

In five seasons at ECU, Skip Holtz turned around a program that had recorded just three wins in 25 games prior to his arrival. After posting a 5-6 record in his first season in 2005, Holtz produced four consecutive winning seasons, which hadn't happened at ECU since the late 1970s, went to four bowl games and won Conference USA titles in 2008 and '09, its first league crowns in 32 years. It also marked the first time in league history that a team won consecutive conference championships. Overall, Holtz led ECU to a 38-27 (.585) record during his five-year run. That was a huge improvement compared to ECU's 21-38 (.356) record in the five seasons prior to his arrival.

2010 A SEASON OF FIRSTS

In Skip Holtz's first season as head coach at USF, the Bulls managed to accomplish some things never before done in school history. It started when they traveled to Cincinnati, a place they had never won. USF ended up outdueling the Bearcats, 38-30, to score their first conference victory of the season. Then, they traveled to Louisville, another place they had never won, and pulled out a 24-21 win in overtime. Next up, the Bulls broke a four-game losing streak to Rutgers. That victory marked the first time USF defeated the Scarlet Knights in Tampa. Then, the Bulls defeated Miami for the first time in school history, a 23-20 overtime win.

2011 SENIORITY

A group of 17 seniors will lead the Bulls during the 2011 season. Collectively, the group has helped USF to a 27-15 record over the last four years, including three consecutive bowl victories. USF's four-year victory record of 34 was set by the 2009 senior class (34-18). The 2011 group has gone 15-6 at Raymond James Stadium and 6-2 against teams from the state of Florida. The seniors have combined to play in 418 games (142 starts). DE Patrick Hampton (33 games/six starts), OG Chaz Hine (36 games/28 starts), WR A.J. Love (36 games/21 starts), DT Keith McCaskill (41 games/eight starts), C Kevin McCaskill (19 games/one start), WR Joel Miller (35 games/one start), OG Jeremiah Warren (36 games/29 starts), DB Quenton Washington (39 games/27 starts) and S Jerrell Young (37 games/21 starts) return with starting experience. In addition, LB Sharly Azard (one game), DB Tyson Butler (31 games), DE Claude Davis (15 games), DE Rony Delisca (four games), Thanasi 'Saki' Mihalakos (four games), OG Darren Powe (eight games), LS Michael Walsh (29 games) and LB Curtis Weatherspoon (14 games) return with game experience.

BULLS RETURNEES

USF returns 44 players that earned letters in 2010 (19 offense/22 defense/three specialists) and two others, wide receivers Sterling Griffin and A.J. Love, that will return to action after missing the 2010 season due to injury. Including all returnees, the members of the Bulls 2011 roster entered the season having combined to play in 857 games (385 offense/437 defense/35 special teams). In addition, 28 players return with starting experience (15 offense/13 defense). The 28 players with starting experience combined to start 258 games (138 offense/120 defense) entering 2011.

OFFENSIVE RETURNEES

USF returns 15 players in 2011 that have starting experience at almost every offensive position. Leading the list of returnees are two stalwarts along the offensive front in seniors Chaz Hine (36 games/28 starts) and Jeremiah Warren (36 games/29 starts). They are joined by senior C Kevin McCaskill (19 games/one start) and juniors OG Danous Estenor (13 games/four starts) and OT Mark Popek (22 games/12 starts). The skill positions are led by the quarterbacks, junior B.J. Daniels (30

FIRST HALF DOMINANCE

USF has outscored its first three opponents 95-14 in the first half and 44-0 in the first quarter alone. The Bulls were up 16-0 at Notre Dam, had Ball State down 30-0 at the half and then were up 49-14 after two quarters vs. FAMU.

games/25 starts) and sophomore Bobby Eveld (eight games/ one start). The triggermen will have a host of wide receivers to target in 2011, especially with the return of senior A.J. Love (36 games/21 starts) and sophomore Sterling Griffin (16 games/12 starts) from injuries that forced them to miss the entire 2010 season. That duo joins a group of returners that saw a lot of action in their absence last year in senior Joel Miller (35 games/ one start), junior Lindsey Lamar (27 games/seven starts) and sophomore Stephen Bravo-Brown (16 games/two starts). In addition, junior Victor Marc (18 games/one start) and sophomores Derrick Hopkins (four games) and Terrence Mitchell (16 games/one start) have seen game action at the wide receiver position. With the loss of junior TE Jeff Hawkins to a seasonending knee injury in the summer, the Bulls will look to converted QB and WR Evan Landi (28 games/15 starts) to join junior Andreas Shields (23 games/three starts) and sopohomore Isaac Virgin (12 games), at the tight end position. At running back, junior Demetris Murray (25 games/two starts) headlines a group that will be bolstered by transfer Darrell Scott from Colorado (three games/one start). In addition, sophomore Marcus Shaw (11 games) saw action in the backfield and on special teams a year ago.

DEFENSIVE RETURNEES

Much like the offensive side of the ball, the defense returns a number of players who have served as starters during their careers. In fact, 13 players on defense return with starting experience, led by the secondary, which returns all but one player from last year, Mistral Raymond, who was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings. Seniors CB Quenton Washington (39 games/27 starts) and S Jerrell Young (37 games/21 starts) headline the group and are accompanied by juniors S Jon Lejiste (29 games/17 starts) and CB Kayvon Webster (29 games/13 starts). Adding depth to the secondary are junior George Baker (27 games/one start) and sophomores Mark Joyce (16 games/one start) and JaQuez Jenkins (12 games). The linebacking corps is also filled with experience returners in juniors Sam Barrington (29 games/16 starts) and Michael Lanaris (28 games/four starts) and sophomore DeDe Lattimore (16 games/15 starts). In addition, senior Curtis Weatherspoon saw action in all 13 games last season after transferring in from junior college. Up front, seniors Patrick Hampton (33 games/six starts) and Keith McCaskill (41 games/ eight starts) will step into leading roles, while junior Cory Grissom (25 games/19 starts) and sophomore Ryne Giddins (18 games/five starts) will bring plenty of experience.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST

USF's 745 yards of total offense against Florida A&M (Sept. 17) not only set the BIG EAST Conference record (previously held by Louisville, 729 yards on Sept. 6, 2007), but it also shattered the

10-year old USF record of 580 yards set against Liberty on Oct. 27, 2001. The 745 yards rank second in the NCAA this season and USF is one of just three schools to produce 700+ total yards in a game in 2011. In fact, since the 2006 season, only seven other teams have produced more than 745 yards in a game. (Georgia Tech, 768, 2011; Nevada-844; 2010; Nevada-773, 2009; Houston-750, 2009; Tulsa-791, 2008; Toledo-812, 2007; Houston-748, 2007).

HOME COOKIN'

USF has posted a 71-21 (.772) record in home games since the program started in 1997. They played their home schedule in 1997 and the first two games of the '98 season in Tampa Stadium, going 6-3. Then, the Bulls moved into Raymond James Stadium for the Citadel game in '98 and have gone 65-18 (.783) since. USF has notched a winning home record in 13 of its 14 seasons. It's gone undefeated three times (2002, '01 and '00) and suffered just one loss five times (2007, '06, '05, 1999 and '98). The Bulls only season with a losing home record came in 2004, when they went 2-4. Since joining the BIG EAST in 2005, USF has gone 27-10 (.730) at home overall and 12-9 (.571) in conference matchups.

ON THE ROAD

USF has posted a 33-38 (.465) record in true road games during the program's 15-year history. The Bulls have had four seasons with winning road records (2010, '07, '03 and '02) and four where they finished at .500 (2009, '08, '06 and 1998). USF's road success has increased over the last four years, producing a 17-12 (.586) record over that time span. In the first five seasons of program history, the Bulls were only able to manage a 6-15 (.286) record in road games, but in the eight seasons since then, USF has gone 27-23 (.540), including seven of nine seasons at .500 or better. Since joining the BIG EAST in 2005, USF has posted a 19-16 (.543) road record.

CONFERENCE COMPETITION

After spending the first six seasons of program history as an independent, USF joined Conference USA in 2003, and then, in 2005, moved to the BIG EAST. Overall, USF is 28-30 (.483) in eight years as a conference member. The Bulls were 8-8 (.500) over their two-year span with C-USA and have gone 20-22 (.476) in the BIG EAST. First-year head coach Skip Holtz has posted a 53-34 (.609) conference record in his 11 years as a head coach and has won two conference championships (C-USA: 2008 and '09).

NON-CONFERENCE RECORD

USF has gone 30-8 (.789) in regular-season, non-conference games during their nine seasons as a conference member. Since joining the BIG EAST in 2005, USF has gone 27-5 (.844) in regular-season, non-conference matchups. Even better, since 2007, the Bulls have posted a 21-2 (.913) record, including wins at No.16/18 Notre Dame (2011), at Miami (2010), at Florida State (2009), at N.C. State (2008), vs. No. 10 Kansas (2008), at Auburn (2007) and vs. North Carolina (2007). USF posted a 3-3 (.500) record in non-conference games in two seasons of Conference USA play.

"FAN" DEMONIUM

One of the key elements of USF's rabid fan base is its students. The Bulls have the largest student section in the entire BIG EAST Conference with an allotment of 12,501, which has led the conference for the past four seasons. The Bulls' faithful also has continued to grow throughout the years, as USF distributed 24,185 season tickets in 2009, which is the second-best mark in program history. In 2008, USF distributed 27,879 season tickets to establish the school record. The previous record was 20,619 set in the inaugural season of 1997.

BULLS RETURN TO DODGERTOWN

The USF football team introduced a new element to their fall training last season when it traveled across the state to the Vero

Beach Sports Village, formerly known as Dodgertown, for 12 days of preseason training camp. With the venture considered a success, the Bulls again headed to Vero Beach in 2011. The venue serves as a practice facility and houses the entire team of 105 players, as well as coaches and support staff. Along with practices, the players participate in team-building events such as the Bulls Olympics, a talent show and a barbecue. The tradition of moving camp off-site is something that Coach Holtz has done as a head coach at both East Carolina and UConn, as well as an assistant with South Carolina and Notre Dame.

BULLS IN THE NFL

In just 14 seasons, USF has produced 19 NFL Draft picks and 53 players that have garnered NFL experience. History began on April 22, 2001 when Bulls Kenyatta Jones, Anthony Henry and Bill Gramatica were taken with consecutive picks in the fourth round. Since then, the Bulls have had seven players drafted in the first three rounds. Over the past two seasons, the Bulls eight draft picks, including a school-record five in 2010, are the most of any BIG EAST league member. In addition, USF's eight draft picks in 2010-11 rank third among Florida schools behind only Florida (13) and Miami (12).

UNDER CENTER

B.J. Daniels continues his junior season, having played in 30 games, starting 25, while producing a 16-9 record as a starter. During his career, Daniels has completed 336-of-577 passes (58.2%) for 4,623 yards and 31 TDs (23 INTs), while rushing for 1,118 yards and 15 TDs. Both his 4,623 passing yards and 31 passing TDs rank third in USF history, while his 1,118 rushing yards rank 10th and his 15 rushing TDs are tied for eighth. Daniels has produced 5,741 yards of total offense, which ranks third in USF history. So far in 2011, Daniels has gone 67-of-100 (67.0%) for 869 yards and six TDs (one INT). Last year, he finished the season having thrown for 1,685 yards and 11 TDs on 143-of-245 passing (58.4%), while rushing for 259 yards and five TDs. In his first season, Daniels threw for 1,983 yards and 14 TDs (nine INTs), while leading the Bulls in rushing with 772 yards and nine TDs. Daniels played in two games during the 2008 season prior to redshirting. Also back with game experience is sophomore Bobby Eveld, who earned the backup role

in 2010 after joining the team as a true freshman walk-on before earning a scholarship in December 2010. He saw the first action of his career against Stony Brook in the 2010 season opener and completed his first eight passes. His next significant action came at Miami, where he took over for an injured Daniels to start the second half. Eveld led USF to a come-from-behind 23-20 overtime win after going 8-of-15 for 120 yards, while adding a rushing TD. Eveld then earned the first start of his career against UConn in USF's regular-season finale, going 22-of-41 for 195 yards and a score. For the season, he went 42-of-75 (56.0%) for 454 yards and two TDs (three INTs).

OFF TO A CLEAN START

Many of the questions B.J. Daniels was hoping to answer heading into 2011 involved his maturation process as a quarterback. If the first three games are any indication, he's off to a strong start. Daniels managed USF's offense perfectly at No. 16/18 Notre Dame, finishing with 128 passing yards and a TD to go along with 37 rushing yards. But the biggest stat was also the smallest number, a zero in the turnover column. Daniels clean game was crucial in the 23-20 victory and helped USF produce a +5 margin thanks to four forced turnovers by the defense and a fumble recovery on special teams. Daniels has thrown just one INT in 100 passing attempts this season.

CAREER PERFORMANCES

Over the last two games, B.J. Daniels has produced a pair of career-making performances which started with career highs in completions (28) and attempts (39) against Ball State despite only playing in just two drives in the second half. In fact, he bettered his career high in completions by halftime and was just shy of his previous top yardage mark of 304 yards after he went 24-of-31 for 289 yards in the first half. Daniels opened the game by connecting on his first seven passes, including 6-of-6 on the Bulls' first drive. He staved hot and threw for 195 yards in the second quarter alone, help USF jump out to a 30-0 halftime lead. Daniels was voted BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week for his performance. The junior continued to set career marks against FAMU on Saturday when he threw for career-high 382 vards. Daniels' 355 vards in the first half alone were just four yards shy of his previous career high (359), set against Ball State the previous week. Daniels also passed for a career-high four TDs against the Rattlers, bettering his previous single-game best of three.

EFFICIENCY AT ITS FINEST

B.J. Daniels produced two of the most efficient passing days in USF history during the 2010 season. He opened the year by going 15-of-22 (68.2%) for 264 yards and two TDs (no INTs) against Stony Brook for a 199.0 rating, which ranks fifth on USF's single-game list. Then, at Cincinnati, he went 13-of-16 (81.3%) for 286 yards and two TDs (no INTs) for a 272.7 rating. The 272.7 rating easily eclipsed USF's previous single-game best of 243.1, which was set by Marquel Blackwell against Liberty in 2000.

BACK-TO-BACK

B.J. Daniels has yet to let up on the offensive attack as he has posted 741 passing yards over the last two games, which stands as the best passing output in back-to-back games in USF history. Daniels better the previous record holder (Matt Grothe, 2008) by 22 yards. Against Ball State, Daniels threw for a then-career best 359 yards but followed up that performance with a career-high 382 yards which ties for the most in a game in program history.

ONE OF TWO

B.J. Daniels became just the second quarterback to rush for 100 yards against Florida since 1996 when he posted 107 yards on 17 carries (6.3 ypc) last season. Daniels joined Ohio's Dontrell Jackson, who rushed for 118 yards against the Gators in 2002. It was the fifth time in Daniels career that he rushed for at least 100 yards.

A FIRST IN BULLS, BIG EAST HISTORY

Daniels became the only player in USF and BIG EAST history to rush for 100 yards and pass for 300 yards in a single game, accomplishing the feat against Louisville (304p/141r) in 2009. He was the 28th player in FBS history to complete the feat. Interestingly enough, Daniels outgained Louisville as a team, which had 313 yards on the day. His 445 yards of total offense stands as the second-best single-game mark in USF history.

EVELD'S INTRODUCTION

After having played in just four games coming into the Miami contest last year, Bobby Eveld was called upon to sub in for an injured B.J. Daniels to start the second half against the Canes. He went on to lead USF to a come-from-behind 23-20 overtime victory. Eveld finished the game 8-of-15 for 120 yards to go along with a rushing TD. After Miami had run off 17 straight points to take a 17-10 lead with just under nine minutes left in the game, Eveld calmly marched USF down the field on a nine-play, 81-yard TD drive to tie the game with two minutes remaining. On the drive, Eveld went 3-of-5 for 63 yards, including completions of 27 and 21 yards, capping it with a one-yard TD run. Then, in overtime, after a running play gave USF first down at the 10, Eveld calmly threaded a pass to Joel Miller for a nine-yard gain to the one, which set up a one-yard scoring run by Demetris Murray to win the game.

EVELD'S FIRST START

Bobby Eveld got the nod for USF's 2010 regular-season finale against UConn, filling in for an injured B.J. Daniels. Instead of relying on the ground attack, USF used the passing game to the tune of 41 pass attempts. It marked the most passing attempts by USF in a game since the 2008 Rutgers contest, a span of 29 games, when the Bulls posted 48 pass attempts, including 43 by Matt Grothe. Eveld completed 22 for 195 yards and a TD and helped make up a 10-point, fourth-quarter deficit. With USF trailing 16-6, Eveld converted a turnover into a TD, when he hit Dontavia Bogan for a 28-yard score. Then, two drives later, Eveld led an 11-play, 74-yard drive that resulted in a field goal and a tie game with 1:16 left in the game. On the two scoring drives, Eveld went 6-of-9 for 70 yards and a TD.

THE BACKFIELD

Junior Demetris Murray will help headline the USF running attack in 2011 after finishing second on the team in 2010 with 542 yards and four TDs on 120 attempts (4.5 ypc), while adding 11 receptions for 153 yards and two TDs. Murray's 49.3 yards per game ranked ninth in the BIG EAST and third among BIG EAST backs returning for 2011. During his three seasons, Murray has seen action in 25 games (two starts) and posted 754 yards and five TDs on 168 carries (4.5 ypc). Also returning is sophomore Marcus Shaw, who played in eight games in 2010 as a true freshman and rushed for 105 yards and a TD on 12 carries (8.8 ypc). The rushing attack will be bolstered by junior Darrell Scott, who transferred from Colorado after the 2009 season and sat out last year. In two seasons at Colorado, Scott played in 16 games and posted 438 yards rushing and a TD.

MURRAY ADDS A BOOST

Demetris Murray posted two 100-yard rushing efforts in 2010. The first one came against WKU, when he tallied 115 yards on 15 carries (7.7 ypc) to earn BIG EAST Honor Roll mention. Then, against Louisville, Murray posted 106 yards on 13 carries (8.2 ypc) to help USF to an overtime win. Murray got off to a solid start in 2010, posting 55 rushing yards and 57 receiving yards, including a TD, in the season opener. He increased that total to 62 yards at Florida, before the 115-yard performance against WKU. Over the first three games in 2011, Murray has rushed for 135 yards and one TD on 34 carries.

SCOTT MAKES A MARK

Darrell Scott really showed off what he is capable of against Florida A&M as he racked up a career-high 146 rushing yards and three rushing TDs, one of which was a 56-yarder, to go along with an 84-yard TD reception. Scott became the first player in USF history to post both a rushing and receiving TD over 50 yards in a season. He also became just the second player in program history to record a 50+yard reception and 50+yard rush in a game since Amarri Jackson did against Louisville on Sept. 22, 2005. Scott's name made it even more into the USF record book as his three rushing TDs tie for the second-most in a game and his 84-yard TD reception is the third-longest in program history. Somewhat buried underneath the stellar performance, Scott also racked up his first career 100-yard rushing effort to join current Bulls B.J. Daniels and Demetris Murray on the USF 100-yard rushing list. In his first two games, Scott ran for 115 yards and one TD.

THE RECEIVING CORPS

With the return of senior A.J. Love and sophomore Sterling Griffin, the Bulls receiving corps entered 2011 with a large group of experienced receivers, despite the loss of Dontavia Bogan, who finished his career ranked second all-time in receiving yards (1,534) and tied for second in TDs (12). Aside from Bogan, four of the Bulls top five receivers returned for 2011 in juniors Evan Landi and Lindsey Lamar, senior Joel Miller and sophomore Stephen Bravo-Brown. Landi, who is now working at tight end, finished second in receiving yards for the Bulls in 2010. He caught 28 balls for 390 yards and two TDs. Lamar made 25 catches for 161 yards, while Miller posted 121 yards and a TD on 11 receptions. Bravo-Brown also made 11 receptions for 104 yards. Love returns and has played in 36 games (21 starts) and posted 69 catches for 1,049 yards and eight TDs during his four seasons on the field. Griffin posted 14 receptions for 265 yards and two TDs as a true freshman in 2009 before missing last year. Add to that junior Victor Marc, who had a solid spring, and sophomore Terrence Mitchell, who converted from defensive back to wide receiver during 2010, and the receiving corps should provide ample targets for USF's signal callers in 2011.

SPREADING IT AROUND

USF has had 10 or more players catch a pass in each of its last two outings. Against Florida A&M, B.J. Daniels spread out his career-best 382 yards over 14 different receivers. Sophomore Sterling Griffin led the way with eight receptions while four receivers caught three or more passes. In addition, 11 of the 14 caught passes over 10 yards while four posted receptions longer than 25 yards. Griffin led the way in the yardage category with his career-high 97, while both A.J. Love and Darrell Scott posted 50 or more yards. In the 37-7 victor over Ball State, 10 players caught a pass led by sophomore Terrence Mitchell's seven receptions. Three players had four catches and three more caught three balls. Junior Victor Marc had the high in receiving yards with 81 on four catches and produced a TD. Six of the receivers produced at least 35 yards receiving.

THEY'RE BAAAAAACK

Sixth-year senior A.J. Love and redshirt sophomore Sterling Griffin made their presence felt in their first game back at Notre Dame after both missed all of 2010 due to injury. Love posted two catches for 26 yards, including a key 18-yard first-down conversion on USF's 14-play, 80-yard TD drive in the second half. Griffin posted career highs in both receptions (8) and yards (75), with six of his eight catches going for first downs. Griffin also drew a pass interference penalty in the end zone on a third-down play that set up USF's only offensive TD of the game on the ensuing play. So far in 2011, Griffin has posted a teamhigh 224 yards and one TD on 20 receptions.

DAVIS DOUBLES UP

True freshman Andre Davis etched his name into the USF record book as he became the first true freshman in program history to record both a special teams TD and an offensive TD in the same game. Davis is one of just two, regardless of grade, to accomplish the feat in USF history (DeAndrew Rubin, Sept. 7, 2002 - 55-yard punt return, 8-yard receiving TD and 95-yard receiving TD). In addition, he's one of just three true freshman Bulls that have scored a TD on a blocked punt return joining Charlton Sinclair (2008) and Sidney Simpson (2001).

THE HOGS UP FRONT

USF's strength up front entering 2011 will come from its senior tandem of Chaz Hine and Jeremiah Warren. Hine, a former walk-on turned scholarship starter, has played in 36 career games, starting 28. Warren also brings a lot of game experience to the front five, having seen action in 36 games, starting 29. At the tackle spots, junior Mark Popek, who has played in 22 games, starting 12, earned the nod at left tackle, while redshirt freshman Quinterrius Eatmon used an outstanding spring and fall camp to earn the top spot at right tackle. In addition, senior Kevin McCaskill returns with game experience at center, having played in 19 games, starting one, while junior Danous Estenor has played in 13 games, starting four.

HINE: THE RENAISSANCE MAN

At 6-4, 299 pounds, senior Chaz Hine looks like an offensive lineman, but as you dig into the make-up of big number 79, you'll find a multi-talented, well-rounded student-athlete. Hine, who went from walk-on to starter and is a two-time BIG EAST All-Academic performer, has already earned his degree in business management and will be working on his MBA this fall. He is a founding member of the Student Coalition Against Homelessness and Poverty, a service organization developed by a group of Honor's College students, with the purpose educating students about the gravity of the situation, absolving stereotypes and linking students to volunteer opportunities. He is also active in Disciples for Life, a student-led campus ministry that fosters relationships between students and Jesus Christ. In addition to his work in the community, on the field and in the classroom, Hine has been heavily involved in the arts, serving as the male lead in the musicals "Les Misérables," "Grease," and "Hello, Dolly." As a result, Hine is a nominee for both the AFCA Good Works Team and the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

DOIN' IT ON DEFENSE

USF's defense kept the Bulls in each game during the 2010 season. The Bulls allowed just 20.0 points per game (22nd NCAA) and gave up just 317.9 yards per game (17th NCAA). USF was also able to get off the field. The Bulls only allowed 70 thirddown conversions on 195 attempts (35.9%), which ranked 23rd nationally. In addition, the Bulls' D gave up just 225 first downs (17.3 per game), which ranked 18th nationally. In the red zone, USF only allowed 18 TDs on 39 drives inside their own 20. The 18 TDs allowed tied for the eighth fewest nationally and their five rushing TDs allowed in the red zone were tied for the second fewest with Alabama. In fact, the Bulls eight rushing TDs allowed tied for the fourth fewest nationally. Overall, the USF defense only allowed a total of 29 TDs in their 13 games (2.2 per game), which tied for the seventh fewest in the nation. The Bulls only allowed four teams to score more than 21 points this season.

TAKE IT AWAY

USF spent the offseason focused on creating turnoves and through three games, the focus has paid off. With 10 takeaways, the Bulls are tied for fifth nationally in turnovers gained. In addition, USF has a +1.67 margin, which is tied for eighth nationally. The Bulls have already forced 10 fumbles and posted six fumble recoveries in 2011 after forcing just 10 fumbles and recovering five in all of 2010. USF's six fumble recoveries this season rank tied for third nationally.

DEFENSIVE END DUTIES

With the loss of David Bedford and Craig Marshall, who combined for 72 tackles, five sacks and 13 TFL in 2010, the defensive end duties will be entrusted to senior Patrick Hampton and sophomores Julius Forte and Ryne Giddins in 2011. Hampton has played in 33 career games (six starts), but in 2010, he had a major impact on defense, posting 20 tackles, 2.5 sacks, seven TFL, two PBU and a fumble recovery in 11 games (three starts). In the first action of his career last year, Forte notched 10 tackles, a sack and a PBU. Giddins, the program's first prep Parade All-American, has appeared in 18 career games (three starts). After playing in three games as a true freshman in 2009 before an ankle injury kept him from the remainder ofthe season, Giddins returned to post 19 tackles, 3.5 sacks and six TFL in 2010. He also added the first INT of his career against Louisville. In addition, senior Claude Davis returns after having played in 12 games last season after transferring from East Mississippi C.C. As a specialized rush end, Davis already has three sacks this season, which is tied for the 11th-most nationally.

THE MEN IN THE MIDDLE

The Bulls returned two of their three major contributors from 2010 at defensive tackle, senior Keith McCaskill and junior Cory Grissom, after Terrell McClain was drafted in the third round by the Carolina Panthers. McCaskill has played in 41 career games, starting eight, and posted 48 tackles, 3.5 sacks, 11.0 TFL, five PBU and a forced fumble. Last year, he notched 14 tackles, a sack and four TFL, while playing in all 13 games. Grissom started all 13 games last year and tallied 16 tackles, a sack,

three TFL and a PBU. For his career, Grissom has played in 25 games, starting 19, and posted 31 tackles, a sack, 4.5 TFL and a PBU. The Bulls will look to a group of younger players to add depth along the defensive line in sophomores Luke Sager (15 games) and Demi Thompson (two games). In addition, true freshman Elkino Watson will add depth to the rotation.

WATSON WATCH

Elkino Watson became USF's first true freshman to play in 2011 when he saw the first action of his career at Notre Dame. Watson made an immediate impact with a tackle on his first collegiate play. He then saw significant action against Ball State and finished tied for second on the team with seven tackles, including two TFL. Watson followed up that performance with a team-high seven tackles and two TFL against Florida A&M. Watson currently leads the team in TFL with four, is tied for second with 10 solo tackles and is fourth with 15 total tackles.

THE BACKERS

The linebacking corps is expected to be one of the deepest units on the 2011 USF squad after losing just one major contributor from the 2010 roster, Jacquian Williams, who was drafted by the New York Giants. Juniors Sam Barrington and Michael Lanaris split time in the middle last season and return as the most experienced linebackers. Barrington has played in 29 career games, starting 15, and posted 125 tackles, a half sack, 8.5 TFL, four PBU, a fumble recovery and two forced fumbles. This year he's already racked up 19 tackles for the second-most on the team. He was the team's third-leading tackler in 2010, tallying 65 tackles, a half sack, seven TFL, three PBU, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries. As a true freshman in 2009, Barrington served as the top reserve behind Kion Wilson and notched 41 tackles in 13 games (one start). Lanaris has played in 28 games (four starts). He saw his first extended action at linebacker last season and made 29 tackles, a half sack, four TFL and two INTs. Lanaris leads the team so far in 2011 with 20 tackles, including 10 at Notre Dame to open the season. He's also intercepted a pass and has a PBU. Sophomore DeDe Lattimore is coming off a season where he was named a Freshman All-American and earned a spot on ESPN.com's All-BIG EAST Freshman team. He finished second on the team last year with 69 tackles to go along with 2.5 sacks and seven TFL. Lattimore has racked up 17 tackles, 2.5 TFL, a sack, an INT, a PBU and a forced fumble already in 2011. Lattimore opened the year by posting nine tackles, a TFL and an INT in the end zone at Notre Dame. Senior Curtis Weatherspoon also returns after playing in all 13 games last year and making 22 tackles. Rounding out the linebacking corps are junior college transfer Mike Jeune, a high school teammate of Barrington in Jacksonville, and redshirt freshman Reshard Cliett.

SECURE IN THE SECONDARY

The Bulls secondary returns all but one of its major contributors from the 2010 season after Mistral Raymond was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings. Senior captains CB Quenton Washington and S Jerrell Young lead the group. Washington has played in 39 career games, making 27 starts. He's tallied 113 tackles, 2.5 TFL, an INT, five PBU and three fumble recoveries. Washington has also been a crucial special-teams player, having blocked four kicks during his career. Last year, Washington finished fourth on the team in tackles with 59 to go along with a TFL, an INT and four PBU. He's added 10 tackles so far in 2011. Young has appeared in 37 games, starting 21, and posted 95 tackles, 3.5 TFL, four INTs and six PBU. Last year, he notched 41 tackles, two TFL, three INTs and three PBU. He opened 2011 with seven tackles, a TFL, an INT and a forced fumble to earn BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week honors. Also returning in the secondary with starting experience are S Jon Lejiste and CB Kayvon Webster. Lejiste has seen action in

29 games, making 17 starts, and tallied 82 tackles, four sacks, 8.5 TFL, two INT, three PBU, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. He started all 13 games in 2010 and notched 43 tackles, four sacks, eight TFL, an INT, two PBU and two forced fumbles. Lejiste posted 10 tackles in the first game of 2011 at Notre Dame, added a fumble recovery versus Ball State and an INT vs. FAMU. Webster has played in 29 games, making 13 starts, and notched 70 tackles, 4.5 TFL, an INT, three PBU and two fumble recoveries. In the first game at Notre Dame, Webster notched three tackles, a PBU and a fumble recovery that he returned 96-yards for a TD on the opening drive. The return is the longest defensive TD in USF history and was also the longest fumble return ever by a Notre Dame opponent. He added five tackles and a TFL versus Ball State. Senior Tyson Butler (31 games), junior George Baker (26 games/one start) and sophomores Ricardo Dixon (13 games), JaQuez Jenkins (12 games) and Mark Joyce (16 games/one start) also return with game experience. Transfer Ernie Tabuteau (Miles College) joined the mix in the spring after walking on and earning a spot on the depth chart coming out of spring drills.

BIG EAST DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior S Jerrell Young got off to a great start in 2011 and had a couple of crucial plays for the USF defense in helping the Bulls to a 23-20 victory at Notre Dame. On the opening drive, Notre Dame moved the ball right down the field, but on third-and-goal from the one, the Bulls defense stood up Jonas Gray and Young saw his opportunity to pounce. He dug in a ripped the ball from Gray's hands, allowing Kayvon Webster to pick it up and take it 96-yards for a momentum swinging touchdown. Then, on the first play out of the second weather delay, with 4:08 left to play and USF up 23-13, Young picked off Irish QB Tommy Rees, allowing the USF offense to run off precious seconds. On the day, Young finished with seven tackles, the forced fumble and the INT.

RETURN RESULTS

Cousins Lindsey Lamar and Terrence Mitchell, who both played at Tampa's Hillsborough High School, were one of the most dangerous return combinations in 2010. Lamar was named the BIG EAST's Special Teams Player of the Year, while Mitchell earned Freshman All-America and ESPN.com All-BIG EAST Freshman honors. Lamar returned 34 kickoffs for 903 yards (26.2 ypr) and two TDs. His 26.2 ypr average ranked 26th nationally. He is the only Bull in school history to return two kickoffs for TDs and his two in 2010 tied the BIG EAST single-season mark. Lamar had a 94-yard return against Syracuse, which is tied for the fourthlongest kickoff return in school history. Then, Lamar tied Mike Jenkins' school record with a 100-yard return against Louisville. Mitchell returned 21 punts for 232 yards (11.0 ypr). His 11.0 ypr average ranked 23rd nationally and was tops among freshmen.

BONANI ON LOU GROZA WATCH LIST

Junior Maikon Bonani returned after missing the 2009 season to solidify the Bulls kicking duties in 2010. He appeared in all 13 games and went 17-of-21 on field goal attempts and 31-of-32 on PATs. His 81.0 field goal percentage ranks first on USF's single-season list and was second in the BIG EAST. The 17 made field goals ranks second on USF's single-season list. Of his 21 place-kicking attempts, Bonani was 13-of-13 on attempts under 40 yards and 17-of-19 on attempts under 50 yards. He continued where he left off in 2011, going 3-of-4 in the season opener at Notre Dame, with the only miss coming from 52 yards. He tied his career long with a 49-yarder and also hit a 36-yarder and a 17-yarder. Bonani added three more FGs versus Ball State and is now 6-of-9 on the season. For his career, Bonani has gone 38-of-51 (74.5%) on field goal attempts and 65-of-67 on PAT attempts in 27 career games.

STAR OF THE WEEK

For his efforts against Notre Dame, junior PK Maikon Bonani was named one of the Lou Groza Award's "Stars of the Week." Bonani was also mentioned on the BIG EAST Honor Roll for his performance. He went 3-of-4 on field goal attempts and nailed both of his PATs for 11 of USF's 23 points. He tied his career long with a 49-yarder and also hit a 36-yarder and a 17-yarder. His only miss of the day came on a 52-yarder that had plenty of leg, but went just wide. The three field goals also tied a singlegame high for Bonani. He's made three field goals in a game five times with the most recent coming against UConn at the end of the 2010 season.

STARTING STRONG

The USF special teams set the tone against Ball State with a huge play on the opening kickoff. The Bulls kickoff coverage unit converged on the Cardinals' returner at the 17 yardline. Mike Jeune got there first and received help from Spencer Boyd as they forced the ball loose on a crushing hit. Mark Joyce picked up the fumble and returned it 17 yards for the opening score just eight seconds into the ball game. The quick score tied USF's all-time record for fastest score in a game matching the eight-second score against Louisville in 2007. It was the second TD of Joyce's career after he returned an INT for a score last year. After not playing in the season opener, the kickoff marked the first play of Boyd's career.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. — The turnover happy USF defense pitched a shutout in the first half and B.J. Daniels threw a key touchdown pass to Evan Landi in the fourth quarter to help the Bulls hold onto a 23-20 victory over the No. 16 Irish before a sold-out crowd of 80,795. Mother Nature also made history in the process. A severe thunderstorm warning at halftime postponed action for 2 hours, 10 minutes with USF holding a 16-0 lead. Notre Dame acknowledged it never had a weather delay in its 123 years at home or on the road. That was only the half of it as well. USF led, 23-13, with 4:21 remaining in the game when referees sent both teams back to the locker room at 8:41 p.m. because lightning showed back up, which resulted in a 43-minute stoppage of play. Lots of time was wasted because of delays, but USF didn't waste any grabbing a lead. Notre Dame marched from its 20 all the way down to the USF 1 on the game's opening drive when Irish running back Jonas Gray neared the goal line. Charging Bulls safety Jerrell Young stripped the ball behind the line of scrimmage and Kayvon Webster jetted to the end zone for a 96-yard touchdown. Webster's scoop and score marked the longest defensive touchdown in USF history and the longest fumble return by any Irish opponent. The second Bulls turnover also prevented a Notre Dame score inside the USF 10 in the second quarter. Linebacker DeDe Lattimore stepped in front of Dayne Crist's pass intended for Theo Riddick on a third-and-goal from the 7 to ruin another Irish drive. Sandwich in two Maikon Bonani field goals between Webster's score and Lattimore's pick and you had a 13-0 Bulls lead. Bonani's first kick went for 49 yards, which tied his career long, Bonani's second, a 17-varder, came at an interesting time. The Bulls faced a fourth-and-goal at the Irish 1 when the coaching staff opted for the points. Bonani had an opportunity to surpass his own personal best with 7:18 to go before the break, but he pushed a 52-yarder wide. He didn't have to stew about the miss long, however. The Lake Wales native redeemed himself with a 36-yarder to put the Bulls ahead, 16-0, about three minutes later thanks to another big Notre Dame mistake. Riddick muffed a USF punt at the Irish 20 three plays before Bonani's boot. Fast-forward to after 7 p.m. and the game finally resumed. After the Bulls punted to open up the half, Notre Dame faced a fourth-and-1 deep in USF territory and decided to try a 43-yard field goal. USF's Ryne Giddins jumped offsides to give the Irish a first down and Notre Dame drove it all the way down to the Bulls' 5. Luck wasn't on the Irish's side again in the red zone as Tommy Rees' pass deflected off T.J. Jones' helmet and into the hands of USF linebacker Michael Lanaris at the 4. Rees bounced back on Notre Dame's next drive with a 37-yard pass to tight end Tyler Eifert to the USF 29. Two plays later, the Irish got on the scoreboard with a 24-yard pass to Floyd with 7:12 left in the third quarter. Notre Dame had a chance to cut its deficit to six, but David Ruffer missed a 30-yard field goal attempt and USF responded with a drive that will be remembered for a long time. Daniels directed a 14-play, 80-yard drive that ate 5 minutes, 2 seconds off the clock. Daniels finished the drive with a two-yard TD pass to junior TE Evan Landi. Notre Dame Stadium again was silenced as Bonani's extra point made the scoreboard read USF 23, Notre Dame 7 with 11:05 left. Cierre Wood capped off Notre Dame's next drive with a 2-yard touchdown run with 7:35 remaining to cut its deficit to 23-13. The Irish had two attempts for a two-point conversion but both failed. Young, who started off the Bulls' turnover party, sealed the deal when he picked off Rees in Notre Dame territory with 4:08 to play for USF's fourth takeaway of the day/night. Floyd struck again for an 8-yard TD reception with 21 seconds left, but it was too little too late. USF recovered the onsides kick and wrapped up a memorable return to South Bend for Holtz.

TAMPA — Mark Joyce matched the fastest score in USF football history with a 17-yard fumble return on the game's opening kickoff and the Bulls rolled to a 37-7 victory over Ball State in their home opener Saturday night before a crowd of 45,113 at Raymond James Stadium. Amazingly enough, everything seemed to be clicking for USF (2-0) on a night it honored longtime Bull Lee Roy Selmon. USF paid tribute to Selmon, its former athletic director who made football possible at the school, with a moving pregame video that ignited the crowd. The school's marching band's lineup spelled out "LRS" during a show before kickoff on the field that sported two "63" logos — Selmon's number during his Hall of Fame career with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. B.J. Daniels posted career highs in passing yards (359), completions (28) and attempts (39). Mike Jeune and Spencer Boyd popped the ball out of Ball State kick returner Phil Dudley's hands on the game's first play and Joyce marched to the end zone to tie the program's quickest scoring record of 8 seconds set back in 2007 against Louisville. Maikon Bonani tacked on three field goals to help the Bulls jump out to a 30-0 lead at the break. Bonani's first came from 31 yards out and put USF up, 10-0, late in the first quarter. He added a 24-yarder with 13:51 left in the second quarter. Demetris Murray's 2-yard touchdown run about four minutes later capped off an 80-yard drive. Bonani's 38-yarder made it 23-0 with 5:03 remaining in the second quarter and Daniels got USF back into the end zone less than three minutes later with a 20-yard strike to Victor Marc. Daniels almost had a career game in two quarters Saturday. His 289 pass yards were three more than his single-game high last season and he was efficient in the process, completing 24 of 31 attempts. Daniels started off the second half 15 yards shy of his career best set in 2009 against Louisville. Credit the USF defense for allowing Daniels the opportunity to produce often. The Bulls gave up just 76 yards of offense in the first half, while USF gained 386 on 53 plays (22 more than the Cardinals). Ball State punted a total of six times in the half and gave away a fumble recovered by Jon Lejiste. Daniels eclipsed his career high in passing yards in the opening drive of the second half and briefly exited the game with the Bulls still ahead, 30-0. The redshirt junior returned later in the third quarter and ignited a six-play drive with a 24-yard strike to Marc. Newcomer Darrell Scott rushed for 41 yards during the march down the field and scored from 1 yard out as USF took a 37-0 lead with 1:56 left in the period. Scott, who sat out all of last season after transferring from Colorado, led all rushers with 82 yards on 11 carries. USF's shutout bid was spoiled early in the fourth quarter when Jahwan Edwards got Ball State on the scoreboard with a 13-yard touchdown run. The Cardinals punted seven times and made no trips into the red zone before the score.

TAMPA — The USF offense put its foot on the accelerator and ran over Florida A&M on its way to busting open the record books Saturday night. The No. 20 Bulls set a new single-game Big East mark with 745 total yards of offense and broke a USF record with 49 first-half points in a 70-17 victory over the Rattlers before a crowd of 51,128 at Raymond James Stadium. That was just part of the fun for a USF offense that passed the Big East's previous all-time record for yards (727) with 6 ½ minutes left in the fourth quarter. "It's certainly hard to find a whole lot to complain about tonight when you look at the way we played," head coach Skip Holtz said. Darrell Scott had the first 100-yard rushing game of his USF career by halftime and did something no other Bull has before in the process. The redshirt junior became the first player in program history to record both a rushing and receiving touchdown of more than 50 yards in a season. Scott finished with 146 yards on 12 carries and scored four touchdowns, including one on an 84-yard reception. "I've been dreaming about it and it finally happened for me," Scott said. Quarterback B.J. Daniels quickly etched his name in the school's history books as well. The redshirt junior tied the USF record for passing yards in a game (382) and broke the record for a half (355) while setting a new career high with four touchdown passes in two quarters. Daniels also rushed for a score. "He's been very very consistent." offensive coordinator Todd Fitch said.".. He made some special players. I'm really proud of his focus." It might not have been an eight-second record like last Saturday against Ball State, but the Bulls didn't take too much longer to score against the Rattlers. Daniels hooked up with A.J. Love for a 43-yard touchdown pass and catch as the Bulls took only 1 minute, 46 seconds to get on the scoreboard. The play was the longest of Love's college career and set the tone for what would become an offensive explosion for USF. The Bulls added to their lead about seven minutes later after Jon Lejiste snatched up USF's first turnover of the game with his first interception of the season. His 21-yard return set the Bulls up at the FAMU 42 and it took them seven plays to make it back in the end zone when Scott rumbled 6 yards for the second score of his USF career. FAMU only had the ball for one play after the USF score and the Bulls jumped on turnover No. 2 when Jordan Stanley fumbled at the Rattlers' 23 with Luke Sager scooping it up. A fake handoff to Scott four plays later allowed Daniels to stroll 5 yards untouched to help put USF ahead, 21-0. The run marked the seventh time Daniels has both passed and rushed for a touchdown in his USF career. Austin Trainor's 4-yard touchdown pass to Lavante Page cut FAMU's deficit to 21-7 early in the second quarter, but USF was just getting warmed up. Scott busted through the middle of the line on USF's next drive, bounced off defenders and jetted to the end zone for a 56-yard touchdown run. Trainor counter-punched with a 32-yard scoring pass about a minute later, but the Bulls delivered the knockout punch shortly after.
