### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Teddy Bridgewater • Fr. • QB • Louisville • Miami, Fla.**

Bridgewater engineered a comeback from a 17-3 second-quarter deficit to lead the Cardinals to a 34-24 win at USF, giving Louisville at least a share of the BIG EAST championship. He completed 19 of 28 passes for 241 yards and three touchdowns, helping the Cardinals outscore the Bulls 31-7 in the final 31 minutes. Bridgewater has helped Louisville to five wins in its last six games as the Cardinals claimed their second BIG EAST title.



### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Julian Miller • Sr. • DT • West Virginia • Columbus, Ohio**

Miller earns BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week honors for the second time in three weeks after helping West Virginia to a 21-20 win against Pittsburgh. He had 12 tackles and tied a school record with four sacks against the Panthers, including two sacks on Pittsburgh's final drive. Miller leads all active Bowl Subdivision players with 27.5 career sacks.



### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Corey Smith • Jr. • P • West Virginia • Inwood, W.Va.**

Smith entered West Virginia's game against Pittsburgh in the second quarter and made an immediate impact in the field position battle, helping the Mountaineers to a 21-20 win. Smith averaged 57.2 yards on four punts, hitting kicks of 57, 50, 62 and 60 yards, dropping two punts inside the Panther 20-yard line and one on the 2-yard line. Smith's 60-yard punt from the West Virginia 14 in the final two minutes, helped the Mountaineers seal the win on defense.

## Any Team, Any Game

Every BIG EAST team has at least five wins this season. The only other time that an existing Bowl Subdivision conference that had each member finish with at least five wins was in 1904 and 1905, when the Big Nine (now the Big Ten) had all of its members with at least five victories.

## No Layups Here

The BIG EAST is the only Bowl Subdivision conference in which each member has won at least four games in 2011. In fact, the BIG EAST is the only FBS conference without a team that has won three or fewer games this year.

## Clubhouse Lead

Louisville's win against USF in its final regular-season game gave the Cardinals at least a share of their second BIG EAST championship. Louisville last won the BIG EAST title in 2006.

## The One And Only

Louisville would win the BIG EAST title outright if USF beats West Virginia Thursday and Connecticut beats Cincinnati Saturday.

## What Do They Know?

Louisville was picked seventh in the BIG EAST pre-season media poll, becoming the lowest preseason selection to win the title. Connecticut (in 2007) and Cincinnati (2008) both won BIG EAST titles after being picked fifth in the respective preseason polls.

## Company Coming?

Cincinnati and West Virginia each would win a share of the BIG EAST championship if either wins this week. Cincinnati has won two BIG EAST titles (in 2008 and 2009), while West Virginia has won six championships, most recently in 2010.

## Think Of The Possibilities

With three BIG EAST games remaining, three teams still have a chance to capture the conference's automatic bid to the Bowl Championship Series.

### Louisville

- Has clinched a share of the BIG EAST title.
- Clinches BCS bid with a Cincinnati loss to Connecticut Saturday.
- Clinches outright title with losses by Cincinnati (to Connecticut) and West Virginia (to USF).

### Cincinnati

- Clinches tie for BIG EAST title with win against Connecticut Saturday.
- Clinches BCS bid with a win at Connecticut and a West Virginia loss to USF.

### West Virginia

- Clinches tie for BIG EAST title with win at USF Thursday.
- Clinches BCS bid with a win at USF, a Cincinnati win against Connecticut and being ranked higher than Cincinnati and Louisville in the final BCS standings.

## Eligibility Standards

Four BIG EAST teams (Cincinnati, Louisville, Rutgers, West Virginia) have clinched bowl eligibility this season, while the winner of Saturday's game between Pittsburgh and Syracuse also will become bowl-eligible. Connecticut and USF also could become eligible for the postseason, giving the BIG EAST a possible seven bowl-eligible teams.

## Paper Or Plastic

The BIG EAST has three teams among the top five nationally in sacks in 2011. USF is second at 3.45 sacks per game, while Cincinnati is third (3.36) and Pittsburgh is fifth (3.27).

## Within Reach

West Virginia quarterback Geno Smith needs 283 yards to tie the BIG EAST's single-season passing record of 4,024 yards, set by Louisville's Brian Brohm in 2007.

## Shattered

Rutgers receiver Mohamed Sanu has shattered the BIG EAST single-season receptions record, which had been held since 2003 by Larry Fitzgerald of Pittsburgh. Sanu has 109 catches this season, surpassing Fitzgerald's total of 92.

## Catching On

Mohamed Sanu is ranked sixth nationally in receptions (9.1 rpg).

## Career Day

West Virginia defensive end Julian Miller leads all active Bowl Subdivision players with 27.5 career sacks. Connecticut kicker Dave Teggart (70) and Rutgers kicker San San Te (62) are second and third, respectively, among active players in career field goals.

## Starting Over

Connecticut's Dave Teggart saw his BIG EAST-record streak of consecutive PATs end at 127 in the Huskies' win against Rutgers when he had an attempt blocked by the Scarlet Knights.

## Ten Grand

Connecticut running back Lyle McCombs became just the 10th BIG EAST freshman to surpass 1,000 rushing yards in a season (1,109). He is the first BIG EAST rookie to break 1,000 yards since Dion Lewis of Pittsburgh did it in 2009.

## Excellent Coverage

USF has allowed three yards on punt returns this season. Louisville has allowed five yards on punt returns.

## Best In Class

The BIG EAST had six players chosen to the Capital One Academic All-District teams by the College Sports Information Directors of America: Louisville kicker Chris Philpott, Pittsburgh defensive tackle Myles Caragein, USF center Chaz Hine, USF tight end Evan Landi, Syracuse fullback Adam Harris and Syracuse defensive back Kevyn Scott.

## We're All In

The BIG EAST is the only Division I conference that has seen each of its members play in at least one bowl game in the past two seasons. The BIG EAST is also the only league in which each team has at least one bowl win in the last four years.

Last year's game was a 20-6 win for No. 25 West Virginia in Morgantown, W.Va., behind two touchdown passes for WVU QB Geno Smith.

West Virginia has won three of its last four games following a 21-20 win against Pittsburgh in the Backyard Brawl ... The Mountaineers would win a share of the BIG EAST championship with a win against USF and could get the league's bid to the BCS if it finishes in a three-way tie for the title and is the highest ranked of the tied teams in Sunday's final BCS rankings ... West Virginia is looking at a potential 10th consecutive finish of second place or better in the BIG EAST standings ... The Mountaineers lead the BIG EAST in scoring offense (35.4 ppg), total offense (468.3 ypg) and passing offense (351.4 ypg) ... QB Geno Smith is ranked fifth nationally in passing (340.1 yards per game) ... Smith has completed 291 of 448 passes for 3,741 yards and 25 touchdowns with five interceptions ... Smith needs 283 yards to tie the BIG EAST's single-season record of 4,024 yards, set by Louisville's Brian Brohm in 2007, while his percentage of interceptions per pass attempts (1.11) would rank as a single-season BIG EAST record ... Cincinnati holds a 5-2 series lead, though Connecticut has won two of the last three ... The most memorable matchup was in 2009, when the No. 4-ranked Bearcats survived the Huskies' upset bid in a 47-45 win at Nippert Stadium ... Connecticut RB Jordan Todman rushed for 175 yards and three TDs in last year's 38-17 win in East Hartford.

The Huskies are 3-1 in BIG EAST home games and are 0-2 on the road in league games ... Connecticut is third nationally in rushing defense (84.2 ypg) after holding Rutgers to -9 rushing yards ... The Huskies have held six of their 11 opponents below 100 yards and have held three teams to 20 yards or less ... ### POLL EXPLANATION & ABOUT THE BCS:

To derive a team's poll percentages in the Harris Interactive and *USA Today* polls, each team's point total is divided by a maximum 2850 possible points in the Harris Interactive Poll and 1475 possible points in the *USA Today* Poll. Teams are assigned a point total for each of their respective computer poll rankings to determine the overall computer component. The highest and lowest ranking for each team is dropped, and the sum total of the remaining four rankings is divided by 100 (the maximum possible points). This figure produces a Computer Rankings Percentage. The six computer ranking providers are Anderson & Hester (A&H), Richard Billingsley (B), Colley Matrix (CM), Kenneth Massey (M), Jeff Sagarin (S) and Peter Wolfe (W). Each computer ranking accounts for schedule strength within its formula. The BCS Average is calculated by averaging the percent totals of the Harris Interactive and USA Today Polls, and Computer rankings. The highest BCS Average receives the No. 1 ranking, the second highest receives No. 2, and so forth.

The BCS is a five-game arrangement for post-season college football that is managed by the 11 Bowl Subdivision conferences and Notre Dame. Its purpose is to match the two top-ranked teams in the final BCS standings in a national championship game and to create competitive matchups in the four other BCS bowl games. ## BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

The Bowl Championship Series (BCS), which enters its 14th season in 2011-12, is a five-game arrangement for postseason college football that is designed to match the two top-rated teams in a national championship game and to create exciting and competitive matchups between eight other highly regarded teams in four other BCS games.



The BCS has been undeniably successful in achieving those goals. Thanks to the BCS, the top two teams have played each other 13 times in 13 years by BCS measurements and 10 times in the last 13 years according to the Associated Press poll. Additionally, it has provided more access to the major bowls for all 11 conferences, more television exposure and more postseason revenue than ever before.

The BCS also allows for preserving the significance of the regular season, which is the most meaningful in sports. It also maintains the bowl season to the benefit of dozens of universities each year.

The Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, Discover Orange Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl and Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio joined with the BIG EAST, Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and Southeastern Conferences and the University of Notre Dame to form the Bowl Championship Series. In the existing BCS agreement, each bowl will host two games once every four years - its traditional game plus the BCS National Championship contest approximately one week later.

The BCS is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision conferences, the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame and representatives of the bowl organizations. The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 Bowl Subdivision programs.

The BCS conferences have a contract with ESPN to televise the games through the 2013-14 season.

### BCS Automatic Qualifications

1. The top two teams in the final BCS standings will play in the National Championship Game.
2. The champions of the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, and Southeastern conferences will have automatic berths in one of the participating bowls each year through the 2013 regular season.
3. The champion of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference, the Sun Belt Conference, or the Western Athletic Conference will earn an automatic berth in a BCS game if either: A. Such team is ranked in the top 12 of the final BCS Standings, or, B. Such team is ranked in the top 16 of the final BCS Standings and its ranking in the final BCS Standings is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls.
4. Notre Dame will automatically qualify for a BCS bowl if it is in the top eight of the final BCS Standings.
5. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 4, and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 3 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
6. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 5, and if Step No. 5 has not been applied and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 4 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier, provided that no at-large team from the same conference qualifies for the National Championship Game.
7. If any slots remain unfilled after the placement of all teams qualifying for an automatic berth, then the bowls shall choose their participants from the "pool of eligible teams" (see below.)

### Pool of Eligible Teams

If berths are available after the automatic qualifiers have been identified, then the bowls shall select at-large participants from the "pool of eligible teams," which shall include any Bowl Subdivision team that is bowl-eligible and meets the following requirements:

- A. Has won at least nine regular-season games, and
- B. Is among the top 14 teams in the final BCS Standings

## BIG EAST 2011 BOWL LINEUP

### The Lineup

In addition to the Bowl Championship Series, the BIG EAST Conference also has agreements with a number of other postseason bowl games. The conference's new lineup, which began in the 2010 season, has the BIG EAST paired against three of the other five automatic-qualifying Bowl Championship Series conferences in the postseason, giving the BIG EAST its strongest bowl partnerships in its history.

The BIG EAST announced a four-year agreement with Florida Citrus Sports and the Champs Sports Bowl to send a team to the Orlando, Fla., game beginning in the 2010 season.

The Champs Sports Bowl will have the first selection from the BIG EAST after the league's BCS representative has been determined. The BIG EAST's opponent in the Champs Sports Bowl will be from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Champs Sports Bowl will have the opportunity to select Notre Dame, in place of a BIG EAST team, once during the four-year agreement.

The BIG EAST has extended its agreement with the Belk Bowl in Charlotte, N.C., through the 2013 season as well. The Belk Bowl (previously known as the Meineke Car Care Bowl) will have the BIG EAST's third selection, after the BCS and Champs Sports Bowl.

The BIG EAST has been aligned with the Belk Bowl since the inception of the game in 2002. The game has averaged more than 62,000 fans and was named one of the five best startups in sports in the previous five years by Sports Business Journal.

The 2010 season featured the introduction of a new bowl game in New York City when the BIG EAST participated in the first New Era Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium. The New Era Pinstripe Bowl pits the fourth overall selection from the BIG EAST against a team from the Big 12 Conference. In the event that the Big 12 is unable to supply a team for the game, Notre Dame could step in as the opponent of the BIG EAST's representative.

The BIG EAST completed its bowl lineup in April 2010 by renewing deals with the BBVA Compass Bowl in Birmingham, Ala., and the Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl in St. Petersburg, Fla. The conference also announced a new agreement with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tenn. The BIG EAST will send teams to two of those three games in each of the 2010-13 seasons.

The BBVA Compass Bowl pairs a BIG EAST team against an opponent from the Southeastern Conference at Legion Field in Birmingham. BIG EAST teams are a combined 5-0 in the BBVA Compass Bowl.

If a BIG EAST team is chosen for the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, the conference's representative would face either the Conference USA champion or an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl will be played for the fourth time in 2011 with the BIG EAST scoring wins in each of the first three games. The BIG EAST will face Conference USA at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg.
