After opening the 2011 campaign with a 27-20 victory over Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium, the home of the Indianapolis Colts, the Cardinals will play USF at Raymond James Stadium, the home of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Video Broadcast: Ball State will play its second straight game on ESPN3, which is ESPN's live multi-screen sports network, giving fans a 24/7 online destination . . . ESPN3 is available in more than 70 million homes . . . Jim Barbar will serve as the play-by-play announcer, while former Ball State assistant coach Doug Graber will serve as the color analyst . . . Graber was Ball State's defensive coordinator in 2009, and was an assistant for the Cardinals in 1976 and 1977.

Television: Big East Network to air Saturday's game in New York, Florida, Colorado, Maryland, Connecticut, Wisconsin and Rhode Island.

The Series: Ball State and USF will be meeting for the first time ever in football.

Scouting Ball State: Ball State started its 2011 season with a 27-20 victory over Big Ten Conference foe Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind. . . . With the win, the Cardinals achieved a second straight victory over the Hoosiers in the six game series . . . Ball State rushed for 210 yards and passed for 173, while limiting the Hoosiers to 103 yards rushing and 272 yards passing . . . With the score tied 17-17 in the third quarter, the Cardinals took a 24-17 advantage on a 20-yard touchdown pass from **Keith Wenning (Coldwater, Ohio/Coldwater H.S.) to Connor Ryan (Westlake, Ohio/St. Ignatius H.S.)** . . . Ball State stretched the lead to 27-17 on a **Steven Schott (Massillon, Ohio/Washington H.S.)** 22-yard field goal with 2:16 to play in the game . . . The Cardinals return 11 starters from a 2010 team that posted a 4-8 overall record and a 3-5 mark in the Mid-American Conference . . . Ball State's top returnee is **Sean Baker**, who was named to the All-MAC Second Team plus was the Cardinals John Magnabosco Award winner as the team's most valuable player in 2010 . . . **Jason Pinkston (Cleveland, Ohio/Glenville H.S.)** returns after starting all 12 games for the Cardinals in 2010 . . . Pinkston was named to the All-MAC Third Team a year ago.

Led Elon to 35 victories in five years after taking over a program that tallied a 14-42 record in the five years prior to his arrival . . . managed a 24-14 career record in the Southern Conference while at Elon . . . 2007 Southern Conference Coach of the Year . . . raised the NCAA Academic Progress Rate at Elon to 971 in 2009-10 and a four year average of 965 . . . the 2010 team averaged 435.2 yards of total offense per game, the fourth straight year the Phoenix averaged more than 400 yards per game on offense . . . led Elon to the 2009 Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs for the first time in the history of the program . . . the nine wins in 2009 tied the school record for most wins since 1999 . . . Elon spent two weeks ranked third in the nation in 2008, while the 7-4 record in 2007 was the school's first winning campaign since 2000 . . . led Elon to final rankings in the top-25 in three of his last four seasons -- 23rd in 2007, 17th in 2008 and ninth in 2009 . . . led Lehigh to the 2001 and 2004 Patriot League Championship and berths in the FCS Playoffs . . . his .759 winning percentage at Lehigh was the highest for a head coach in the school's history . . . named the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year and the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 . . . as an assistant at Dartmouth, helped the team to a 10-0 record and the Ivy League Championship in 1996 . . . as an assistant at Lehigh, helped the team to a 12-1 record in 1998, a 10-2 mark in 1999 and a 12-1 ledger in 2000, and three straight Patriot League Championships.

Ball State Quick Hits

- **Keith Wenning** completed a career high 23 passes and rushed for a career best 61 yards in Ball State's 27-20 victory over Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind. . . . **Wenning**, who started the Cardinals final 10 games as a true freshman in 2010, completed 23-of-29 passes for 173 yards with two touchdowns and zero interceptions . . . He rushed eight times for 61 yards and one touchdown with no loss yardage plays.
- **Jahwan Edwards (Matthews, N.C./Butler H.S.)**, a true freshman running back, gained a career high 84 yards on a career best 16 rushes vs. Indiana in the season opener . . . **Edwards** rushed 475 times for 2,979 yards in his career and tallied 33 touchdowns as a high school senior.
- **Steven Schott (Massillon, Ohio/Washington H.S.)**, a junior placekicker for the Cardinals, kicked a career long 38-yard field goal with 9:25 left in the third quarter of Ball State's season opening 27-20 win over Indiana, which tied the game at 17-17 . . . **Schott** then nailed a 22-yard field goal with 2:16 left in the game to give the Cardinals a 27-17 lead and secure the victory.
- Ball State's defense tallied four sacks in its season opening victory over Indiana . . . It marked the most sacks for a Ball State defense since the Cardinals had six at Central Michigan Oct. 2, 2010.
- Ball State's football team has played on television 20 times in the last three seasons . . . The Cardinals are scheduled for at least three television games in 2011 . . . Ball State played twice on ESPN2 plus appeared on ESPNU, CBS College Sports and Fox Sports in 2009 . . . In 2010, the Cardinals played on ESPNU once, ESPN Plus once and the Big Ten Network twice.
- Ball State has won 16 of its last 27 Mid-American Conference games . . . The Cardinals won their final three MAC games in 2007 and all eight league contests in 2008 for 11 straight conference victories, which is the second longest league winning streak in school history.

Ball State Notes

Wenning's Winning Ways: **Keith Wenning**, who completed a career high 23 passes and rushed for a career best 61 yards in Ball State's 27-20 victory over Indiana, has started the last 11 games for the Cardinals . . . **Wenning** started the final 10 games of the 2010 season as a true freshman after appearing in Ball State's first two games in relief . . . **Wenning** threw a career best three touchdown passes vs. Akron in 2010, including a career long 63-yard pass to Jack Tomlinson that went for a touchdown . . . **Wenning** tallied a career high 39 pass attempts for a career high 224 yards at Toledo in 2010 . . . He also threw for 217 yards vs. Akron and 200 yards at Kent State last season.

Wenning a Double Threat: **Keith Wenning** rushed for a touchdown and passed for two TDs in Ball State's 27-20 victory over Indiana in the season opener . . . It marked the third time he has both rushed and passed for a touchdown in his career . . . He rushed and threw for a TD in the same game twice in 2010 -- vs. Eastern Michigan and at Kent State . . . **Wenning** rushed for the first TD of his career with 12:07 left in the second quarter vs. Eastern Michigan in 2010 . . . His third career rushing touchdown was a one-yard gain with 7:11 to play in the first half against Indiana.

Baker is Ball State's All-Time Interceptions Leader: **Sean Baker**, who was third on the team with eight tackles in the season opener vs. Indiana, intercepted two passes and returned a fumble for a touchdown in Ball State's 20-3 win at Buffalo in 2010 . . . **Baker** became Ball State's career interceptions leader with his 15th and 16th picks at Buffalo . . . Only a junior in 2010, **Baker** passed Mike Lecklider (1973-76) and Shafer Suggs (1972-75), who shared the school standard with 14 apiece . . . He has four multiple interception games in his career, including vs. Liberty and at Buffalo in 2010 . . . **Baker** tied for first in the MAC and tied for fifth in the NCAA in interceptions last year.

Baker More than Just Interceptions: **Sean Baker**, who was second on the team with 88 tackles in 2010, forced the fifth fumble of his career and recovered his third career fumble at Buffalo last season . . . He returned the recovered fumble 26 yards for a touchdown, marking the second time in his career he has accomplished the feat . . . **Baker** recorded his first career blocked field goal vs. Liberty in 2010 . . . He was credited with the first sack of his career vs. Southeast Missouri State last season.

More News on Baker: In addition to setting the Ball State career interceptions mark, **Sean Baker** is 13th all-time with 121 career interception return yards and second on the Cardinals' career chart with 59 fumble return yards . . . His fumble return for a touchdown at Buffalo in 2010 was the second of his career and he became the first player in Ball State history to return two fumbles for TDs in a career.

Offensive Line Returns Experience: Seven offensive linemen with a combined 93 career starts return to the 2011 squad . . . **Kreg Hunter (Lebanon, Ind./Lebanon H.S.)** is the veteran among the returning linemen with 22 starts in his career . . . Hunter started four games as a freshman in 2008, all 12 games at center in 2009, five games in 2010 and one contest in 2011 . . . **Kitt O'Brien (Walton, Ind./Lewis Cass H.S.)** has 15 career starts . . . He started two games in 2009, all 12 in 2010 and one in 2011 . . . **Dan Manick (Dyer, Ind./Lake Central H.S.)** has 17 career starts . . . **Cameron Lowry (Indianapolis, Ind./Pike H.S.)** started all 12 games in 2009 at left tackle and the first three games of 2010 before suffering an injury . . . **Austin Holtz (Holt, Mich./Holt H.S.)** started eight games in 2009, six contests in 2010 and one in 2011 . . . **Jordan Hansel (Covington, Ky./Simon Kenton H.S.)** started six games in 2010 and the season opener in 2011, while **Jerrod Gray (Bradley, Ill./Bourbonnais)** started seven games in 2010.

Freshman Running Back Starts Career: **Jahwan Edwards (Matthews, N.C./Butler H.S.)**, a true freshman running back, began his Ball State career with a four yard rush in the second quarter of the Cardinals season opener vs. Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind. . . . In addition to gaining a career high 84 yards on a career best 16 rushes vs. Indiana, **Edwards** tallied his first career reception for 11 yards.

Kick Starting a Career: **Steven Schott (Massillon, Ohio/Washington H.S.)**, a junior placekicker for the Cardinals who had only two attempts in his first two seasons, kicked a career long 38-yard field goal with 9:25 left in the third quarter of Ball State's season opening 27-20 win over Indiana, which tied the game at 17-17 . . . **Schott** then nailed a 22-yard field goal with 2:16 left in the game to give the Cardinals a 27-17 lead and secure the victory . . . In his first two seasons, **Schott** was 1-for-2 on field goal attempts . . . He primarily handled kickoff duties for the Cardinals in 2010.

Punter U. Continues: **Scott Kovanda (Hartland, Mich./Detroit Central Catholic H.S.)** punted three times for 133 yards and a 44.3 average in the season opener . . . **Kovanda** helped the Cardinals to limit Indiana to one punt return for a negative one yard . . . Ball State ranks 13th in the nation in net punting in 2011 . . . **Kovanda** managed a season long 57-yard punt vs. Indiana . . . He punted 64 times for 2,557 yards in 2010 . . . He tied his career long with a 63-yard punt vs. Eastern Michigan, a feat he also accomplished vs. North Texas in 2009 . . . He punted a career high nine times for a career best 343 yards at Iowa . . . Ball State has a long tradition of outstanding punters . . . Brad Maynard (1993-96) set the Ball State career record with a 44.2 average, was a consensus All-American and is in his 15th year in the National Football League . . . Reggie Hodges (2000-04) punted for 10,210 yards and is in his seventh year in the NFL . . . Chris Miller (2004-08) completed his career in 2008 ranked second in Ball State annals with 10,342 career punt yards and broke Maynard's career average record with a 44.77 mark.

Senior Captain Leads Receivers: **Briggs Orsbon (Convoy, Ohio/Crestview H.S.)**, a senior in 2011, had five catches for 40 yards in the season opener vs. Indiana . . . **Orsbon** was second for the Cardinals with 28 catches in 2010 . . . He tallied his first receiving TD of the 2010 season with 34 seconds left in regulation vs. Eastern Michigan to force the game into overtime . . . **Orsbon** tallied 13 catches for 141 yards vs. Buffalo in the 2008 Mid-American Conference Championship Game . . . Both totals were career highs and set MAC Championship Game records . . . He blocked the first punt of his career with 3:18 remaining in the third quarter of Ball State's season opener vs. Southeast Missouri State last season.

Freeman Leading the Defense: **Travis Freeman (Cleveland, Ohio/Glenville H.S.)** led the Cardinals with 10 tackles in Ball State's season opening victory over Indiana . . . He managed five solo tackles and five assists plus added one sack in the contest . . . **Freeman** started all 12 games in 2010 after starting the last 11 games as a true freshman in 2009 . . . He led the Cardinals in tackles in four games in 2010 -- Purdue (9), Iowa (16), Central Michigan (8) and Western Michigan (14) -- and tied for team-high honors at Toledo (10) . . . He tallied his second career interception and his first of the season at Toledo a year ago . . . **Freeman** tallied the first fumble recovery of his career in the season finale vs. Northern Illinois . . . His 16 tackles at Iowa was a career high . . . **Freeman** ranked seventh in the Mid-American Conference and tied for 39th in the NCAA in tackles last season . . . **Freeman** led the team with 109 tackles and added six tackles for loss, one sack, one interception, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup.

Morris Boys Have a Day: **Aaron Morris (South Euclid, Ohio/Glenville H.S.)** and **Adam Morris (Dublin, Ohio/Scioto H.S.)** are no relation, but both put together solid first games in 2011 . . . **Aaron Morris** was second on the team with nine total tackles plus added one sack and 1.5 tackles for loss . . . The nine tackles was a career high, while the sack was the first of his career . . . **Adam Morris** tallied three tackles, one sack and two tackles for loss in the season opener . . . The sack was the fourth of his career.

Andrew Puthoff Joining the Club of Firsts: **Andrew Puthoff (St. Henry, Ohio/St. Henry H.S.)**, a junior defensive end, managed the first interception of his career at Central Michigan in 2010 . . . He picked off the Chippewas with 1:56 left in the third quarter . . . The interception led to a Ball State touchdown and put the Cardinals ahead by 25 points, the largest lead of the game.

Receiver Has a Day: **Jack Tomlinson (Westerville, Ohio/South H.S.)**, a freshman in 2010, caught a career best three touchdowns vs. Akron last season, which ties for the third best single game total in Ball State history . . .
