THE GAME

The University of South Florida (0-0, 0-0 The American) will open the 2013 season in Tampa as it faces McNeese State on Saturday, August 31 (7:04 p.m. ET/ESPN3) at Raymond James Stadium. The Bulls are 12-4 in season openers and a perfect 11-0 when opening the season at Ray Jay. This will be the first meeting between these schools since 2006, when the Bulls opened their season with a 41-10 win over McNeese St. and went on to enjoy a 9-4 season. USF enters the Willie Taggart era, following a 3-9 finish in 2012. McNeese St. completed the 2012 season with a 7-4 record.

THE BROADCASTS

The game will be televised on ESPN3 with a 7:04 p.m. (ET) start time. Drew Fellios (play-by-play) and Doug Graber (analyst) will have the call. USF's radio broadcast with Jim Louk, Mark Robinson and Alex Perlman can be heard on 98.7 The Fan and nationally on Sirius satellite radio channel 94. In addition, the USF radio broadcast can be heard through BullsCast Radio on GoUSFBulls.com.

THE PROGRAM

USF has an all-time record of 111-78 (.587). The Bulls overall winning percentage of 58.7 ranks 20th among FBS schools in all-time winning percentage. In addition, the Bulls have posted a 91-65 (.583) record since joining the FBS in 2000. USF's winning percentage of .630 (76-43) from 2000-09 ranked 26th nationally over that time span.

2013 SENIORITY

A group of 19 seniors will lead the Bulls during the 2013 season. Collectively, the group has helped USF to a 16-21 record over the last three years, including a bowl victory in 2010. USF's four-year victory record of 34 was set by the 2009 senior class (34-18). The 2013 group has gone 9-11 at Raymond James Stadium and 3-4 against teams from the state of Florida. The seniors have combined to play in 342 games (112 starts). DB Joshua Brown (8 games/1 starts), QB Bobby Eveld (13 games/3 starts), S Mark Joyce (37 games/12 starts), OL Lawrence Martin (two games/one start), DL Tevin Mims (11 games/11 starts), DB Fidel Montgomery (12 games/one start), RB Marcus Shaw (28 games/3 starts), DE Julius Forte (31 games/one start), DE Ryne Giddins (39 games/21 starts), WR Derrick Hopkins (15 games/one start), S Jaquez Jenkins (32 games, nine starts), LB DeDe Lattimore (37 games, 36 starts) and DT Luke Sager (36 games/12 starts) earned starting experience as Bulls. In addition, DB Brandon Salinas (seven games), FB Ryan Eppes (three games), DL Anthony Hill (21 games), OG Steven Jacques (six games), and Demi Thompson (four games) have all contributed during their time in Tampa.

BULLS RETURNEES

USF returns 42 players that earned letters in 2012 (16 offense/24 defense/two specialists). Including all returnees, the members of the Bulls 2013 roster enter the season having combined to play in 689 games (257 offense/408 defense/24 special teams). In addition, 28 players return with starting experience (14 offense/14 defense). The 28 players with starting experience combined to start 186 games (74 offense/112 defense) entering 2013.

AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE COMMEMORATIVE COIN

In celebration of the first year of American Athletic Conference Football, the conference has issued a commemorative coin that will be used by game officials throughout the 2013 season. The front of the coin (heads) depicts the American Athletic Conference logo. The back of the coin (tails) lists the opening home conference game for each of the 10 American schools. A specially numbered coin will be used during each school's American home opener and will be included in the full collection of coins that will be displayed at the conference office.

ONE OF THE YOUNGEST

At just 37 years old, USF Head Coach Willie Taggart (8/27/1976) is the second-youngest head coach in the BCS, only to Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech), who is 34 and in his first year with the Red Raiders. Taggart also got his first head coaching job at the age of 34, as he took over the Western Kentucky program in 2010. Additionally, Coach Taggart is the fourth-youngest FBS head coach behind Kingsbury, Matt Campbell (Toledo) and Bryan Harsin (Arkansas State).

TAGGART RETURNS HOME

USF Head Coach Willie Taggart was finally able to return to his home state when he became a Bull. Taggart was a prep standout at Bradenton Manatee High School as a youngster where he guided the Hurricanes to the state 5A Championship game. He led his squad to the title game his junior year and helped the school post a 26-4 record during a two-year spa, while recording more than 3,000 yards passing and 975 yards on the ground.

MCNEESE STATE TIES

The visiting sideline during the Bulls' home opener against McNeese State will feature a familiar face for USF Head Coach Willie Taggart as the Cowboy's Defensive Coordinator, Lance Guidry, was a member of Taggart's staff during the 2011 and 2012 seasons. Additionally, when Taggart was the Co-Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks coach at WKU, the Hilltoppers beat McNeese State to win the Division I-AA National Championship in 2002. The Bulls and Cowboys have faced off one in program history with USF coming out on top in a 41-10 victory during 2006.

TAGGART AS A HEAD COACH

Taggart is in his fourth season as a head coach, and first at USF after leading Western Kentucky to the school's first-ever bowl game in 2012. Prior to joining the Bulls, he spent three seasons at Western Kentucky as the head coach, (2010-12: 16-20, .444) and 11 seasons as an assistant coach. Taggart started his coaching career in 1999 with the Hilltoppers, serving as an assistant for eight years (1999-2006: 67-31, .684) before heading to Stanford for three seasons. Following his stint on

the Farm, Taggart got a chance to return to his alma mater as the head coach at WKU. In his 14 years as a collegiate coach, Taggart's teams have posted a 100-71 overall record.

TAGGART TURNS IT AROUND

In three seasons at WKU, Willie Taggart turned around a program that failed to record a win in 20 games prior to his arrival. After posting a two-win season in his first year with the Hilltoppers in 2010, Taggart produced two consecutive winning seasons, including a 7-1 Sun Belt Conference finish in 2011, marking the largest one-year turnaround in conference history. Taggart continued to make history in 2012, leading WKU to the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl, which is the first bowl appearance in school history for the Hilltoppers since joining the Football Bowl Subdivision.

BRINGING THE YOUTH

The Bulls' offense will have a younger look to it in 2013 as eight of the 11 players atop the latest depth chart still have at least two years of college left. Junior wide receiver Andre Davis is one of the most experienced out of the group as he has started in 11 of his 23 games played while posting eight TDs and 807 career yards. Running back Marcus Shaw (28 games/three starts), right guard Lawrence Martin (two games/one start) and fullback Ryan Eppes (three games) are the three seniors with starting spots on the first two-deep of the season. On the front line, junior RT Quinterris Eatmon (24 games/ 23 starts) is joined by junior LT Darrell Williams (18 games/five starts), junior center Austin Reiter (22 games/12 starts) and sophomore LG Brynjar Gudmundsson (nine games/one start). Along with Davis, sophomore QB Matt Floyd (seven games/two starts) will also have junior wide receiver Deonte Welch (24 games/seven starts) to throw to down field.

DEFENSIVE RETURNEES

Unlike the offensive side of the ball, the defense returns a solid group of players who have combined to play in 247 games during their careers. Six seniors will line up on the defensive side to start the season led by linebacker DeDe Lattimore who has started in 36 of his 37 career games. Lattimore has already received a wealth of preseason recognition as he is on both the Butkus and Bednarik Watch Lists for 2013. Lattimore is joined by senior safety JaQuez Jenkins (32 games/nine starts), senior defensive tackle Luke Sager (36 games/12 starts), senior defensive end Tevin Mims (11 games/11 starts), and senior defensive back Mark Joyce (37 games/12 starts). On the front seven, the seniors will be joined by 2011 Freshman All-American transfer defensive end Aaron Lynch (Notre Dame) and junior defensive tackle Elkin Watson (24 games/one start). Adding depth to the defense will be senior defensive end Ryne Giddins (39 games/31 starts), junior linebacker Reshard Cliett (20 games/six starts) and senior walk-on turned scholarship player Brandon Salinas.

HOME COOKIN'

USF has posted a 74-29 (.718) record in home games since the program started in 1997. They played their home schedule in 1997 and the first two games of the '98 season in Tampa Stadium, going 6-3. Then, the Bulls moved into Raymond James Stadium for the Citadel game in '98 and have gone 65-22 (.747) since. USF has notched a winning home record in 13 of its 16 seasons. It's gone undefeated three times (2002, '01 and '00) and

suffered just one loss five times (2007, '06, '05, 1999 and '98). The Bulls only three seasons with a losing home record were in 2012 (2-4), 2011 (3-4) and 2004 (2-4). USF has gone 30-18 (.625) at home overall and 15-14 (.517) in conference matchups since 2005.

ON THE ROAD

USF has posted a 35-46 (.432) record in true road games during the program's 16-year history. Including 2010, in which USF went 3-2 on the road, the Bulls have had four seasons with winning road records (2010, '07, '03 and '02) and four where they finished at .500 (2009, '08, '06 and 1998). USF's road success has increased over the last five years, producing a 19-20 (.487) record over that time span. In the first five seasons of program history, the Bulls were only able to manage a 6-15 (.286) record in road games, but in the 10 seasons since then, USF has gone 29-31 (.483), including seven of 10 seasons at .500 or better. Since 2005, USF has posted a 20-24 (.455) road record.

CONFERENCE COMPETITION

After spending the first six seasons of program history as an independent, USF joined Conference USA in 2003, and then, in 2005, moved to the BIG EAST. Realignment continued as the BIG EAST morphed into the American Athletic Conference in 2013. Overall, USF is 30-42 (.423) in nine years as a conference member. The Bulls were 8-8 (.500) over their two-year span with C-USA and went 22-34 (.392) in the BIG EAST. First-year Head Coach Willie Taggart made history in his last conference as his one-year turnaround from 2-10 in 2010 to 7-5 in 2011 was the single-best turnaround in Sun Belt history.

NON-CONFERENCE RECORD

USF has gone 33-12 (.733) in regular-season, non-conference games during their nine seasons as a conference member. During their time in the BIG EAST (2005-2012), USF went 30-9 (.769) in regular-season, non-conference matchups. Even better, since 2007, the Bulls have posted a 24-6 (.800) record, including wins at Notre Dame (2011), Miami (2010), at Florida State (2009), at N.C. State (2008), vs. No. 10 Kansas (2008), at Auburn (2007) and vs. North Carolina (2007). USF posted a 3-3 (.500) record in non-conference games in two seasons of Conference USA play.

BULLS RETURN TO DODGERTOWN

For the fourth-straight year, the USF football team took its preseason fall training across the state to the Vero Beach Sports Village, formerly known as Dodgertown. After three successful preseason camps, starting in 2010, the Bulls will head to Vero Beach for seven days from Aug. 10-17. The venue serves as a practice facility and houses the entire team of 105 players, as well as coaches and support staff. Coach Taggart brought a different feel to this year's camp as he woke the team up for a 4:30 a.m. scrimmage halfway through the week and said it was the best practice he had seen since arriving at USF. During the week the Bulls watched historical footage on the USF football team so they could better understand the program they were representing, while also

listening to former Bulls such as Super Bowl Champion Kawika Mitchell and Marquel Blackwell speak about what it means to be a Bull.

NATIONAL AWARDS WATCH

The Bulls have earned some preseason recognition as senior DeDe Lattimore has been named to both the Butkus Award and Bednarik Award Watch Lists to start the 2013 season. The Bednarik Award is given out annually to the college defensive player of the year while the Butkus Award goes to the nation's best linebackers. Additionally, Lattimore was named to Athlon Sports' preseason 2013 American Athletic Conference All-Conference Second Team. Joining Lattimore on the preseason lists is sophomore transfer defensive end Aaron Lynch who was named to Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List, which is presented to the national defensive player of the year by the Charlotte Touchdown Club and the Football Writers Association of America. The 2011 Freshman All-American at Notre Dame was also named to Athlon Sports' preseason AAC All-Conference First Time while additionally being named an impact transfer by Sports Illustrated. On the offensive side of the ball, junior center Austin Reiter has been named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List which is given out to the nation's top center. Reiter was the lone USF offensive lineman to start all 12 games a year ago.

UNDER CENTER

The 2013 Bulls will feature a new quarterback for the first time in four seasons as standout B.J. Daniels graduated and is now playing for the San Francisco 49ers. The Bulls are the only team in the American Athletic Conference that does not return its starting quarterback from 2012. Sophomore Matt Floyd claimed the starting job following fall camp and will kick off the 2013 season after seeing action in seven games as a freshman, including two starts. Floyd has thrown for 466 yards (57-of-110) with a long of 78 yards. The Milton, native earned his first career start at Cincinnati, going 21-of-39 for 176 yards in 2012 and also started against Pittsburgh. Backing him up is senior Bobby Eveld who has seen action in 13 games with three starts. Eveld has recorded 837 yards on 150 attempts and posted three touchdowns. The senior joined the squad as a walk-on before earning a scholarship in December 2010. He saw the first action of his career against Stony Brook in the 2010 season opener and completed his first eight passes. His next significant action came at Miami, where he took over for an injured Daniels to start the second half. Eveld led USF to a come-from-behind 23-20 overtime win after going 8-of-15 for 120 yards, while adding a rushing TD. Eveld then earned the first start of his career against UConn in USF's regular-season finale, going 22-of-41 for 195 yards and a score. For the season, he went 42-of-75 (56.0%) for 454 yards and two TDs (three INTs). Eveld made his first start of the 2011 season against Louisville where he went 20-of-35 for 210 yards and one TD. Rounding out the QB corps is sophomore transfer Stephen Bench (Penn State), redshirt freshman

Tommy Eveld and freshman Mike Love.

FLOYD'S SUMMER

Sophomore starting quarterback Matt Floyd had a busy offseason to say the least. Along with preparing for the 2013 season, Floyd spent time as an intern for U.S. Senator Marco Rubio, where he handled administrative duties and spoke with phone constituents regarding policy issues. Additionally, he went to the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) Policy Conference in Washington DC to learn about Israel and how to advocate for the country and while there, USF won the "Top 5 Campus Advocates of the Year" award. On top of all of that, Floyd attended the Ultimate Training Camp with Athletes in Action, where he was required to complete a series of physical, mental and spiritually demanding challenges that pushed him to the limit of what he could individually take.

THE RECEIVING CORPS

The Bulls receiving corps may be young in 2013 but they're experienced. USF returns its top receiver from 2012 in Andre Davis who went for 534 yards, averaging 11.6 yards per game, while his six receiving TDs tie for the second-most in USF single-season history. The junior from Tampa set both the single-game reception record in 2012 with his 12 catches and the single-game receiving yards record (191 yards) at Nevada (Sept. 8). Additionally, Davis will be joined by tight end Sean Price (12 games/three starts) who posted 209 yards on 21 receptions with one TD, and junior Deonte Welch who has registered 616 yards on 49 receptions in 24 career games. Welch finished seventh on the team in receiving yards a year ago, averaging 15.2 yards per game. Notably, the Bulls lose three of their top five receivers from 2012.

THE HOGS UP FRONT

USF's strength up front entering 2013 will come from a group of experience, led by redshirt juniors Austin Reiter (center) and Quinterrius Eatmon (right tackle). Eatmon has appeared in all 24 games over the last two years, starting 23 of them, while Reiter was the team's sole starting center last season. Sandwiched between Reiter and Eatmon on the right side will be senior Lawrence Martin, who earned a start against Cincinnati last season, on a day when USF ran for 130 yards. Junior Darrell Williams and redshirt sophomore Brynjar Gudmundsson will shore up the left side of the line, bringing experience to each position with a combined 17 games and six starts under their belts from 2012. The Bulls ran for 1,824 yards in 2012 and scored 14 touchdowns on the ground, and could be even more dangerous with their front five in 2013.

THE D-LINE

The Bulls' defensive line will boast a wealth of experience in 2013, especially at the defensive end position in seniors Tevin Mims, Ryne Giddins and Julius Forte

while adding in 2011 First Team Freshman All-American transfer sophomore Aaron Lynch (Notre Dame) and sophomore Eric Lee. Mims started in 11 games a year ago posting 35 tackles, two sacks, 3.5 TFL and a FF while Giddins, a second-team All-BIG EAST selection in 2011 has started in 31 of 39 career games while recording 91 tackles, 22 TFL and 14.5 sacks. The senior due will be joined by Lynch, who had a stellar freshman campaign in South Bend where he notched 33 tackles, 5.5 sacks, seven TFL, 14 pressures, two PBU and a FF in 12 games. In the middle, the Bulls will have senior Luke Sager (36 games/12 starts) and junior Elkin Watson (24 games/one start) who will provide solid depth on the line. Additionally, sophomore James Hamilton (11 games) and senior Anthony Hill (21 games) will contribute for the front seven.

THE BACKERS

The linebacking corps will be led by senior DeDe Lattimore in 2013 as he is the top returner after having posted 76 tackles, 7.5 TFL, 3.5 sacks, two PBU, two QBH and two blocked kicks a year ago. Lattimore has started in 36 of his 37 career games and is on the Bednarik and Butkus Watch Lists for 2013. Joining Lattimore in the box is redshirt junior Reshard Cliett, who broke into the starting lineup last season, starting six of the Bulls' 11 games en route to a 40-tackle season. Cliett tallied 11 of those tackles against Syracuse, and has 20 games of experience with USF over the last two seasons. Sophomore Tashon Whitehurst also gained valuable experience last season, playing in 10 of 11 games, starting one. Whitehurst made the most of his first career start, racking up eight tackles, recovering a fumble and blocking a punt to help the Bulls to a win over UConn. Whitehurst was recognized for his efforts, earning BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week. Also getting his feet wet in 2012 was redshirt sophomore Zack Bullock. Bullock played in nine games and recorded five solo tackles. Adding depth to the linebacking corps will be redshirt juniors Ruben Garcia and Hans Louis, junior Rahmon Swain, redshirt sophomores C.J. Garye, Corian Hamilton and Antoine Pozniak, and freshmen Nigel Harris and Mitchell Wright.

SECURE IN THE SECONDARY

Despite losing seniors CB Kayvon Webster and S Jon Lejiste in its secondary, USF will have plenty of coverage options in 2013. Taggart has placed a big emphasis on creating turnovers this season, and will look to seniors Mark Joyce and JaQuez Jenkins to provide leadership in the secondary. Joyce and Jenkins will play alongside each other at the two safety positions, with a combined 69 games of experience between the two. Joyce has played in 37 games for the Bulls, starting 12, and has 128 career tackles to his name. Jenkins has played in 32 games, starting nine, and has recorded 76 tackles including 53 in 2012. Jenkins has three career interceptions, two fumble recoveries and six career tackles for a loss. Jenkins and Joyce will be joined in the secondary by senior CB Brandon Salinas and redshirt sophomore CB Kenneth Durden.

KICKING GAME

The kicking game will have a new look to it in 2013 as sophomore walk-on turned scholarship player Mattias Ciabatti will handle punting duties, replacing Justin Brockhaus-Kann who had held the role from 2010-12. Taking over for USF's all-time leading scorer, Maikon Bonani (2008-12), on field goals and extra points will be junior Marvin Kloss, who has also handled kickoff duties for the two previous seasons.
