**THE GAME**

The University of South Florida (2-5, 0-3 BIG EAST) returns to Tampa after a month away to face BIG EAST foe Syracuse at 7 p.m. on Saturday, October 27th at 7 p.m. ET (ESPN3) at Raymond James Stadium (65,787). The Bulls are coming off a 27-25 loss at No. 14/16 Louisville while the Orange beat Connecticut 40-10 at home. The two teams have faced off seven times in program history with the Bulls winning six, including the last meeting, 30-13 in Syracuse. The Bulls own a 2-1 mark when playing in Tampa.

**THE BROADCASTS**

The game will be televised exclusively on ESPN3 with a 7 p.m. (ET) start time. Mike Gleason (play-by-play) and John Gregory (analyst) will have the call. USF's radio broadcast with Jim Louk, Mark Robinson and Mike Pepper can be heard on 98.7 The Fan. In addition, the USF radio broadcast can be heard on Sirius 112 and XM 197 along with through BullsCast Radio on GoUSFBulls.com.

**THE PROGRAM**

USF has an all-time record of 110-74 (.598). The Bulls overall winning percentage of 59.8 ranks 24th among FBS schools in all-time winning percentage. In addition, the Bulls have posted an 90-60 (.600) record since joining the FBS in 2000. Their winning percentage of .630 (76-43) from 2000-09 ranked 26th nationally over that time span.

**2012 SENIORITY**

A group of 25 seniors will lead the Bulls during the 2012 season. Collectively, the group has helped USF to a 31-27 record over the last four years, including two bowl victories. USF's four-year victory record of 34 was set by the 2009 senior class (34-18). The 2012 group has gone 20-14 at Raymond James Stadium and 7-5 against teams from the state of Florida. The seniors have combined to play in 750 games (306 starts). DB George Baker (42 games/10 starts), LB Sam Barrington (45 games/32 starts), QB B.J. Daniels (45 games/40 starts), OG Danous Estenor (29 games/19 starts), DT Cory Grissom (41 games/35 starts), RB Lindsey Lamar (42 games/10 starts), LB Michael Lanaris (44 games/17 starts), WR Evan Landi (44 games/24 starts), S Jon Lejiste (44 games/29 starts), WR Victor Marc (34 games/10 starts), RB Demetris Murray (41 games/12 starts), OT Mark Popek (39 games/28 starts), TE Andreas Shields (39 games/eight starts) and DB Kayvon Webster (43 games/27 starts) earned starting experience as Bulls. In addition, PK Maikon Bonani (43 games), FB Chris Breit (11 games), P Justin Brockhaus-Kahn (32 games), OL Damien Edwards (22 games/four starts), TE Jeff Hawkins (19 games/two starts), DL Anthony Hill (21 games), LB Mike Jeune (19 games) and S Ernie Tabuteau (11 games) have all contributed during their time in Tampa.

**BULLS RETURNEES**

USF returns 42 players that earned letters in 2011 (22 offense/17 defense/three specialists) and one other, tight end Jeff Hawkins, who will return to action after missing the 2011 season due to injury. Including all returnees, the members of the Bulls 2012 roster enter the season having combined to play in 929 games (444 offense/412 defense/73 special teams). In addition, 17 players return with starting experience (10 offense/seven defense). The 17 players with starting experience combined to start 289 games (139 offense/150 defense) entering 2012.

**HOLTZ AS A HEAD COACH**

Holtz is in his 13th season as a head coach after leading USF to a 15-167 (.469) record. Prior to joining the Bulls, he spent five seasons at East Carolina (2005-09:38-27, .585) and served as the head man at Connecticut (1994-98:34-23, .596). Overall, Holtz is 87-66 (.569) as a head coach. He holds a conference record of 54-42 (.563) and a non-conference mark of 33-24 (.579). Holtz has led his teams to winning seasons in eight of his 12 years. He has only posted two seasons under .500 in conference play. He won his first conference championship in 2008 at ECU and followed that with another league title in '09.

**OFFENSIVE RETURNEES**

USF returns 11 players in 2012 that have starting experience at almost every offensive position. Leading the list of returnees is senior quarterback B.J. Daniels (45 games/40 starts). Daniels has a host of wide receivers to target in 2012 which was led by junior standout Sterling Griffin (23 games/19 starts) until he suffered a season-ending injury following the game at Nevada. Senior Victor Marc (34 games/eight starts), junior Terrence Mitchell (24 games/eight starts) and sophomores Andre Davis (18 games/eight starts) and Deonte Welch (19 games/four starts) have all been hot targets for Daniels this season. Additionally, senior TE Jeff Hawkins (19 games/two starts) will return to the field after missing the 2011 season due to injury and will be joined by converted QB and WR senior Evan Landi (44 games/24 starts) and senior TE Andreas Shields (39 games/12 starts). At running back, the Bulls will be led by seniors Demetris Murray (41 games/10 starts) and Lindsey Lamar (42 games/11 starts). Lamar will also put his talent to use on the special teams units. Marcus Shaw (23 games/one start) and Bradley Battles (16 games) also saw action in the backfield and on special teams a year ago. A trio of stalwarts on the offensive line return in seniors Mark Popek (38 games/28 starts), Daneous Estenor (29 games/20 starts) and sophomore Quinterrius Eatmon (19 games/18 starts).

**DEFENSIVE RETURNEES**

Much like the offensive side of the ball, the defense returns a number of players who have served as starters during their careers. In fact, 15 players on defense return with starting experience, led by the linebacking crew which returns all three starters from last year. Seniors Sam Barrington (45 games/32 starts) and Michael Lanaris (44 games/17 starts) along with junior DeDe Lattimore (32 games/31 starts) combined for 253 tackles in 2011, which was just shy of a third of the teams total number (815). In the secondary, the Bulls return seniors Jon Lejiste (44 games/29 starts) and Kayvon Webster (44 games/27 starts). Adding depth to the secondary are senior George Baker (42 games/nine starts) and juniors Jaquez Jenkins (26 games/four starts) and Mark Joyce (31 games/four starts). Up front, senior Cory Grissom (41 games/35 starts) and junior Ryne Giddins (34 games/20 starts) will lead the group, while senior

Anthony Hill (21 games), juniors Julius Forte (27 games/one start), Luke Sager (31 games/seven starts) and sophomore Elkino Watson (19 games) will add plenty of experience.

**HOME COOKIN'**

USF has posted a 73-27 (.730) record in home games since the program started in 1997. They played their home schedule in 1997 and the first two games of the '98 season in Tampa Stadium, going 6-3. Then, the Bulls moved into Raymond James Stadium for the Citadel game in '98 and have gone 64-20 (.762) since. USF has notched a winning home record in 13 of its 15 seasons. It's gone undefeated three times (2002, '01 and '00) and suffered just one loss five times (2007, '06, '05, 1999 and '98). The Bulls only two seasons with a losing home record were in 2011 (3-4) and 2004 (2-4). Since joining the BIG EAST in 2005, USF has gone 29-16 (.644) at home overall and 15-14 (.517) in conference matchups.

**ON THE ROAD**

USF has posted a 35-44 (.443) record in true road games during the program's 15-year history. Including 2010, in which USF went 3-2 on the road, the Bulls have had four seasons with winning road records (2010, '07, '03 and '02) and four where they finished at .500 (2009, '08, '06 and 1998). USF's road success has increased over the last five years, producing a 19-18 (.513) record over that time span. In the first five seasons of program history, the Bulls were only able to manage a 6-15 (.286) record in road games, but in the 10 seasons since then, USF has gone 29-29 (.500), including seven of 10 seasons at .500 or better. Since joining the BIG EAST in 2005, USF has posted a 20-22 (.476) road record.

**CONFERENCE COMPETITION**

After spending the first six seasons of program history as an independent, USF joined Conference USA in 2003, and then, in 2005, moved to the BIG EAST. Overall, USF is 29-39 (.426) in nine years as a conference member. The Bulls were 8-8 (.500) over their two-year span with C-USA and have gone 21-31 (.404) in the BIG EAST. Third-year head coach Skip Holtz has posted a 54-43 (.557) conference record in his 12 years as a head coach and has won two conference championships (C-USA: 2008 and '09).

**NON-CONFERENCE RECORD**

USF has gone 33-11 (.750) in regular-season, non-conference games during their nine seasons as a conference member. Since joining the BIG EAST in 2005, USF has gone 30-8 (.789) in regular-season, non-conference matchups. Even better, since 2007, the Bulls have posted a 24-5 (.828) record, including wins at Notre Dame (2011), Miami (2010), at Florida State (2009), at N.C. State (2008), vs. No. 10 Kansas (2008), at Auburn (2007) and vs. North Carolina (2007). USF posted a 3-3 (.500) record in non-conference games in two seasons of Conference USA play.

**BULLS RETURN TO DODGERTOWN**

For the third-straight year, the USF football team took its pre-season fall training across the state to the Vero Beach Sports Village, formerly known as Dodgertown. After two successful pre-season camps, starting in 2010, the Bulls headed to Vero Beach for 10 days from Aug. 8-18. The venue serves as a practice facility and houses the entire team of 105 players, as well as coaches and support staff. Along with practices, the players participate in team-building events such as the Bulls Olympics, a talent show and a barbecue. The tradition of moving camp off-

site is something that Coach Holtz has done as a head coach at both East Carolina and UConn, as well as an assistant with South Carolina and Notre Dame.

**HITTING THE BOOKS**

Since Skip Holtz arrived in 2010, one of his points of emphasis was doing things right on and off the field, which includes being productive academically. As a result, USF has seen a tremendous rise in its APR. After posting a 930 in the 2010 report and producing a 21-point increase, which was tied for the largest improvement of any BCS school, the football program increased another 23 points, the largest improvement of any BCS school in 2011, to 953. In 2012, the program added another 10 points to its multi-year score, finishing at 963. That mark is tied for 26th out of the 66 BCS schools, up from 30th last year, and is tied for second in the BIG EAST, up from fourth a year ago. USF's three-year 54-point improvement is also the best by a BCS school. The program's annual score has increased in each of the last five years, going from 879 in 2005-06 to 978 in 2010-11. In addition, USF has developed a culture of graduation, which is demonstrated by this year's senior class. Of the 25 seniors, 22 will have their degree at the end of the fall semester, including 11 players that have already earned an undergraduate degree.

**NATIONAL AWARDS WATCH**

The Bulls had six players named to 2012 preseason national award watch lists. Senior QB B.J. Daniels has been named to the Davey O'Brien Award Watch List. The award honors the nation's top quarterback each year. Junior DE Ryne Giddins, a 2011 All-Big East second team selection and 2010 freshman All-American was selected for the Lombardi Award watch list. Joining Giddins on the Lombardi list is junior LB DeDe Lattimore. The Lombardi Award recognizes the nation's top lineman or linebacker. On the offensive side of the ball, senior OT Mark Popek is on the Outland Trophy list, which honors the nation's top lineman. For the second-straight year senior PK Maikon Bonani, a 2011 second team All-BIG EAST selection, has been named to the Lou Groza watch list, Rounding out the group of Bulls gaining national attention is senior OG Danous Estenor, who is on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team list, which is one of the nation's most prestigious off-the-field honors for a group that has made a difference in the community.

**BUNCH OF BULLS DEBUT**

In the 2012 season-opener against Chattanooga, head coach Skip Holtz wasted no time in getting his newcomers - true freshman, redshirts and transfers - experience on the field. A total of 30 newcomers saw game action against the Mocs (12 offense/16 defense/two specialists).

**DANIELS SINGLE-GAME PASSING HIGHS**

**USF AT NEVADA NOTES**

The Bulls' 32-31 win at Nevada was the second-biggest comeback in program history ... the 11-point deficit the Bulls overcame in the fourth quarter was the biggest in program history ... USF handed Nevada just its second home loss in 19 games dating back to October 3, 2009 ... USF's 572 yards of total offense tie for the fifth-most in a game in program history ... Sam Barrington tied the school record with two forced fumbles.

**QUITE THE COMEBACK**

Down 21-6 early in the game at Nevada, the Bulls scored with 38 seconds remaining to beat the Wolf Pack 32-31 for the second-largest comeback in program history. Additionally, USF's 11-point deficit overcome in the fourth quarter alone was a program record.

**BIG PLAY BULLS**

If the Bulls have showed one thing this season, it's that they can create some explosive plays on offense. Through seven games, USF has posted 11 plays over 30 yards - four over 50 yards - with six of the 10 resulting in TDs. In addition, the Bulls have only given up five plays over 40 yards. During the entire 2011 season, the Bulls had 13 plays of 30 yards or more and just five over 50 yards. Here's a look at the big plays this season so far:

**UNDER CENTER**

B.J. Daniels returns for his final season in Tampa, having played in 45 games, starting 40, while producing a 20-20 record as a starter. During his career, Daniels has completed 613-of-1,073 passes (57.1%) for 8,051 yards and 51 TDs (38 INTs), while rushing for 1,911 yards and 24 TDs. Both his 8,051 passing yards and 451 passing TDs rank third in USF history, while his 1,911 rushing yards rank fourth and his 24 rushing TDs are tied for first all-time. Daniels has produced 9,962 yards of total offense, which ranks third in USF history and fourth in BIG EAST history. Last season, Daniels finished the year having thrown for 2,585 yards and 13 TDs on 215-of-365 passing (58.9%), while rushing for 601 yards and six TDs. His 2,585 passing yards rank as the fifth-best single-season showing in USF history. Daniels also recorded 3,186 yards of total offense, which is fourth best at USF and his average of 289.6 yards per game on the season is the best single-season average in program history. In 2010, he finished the season having thrown for 1,685 yards and 11 TDs on 143-of-245 passing (58.4%), while rushing for 259 yards and five TDs. In his first season, Daniels threw for 1,983 yards and 14 TDs (nine INTs), while leading the Bulls in rushing with 772 yards and nine TDs. Daniels played in two games during the 2008 season prior to redshirting. Also back with game experience is junior Bobby Eveld, who earned the backup role in 2010 after joining the team as a true freshman walk-on before earning a scholarship in December 2010. He saw the first action of his career against Stony Brook in the 2010 season opener and completed his first eight passes. His next significant action came at Miami, where he took over for an injured Daniels to start the second half. Eveld led USF to a come-from-behind 23-20 overtime win after going 8-of-15 for 120 yards, while adding a rushing TD. Eveld then earned the first start of his career against UConn in USF's regular-season finale, going 22-of-41 for 195 yards and a score. For the season, he went 42-of-75 (56.0%) for 454 yards and two TDs (three INTs). Eveld made his first start of the 2011 season against Louisville where he went 20-of-35 for 210 yards and one TD.

**DANIELS WITH HIS LEGS**

B.J. Daniels stepped up his running game in 2011, as he is the top rusher returning in 2012. Last season, he posted a career-best 601 yards on 132 carries, averaging 54.6 rushing yards per game. Against UTEP, the QB recorded a career-long 71 yard rushing TD for the fourth-longest TD run in USF history. This year, Daniels is second on the team with 277 yards on 70 carries and four TDs. He has posted seven 100-yard rushing games, which is tied for second all time at USF. In addition, his seven 100-yard rushing efforts are the most by a Bulls QB in program history. Daniels is also tied for the school record in rushing TDs with 24.

**MULTI TDs**

With his three passing TDs at Louisville, B.J. Daniels posted his 15th career game with at least two passing touchdowns. Daniels has recorded three passing TDs in four of the seven games this year and has posted three or more seven times in his career with his personal record of four being set against FAMU in 2011.

**DUAL THREAT**

B.J. Daniels has shown he can produce in the air, but he's also displayed his skills on the field. At Temple, Daniels recorded both one passing TD and one rushing TD for his 11th career game with at least one TD both in the air and on his feet. Daniels sits tied for second all-time at USF in number of games with both a rushing and passing TD is just four games behind the USF record holder Matt Grothe (2006-09) who has accomplished the feat 14 times. Additionally, Marquel Blackwell (1999-2002) posted at least one passing and rushing TD in a game 11 times. The senior is currently second on the team in rushing with 277 yards on 70 attempts.

**CAREER PERFORMANCES**

Over the 2011 season, B.J. Daniels produced a number of career-making performances which started with then-career highs in completions (28) and attempts (39) against Ball State despite only playing in just two drives in the second half. In fact, he bettered his career high in completions by halftime and was just shy of his previous top yardage mark of 304 yards after he went 24-of-31 for 289 yards in the first half. Daniels opened the game by connecting on his first seven passes, including 6-of-6 on the Bulls' first drive. He stayed hot and threw for 195 yards in the second quarter alone, help USF jump out to a 30-0 halftime lead. Daniels was voted BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week for his performance. The junior continued to set career marks against FAMU when he threw for then-career-high 382 yards. Daniels' 355 yards in the first half alone were just four yards shy of his previous career high (359), set against Ball State the previous week. Daniels also passed for a career-high four TDs against the Rattlers, bettering his previous single-game best of three. Against Cincy, Daniels continued to improve as he threw for career highs in completions (31) and attempts (48), while racking up a career-high and school record 409 yards.

**BACK-TO-BACK**

B.J. Daniels showcased his offensive attack in 2011 as he posted 741 passing yards over two games (Ball State and FAMU), which is the best passing output in back-to-back games in USF history. Daniels bettered the previous record holder (Matt Grothe, 2008) by 22 yards. Against Ball State, Daniels threw for a then-career best 359 yards but followed up that performance with a then-career-high 382 yards which at the time tied for the most in a game in program history. In 2012, Daniels posted 588 yards over the first two games of the season, which ranks as the sixth-best back -to-back showing at USF.

**OVER 1,000 YARDS**

With 312 passing yards at Ball State, senior QB B.J. Daniels eclipsed 1,000 passing yards on the season and now has 1,693 on the year. It marks the fourth-straight season that Daniels has reached 1K yards. It took him four games a year ago to reach 1,000 while it took seven games in 2010.

**MURRAY THE QB**

Not only has Murray made his mark in the rushing game, against Louisville in 2011, he showed he can make plays in the air, too. In the third quarter, Murray completed a 37-yard TD pass to Deonte Welch to become the first non-QB Bull since 2005 to record a touchdown pass (Amarri Jackson vs. Louisville, Sept. 24).

**THE BACKFIELD**

The Bulls return five of their top six rushers from a year ago led by seniors B.J. Daniels and Demetris Murray. Daniels racked up a career-best 601 yards in 2011, which ranked sixth in the BIG EAST. Murray, who has seen action in 41 career games, rushed for 503 yards on 121 attempts while adding eight TDs a year ago. Also returning is senior Lindsey Lamar who saw action in all 12 games and rushed for 150 yards on 17 carries (8.9 ypc), while playing mainly at wide receiver. The Bulls lost their top rusher from 2011 in Darrell Scott who declared for the NFL Draft after posting 814 yards.

**LAMAR'S 100-YD RUNNING GAME**

Having been used mostly as a wide receiver the last two seasons, senior Lindsey Lamar made his return to the run game at Nevada. He racked up a then-career high 85 yards on eight carries. Lamar also recorded his first rushing TD since 2009 with a career-long 35-yard rush in the third quarter. At Louisville, Lamar continued to showcase his running game as he posted 110 yards on 15 carries with no rushes for loss.

**THE RECEIVING CORPS**

The Bulls receiving corps shouldn't miss a beat in 2012 as they started the season with all six of their top receivers back led by junior Sterling Griffin. Griffin started the first two games in 2012 but announced a season-ending injury following the Nevada game. A year ago, despite missing four games, Griffin posted a team-high 530 receiving yards on 43 receptions. Griffin's 530 yards rank ninth all-time at USF. The junior is joined by seniors Victor Marc and Evan Landi along with a pair of sophomores that had standout freshman campaigns in Deonte Welch and Andre Davis. Marc finished second in receiving yards for the Bulls in 2011 with a career-best 357 yards on 33 receptions and two TDs. Evan Landi, who spent the year at the tight end position, recorded 297 yards on 29 receptions and one TD. Welch had a stellar freshman campaign as he caught 31 passes for 433 yards for a team-best 13.0 yards per reception. Appearing in 11 games at WR and on special teams, Davis made 22 receptions for 273 yards and also blocked a punt and returned it for a TD. Add to that junior Terrence Mitchell, who missed a majority of last season to injury and the receiving corps is a deep unit for the Bulls in 2012.

**DAVIS BREAKS OUT**

Sophomore Andre Davis had a record-setting performance in the Bulls' 32-31 comeback victory at Nevada as he set the USF single-game record for both receiving yards (191) and reception (12). He also added a pair of 50+yard receiving TDs to become the first Bull since 2001 (DeAndrew Rubin vs. Northern Illinois, Aug. 30) to record two receiving TDs over 50 yards in a single game. In the latest NCAA single-game stats, Davis' 191 yards rank 15th nationally while his 12 receptions are tied for 17th. The sophomore was awarded with the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week award along with the College Sports Madness BIG EAST player of the week and was nominated as one of four Capital One Impact Players of the Week.

**MITCHELL'S BACK**

After missing the final eight games of 2011 due to a head injury, Terrence Mitchell made his return to the turf known against Chattanooga as he led the team with five receptions for a then-career-high 78 yards including a 38-yard TD catch. The speedy WR also returned four punts for 69 yards marking just the fourth time in USF history that a player has posted 70+ receiving yards and 60+ punt return yards in the same game. Mitchell is one of only four players nationally to accomplish the feat this season. The junior followed that up with a then-career-high 83 yards on three receptions including a career-long 58-yard reception against Rutgers. Against Ball State, Mitchell was one yard shy of his first career 100-yard receiving game as he posted a career-high 99 yards on six receptions. He's currently second on the team in receiving yards with 339, averaging 48.4 ypg.

**SPREADING IT AROUND**

B.J. Daniels and the QB crew picked up right where they left off in 2011 by spreading the passes amongst a wealth of talented receivers. In the season-opener against Chattanooga, Daniels and Matt Floyd hit 11 different players on 20 completed passes led by Terrence Mitchell's team-high five receptions for 78 yards. With Chris Dunkley making his first career catch at Nevada, USF has now had 14 players make a reception in 2012. Over the course of last season, 19 different receivers caught at least one pass. That number was the most in a season since 2002. Additionally, USF has had eight or more players catch a pass in 13 of its last 18 outings dating back to 2010.

**THE HOGS UP FRONT**

USF's strength up front entering 2012 will come from its a trio of Bulls that started every game during 2011. Seniors Danous Estenor and Mark Popek along with sophomore Quinterrius Eatmon will bolster the front line bringing a combined total of 86 career games (66 starts) to the field. All three were key in USF's record-setting offensive production last season. In 2011, the Bulls averaged 432.8 yards of total offense which ranked 30th in the NCAA and 2nd in the BIG EAST, 183.2 rushing yards (31st NCAA/1st BE) and led the league in sacks allowed (30th NCAA) after giving up just 1.3 per game. USF also posted three-straight 500-yard games and set the BIG EAST record with 745 yards of total offense against FAMU. Estenor has seen action in 29 career games with 19 starts while Popek has started 28 times in 39 career games. Eatmon, just a sophomore this year, gained valuable experience starting at right tackle in 2011. The trio will be joined on the front line by senior Damien Edwards (22 games/four starts), sophomore Austin Reiter (17 games/seven starts) and transfer Lawrence Martin (Meced College). In addition, a group of youngsters have worked their way into the offensive line. Sophomore Darrell Williams earned the start at left tackle against Nevada, while redshirt freshman Max Lang started at right tackle in the season opener. Fellow redshirt freshmen Thor Jozwiak and Brynjar Gudmundsson also provide quality depth along the interior of the line.

**AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM NOMINEE**

Danous Estenor decided as a youngster that if he ever had the opportunity to serve as a mentor or help others he was going to. Having had the benefit of a strong mentor, Estenor saw the value in spreading a positive message. Because of his experiences as a child and now his capacity as a college football player, he has been involved in numerous community service initiatives that have led him to be nominated for the AFCA Good Works team. Estenor has participated in the Pen Pal Program and USF's Stampede of Service as well as making numerous visits to children's hospitals and elementary schools. But, what sets Estenor apart was the act of saving a man's life in February of 2011, when he lifted a car off of a tow-truck driver who was trapped underneath. **EATMON'S TRANSFORMATION**

Quinterrius Eatmon came to USF from his home in Alabama with an eye on continuing his promising football career, but before he would be able to, he needed to get into college football shape. At 6-6, 362 pounds, Eatmon needed to drop some weight to play in Skip Holtz's up-tempo offense. So, he took his redshirt year and went to work. Sixty-five (65) pounds later, Eatmon was ready to take over the role of starting right tackle for the 2011 season, weighing in at 297 pounds, and would go on to earn Freshman All-America honors. Impressively, he has been able to keep the weight off, and is now in his second year as a starter.

**DEFENSE SHINES**

The USF defense had something to be proud of in the 2012 season opener against Chattanooga as it held the Mocs to just 151 yards of total offense, which is the fewest by a USF opponent since the Bulls held UT-Martin to 98 yards on Aug. 30, 2008. The Bulls also posted six sacks, one shy of the school record, to go along with 70 tackles and 12 TFL, which tie for the most in a game since 2007.

**SACK-TASTIC**

USF came close to tying the school record for sacks against Chattanooga as it racked up six versus the Mocs. The Bulls has seven different players record at least a half sack with two coming from defensive tackles, two from linebackers and two from defensive ends. USF now has 12 sacks on the season, which is tied for 56th nationally. Junior DeDe Lattimore leads the team with 2.5 sacks while eight Bulls total have recorded at least a half sack this season.

**THE D-LINE**

The Bulls return a wealth of experience on the defensive line, especially at the defensive end position in juniors Ryne Giddins and Julius Forte. Having lost just Patrick Hampton (42 games/15 starts), USF has solid depth at the DE spot this season, especially with the additions of junior college transfer Tevin Mims, who started his career at Texas, and true freshman Eric Lee from Daphne, Ala. Giddins, a second-team All-BIG EAST selection in 2011, has started in 30 of 34 career games and posted 44 tackles, 11 TFL, 5.5 sacks, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 2011. Forte has seen action in 27 games (one start), including all 12 last season where he recorded 21 tackles, six TFL, three sacks, two QBH and one PBU. In the middle, the Bulls return senior Cory Grissom who has started in 35 of 41 career games at defensive tackle. Grissom posted 38 tackles, six TFL, 1.5 sacks, one FF and one FR in 2011. He set career-highs at Connecticut with eight tackles, one PBU, one FR and a FF. Junior Luke Sager (31 games/seven starts) and sophomores Elkin Watson (19 games) and Todd Chandler (seven games) each had productive springs and will be counted on to solidify the middle of the d-line.

**CHANDLER'S DEBUT**

In his collegiate debut, defensive tackle Todd Chandler looked like a veteran when he took the field against Chattanooga, posting a team-high three TFL for 13 yards, one sack and a total of five tackles. On the season, the sophomore has totaled 13 tackles, 3.5 TFL and one sack.

**PORK CHOP PLUGGING THE MIDDLE**

Senior Cory 'Pork Chop' Grissom has been a mainstay in the middle of the Bulls' defensive line for the last three years, having played in 40 games, starting 34. But, the beginning of the 2012 season was put in jeopardy at the end of spring practice when Grissom suffered a broken angle during a non-contact drill on April 16. Initially, he wasn't expected to return until maybe the fourth or fifth game of the year, but his diligent work in rehab over the summer had him ready to go for fall camp. The coaching staff was cautious in order to make sure he returned to full health, but there was the familiar 46 lining up over center in the season opener against Chattanooga. As he usually is, Grissom was a handful and posted seven tackles and a half TFL on just 26 snaps against the Mocs. He added five more tackles at Nevada.

**THE BACKERS**

The linebacking corps is expected to be one of the deepest units on the 2012 USF squad as it returns three starters from the 2011 season - seniors Sam Barrington and Michael Lanaris

and junior DeDe Lattimore. The trio were the top three in total tackles last year, combining for 253, which accounted for just under a third of the team's 815 tackles. Barrington has seen action in 45 career games (32 starts) and has posted 50 tackles, 3.5 TFL, one sack, two FF and three PBU in 2012. He notched 72 tackles, 6.5 TF and 2.5 sacks in 2011, was the team's third-best tackler in 2010, tallying 65 and served as the top reserve as a true freshman in 2009. Lanaris has played in 44 games (18 starts) while racking up 87 tackles, 4.5 TFL, 1.0 sack and two FR a year ago. He recorded two double-digit tackle performances in 2011 with 13 at Pitt and 10 at Notre Dame. Lattimore (32 games/31 starts), a second-team ALL-BIG EAST selection by Phil Steele in 2011 and a Freshman All-American in 2010, leads the team with 52 tackles, 5.5 TFL, 2.5 sacks, and one PBU through seven games. He led the team in tackles last season with 94, including a team-best 13.0 TFL and seven sacks. He also finished tied for sixth in the BIG EAST in tackles while posting five double-digit tackle performances. The junior came on strong in the second half of the season posting 67 tackles (50 unassisted), 9.0 TFL, 6.0 sacks, one FF and one FR over the final eight games. In comparison, over the first four games of the year, Lattimore collected 21 tackles (12 unassisted), four TFL, one sack and one FF. The Bulls will also be able to look to Mike Jeune, who saw action in all 12 games a year ago after transferring from Independence CC where he was a junior college All-American. Additionally sophomore Reshard Cliett will provide depth on the linebacking corps.

**WORLD TRAVELER**

While Sam Barrington has found a home at linebacker for USF, having started 32 games over the last two seasons, his mind and body often travels outside of Tampa. Barrington's father, also named Samuel, runs a crane manufacturing company in Ghana, allowing Barrington to make multiple trips there. He's used the trips to learn more about his father's business, while engaging in the culture. Each of the last three spring breaks, Barrington has made the trip to West Africa, most recently bringing a number of teammates, including WR Sterling Griffin and former high school teammate and current USF LB Mike Jeune. Barrington expanded over the summer and joined his father in Paris, and now, he has his sights set on the next destination, Dubai.

**LATTIMORE HONORED**

After posting 10 tackles, 2.5 TFL for 17 yards and a half sack against Chattanooga, junior DeDe Lattimore was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll for the first week of the 2012 season. Lattimore was recognized earlier this year as a member of the Lombardi Award watch list and was virtually a unanimous preseason All-BIG EAST selection.

**SECURE IN THE SECONDARY**

Despite losing both of its senior captains in CB Quenton Washington and S Jerrell Young, the Bulls secondary returns a lot of experience to the field this year led by seniors CB Kayvon Webster (44 games/27 starts) and S Jon Lejiste (44 games/30 starts). Webster, a second-team All-BIG EAST selection in 2011, has notched 147 tackles, 6.5 TFL, three INT, 12 PBU, two fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles. In the first game of 2011 at Notre Dame, Webster notched three tackles, a PBU and a fumble recovery that he returned 96-yards for a TD on the opening drive. The return is the longest defensive TD in USF history and was also the longest fumble return ever by a Notre Dame opponent. Lejiste has started in 28 of the last 32 games at safety and posted 134 career tackles, 10.5 TFL, 5.0 sacks, two INT, four FF, three FR and seven PBU. In 2011, he tallied 47 tackles, two TFL, a sack, an INT, two PBU, one FF and FR. He started all 13 games in 2010 and notched 43 tackles, four sacks, eight TFL, an INT, two PBU and two forced fumbles. Lejiste posted 10 tackles in the first game of 2011 at Notre Dame, added a fumble recovery versus Ball State and an INT vs. FAMU. Joining Lejiste and Webster in the secondary will be junior Mark Joyce (32 games/five starts), junior JaQuez Jenkins (27 games/four starts) and senior George Baker (42 games/nine starts).

**BONANI'S RECORDS**

Senior PK Maikon Bonani continued to etch his name into the USF record book as he became USF's all-time scoring leader after scoring four points on PATs against Chattanooga (Sept. 1). Bonani pushed his career total to 248 points (51 FG/95 PAT), passing Santiago Gramatica (2001-04) who held the record with 246 points (38 FG/132 PAT). He currently has 278 career points. Bonani is also USF's record holder for most career FGs made (57), most FGs in a season (19; 2011), most career FG attempts (75), FG percentage in a season (81.8, 17-of-21), career FG percentage (75.0; 57-of-76), most consecutive FGs made (12; 11/11/11-10/6/12) and most consecutive PATs made (58; 10/14/10-9/8/12).

**RECORD HOLDER BONANI BACK**

While the USF offense had been lighting up the scoreboard in 2011, senior PK Maikon Bonani also did his part. Against FAMU, Bonani went 10-for-10 on PAT attempts, tying the school record for most PATs made in a game and most PATs made with no misses, both originally set by Steve Riggs vs. Kentucky Wesleyan on Sept. 6, 1997. In addition, Bonani pushed his career FG total to 39 after making one against UTEP to give him the USF record for career FG made, passing Santiago Gramatica (38). He now has 57 career FG made.

**BRAZILIAN FLARE**

When PK Maikon Bonani came to the U.S. as an 11-year old boy, playing football wasn't necessarily the first thing he thought he would do. As a native of soccer-crazy Brazil, his natural interest was kicking the round ball, but that changed the spring of his high school freshman year, when the oblong ball drew his attention at the request of the football coach. Since then, he's gone from penalty kicks to place-kicks and now sits atop the all-time USF scoring chart. But, the Brazilian in him is still very strong and he's become an ambassador for American football in his native country. Bonani, possibly the most well-known Brazilian football player, has been featured by ESPN Brazil, and last spring, returned to Rio de Janeiro to help continue the surging interest in America's most popular sport.

TAMPA - USF's season opener wasn't perfect, but the Bulls produced plenty of fireworks in a 34-13 win over Chattanooga on Saturday night before a crowd of 41,285 at Raymond James Stadium. B.J. Daniels threw three touchdown passes and ran for another score to help USF improve to 11-0 when opening the season on its home turf. The Bulls' senior quarterback went 17-for-26 for 225 yards despite throwing an interception and losing a fumble that led to 10 points for Chattanooga. "It was OK. There are a lot of things we can definitely work on," said Daniels, who recorded his 10th game of rushing for at least one touchdown and passing for at least one score. USF's defense definitely held up its end of the bargain by registering six sacks and holding the Mocs to 151 total yards of offense on 63 plays. Junior defensive end Ryne Giddins came up with 1.5 sacks in Chattanooga's first three plays on offense. "They controlled the line of scrimmage. They played a large part of this night in UTC's backfield and I think that was the difference in the game," USF head coach Skip Holtz said. USF took the momentum earned by its stellar defense and used it to grab a 7-0 lead when Demetris Murray started the scoring off with a 2-yard touchdown run with 7:41 remaining in the first quarter. Chattanooga got into USF territory for the first time after defensive end Davis Tull forced a fumble while sacking Daniels to set the Mocs up with the ball at the Bulls' 25 with 5:33 remaining in the first quarter. Nick Pollard cut the Mocs' deficit to 7-3 with a 39-yard field goal on the drive. Chattanooga's fourth punt of the day set USF up at the Mocs' 44 and Daniels went to work early in the second quarter. The senior was 4-for-4 through the air and connected with Derrick Hopkins for a 19-yard touchdown less than 3 minutes into the period. It was Hopkins' first-career touchdown and capped off drive that took only five plays. Daniels' second TD toss of the half was a 38-yard strike to Terrence Mitchell with 7:27 to go before the break. Maikon Bonani's extra point made it 21-3 and gave him the USF record for career points (247), one ahead of Santiago Gramatica. "If we're scoring touchdowns and I'm kicking extra points, that means we're doing something right. It's a testament to our offense and it's such an honor," Bonani said. DeDe Lattimore and Julius Forte's sack of quarterback Jacob Huesman stalled a very promising Chattanooga drive late in the second quarter. The Mocs drove from their 25 all the way to having a first-and-goal at the Bulls' 4-yard line. Huesman was on the ground at the USF 23 five plays later and Pollard's 40-yard field goal attempt went wide right. Daniels' first interception of the season wound up in the hands of Mocs' safety D.J. Key, who returned it to the USF 4 with 1:13 to go before the break. Chattanooga cut its deficit to 21-10 two plays later when Keon Williams scored from 2 yards out with 30 seconds remaining in the half. Daniels bounced back with his third touchdown pass of the game, a 39-yard connection with Sterling Griffin to give the Bulls a 27-10 lead less than 5 minutes to go in the third quarter. The extra point try was never attempted because of a botched snap. Daniels was 15-for-18 for 247 yards, three scores and one pick after Griffin trotted into the end zone. Freshman kicker Henrique Ribeiro capped off Chattanooga's scoring when he hit a 46-yard field goal to cut Chattanooga's deficit to 27-13 with 28 seconds remaining in the third quarter. Ribeiro's kick hit the crossbar before sailing over it on his first attempt of the game. Holtz has said special teams could be USF's biggest area of impact in 2012 and the Bulls definitely started off on the right foot. Mitchell produced a 39-yard punt return that set USF up at the Mocs' 34 with 12:34 remaining in the game. Mitchell is back as the Bulls' primary punt returner after playing in just four games last season because of a concussion. He returned four punts for 69 yards along with leading all USF receivers with five catches for 78 yards. "I'm really proud of the way that special teams showed up today," Holtz said. Daniels scored the final touchdown of the game after turning what looked like a sack for a big loss into a 20-yard scoring run that ended with the quarterback stretching out just enough to reach the goal line. The 21st rushing TD of Daniels' career put him into fourth place in USF's record books and helped give the Bulls a 34-13 lead with 9:52 remaining. "There were a lot of positives out on the field tonight," Holtz said.

RENO, Nev. – The Bulls pulled off a miracle in front of a mountainous terrain with a soaring pass from B.J. Daniels to Andre Davis. Davis' 56-yard touchdown reception with 38 seconds remaining gave USF its first lead of the game in a 32-31 thriller before a crowd of 22,804 at Mackay Stadium. Davis, a sophomore, set broke USF's single-game receiving record with 12 catches for 191 yards and two scores to help the Bulls improve to 2-0. Daniels went 22-for-40 for 363 yards and three touchdowns. Senior Lindsey Lamar shined on the ground by rushing for 85 yards and a score on eight carries. Saturday's game ended and started with plenty of fireworks provided by both offenses. The game's opening drive featured a daring Nevada offense that gambled twice on fourth down and won. Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week Stephon Jefferson gained a yard on a fourth-and-1 at the Wolf Pack's own 34 and gained two more on another fourth-and-1 at the USF 42. Nevada (1-1) capped off the 75-yard drive on the 11th play when quarterback Cody Fajardo jetted 26 yards, fumbled at the 2 and celebrated after teammate Zach Sudfeld recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown. Fajardo rushed for 97 yards, including a 49-yard score, last week in a victory at Cal. USF's initial drive stalled after three plays and the Wolf Pack got back into the end zone on a Fajardo 1-yard run with 6:29 to play in the first quarter. Nevada's first two drives went for a combined 148 yards with Fajardo running for 46 against a Bulls defense that gave up only 49 yards in the season opener against Chattanooga. The Bulls cut into the Nevada lead on their second offensive drive of the game that featured two dynamic plays. Lamar took his first carry of the season 18 yards to get USF up on its own 48. Two plays later, Daniels threw a short pass to Andre Davis, who shook off a defender and took it 51 yards for a score. It marked a career-long reception for Davis, whose previous top mark was a 43-yard catch against Syracuse last season. USF was stuck at six points, however, after Maikon Bonani missed the extra point. It snapped his school record streak of 62 straight extra points made. Fajardo's feet continued to cause USF problems on Nevada's third drive when the sophomore scrambled up the middle for 42 yards to set the Wolf Pack up at the Bulls' 28. Fajardo's arm did the most damage, however, when he threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Joseph Huber as Nevada led USF, 21-6, with 2:58 remaining in the opening quarter. Nevada had 228 yards of total offense in the first quarter. Nevada was the aggressor in the first quarter, but USF's offense delivered a powerful counterpunch early in the second quarter by driving 73 yards and ending with a 1-yard TD run by Demetris Murray with 9:12 remaining before the break. The Bulls collected four first downs on the drive, including Chris Dunkley's first-career reception that went for 15 yards on a third-and-six play at the Nevada 29. USF gained some needed confidence more than midway through the second quarter when Sam Barrington forced a fumble that was recovered by JaQuez Jenkins that stopped a Nevada drive at the Bulls' 14. USF forced Nevada to punt twice after that and went into the locker room down by only eight points after holding the Wolf Pack to 82 yards in the second quarter. Like Nevada, USF produced a strong scoring drive to open up a half when Lamar sprinted 35 yards to the end zone to cap off seven plays after the Bulls started the third quarter on their own 25. Lamar was up to 80 yards at that point on only seven carries after sitting out the first game of the season. The USF defense came up with its second turnover inside the red zone on Nevada's next drive when Mike Jeune recovered a Jefferson fumble at the Bulls' 1. Credit Barrington on his second forced fumble of the game after he flew into the Wolf Pack's backfield and knocked the ball out of Jefferson's hands with his knee. Nevada made good on its next opportunity in the red zone when Fajardo ran 14 yards for a touchdown to help put the Wolf Pack up, 28-20, as time expired in the third quarter. The scoring run was Fajardo's 10th carry and it pumped his stat line up to 133 yards. Nevada increased its lead to 31-20, on a 35-yard field goal by Allen Hardison with 8:16 remaining on the clock. USF got back into the game late when Daniels hit Dunkley for a 52-yard touchdown pass with 2:37 remaining. The Bulls' two-point conversion attempt failed on an incomplete pass by Daniels. The Bulls had one last shot, backed up at their own 8 with 1:38 to play, when they pulled off the miracle drive. The Bulls are back at home 7:30 p.m. Thursday when they host Rutgers on ESPN in a nationally televised contest at Raymond James Stadium.

TAMPA - The Bulls will be keeping a tighter grip on the ball moving forward after watching their Big East opener slip away. USF turned the ball over four times in a 23-13 loss to Rutgers before a crowd of 44,219 at Raymond James Stadium on Thursday night. The Scarlet Knights (3-0) scored 13 points off three of the Bulls' four giveaways as USF dropped to 2-1. "We have to do a better job of taking care of it," USF head coach Skip Holtz said. "If we protect the football, we'll at least give ourselves a chance." Holtz called what happened to B.J. Daniels "unfortunate" after the senior quarterback threw three interceptions with two coming off passes that escaped teammates' hands. "I think B.J. is competing his tail off. Without much of a running game in front of him, I really thought he did a good job today out there handling all the pressure he received," Holtz said. Jawan Jamison provided Rutgers with finishing power by rushing for 151 yards, including a 41-yard scoring run that put the game away with 1:19 left in the fourth quarter. What ended with a quick Jamison sprint started with production from the powerful leg of Maikon Bonani. USF struck first with a 41-yard field goal by the senior kicker with 7:35 to go in the opening quarter after the Bulls capitalized on Rutgers' many mistakes. The Scarlet Knights were penalized four times on their opening drive and let USF get past midfield on the scoring drive by committing a personal foul while trying to wrap up a scrambling Daniels. Kicker Kyle Federico had a chance to tie it up for Rutgers on the ensuing drive, but the holder Justin Doerner mishandled the snap and the 42-yard field goal attempt was blocked by DeDe Lattimore. USF's third drive of the game stalled, but Rutgers' lack of discipline continued when the Scarlet Knights roughed punter Justin Brockhaus-Kann. Rutgers' made a second mistake on the play when Mason Robinson fumbled the punt return after getting hit by Fidel Montgomery, which set the Bulls up at the Scarlet Knights' 36. Four plays later, USF career points leader Bonani gave USF a 6-0 lead with a 46-yard kick that set a new Bulls record for consecutive field goal attempts made. Bill Gramatica previously held the school record after making eight straight field goal attempts in 1999-2000. The only points of the second quarter were scored by Rutgers after Federico nailed a 52-yard field goal with 28 seconds remaining in the half. The Scarlet Knights could have had more, but cornerback George Baker had two huge pass breakups deep in USF territory. The senior's second knocked down pass came on third-and-10 with Rutgers at the Bulls' 35. Rutgers was forced to punt on the opening drive of the second half, but the Scarlet Knights had new life after recovering a Terrence Mitchell fumble on the return at the USF 37. Federico's 30-yard field goal tied the game up at 6 with 10:40 remaining in the third quarter. USF's second big mistake of the half came on its first drive when Daniels' screen pass to Demetris Murray bounced off the running back's hands and was intercepted by Jamal Merrell at the Bulls' 30. Rutgers grabbed its first lead of the game with 7 minutes left in the quarter when Gary Nova threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to Mark Harrison. The Bulls' offense had struggled on third down all night, but Daniels' athleticism paid off deep in Rutgers territory late in the third quarter. USF faced a third-and-9 at the Scarlet Knights' 32 when the senior avoided a sack, scrambled right and found Derrick Hopkins for a 16-yard strike to the Rutgers 15. Another tipped pass doomed the drive, however, when Daniels' toss to Evan Landi bounced off the tight end and into hands of Wayne Warren in the end zone with 2:59 remaining in the third quarter. "The ball didn't really bounce our way," Daniels said. A tipped pass finally fell into USF's favor when the team needed it the most. The Bulls faced a third-and-10 at the Rutgers' 33 when Daniels went for it all downfield in the fourth quarter. The deep pass went through the fingertips of Scarlet Knights cornerback Marcus Cooper and was caught by Hopkins at the 1. Murray plunged into the end zone one play later to help USF tie things up at 13 with 9:23 left in the game. Thursday's crazy swing of events turned in Rutgers' favor after the huge momentum shift when Nova found Tim Wright for a 46-yard gain down to the USF 7 with less than 5 minutes to play. The USF defense tightened up and limited the Scarlet Knights to a 22-yard Federico field goal with 2:48 remaining. USF gambled inside of 3 minutes to play by going for it on fourth-and-4 at its own 41 and came up short when Daniels' pass intended for Mitchell fell incomplete. The Scarlet Knights put the game away two plays later when Jamison completed his 41-yard run to the end zone. "It's still one game and we still have a long season ahead of us," said an optimistic Daniels.

**MUNCIE, Ind.** – USF's incredible escape act almost continued Saturday at Ball State. Keith Wenning's 19-yard touchdown pass to Willie Snead with 1:02 remaining foiled the Bulls' strong comeback attempt in the Cardinals' 31-27 victory before a crowd 16,397 at Scheumann Stadium. The decisive score came about three minutes after B.J. Daniels orchestrated a 99-yard, go-ahead scoring drive for USF (2-2). The Bulls had a 27-24 lead after a 29-yard Lindsey Lamar touchdown catch and a two-point conversion before suffering their second-straight loss. What turned into a battle in the air started with two teams grinding it out on the ground. USF talked all week about wanting to get the running game going and the Bulls did just that on the first drive of Saturday's game. USF ran the ball 15 times in a row to get into Ball State red zone and ended the drive on the 17th play with a 42-yard field goal by Maikon Bonani into the wind. Ball State (3-1) answered back on its first drive with a 39-yard field goal by Steven Schott and the Cardinals grabbed a 10-3 lead on a 3-yard scoring run by Jahwan Edwards with 7:18 to play in the half. The touchdown capped off a 13-play drive that featured a 21-yard reception by Willie Snead to the USF 3. Snead had six catches for 83 yards in the first half. USF got back to the ground game on the ensuing drive that started with a 19-yard run by Daniels. The senior quarterback ended the 11-play series with a 15-yard shovel pass to Lamar for a score. Ball State kept a 10-9 lead after Joel Cox blocked Bonani's extra point attempt with 3:27 remaining in the second quarter. The Bulls had 149 rushing yards at the half a week after totaling 95 in a loss to Rutgers. Daniels led the way with 63 yards on 11 attempts, and Lamar carried the ball nine times for 48 yards. Daniels' feet helped him become only the 14th FBS player from a school in the state of Florida to surpass 9,000 yards of total offense. Ball State extended its lead to 17-9 on the opening drive of the second half thanks to assists by the USF defense. The Cardinals faced a third and 16 on USF's 38 when the Bulls were penalized on consecutive plays. The second flag was for unnecessary roughness to give Ball State a first down on the 18 and Wenning scored on a quarterback keeper four plays later from 1 yard out. Daniels fired back with a 35-yard pass to Terrence Mitchell on USF's next offensive play and Ball State tacked on another 10 yards for roughing the passer to get the Bulls to the Cardinals' 26. Bonani's 27-yard field goal cut USF's deficit to 17-12 with 5:36 to play in the third quarter. Wenning gave Ball State more breathing room with 3:14 to go in the third quarter when he threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Jamill Smith to help put Ball State ahead, 24-12. USF's deficit going into the fourth quarter was only five, however, after Daniels converted a key third-and-8 by hitting Andre Davis for a 15-yard touchdown with 21 seconds left in the third. Daniels warmed up his arm for the scoring toss by connecting on a 24-yarder to D'Vario Montgomery and a 22-yarder to Lamar earlier in the 81-yard drive. The Bulls defense forced Ball State to punt for only the second time and got the ball back with a chance to go ahead with 10:31 remaining. Daniels kept a drive that started at USF's own one alive with one of his trademark escapes from a potential sack. The Bulls faced a third-and-12 at their own 29 when Daniels circled defenders and hit a wide-open Mitchell for 21 yards. Daniels was clutch again on a third-and-10 at the 50 by throwing an 18-yard pass to Derrick Hopkins and suddenly the Bulls were in business at the Ball State 32. Two penalties sent USF all the way back into their own territory on the drive, but more Daniels magic followed. Demetris Murray caught a 25-yard pass to make it a manageable third-and-7 at the Ball State 28 and Daniels finished off the drive with a 29-yard touchdown pass to Lamar, who weaved around defenders to the end zone with 4:12 left. The Bulls tacked on two more points with a Murray run to go up 27-24. The Bulls had one last go-ahead drive to complete and got all the way to the Ball State 28 before Daniels threw his second interception to end the game.

TAMPA - The end result wasn't what they wanted, but the Bulls made head coach Skip Holtz a proud man on Saturday night. USF hung with No. 4 Florida State most of the way in a 30-17 loss before a program record crowd of 69,383 at Raymond James Stadium. Quarterback B.J. Daniels rushed for 72 yards and two touchdowns, including a 3-yard scramble that made it a two-possession game early in the fourth quarter. "I think we're work in progress, but we got better as a football team today," Holtz said. FSU (5-0) knew it could be a tight game heading into the series' second installment and quarterback EJ Manuel helped the Seminoles come out on top with an efficient performance. The redshirt senior completed 19 of his 26 pass attempts for 242 yards, and his touchdown toss to Kevin Haplea gave FSU a 20-10 lead with 5:09 remaining in the third quarter. "He didn't put the ball in danger," USF linebacker Sam Barrington said. "Their offense did a good job and they were very productive." Holtz said he was proud of USF's intensity throughout the game and the Bulls set the tone early by scoring first. USF used the first drive of the game as a confidence builder by moving the ball 62 yards to set up a 32-yard field goal by Maikon Bonani. The Bulls went deep into FSU territory thanks to 25-yard reception by senior tight end Evan Landi. USF's lead didn't last long, however, after Karlos Williams returned the ensuing kickoff 60 yards to set FSU up at the Bulls' 37. Wide receiver Rashad Greene scored five plays later on a 10-yard end-around run. The Seminoles took the 7-3 lead into the second quarter, but most of the movement on the field was done by USF's offense. The Bulls outgained FSU, 144-85, in the opening quarter and went 3-for-5 on third down. FSU came into the game allowing opponents to convert only 19.7 percent of the time. The Bulls' defense came to play on a key third down in the second quarter that limited FSU to a 26-yard field goal by Dustin Hopkins with 5:45 to go before the half. FSU had a third-and-goal at the USF 3 when defensive tackle Luke Sager tackled Manuel for a loss in what originally had been ruled a fumble on a failed option pitch. FSU went into the locker room with a 13-3 lead after Hopkins made good on his second chance inside of 2 minutes remaining. Hopkins missed a 48-yard attempt to end what appeared to be the Seminoles' final drive of the half with 1:09 remaining. Daniels gave FSU new life two plays later when his deep pass into tight coverage was intercepted by Xavier Rhodes. Manuel connected with Nick O'Leary three straight times for 30 yards and Hopkins split the uprights from 43 yards out with 3 seconds to go in the half. "You can't get in a game against a team like that and play conservative," Holtz said. "In a game like this, you have to take some of those risks." What many thought would be a blowout by the start of the third quarter turned into a nail-biter after USF's special teams came up huge when Tashon Whitehurst blocked a punt on the opening drive of the half. That set the Bulls up at the FSU 8 and Daniels scrambled into the end zone from 1 yard out three plays later to cut the Seminoles' lead to 13-10. "I just tried to make something happen for my team," Whitehurst said. The Seminoles started to breathe a little easier later in the third quarter when Manuel threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Haplea, a former Penn State tight end, with 5:09 to play in the quarter. Manuel started the 63-yard play drive with a 32-yard pass to Greene that brought the Seminoles into USF territory. Manuel's accurate arm helped add to what would become a 17-point third quarter for FSU. The redshirt senior connected with Kenny Shaw for 47 yards to get the Seminoles down to the USF 32. FSU had a 23-10 lead with 34 seconds left in the quarter after Hopkins made his third field goal of the game from 23 yards out. FSU's defense got into the scoring act in the closing seconds of the third quarter in what proved to be the decisive play of the game. Cornellius Carradine sacked USF backup Matt Floyd and Christian Jones returned the fumble 12 yards for a touchdown while Daniels took the play off after absorbing a punishing hit. "We had a mistake on that play. We didn't chip the end and he came from off the edge," Holtz said. No matter the quarterback, USF had a hard time rediscovering the success it had in the opening quarter. The FSU defense gave up 18 total yards in the second quarter and 11 in the third quarter. Daniels started the fourth quarter off in much better fashion by orchestrating a 73-yard scoring drive that ended with a 3-yard quarterback keeper with 12:37 remaining that cut USF's deficit to 30-17. Daniels got the Bulls to the FSU 7 with a 37-yard pass to Derrick Hopkins. The Bulls needed a stop and got it after FSU's ensuing drive ended at its 31. Defensive tackles Cory Grissom and Elkino Watson sacked Manuel, but USF's offense failed to use the momentum to its advantage and FSU got the ball back with 7:08 to play. USF had another chance with less than 4 minutes to go, but the Bulls' final drive ended with an incomplete pass by Daniels on a fourth-and-7 near midfield. "I was really proud of the way this football team played tonight. (Aside from) a couple of plays, I thought they gave themselves a chance," Holtz said. The Bulls will try to get back on the winning track at Temple on Saturday, Oct. 6. Kickoff is set for noon in the start of a two-game road trip for USF. "This team knows what it's capable of doing. We just have to go out and play with that same amount of passion each and every week," Holtz said.

PHILADELPHIA – Temple stuffed USF’s attempt at another memorable comeback Saturday at Lincoln Financial Field. Maikon Bonani’s 45-yard field goal attempt was blocked with 1:11 remaining and the Owls sealed a 37-28 victory with a 35-yard touchdown run by Montel Harris on the next play. B.J. Daniels tied the USF record for career rushing touchdowns with a 1-yard scoring run that cut the Bulls’ deficit to 30-28 with 5:19 remaining. The field goal block by Marcus Green gave Temple (2-2) its first Big East win since 2004, while USF (2-4) dropped its fourth straight game. Lindsey Lamar had another strong game with a 24-yard scoring reception and a 19-yard touchdown run for a USF team that nearly got back to even ground in the conference. Saturday’s first-ever meeting between the programs started off in sloppy fashion with three missed kicks and nine punts in the opening half. The USF defense stuffed Temple on the first drive of the game, but didn’t have much luck the second time around. The Owls capped off a 65-yard scoring drive with a 24-yard touchdown run by quarterback Chris Coyer, who ran untouched to the end zone after a perfectly disguised fake draw. Temple kicker Brandon McManus missed the extra point attempt a drive after USF’s Bonani hooked a 52-yard field goal attempt to the left. Bonani wound up giving the Bulls the lead with an extra point with 3:34 remaining in the opening quarter at the end of a quick scoring drive. Daniels hit Lamar for a 24-yard touchdown pass that completed a five-play, 46-yard sprint to the end zone. It was Lamar’s third touchdown catch of the season and the sixth of the senior’s career. USF was consistently winning the field position battle until late in the third quarter when Daniels was sacked by Tavon Young and Temple’s Nate Smith recovered the fumble at the Bulls’ 10. No damage was done by the Owls, however, after McManus missed a 22-yard field goal attempt with 2:59 to play in the half. Temple gave McManus one last shot in the first half and the senior nailed a 50-yard attempt as time expired to give the Owls a 9-7 lead at the break. What was a struggle to put up points in the first half turned into a scoring spree after the break. USF looked much sharper at the start of the second half and leaned on the running game to grab a 14-9 lead. The Bulls rushed for 44 of their 75 yards on the scoring drive that was completed with a 19-yard touchdown carry by Lamar less than 4 minutes into the third quarter. It was Lamar’s second rushing TD of the season and the fourth of his career. The Bulls’ lead lasted about as long as it took to get it after Temple went 74 yards to the end zone on its opening drive of the half. Matt Brown gave the Owls a 16-14 lead with a 15-yard scoring run with 6:23 remaining in the third quarter. Temple got the ball back less than 2 minutes later when John Youboty forced a fumble on a carry by Demetris Murray that was recovered by Hersey Walton at the USF 31. The Owls pumped their lead up to 23-14 three plays later when Coyer found Cody Booth open in the middle of the end zone for a 9-yard touchdown. Demetris Murray continued the scoring outburst for USF with a 4-yard touchdown run with 1:19 remaining in the third quarter. Again, the Bulls drove 75 yards while Daniels’ arm started to heat up. The senior completed four of his five attempts for 48 yards, which was only 19 yards fewer than he had in the entire first half. Temple accomplished both of its objectives on the ensuing drive – scoring a touchdown and using up a lot of clock. Harris, a transfer from Boston College, scored a 3-yard touchdown at the end of an 11-play, 79-yard drive that gave the Owls a 30-21 advantage with 7:29 remaining in the game. Daniels made things happen much quicker for USF in its attempt to pull off another memorable comeback on the road. The quarterback completed a 2 minute, 10 second scoring drive with a 1-yard touchdown run that helped the Bulls cut their deficit to 30-28 with 5:19 remaining. It marked USF’s third 75-yard drive of the half and it was highlighted by a 41-yard toss to Derrick Hopkins that got the Bulls to Temple’s 11. The USF defense stepped up by forcing a three-and-out and the Bulls had the ball at their own 32 with 3:49 remaining. Daniels’ incomplete pass on a fourth-and-5 at USF’s 47 appeared to end the Bulls’ drive, but a roughing the passer call kept it alive with a 15-yard push toward the end zone. Temple’s huge special teams play came four plays later. The Bulls get to rest up during a bye week before traveling to Louisville on Saturday, Oct. 20.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – The Bulls were ready to start the second half of the season off in strong fashion and almost pulled off a stunner at Louisville on Saturday night. B.J. Daniels' go-ahead 12-yard touchdown pass to Andre Davis helped USF erase an 11-point deficit in the fourth quarter, but the Bulls couldn't hold on in a 27-25 loss to the No. 16 Cardinals. Teddy Bridgewater's 11-yard touchdown pass to Eli Rogers gave the Cardinals a 27-25 lead with 1:35 to play, sending the Bulls to their fifth straight loss. Davis caught a pair of touchdown passes, while freshman tight end Sean Price caught another important scoring reception in the fourth quarter for USF (2-5, 0-3). Senior Lindsey Lamar led a strong USF rushing attack with 15 carries for 110 yards. The Bulls rushed for 202 yards as a team in the first game since regrouping during a bye week. Louisville quarterback Teddy Bridgewater continued his superb season by completing 21 of 25 passes for 256 yards and two scores. Bridgewater added a team-leading 74 rushing yards on 10 carries. The Bulls grabbed a 3-0 lead on the game's opening drive after moving the ball with a combination of big plays. Daniels, Marcus Shaw and Lamar each rushed for 10-plus yard gains, and Derrick Hopkins came down with a 27-yard catch that got the Bulls into Louisville territory. Maikon Bonani capped off the drive with a 36-yard field goal. USF kept Louisville off the scoreboard in the first quarter, making the second time the Bulls have accomplished the feat this season. The Cardinals opened the second quarter on the USF 1 and Senorise Perry just got enough on fourth down to help give Louisville a 7-3 advantage. The Cardinals (7-0, 2-0) started to get rolling near the end of the half when Jeremy Wright ran 11 yards into the end zone with 3:38 to go before the break. The scoring play belonged to a running back, but the drive – and first half- was all about Bridgewater. The sophomore completed all 11 of his pass attempts for 125 yards and led all rushers with four attempts for 48 yards. Daniels' half was a different story. The senior completed six of 13 passes for 66 yards and lost a fumble at the Louisville 33 with 17 seconds to go before the break. Daniels bounced back on the first drive of the second half with a beautifully thrown 12-yard fade pass to Andre Davis for a touchdown to help cut USF's deficit to 14-10. Credit Lamar for getting the Bulls deep into Louisville territory with two carries for 42 yards. USF's momentum was short-lived, however, after Bridgewater drove the Cardinals 65 yards in 2 minutes, 36 seconds and wrapped things up with a 21-yard touchdown pass to Damian Copeland. Bridgewater has thrown at least one touchdown pass in seven consecutive games and his toss to Copeland gave the Cardinals a 21-10 lead midway through the third quarter. The Bulls went back to Lamar on the ensuing drive and the senior delivered by rushing five times for 33 yards. Lamar went over the 100-yard mark with a 3-yard carry to the Louisville 1, but USF's gamble on fourth down fell short when Daniels was stuffed at the goal line on a QB keeper. The drive also proved to be costly from a depth standpoint when Hopkins absorbed a head-to-head hit that resulted in a 15-yard penalty to put USF inside the Cardinals' red zone. Daniels continued his strong second half by getting USF closer in the fourth quarter when he hooked up with Price for a 13-yard touchdown with 8:02 to play. Demetris Murray's two-point conversion run cut the Bulls' deficit to 21-18. The drive included a 17-yard pass to Price on a fourth-and-8 from the Louisville 44. Louisville was forced to punt on the ensuing drive and a short kick, plus a penalty set the Bulls up at the Cardinals' 49 with 6:35 to play. Again in a red zone chance, Daniels went with a fade pass to Davis, who outjumped a defender for a 12-yard touchdown to help give the Bulls a 25-21 lead with 3:09 remaining in the game.
